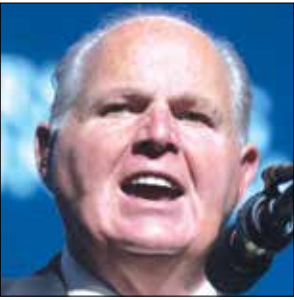

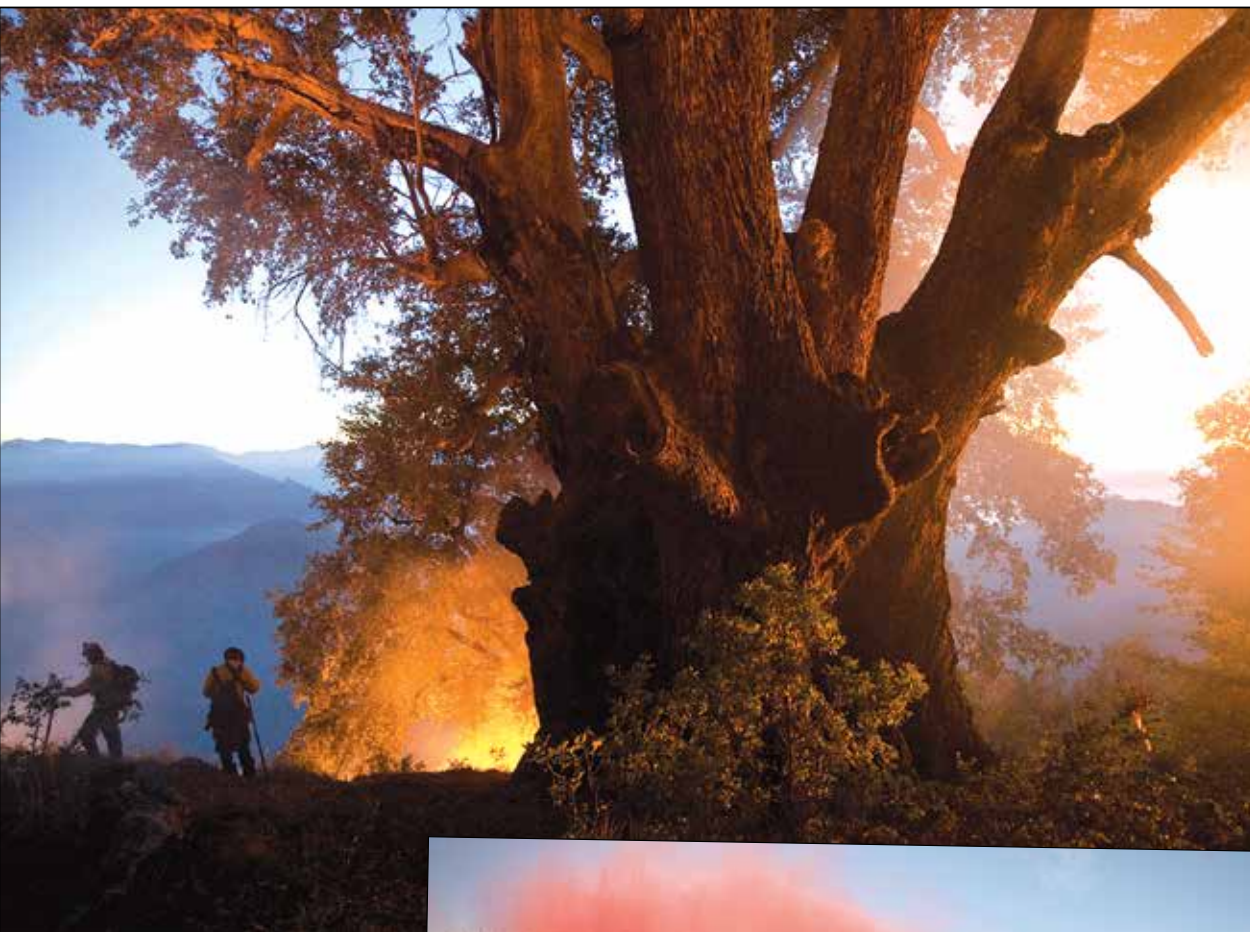

Facing the Inferno

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - “When things go well it’s synergy and the fire is contained or corralled,” said photographer Kari Greer. “If conditions are ripe then it can be more challenging, with wind and drought-stricken trees and shrubs. That’s when you get the sixth sense, the hairs on the back of your neck stand up and you are hyperaware.” The show at the MACC titled “Facing the Inferno” contains up to 64 of Greer’s thousands upon thousands of unique wildland fire photographs from fires in the west.

Greer studied photography and film production at California State University, Sacramento. She wanted an adventurous summer job and was able to make good money on a Forest Service fire crew in Washington State, working 16 hour days for four months. “There is also a



very real sense of awe when you’re witnessing fire,” Greer said. “The elements and the landscape become different animals and it is amazing to see.”

Curated by director Roger H. D. Rowley, Facing the Inferno originated from Prichard Art Gallery in Idaho. Rowley said with Kari’s photos he knew they could create, “an exhibit of really high quality ... timely, topical, popular, important, graphically and visually amazing.” He narrowed down

tens of thousands of Greer’s photos to about 300, then with help from Greer down to 64. “I had intense fire images, I had interactions between fire and people, I had aerial operations,” Rowley said. “To me it was important to have . . . very strong portraits of firefighters as well as community members and people impacted.”

Greer said it seems that fires are burning more frequently and for

**Specialty Team
Deployment
of Body-Worn
Cameras
Announced**

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - The Sacramento County Sheriff’s Office is pleased to announce that effective February 15, 2021, the specialized units of Gangs, Homeless Outreach and North Problem Oriented Policing (POP) will be equipped with body worn cameras. After a process that started with field-testing cameras in 2017, and officially requesting funding for body cams in 2018, our body worn program has finally begun. This pilot program approach allows the sheriff’s office to study and evaluate the effectiveness, as well as the technology, data storage and best practices.

The Sacramento County Sheriff’s Office is committed to an ongoing partnership with our community to provide the highest level of service based on trust and transparency. In addition to our in-car camera systems which have been utilized for over a decade, the implementation of the body worn cameras will allow deputies to document incidents and interactions and obtain evidence during investigations. In terms of evidence collection, body worn cameras and in-car cameras provide an invaluable record of statements, physical evidence, and timeline of events during crimes in progress and other critical incidents.

Additionally, the sheriff’s office will be able to review the video footage to debrief critical incidents and use the camera footage as a training tool to keep officers well trained and prepared. We embrace this valuable tool and are proud of our deputies’ professionalism as they provide service to the Sacramento County Community.

We are on track for a full deployment of body worn cameras by June 2021. The agency wide distribution of body-worn cameras for deputies will enhance safety, increase accountability, reduce County liability and advance prosecution. ★

The Ranch’s Long and Winding Road is Taking Longer

- The Ranch, a development area south of Douglas Boulevard, has encountered a slight bump in the road. Namely, Chrysanthy Boulevard, the to-be constructed four-lane road that will run through it.

Originally envisioned to be fully built prior to the development’s first occupants, the builder K. Hovnanian® Homes decided it necessary to now construct Chrysanthy in a series of phases over the course of several years. As discussed in the Tuesday February 16 Council meeting, Councilmember Linda

Budge worried about the lack of a “complete street to serve the people that are going to live there. Or, as she put it, having “dragon’s teeth,” referring to some unfinished city streets that alternate concrete, dirt, and sidewalk.

Olga Shlorelli of K. Hovnanian® Homes stated that some parts of Chrysanthy would indeed be full sections of road but at some areas only half sections too. She attributed this need to amend the original plan to cash flow problems and a lack of development partners. The exact time line of when the road will extend fully and completely across the Ranch is unknowable.

Essentially, completion of the road will continue in step with the additional homes built with each concurrent phase.

Although construction of the Ranch is differing in conception, Shlorelli felt it best to proceed to increase the number of families, and accordingly children, which would aid in bringing a new high school to Rancho Cordova.

The ordinance is coming for a second reading at the next regular City Council meeting where approval is likely. Besides homes, the Ranch (its full name) will include parks, a commercial center, access to trails and more.

The Council also

continued to look at the proposed expansion of the Royal C Store on Mather Field Road. Owner Sunmeet Ghuman wants to convert his current Tobacco business into a full-fledged convenience store. After the Council previously expressed great unease over desired alcohol sales, Ghuman withdrew his application for the required permits but continued to press on with the expansion.

While stating the large community support and past testimony on Ghuman’s positive business practices, Councilmember Linda Budge still had concerns

Wounded Heroes Documentary Brings Hope to Our Military, First Responders, and Everyone Battling Post Traumatic Stress

CHICAGO, IL (MPG) - New film shines a light on bold new alternative non-drug treatments and programs that heal the wounds of PTS

In the Wounded Heroes Documentary due out March 5th, 2021, PTS sufferers are finally getting their voices heard as they speak out about their mistreatment by the healthcare system, the medications that are making them worse, and the amazing new proven therapies that are giving them back their lives.

An alarming statistic by the Department of Veterans Affairs report anywhere from 17 to 22 veteran suicides every single day.

Many feel it does not need to be that way.

After learning about this statistic and the serious side effects of overmedicating veterans, California filmmaker, Michael Gier, went on a mission to find successful alternative non-drug treatments that restore lives from the destruction of PTS.

"Post-Traumatic Stress among our veterans is a serious problem," said Gier. "Most are given prescription medications, or drug cocktails as many call them, some of these prescriptions are black labeled with serious side effects."

Gier, who traveled all over the country interviewing veterans, military brass, politicians, doctors, and other experts, said many veterans feel medication is just a band-aid over a wound that will never heal. "Our veterans deserve so

much more than just a band-aid and that is what inspired me to create this film," said Gier.

Wounded Heroes Documentary is a 3-year passion project, funded primarily by Michael Gier and his wife Terri Gier, and features life changing options that give those suffering from PTS hope, potentially saving lives.

"These men and women served our country for years and the best we can do is give them drugs; some as many as eighteen different prescriptions, forty pills a day?!" said Gier. "I knew there had to be better options."

In the film, Gier interviews health care professionals who are using alternative therapies that have been successfully proven to dramatically decrease their patients' medication or help them become completely PTS prescription free.

Gier said by creating the film he wanted to bring as much awareness as possible about these life changing treatments and that everyone suffering from PTS needed to know there were other options out there for them.

"These aren't just therapies that can help our soldiers and veterans," said

Gier. "Firefighters, police officers, and first responders all deal with PTS, and even more people from all walks of life are being affected by Covid-19. These can benefit them too."

Veterans reported the alternative treatments helped change their lives significantly for the better and went from contemplating suicide to finding happiness and gratitude in their daily lives.

"I'm happier today than I've ever been in my entire life." - Chuck Gardea, US

Dr. Shauna Springer, Ph.D., known as "Doc Springer" in the military community, is one of the nation's leading experts on trauma, military transition, and close relationships. She has become a trusted Doc to

countless warfighters across the country and has gained the respect of warriors of all ranks. Her unique role has given her a deep understanding of warrior culture, and the warfighter.

Dr. Springer is a proud advocate of the film.

"The feeling that Post-Traumatic Stress is a "life sentence" is killing warriors - and people across America. Many have given up, but they need to know that there is life beyond trauma - not just survival, but a good life - a connected, emotionally fulfilling life. Wounded Heroes presents this life changing story of hope," said Dr. Springer.

The Wounded Heroes Documentary will be available for streaming across multiple platforms including Amazon, iTunes, Google, and more starting March 5th, 2021.

longer duration. “In order to mitigate future tragedies like the Camp Fire, the Carr Fire and the Tubbs Fire, just to name a few, we need to accept that fires will happen and prepare ahead of time . . . the fire-prone condition of California’s landscape is a given and so everyone must contribute to creating safer buffers. This falls to government and utilities all the way down to individuals.”

Also included in this exhibit are photos of Shane Grammer murals, painted on chimneys and rock walls left standing after fire destroyed Paradise, California. Grammer will present a Zoom lecture 6-8 p.m., Wednesday, March 3 and Greer a Zoom lecture 6-8 p.m., Tuesday, March 16. To join these lectures register in advance at <https://www.rcmacc.org/exhibits/facing-the-inferno>.

An important event during this exhibit at the MACC is a drive-through Fill the Boot for Burns, 11 a.m. – 4 p.m. Saturday, March 6 and 13. This will benefit the Firefighters Burn Institute, a nonprofit organization started by Fire Captain Cliff Haskell and Sacramento Firefighters Local 522 in 1973. The Institute provides recovery programs for burn survivors as well as burn treatment, rehabilitation, and education. Donations may also be made inside the MACC during open hours.

In addition, the Zintzuni Cocina Mexicana food truck will be in the MACC parking lot 11 a.m.-2 p.m., Saturday, March 6. “This is a great way to celebrate and support a small business,” said MACC curator Cheryl Gleason.

Greer continues to photograph and film fire for the Forest Service and the BLM under federal contracts. “In recent years I have started working as a freelance shooter for large documentary production companies,” Greer said. “They utilize my time in and hard-won understanding of protocol and tactics to get realistic footage.”

Facing the Inferno will be on view at the MACC Thursdays, Fridays, and Saturdays from March 4 through March 20. Hours are 3-8 p.m. on Thursdays and Fridays, and 11 a.m. to 4 p.m. on Saturdays. Admission is free. The MACC is located at 10191 Mills Station Rd., Rancho Cordova. regarding signage, covered windows and the use of a metal front grill door that made the establishment, in her words, look like something that “needs an armed guard.” However, Ghuman said he was agreeable to all the suggestions, and the Administrative Use Permit needed for the store expansion was approved.

Vice Mayor Donald Terry placed the Royal C Store in the larger context of city economic development hoping to give grants and favorable financing to other tobacco and liquor stores thus incentivizing businesses moving on from “vice products” to “serve the community.”

Earlier during the Council meeting, the vice mayor’s birthday was celebrated with a Zoom style rendition of “Happy Birthday”. During the Council Reports from each member, Terry provided information about his recent meetings for the California Air District and that designated days for wood burning were currently set, the Lower American River Conservancy concerning funds and the National League of Cities, and his work with local junior colleges. He also highlighted his upcoming involvement with the Cap-to-Cap Steering Committee in conjunction with city lobbyist Jen Covino on homelessness and affordable housing.

Councilmember David Sander reported on a “lively” Cal City Board meeting he took part in with Governor Gavin Newsom where attendees pressed Newsom on issues concerning Covid-19, affordable housing, homelessness and the remaining closure of schools. Sander said the Governor remarked he was personally committed to elementary schools opening again, but that laid in hands other than his to which Sander attributed to local school districts and teachers unions.

Another memorable recent meeting for Sander was for the National League of Cities with Secretary of Transportation Pete Buttigieg. He rated the positive call as an experience not like anything he’d experienced in his nearly 20 years of leadership due to the new secretary’s desire to fund at the city level as opposed to the state.

Mayor Garret Gatewood talked with new Stockton Mayor Kevin Lincoln who expressed admiration for many of Rancho Cordova’s programs hoping to install them in his own city. Gatewood also spoke

with representatives of Sutter Health who he said “were interested in putting little medical facilities” in the city. He even mentioned there were “whispers” of a possible hospital.

Referred to as a “pet project” by both the Mayor and herself, Councilmember Suri Pulipati discussed the building of a Technology Council and the specific desire to aid women in the technology field providing a “support structure” to balance both work and life.

She also met with Lorianne Ulm of the Community Engagement division and discussed the program’s focus on utilizing the strengths of a community to better Rancho Cordova neighborhoods.

The Japanese Beetle, on the other hand, will find a much less positive end, according to City Manager Cyrus Abhar as it’s been found in areas of the city (Stone Creek and Mather field) and due to its reputation as an invasive pest (both agriculturally and horticulturally) will be eradicated. Several hundred residents have been affected.

City Manager Abhar also addressed an earlier concern by Councilmember Sander who stated Rancho Cordova’s designation as a low opportunity zone could make the acquiring of affordable housing grants tough. The City Manager underlined that wasn’t the only criteria the California Housing Agency uses to allocate funding and that opportunity was strong. He closed his report by mentioning the Measure H/Community Enhancement Fund Application Process was kicking off as well.

Councilmember Linda Budge reminded the Council about the February 25 2021 Business Outlook and Economic Forecast event hosted by the Chamber of Commerce.

She also brought up the availability of learning kits from the Children’s Museum and the Sacramento History Museum noting their cache as a way “to expand your kids’ access to knowledge in a very fun way.”

On a more solemn note, Budge asked if the night’s meeting could adjourn in the memory of recently passed Ed Sarmento, a former County of Sacramento Chief Building Manager, Ken Noack, Sr. an insurance broker and Russ Knauer who converted the Libby Olive Cannery into today’s Nimbus Winery Shopping Mall. ★

Is Buying a Second Home on Your 2021 To-Do List? Surge in Sacramento-Area New Home Sales Were the Highest in 16 Years

Owning a second home can provide retirees – or even younger families – a mountain retreat or a house at the beach for those family vacations or quick week-end getaways.

But if buying a second home is on your list of New Year’s resolutions for 2021, be sure to consider all the upsides and downsides before committing, says Patrick Rush (www.patrickrushtfa.com), CEO of Triad Financial Advisors and the ForbesBooks author of Gain Big and Give Back: Financial Planning with Intention.

“Many retirees end up regretting it,” Rush says. “They feel they are forced to go to that second home every weekend just because they spent so much on it. A vacation property or second home can certainly provide a lot of joy, but it rarely works out financially.” That doesn’t stop people from buying them, though.

The National Association of Home Builders estimates that Americans own about 7.4 million second homes, which is about 5.6 percent of the total housing stock.

“People tend to purchase a second home either as a rental property or a vacation home, which they might also rent for part of the year,” Rush says. “But unless you’re in a hot real estate market, the return on investment usually isn’t worth the hassle. There are better ways of growing your money.”

Rush says a few things to know about investing in a second home include: **Real estate doesn’t automatically mean easy money.** People mistakenly believe real estate provides a guaranteed return, but that’s not always true. Rush recalls one client who, over Rush’s vehement objections, withdrew all of his retirement money to build an expensive second home. The client was certain the house would pay off, but he eventually was forced to sell it for half his investment. **Consider the overall impact on your life.** Most people don’t have endless streams of money, even if they have done well for themselves financially. So, a splurge in one area often requires a sacrifice in another. “If you want the second home, then perhaps an Alaskan cruise

won’t be in the budget,” Rush says. “It comes down to what your priorities are.” **Upkeep can become overwhelming.** People tend to overlook the ancillary costs that make owning a second home expensive, Rush says. Take those into consideration as you make your decision. “Property taxes, homeowners association dues, insurance, and maintenance start to add up,” he says. “Renting the house out when you aren’t using it does provide an income stream, but managing the property and dealing with tenants is a hassle. You can hire a property manager, but that has its own disadvantages.” **Renting can work just as well.** While it might feel exhilarating to own a mountain home in North Carolina or a Pacific Ocean beach house, Rush says another option is simply to rent a place for a week or a weekend whenever you’re in need of a getaway. None of this means a second home is always a mistake, Rush says.

One client whose parents died and left her a generous inheritance wanted to invest the money in a beach home. Rush warned her of the potential pitfalls. She teared up. She agreed it might not be the best financial decision, but when she and her sister were growing up, their parents took them every summer to Sunset Beach on the North Carolina coast. She wanted to continue that tradition for her children, her sister, and her sister’s children.

“It was a reminder that it’s not always about the numbers,” Rush says. “You have to weigh the return on investment against the emotional benefit. Financially, it wasn’t the best choice, but to her, it meant so much more. It was about keeping her parents’ memories alive. Some things truly matter more than money.”

North State Building Association

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - A total of 729 new homes were sold during January in the greater Sacramento region, the highest number since 2005, the North State BIA reported.

Mike LaFortune, senior development director for Easton Development and the BIA’s 2021 Chairman, said January was the eighth month in a row with sales higher than the previous year and shows demand for new homes in the region remains unabated.

“Sacramento-area residents are taking advantage of extremely low interest rates and new home designs that meet the needs for working at home and online learning, and we also continue to see a steady stream of prospective buyers coming from the Bay Area as more companies are committing to allowing

employees to work from home,” LaFortune said. “As more new designs hit the market to meet those needs even better, we expect the strong new home market will continue for some time.”

But while new floorplans are being offered, the number of new homes actually being built remains well below current demand, let alone the number needed to begin attacking the shortfall in new homes that the region has experienced for many years, warned Michael Strech, the BIA’s President & CEO.

“While single-family construction ramped up in December across our region, for the year housing starts were -actually slightly lower than in 2019 with 7,328 permits issued, according to the just-released report from the Construction Industry Research Board. That’s just slightly higher than the number of new homes sold during the

year,” Strech said.

“In the long run, to meet the need for housing and maintain affordability we will need to continue a steady pace of building, which will require cooperation from our local officials to approve new communities and issue building permits. Fortunately, most local officials understand the need for more housing but it’s an issue we will be watching closely in the years to come.”

Prosecutors Feud over Criminal Sentencing Laws

The starkest aspect to California’s evolution from a relatively conservative state into a blue bastion has been an evolving attitude toward crime and punishment.

In the 1980s and 1990s, California became a national leader in increasing penalties for crimes large and small, symbolized by a three-strikes-and-you’re-out law calling for life imprisonment of repeat offenders. Not surprisingly, despite construction of many new prisons, they became horrendously overcrowded with inmates.

However, as California made its almost 180-degree political turn to the left over the last couple of decades, attitudes about crime also evolved, culminating in legislative acts, ballot measures and administrative policies that repealed or softened the state’s sentencing laws. The number of felons locked up in state prisons has dropped by at least one-third in recent years.

That said, what supporters call “criminal justice reform” is not universally accepted. Some law enforcement officials believe it’s gone too far and has contributed to recent upticks in violent crime — a conflict now rippling through the state’s local district attorneys.

In 2020, George Gascón,

who had been district attorney of San Francisco, challenged and defeated Los Angeles District Attorney Jackie Lacey and immediately issued new operational rules that downplayed punishment.

He prohibited his deputies from seeking the death penalty, prosecuting juveniles as adults, attending parole hearings or seeking “enhancements” that increase a defendant’s prison term. The union representing those deputies sued, alleging that Gascón was ordering them to violate criminal laws, and won an initial judgement.

What really blew up the conflict politically was support from the California District Attorneys Association (CDAA) for the union position. In its supporting brief, the District Attorneys said Gascón’s orders meant that “the voices of victims fall silent and the might of the state has failed its most vulnerable.”

Last week, Gascón resigned from the organization with a two-page letter that he posted on Twitter, accusing the association of being racially insensitive, closed-minded about criminal justice reform and even corrupt.

“CDAA continues to be a member organization solely for those willing to toe the ‘tough on crime’ line,” Gascón wrote. “For the rest of us, it is a place that fails to support us, our communities, or the pursuit of justice.”

Gascón and several other like-minded district attorneys have founded their own group, the Prosecutors Alliance of California, to push for criminal justice reforms. It includes Gascón, San Joaquin County’s Tori

Salazar, Chesa Boudin of San Francisco and Contra Costa County’s Diana Becton.

Gascón’s election and the burgeoning conflict with more traditional prosecutors is part of a larger phenomenon — a nationwide effort by left-of-center organizations to change criminal justice policies one election at a time.

Billionaire businessman George Soros is a major figure in the campaign, having donated millions of dollars to reform-minded candidates. The movement has scored some victories, such as Gascón’s election, and also suffered some losses, such as a failed challenge to Sacramento County District Attorney Anne Marie Schubert.

The conflict also colors Gov. Gavin Newsom’s selection of a replacement for Attorney General Xavier Becerra if he is confirmed as the federal health and human services secretary.

Newsom seemingly supports the criminal justice reform movement. He sponsored a ballot measure to make marijuana legal, has sped up reductions in prison populations and declared a moratorium on executions.

He could appoint a new Attorney General sympathetic to the Gascón-led faction, such as Oakland Assemblyman Rob Bonta, but such a move would carry some political risk. Were Newsom to face a recall election this year, as seems likely, opposition from police and prosecutors could be a critical factor.

One of the most innovative grant programs, initiated by the City of Rancho Cordova, was the Folsom Lake College/ Rancho Cordova College Promise program which started in the 2017-18 academic years. It began with a \$100,000.00 grant, and it has been increased to \$150,000.00. I think it was one of the best uses for our Community Enhancement Funds, and it has given many students from Cordova the ability to go to college. They wouldn’t have been able to do that otherwise. The State has, since we began, given funds which pay for the fees and other costs that were initially paid for by the Promise Program, but that money is now being used for books, and lab fees, etc.

I had an opportunity to talk to FLC President Whitney Yamamura about our campus in Rancho Cordova. He said there is enough money left in the initial local school bond money, and that there is enough proven need for education that the other ½ of the cost will come from the state. That will then build the second building (phase 2) on the Rancho

Cordova campus. The engineers and planners are working on blueprints now. The groundbreaking ceremony is to be done next year (2022), and the ceremony to open and use the new building will be done in 2024. That will be a great addition to our campus. The President said that in the future as the students increase in numbers, another bond would need to be passed. That will be in the future though, so that is something that will have to be looked at then, not now.

The Folsom Lake College and the Los Rios Community College District are talking about how and when the students will be going back to classes. That of course will be when the COVID-19 is under control and everyone is able to get back to our usual lives.

One more thing, I talked to my brother in Indiana and he said that their high temperature hasn’t gone over 20 degrees for over a week. That is quite a blow to have the temperature, and snow, and ice, etc in addition to the COVID-19. We are hoping that all of the difficulties across the country can clear up very soon.

largest using the debt snowball method. Then, Baby Step 3 is where you go back and grow your emergency fund to a full three to six months of living expenses.

With all this in mind, let’s call getting ready to buy a home Baby Step 3b. Save up for a down payment of at least 20 percent to avoid PMI (private mortgage insurance). Also, make sure any mortgage loan is a 15-year, fixed rate loan, where the payments are no more than 25 percent of your monthly take-home pay.

Doing it this way may delay your dream of being a homeowner for a while, but it will help ensure your new home is a blessing and not a financial curse!

How far in advance do you recommend figuring future purchases into your budget? – Robbie

Dear Robbie,

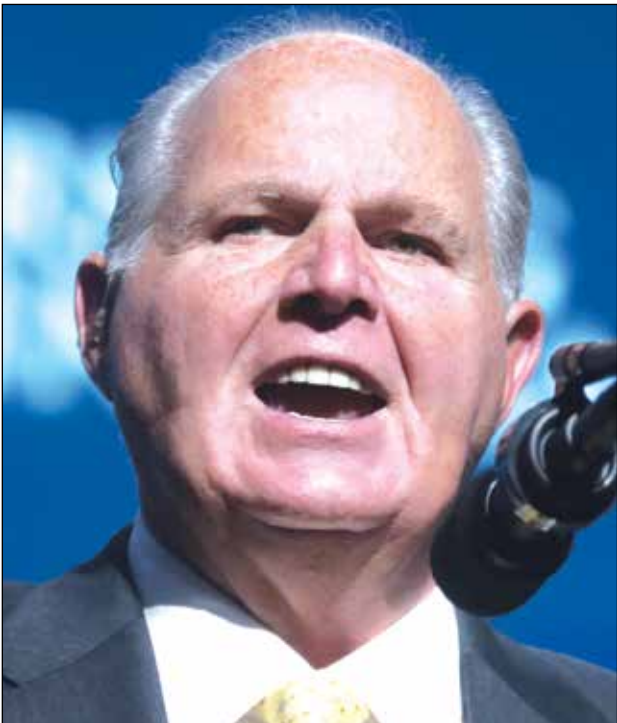
That voice was the voice of Rush Limbaugh.

Planning to Travel Internationally?

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - If you are planning to travel internationally please be aware beginning Jan. 26 changes will be made to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) (CDC) travel mandates.

Effective January 26, 2021 the CDC will require all international air passengers entering the United States (including U.S. citizens and Legal Permanent Residents) to present a negative COVID-19 test, taken within three calendar days of departure, or proof of recovery from the virus within the last 90 days. Airlines must confirm the negative test result or proof of recent recovery for all passengers prior to boarding. Airlines must deny boarding of passengers who do not provide documentation of a negative test or recovery.

Alaska, American, jetBlue, Southwest, Aeromexico and Volaris offer nonstop flights between SMF and destinations throughout Mexico. Please visit our website or contact the airlines for more information about flights <https://sacramento.aero/smf/flight-and-travel/airlines>.

Passengers are required to wear a face coverings and social distance whenever possible throughout their journey.
