RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - The Cordova Recreation & Park District is honored to be selected by Government Technology Magazine Special District's Program for a Technology Innovation Award for the work done on the Cordova Community Pool Virtual Groundbreaking and Public Outreach Campaign.

The Technology Innovation Award recognizes agencies that use innovation in technology to improve communication with the public they serve. An important piece

of the pool outreach was a virtual groundbreaking video. Because of the COVID pandemic, the making of the video required all of project parties to collaborate so that each official and staff member could be individually filmed participating in the groundbreaking. The District has been regularly documenting the construction process through drone videos. A video of the construction progress can be found on our website at crpd.com.

The Cordova Community Pool Project is a collaboration between the Cordova Recreation & Park District, City of Rancho Cordova (one of the project funders),

Reducing African American Child Deaths the Goal

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Sacramento County continues to see dramatic results in the community-wide effort to reduce African American child deaths. In a recent report compiled by Applied Survey Research (ASR), the results for FY 2019-20 show progress in addressing the long-standing issue of African American children dying at twice the rate of children of other races. The top four causes of the disparity in preventable child deaths are perinatal conditions, infant sleep-related deaths, child abuse and neglect homicides, and third-party homicide.

Using Child Death Review Team and Public Health data, the following decreases in the rate of African American child deaths and changes in disparity compared to other races was determined. When comparing 2012-14 to 2016-18, for African Americans in Sacramento County there was a: 19 percent reduction in infant death rate and a 33 percent reduction in disparity; 51 percent reduction in infant sleep-related death rate and a 58 percent reduction in disparity; 88 percent reduction in the rate for child abuse and neglect homicides for children ages 0-17 and a 95 percent reduction in disparity.

"Our community began this critical work with the goal of reducing African American child deaths 10-20 percent by 2020. Data through 2018 indicate that due to thoughtful, community-led partnerships, programs and interventions, we have hit the lofty mark we set, and in fact, when it comes to specific types of child death, we've far exceeded our goal" said Phil Serna, Chair of the County Board of Supervisors and First 5 Sacramento Commission. "Now, however, is not the time for complacency, but it is time to double-down and build on the progress we've made, especially given the uncertainty the pandemic presents, including the myriad associated increases in violence, mental health needs and pronounced racial inequities. It is more important than ever to support African American families and invest in the health and safety of our youngest residents, and that's exactly what I and others will continue to forcefully advocate."

COVID-19 Vaccines Arrive at Mercy San Juan

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - The 2020 year came to a close with news that the long awaited COVID-19 vaccine has now begun to be administered in hospitals in the Greater Sacramento area. Dignity Health Mercy San Juan Medical Center in Carmichael was among six Dignity Health hospitals receiving its first shipment of the first FDA approved emergency COVID-19 vaccine on Thursday, December 18.

External Communications Manager for Dignity Health Greater Sacramento Division, Yessenia Anderson, said, "Today marks a moment for the history books... This is a huge step forward in the battle against COVID-19."

In order to receive the Pfizer BioNTech COVID-19 vaccine, the hospital prepared by acquiring equipment for

cold temperature storage and developing all the safety processes to be implemented.

As part of a pilot vaccination program for the

respiratory illness, the hospital began administering the first round of vaccinations to 29 critical health care workers who volunteered on Friday,

December 19.

Mercy San Juan Medical Center president Michael Korpiel said, "Our care team members... have answered the call of duty and beyond during this pandemic, and I am thankful to now be able to offer them an added layer of protection as they carry out their crucial life-saving work."

"While there are always unknowns when a new vaccine is developed..." Korpiel said, "Safety is our priority, and we only administer vaccines that are proven safe and effective."

Hospitals such as Mercy San Juan, Anderson said, "are expect[ed] to receive more doses of the vaccine every week, so the number of people who can get the vaccine will increase exponentially very quickly."

Home is Where You Make It, a Re-Housing Success

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Rising rents, increased cost of living and a shortage of affordable housing – among other factors – have caused homelessness to increase across California communities, including Sacramento. For people already living paycheck-to-paycheck, a rent increase threatens housing stability. Victoria Deal, who relies on disability and Social Security, was evicted and found herself homeless.

“I had nowhere to go ... I was sleeping on my daughter’s couch, in my car, here, there and everywhere. So I called my navigator at Sacramento Self-Help Housing (SSHH) and I told her about my situation and my health problems,” said Deal. “I have a lot of health issues already and I can’t deal with people getting COVID-19

and being (unhoused). So they helped me.”

The organization Deal reached out to – Sacramento Self-Help Housing – is one of several nonprofits working with the County of Sacramento to alleviate homelessness. Funded through the county’s Full Service Rehousing Shelter Program (also known as the Scattered Site Shelter Program), SSHH master-leases 23 multi-bedroom homes throughout the county and provides small-group housing settings, as opposed to large congregate shelters.

“The goal is obviously not only to get people off the streets and under a roof, but we do it in such a way that integrates them back into a healthy living situation,” said Janna Haynes, public information officer with Sacramento County Department of Human Assistance. “Our goal is to identify what it is that’s keeping them in homelessness

and how we can help them overcome those challenges so they can stand on their own two feet. And it’s different for people; it’s not always mental health or drug addiction. Sometimes it’s something as simple as help with a deposit.”

Deal, who lives with multiple physical and mental health conditions, was able to move into one of SSHH’s homes where they helped with all basic living expenses such as food and utilities. That allowed her to pay off debts, including back rent related to her eviction. With help from her case manager and housing coordinator, she was able to find permanent housing after four months. When she moved into her apartment in September 2020, County Full-Service Rehousing Shelter Program also helped with moving costs, the rental deposit and helped furnish her home with some basic furniture.

“I didn’t know of any other way in the world that I would be able to do it with my income,” Deal said. “I am thankful because they help me keep my stability, my mental stability and they helped me keep my possessions together. I’ve worked a long hard way to get to where I am today. They help me maintain that and my dignity.”

Uplifting Others - Employee Spotlight

Julie Field has dedicated her career to helping individuals and families in her community. Since 2015, she has served as the Sacramento County Department of Human Assistance Homeless Services Program Manager, designing and administering programs that support positive outcomes for persons experiencing homelessness. These services include outreach and crisis response, emergency shelter and rehousing programs, all geared to transition people into

stable housing.

In her role, she has witnessed people overcome great challenges to lift themselves up and out of homelessness.

“It always starts and ends with the person; you, as a provider, can only do so much,” said Field.

The gains may be incremental and seem insignificant to the scale of the issue, but to Field and the people she works to support, every win is a huge win.

“When I first began my work in this role, the answer to homelessness always sounded so simple to me; you connect a person to a home,” she said. “What I learned is that the journey to housing is where the complexities and hard work lie, and getting to that destination is nothing short of amazing and inspiring.”

Status of Women and Girls Approved Reducing African American Child Deaths the Goal

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - By a unanimous vote, the Sacramento County Board of Supervisors approved establishment of a Sacramento County Commission on the Status of Women and Girls. The advisory council will help shape policy decisions that impact women and girls; act as a resource to advance economic opportunities for women and girls; and gather data on the status of women and girls, among other duties.

In July 2019 a Blue Ribbon Commission (BRC) on the Establishment of

a Sacramento County Women's Commission was initiated by First District Supervisor Phil Serna and approved the Board of Supervisors. The group's mandate was to research the merits of a Sacramento County Women's Commission by which the Board of Supervisors and public could better understand issues, opportunities and challenges unique to women in Sacramento County.

The group presented their recommendations before the Board of Supervisors on Dec. 8. The resolution was approved today.

"The establishment of this Commission on the Status

of Women and Girls is long overdue for Sacramento County, and that's why I proposed the formation of a Blue Ribbon Commission last year to explore the prospect of a permanent commission," said Board Chair and First District Supervisor Phil Serna. "I'm confident this commission is going to do great work, and I want to thank all the members of the BRC for their work in providing an outstanding report and their public outreach efforts."

The Sacramento County Commission of the Status of Women joins 26 other California city and county commissions dedicated to gender equity. ★

Aerojet to be Acquired by Lockheed Martin for \$5 Billion

EL SEGUNDO, CA (MPG) - Aerojet Rocketdyne Holdings, Inc. (NYSE: AJRD) announced that it has entered into a definitive agreement to be acquired by Lockheed Martin Corporation (NYSE: LMT) in an all-cash transaction with a total equity value of \$5.0 billion.

Under the terms of the agreement, which has been unanimously approved by each company's Board of Directors, Lockheed Martin will acquire Aerojet Rocketdyne for \$56.00 per share in cash, representing a premium of approximately 33% to Aerojet Rocketdyne's closing stock price on December 18, 2020 and a premium of approximately 42% to the Company's volume weighted average stock price ("VWAP") for the last 90 trading days.

As part of the transaction, Aerojet Rocketdyne declared a \$5 per share pre-closing special dividend

to holders of its common shares and convertible senior notes, on an as-converted basis. The special dividend will be paid on March 24, 2021, to holders of record as of March 10, 2021. The payment of this special dividend, unless revoked, will adjust the consideration to be paid by Lockheed Martin to \$51 per share at closing.

"We are pleased to bring together our complementary companies in a transformative transaction that will provide premium cash value for our shareholders and tremendous benefits for our employees, customers and partners," said Eileen P. Drake, CEO and President of Aerojet Rocketdyne. "Joining Lockheed Martin is a testament to the world-class organization and team we've built and represents a natural next phase of our evolution. As part of Lockheed Martin, we will bring our advanced technologies together with their substantial expertise and resources to

accelerate our shared purpose: enabling the defense of our nation and space exploration. On behalf of the Aerojet Rocketdyne Board and management team, I'd like to thank all of our employees for their unwavering dedication and focus in helping us achieve this great milestone."

The transaction is expected to close in the second half of 2021 and is subject to the satisfaction of customary closing conditions, including regulatory approvals and approval by Aerojet Rocketdyne's stockholders. A transition team will be formed to allow for a seamless integration and ensure continuity for customers, employees and other stakeholders.

Citigroup Global Markets Inc. and Evercore were co-lead financial advisors to Aerojet Rocketdyne. Jenner & Block LLP acted as M&A counsel and Gibson, Dunn & Crutcher LLP acted as Securities counsel. ★

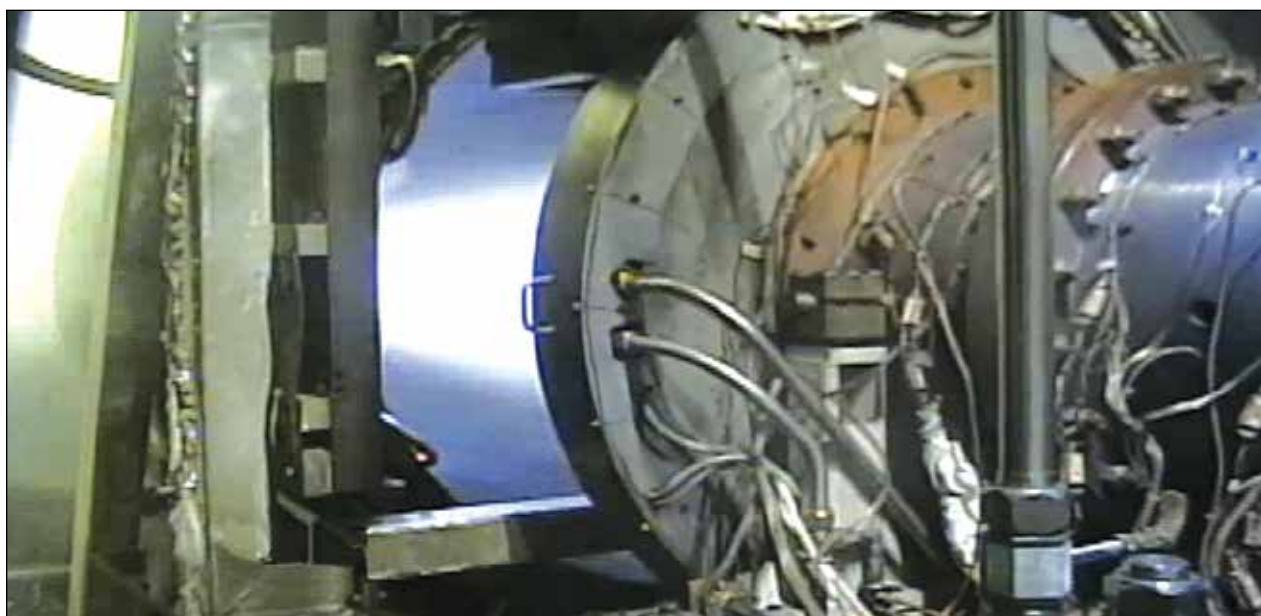

Another Aerojet Rocketdyne Hypersonic Engine Makes History

HUNTSVILLE, AL (MPG) - Aerojet Rocketdyne and the Air Force Research Laboratory (AFRL) have achieved record levels of thrust by a scramjet engine 10 years after making history by powering the first hydrocarbon-fueled and cooled air-breathing hypersonic flight test. The AFRL-Aerojet Rocketdyne team recently completed a successful series of hot-fire tests of an advanced air-breathing hypersonic engine under the United States Air Force's Medium Scale Critical Components (MSCC) program.

"Our scramjet engine powered the United States Air Force X-51A Waverider when it made history in 2010 by completing the longest air-breathing hypersonic flight ever and we continue to propel the technology," said Eileen P. Drake, Aerojet Rocketdyne CEO and president. "Our Generation-3 scramjet delivers increased performance and affordability because of our significant investments in our skilled workforce, advanced technologies and innovative manufacturing processes."

The 18-foot Aerojet Rocketdyne scramjet engine produced record levels of thrust, in excess of 13,000 lbs. The testing occurred over 12 months

with more than an hour of sustained combustion at several hypersonic flight conditions. Tests were conducted across a range of Mach numbers demonstrating performance to accelerate a vehicle approximately 10 times the size of the X-51, at hypersonic speeds.

"Aerojet Rocketdyne successfully demonstrated the scalability of their air-breathing scramjet engine, proving its applicability to platforms ranging from missiles to high speed aircraft," said AFRL Program Manager Paul Kennedy. "Years of preparation paid off as the completion of the MSCC test program sets the foundation for design of hypersonic propulsion systems across a broad range of vehicle scale and Mach operability."

Testing was accomplished by the ground test team operating the Arnold Engineering Development Complex (AEDC) Aerodynamic and Propulsion Test Unit (APTU) at Arnold Air Force Base.

"AEDC and the APTU facility have been proud to partner on this challenging and rewarding test program. The test team has worked through COVID-19 restraints, shared base resources and hardware limitations to make the test successful," said Kirk Butler, director of Operations for the AEDC's Hypersonic Systems Test Branch and

Ground Test Team Section Lead. "The knowledge gained from this testing will be studied for years and will drive future designs."

Aerojet Rocketdyne has continued to improve the aerothermal performance, affordability, scalability and rapid manufacturability of scramjet engines to meet emerging needs. The company's innovative design incorporates numerous advanced technologies and manufacturing materials and processes. With ongoing investments in facility modernization, retention of highly-skilled personnel, and decades of expertise in scramjets, solid rocket motors and warheads, the company is well-positioned to meet a range of defense operational requirements.

County Appoints Acting Director of Health Services

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - The County has appointed Jim Hunt as Acting Director of the Department of Health Services. His appointment is effective Monday, Dec. 21.

Hunt has extensive experience with Sacramento County. He was the Director of Health and Human Services from 1997-2006 and was Deputy Administrator for what is now the Social Services Agency (the agency that oversees Health Services), from 2006-07. Prior to that, he was the Chief of Administration and Deputy Director for Health Services from 1992-97, Workers' Compensation Manager from 1991-92, and served in a series of increasingly responsible positions with the County from 1973-91.

"Jim is extremely familiar with the importance and operation of

the programs and services provided by Health Services, and has a strong background in the administration of the department, including management of fiscal, budgetary, contract, personnel and other administrative services," said Bruce Wagstaff, Deputy County Executive for Social Services. "Jim's experience will allow him to transition into the role and seamlessly continue the department's operations."

While Hunt was the Director of Health and Human Services, he oversaw Child Protective Services, Mental Health Services, Alcohol and Drug Services, Services for Seniors and Dependent Adults, Public Health and Primary Health Services. He also directly supervised the Public Health Officer and eight managers.

Hunt will serve in the Acting Director of Health Services role while the County conducts a nationwide search for the permanent position. ★

Changing Election Rules Alters Outcomes

Periodically, owners of major league sports teams change game rules and in doing so they inevitably affect the games' outcomes, purposely or not.

Politics are no different. Changing the rules of campaigning, voting and other political procedures affects election results.

We saw an example of that adage this year. Loosening voter registration requirements, allowing or disallowing ballot harvesting and, in some states, shifting from in-person voting to vote-by-mail affected voter turnout, altered the composition of the electorate and thus ultimately had an effect on what or who won or lost.

Obviously, writers of rules – federal and state legislators, mostly – have a motive in changing them to benefit themselves, their parties and their allied interest groups.

That's why, for instance, the national Democratic Party poured untold millions of dollars into state legislative campaigns. The campaign's avowed goal was altering the partisan balance of statehouses, now mostly Republican, to affect how congressional districts are redrawn after the

2020 census, but it largely failed.

Two constitutional amendments introduced in the California Legislature's newly convened session attest to the continuing desire of politicians to change political rules and thus outcomes.

Senate Constitutional Amendment 1, submitted by Sen. Bob Hertzberg, a Democrat from Van Nuys, would flip how referenda – measures to overturn laws passed by the Legislature – are submitted to voters.

Currently, an interest group opposed to a new law can challenge it by collecting enough signatures to place a referendum on the ballot. Voters are then asked to either validate the new law by voting "yes" or repeal it by voting "no."

Hertzberg wants a "yes" vote to repeal the new law and a "no" vote to keep the new law in place.

Is the current procedure a little confusing? Yes, particularly since the referendum process is only occasionally used. But it's doubtful that SCA 1's change would be less confusing.

Hertzberg apparently believes that the change would decrease the chances of a successful referendum because if voters are somewhat undecided or confused about the underlying issue, they are more likely to vote "no."

He introduced SCA 1 a month after his landmark law abolishing cash bail for criminal defendants was overturned by a referendum, Proposition 25, sponsored by the bail

bond industry. Voters marked nearly 55% of their ballots "no" on Hertzberg's bail bill.

Proposition 25 is widely seen as a template for other referenda by business groups adversely affected by laws passed by a liberal Legislature.

Senate Constitutional Amendment 3, offered by Sen. Ben Allen, a Redondo Beach Democrat, would make a huge change in recall elections.

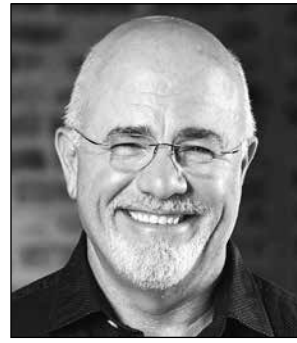
Currently, when enough signatures are collected to seek the recall of an elected official, such as then-Gov. Gray Davis in 2003, the issue is placed before voters in two simultaneous ballot measures. One is on the recall itself and the second is to elect someone to replace the ousted officeholder if the recall is successful.

With 135 candidates on the second ballot, action movie star Arnold Schwarzenegger succeeded Davis with about 48% of the vote.

SCA 3 would place the targeted officeholder on the same ballot as the challengers, meaning the incumbent could stay in office with a plurality of the vote instead of the harder-to-achieve majority vote currently required for the recall ballot.

When you change political rules, you likely change the outcome of the political game, just as in football or baseball.

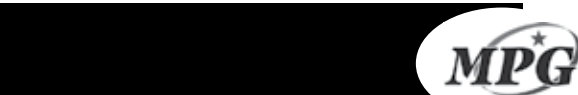

SMUD Extends Suspension of Power Shutoffs for Non-Payment

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - In response to the COVID-19 pandemic and growing economic challenges, SMUD announced it will extend the suspension of disconnecting power due to non-payment for residential and commercial customers through April 30, 2021, at the earliest.

California Proposition 25 Defeated

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Grassroots political organization National Police Support Fund partnered with local organizations to oppose California Proposition 25 that was ultimately defeated by voters on Election Day.

Proposition 25 would have upheld California Senate Bill 10 passed by the state legislature in 2019 that would replace cash bail for some criminal offenses with a risk assessment system. National Police Support Fund opposed this measure because repealing cash bail laws would only encourage and allow criminals to reoffend. This poses a danger to both communities and police officers, and by eliminating cash bail as proposed in this measure- we are allowing criminals to continue to wreak havoc with little to

no consequences.

National Police Support Fund works across the country to support and defend police offices within the political process. During this critical election year, the organization focused on state measures that would have direct impacts on law enforcement, including California proposition 25. The mission of National Police Support Fund is to "provide a united voice for true Americans who support our nation's law enforcement officers. We strive to engage the public through political grassroots activity to support political interests that promote officer's interests. We're working to defeat anti-police sentiment and bring honor and respect back to the policing profession."

Healthy Communities Resolution Adopted by Growing Number of Counties

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - A growing number of counties have passed the Healthy Communities Resolution – a product of a collaborative meeting of 15 Northern California counties earlier this year – rejecting Governor Newsom's Blueprint for a Safe Economy as unscientific and counterproductive. The Healthy Communities Resolution was drafted by Assemblymembers James Gallagher, Kevin Kiley and Megan Dahle, and Senators Brian Dahle and Jim Nielsen. Today, these Legislators released the following statement:

"We are encouraged to see different counties pass variations of the Resolution that are right for them. The consensus emerging across the state is that lockdowns from Sacramento cannot stay with us in the new year. California must take a different approach to the final phase of its COVID-19 response." ★

Sac State Prepares for Vaccines

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Following several months of practice runs dispensing flu vaccine, Sacramento State is in line to deliver COVID-19 vaccinations, when the medicine becomes available.

The University is one of several local sites Sacramento County Public Health is considering

as a Medical Point of Dispensing (MPOD) for the COVID-19 vaccine.

MPODs are pop-up clinics in locations across the region designed to distribute the vaccine to large numbers of people.

If Sacramento State is selected, the vaccine will be available to students, faculty, staff, their family members, and possibly the public.

The University has used the MPOD model three

times during the Fall 2020 semester, dispensing flu vaccinations and using the experience to prepare for COVID-19 vaccine distribution.

Nursing students administered flu shots for more than 200 campus community members during the previous MPODs and vaccinated hundreds more during walk-in flu clinics on campus.

There is no timeline or final decision at this point.★

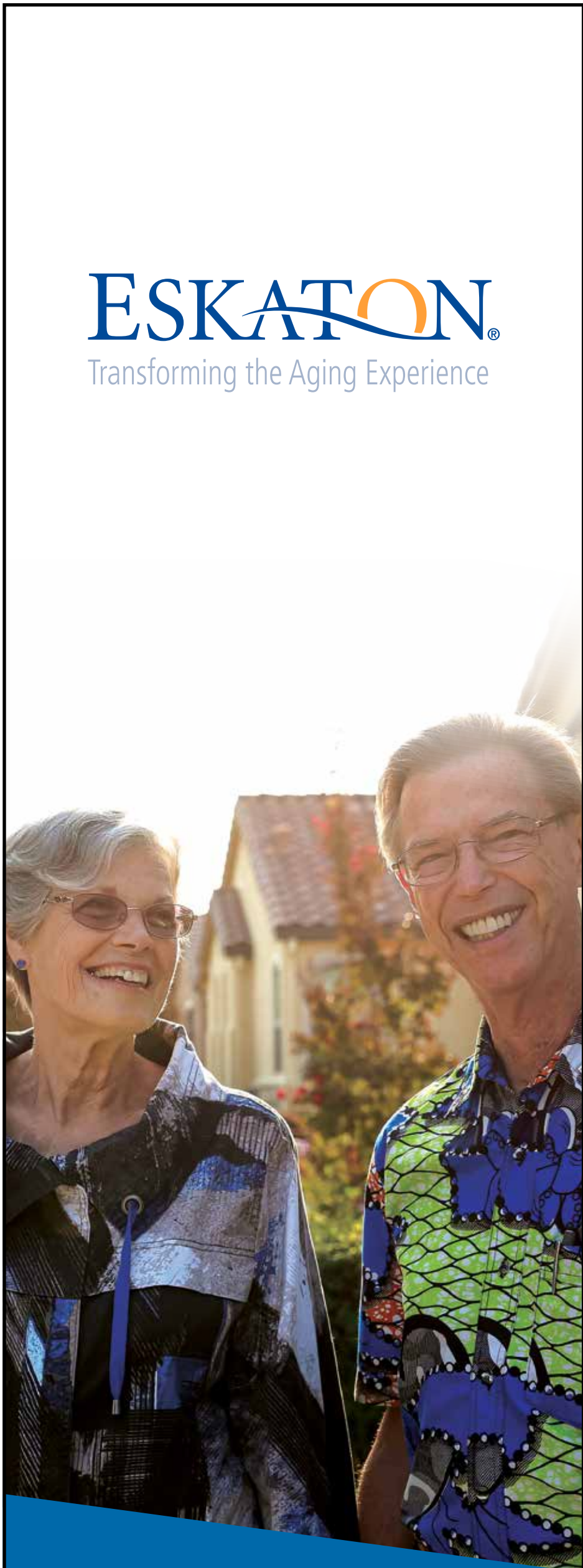

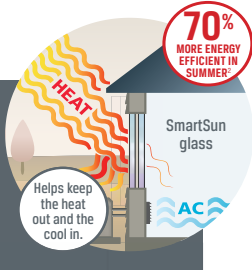

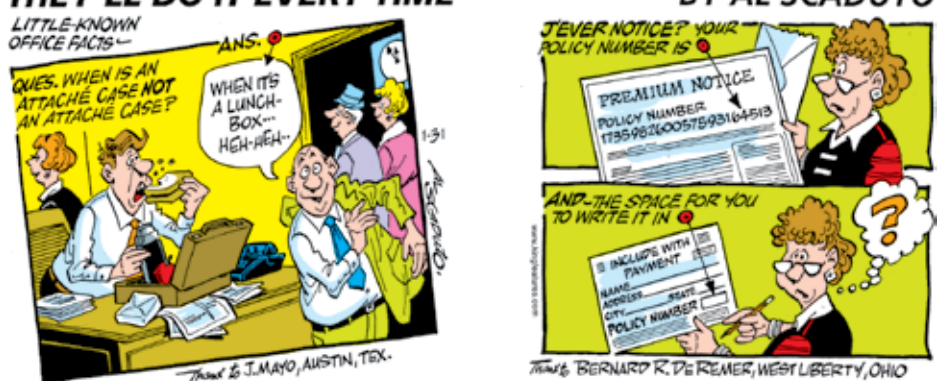
