**RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG)** - Rain distinguished the December 11 opening of the Rancho Cordova Holiday Lights drive-thru experience. Guests were safely dry in their cars, but volunteers were out in the open. Shelly Blanchard, Cordova Community Council executive director, and numerous volunteers greeted and directed hundreds of individual visitors.

"They were all ages, many with carloads of little children," Blanchard said. Some kids popped their heads out of the sunroof, rain pounding down on their heads, giggling and waving their souvenir tree wands. Others included masked middle-aged

children with their elderly parents. "I met families who had come from as far away as Vacaville, Stockton and Marysville, and saw many Rancho Cordova friends and neighbors," Blanchard said. "It may not be the holidays we all had been hoping for, but for me, it felt like Christmas."

The display required more than 600 plug-ins to engineer and thousands of feet of electrical cords. "There's been so much we couldn't do this year, that we wanted to end with a bang," Blanchard said. "I started and then the rest of the team made it better, as is usually the case." Blanchard's "team" consisted of Melody Granger-Mayer, Marie Beckstaiger, Cheryl Gleason, and Lydia Bredin. Other volunteers assisted.

Santa Claus, aka a former Rancho Cordovan of the Year Wayne Harmer, said "I see the cars when they come by, I got a good spot. I talk to the kids maybe 15-20 seconds so I don't hold up traffic, and I wish them a Merry Christmas and they drive on through the rest of the lights." No sitting on Santa's knee this year. Harmer is well known for his help and love for Rancho Cordova events.

Volunteers directed traffic and took tickets and everything was built by volunteers. "It was very impressive, nice to see families going through together," said volunteer Kevin Sims, a teacher at Cordova High School. He was there on December 11, when it rained. "I was wet, yes," Sims

## A Deck with a View

**SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)** - Thirty feet above the shoreline near Nimbus Dam, a new lookout allows stunning observation of one of the American River's most bio-diverse hotspots.

Completed just in time for the 2020 salmon run, the cantilevered deck is an amenity offered by the Department of Fish and Wildlife. Construction was undertaken by Orangevale-based Swierstok Enterprises.

The structure is designed to accommodate nature lovers and school-room-sized groups on educational visits. Rails are safety features; the amenity is ADA compliant and will soon also offer bench seats and educational panel displays.

"This is something

we've wanted at the hatchery for years," enthuses interpretative specialist Jason Fareira. "At last, we have a bird's-eye view of these shallows, so students can really see what

goes on with salmon and other wildlife. We also hope that fewer people will want to climb down banks now; we're always concerned for their safety, and for bank erosion and dirt

being dislodged to damage fish eggs." The deck overlooks active Chinook nesting areas in shallows where salmon – some close to four feet in length – use

## Greater Sac in Regional Stay Home Order

**Sacramento County  
Public Information Office**

**SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG)** - The State of California announced that the Greater Sacramento region has met the ICU availability criteria of 15 percent or less to trigger the State's Regional Stay at Home Order. Once triggered, the Thursday, Dec. 10, order will remain in effect for at least three weeks.

In alignment with the Regional Stay At Home Order, Sacramento County residents are required to stay at home as much as possible and minimize mixing with other households in order to slow the surge in cases and hospitalizations to help prevent overwhelming regional ICU capacity.

The following sectors must close all operations until further notice:

Amusements  
parks; Bars, breweries, distilleries, and wineries; Cardrooms and satellite wagering; Family Entertainment Centers (e.g. arcades, batting cages, bowling alleys, and kart racing); Hair salons and barbershops; Indoor playgrounds; Live audience sports; Museums, zoos, and aquariums; Personal care services (e.g. body piercing, body waxing, estheticians, massage therapy, nail salons, and tattoo)

In alignment with the Regional Stay At Home Order, the following sectors are permitted for OUTDOOR operations only until further notice. These sectors must still maintain mitigation measures (social distancing, face coverings, and sanitization) and specific modifications in parenthesis below:

Drive-in movie theaters (maximum 25% capacity or 100 people, whichever is fewer); Gyms and fitness centers; Places of worship (maximum 25% capacity or 100 people, whichever is fewer); Recreational facilities (e.g. athletic fields, playgrounds, tennis courts, golf courses, skate parks, etc.; onsite sales or consumption of food or beverages is prohibited)

In alignment with the Regional Stay At Home Order, the following sectors are permitted for INDOOR operations. These sectors must still maintain mitigation measures (social distancing, face coverings, and sanitization) and specific modifications in parenthesis below:

All retail (maximum 20% capacity); Standalone

*Continued from page 1* end-of-life energy to leap and “walk” over riffles with bodies above water. After spawning, females hover to guard deposited eggs.

Other adults continue their mission to find mates, by climbing the hatchery’s fish ladder. At its apex, salmon and steelhead are relieved of eggs and milt so fertilization is achieved artificially. The hatchery assures migratory fish survival, in mitigation for river alterations caused by Nimbus and Folsom dams. Fry begin lifecycles – heading downstream for the Pacific Ocean – in spring of 2021.

From the new lookout, viewers can also observe a multitude of wildlife that follows fish upstream. Turkey vultures, bald eagles and gulls make meals of decaying salmon carcasses.

Ducks and wading birds dive for salmon eggs. Otter, coyote, bobcats – even the occasional sea lion from the delta – join the winter rush to gorge at the river’s buffet.

The new viewing deck is located opposite Sailor Bar in Gold River. It may be accessed from the Hatchery entrance at 2001 Nimbus Road (off Gold Country Boulevard), Gold River. For

# SacRT: Mask, Face Covering Mandatory

**SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)** - With the recent announcement of the Regional Stay Home Order for the Greater Sacramento region, the Sacramento Regional Transit District (SacRT) is requiring anyone waiting at a station or transit center, riding transit (bus, light rail, SmaRT Ride, SacRT GO, Folsom Stage Line, Causeway Connection, Jibe Express, or Rancho Cordovan), or visiting the SacRT Customer Service and Sales Center located at 1225 R Street, to wear a mask or face covering beginning the start of service on Friday, December 11, 2020. In coordination, the Yolo County Transportation District (Yolobus) will also begin the No Mask, No Ride, No Exceptions policy on Friday.

SacRT takes the health and safety of our riders and employees very seriously. With the increase in cases of COVID-19, SacRT is taking stricter measures to slow the spread of

COVID-19. The new “no mask, no ride, no exception” policy will be in place until at least December 31, 2020.

The new policy will not allow for any exceptions and follows the U.S. Equal Employment Opportunity Commission’s guidance on “direct threat” criteria of the ADA Reasonable Modifications. In addition, the new policy requires anyone age two and older boarding SacRT vehicles to wear a mask or face covering while riding transit. Bus and light rail operators, as well as other SacRT employees will continue to be required to wear a mask or face covering while in the workplace.

Types of face coverings can include a paper or disposable mask, a cloth mask, a neck gaiter, a scarf, a bandanna, or a religious face covering. A face covering must cover the nose and mouth completely.

# Recycling Competition Awards \$140,000 to California Schools

**SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)** - Keep California Beautiful was joined by representatives from the California Department of Resources for Recycling and Recovery (CalRecycle), the California Department of Transportation (Caltrans), and the American Chemistry Council to announce the results of the 2020 K–12 Recycling Challenge and the changes to the contest for 2021.

“We are fortunate to have support from a wide variety of industries and state organizations to continue educating, engaging and encouraging California students to recognize the value of recycling,” said Ray Scott, Keep California Beautiful Board President.

The K-12 Recycling Challenge is the only school program in the state promoting California’s diversion rate goals through collaborative efforts including industry, state agencies, non-government organizations, public and private schools, and waste haulers. The annual competition is endorsed by CalRecycle and is supported by corporate donations from a wide variety of industries including the American Chemistry Council, American Beverage Association, the Carton

Council, Dart, Pepsi, Metropolitan Recycling, LLC. and others.

Since its inception in 2015, the K-12 Recycling Challenge has awarded more than \$140,000 to winning schools across the state and helped divert more than 7.7 million pounds of recyclable material from California’s landfills.

“We know that teaching the value of recycling at an early age works, and we recognize the benefit these habits will have in the long term,” said Lindsay Stovall, American Chemistry Council Director of State and Regulatory Affairs. “It is a privilege to partner with Keep California Beautiful to support this important recycling competition.”

“Thanks to Keep California Beautiful and its ‘K-12 Recycling Challenge,’ millions of California students have recycled more than 7 million tons of material,” said Ken DaRosa, acting Director for CalRecycle. “That’s millions of tons of metal, glass, paper and plastic kept out of our landfills and off of our streets.”

In addition to the annual recycling competition, Keep California Beautiful has received the support of CalRecycle and Caltrans on other events, including the Great American Cleanup which takes place

every Spring.

“Caltrans collects nearly 300,000 cubic yards of litter a year from the state’s highways—enough to fill 18,000 garbage trucks,” said Caltrans Director Toks Omishakin. “California needs the public’s help to keep our highways and the environment free of litter and safe for all Californians.”

While the competition will feature three new components in 2021, KCB and its partners are looking forward to continuing to promote education and awareness about recycling in communities across the state.

Since 1991, KCB and its partner programs have sponsored over 14,372 events involving over 855,958 volunteers, and have collected over 26,238,000 pounds of litter and trash from California’s highways, public lands, waterways and beaches. ★

# CHP Focused on Eliminating Distracted Driving

**SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)** - Distracted driving can be a life-changing choice resulting in crashes and the deaths of thousands of people every year in the United States. Driven to make a difference, the California Highway Patrol (CHP) has implemented a yearlong *Adult Distracted Drivers* grant designed to keep California roads safe through education and enforcement.

CHP officers throughout the state will host in-person presentations and use Web-based or virtual platforms to conduct distracted driving traffic safety presentations. In addition, the CHP will conduct several distracted driving enforcement operations through September 30, 2021.

“Distracted driving continues to be a serious issue on our roadway, and it is entirely avoidable,” CHP Commissioner Warren Stanley said. “With the support of this grant, we can implement lifesaving efforts throughout California that will raise awareness and hopefully change dangerous behavior behind

the wheel.”

Multitasking behind the wheel places extra demands on the driver, which can have tragic consequences.

On average, there are more than 20,000 drivers in California involved in a crash every year where inattention is a factor. “These statistics are likely much higher and are often under-reported to law enforcement since motorists do not always admit to driving distracted,” Commissioner Stanley added.

While there are many forms of inattention, cell phones continue to be the main source of diversion. Using a handheld cell phone while driving is not only a violation of the vehicle code, it is also an unsafe activity behind the wheel. Drivers should only use a phone when necessary and in a hands-free mode.

Funding for this program was provided by a grant from the California Office of Traffic Safety through the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration.

The mission of the CHP is to provide the highest level of Safety, Service, and Security. ★

# Wine Grape Remains Biggest Cash Crop in Sacramento County

**SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG)** - During her presentation of the 2019 Sacramento County Crop and Livestock Report at the Nov. 17 Board of Supervisors meeting, Agriculture Commissioner, Chris Flores reported that the gross value of all agricultural products in Sacramento County was a little more than \$460 million in 2019. The number represents the gross production value of all agricultural commodities and does not reflect actual profits or losses.

Wine grapes were once again the county’s leading cash crop, with a value of \$175 million, even though harvested acreage, tonnage and price per ton were less last year than previous years. Wine grapes alone accounted for 38 percent of total production value of crops and livestock.

Milk remains the second-highest cash value commodity, at \$52.3 million.

The most exported Sacramento County produced crop was pears. Some 5.4 million pounds were exported to 6 countries, including Canada, Ecuador, French Polynesia, Guatemala and Mexico.

The 2019 Crop and Livestock report

includes a 50-year lookback of the County’s agricultural history. In 1969, the most valuable commodity was cattle and calves. Fruits and nuts comprised only 11.5 percent of all agricultural products grown in Sacramento County 50 years ago. In 2019, fruits and nuts made up nearly half of the county’s bounty, at 46.2%.

Every year, the value of specific commodities rises or falls based on weather, supply and demand, and market forces. In 2019, almonds, sweet corn and honey/pollination services (among other crops) experienced increases, while aquaculture, cattle and calves, and cherries (among others) experienced downturns. Cherries alone lost more than \$6 million in value because of damage caused by late spring rainstorms.

The 2019 Crop and Livestock report can be found in Sacramento County libraries and on the Sacramento County Agricultural Commissioner’s website.

Top 10 Agricultural Commodities in 2019: Wine grape, milk, nursery stock, poultry, pears, aquaculture (fish, crustaceans, mollusks and aquatic plants), cattle and calves, hay (alfalfa), rice, and field corn (corn grown to feed livestock). ★

**Ex-Facebook exec suggests everyone who gets vaccinated to wear certain color mask, reminiscent of Nazi Germany's use of the Star of David** | 11 Dec 2020 | Former Facebook executive Chamath Palihapitiya suggested in a tweet on Friday that everyone who gets vaccinated should “all wear a mask of a special design or color” in order to let other people around them know that they have been vaccinated. The idea did not sit well with many on social media, who quickly blasted the idea, comparing it to Nazi Germany’s use of the Star of David. “How about we just put a gold star on ones that aren’t,” one user tweeted sarcastically. Other users didn’t see the point of having to continue to wear a mask when the vaccine is supposed to provide protection on its own.

**Facebook sued by FTC, 48 attorneys general alleging it operates an illegal monopoly --Attorneys general included those for Guam and Washington, D.C., and every state except for Alabama, Georgia, South Carolina, and South Dakota** | 09 Dec 2020 | A group of 48 U.S. attorneys general led by New York filed an antitrust lawsuit against Facebook on Wednesday, alleging the social media giant is violating antitrust law by buying up competitors and depriving consumers of alternatives that would better protect their privacy. The Federal Trade Commission (FTC) filed a separate suit alleging similar antitrust violations. At the heart of both lawsuits are claims that Facebook’s acquisitions of Instagram in 2012 for \$1 billion and WhatsApp in 2014 for \$19 billion, as well as other smaller technology companies, were carried out in order to quash competition. As part of its lawsuit, the FTC wants to force Facebook to break off both Instagram and WhatsApp.

**Chinese Spy Was in 'Relationships' With at Least Two Midwestern Mayors - Report** | 08 Dec 2020 | A suspected Chinese spy was linked to at least two anonymous Midwestern mayors, according to a bombshell report from Axios. The political journal said Fang Fang, who also goes by Christine Fang, developed political contacts primarily in California, including Rep. Eric Swalwell (D-CA). It went on to report: “Fang attended regional conferences for U.S. mayors, which allowed her to grow her network of politicians across the country. She also engaged in sexual or romantic relationships with at least two mayors of Midwestern cities over a period of about three years, according to one U.S. intelligence official and one former elected official. At least two separate sexual interactions with elected officials, including one of these Midwestern mayors, were caught on FBI electronic surveillance of Fang, according to two intelligence officials,” Axios said.

**WHO against making coronavirus vaccine mandatory – Such moves have backfired and caused greater opposition in the past, the UN health agency warns** | 08 Dec 2020 | The World Health Organization said Monday that persuading people on the merits of a Covid-19 vaccine would be far more effective than trying to make the jabs mandatory. The WHO said it would be down to individual countries as to how they want to conduct their vaccination campaigns against the coronavirus pandemic. But the UN health agency insisted making it mandatory to get immunised against the disease would be the wrong road to take, adding there were examples in the past of mandating vaccines use only to see it backfire with greater opposition to them. “I don’t think that mandates are the direction to go in here, especially for these vaccines,” Kate O’Brien, director of the WHO’s immunisation department, told a virtual news conference. “It is a much better position to actually encourage and facilitate the vaccination without those kinds of requirements. I don’t think we envision any countries creating a mandate for vaccination.” ★

# A Celebration of Parks

**RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG)** - The Cordova Recreation & Park District is pleased to announce the opening of two new parks in Rancho Cordova and a brand-new playground in the Rosemont Area. Despite the difficulties of the current pandemic, the Cordova Recreation & Park District and its partners have been working hard to create parks and build community for residents.

### Labyrinth Community Park

This park in the Sequoia at Cypress development in eastern Rancho Cordova was designed with community wellness in mind. Like most successful projects, Labyrinth Community Park was a team effort. Partners included: Woodside Homes, Olympic Land Construction, and Callander Associates. The park includes the District's first zip line play equipment, a children's demonstration garden, restroom and picnic shelter. A meandering walkway circles the site with fitness stations spaced throughout the park. The park uses drought-tolerant vegetation and a weather-based irrigation controller to reduce water usage. At the heart of the park is a labyrinth constructed of stone pavers. The labyrinth has been used in art and storytelling around the world for centuries. In this park, the labyrinth provides a central gathering space and a place for people to relax. Labyrinth Community Park was designed as a place for residents to come to at the end of a busy day and enjoy the outdoors with their families. This park is located at 12770 Glass Beach Drive, Rancho Cordova.

### Cypress Grove Park

The 2.1-acre Cypress Grove Park project was a successful partnership between the Cordova Recreation & Park District, Woodside Homes, and Callander Associates. The site for Cypress Grove Park had a nine-foot grade difference from the east side to the west, presenting a unique design challenge for landscape architects. The final master plan gracefully solves the grades through a single, accessible walkway that curves through the site and helps to organize its unique park features. In California's newer developments, where resident yards are compact, pocket parks such as Cypress Grove Park become shared neighborhood



backyards. These parks are crucial for providing open green space for picnics, dog-walking, leisure lawn games, birthday parties, and other kinds of informal outdoor recreation. The simple, sustainable design of Cypress Grove Park is a great example of landscape architecture at its elegant and subtle best. This park is located at 4047 Cypress Grove Avenue, Rancho Cordova.

### Primrose Park Playground

The new playground at Primrose Park was the result of a year-long outreach process. The District met with neighbors in the fall of 2019 to introduce the project. When COVID prevented the District from further face-to-face community meetings, staff created a video and survey to continue outreach efforts. The community-favored design was constructed this fall. The playground is not a traditional post and deck structure, but rather a unique structure that incorporates nets, spinners, and other newer play features that allow for varied, improvised play. The project was funded through the My Parks Enhancement Fund: Investment for Better Parks. The project shows that great things can happen when the District and community work together to build parks. Now more than ever, local parks make life better! This park is located at 9142 Rose Parade Way, Sacramento.
