Folsom Cordova Unified School District

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - Beginning November 9, Elementary schools in Folsom Cordova Unified School District have phased instruction to a Hybrid Model. The Folsom Cordova Unified School District has been planning for the safe return of students to campus for many weeks and in collaboration with bargaining team leadership from FCEA and CSEA, and health officials from Sacramento County Public Health.

Close to 4900 FCUSD students are back on elementary school campuses for in-person learning as of November 12. As part of the Folsom Cordova Unified School District's phased approach to reopening, families who chose in-person learning

for their elementary aged children (TK-5th grades) are returning to an AM/PM Hybrid schedule. All families who chose 100 percent virtual for their children will continue in the Virtual Academy.

The AM/PM schedule consists of students being divided into two separate 2 hour 35 minute on-campus learning sessions, four days a week from Tuesday-Friday, with the remaining minutes for each grade to be completed with virtual and asynchronous learning at home. Total instructional minutes will be: 180 for TK-1st grade, 230 for 2nd and 3rd grade, and 240 for 4th and 5th grade.

As part of FCUSD's safe reopening plan, all in-person families are required to review daily, the District's COVID Screening Tool, Symptom Decision Tree and sign a

health and safety Family Agreement form.

As part of our Safe Reopening Plan, no visitors are allowed onto any school campuses.

Students will use their own supplies and will wash/sanitize their hands throughout the day. Families and students should screen for symptoms before arriving on campus. All students and staff will wear face covering while on campus. Custodial staff will sanitize classrooms and restrooms, including high touch points, before each AM and PM sessions of students. School meals will be grab and go as students complete their AM or PM session.

Students from all 20 Folsom Cordova Unified Elementary schools have now returned for in-person learning. ★

Let's Talk Meth

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Just like the opioid crisis, methamphetamine (meth) is highly addictive and continues to be a serious issue across the country and for Sacramento County. Through planning and far-reaching collaboration, in May 2019, the Sacramento County Division of Behavioral Health Services, Substance Use Prevention and Treatment Services launched the Sacramento County Methamphetamine Coalition to identify and implement community-wide initiatives that help reduce the devastating consequences of meth use, its effects on the person and on the community.

In an effort that will continue the conversation about meth and offer education, resources and support to any person in need, Sacramento County Division of Behavioral Health Services, Substance Use Prevention and Treatment Services is excited to announce the launch of the Let's Talk

Meth digital outreach campaign.

The Let's Talk Meth website provides information on a variety of treatment programs that matches different needs and connects people with others who have begun a journey

of recovery.

"We are so excited to launch the Let's Talk Meth campaign," said Sacramento County Substance Use Prevention and Treatment Services Division Manager, Lori Miller. "This resource will

be so helpful for those searching for lasting recovery and will connect you to licensed and certified substance use treatment providers in Sacramento County. We know the journey to take back your life and reconnect with friends and family is a hard process but it is possible and you do not have to do it alone."

Getting Substance Use Treatment

Every person has different needs when it comes to substance use treatment. It is important to be referred to the appropriate level of care. Sacramento County offers a full continuum of care based on the American Society of Addiction Medicine to make sure the right treatment is provided.

To qualify for any Sacramento County treatment and recovery program, an assessment is required. This means speaking with a care professional who uses standardized guidelines to ask questions that help determine the level of treatment you need.

For Lt. Jeffrey E. Osborn assigned to Navy Medicine Readiness and Training Command (NMRTC) Bremerton's, the ongoing pandemic outbreak has him helping maintain the warfighting capability of commands in the third largest fleet concentration, as well as provide resources for the command's healthcare workers.

According to Osborn, attached to NMRTC Bremerton's Branch Health Clinic Bangor, the goal of the program is to ensure patient safety while acting as an advocate for credentialed healthcare providers.

"As with all functions at the hospital, our number one goal is always improving patient safety," Osborn said. "In this care prevention, early identification, treatment and rehabilitation of possibly



The program is a Defense Health Agency requirement and is comprised of multiple professions such as credentialed provider, mental health and nursing staff representative(s).

There's a number of services that can be provided, including mental health, substance abuse rehabilitation referrals, even help with work schedule issues for someone struggling with significant life events.

“We act as a voice of advocacy for staff. Our program provides routine information on building resiliency with a goal of prevention of impairment,” stated Osborn, adding that the program routinely reaches out to the medical community with discussions and briefs on a regular basis, such as sharing during new provider orientation and during the occasional medical staff meetings. “Additionally,

we focus on early identification and treatment always with the goal of rehabilitation and return to clinical duties.” “Now more than ever it is critical that we work together as peers to provide support and feel comfortable checking in with each other to make sure that none of us are struggling in silence,” Osborn stressed. “Medical providers in particular tend to downplay their own problems trying to focus on providing care. It is up to us to look out for each other.”

As Navy Medicine continues to respond to the pandemic's lingering impact on physical, mental and emotional impacts with a ready medical force ensuring there's a medical ready force, the added responsibilities have led to concerns about burn-out and complacency.

“Healthcare workers are especially impacted by this as they fill a critical role on the front lines of addressing the

pandemic,” stated Osborn. “This has put increased stress on our staff as they work to provide critical care to our community while accepting increased risk of exposure and the fear of potentially spreading of the virus to family and friends.”

For Osborn, the path to his current position has been based more on the journey than the actual destination. Although the Pacific Northwest has made a lasting positive impression.

"I enjoy my time as a Navy provider. The job has unique challenges and opportunities that my civilian peers never get to experience. As someone who has been active duty with a long break in between periods of service, I can safely say that there is no place that has a similar sense of community and camaraderie as the military. The friendships and experiences will truly last a lifetime," exclaimed Osborn,

noting that being able to engage in operational medicine – whether in the field or at sea – offers unique challenges in distinctive settings unlike any typical hospital and clinic environment.

Navy Medicine has taken Osborn far afield, across the Pacific and Indian Oceans, from the arid African coastline of Djibouti to the tropical jungles of Sri Lanka. He also deployed in support of Combined Joint Task Force – Operation Inherent Resolve and provided an array of medical care to joint and Coalition service members in Iraq and Syria.

Yet well before his current role, Osborn joined the Army after graduating in 1999 from Elk Grove High School. He served as an airborne infantryman for four years, then diligently worked as an emergency medical technician and earned his Bachelors of Science degree in Medical Microbiology from

University of California, Davis. He followed up by graduating from Touro University California with a dual Master of Public Health and Master of PA studies in 2013. He joined the Navy as a direct accession soon after.

“While in PA school I spent a considerable amount of time trying to decide where to practice and the kind of patient population to treat,” Osborn related. “I wanted to serve again after an almost 10 years break. I spoke with medical recruiters from all the military branches and was impressed with the chief hospital corpsman that I worked with. I was interested in the large scope of Navy Medicine encompassing both the blues side as well as the green side working with sailors and Marines.”

As a physician assistant, Osborn works hand-in-hand with supervising physicians and surgeons, and is proficient in areas such as emergency medicine and family practice, along with handling primary care issues and overseeing other members of the medical team such as hospital corpsmen. Working with those hospital corpsmen is the best part of his job.

“The PA profession was born out of the hospital corpsman rate,” said Osborn. “Many current corpsmen and medics are the future of the PA community. Corpsmen are the first link in the chain of survival following trauma or injury in operational environments.”

Osborn's role as a Navy PA is also part of that chain of survival, from training corpsmen to providing care to those in need with the Provider Wellness/Impaired Provider Prevention Program. ★

Stories in Art – The Fall Open Show

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - The Fall Open Art Show at Rancho Cordova City Hall presents nearly 80 works of art by 45 artists. It runs November 1, 2020, through January 24, 2021.

Ted Helms’s painting titled *Peer Pressure* received the Best of Show award. Thinking about what to enter, Helms decided that given the time of year, he would base his painting on the movie *A Christmas Story*. “My wife actually suggested the tongue-sticking scene,” Helms said. “I paint monsters, for lack of a better term, in situations like what a normal person would be doing, so I just put two little green goblin guys in that picture . . . I thought it turned out pretty good.”

First place was awarded to Paul Anderson for his photograph, *Finding Nemo*. “This reddish brown egret is my favorite bird to photograph . . . they’re just so expressive,” Anderson said. The photo looks as if the fish is poking its head up out of the water to stare at the egret, which is staring back. However, the rest of the story is a little different. “(The egret) was literally picking up the fish and then throwing it back, and picking it up and throwing it back,” Anderson said. “Finally after three times it finally just picked it up and ate it. The image is actu-

ally the fish going back in the water.” Artist Eugene D. Stevenson III took second place with his photograph, *Surprise*.

“I’m just trying to really tell a story,” Stevenson said, “give the viewer the opportunity to fill in the gaps.” Stevenson has a friend who loves to go all out with her makeup, and to make his photo of her more interesting he said, “Just act like I surprised you.” So, looking startled, she threw a handful of makeup in the air as he photographed. To be sure he got the best one, he did 26 takes. “Every time, I had to pick it up, give it back to her and say, ‘Throw it’,” Stevenson said. He actually ended up using take number three.

Third place was *Wonky Couple* by Alice Washington, whose work is done in mixed media. While working on an online art course, she took a class called Wonky People. Trying some techniques suggested by the class, she came out with a unique work of art. “This was my first time ever

using India ink,” Washington said. “I had to collage some of it and make separate pieces for that mouth that’s in there . . . I just really focused in on it and made it my own and I came out with what I created.”

Every work of art in the show has its own story. Telling a story with his photos is “fun and it’s positive,” Stevenson said. “That’s how I’ve been trained by my mentor, to put elements in the scene that give people guideposts, but you leave them enough untold so that they are able to create their own story.”

City Partners with National League of Cities to Aid Students

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - The City of Rancho Cordova is proud to be one of thirteen cities from across the nation to join a new peer-learning cohort led by the National League of Cities (NLC) to address removing barriers to basic needs for local postsecondary students.

“Through this cohort, the city will determine a

strategy and identify potential programs that will connect some of our economically challenged students with high-quality, resilient and well-paying jobs that already exist within our community,” said Cyrus Abhar, City Manager for the City of Rancho Cordova.

Barriers to basic needs such as food, housing, childcare, mental health services and transportation often prevent college students from successfully completing postsecondary degrees, certificates or other credentials that help gain access to rewarding careers. This program will provide participating cities with virtual learning opportunities, assistance from NLC staff and national content experts to help advance the city’s efforts to support local students gain access to these needs.

“As high levels of educational attainment are

directly linked to a city’s economic vitality and well-being, there is a great incentive for municipal leaders to support and promote postsecondary credential attainment,” said Audrey Hutchinson, Director of Education and Expanded Learning at the National League of Cities. “The National League of Cities is proud to work with the City of Rancho Cordova in addressing the basic needs of postsecondary students,” she added.

California State Parks Experience Goes Virtual for K-12 Students

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The school field trip to California State Parks is being reimagined thanks to a new partnership between California State Parks, Parks California, and Computer-Using Educators (CUE). California is home to some of the country’s most unique and precious cultural, natural, and historic resources, and a new passPORTS online adventure will help make it possible for students from across the state to experience them.

The new pilot program, passPORTS, will use a blended access approach that combines quality teaching practices with the latest technology to reduce barriers to park access. Using videoconference technology and web resources, the Parks Online Resources for Teachers and Students (PORTS) program introduces K-12 students to live State Park Interpreters, allowing them to connect their classroom studies within the context of California’s state park system. “We are excited to embark on a new partnership with Parks California and CUE to provide deep and meaningful digital learning experiences for K12 students and invite them for an in-person class visit to our parks, recreation areas, natural reserves, and culturally important places when the time is right for schools,” Brad Krey, PORTS Program Manager said. Geoff Kish, Vice President of Programs at Parks California said, “passPORTS is an exceptional opportunity for kids to connect with and learn about California’s State Parks from the comfort of their home. Programs like this play an important role in making state parks accessible for all people, regardless of where they live.”

This enhanced initiative builds on 15 years of successful PORTS programs with a new combination of digital instructional materials for use in the classroom, as well as in-park use, and provides funding to school districts to cover bus and transportation costs, giving students their passPORTS to the Parks. “We believe parks provide deep and meaningful interdisciplinary learning experiences for students regardless of physical, social, cultural, economic circumstance, or ability,” said Scott Shepherd, Parks Access Coordinator, California State Parks. “Our work will not only increase equitable access to parks for all California citizens, but

in turn mobilize a new generation to play, learn, serve, and share in California State Parks.”

The goal of the passPORTS program is to provide more students with access to California State Parks through a blended access approach, using both online learning adventures now and in-person field trips once COVID-19 restrictions are lifted. “The Parks offer interdisciplinary learning opportunities which afford schools a wide variety of curriculum engagement. California State Parks encourages students to learn more about nature, science, and history,” said Scott Shepherd. “These experiences not only support learning but also build respect for the natural environment and our diverse history and helps students to develop their understanding of California’s unique resources.”

Shepherd says, “Naturally, we want students, as well as their teachers and parents, to discover that our parks are learning laboratories, as well as places for environmental awareness, advocacy, and stewardship. But, we also want them to discover that these are places to enjoy the wonder of our state. Through collaboration with California State Parks and the K12 community, we aim to develop both sustainable and equitable access for the next generation of park visitors and champions.”

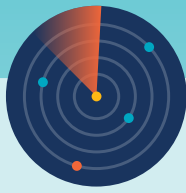

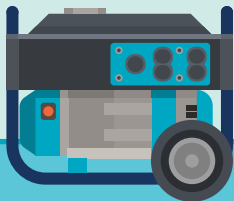

Used Batteries in Curbside Carts Are Fire Hazards

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Sacramento County is asking residents not to put household batteries – rechargeable, or otherwise – in your curbside recycling or garbage cart.
Recently, a Sacramento County Department of Waste Management and Recycling Collection Equipment Operator was finishing his route in Antelope, when he realized that the funny smell he noticed in the back of his truck was actually a fire!
Following department procedure, he called 911, found a safe location to dump

the load, and waited for firefighters to put out the flames.
Common household batteries - such as AA, AAA, D, button batteries, lithium-ion batteries (commonly used in electronics) - are banned from landfill disposal. Do not put batteries of any kind in any of your curbside carts because of the danger they pose to spark a fire, and the danger to our environment.
Residents can drop off batteries for no charge at local area Household Hazard Waste Facilities or visit the Earth 911 or Call 2 Recycle websites for other drop off locations. Local hardware stores, grocery stores and home improvement stores may have take-back programs, too. Always call before you go. ★

Federal Election Commission Chair Calls Election ‘Illegitimate’ Due to Voter Fraud – ‘The law is not being followed, making this an illegitimate election.’ | 12 Nov 2020 | Trey Trainor, the Chairman of the Federal Election, stated during an appearance on Newsmax this Thursday that he “does believe there's voter fraud taking place,” and confirmed that the refusal to allow poll watchers to observe the ballot counting process - among numerous other irregularities - does indeed constitute an “illegitimate election.” “I do believe that there is voter fraud taking place in these places,” Trainor said. “Otherwise they would allow the observers to go in.” “When you have claims of 10,000 people who don’t live in the state of Nevada having voted in Nevada, when you have the video showing where people are either duplicating a spoiled ballot right there, or they’re in the process of just marking a ballot that came in blank for a voter, that’s a process that needs to be observed by election observers,” Trainor said. The FEC Chairman added that poll observers are legally allowed to be present during the counting of ballots, and if they are refused entry to a place where the vote is being tabulated then “the law is not being followed, making this an illegitimate election.”
Michigan Witness: GOP Poll Challengers Were Assaulted at TCF Center trying to Protect the Vote – GOP challengers were prevented from seeing ballots –Witness says: ‘The most crooked thing I’ve ever seen’ | 12 Nov 2020 | Absentee ballots from Wayne County/Detroit were supposed to be counted by 8:00 PM on election night last week, but a 3:30 AM delivery of what witnesses have described as 50-61 boxes of ballots puts into doubt the validity of the surprising election results. That surprise brought a commanding Trump lead of 300,000 votes for Michigan’s 16 electoral votes into a 120,000 vote deficit after votes from Wayne County were counted. Ann Rudisill went down to the counting area after hearing that a large batch of suspicious ballots had arrived in the middle of the night. Rudisill noticed a total lack of security at the TCF Center when she entered. “There was no sign in sheet. There was nothing. Maybe a hundred of us walked in there.” She described poll challengers as being purposefully prevented from being able to review the ballots as they were being counted on Wednesday, the day after the election, by poll workers and Democrat Poll Challengers. “I was completely unable to see the ballots.”
Pennsylvania court: Secretary of state lacked authority to change deadline 2 days before Election – Judge ruled ballots that were previously set aside should not be counted | 12 Nov 2020 | A Pennsylvania judge ruled in favor of the Trump campaign Thursday, ordering that the state may not count ballots where the voters needed to provide proof of identification and failed to do so by Nov. 9. That guidance was issued two days before Election Day. “(T)he Court concludes that Respondent Kathy Boockvar, in her official capacity as Secretary of the Commonwealth, lacked statutory authority to issue the November 1, 2020, guidance to Respondents County Boards of Elections insofar as that guidance purported to change the deadline...for certain electors to verify proof of identification,” Judge Mary Hannah Leavitt said in a court order.
Trump Lawsuit Alleges Rampant Violations at Detroit Vote Counting Center | 11 Nov 2020 | President Donald Trump’s reelection campaign sued Michigan in federal court late on Nov. 10, alleging pervasive violations of election laws at a vote-counting center in Detroit. The lawsuit is accompanied by 234 pages of sworn witness affidavits which describe how Republican poll challengers were prevented from having adequate access to observe the counting process in violation of Michigan’s election code. The witnesses detail a battery of problems with the handling, processing, and counting of the votes, including instances in which election officials ignored their challenges.
Analysis of Election Night Data From All States Show Millions of Votes Either Switched From President to Biden or Were Lost - Using Dominion and Other Systems | 10 Nov 2020 | Tonight we have obtained an unaudited analysis of data available for all the states looking for system glitches and other oddities in vote counts related to the Presidential race only. More High-Dollar Ballot Measures in 2022

Much has been said and written about the hundreds of millions of dollars spent for and against the dozen statewide measures on this month's ballot.

Big money? Yes, but it was really just chicken feed, because the stakes in those ballot battles were infinitely greater.

Take, for instance, Proposition 15, a battle between a union-led coalition that proposed the measure, and a business coalition. Had Proposition 15 passed, it would have generated roughly \$10 billion a year for schools and local governments. That's about 66 times as much as the one-time spending for and against the measure.

Other than the scale, there was nothing unusual this year about the lopsided risk-reward aspect of major ballot measures, and it will fuel another round of conflicts two years hence. There are at least four high-dollar ballot measures headed for the 2022 ballot:

MICRA – In 1975, Jerry Brown signed the Medical Injury Compensation Reform Act or MICRA, placing a \$250,000 cap on damages for what were called "pain and suffering" in medical malpractice lawsuits.

Consumer advocates and personal injury lawyers have attempted numerous times in the Legislature to modify the law, contending that it protects bad medical care providers and short-changes their innocent patients. Providers and their insurers have turned back each challenge, saying that removing the cap would raise medical costs.

A measure already qualified for the 2022 ballot would adjust the cap for inflation retroactively to 1975, probably increasing it to well over \$1 million, and eliminate it for "catastrophic injuries." The outcome could have multi-billion-dollar impacts and thus will mean multi-million-dollar campaigns.

PLASTICS – A certain-to-qualify measure would reduce or eliminate single-use plastic packaging through regulation and a tax.

California recycler Recology is the chief sponsor of the initiative, which would continue a crusade, also supported by environmental groups, that stalled in the Legislature thanks to fierce lobbying by a packaging industry coalition led by South Carolina-based Novolex.

As the battle shifts to the ballot, the Recology group will portray plastic packaging, particularly items used for takeout food, as environmental despoilers. The industry will counter that using plastic packaging is cleaner than the alternatives, particularly during a pandemic.

SPORTS WAGERING – Another virtually certain 2022 ballot measure also continues a contentious issue the Legislature failed to resolve – whether legal

sports wagering should come to California and if so, who should benefit.

A legislative measure would have given Indian tribal casinos and some horse racing tracks authority to take bets on sporting events, but the politically powerful casinos opposed it because it would also have sanctioned new forms of gambling in non-tribal card rooms, impinging on the tribes' monopoly.

A tribal coalition's pending ballot measure mirrors the failed legislation except for its card room enhancements. It's uncertain whether the card rooms will try to mount an opposition drive but billions of gambling dollars will hinge on the outcome.

FLAVORED TOBACCO – Despite stalling on other issues, the Legislature did pass a ban on flavored tobacco products, which have been criticized as luring young men and women into tobacco use.

"It will be a point of deep pride and personal privilege as a father of four and as someone who's had many, many family members die at the hands of the tobacco industry to sign that bill," Gov. Gavin Newsom said.

The legislation was a defeat for the tobacco industry, which is fighting back with a referendum that would repeal the new law, just as this year's Proposition 25, sponsored by the bail bond industry, erased a law that eliminated cash bail for criminal defendants.

Temperatures Dip - Cold Weather Tips

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - While winter is still a few weeks away, these weather conditions are definitely giving us a taste of winter-like temperatures for a couple of days this week. It's a great time to review cold weather tips:

For inside the home:
Check on elderly family members, friends or neighbors. Seniors and those with serious medical conditions are at risk. Check on community members that might be vulnerable to ensure they are safely keeping warm; **Heat your home safely - carbon monoxide is a silent killer.** It is not OK to heat the inside of your home with any kind of BBQ, propane heater, or any other fuel-fired equipment due to the risk of carbon monoxide poisoning. Only

use heaters installed with your home and those designed to be used indoors. Make sure that your natural gas furnaces and other appliances are in good, clean working order; **Bring your pets inside when temperatures start to dip near freezing.** Make sure dogs and cats have a warm, draft-free place indoors with a dry mat or blanket that they can lie on. For outdoors:
Insulate outdoor pipes that lead into your home to prevent freezing. Seal with caulk around the pipes that lead into and out of your home. Inside your home, leave the bathroom and under-sink cabinets open to help warm the water. If your pipes freeze, leave your tap

on and call a plumber. You can defrost your pipes using a hairdryer on a low setting, working your way slowly from the faucet to where your pipe enters the wall. County residents who need to have their water turned off in order to make repairs to their lines can go online or call 311 (or 916-875-4311 if calling from out of the area); **Ensure proper drainage by scooping up leaves and debris.** Keeping storm drains clear can prevent street flooding and black ice from forming;

On the road:
When raining, reduce your vehicle speed. Wet roads increase the distance and time needed to stop your vehicle. Be extra cautious on roads, bridges and overpasses when temperatures are 32 degrees or below due to black ice – slow down and give

yourself extra spacing between vehicles in front of you; **Watch for tree limbs.** As temperatures dip, trees become vulnerable to limbs snapping. blow around and be prepared for the possibility of loss of power. For downed power lines, stay away and call 9-1-1 immediately; **Sign-up for Emergency Alerts.** This system alerts residents about emergency events and other important public safety information quickly in a variety of situations, such as severe weather, unexpected road

closures, missing persons and evacuations of buildings or neighborhoods.

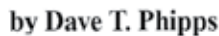

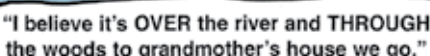
