Bold New Look, Same Critical Mission

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - The revered Cordova Community Food Locker, which has been feeding hungry Rancho Cordovans for 33 years, is unveiling a new name, new logo, new website and new attitude - but

the critical mission hasn't changed. Now known as the Rancho Cordova Food Locker, the longtime volunteer-driven emergency food pantry has incorporated into an IRSsanctioned non-profit organization,

food locker are tax-deductible.

While remaining true to its roots, the updated organization came out swinging Nov. 2 as it officially unveils its new look with food and donation drives to address need in the community throughout the holiday

"We have a new look, but our heart is still dedicated to the mission begun way back in 1987 – to provide a 60-foot trailer and walk-in refrigera safety net for people in our community who are hungry," said Walter Little, who is a founder of the food locker and serves as chairman of a Locker from a parish-based operation which means donations made to the newly-created board of directors.

"Our new slogan - 'Fighting Hunger. Feeding Hope' – pretty much says it

The Rancho Cordova Food Locker was founded in 1987 when 13 churches came together to create and provide volunteer support for a community-based food pantry. Newsom's unconstitutional orders that discriminate against churches and places of worship, he has now released onerous government restrictions on Thanksgiving gatherings.

CONTROL.

The mandatory restrictions for Thanksgiving gatherings include:

- No more than three households, including hosts and guests.
- · The names and contact information of guests must be recorded so they can be "contact traced."
- Must be held outside.
- No more than two hours. Guests may use restrooms only if they are sanitized between use.
- Six-foot distancing in all directions.
- Everyone should frequently wash their hands with soap and water or use hand sanitizer which must, of course, be done outside.
- Food and drink must be in single-serve disposable containers.
- No food or drink on the table other than your plate and cup.
- Masks must be worn and removed only briefly to eat or drink.
- Masks can also be removed for urgent medical needs (an asthma inhaler, medication or light-headedness).

Walking in Our Grandmother's Footsteps, We Can Vote!

RANCHO CORDOVA. CA (MPG) - The latest exhibit at the MACC celebrates the 100th anniversary of the 19th amendment to the United States Constitution granting women the right to vote. The exhibit includes banners from the Rochester, New York, public library; posters from the Smithsonian; and 18 works of art by 16 artists.

Marsha Mason of Rancho Cordova was awarded Best in Show for her work "Walking in Our Grandmother's footsteps." Using 100 plus year-old leather boot tops from her husband's family, Mason crafted a pair of boots to commemorate the suffragettes. The boots are filled with colorful fabric roses, in recognition of Inez Milholland, a lawyer and activist born in 1886. "When Inez Milholland did her 12,000 mile campaign to get ratification," Mason said, "everywhere she went her fans would bring her a

Continued from page 1 Nov. 12-14, and Nov. 19-21. Hours are 3-8 p.m. Thursdays and Fridays, and 11 a.m.-4 p.m. on Saturdays. There will be two online Zoom lectures as well. Mona Siegel held hers from 6-7:30 p.m., on Wednesday, Nov. 4, and Amanda DeWilde will speak 6-7:30 p.m., Tuesday, Nov. 10.

The first place in the world to allow women the right to vote was Wyoming in 1869, while it was still a territory. Cheryl Gleason, the MACC event coordinator and curator, points out that men outnumbered women 6 to 1 in Wyoming at that time, and the population of the territory was decreasing, partly due to waning yield of gold from the mines. So while many men may have wanted the vote for women because it was the right thing to do, there were also a number that wanted to attract more women to the area.

Ιn California, Proposition 4 of 1911 amended the state's Constitution to grant women the right to vote; however, not all women were included. There was a literacy requirement that barred some women from voting and Native American women were excepted as well.

Other states passed laws at various times concerning women's suffrage, ending in 1920 when the 19th amendment to the United States Constitution was ratified and became the law of the land. It read, "The right of citizens of the United States to vote shall not be denied or abridged by the United States or by any State on account of sex."

The video presentation captures high points and light moments while acknowledging difficult challenges faced across the city during a year which was dominated by COVID



Eastvale incorporated on October 1, 2010. And Jurupa Valley incorporated on July 1, 2011. All four of those "new cities" are located in Riverside County. (As a side note, Jurupa Valley is the 482nd city in California, and it is the 28th city in Riverside County.)

Hidden Habits of Geniuses

Would you like to be a genius? Believe 7. CREATIVE MALADJUSTMENT. it or not, you don't have to be born one. That from Professor Craig Wright, the creator of Yale University's popular genius course where he shares stories of history's achievers and explores the fourteen key traits of genius in "The Hidden Traits of Genius" unlocking the secrets of genius. Here's a sample.

- 1. WORK ETHIC. Why IQ scores and Ivy League educations are greatly overrated, and hard work is underrated. Natural talent versus hard work is not a binary opposition. Genius is both the product of both nature and nurture.
- 2. RESILIENCE. Women and minority geniuses have historically needed an extra dose of resilience for their achievements to be recognized. Wright unpacks why hidden cultural biases against women in particular are so difficult to discard, and how we can openly challenge these biases to defeat them.
- 3. ORIGINLAITY. No matter how "gifted" your children are, you do them no favors by treating them like prodigies, who tend not to fulfill expectations.
- 4. CHILDLIKE IMAGINATION. If we value creativity and openness to unexpected solutions, as geniuses do, the least helpful thing we can say to our children, or to ourselves, is "Grow
- 5. INSATIABLE CURIOSITY. Beyond the obvious acts of reading and taking a class to stoke your lust for learning, try something less apparent like getting lost while wandering in a new city, or asking questions frequently and then actually listening to the answer.
- 6. PASSION. Passion is essential to happiness and human progress. You'll have a happier and probably longer

- There is a correlation between genius and mental disorder. Rather than stigmatizing or medicating neurological differences, let's learn to embrace them and leverage them to our advantage.
- 8. **REBELLIOUSNESS.** Without rebellion against the status quo, there is no genius. Want to raise a bold, original thinker? Permit your children to explore alone, take risks, and experience failure.
- 9. CROSS-BORDER THINKING. Geniuses teach us not to specialize too soon or too strictly, in school or on the job. Steve Jobs said, "It's technology married with liberal arts, married with humanities, that yields the results that make our hearts sing."
- 10. **CONTRARION ACTION.** The more a person can exploit the contradictions of life, the greater his or her potential for genius.
- 11. PREPARATION. Talent is important, but just as important are favorable circumstances, or luck. And luck favors the prepared. Legendary golfer Gary Player said, "The harder I practice, the luckier I get."
- 12. OBSESSION. Geniuses are obsessed with their personal quest to change the world, often to the detriment of others and many great minds turn out to be not-so-great human beings.
- 13. RELAXATION. The great way to have a brilliant insight is to engage in creative relaxation...go for a walk, take a shower, or get a good night's sleep with pen and paper by the bed.
- 14. CONCENTRATION. To be more productive, adopt a daily ritual for work. All geniuses do.

U.S. Loses \$19 Billion in Afghanistan Reconstruction Funds to Fraud, Waste, Abuse | 29 Oct 2020 | A staggering \$19 billion spent by the U.S. government to reconstruct Afghanistan has been lost to fraud, waste, and abuse in the last decade and that only includes a portion of the money allocated by Congress for the cause. In 90% of the cases examined in a new federal audit, the money was blown "carelessly, extravagantly, or to no purpose." This month the Special Inspector General for Afghanistan Reconstruction (SIGAR) published a troubling report that analyzes less than half of the U.S. budget for the initiative, \$63 billion in projects. As of December 2019, Congress has appropriated \$134 billion for Afghanistan reconstruction, which began roughly a year after the U.S. invaded the Islamic nation to destroy Al-Qaeda [al-CIAduh] and eradicate the Taliban. Afghanistan reconstruction has been a huge and well-chronicled debacle that continues fleecing American taxpayers nearly two decades after its inception.

FBI conducting criminal investigation into Hunter Biden and associates days ahead of 2020 election - report | 29 Oct 2020 | The FBI reportedly has an active criminal investigation into Hunter Biden, the son of Democratic presidential nominee Joe Biden, and his associates. James Rosen, a reporter with the Sinclair Broadcast Group, tweeted on Thursday, less than a week until Election Day, that the bureau opened the inquiry into allegations of money laundering in 2019. "EXCLUSIVE: A @TheJusticeDept official confirms that in 2019, the @FBI opened up a criminal investigation into 'Hunter Biden and his associates,' focused on allegations of moneylaundering, and that it remains open and active today," he said. Rosen followed up by posting a short TV report to his Twitter account.

Bower said two voters received mail-in ballots that were already filled out and two ballots were found at the election bureau already opened. "The secrecy envelope was missing and the ballot was missing out of those envelopes," said Bower. Bower said the ballots that were already filled out and arrived at homes 40 miles apart, which he says means they are not isolated incidents. "They literally stole my vote," said Delmas Fike. Fike said when his mail-in ballot arrived, each Democrat was already selected.

Judicial Watch finds 1.8 million 'ghost voters' in 29 states, warns of 'dirty elections' | 20 Oct 2020 | Judicial Watch has released a comparison study of Census Bureau population statistics and state voter registration data to reveal a notable disparity. The study found that 352 U.S. counties in 29 states managed to have 1.8 million more registered voters than eligible voting-age citizens. "In other words, the registration rates of those counties exceeded 100% of eligible voters. The study found eight states showing state-wide registration rates exceeding 100%: Alaska, Colorado, Maine, Maryland, Michigan, New Jersey, Rhode Island, and Vermont," reported Tom Fitton, president of the watchdog group. Some of that excess ran as high as 187% in Texas, 177% in New Mexico and 171% in South Dakota.

What you need to know about accessing DMV services online

In response to the COVID-19 pandemic, the DMV is prioritizing customer and employee safety and increasing the number of transactions that can be completed without a visit to a DMV field office. The DMV has several channels to better serve customers, including self-service options online or at DMV kiosks, the ability to complete transactions online or over the phone with help from a DMV representative, or via a DMV business partner so that customers can "visit" the DMV by other means. The following questions address the most convenient ways to access DMV services and complete essential transactions without stepping foot in a field office.

Q: MY DRIVER'S LICENSE IS EXPIRING SOON. CAN I RENEW MY LICENSE ONLINE?

A: Yes, you can renew your license online. Governor Gavin Newsom signed executive orders waiving in-person renewals for eligible driver's license and identification cardholders who had reached their maximum out-of-office renewals. With that wavier in effect for the length of California's State of Emergency, or until modified, nearly all California drivers younger than age 70 are eligible to renew their license online or by mail. The DMV is providing an automatic one-year extension to drivers age 70 and older with a non-commercial driver's license with an expiration date between March 1 and December 31, 2020. The California Department of Motor Vehicles is encouraging eligible Californians to renew their driver's licenses online and avoid visiting DMV field offices at this time, even if their mailed renewal notice states an office visit is required. You can start the process by visiting dmv.ca.gov and clicking on "Driver License & ID Cards."

However, Californians applying for a REAL ID for the first time must visit a field office to complete their transaction. The DMV strongly encourages REAL ID applicants to fill out the online application, upload the required documents and bring their confirmation code with them before their office visit. - Q: I AM A SENIOR OVER THE AGE OF 70 WITH A DRIVER'S LICENSE THAT IS ABOUT TO EXPIRE. DOES THE DMV REQUIRE IN-PERSON VISITS FOR CUSTOMERS OVER AGE 70, OR CAN I RENEW MY LICENSE ONLINE LIKE EVERYONE ELSE?
- **A:** The California Department of Motor Vehicles is working hard to help Californians stay safe during the COVID-19 pandemic, and senior drivers are no exception.

The DMV is providing an automatic one-year extension to drivers age 70 and older with a non-commercial driver's license with an expiration date between March 1 and December 31, 2020. This action delays the requirement for many seniors to visit a DMV office during the COVID-19 pandemic. While the new extensions are automatic, drivers will not receive a new card or paper extension in the mail. As an option, drivers can request a free temporary paper extension online beginning July 15 through DMV's website, though it is not needed to drive. Californians with a suspended license are not eligible.

Drivers over the age of 70 can find information on DMV services, safety guidelines, and other resources by visiting **www.dmv.ca.gov/seniors**.

Sacramento County Streamlines **COVID-19 Contact Tracing**



Sacramento County Public Health is making the COVID-19 case investigation process more

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Sacramento County Public Health is making the COVID-19 case investigation process more efficient by launching a new solution to streamline its COVID-19 contact tracing. The new program powered by Qualtrics allows the department to contact individuals who have tested positive for COVID-19 and anonymously notify those they have been in contact with about exposure to the

Those who have tested positive for COVID-19 can confidentially share information about individuals they have had contact with and locations they have visited through the new and

easy to use platform. Data collected is then used to automate the process to notify impacted individuals by email or text that they may have been exposed and the next steps to take to maintain safety while also maintaining individual confidentiality. All data from the health assessment and contact tracing process are compliant with Federal, State and local privacy laws. The solution does not employ automatic location tracking technology.

Sacramento County Health Officer Dr. Olivia Kasirye said, "We are excited to start implementing this new platform, the quicker confirmed cases can begin isolating, the better we will be at preventing outbreaks in Sacramento

County." Personal health information from positive cases will not be shared with contacts at any time, and the tracing portion of the online program is opt-in, however, those who do not respond will still receive a phone call from a contact tracing investigator.

Below is an example of the contact tracing email Sacramento County Public Health will send:

Please answer this health assessment from the Sacramento County Health Department. You are receiving this assessment because you may have either tested positive for COVID-19 (coronavirus) or may have potentially been exposed to COVID-19. This assessment should only take 5-10 minutes to complete. The information you provide the County Health Department in this assessment will help to flatten the curve and stop the spread of COVID-19. All information that you provide is confidential and will be protected to keep your personal information private.

If you have any questions

about providing this information or wish to confirm the validity of this e-mail, please contact our team at COVID19@saccounty. net or visit the Sacramento County COVID-19

The questionnaire will be sent as an email or text and the COVID-19 case investigators and contact tracers will have the option to contact individuals directly when appropriate, such as cases involving congregate facilities or for specific follow-up to certain responses provided in the automated questionnaire.

The custom-built solution and three years of support services will cost \$1.6 M and is anticipated to save money over time with the reduction in the number of investigators/tracers positions that would be needed. Sacramento County is also exploring possible addons of creating a portal for schools and businesses to submit contacts into the system and an automated system for referring some respondents to wraparound services.

Left Employer Benefits Now I Have a **Medicare Part D Penalty ... Why??**



Hello Toni,

I made a terrible mistake last April when I was no longer being covered by my employer group health plan due to retiring. I had

a telemarketing agent help me find a Medicare Supplement which began April 1, 2020. No one told me that I had a specific amount of time to enroll in my Medicare Part D plan. I have a serious health issue with Crones disease and have had a liver transplant in the past and should have enrolled at that time for my Medicare Part D. When I enrolled in July for a new Medicare Part D plan, I was denied because did I not apply on time. I take Stelara which is over \$2,000 a month that I now must pay on my

I now am 70 years old and have been told that my Part D penalty for not enrolling in Medicare Part D will be \$.3274 X 60 months since my Part A began 5 years ago. I cannot believe that I must pay an extra \$19.64 per month as a Part D penalty.

Please explain this ridiculous Medicare Part D penalty. I have not purchased my Stelara in the last few months. Thank You,

Sydney:

You are aware you waited too long to apply for a Medicare Part D plan. Once you are past 65 and/or leaving creditable coverage, Medicare gives you 63 not 70 or 90 days to apply for a Medicare Part D or Medicare Advantage plan with prescription drug coverage. Not needing to order your prescriptions does not refrain from receiving Part D penalties.

Your late enrollment period (LEP) does not begin from the day you lose or leave your company health plan, BUT from the month you turned 65 or began your Medicare and is based on when Medicare Part A begins not Part B.

This LEP (late enrollment period) penalty can be because:

- 1. You waited past 63 days without creditable prescription drug coverage when you are leaving company benefits and you are older than 65 years old and 90 days. Don't wait past 63 days to get Part D when leaving company health
- 2. Your company prescription drug benefits (not health benefits) are not creditable as Medicare declares.
- 3. You simply never enrolled in Medicare Part D when you were first eligible and want to enroll.

Your company prescription drug benefits met Medicare's "creditable coverage" rule, but you waited past the 63-day window to apply. Sydney, you have been denied Part D prescription coverage because you did not follow Medicare's LEP (late enrollment penalty) rule and are receiving a Part D penalty.

You must wait until the next Medicare Annual Enrollment period from October 15 - December 7 to enroll in a Medicare Part D prescription drug plan with your effective date to be January 1, 2021.

Americans retiring after 65, that are leaving company health plans and applying for Medicare Parts A and B must also prove they have "creditable coverage" when applying for Medicare Part D prescription drug plan.

The Medicare & You handbook states: "Creditable prescription drug coverage could include drug coverage from a current or former employer or union, TRICARE, Indian Health Service, the VA or health insurance coverage.

Does More Money Mean Better Schools?

It's by no means certain that California voters will pass Proposition 15, but if they do, it would be the largest tax increase in the state's history.

That said, it would provide a relatively small down payment on the long-standing desire of the state's educational establishment for a massive increase in spending that's needed, advocates say, to improve California's rather dismal

K-12 educational outcomes. Proposition 15, largely sponsored by the California Teachers Association and other public employee unions, would increase property taxes on some commercial real estate, such as office buildings and hotels, by requiring their taxable values to be upgraded more often. Estimates of its effects vary somewhat, but generally are in the \$10 billion to \$12 billion per year range, with schools getting about 40% of the proceeds.

Those are big numbers, but the few billion extra dollars that would flow to schools are a fraction of the \$25 billion to \$30 billion more per year that unions and other educational groups have been touting. The increase is needed, they say, to make a real difference in

school graduation rates and other measures of academic attainment.

The number derives from a 2018 report from a multi-university team of academic researchers saying that California should spend 38% more, or about \$4,000 per pupil per year, to raise overall achievement and close the "achievement gap" that separates poor and/ or English-learner students from their more advantaged

The 2018 report and much other academic drumbeating for higher education spending comes from Policy Analysis for California Education (PACE), a consortium of the state's major university schools of education.

As the campaign over Proposition 15 – basically a duel between public worker unions and business interests – entered its final stages, PACE issued another report to reinforce its advocacy for a big increase in school financing.

Its core is a series of charts comparing education spending in California to that of other major states and tracing what it says is a relative decline in California's commitment to schools.

Citing the global size of California's economy, the report laments that "California school funding even before COVID-19 was insufficient to meet educational goals and address the needs of students, particularly given the state's high cost of living. How can that be true? Why is education funding so low in California, despite

academic test scores, high its wealth and comparatively high tax revenues?"

The report's charts appear to be accurate as far as they go. But they don't go far enough because they are confined to financial comparisons on the questionable assumption, also reflected in the 2018 study, that money automatically equates to educational achievement.

If PACE and other advocates of big increases in school spending were intellectually honest, they would not only compare spending levels to other states, but also compare how well they are faring vis-à-vis California in national academic testing results and other measures of attainment.

New York, for instance, is spending at least 50% more per pupil than California but its scores on the last batch of National Assessment of Educational Progress tests were virtually identical to California's - both being subpar. Meanwhile, many states that spend much less than California routinely score higher.

Regardless of Proposition 15's outcome, the neverending debate on California education will continue, but it should be a debate about more than money. Some of the academic resources being devoted to persuading Californians to raise taxes for schools should be spent on exploring why outcomes elsewhere bear little or no relationship to how much money other states are spending.

Today, Rancho Cordova Food Locker is the largest USDA food distribution site in the east Sacramento area and a federally designated disaster response site. While 1,500 individuals per month received food supplies when the food locker first opened, that number has grown to 4,000 people each month - providing an astounding 17 million meals over the life of the organization.

Bolstered by food donations from Sacramento Food Bank Services and donors like Safeway, Raley's/Bel-Air and Grocery Outlet, the 30 volunteers who power the Rancho Cordova Food Locker are kept busy stocking and emptying the shelves for clients in their location at 10497 Coloma Road on the campus of

St. John Vianney Church. The City of Rancho Cordova has also supported the food locker mission, providing gap funding to assure the organization is ready when need arises. Open from 9:30 to 1:20 p.m. every Monday, Wednesday and Friday, the food locker is visited by over 300 families a week.

"We have established many strong partners over the years, and we have always been able to rise to challenges in Rancho Cordova," Little said. believe the changes we are making will leave us stronger than ever."

With a new website, upgraded technology and modernized structure, food locker organizers hope to boost community impact and be in a stronger position when unexpected needs arise, such as what occurred with the corona virus pandemic.



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


