## New Neonatal Intensive Care Unit Opens

**SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)** - Dignity Health announced the completion of construction of the new 'Robert S. and Star Pepper Neonatal Intensive Care Unit' at Mercy San Juan Medical Center. The NICU spans 17,889 square feet and is a huge increase over

the previous 1,200-square-foot space originally built in 1989. Mercy San Juan's original NICU was among the first of its kind in Northern California. Over the past three decades, the practice of neonatology has progressed significantly and the Sacramento region has grown exponentially and therefore so have the community's needs for the

NICU. Since its inception, the hospital has always grown with its community, and the development of the new NICU further demonstrates Dignity Health's continued commitment to carry out its mission of improving the health of the people we serve, especially those who are most vulnerable.

On average, 400 babies

annually receive life-saving care at the NICU, with many transferred from other Northern California hospitals that are unable to provide the high-level care they require. The NICU has cared for some of the most critically ill babies who are born as early as 23 weeks and weigh as little as 400 grams. The new Level III

## New Voter Challenge Brings Fun to Mail-in & Absentee Voting

**LOS ANGELES, CA (MPG)** - In a time of pandemic and national turmoil, many Americans feel anxiety over the upcoming general election. Will they be able to vote safely? If they are receiving a ballot by mail, can they depend on the USPS to return it in time?

In a new grass-roots effort, a small team came up with a new idea, and quickly brought it to life: the #VotercadeChallenge. Registered voters who are voting by mail can plan a Votercade - a trip to their county elections office or nearby dropoff location - with patriotic clothing and décor encouraged. As "Votercaders" submit their ballots, they can add a #DropoffDance or #BallotBump, then upload a picture or video to their favorite social media platform and tag 5 friends to a #VotercadeChallenge of their own.

"My friend Bob Globerman initially asked the question, how can we make it fun for voters to fill out their ballots at home and drop them off in person?" asked Stacy Stern, one of the project founders. "I shared this conversation with Erica Nataren, who was introduced to me by a mutual friend, and we landed on the #VotercadeChallenge idea. The three of us met and decided to launch the project, and Erica went to work creating the website."

The new site, <https://www.VotercadeChallenge.com>, gives voters all the info they need to plan their own #VotercadeChallenge.

"A couple of things were really important to us," explains Nataren. "First, while we do have our own political opinions, we wanted this to be a 100% non-partisan effort so that everyone feels comfortable sharing and participating."

"We also wanted it to be something that individuals can do on their own or virtually. We want to encourage participation with neighbors, but sometimes a solo trip is just easier."

This year, when Americans are sharply divided, all three hope to offer something everyone can agree on: that voting can and should be something to look forward to doing - together. ★

**SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)** - The Sacramento Regional Transit District (SacRT) has teamed up with Sacramento County and the Sacramento Kings to drive community members to Vote Center and Ballot Drop Box locations across the Sacramento region to help Drive the Vote.

SacRT is offering free rides system-wide on all bus, light rail, Smart Ride and SacRT GO Paratransit Services to honor the first day of early voting on Saturday, October 24, and a second system-wide free ride day in celebration of Election Day on Tuesday, November 3.

"We hope that Sacramento area voters take advantage of early voting and choose to take transit to help cast their

ballot," said SacRT General Manager/CEO Henry Li. "It is free to vote and SacRT is making it free to drive you to vote."

In addition, SacRT is offering free rides on Smart Ride on-demand microtransit shuttles in

# California Mailed “Massive” Number of Ballots in Error and Risks Voter Fraud

**SAN DIEGO, CA (MPG)** - Reform California releases a bombshell research study providing proof that Californians are being inundated with “bad election ballots” that have been sent by state election officials in error. This report includes results of a survey of voters revealing nearly one-out-of-ten California households have received some kind of “bad ballot” in the mail.

To provide concrete proof of the problems surfaced in the survey, Reform California also provides actual pictures of “bad ballots” and testimonials from voters who say they received duplicate or triplicate ballots for themselves or received ballots for dead people, illegal immigrants, or people who do not even live at their house.

“The evidence in this report is irrefutable proof that California’s voter rolls are a complete mess and the risk of voter fraud in California’s election has never been greater,” said Carl DeMaio, Chairman of Reform California. “When almost one-out-of-ten households in an election in a state are receiving some form of bad ballots that is a massive problem that could impact races that are decided by fractions of a percent in vote totals,” DeMaio warned.

The following are the results from a survey Reform California conducted between October 10-13 using online and text screens of 1251 registered voters (4.4% MOE) in California asking them if their household received any erroneous ballots in the mail:\*

HH Received Multiple Ballots for Same Person-9 at .7%; HH Received Ballots for Wrong Person-98 at 7.8%; HH Received Ballots for Dead Person-8 at .6%; Total Error Rate Per Household-115 at 9.2%\*\*

\*Note:106 responses (8.5%) indicated no ballot had been received yet.  
\*\*Numbers off due to rounding.

## Duplicate Ballots Mailed to Individual Voters

Reform California compiled examples of multiple ballots individual voters received with the exact same name on the ballot but a different voter identification number. While California election officials check to see if a ballot is cast twice using the same voter identification number, systems are not in place to properly review for an individual to vote twice or three times using multiple voter identification numbers. As reflected in the attached examples of bad ballots, “Peggy Smith” in San Diego, CA received one ballot using her familiar name and also received a second ballot for her legal name of “Margaret Smith.”

## Receiving Ballots at Wrong Household

The most common problem identified by Reform California relates to the state mailing ballots to addresses that the individual does not live at. In some cases these erroneously mailed ballots were sent to an individual who no longer lives at the address in question – having moved away long ago. In other cases the ballots were mailed to homes where the current long-time residents had no idea who the individuals were. One individual in Jamul, CA reported and provided proof of receiving 11 extra ballots at their address for individuals who do not live there.

## Ballots for Dead People

Reform California received several reports of deceased individuals receiving ballots – some having died long ago.

## Ballots for Illegal Immigrants

Reform California even captured several examples of illegal immigrants receiving ballots. Detecting this problem is difficult as it requires someone to admit they are not a citizen and not eligible to vote, but several individuals courageously

reported these bad ballots to the study.

## Reasons for California’s Election Problems

Reform California outlines three main reasons why California’s voting system is a mess:

- (1) Flawed Motor Voter Program: The State of California implemented a motor voter program in 2017 that automatically enrolled any individual who got a new driver’s license as a voter. A separate bill passed the same session allowed illegal immigrants to receive new driver’s licenses. California’s motor voter program has been plagued by problems from the outset and state election officials have failed to properly review eligibility requirements for voters that are registered through this program;
- (2) Failure to Maintain Voter Rolls: County election officials do not conduct proper audits or reviews of their voter rolls. A analysis of the voter rolls in California’s 50th Congressional District in December 2019 found an 11% variance between the voter rolls for that district and the National Change of Address (NCOA) database used by the postal service to track individuals who move away from their previous address;
- (3) Failure to Check for Duplicates: A simple way to check for duplicates would be to search every address on the voter rolls and examine any voters at that address who share an exact birth date. In some cases the voters may be twins or triplets, but in most cases this simple search would surface individuals who are registered more than once.

NICU will now be able to accommodate 40 infants in 16 private rooms and eight three-bed pods. The private rooms are available for multiple birth family sets, isolation for infants whose circumstances require it, and a private place for families to say a loving goodbye to NICU babies who, despite every effort, will be unable to survive. The new space also offers parents the opportunity to stay at the bedside of their baby at all times.

“For over 30 years, Mercy San Juan Medical Center’s NICU has been a life-saving resource for families throughout the Sacramento region,” said Mercy San Juan Medical Center president, Michael Korpel. “The new unit will house the remarkable neonatologists and nurses who have made the NICU what it is today and continue to offer this urgently needed, excellent care to our region’s most vulnerable babies.”

Despite caring for many of the sickest and most-fragile infants in the Sacramento region, Mercy San Juan Medical Center’s NICU had a mortality rate of 1.1 percent in 2015 – among the lowest in the nation.

“Thanks to Bob and Star Pepper and numerous other donors and supporters of this project, the department now has the facilities and equipment it needs to continue carrying out its extraordinary life-saving work,” said Kevin Duggan, President and CEO of Mercy Foundation. “It is through this thoughtful generosity of many that the NICU can continue to be a source of comfort, hope and advanced medical care for fragile infants in our community for generations to come.”

With Dignity Health’s commitment of \$35 million to make the new NICU a reality, Mercy Foundation led the efforts to raise community support and donations for the additional \$3,080,000 needed to expand and update the NICU at Mercy San Juan.

“The work they do there is just incredible. They’ve accomplished miracles in very tight quarters. You merely have to look at some of the little babies that can fit in the palm of your hand and realize that they’re able to save their lives so

Star and I are very pleased to have had a role making this new unit possible,” said Bob Pepper.

As most premature babies are in the NICU until they reach what would have been 36 to 40 weeks gestation, they may be in the care of NICU staff for months, with parents who are trying to balance work, caring for family at home, and being at the hospital for their new baby. Central to this initiative was the desire to offer families the opportunity to stay with their infants. Research has shown that these tiny patients have the best chance at survival when they are able to bond with their parents or guardians. The new NICU offers families a comfortable space with enough room in which to nurture their new babies and get to know them. An important element for people like Scott and Cary Boese, who know very well the difficult journey that can come with being parents to babies who need high-level care.

“When we heard news that the new NICU would be built, we were overcome with joy and emotion, because the unit represents more than just additional bed space. It gives our community access to a modern facility, new technology, and room for privacy, so that parents can bond with their fragile children,” said Cary.

The NICU will be up and running to receive its first patient sometime in late October to early November.

# CHP Grant Improves Motorcycle Safety

**SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG).** - The California Highway Patrol (CHP) is stepping up motorcycle safety awareness statewide as part of Get Educated and Ride Safe (GEARS) III, a yearlong, federally funded program focused on educational and enforcement efforts.

The primary goal of GEARS III is to reduce the number of motorcycle-involved crashes and victims. In federal fiscal year (FFY) 2017-18, the number of motorcycle-involved crashes increased approximately 3 percent within CHP

jurisdiction. However, provisional FFY 2018-19 data show a 10 percent decrease.

“The ultimate objective is to improve not just motorcycle safety, but highway safety overall,” CHP Commissioner Warren Stanley said. “The additional education and enforcement funded by GEARS III helps our officers meet this objective.”

During the grant period, the CHP will increase motorcycle safety activities in regions with a high number of motorcycle incidents and participate in traffic safety education campaigns such as “May is Motorcycle Safety Awareness Month.” The campaigns will promote

the use of U.S. Department of Transportation-compliant helmets for all riders and raise motorists’ awareness of sharing the road with motorcyclists. The campaigns will also focus on the most dangerous traffic violations, including speeding, improper turning, and driving under the influence of alcohol and/or drugs.

Funding for this program was provided by a grant from the California Office of Traffic Safety through the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration.

The mission of the CHP is to provide the highest level of Safety, Service, and Security. ★

# CHP to Focus on Reducing Teen Distracted Driving

**SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)** - Nearly six teen drivers are involved in a fatal car crash every day in the United States. Inexperience combined with driver distraction increases the risk for error, making motor vehicle crashes the leading cause of death for young drivers in the nation. To reduce teen distracted driving, the California Highway Patrol (CHP) has partnered with Impact Teen Drivers (ITD) to teach positive habits and behaviors to our most vulnerable drivers through education and enforcement.

Ten percent of all drivers ages 15 to 19 who were involved in fatal crashes were reported as distracted at the time of the crash, and 100 percent of those crashes were preventable. Based on miles driven, the AAA Foundation for Traffic Safety discovered that teens are involved in three times as many fatal crashes as all other drivers. To combat this alarming trend, the message of the ITD program is simple: keep both hands on the wheel, eyes on the road, and mind focused on driving.

“Teen drivers are the most at risk of driving distracted. They are more likely than any other demographic to be involved in traffic crashes where distracted driving is a factor,” said CHP

Commissioner Warren Stanley. “Sadly, many of these crashes will result in injuries and deaths. We hope to help eliminate these preventable deadly crashes.”

The CHP and ITD will conduct virtual classes at schools and community events throughout California during the pandemic to help change the behavior of

teen drivers. The yearlong Teen Distracted Drivers Education and Enforcement X grant provides for an education component as well as enforcement operations to be conducted statewide through September 30, 2021.

“In California we lose the equivalent of eight, large school buses filled with teens each year

to car crashes. Impact Teen Drivers, CHP, and the Office of Traffic Safety (OTS) partner to offer free in-person and online training for parents and teens— together, we can stop the #1 killer of teens,” said Dr. Kelly Browning, Executive Director of ITD.

# Over 2 Million California Voters Signed Up to Track Their Ballot

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - More than 2 million registered California voters have now signed up for California's ballot tracking service "Where's My Ballot?" to receive automated notifications about their vote-by-mail ballots by email, text (SMS), or voice call.

"Signing up for 'Where's My Ballot?' is one of the most prudent steps Californians can take to protect their vote," Secretary of State Alex Padilla said. "Every active, registered voter was sent a vote-by-mail ballot for the General Election, and ballot tracking will play a critical role in strengthening transparency, accountability, and voter confidence during this unprecedented election. All California voters can quickly and easily sign up to track their ballot at [WheresMyBallot.sos.ca.gov](https://WheresMyBallot.sos.ca.gov)."

"Ballot tracking has only been available statewide for a few months, and

we are seeing an incredible adoption rate. Nearly 1 in 10 registered voters has already signed up for the "Where's My Ballot?" tool. If you've already signed-up, encourage your friends and family to do the same," Padilla added.

Voters who sign up for "Where's My Ballot?" will receive automatic updates when the county elections office: mailed the voter's ballot, received the voter's ballot, counted the voter's ballot, and has any issues with the voter's ballot.

Voters who sign up for "Where's My Ballot?" will also receive communications from their county elections office about important election deadlines and critical updates such as polling place changes.

AB 2218, signed 2018, required the Secretary of State's office to provide a ballot tracking service to county elections offices. In response to the COVID-19 pandemic, Governor Newsom signed legislation to expand the ballot tracking tool statewide. ★

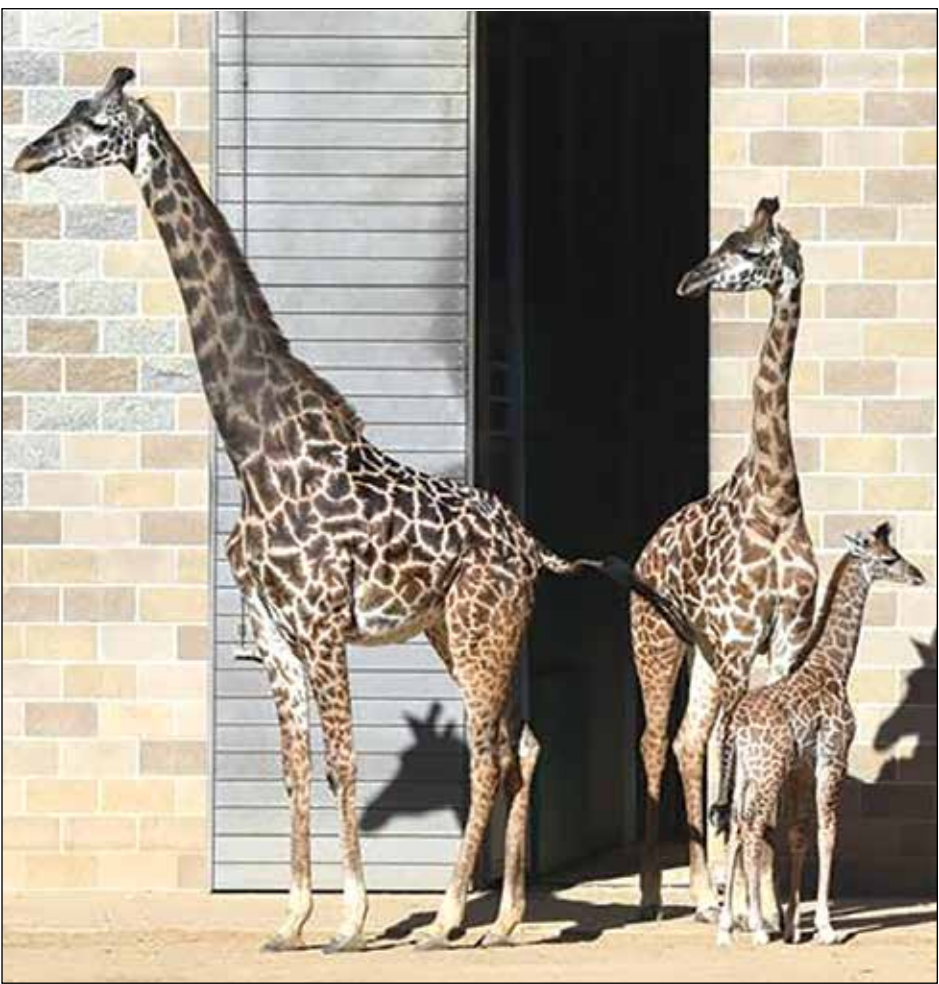

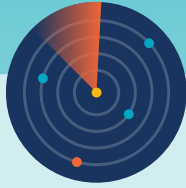

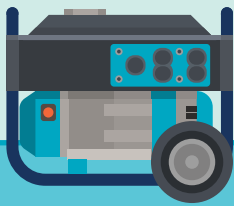

As a scientist, I am trained to look for facts and to seek truth. Running a city is not the same as studying viruses and microbes, but the same commitment to facts and truth guides me as I work to make our city better.

In the current crisis, that training also provides me a unique expertise on what we should, or should not, do to combat COVID and lead us through this crisis.

The COVID shutdown has hit our community hard. To get back on track, the city must work to help our businesses to re-open, recover, and grow again. We must also find a way to open our schools safely, so children can learn and parents can work again.

But we can’t let the current crisis crowd out all the other priorities - like reducing homelessness and the impact it has on our communities and keeping neighborhoods safe.

We have an obligation as human beings to help those in need, but too few give any consideration to the impact homeless is having on our neighborhoods and businesses. I will. At the same time, we can push for a new approach that tackles the causes of homelessness, instead of continuing the

failing “housing first” policy that is little more than a shelter and a sandwich!

Public safety is the single most important job we have in the City of Rancho Cordova. As Mayor and Councilmember I consider this my highest calling and biggest responsibility. Safety is about our Rancho Cordova Police Department and officers - but it is also about Code Enforcement, Building Inspection, Animal Control and our partner public safety agencies.

We are the only city to bring in Probation officers into our Police Department on a permanent basis. These officers give us access to more information about criminals, as well as additional capability to head off some crimes before they even happen. We have also our own dedicated Community Prosecutor from the District Attorney’s Office to ensure issues in our community are dealt with quickly. Thanks to our efforts, we have driven crime down much faster and further than any of the surrounding communities.

We still have more work to do – the COVID-19 crisis has seen prisons releasing prisoners early, restricted our ability to deal with the chronic homeless, and closed far too many businesses. But building our on past successes, I know that we are on the right path to a Rancho Cordova Comeback! ★

Thank you for covering the need to replan the wasteful Capitol Annex Project. # Have Safer Halloween Trick or Treating during COVID-19

**SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG)** - The usual spooky festivities for Halloween may feel extra scary due to the COVID-19 pandemic. However, Sacramento County Public Health has important guidance to help ensure safer trick-or-treating for everyone to reduce the risk of spreading COVID-19. Follow the guidance below to have a fun and safe Halloween!

**FACE COVERINGS**  
Firstly, you will need to wear a face-covering – so why not make it fun! Have your child select their own face covering, and then decorate it together to match their costume.

**SOCIAL DISTANCING**  
When you are out trick-or-treating, travel only with your household members (don't forget – wear your face covering), be sure to maintain 6 feet of social distance from others, and make interactions brief with others outside your household.

**HYGIENE**  
Keep from transferring the virus with your hands. When you touch objects or your face, the virus may be lurking, so wash your hands often and have hand sanitizer handy. Be sure to clean/disinfect high-touch surfaces. Also, have everyone wait to dig into the candy until hands are clean before unwrapping the candy, and then again before eating the candy. Do not share costume props or food. And, of course, if you feel sick or could be contagious, you must stay home and away from others.

**BE READY FOR TRICK-OR-TREATERS**  
This year, you need to make it an outdoor festivity. In an outdoor area, such as a porch or driveway:  
Set up a table to stand behind and hand out candy using candy-grabber or tongs; Make treat bags and hang them from streamers outside for kids to grab; or Place a bowl of candy and bottle of hand sanitizer at the end of the driveway/walkway; and always wear a face-covering around others, don't touch your face, and practice good hand

hygiene when handling candy.

**CELEBRATE A COVID-19 HALLOWEEN CREATIVELY**  
These ideas will help you and others be extra safe while still celebrating Halloween:  
Host a virtual Halloween "watch" party with online video/chat and have best costume or craft project contests; Have a Halloween movie night with household members either at home or drive-in; Do reverse trick-or-treat by dropping off

small gift bags on your neighbor's porch; Put on a trunk-or-treat on your street (Halloween decorated car trunks) with socially distanced parked cars in driveways; Coordinate a contact-free neighborhood scavenger hunt;  
Organize a neighborhood car parade or socially distanced costume parade for best decorations/costume and give treat bags or toss candy (preferably with candy grabbers).

Read about all the usual Halloween precautions you will need to have in place

**LET'S GO OVER THE "NO-NO'S"**  
Don't have trick-or-treaters walk up to your door to give candy and don't use your hands to deliver treats. If you are not feeling well or are exhibiting symptoms, do not go out in the public. To clarify, gatherings with individuals outside of your household are not allowed. The reason for this is because the virus is widespread in Sacramento County and you or those at the gathering may not know if someone is COVID-19 positive and contagious.

Due to our high-risk level, Sacramento County has been placed in a restrictive Tier by the State. It is for your safety and of others that gatherings are prohibited. In early summer, the County had bent the COVID-19 case "curve," but gatherings caused a spike in new COVID-19 cases and the ripple effect is still with us. We know social distancing works and if we adhere to the protocol, our COVID-19 cases will continue to go down. If you do disregard the Order – at the very least, do it smarter – keep gatherings small, outdoors, wear face coverings and with only those in your "regular bubble."

**AN IMPORTANT MESSAGE ABOUT COVID-19 TESTING**  
Have you spent time with people outside of your household and you weren't able to physically distance? You may have been exposed unknowingly to the COVID virus – you should get tested. The public is encouraged to get tested regularly. Sacramento County has 11 locations to get tested for COVID-19 for anyone living in the County (2 years old+). Testing is free, appointment times are easy to get, and results are provided in 1-3 days. Also, having the public get regular testing in our County gives the State more precise data so that the Case Rate isn't adjusted higher when Tier levels are determined.

Proposition 16 Promotes Racial Discrimination

Out-of-Work Californians Urge Governor to Expedite Unemployment Benefits

Parents and Students for Racial Equality in California is opposing a measure that would result in legal racial discrimination in California. Proposition 16, an initiative on this November’s ballot, threatens to introduce institutionalized and legal race-based admissions in our public universities, as well as contracting and hiring policies in all California government settings.

“Although recent polling shows that this measure is struggling to gain traction with California voters, organizations opposed to racial discrimination must remain vigilant,” said organization spokesman and former California State Senate Minority Leader Bob Huff. “Proposition 16 represents a step backwards to the darkest days of this country, when racial discrimination was openly tolerated and encouraged. This is contrary to the fundamental principles upon which this nation was built and for which so many fought to secure. The Declaration of Independence tells us all men are created equal. Proposition 16 tells us that some are more equal and deserving than others.”

Proposition 16 would allow supporters to impose across the board, racial guidelines for all California public school and public university admissions and settings. It would also allow schools, colleges and other government agencies to discriminate in employment,

promotions and contracting. The measure seeks to overturn Proposition 209, which appeared on the November 1996 ballot and passed with a strong 54 percent majority in support. Proposition 209 amended the state constitution to prohibit state government institutions from considering race, sex, or ethnicity, specifically in the areas of public employment, public contracting or public education.

Recent polling conduction by the Public Policy Institute of California (PPIC) revealed that barely one-third of the state’s voters appear to support the idea of racial discrimination. Nearly half are opposed to the proposal and some remain unopposed. A second poll conducted by the Berkeley Institute of Governmental Studies divulged nearly identical findings.

“No person in California should ever be told that they cannot be admitted to a university or not awarded a job or contract because they are the wrong color or sex,” said Huff. “Discriminating on the basis of race, color, sex or religion represents the darkest part of California’s history. Measures like Proposition 16 only serve to divide our state at a time when everyone is needed to work together to heal wounds and create a brighter future.”

Parents and Students for Racial Equality is an organization that fights for the rights of all California citizens, regardless of race or color, and believes that government must judge all people equally, without discrimination. ★

**SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)** - Standing in front of California’s Employment Development Department (EDD) headquarters, seven residents of Northern California urged Governor Newsom to be more hands-on with helping those in need. Like millions of Californians, these residents lost their jobs after the Governor triggered a shutdown of businesses and ordered a shelter-in-place for all Californians.

“The experiences of out-of-work Californians and EDD’s lack of action are shameful,” said Senator Jim Nielsen (R-Tehama). “The Governor and his Administration must do better to serve the people who elected him. Californians deserve better.”

Waiting for unemployment benefits has been a shared frustrating, infuriating and devastating experience.

Phone calls are cut off after hours of waiting on hold. Mails and emails gone unanswered. Endless requests for legal documents that are not always related to the applicant’s claims, has resulted in a nerve-racking game of waiting.

With the support Senator Jim Nielsen, Sacramento area residents spoke up for the 1.6 million Californians who are still waiting for their benefits.

“Action must be taken now to help those who are waiting for their benefits,” said La Toya Horne of Sacramento. “I don’t want anyone else to deal with the humiliation and bureaucratic obstacles I had to endure. I lost my home. No one should have to lose their home while waiting for a benefit they have earned and deserved.”

Ms. Horne owned a thriving salon in an upscale part of town. She applied for unemployment in March when salons were forced to close. Months later, a stranger contacted Ms. Horne through social media to inform her that mail from EDD arrived at his house. She had lived at that address 10 years ago. When she amended her application and updated her identification, EDD told her she needed a judge to resolve the issue. They later reversed their decision.

Resolved in her passion to help others, Ms. Megan Williams drove nearly 100 miles to urge the Newsom Administration to act swiftly to get benefits to applicants.

“It is very disheartening to see the lack of urgency. I feel bad for the people who are not as lucky to have others to lean on financially, or who have landlords that are not as understanding as mine. The stress of having to call phone companies, credit cards companies, etc. to work

out payment plans or shifting debt from one credit card to another, just to maintain on time payments, or keep things turned on, is unnecessary,” Ms. Williams stated.

EDD just emerged from a two weeks closure that left an estimated 100,000 people unable to apply for benefits. The hiatus was supposed to “reset” its operations and implement a new system. However, Senator Nielsen’s office was informed Tuesday that the backlog to review claims went from eight weeks to 11 weeks.

Understanding the financial and mental toll of waiting for EDD’s sloth-like movements, Mr. Rick Walters of Yuba City joined the call to ask the Governor to immediately take action to help those who have lost their jobs due to the government-imposed lock-down.

“Government is supposed to work for us when we need help. We are law-abiding taxpayers. This experience was beyond stressful. As Governor, you need to act now to protect our citizens of this state,” Mr. Walters appealed.

Like the 1.6 million residents still waiting for their benefits, Ms. April Carlton of Citrus Heights has been able to meet most of her financial obligations thanks to her close-knit family.

As an office manager and bookkeeper at a small business, Ms. Carlton’s hours were reduced and she was later furloughed. EDD denied her claim based on a name change in 2018. Ms. Carlton provided EDD with judgment orders for the name change, immigration papers and proof of residence. Despite providing all legal documents, Ms. Carlton is still waiting for her backdated benefits.

“Thank God for the support of my family. Without them, I would not have been able to handle this financially straining and emotionally infuriating process,” said Ms. Carlton.

Sherri Bailey of Rancho Cordova, along with her 82-year-old mother, joined the group to remind EDD officials of their commitment during the Great Recession to the public and lawmakers.

“They are not keeping the promise they made in 2008. They owe it to Californians to tell us what they did do to serve the public. Clearly, their system is still broken.”

Elected to the State Senate in January 2013, Senator Nielsen represents the Fourth Senate District, which includes the counties of Butte, Colusa, Glenn, Placer, Sacramento, Sutter, Tehama and Yuba. **Defendant Sentenced for Human Trafficking, Pimping & Pandering**

**CASE:** Kenneth Hawkins (Case #20FE004144)  
**PROSECUTOR:** Deputy District Attorney Courtney Martin, Human Trafficking Unit

On October 16, 2020, the Honorable Steve White sentenced Kenneth Hawkins to 40 years in state prison. On September 17, 2020, a jury convicted Hawkins of human trafficking, pimping and pandering.

On March 1, 2020, the Sacramento Police Department received a report from a witness that Hawkins was forcing the victim to perform oral sex on another man in a parking lot on Franklin Boulevard. When officers located Hawkins and the victim, the victim disclosed that Hawkins had been forcing her to engage in prostitution. The victim also told officers that on that day, Hawkins was angry at her and humiliated her by forcing her to perform oral sex on another man in the parking lot as his friends stood by and taunted her. Friends of Hawkins filmed a portion of the crime and posted the video on social media. Officers located the video as well as other surveillance video that corroborated the reports of the witness and the victim.

**Elk Grove Man Sentenced for Sexually Abusing Four Young Girls**

**DATE:** October 9, 2020  
**CASE:** Alejandro Padilla (Case #19FE020867)  
**PROSECUTOR:** Principal Criminal Attorney Hilary Bagley-Franzoia, Animal Cruelty Unit

The Honorable Patrick Marlette sentenced Alejandro Padilla to 10 years in state prison. On August 11, 2020, Padilla pled to 11 counts of intentional and malicious animal cruelty. In two of the counts, Padilla admitted to a use of weapon allegation, which qualify those convictions as separate and serious felonies under California’s Three Strikes Law. By operation of law, and upon his release from prison, Padilla will not be allowed to own, possess, care for, maintain or reside with any animal for 10 years.

Between August and September 2018, Padilla lived with his girlfriend in college housing. In that one-month period, Padilla committed multiple acts of torture to his girlfriend’s small dog. When the dog ultimately died from his acts, Padilla discarded the remains on the Sacramento City College campus. He later recovered and cleaned the dog before representing to his girlfriend that her dog had escaped their apartment and was hit by a car. The girlfriend greatly mourned her dog and believed Padilla. In December 2018, the girlfriend replaced her beloved pet with a new puppy. By early February 2019, Padilla had killed the puppy by asphyxiation. He later confessed to his girlfriend and law enforcement that he had committed repeated similar acts of torture to both dogs. The girlfriend reported Padilla to the City of Sacramento Front Street Shelter.

This case was investigated by the Sacramento Police Department and the Sacramento County Animal Cruelty Task Force.

**Defendant Sentenced for Violently Attacking Two Elderly Women**

**DATE:** October 16, 2020  
**CASE:** Edward Thomas (Case #19FE021541)  
**PROSECUTOR:** Deputy District Attorney Frederick Gotha, Elder Abuse Unit

The Honorable James Arguelles sentenced Edward Thomas to 11 years and 8 months in state prison. On September 16, 2020, a jury convicted Thomas of two counts of elder abuse with great bodily injury enhancements and two counts of battery causing serious bodily injury.

On November 30, 2019, Edward Thomas attacked his elderly 72-year-old sister and 94-year-old mother. The attack occurred when his sister asked him to keep marijuana smoke from wafting through the house. Both victims were taken to the UCD Medical Center and treated for significant injuries. One victim suffered a broken nose, fractured orbital bone, scalp hematoma, wounds to her head requiring 20 staples, fractured ribs, fractured fingers

Republican senators requested subpoenas for the heads of Facebook and Twitter to testify before the Senate. “You have big tech oligarchs declaring war on Donald Trump, on the Republican Party, on conservatives across America,” Cotton said on a Trump campaign press call on Thursday. “Refusing to allow people to post the url of a story, and then they just issue a mealy-mouthed apology saying that they could have communicated better...that is not exactly the standard that big tech oligarchs apply to every story about Donald Trump for the last five years,” he said. “And for all of those tech oligarchs who think they can get away with this, I will simply say that winter is coming.”

**Rep. Ken Buck demands DOJ investigate removal of big tech protections after censoring of NYPost Biden article** | 14 Oct 2020 | Rep. Ken Buck, R-Colo., sent a letter to the Department of Justice on Wednesday, asking the attorney general to look into accusations of censorship by Twitter and Facebook, after the big tech giants took steps to limit the exposure of a New York Post article critical of Hunter Biden. “I write to express my concerns regarding Twitter and Facebook’s recent actions to censor a prominent American news outlet,” Buck began. “These actions violate the platform’s immunity under Section 230 of the Communications Decency Act and threaten to chill free speech throughout our nation.” The NY Post story, entitled “Smoking-gun email reveals how Hunter Biden introduced Ukrainian businessman to VP dad,” touched upon reports that the former vice president's son had unscrupulous financial and business ties to a natural gas firm in Ukraine – Burisma Holdings – and that his father later stepped in to have a probing prosecutor fired for looking into the matter.

**Twitter Locks Trump Campaign Account Over Hunter Biden Post - Spokesman** | 15 Oct 2020 | Trump's reelection campaign said Thursday that Twitter suspended its official account, claiming that Team Trump's post about Democratic presidential nominee Joe Biden and his son, Hunter, is a violation of its policy. “Your account has been locked,” the Twitter message said. “What happened? We have determined that this account violated the Twitter Rules. Specifically, for: Violating our rules against posting private information.” The account was active and posting on Twitter again hours after campaign officials first said it had been locked. The original campaign post which Trump campaign spokesman Tim Murtaugh said triggered Twitter to take action was apparently taken down. The incident came less than three weeks from the Nov. 3 election.

**California wildfire that killed 4 may have been sparked by power line equipment** –The Zogg Fire erupted in Shasta County in September and destroyed over 200 structures | 11 Oct 2020 | Investigators in California probing the cause of a recent wildfire that killed four people have taken possession of equipment belonging to Pacific Gas and Electric, the utility said Friday. In a filing with the California Public Utilities Commission, PG&E said investigators with the California Department of Forestry and Fire Protection (Cal Fire) have taken some of its equipment as part of the ongoing investigation into the Zogg Fire. The Zogg Fire erupted in Shasta County on Sept. 27 as high winds were impacting the region, quickly growing into a blaze that has consumed at least 56,338 acres. The fire killed four people in the community of Igo and later spread into neighboring Tehama County. ★

I know it is October, but I would like to get prepared and really cannot find the answer online or at the Medicare.gov website. Please inform me what are the 2021 Medicare Part D costs.

You are correct that the 2021 Medicare and You handbook did leave some information out regarding the 2021 Medicare Part D deductibles or out of pocket maximums.

But guess what?? For the Toni Says® Medicare newspaper column readers, we have a big surprise! I know what the Medicare Part D cost, copays, and Donut Hole out of pocket will be beginning January 1, 2021.

2021 Medicare Part D costs and copays are explained below:

Part D changes for 2021 are:

- **Initial Deductible:** will be increased by \$10 from \$435 in 2020 to \$445 in 2021.
- **Initial Coverage Limit:** will increase by \$120 from \$4,020 in 2020 to \$4,130 in 2021 where the 2021 “Donut Hole” begins.
- **Out-of-Pocket threshold cost: or (TrOOP true out of pocket)** will increase from \$6,350 in 2020 to \$6,550 in 2021.
- **Coverage Gap (Donut Hole):** begins once you reach your Medicare Part D plan’s initial coverage limit (\$4,130 in 2021) and ends when you spend a total of \$6,550 out-of-pocket in 2021.
- **Does the Donut Hole really go away?** In 2020, the Donut Hole began being called Donut Hole Discount.
- **What is the Donut Hole Discount?** Part

D enrollees will receive a 75% **Donut Hole discount** on the total cost of their **brand-name** drugs purchased while in the Donut Hole. The discount includes, a 70% discount paid by the brand-name drug manufacturer and a 5% discount paid by your Medicare Part D plan. The 70% paid by the drug manufacturer, 5% Part D plan discount combined with the 25% you pay, count toward your TrOOP or Donut Hole exit point.

- **Generic Drug** when one reaches Medicare Part D Donut Hole: pay a maximum of 25% co-pay on generic drugs purchased while in the Coverage Gap (receiving a 75% discount). For example: If you reach the 2021 Donut Hole, and your generic medication has a retail cost of \$100, you will pay \$25. The \$25 that you spend will count toward your TrOOP or Donut Hole exit point.

- **Lower costs** when one comes out of the Donut Hole and enter Catastrophic coverage until December 31 and then a new year begins. Then the Medicare Part D cycle begins again with a new deductible on January 1 of every year.

Toni’s Tips:

1. During Medicare’s Annual Enrollment Period from October 15 th to December 7 th be sure that all your prescriptions are covered by a new standalone Medicare Part D plan or a Medicare Advantage plan with prescriptions which will begin January 1st .
2. Remember you will pay 100% of the cost if any prescriptions (generic or brand name) are not covered on your Medicare Part D plan.
3. Talk to your doctor or doctors about which brand name drugs can be changed to generics.
4. Get samples from your doctor.

**Do not forget ...**There is a penalty for not enrolling in a Medicare Part D Prescription Drug plan when you first become eligible to enroll.

Misusing Taxpayers’ Money for Campaigns

California voters are not only voting on presidential, congressional, legislative and local government offices and a dozen statewide ballot measures but deciding the fate of 234 local tax and bond measures.

The California Taxpayers Association estimates that if passed, the local tax measures would raise about \$1.5 billion a year in new revenues. The proposed bond issues, mostly for schools, total nearly \$15 billion and their passage would automatically trigger increases in property taxes to repay lenders.

These are hefty financial stakes and the local officials that placed measures on the ballot have reason to worry about their passage. Voters rejected 62% of the 239 local measures on the March 3 primary ballot — and that was before the COVID-19 pandemic struck home, the state’s economy plummeted and more than two million jobs were erased.

The recession that’s still raging is a two-edged sword for local government and school officials. It has cut their tax revenues sharply and also tends to make voters even more leery about paying higher taxes.

City council members, county supervisors and school trustees are tempted, in their zeal to persuade voters to vote for new taxes and bonds, to violate a state law prohibiting them from using taxpayer funds for campaign purposes.

Government Code Section 54964 forthrightly declares, “An officer, employee, or consultant of a local agency may not expend or authorize the expenditure of any of the funds of the local agency to support or oppose the approval or rejection of a ballot measure, or the election or defeat of a candidate, by the voters.”

In fact, such violations have become commonplace in recent years. Under the guise of providing “information,” local officials routinely hire campaign management firms to design advertisements, mailers and other material aimed at persuading voters to pass the proposed taxes and bonds.

They have done so because they know that state and local prosecutors just as routinely refuse to prosecute violations of Section 54964 by their fellow officeholders.

The only investigative agency to interest itself in such violations is the California Fair Political Practices Commission and while the FPPC lacks authority to enforce Section 54964, it can treat agencies that step over the line dividing information from advocacy as campaign contributors.

Recently, for example, the FPPC targeted the County of Los Angeles, which in 2017

spent a million dollars for an ill-disguised, but successful, campaign to pass Measure H, a quarter-cent increase in the sales tax. The campaign included broadcast commercials in English and Spanish that used the slogan “Real Help. Lasting Change.”

County officials, without admitting liability, agreed to pay the FPPC a \$1.35 million penalty for failing to report their spending as a campaign contribution. However, that pales in comparison to the estimated \$355 million a year that Measure H’s passage will generate.

Last week, the FPPC invited the public to use its “AdWATCH” program to monitor the materials local officials are using to promote their tax and bond measures and upload questionable items to the agency for examination and perhaps investigation.

“The public can play a vital role in helping our enforcement division in making sure campaigns and public agencies are following the rules and ensuring a level playing field,” FPPC Chair Richard C. Miadich said in a statement.

The FPPC’s efforts are welcome, despite being an indirect and relatively weak way of discouraging improper use of taxpayer funds for campaigns, but it’s likely to be the only way as long as prosecutors refuse to enforce the law.

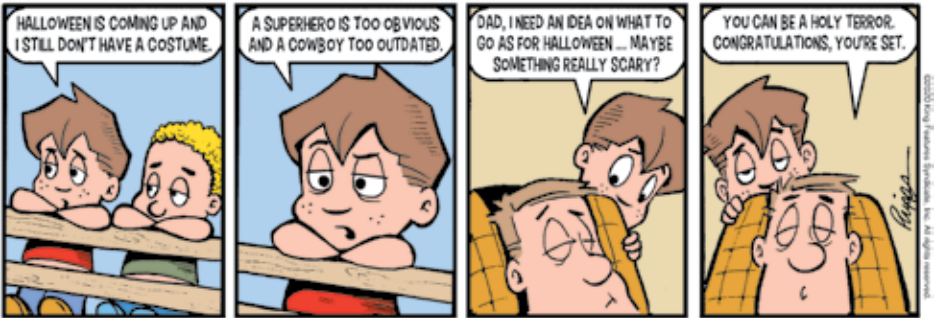

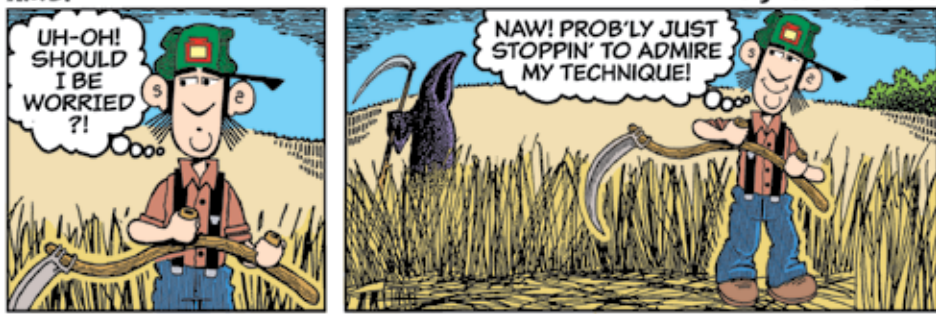
