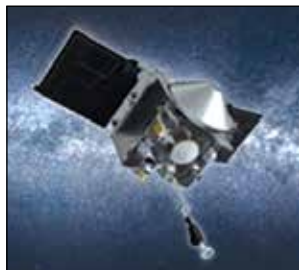

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - At the October 22 Board of Education meeting an update on school reopening was presented along with the District's goals of minimizing

disruption for students and staff, while concurrently maintaining health and safety precautions and delivering the highest level of instruction possible for all students.

**Here's How
California Keeps
Early Votes Secret**

Some county registrars lock up equipment and threaten dismissal to protect California's early votes from being tallied before election day.

The state legislature changed election law this year so election officials could scan ballots as they come in, to deal with an expected crush of ballots well before election day. Officials wanted to be sure the count wouldn't be slowed by the decision to send each voter a mail ballot because of the pandemic.

Ballots have been coming in at a record pace. As of today, 32 percent of voters already returned their ballots, according to Political Data Inc.'s ballot tracker.

County elections departments are processing the ballots, but not compiling vote totals.

"(U)nder no circumstances may a vote count be accessed or released until 8 p.m. on the day of the election," the election code states. No one wants to influence the outcome of a race by releasing vote counts before the polls close.

Yet once a ballot is scanned, doesn't a computer take over? Isn't a vote total in there somewhere? Couldn't someone take a peek at it?

No, elections officials say. Scanning starts the process but doesn't total the votes.

"We don't generate any reports to know what the result is until election night," said Michael Vu, registrar of voters for San Diego County.

Just to make sure there's no trickery, the tabulator is kept under lock and key in a separate room, he said. Only the few people who must tabulate votes have access and even they must sign in at the door. Vu said he doesn't even have keycard access to the room. There's video surveillance of the equipment, too.

Keeping scanning and tabulation systems separate appears to be common in California. Forty of the state's 58 counties use the same tabulation system as San Diego County, according to a list from the Secretary of State's office.

Shasta County uses the same system. Counting votes involves two servers, said Cathy Darling Allen,

The Speed of Trust

Newsom wants statewide panel to review any COVID vaccine

Coronavirus vaccines approved by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration in coming months will not be distributed in California until a statewide panel of health experts can ensure they meet safety requirements, Gov. Gavin Newsom announced Monday, October 19, 2020.

While there is no vaccine available yet, California and other states have been gearing up for its eventual distribution. On Friday, California sent a draft of its vaccination plan to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. In the draft, state officials said a scientific safety review workgroup, made up of immunization and public health experts from

agencies and universities across the state, will help "ensure public confidence in vaccine safety,

efficacy, and implementation efforts."

Other states also have created committees to

review any coming vaccine in response to concerns that the Trump administration

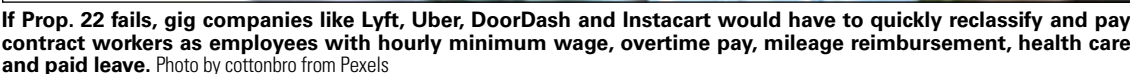

“At the end, when you’re really fighting it out, going to court can accomplish two things,” said Jessica Levinson, a law professor and Director of Loyola Law School’s Public Service Institute.



“You can try and vindicate your rights, but it also shows to the world the seriousness of what you’re saying.”

For large labor unions and a new crop of gig worker advocacy groups like Gig Workers Rising and Rideshare Drivers United, Prop. 22 and the labor law it attempts to evade are a proxy war over workers’ rights in an increasingly digital economy where stability can be elusive. But gig companies, in the process of shifting from quirky startups to multibillion-dollar public companies chasing profitability, are seizing the pandemic to argue that their on-demand contract jobs still get cash into the hands of workers faster than traditional jobs or government programs.

“Uber, Lyft and other gig work provides a safety net for Americans that unemployment checks cannot,” the Yes on 22 campaign argued in a statement last week. Labor groups counter that the companies have long

gone to extremes to avoid traditional costs of doing business, like unemployment insurance taxes, minimum wage and health care.

“Think about what they could be spending all of that campaign money on,” Oakland ride-hailing driver Mekela Edwards said during a No on 22 campaign event last week, ticking off worker benefits like paid sick leave and protective equipment for drivers during the pandemic.

If Prop. 22 fails, gig companies like Lyft, Uber, DoorDash and Instacart would have to quickly reclassify and pay contract workers as employees with hourly minimum wage, overtime pay, mileage reimbursement, health care and paid leave. If Prop. 22 passes, the ballot measure would keep drivers independent contractors and guarantee pay of 120% of minimum wage, partial health care subsidies, partial expense reimbursements and accident insurance – though the

narrower benefits would be based on engaged time, or only when a passenger or order is in the car, leaving unpaid the roughly 30% of time drivers spend waiting for work. Prop. 22 also requires a 7/8 “super, super, super-duper majority” for lawmakers to make changes later.

Drivers are divided on the measure. While AB 5 and current state law would not require the companies to change drivers’ schedules, Uber and Lyft have argued in court that it doesn’t make sense to allow full-fledged employees to log in and out as they please, spurring some drivers to support Prop. 22 to keep their flexible schedules. Drivers opposed to Prop. 22 say they should be guaranteed the same legal protections as workers in other industries, even if gig companies have to change their business models in the process. Some also favor the ability to unionize and bargain commissions like taxi drivers, which

Prop. 22 would prohibit.

Uber and Lyft have both threatened to pull out of California or cut hundreds of thousands of jobs if forced to treat drivers as employees, which labor advocates say fits a pattern of businesses bluffing or overstating the financial impacts of new regulations. Other corporate interests like Chevron, Mercury Insurance, dialysis giant DaVita and the real estate industry have spent big on past ballot measures with high financial stakes, but Levinson said Prop. 22 is a different kind of campaign.

“Those were ballot measures that affected the businesses, but not the relationship of the businesses and the workers,” Levinson said. With both sides in the Prop. 22 battle suggesting that they’re looking out for workers’ best interests, “People are not lined up the way you necessarily think they would be” on the measure, Levinson said. One poll found that 40% of those who voted Yes on Prop. 22 did so to ensure drivers earn a living wage, even though the measure offers fewer benefits and pay estimates vary widely.

In addition to the unprecedented campaign cash and high bar for amending Prop. 22, another open question is whether the measure could inspire other industries to take more of their own labor disputes to voters. As it stands, Prop. 22 has a narrow lead in the polls.

“This is what we always say with ballot initiatives: If business wins here, then every other business is going to put on a ballot initiative to try and win a favorable outcome,” Levinson said. “Sure, if they have this much money to spend.”

Sacramento State Sets Enrollment Record Amid Ongoing Pandemic, Virtual Learning

SACRAMENTO, CA. (MPG) - WHAT: Sacramento State has reached another year of record enrollment with 31,510 students registered for classes in Fall 2020, a 1% increase over last year.

In addition, the University retained an impressive 84% of first-year students and more than 90% of transfer students who are committed to continuing their education.

"These gains clearly demonstrate that an increasing number of Sac State students are steadily engaging in their studies and advancing toward a timely graduation," said James Dragna, executive director for University Initiatives and Student Success.

Sac State is among a select number of universities successfully going against enrollment trends. A National Student Clearinghouse Research Center study calculates national undergraduate

enrollments are down 2.5% from last year.

Dragna said Sac State's figures point to a commitment by Sacramento State faculty, staff and administration to continue to serve students in new and creative ways despite the difficulties posed by COVID-19.

The progress supports the California State University's Graduation Initiative 2025, including Sacramento State's "Finish in Four" and "Through in Two" campaigns.

registrar of voters. They are separate. The first server stores data generated by the scanners that read the ballots. The second is a reporting and tabulation server that runs a different program.

"That's the server we use on election night," she said. Both are kept in a protected area.

No one can sneak in, run the numbers and take a peek without getting caught, said Joseph Holland, registrar of voters of Santa Barbara County. "They'd be fired" if

they did, he said.

For security, Holland said two people are required to access the tabulator. And whenever anyone accesses the tabulation server, it creates a permanent record called an audit log that cannot be removed from the system.

Finally, the equipment is not connected to the Internet. That's the law to thwart hackers and prevent tampering.


It's amazing how things change. This year it's not a culture but a virus that will change things. Please stay safe and pray for a better 2021 Halloween for all! ★

SMUD’s South Fork Powerhouse Hydroelectric Project Goes Operational

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - SMUD’s new 2.7-megawatt hydroelectric powerhouse is now operational on the American River near Camino. Electricity from the new South Fork Powerhouse will supplement generation from an existing powerhouse at Slab Creek Dam. Because the new powerhouse is considered a “small hydro” project (less than 30 megawatts), the electricity it produces will count toward the state Renewable Portfolio Standard. The project received \$1.5 million in U.S. Department of Energy grant funding.

The powerhouse project includes a boating flow release facility and is located just below Slab Creek Dam, about one-quarter mile downstream. This enhances whitewater boating flows on a 9-mile stretch downstream of the reservoir, improves raft and kayak put-in areas, and provides more boat parking and space. Boating flows will be released from the new facility, rather than from spilling water over Slab Creek Dam.

The powerhouse and boating flow release facility will also enable water releases from the dam for environmental needs, including enhancing fish habitat. The enhancements are required in the current 50-year license issued by the

Federal Energy Regulatory Commission for SMUD to operate its hydroelectric power plants in the Sierra Nevada, known as the Upper American River Project. The UARP is SMUD’s “Stairway of Power”—a system of hydroelectric generation facilities that provides nearly 700 megawatts of low-cost, clean, non-carbon-emitting hydro power, enough to provide about 15 to 20 percent of SMUD’s energy capacity during an average year.

Construction on the powerhouse began in April 2017 with commercial operation commencing September 25, 2020.

“The new South Fork Powerhouse allows us to generate more carbon-free renewable energy,” said SMUD Chief Energy Delivery Officer Frankie McDermott. “The boating flow release facility provides more accurate and safer recreational water flows for boaters while complying with the boating release requirements of the federal 50-year license.”

The South Fork Powerhouse project comes online as SMUD awaits transition closing of the Chili Bar hydro facility down river on the American. SMUD purchased the facility from PG&E last year. Chili Bar is also considered renewable by the state of California and adds another 7 megawatts to SMUD’s renewable portfolio. ★

Available: IRS Form 1040-X Electronic Filing

WASHINGTON, DC (MPG) - Marking a major milestone in tax administration, the Internal Revenue Service announced that taxpayers can now submit Form 1040-X electronically with commercial tax-filing software.

As IRS e-filing has grown during the past 30 years, the 1040-X, Amended U.S. Individual Income Tax Return, has been one of the last major individual tax forms that needed to be paper filed. The announcement follows years of effort by the IRS, and the enhancement allows taxpayers to quickly electronically correct previously filed tax returns while minimizing errors.

“The ability to file the Form 1040-X electronically has been an important long-term goal of the IRS e-file initiative for many years,” said Sunita Lough, IRS Deputy Commissioner for Services and Enforcement. “Given the details needed on the form, there have been numerous challenges to add this form to the e-file family. Our IT and business operation teams worked hard with the nation’s tax industry to make this change possible. This is another success for IRS modernization efforts. The addition helps taxpayers have a quicker, easier way to file amended returns, and it streamlines work for the IRS and the entire tax community.”

Making the 1040-X an electronically filed form has been a goal for the tax software and tax professional industry for years. It’s been a continuing recommendation from the Internal Revenue Service Advisory Council

(IRSAC) and Electronic Tax Administration Advisory Committee (ETAAC).

Currently, taxpayers must mail a completed Form 1040-X to the IRS for processing. The new electronic option allows the IRS to receive amended returns faster while minimizing errors normally associated with manually completing the form.

Since the tax-filing software allows users to input their data in a question-answer format, it simplifies the process for them. It also makes it easier for IRS employees to answer taxpayer questions since the data is entered electronically and submitted to the agency almost simultaneously.

“Adding the 1040-X to the e-filing portfolio provides a better experience for the taxpayer, all around. It makes submitting an amended return easier and it allows our employees to process it in a more efficient way,” said Ken Corbin, the IRS Wage and Investment commissioner and head of the division responsible for processing these returns.

For the initial phase, only tax year 2019 Forms 1040 and 1040-SR returns can be amended electronically. Additional improvements are planned for the future.

About 3 million Forms 1040-X are filed by taxpayers each year.

Taxpayers still have the option to submit a paper version of the Form 1040-X and should follow the instructions for preparing and submitting the paper form. Those filing their Form 1040-X electronically and on paper can use the “Where’s My Amended Return?” online tool to check the status of their amended return. ★

Causeway Connection Service Improvements Launched

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - The Sacramento Regional Transit District (SacRT) and Yolo County Transportation District (Yolobus) are reminding riders that the Causeway Connection zero emission bus service between Davis and Sacramento has added additional service.

The Causeway Connection will now have all-day service once an hour Monday through Friday. All trips will serve the Mondavi Center, Genome Facility, and the Silo in Davis and the UC Davis Medical

Center in Sacramento. SacRT and Yolobus operate the Causeway Connection service in tandem.

The Causeway Connection service was developed in partnership between SacRT, Yolobus, UC Davis, UC Davis Health and the City of Sacramento, as well as Electrify America, which provided funding for the electric buses and charging infrastructure. Due to the impacts of COVID-19, the service began with a modified schedule on May 4 with only 10 trips per day. On September 28, the number of bus trips will increase

to 30 trips per day, which begins at the start of the new UC Davis school year.

100% zero emission electric-battery buses; Free Wi-Fi and USB charging; 100% accessible with space for up to two wheelchairs; Secure bike rack; Real-time bus tracker using transit apps; The 12 Proterra buses were purchased by Electrify America, the Volkswagen subsidiary, as part of its \$44 million Green City initiative to promote electric vehicle adoption in Sacramento.

He was a source of great pride to the Russian community. Officer Stasyuk was a beloved son, brother and husband. He is survived by his wife, Amy, as well as his mother, father and younger sister. Officer Stasyuk had a great love

of the outdoors, especially fishing and diving. He was a devout Christian and demonstrated his faith in his daily life. He was a friend to be counted on and exuded a positive attitude and infectious smile. RCPD received an outpouring of support from our community in the wake of the death of Officer Stasyuk. FBI Reminds Public about Election Security and Foreign Influences during Elections

SACRAMENTO - The Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) Sacramento Field Office is reminding the public about election security information resources and how to report alleged election crimes ahead of the November 3, 2020, general election. The FBI is continually coordinating national messaging about election security on fbi.gov/elections and across its social media platforms. The FBI's goal is to increase public awareness and to inform Americans how they can help ensure a safe and secure election. For decades, the FBI has served as the primary law enforcement agency investigating federal election crimes. This includes investigating allegations of voter and ballot fraud, campaign finance crimes, civil rights violations, unique cyber threats targeting the election process, and threats posed by foreign governments and actors. The FBI is also the lead federal agency for identifying and combating malign foreign influence operations targeting our democratic institutions through the FBI's Foreign Influence Task Force (FITF). The FITF brings together all FBI authorities and capabilities from multiple divisions to include counterintelligence, cyber, criminal, and counterterrorism assets to coordinate and work together to combat the threat. "Every American should be free to vote without interference or discrimination and

have their vote count," said Special Agent in Charge Sean Ragan, who leads the FBI Sacramento Field Office. "The FBI is committed to ensuring safe, secure elections and thwarting the actions of any foreign actors who may attempt to influence our elections for their own political or national interests. Our office continues to engage with law enforcement partners and election security officials to ensure the security of our national elections and preservation of this important civic right." Each state has primary responsibility for conducting free and fair elections within its borders. The FBI Sacramento Field Office serves communities located in 34 of California's 58 counties and is in continuous contact with election partners including the California Secretary of State, Justice Department, U.S. Department of Homeland Security, U.S. Postal Inspection Service, and other agencies. Together, we stand ready to investigate federal election crimes, identifying and assessing potential threats, and to protecting the public's constitutional right to vote. On November 12, 2008, the Communications Center received a 9-1-1 call from a resident stating that an accident had occurred in front of her residence and a Rancho Cordova motor unit had been involved. Witnesses stated Officer Lawrence W. Canfield had his lights and siren on and was attempting to overtake a speeding vehicle when another vehicle turned in front of him, causing severe injuries. Officer Canfield

was transported to a local hospital, but despite heroic measures, succumbed to his injuries. Officer Canfield, a second generation Deputy Sheriff, was a 13-year veteran of the Sacramento County Sheriff's Office and assigned to the Traffic Unit in the City of Rancho Cordova in 2004. He was a hard worker and took pride in protecting the residents of Rancho Cordova and the surrounding county. He was admired and respected by his fellow law enforcement officers. Officer Canfield's signature was the unlit cigar hanging out of his mouth, while he patrolled the streets of Rancho Cordova. Among the many off-duty activities Officer Canfield enjoyed, camping and boating with his family was his favorite. In the spring and summer, he could be found on the

baseball diamond, coaching his son's baseball teams. He also enjoyed golfing with his friends and coworkers. Officer Canfield was a dedicated father and husband. He is survived by his wife, Michelle, and two sons Tylor and Bryce. He is also survived by his father, retired Sacramento County Sheriff's Sergeant Robert Canfield. On August 31, 2011, the City of Rancho Cordova opened its new Rancho Cordova Police Station at 2897 Kilgore Road. An open house was held at the police station and included the dedication of the Larry Canfield Community Room, which pays tribute to Officer Canfield. The loss of Officer Lawrence W. Canfield has left a lasting impression on his brothers and sisters in blue and our community. We will never forget. ★

Families will be notified of placement by October 30. **Other Information** Transportation will be offered for Elementary PM sessions; Lunches will be "grab-and-go"—Breakfast will be provided for schools that provide this service; Recess will look different. Supervised, small group Breaks will be part of the school day, allowing students to eat a snack and to stretch, move, and play, with all health and safety guidelines in place. Students will be kept with their AM or PM small group cohort of students during the Break. **Secondary Education** The complexity of secondary schedules creates challenging circumstances as we transition to offering both Hybrid and Virtual scenarios simultaneously. Staff leaders in Curriculum & Instruction and ETIS, are working together to bring technological solutions to this complex challenge. Livestreaming capabilities in the classroom will help foster student/teacher interaction and minimize schedule

At least a dozen medical doctors from all over America assembled in front of the Supreme Court July 27 to counter the only message going forward allowed the American people with respect to the coronavirus. Here are some of the messages Google, Facebook, YouTube and Twitter refused to allow Americans to hear. This is every bit as big a censoring as burning books in the Middle Ages.

Dr. Simone Gold spoke of two phases of the virus, early and late, both treatable with present drugs. But physicians are confronted with a generated “spider web of fear...all around us and it’s constricting us” and “draining the lifeblood of the American people,” society and economy that “does not make sense.” The virus is “treatable” now. “That’s what we’re here to tell you.” “But we implore you to hear this, because this message has been silenced.” “There are many thousands of physicians who have been silenced from telling the American people ... that we can manage the virus.” Why? Transitioning into Medicare the Right Way!

Hello Toni,

You have been referred to me as a resource that can answer questions I have about Medicare. I am turning 65 in January and have not discovered what I need to do to begin Medicare since I am still working?

If I retire soon, do I stay on COBRA or enroll in Medicare plans? What if I get another job? Friends and co-workers tell me one thing about Medicare, but the massive amount of telemarketing calls I am receiving are telling me something else.

I am baffled at where I should begin. I am sure there are others in Medicare land, who also need answers to these worrisome, yet semi-simple Medicare questions.

Terry:

Our motto at the Toni Says office is that “your Medicare needs are not the same as your friends”, so discussing your Medicare wants and needs with those who do not know Medicare’s specific rules, can confuse you and may give you wrong information that can affect your Medicare in the wrong way.

Below are a few Medicare questions you asked about and which we typically discuss during a Toni Says® Medicare consultation:

1) Is the Medicare enrollment process automatic?

Answer: Medicare enrollment is automatic only if you have already claimed your Social Security benefits by the time you turn 65. When not receiving your Social Security check, you will not receive your Medicare card and will need to apply online if you are not working full-time with employer benefits or covered under your spouse’s employer benefits.

Failing to sign up at the right time is costly especially after 65 and leaving employer benefits. Read question 3 of this article when leaving employer health benefits past 65 and need to enroll in Medicare

Part A and B properly. You will want to file CMS-L564 with Social Security and an application for Medicare Part B.

2) Should I enroll in Medicare even if I am offered COBRA health insurance when I leave my job?

Answer: Yes. Enroll in Medicare. Although you might need COBRA to cover a spouse or dependent child, Medicare should be your primary insurance coverage once you are 65 or older and not “working full-time” with company benefits. You will want to enroll in Medicare Parts A and B. Explore which option is best for your Medicare situation either a Medicare Supplement that works with “Original Medicare” and a stand-alone Medicare Part D plan or a Medicare Advantage plan with Part D coverage. In today’s health insurance world, many COBRA health plans will allow the COBRA retiree who has Medicare Parts A and B to opt out of the COBRA plan, while the family remains on COBRA.

3) What if I become unemployed or retire, enroll in Medicare, and then go back into a full-time job?

Answer: If your new employer provides health insurance, you can disenroll from Medicare Part B by contacting Social Security (1-800-772-1213) and request the form to delay your Medicare Part B because you now have medical benefits provided by you or your spouse’s current employer.

You can re-enroll in Medicare Part B when you finally retire without paying late enrollment penalties by having your employer sign and file CMS-L564 “Request for Employment Information” form with Social Security.

California’s Vague New Financial Regulation Law

Assembly Bill 1864 didn’t get much media or public attention as it zipped through both houses of the Legislature on the last day of the 2020 session.

Superficially, it appeared merely to reconfigure the state’s financial regulatory agencies into a new entity called the Department of Financial Protection and Innovation.

However, those in California’s vast financial industry were paying lots of attention because the bill creates an entirely new regulatory regime with broad powers, including fines of up to \$1 million a day, to police financial players that hitherto have had little oversight.

The official rationale for the legislation is that President Donald Trump’s administration neutered the federal Dodd-Frank Wall Street Consumer Financial Protection Act of 2010, so the state must step in with an equivalent to guard against predatory financial practices that harm consumers.

The new California Consumer Financial Protection Law gives the reconstituted agency authority to go after “abusive practices” whose definition in the law is fairly vague. Thus, the agency itself will

define the term as it also decides which businesses will face its scrutiny.

It appears that the new law will affect firms involved in debt settlement, credit repair, check cashing, rent-to-own contracts, payday lending, student loan servicing and financing for retail sales. However, its primary target seems to be financial services offered by non-banks, particularly what are called “fintech companies” that offer bank-like services via the Internet without maintaining physical offices.

Fintechs, many of them based in the San Francisco Bay Area, have blossomed in recent years as part of the digital economy, competing with traditional brick-and-mortar banks. Their disruptive nature is not unlike the challenge that technology-based ride services such as Uber and Lyft pose to taxicabs and buses.

Late-blooming changes in AB 1864 exempted traditional financial firms that are already regulated, such as banks and credit unions, from the new consumer protection law, leading some analysts to conclude that its unstated aim is to help them stave off competition from new kids on the financial block.

The vagueness of the new law was encapsulated in what Gov. Gavin Newsom said during a signing ceremony. The new law and the new department, he said, will “create conditions for innovation to flourish in a way where we can steward that and we can just work against its excesses. So we support risk-taking, not recklessness.”

Newsom also signed two other financial protection measures, one that requires debt collectors to be licensed beginning in 2022 and the other creating a Student Loan Borrower Bill of Rights.

Although the new state law is said to mirror the Dodd-Frank law, it contains at least one significant difference. When federal regulators levy fines for what they consider to be bad conduct, the money goes into the federal treasury. When state regulators impose their fines of up to \$1 million a day, the money will be retained by the new agency to finance more activity.

Will that give the new agency a financial incentive to skip over minor consumer issues and go after big companies? It’s a question that only time will answer.

Significantly too, the new investigative and regulatory mechanism contained in AB 1864 specifically does not usurp the authority of the attorney general to also target companies under the state’s equally vague “unfair competition” law.

From its inception a decade ago, Dodd-Frank has attracted criticism from business executives for regulatory overkill. Will California’s new version be less controversial? We won’t know until the new agency puts some definitional meat on its bones.

might rush the regulatory approval process.

“Of course, we don’t take anyone’s word for it,” Newsom said, in a nod to the politicization of the COVID-19 pandemic.

“This vaccine plan will move at the speed of trust. You have to have confidence in the efficacy of the vaccine, confidence that we’re not rushing to judgment in terms of its distribution and its accessibility,” Newsom said.

In response to a reporter’s question, Newsom said the review group process will stand even if former Vice President Joe Biden wins the election.

A new survey from STAT and The Harris Poll showed 58% of people in the U.S. said they would get vaccinated for COVID-19 as soon as the vaccine became available – that’s down from the 69% who said the same thing in mid-August, possibly indicating a growing mistrust among the general public. Only 43% of Blacks said they’d get the vaccine as soon as it was ready compared to 59% of white respondents, according to the poll.

In the summer, California was tapped by federal health officials to help plan for a large-scale rollout of a COVID-19 vaccine as early as Nov. 1. Some public health experts pushed back on the idea that a vaccine could be ready for safe distribution by then.

The drug company Pfizer is expected to have one of the first coronavirus vaccines. If its vaccine proves effective, safe and can

be consistently manufactured, the company would apply for emergency use authorization in the third week of November, CEO Albert Bourla said in an open letter last week.

But even if ready in this calendar year, Newsom said, supply is expected to be limited and, just like previously with coronavirus diagnostic testing, people who are considered high risk would be first in line.

In one projection, Newsom said that about 45 million doses could be ready for national distribution by the end of this year. California would only get a percentage of these, and each person will likely need two doses. Health workers and first responders would be prioritized, followed by people with high risk of becoming severely ill if infected, according to the state’s vaccination plan.

To the rest of Californians: Don’t anticipate getting a vaccine at your local pharmacy anytime this year, Newsom said.

Newsom also acknowledged that the state will need to work through some logistical hurdles. Some of the prospective vaccines will need to be stored in cold or “ultra cold” spaces, and their administration would require additional supplies of needles, alcohol pads, bandages and more face masks as doses become available.

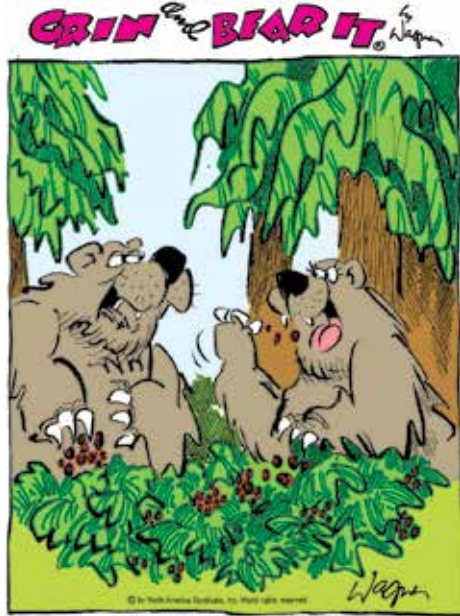

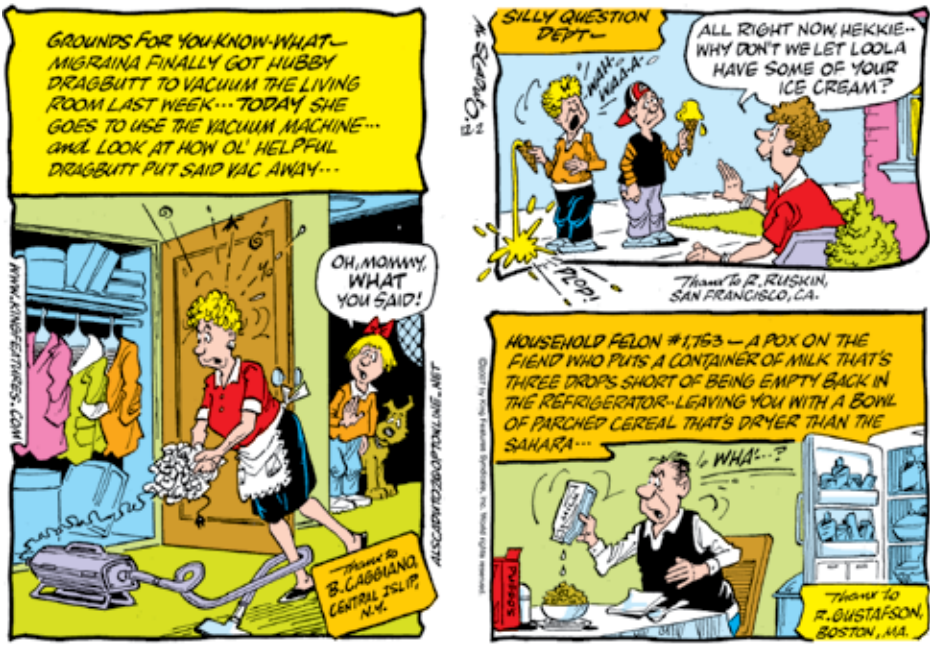
