### Licenses for **Drivers 70** and Older are **Extended**

California Department of Motor Vehicles

#### SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) -

The California Department of Motor Vehicles is providing an automatic one-year extension to Californians age 70 and older with a noncommercial driver license with an expiration date between March 1 and December 31, 2020. This action delays the requirement for this population to visit a DMV office during the COVID-19 pandemic.

The DMV previously provided 120-day extensions to senior drivers with noncommercial licenses expiring in March through July. While the new extensions are automatic, drivers will not receive a new card or paper extension in the mail. As an option, drivers can request a free temporary paper extension online beginning July 15 through DMV's Virtual Field Office to document the extension, though it is not needed to drive. Californians with a suspended license are not eligible.

California law requires drivers age 70 and older to visit a DMV field office to renew their license but gives the DMV authority to issue extensions. The DMV has alerted California law enforcement of the extensions. The TSA accepts driver licenses for a year after the expiration date.

Commercial licenses, including those for drivers 70 and older, expiring between March and September are extended through September 30, 2020, to align with federal guidelines.

The one-year extension for senior drivers is the latest action to help Californians avoid or delay a DMV office visit during the COVID-19 pandemic. The DMV has issued extensions for expiring driver licenses and permits, expanded eligibility to renew a driver license or identification card online or by mail, and created new digital options for transactions that previously required an in-person office visit. The DMV continues to streamline its processes to limit the time customers spend at an office. Customers are encouraged to fill out the online application and upload their documents before they come to the office. The DMV is also contemplating other ways to safely serve seniors.

Golden 1 Center will open as an 11-day Vote Center leading up to the Presidential Election on Nov. 3, 2020. The location will be the largest Vote Center in the county and

A voter anywhere in the state may drop off their voted ballot to Golden 1 Center.

In addition to providing the arena at no cost to the County, the Kings will also provide free parking in the Downtown West Garage to individuals accessing the Vote Center, which will open Saturday, Oct. 24 and run through Election Day, Nov. 3.

Golden 1 Center is the first professional sports venue in the state to announce plans to serve as a Vote Center. In addition to its partnership with the County, the Kings are working with the California Secretary of State's office to amplify poll worker recruitment and education efforts, increase awareness around voting timelines and requirements, and host Update your registration; a virtual voter registration

Kings plan to offer up staff to train as Election clerks to staff the Vote Center.

"We are incredibly excited to work in partnership with the Sacramento Kings and the Golden 1 Center to host a Vote Center for the November election," said Sacramento County Registrar of Voters Courtney Bailey. "Access to a large, state of the art facility such as Golden 1 Center helps us ensure accessibility and proper social distancing, while also providing our residents the voting services they need. # **BOE Member Gaines Strongly Opposes Prop. 15 "Split Roll" Initiative**

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Board of Equalization (BOE) Member Ted Gaines held an informational hearing that considered both the pros and cons of Proposition 15, California's "Split Roll" initiative that will appear on the November ballot. Following the hear-

ing, Member Gaines came

out in forceful opposition

to the measure. "California is straining under the coronavirus. Millions are unemployed, businesses are closed, and the last thing we need right now is \$12 billion in commercial agriculture," new taxes put on the backs of struggling families. We are a resilient state and I'm convinced we will recover but for that to happen we need a business climate that promotes prosperity. Proposition 15 does the opposite. It will crush agriculture. It will hurt the mom and pop shops who are already at risk and scared for their futures. It will drive businesses out of our state." Gaines said.

protections provided by to these communities. California's landmark Prop. 13, which was passed in 1978. Prop. 13, among other changes, implemented a predictable, stable property tax regimen in California, where commercial and residential properties are taxed at 1-percent of their purchase prices and increases in property tax are capped at 2-percent a year from that purchaseprice valuation.

Under Prop. 15, many commercial properties would be subject to reassessment annually, or at least every three years, opening the door to the unpredictable property tax spikes that forced seniors out of their homes in the 1970s and contributed to the taxpayer revolt that ended in passage of Prop. 13. It is referred to as "split roll" because it would lead to different treatment of residential and commercial properties in the property tax roll.

In addition, under the measure's definition of "real property used for fixtures and improvements such as irrigation systems, barns, tasting rooms and even fruit trees would be subject to reassessment, exposing the agricultural sector to a wave of new and higher taxes. Additionally, the nonpartisan Legislative Analyst's Office review of Prop. 15 indicates that rural areas may end up losing money overall if the initiative passes, even as their agricultural interests pay more in taxes, providing a double blow

Gaines hosted today's Prop.15 informational hearing, convening initiative supporters and opponents, assessors, the Legislative Analyst's Office, Board of Equalization personnel, as well as tax professionals involved in the property tax appeals process. The hearing was non-partisan and did not call for the Board to take a position on the measure. It was designed to give Board Members deeper insight into the alleged need for the initiative, how it would be implemented, and how it would affect property tax administration in the state. However, the day's testimony made clear to Gaines that the measure would be a disaster for California taxpayers and

"When will California taxpayers ever catch a break? They pay the highest gas taxes, highest state sales tax, highest income taxes, highest corporate tax in the western states; it's never ending. If this Initiative were to be successful, I have no doubt that Prop. 13 homeowner protections would be the next target.

"I support Prop. 13. For four decades it's been the bedrock protection for homeowners and business property owners. As a taxpayer advocate, I oppose split roll and every other effort to raise California taxes.'

Elected in 2018, Ted Gaines represents nearly ten million people as a Member of the Board of Equalization.

# **Caring for Pets During Hot Weather**

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Every year, Sacramento County residents do their best to keep cool during the summer heat. Failing to keep cool in extreme temperatures can cause adverse health effects for residents—both human and animal.

Unlike humans, cats and dogs cannot sweat to keep cool; they cool their bodies off through panting and the pads of their feet. As a pet owner, it's important to take measures to

keep them cool during the high temperatures. Here are some tips for keeping your pet

Never leave your pet in a parked car: Even cracking a window won't protect your pets. It is against the law in California and could be punishable by a fine or imprisonment. A car can reach 120 degrees in just minutes; even if the windows are slightly open the car can still reach 102 degrees. A dog's normal temperature is 101.5 degrees; at 120 degrees your pet can suffer from heat exhaustion and die and at 107 degrees brain damage occurs. Check out this video on how hot it gets in cars;

**Avoid extreme heat:** When temperatures get above the 90s, take your pet inside. For outdoor pets, be sure to provide them with plenty of fresh, cold water in a tip-proof water dish and shade for them to cool down;

Don't exercise with your pets when it is too hot: Older and certain long-haired dogs can be particularly susceptible to heat, and hot asphalt can burn their paws. Exercise in

the early morning or cool evenings and make sure both of you have plenty of water.

Use sunscreen: Pets get sunburned just like people, and if your pet has light skin or fur, they can be particularly susceptible to a painful burn, and even skin cancer. Use sunscreen on sensitive areas, such as ears or nose to make sure your pets are protected.

Secure your dog during transport: Make sure your dog is secured safely in your vehicle. Cross-tethering your dog with a rope or containing them via kennel in the bed of your truck will help prevent the dog from falling or jumping from the vehicle. Also, please note that truck beds can get hot when exposed to the sun and that can severely burn dog footpads. Transporting animals on a public highway or public roadway without properly securing them could be punishable by a fine.

Be your pet's lifeguard: While swimming can help pets get exercise without overheating, always supervise pets when swimming either in a pool or in waterways. Dogs can get tired swimming, particularly in rivers where they have to fight against currents. To avoid drowning, make sure they wear life jackets and keep them out of the water when flows

If pets have been exposed to high temperatures ... Be alert for signs of heat stress including heavy panting, glazed eyes, a rapid pulse, unsteadiness, staggering gait, vomiting, or a deep red or purple tongue.

Immediately move your pet to the shade to gradually lower their temperature. Apply cool (not cold) water to the pet, and provide lukewarm or cool water to drink. Take your pet to a veterinary hospital immediately. It could save their life.


# **Cordova Graduate Authors COVID Survivor's Thriller**

California peace officers with a fundamental duty to serve and protect the public. They have the authority to enforce all California laws. Wildlife officers patrol the mountains, valleys, deserts, creeks, streams, rivers and ocean. They frequently work alone and cover both rural and urban areas. California's diverse ecosystem spans 159,000 square miles divided into 58 counties, with a human population more than 39 million. The state has 1,100 miles of coastline, 30,000 miles of rivers and streams, 4,800 lakes and reservoirs and 80 major rivers. Wildlife officers patrol with trucks, off road utility vehicles, personal watercraft, large patrol vessels, snowmobiles and aircraft. They work undercover, conduct surveillances and complete indepth investigations, including writing and serving search warrants. CDFW's Law Enforcement Division has numerous specialized teams and assignments including K-9, wildlife trafficking, cannabis enforcement, marine patrol, and oil spill prevention and response.

Successful applicants for warden cadet will attend a POST-certified law enforcement training academy, conducted by CDFW at Butte College in Oroville. Following the academy, probationary wildlife officers will work with seasoned field training officers for several months, where they will learn to apply their training in practical circumstances



# **Fitness Centers are Safe and Essential** to Combat America's Health Crisis

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The California Fitness Alliance (CFA) announced that since reopening on June 12, its members have reported no cases of COVID-19 traced to California fitness centers including health clubs, gyms or studios. CFA surveyed 150 fitness operators, representing 785 locations in California, to demonstrate the implementation of its guidelines and superior safety standards have kept its communities safe while providing an essential service to its members and vital jobs to its employees.

"Our survey results show fitness centers are safe due to the standards we are implementing," said Randy Karr, founding partner of CFA and President and CEO of California Family Fitness. "Survey respondents had more than 5.5 million members check into their facilities between June 12 and July 13, and only .002 percent of those members have tested positive for COVID-19, with no cases reported as a result from visits to fitness centers."

We support doing the right thing to flatten the curve, but America is facing a physical and mental health crisis and physical fitness is essential to combat this pandemic," said Francesca Schuler, founding partner of CFA and CEO of In-Shape Health Clubs. "This is why the California Fitness Alliance worked with Governor Gavin Newsom's administration to develop standards that would enable fitness centers to stay open safely during the COVID-19 pandemic."

Under CFA's "4-W" program to protect and prevent the spread of COVID-19, our participating fitness clubs have members wear masks, work out 6-feet apart, wash their hands before exercising and wipe down the equipment they use when finished. This is in addition to fully complying with or exceeding strict safety standards directed by state and county public health offices for facilities and staff including frequent cleaning, sanitizing, social distancing, physical separation and new check-in procedures.

One in five Americans experiences a mental health issue and physical fitness can be a critical way to combat these issues according to the Journal of Clinical Psychology. Additionally, heart disease is the leading cause of death in the United States – responsible for 840,768 deaths in 2016 and an annual total cost

estimated at \$351.2 billion in 2014-2015. The leading causes of cardiovascular disease are obesity, high blood pressure and lack of physical activity. Forty-seven percent of Americans have at least one risk factor for heart disease.

"Sadly, people with chronic health issues have significantly higher risk of severe illness or death if they do become ill from COVID-19," said Marc Thomas, CFA advisory board member, Co-CEO of Aspyr Holdings and an Orangetheory Fitness Franchisee. "According to the National Institutes of Health, engaging in regular physical activity is critical to preventing heart disease and Type 2 diabetes among other ailments, confirming once again that fitness is an essential business."

In fact, Dr. Hemmal Kothary, the Chief Medical Officer for Dignity Health Central California Division, believes fitness is so essential to mental health that he's joined CFA as a medical advisor.

"Now more than ever, people need routine and healthy ways to deal with things like anxiety, depression and the isolation caused by this pandemic," Kothary said. "The communities created within fitness clubs not only help people maintain motivation for their physical fitness but remind us that we are not alone even when we are safe and physically distant."

"Our industry takes health very seriously, which is why we implemented strict standards. The results of our survey demonstrate these standards work," said Cory Brightwell, CFA advisory board member and CEO of Chuze Fitness.

"The California Fitness Alliance will continue working with the Governor and local governments to demonstrate that fitness centers are not where infections are spreading." ★







Why is GSWC requesting this rate

increase? The CPUC requires GSWC to submit a GRC application every three-years. GSWC is requesting authorization to increase revenues in the Arden Cordova service area by \$2,876,700 (or 19.03%) for 2022, \$622,600 (or 3.44%) in 2023, and \$691,600 (or 3.66%) in 2024. The total requested increase for all three years combined would be \$4,190,900 (or 26.13%).

The purpose of this GRC is for GSWC to cover its anticipated costs from 2022 through 2024 for improvements to the water supply system, federal income tax, property taxes and cost for other operating expenses (such as lab fees for testing and conservation, etc.)

On May 27, 2020, GSWC filed Advice Letter No. 1818-W with the CPUC regarding the acquisition of Sutter County Water Works District No. 1's (WWD1) Robbins Water System (Robbins). GSWC will provide service and water supply for Robbins customers and they will be will be served through the Arden-Cordova Customer Service Area. The acquisition of Robbins which is reflected in this application, does not increase the rates requested for the existing Arden Cordova customers.

How could this affect my monthly bill? If the proposed application is approved by the CPUC, the average residential customer with a 5/8 x 3/4" meter using 13 Ccf would see a monthly bill increase of \$6.96 (or 18.76%), from \$37.10 to \$44.06 in 2022. In 2023 the average residential customer would see a monthly bill increase of \$1.54 (or 3.50%), from \$44.06 to \$45.60. and a monthly bill increase of \$1.70 (or 3.73%), from \$45.60 to \$47.30 in 2024, excluding any applicable surcharges.

How does the rest of the process work? This application will be assigned to a judge. who will consider proposals and evidence presented during the formal hearing process. The judge will issue a proposed decision which may adopt GSWC's application, modify it, or deny it. Any CPUC Commissioner may sponsor an alternate decision. The proposed decision, and any alternate decisions, will be discussed and voted upon by the CPUC Commissioners.

The Public Advocates Office may review this application. The Public Advocates Office is the independent consumer advocate within the CPUC with a statutory mandate to represent customers of investor-owned utilities to obtain the lowest possible rate for service consistent with safe and reliable service and the state's environmental policy goals. #### NOTICE OF ADOPTED ORDINANCE

The following is an Ordinance adopted by the City Council of the City of Rancho Cordova at its meeting of July 20, 2020:

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RANCHO CORDOVA. STATE OF CALIFORNIA. LEVYING A SPECIAL TAX WITHIN COMMUNITY FACILTIES DISTRICT

Community Facilities District No. 2020-1 (Landscape Maintenance)

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Rancho Cordova ("City Council") adopted a resolution entitled "A Resolution of the City of Rancho Cordova of Intention to Establish a Community Facilities District and Future Annexation Area (the "Resolution of Intention"), has conducted proceedings (the "Proceedings") to establish City of Rancho Cordova Community Facilities District No. 2020-1 (Landscape Maintenance) (the "CFD"), pursuant to the Mello-Roos Community Facilities Act of 1982, Chapter 2.5 of Part 1 of Division 2 of Title 5, commencing with Section 53311, of the California Government Code (the "Act") to finance certain public services (the "Services) as provided in the Act; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to notice as specified in the Act, and as part of the Proceedings, the Council has held a public hearing under the Act relative to the determination to proceed with the formation of the CFD and the rate and method of apportionment of the special tax ("Special Tax") to be levied within the CFD to finance the Services and at such hearing all persons desiring to be heard on all matters pertaining to the formation of the CFD and the levy of the Special Tax were heard, substantial evidence was presented and considered by this Council and a full and fair public hearing was held; and

WHEREAS, upon the conclusion of the hearing, this City Council adopted its Resolution of the City Council of the City of Rancho Cordova of Formation of Community Facilities District (the "Resolution of Formation") pursuant to which it completed the Proceedings for the establishment of the CFD, the authorization of the levy of the Special Tax within the CFD and the calling of an election within the CFD on the propositions of levying the Special Tax and establishing an appropriations limit within the CFD, respectively; and

WHEREAS, on July 6, 2020, a special election was held among the landowner voters within the CFD at which such voters approved such propositions by the two-thirds vote required by the Act, which approval has been confirmed by resolution of this Council.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RANCHO CORDOVA DOES ORDAIN as follows:

Section 1. By the passage of this Ordinance, the Council hereby authorizes and levies the Special Tax within the CFD pursuant to the Act, at the rate and in accordance with the rate and method of apportionment of Special Tax set forth in the Resolution of Formation which rate and method is by this reference incorporated herein. The Special Tax is hereby levied commencing in fiscal year 2020-21 and in each fiscal year thereafter to pay for the Services for the CFD, as contemplated by the Resolution of Formation and the Proceedings and all costs of administering the CFD.

Section 2. The Chief Financial Officer of the City or designee or employee thereof of the City is hereby authorized and directed each fiscal year to determine the specific Special Tax to be levied for the next ensuing fiscal year for each parcel of real property within the CFD, in the manner and as provided in the Resolution of Formation.

**Section 3.** Exemptions from the levy of the Special Tax shall be as provided in the Resolution of Formation and the applicable provisions of the Act. In no event shall the Special Tax be levied on any parcel within the CFD in excess of the maximum tax specified in the

**Section 4.** All of the collections of the Special Tax shall be used as provided in the Act and in the Resolution of Formation, including, but not limited to, the payment of costs of the Services, the payment of the costs of the City in administering the CFD, and the costs of collecting and administering the Special Tax.

Section 5. The Special Tax shall be collected in the same manner as ordinary ad valorem taxes are collected and shall have the same lien priority, and be subject to the same penalties and the same procedure and sale in cases of delinquency as provided for ad valorem taxes; provided, however, that the Council may provide for other appropriate methods of collection by resolution(s) of the Council. In addition, the provisions of Section 53356.1 of the Act shall apply to delinquent Special Tax payments. The Chief Financial Officer of the City is hereby authorized and directed to provide all necessary information to the auditor/tax collector of the County of Sacramento in order to effect proper billing and collection of the Special Tax, so that the Special Tax shall be included on the secured property tax roll of the County of Sacramento for fiscal year 2020-21 and for each fiscal year thereafter until no longer required to pay for the Services or until otherwise terminated by the City.

Section 6. If for any reason any portion of this ordinance is found to be invalid, or if the Special Tax is found inapplicable to any particular parcel within the CFD, by a court of competent jurisdiction, the balance of this ordinance and the application of the Special Tax to the remaining parcels within the CFD shall not be affected.

Section 7. The Mayor shall sign this Ordinance and the City Clerk shall cause the same to be published immediately after its passage at least once in a newspaper of general circulation circulated in

Section 8. This ordinance shall go into effect immediately following its second reading and adoption, pursuant to Government Code section 36937.

# **Social Security Matters** About Working While

**Collecting Social Security**

Dear Rusty: In 2019 I was out of work for an extended period. I was eligible to begin receiving retirement benefits (at age 63) and started to do so in August. My part time job was limited so it did not conflict with my Social Security amount, but in October through the end of 2019 I went back to my old industry at four times the pay rate. My understanding is that I will need to pay Social Security back about \$1.40 for every benefit dollar they have paid me while I worked at the higher wage. When and how is that paid? Signed: Part Time Again

Dear Part Time Again: If you started your Social Security benefits in August of last year at age 63, for the remainder of 2019 you were subject to the "first year rule" which means you had a monthly earnings limit



of \$1,470 after your benefit started. If you exceeded that monthly limit starting in October of 2019 and for the rest of the year, you won't be entitled to benefits for the months of October, November and December. Social Security will consider that an overpayment, and they will want you to repay all those benefits to them. However, if it would be to your advantage to do so, you can request that Social Security use the annual earnings limit for 2019, instead of the monthly limit. For example, if using the 2019 annual earnings limit (\$17,640) would result in a smaller impact to your benefits, Social Security may accommodate your request to use the annual limit. Depending upon your total earnings in 2019, you may want to consider asking that the annual earnings limit be used, instead of the monthly limit, when determining your 2019 impact for exceeding the earnings

Starting in 2020 you'll be months now, when you

of \$18,240 (limit changes yearly). If you exceed the annual limit, SS will take back benefits equal to \$1 for every \$2 you are over the limit. If you've again stopped working at the higher amount, and now only working part-time and won't earn more than \$18,240 for this year, you'll not be subject to the annual limit. But exceeding the 2019 monthly limit last year will still affect you.

You will receive a form

from Social Security asking you to specify your 2019 income month by month for the months you were receiving benefits. Since vou exceeded the monthly limit from October through December, they'll be asking you to repay all of the benefits you received for those months. They will give you the option of either repaying them in full in a lump sum, or they will recover what vou owe by withholding your monthly benefits until the overpayment is satisfied. That will mean you'll go some months without benefits, the number of months dependent upon your monthly benefit amount and how much you owe them. Remember, you have the option to request the annual limit if it will benefit you.

Though you'll lose benefits for some number of

subject to an annual limit reach your full retirement age (66 years and 4 months) they will automatically give you time credit for the number of months they withheld benefits and move your SS claim date forward. That will increase your monthly benefit amount slightly, and you'll get that slightly higher benefit for the rest of

> One final point: In the year you reach your full retirement age the annual earnings limit will go up by about 2.5 times and the penalty for exceeding it will be less (\$1 for every \$3 over the limit). And when you reach your full retirement age the earnings limit goes away entirely.

### **Aerojet Rocketdyne Completes its Propulsion for NASA's Artemis II Mission**

EL SEGUNDO, CA (MPG) - Aerojet Rocketdyne recently completed all of its propulsion hardware for the first crewed flight of NASA's Space Launch System (SLS) rocket and Orion spacecraft. The engines and motors, which Aerojet Rocketdyne produces at its major space operations sites across the country, will support NASA's Artemis II mission. The Artemis II mission is the second flight of SLS and Orion and the first to send an astronaut crew to fly around the Moon.

"These are very exciting times for both NASA and the nation," said Eileen Drake, Aerojet Rocketdyne CEO and president. "The United States is sending humans beyond low Earth orbit for the first time in nearly 50 years, and we are traveling even farther with Artemis than we did with Apollo."

Four Aerojet Rocketdyne RS-25 engines collectively provide two million pounds of thrust to power the core stage of SLS, the world's most powerful rocket. The company completed upgrading the Artemis II RS-25 engines with advanced components and controllers in November 2019. Engine assembly and testing was completed at Aerojet Rocketdyne's facility at NASA's Stennis Space Center in Mississippi, and all four engines are ready for integration with the Artemis II core

Aerojet Rocketdyne's RL10 engine powers the Interim Cryogenic Propulsion Stage (ICPS), or the second stage, of the SLS. This engine provides the power to accelerate the Orion spacecraft to speeds over 24,000 miles per hour and set it on a course for the Moon. Design, manufacture, assembly and test of the RL10 engine for the Artemis II mission took place at Aerojet Rocketdyne's West Palm Beach facility in Florida. The engine is ready for installation on the ICPS being manufactured by Boeing and United Launch Alliance in Decatur, Alabama.

Aerojet Rocketdyne provides a number of propulsion systems for the Lockheed Martinbuilt Orion crew module and the European Service Module that will be used on the Artemis II mission. The biggest of these is the jettison motor which generates 40,000 pounds of thrust for the Launch Abort System (LAS). The jettison motor pulls the LAS off the crew module during both nominal operations and abort modes. Qualification testing was

conducted at Redstone Arsenal in Huntsville, Alabama, and assembly of the Artemis II motor was completed in October 2019 at Aerojet Rocketdyne's facility in Orange, Virginia, and delivered to Lockheed Martin in February 2020.

Once in space, the Orion Main Engine (OME) on the service module will maneuver the spacecraft. Aerojet Rocketdyne is the original manufacturer of the OME, which was originally built and used for the space shuttle program. In March 2019, Aerojet Rocketdyne provided key valve and thermal components to NASA to complete the refurbishment of the Artemis II OME.

Also aboard Orion, Aerojet Rocketdyne is responsible for eight auxiliary engines on the service module and 12 reaction control thrusters on the crew module. The auxiliary engines, built in Redmond, Washington, each generate 110 pounds of thrust to provide position control while backing up the OME for required thrust. They were provided in March 2019 to Lockheed Martin for shipment to Europe for integration into the service module.

The reaction control system thrusters, also built in Redmond, each generating 160 pounds of thrust, will be used to control and properly orient the Orion crew module during its atmospheric reentry. Those thrusters were delivered in March 2020.

"The Artemis II mission will be the first time the Space Launch System and Orion will send astronauts into orbit around the Moon, and it is a key precursor to landing the first woman and the next man on the Moon," added Drake. "Aerojet Rocketdyne propulsion systems will play a critical role in making this endeavor a reality."
