RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - Hagan Community Park is a household name, an iconic site in Rancho Cordova and home to our community's beloved Fourth of July (canceled this year due to COVID-19), countless family reunions, business end-of-year picnics, the Hagan Community Barn animals and more. However, many residents know something has been missing the past few years: The Cordova Community Pool. Six years ago, the pool closed due to major water leaks in the piping system. With sustainability in mind, the Cordova Recreation & Park District (CRPD) began preparing for a total replacement of the pool in order to provide a lasting service for

the community. The original pool opened in the early 1960's. At the time, it was considered a state-of-the-art, first-class aquatic center and was a regional draw. For over 50 years, this pool was the premier aquatics facility in the region, serving up to 150 visitors per day not including swim meets and special events. As CRPD's Park Planning & Development Team continued to work on the pool concept, CRPD's Board of Directors secured a \$5 million bond for replacement construction and hired the design firm LPA, Inc. in 2017. Shortly after, the City of Rancho Cordova also committed to donating \$3.4 million to the project. A huge win for the community. Over the next two years, the CRPD

continuously prepped and planned for the pool project to begin, from minor landscaping changes to major building removals near the site. Then, just after CRPD's Board of Directors authorized a construction contract with SW Allen Construction Incorporated to build the project for \$7.9 million, the Coronavirus pandemic hit Sacramento County in mid-March of 2020. For the safety of the community and CRPD staff, leadership made the challenging decision to restructure services and operations temporarily. While CRPD had to halt recreational programming, close some park amenities and other facilities, construction was deemed an essential service by the government. This allowed for the pool project to remain on schedule, so

Governor's Powers Checked by the Courts

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - A State Superior Court judge granted my request for a Temporary Restraining Order against Governor Gavin Newsom. The restraining order suspends the Governor's recent Executive Order N-67-20 regarding the conduct of elections, and further restrains him from "exercising any further legislative powers in violation of the California Constitution and applicable statute, specifically from unilaterally amending, altering, or changing existing statutory law or making new statutory law." The Governor's Executive Order changed a variety of state election laws, including the elimination of public meetings with protected groups such as Californians with disabilities and limited English proficiency. The order was issued in Sutter County Superior Court. This action by the court is a victory for separation of powers. The Governor has continued to brazenly legislate by fiat without public input and without the deliberative process provided by the Legislature. The judicial branch finally gave him the check that was needed and that the Constitution requires. Our election laws have been drafted to ensure that the rights of all people to vote are protected. They are the result of public input given in a legislative process. For the Governor to arbitrarily change these laws is wrong. This is why we acted to end this abusive practice and to restore representative government. ★

Sac County Public Health Order Amended Again

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Sacramento County has an amended Public Health Order that will allow the relaxation of restrictions on low-risk businesses consistent from the direction of the State of California, to move further into Stage 3 of the state's Resilience Roadmap. The new Public Health Order became effective at 11:59 a.m. June 12. Sacramento County is able to move further into Stage 3 because its Variance Attestation was approved by the state on May 20. The following activities and venues are now allowable in the amended Public

Health Order as listed in Appendix B of the Order, provided they have implemented the required health and safety protocols outlined in Appendix A of the Order: Bars and wineries; Hotels, lodging and short-term rentals; Campgrounds, RV parks and Outdoor Recreation; Gyms and fitness facilities; Pools; Museums, galleries, zoos and aquariums; Family entertainment centers; Movie theaters; Day camps; Tribal casinos; Cardrooms, satellite wagering facilities and racetracks. Additionally, businesses must include a policy for face coverings in their protocol and provide face coverings to staff when six

feet of social distance is not possible. "In spite of recent reopenings, the virus risk is still here," said Dr. Peter Beilenson, director of Health Services. "We have seen an increase in COVID cases and hospitalizations recently, in large part due to social gatherings, and to keep these cases down we need to remember to be sensible while we're being sociable. "Continue to maintain social distancing requirements of six feet or more, practice good hand hygiene, stay home as much as possible and remember that gatherings of people not from the same household inside houses are prohibited." The Health Order supersedes previous orders

and is in effect until it is rescinded or amended by the Sacramento County Health Officer. The best defense against COVID-19 continues to be: Staying at home and physical distancing; Wearing a face covering wherever possible; Washing hands frequently; Avoiding touching eyes, nose and mouth with unwashed hands; Avoiding being around people with COVID-19 symptoms. Park districts and Counties are increasingly using herbivore power on hard-to-mow territory. Poison oak and steep slopes are all in a day's rumination for goat gangs that recently trimmed Willhaggin Retention Basin on American River Drive. Though animals take longer than blades, their chomping doesn't cause sparks and fires. They're also quieter. "We hardly knew they were here," said a resident near Schweitzer Grove. "I came out to watch them every day. Such a peaceful sight."

For Lincoln goat farmer Steve Gregory, summer is when his goat and sheep are busiest – and happiest. However, coyotes and mountain lions can be a worry in wilderness work areas. Gregory flocks are tended with Biblical devotion by shepherds and

canines who sleep with their charges at night. Hydration is another big concern. "Each animal needs up to two gallons of water per day - more if it gets really hot," confirms the farmer. Though his truck delivers water daily, some neighboring residents volunteer garden hoses. "We're always

grateful for that," he says. "Our animals' health is our first concern." Gregory's Peruvian herders are legendary in their industry. "These guys grow up around grazing animals," says their boss. "They seem to know how sheep and goats think. We all put our animals before ourselves. If they're not healthy, we

From a landowner's view, goats are often more cost-effective than machines. "They might take more time to do the job," explains Sacramento County engineer Lennard Bravo. "But they're great on steep terrain where human ankles have been turned. They free up staff

Though his livestock has fulfilled many Sacramento County contracts, the passage of Fair Oaks' century-old truss bridge presented a picturesque challenge. "It's a bridge with so many pedestrians and cyclists," explains Gregory. "We don't worry about how the goats will manage - they move well as a herd - our concern is how people react to them. Fortunately, eating's their favorite thing to do. That's what gets them across bridges so smoothly. They're all led by their stomachs." ★

Additional Charging Decisions Related to Acts of Looting

Sacramento County District Attorney's Office

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - On June 3, 2020, the Sacramento District Attorney's Office received thirteen reports relating to looting from law enforcement agencies to review for filing of criminal charges. All events took place in the late evening hours of May 31st to the early morning hours of June 1st. Charges were filed in all of the cases received including:

- (1) At midnight, several subjects were located inside the Sunrise Mall. One of the female adult suspects admitted to driving six juveniles to the mall. She also admitted that someone broke glass and she went inside. They went to the Vans store, but then heard police and ran. Several boxes of new shoes were found in her trunk. The second suspect was found in a car parked at the mall just outside of the broken glass point of entry. When police arrived, she fled in her car and took police on a three-mile pursuit. Both were charged with commercial burglary, looting, and receiving stolen property. The second suspect was also charged with reckless evasion of a peace officer.
- (2) At 12:00 a.m., a male adult suspect was observed fleeing Walgreens located

- at 2201 Arden Way. He was stopped nearby and in possession of stolen items. He was charged with commercial burglary, looting, and receiving stolen property.
 - (3) At 2:30 a.m., two male defendants were observed trying to break into Paradyme on 1720 Fulton. They were charged with attempted burglary and attempted looting.
 - (4) At 2:50 a.m., a male adult suspect and a female adult suspect were observed fleeing a Boost Mobile store located at 6176 Auburn Blvd. Their car drove off as officers approached, reached speeds in excess of 100 mph and ran a red light. An infant was located in a child seat in the rear of the car. They were charged with commercial burglary, looting, reckless evasion of a peace officer, child endangerment, and receiving stolen property.
- As was stated in previous releases, the Sacramento District Attorney's Office supports every citizen's right to lawfully exercise their first amendment right to protest, particularly in these painful times. At the same time, we will also zealously prosecute those who choose violence, looting or lawlessness over peaceful protest thereby creating a threat to public safety and the well-being of our community. ★

Merritt Continues Criminal Dismissal Process

Liberty Counsel Press Release

SAN FRANCISCO, CA (MPG) - Sandra Merritt filed a reply in support of the motion asking the San Francisco Superior Court to dismiss the charge regarding "false identification documents" brought against her by California Attorney General Xavier Becerra for her undercover journalism work in exposing Planned Parenthood's trafficking in baby body parts. Judge Christopher Hite dismissed six of the original 15 felony charges as he

made factual findings that the recorded conversations were not confidential. Given those factual findings, Attorney General Becerra cannot bring those dismissed charges again. Becerra then filed an "Information" on December 13, 2019, adding an additional count to Merritt's charges, even though the statute of limitations had long ago expired for any new claims. Liberty Counsel represents Merritt and has shown that, to date, no other citizen journalist or journalism organization has ever been charged with

a crime for undercover recordings made in the public interest. In fact, Merritt and her co-defendant, David Daleiden, the founder of the Center for Medical Progress, are the first undercover journalists to be criminally prosecuted in California's history. Liberty Counsel's Founder and Chairman Mat Staver said, "Attorney General Becerra has tried to pull another trick out of his bag with another politically-motivated charge to cover for the evil acts of Planned Parenthood. This too shall fail." ★

Legislative Democrats Pass Incomplete State Budget with \$9 Billion Tax Increase

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Senate Republican Leader Shannon Grove (R-Bakersfield) issued the following statement after legislative Democrats passed a fake budget bill, Senate Bill 74, just to meet state and constitutional deadlines. "The state is facing a government-induced recession with more than 4.8 million unemployed Californians and a budget deficit of \$54 billion." Despite this economic crisis, the Democrats' backroom budget deal has prioritized pet projects and includes a \$9 billion tax increase on our job creators. "Today's incomplete and poorly prioritized budget is the result of last-minute discussions that lacked public transparency. Californians deserve better," said Senate Republican Leader Shannon Grove. As presented, SB 74 is a budget riddled

The Governor and Legislative Democrats' Budget include: \$22 million to enforce the anti-worker law (AB 5, 2019) forcing more people out of work, even though there are more than 4.8 million residents on unemployment now; \$5 million to buy a new state park even though the Governor has prevented people from going outside; \$2.9 billion to continue the high-speed rail project, despite more cost increases, project delays, and a \$54 billion state budget deficit; \$9 billion in new taxes on businesses, even though thousands of businesses are barely staying afloat or being forced to close due to the stay-at-home order; Lastly, the Governor and legislative Democrats are relying on billions of dollars from the federal government-yet the Governor allocated \$6.5 million to sue the federal government. ★

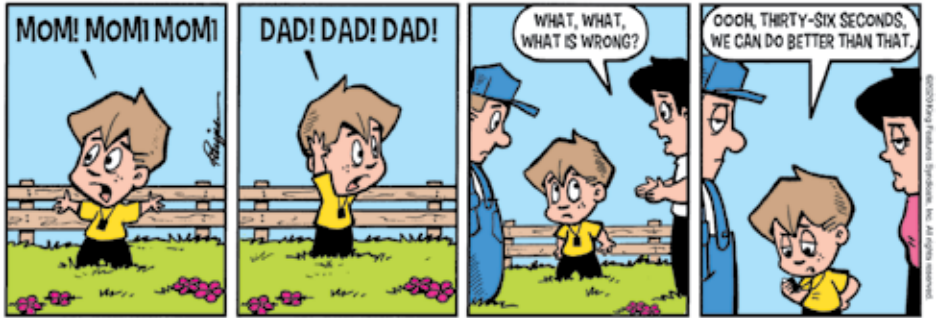

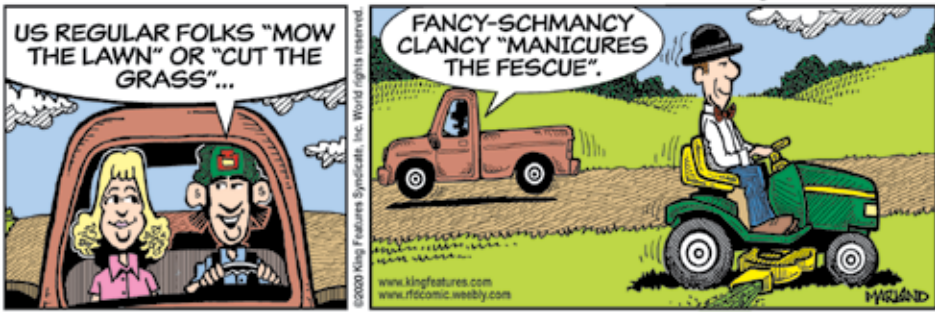

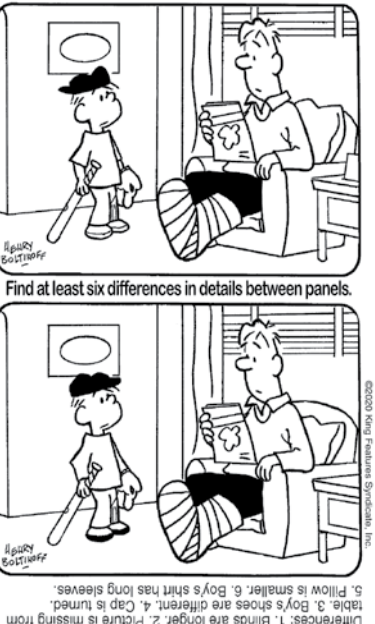

Social Security Matters

When Should We Claim Our Benefits?

California Fairs in Trouble

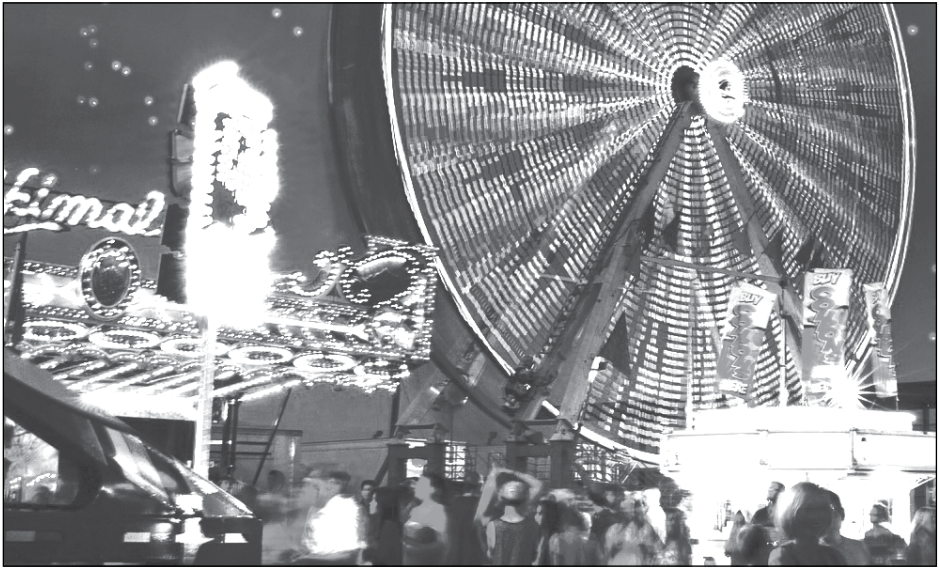
Dear Rusty: We served overseas for several years, not earning many quarters for Social Security. However, we have made sure that we paid in over time so we can receive a benefit, but it will not amount to much. For the past several years now, we have been back in the US, earning some professional salaries. Now it looks like at full retirement age my husband will get \$1147/month, and I will get \$1026/month. I was born in 1957 and my husband in 1956. Question #1: For the most financial benefit, when should we each start collecting SS (either now or at full retirement age)? And question #2: Will our amounts change because we are married and both collecting? **Signed: Overseas Worker**

Dear Overseas Worker: To answer your second question first, no, your benefit amounts will not change because you are married and both collecting. Based upon the numbers you provided, neither of you will be eligible for a “spousal boost” from the other because your benefit amounts at your FRA are too similar, so maximizing your individual benefits should be your goal. As for your other question, when you should start collecting depends upon a number of factors, including your financial



needs and, importantly, your expected longevity. Both of you can get the maximum benefit available to you by waiting until you are 70 years old to claim, but that only makes sense if you are in good health and expect at least average longevity (about 84 for a man and 87 for a woman). If you claim benefits before you reach your full retirement age (66 ½ for you and 66 plus 4 months for your husband), those benefits will be cut. If you collect now, your benefit would be cut by about 27% and your husband’s by about 22% (based upon your respective years of birth). Further, if you claim before your full retirement ages and continue to work, you’ll be subject to Social Security’s earnings test, which limits the amount you can earn before they take back some of your benefits (the 2020 earnings limit is \$18,240; if you exceed that they’ll take back half of anything you earn over the limit). The earnings limit changes annually but goes away at your FRA. At your full retirement ages, you’ll be entitled to 100% of the benefits you’ve earned from your lifetime of working (approximately the amounts estimated now). If you can and do wait beyond your full retirement age (FRA), for each month you delay you’ll earn delayed retirement credits of 2/3 of 1% per month of delay (8%

per year of delay), up to age 70 when your maximum benefit is reached. As a point of information, if you wait until your full retirement age to claim, you will have collected the same amount of money at age 78 as if you had claimed at age 62; and if you wait until age 70 to claim you’ll have collected the same amount of money at age 82 as if you had collected at your full retirement age. If you live at least until “average” longevity, you’ll collect more in cumulative Social Security benefits by waiting. So, when should you claim? If you’re still working and earning “professional salaries”, then waiting at least until your full retirement age would be a wise choice. If you expect at least average longevity and don’t need the money right away, waiting until age 70 would be a prudent strategy. But if you don’t work and expect less than average longevity, then claiming at any time you need the money would be a reasonable decision. PLACERVILLE, CA (MPG) - Every county in our state has one. Every county in our state needs one. But by the end of 2020, not every county in our state will have one – a local fairgrounds. Your local Fairgrounds are the go-to place during disasters in your community – such as wildfires, floods, pandemics and other disasters. They are the hub of the community. In El Dorado County, the Sheriff utilized the fairgrounds for a press conference when Jaycee Lee Dugard was found. Domestic animals displaced by fire are housed here. Every year, local non-profits host their fundraisers, raising millions of dollars to serve our community at our fairgrounds. Hundreds of local residents walk their dogs at our fairgrounds. Local law and fire departments test and train here. The Speedway hosts races throughout the summer months, bringing fans from all over for a little clay track action. And there is our annual County Fair where

local youth learn lessons that will last them a lifetime by raising and showing their livestock. Couples meet and fall in love. Longtime residents listen to the bands of their youth. Thousands of tacos are consumed. All of this could change due to the consequences of COVID-19. In 2011, then Governor Jerry Brown eliminated ALL funding for California Fairs. For El Dorado County Fairgrounds, that constituted about 25 percent of the annual revenue. For some fairgrounds it was much more. Some fairgrounds have never recovered. El Dorado County Fairgrounds cut spending, created new methods of generating revenue, streamlined interim rentals, run a bar during the Fair and 4th of July, and created other events, such as the popular Crab and Chowder Gala. With the shutdown THESE ALL CEASED. As of this writing, the Fair Association has lost more than \$200,000 in interim rental revenue, and that will likely rise. If the Fair Association is not able to host the annual County Fair, it will be difficult to keep the gates open.

Here are some facts about California Fairs. Statewide, more than \$35 million is generated by non-profits for their community on fairgrounds. Fairgrounds generate more than \$3.5 billion in annual economic impact while contributing over \$200 million in tax revenue to local and state government. There is a movement within the California Fair Network to request emergency funding. This is where you come in. The fair industry needs the public to show their support by urging their local politicians to support emergency fair funding. El Dorado County Fair has a sample letter on their website, eldoradocountyfair.org/contact.html or simply write your own, supporting emergency funding for fairgrounds throughout the state. Please share this with your family and friends throughout the State and urge them to write letters as well. It is important for ALL fairgrounds in ALL California communities! Please act today to save your fairgrounds. Thank you. ★

Price Controls Would Prevent COVID-19 Medicine

America’s biopharmaceutical industry dwarfs most other economic sectors. It’s one of our nation’s single biggest job creators, supporting close to a million positions across the country. And its products save countless lives each year. Yet for some reason, politicians in both parties seem determined to snuff it out by imposing crippling price controls on medicines. That would be a disaster for employees and patients alike. The industry has been an economic behemoth for decades. It contributes more to GDP than the agricultural and utility industries combined. The total value of the goods and services directly produced by drug firms totaled \$560 billion in 2017, according to a new report from TEconomy Partners. And after factoring in the output from drug companies’ vendors and other partners, that figure exceeds \$1.1 trillion. The industry also generates millions of high-paying jobs. Drug companies directly employed more than 811,000 Americans and indirectly supported over

3 million others in 2017. A third of those jobs are coveted science, technology, engineering, and math positions – the occupations of the future. And average compensation in the industry exceeded \$126,500 per worker in 2017. That’s more than twice the U.S. private sector average of \$60,700. Of course, the industry isn’t just an economic powerhouse. It’s also the global leader in medical innovation, producing half of the world’s new medicines. Right now, U.S. researchers are working on more than 4,500 new drugs. Despite these successes, drug development remains an expensive and risky venture. The White House Council of Economic Advisors estimates the cost of developing a single new drug at \$2 billion. Firms generally dedicate 15 to 20 percent of their revenues to drug development. But now, some lawmakers want to weaken the industry responsible for this economic growth and medical innovation. The recent drug pricing bill passed by the House, H.R. 3, would empower the government to cap the price of 250 common brand-name drugs. The prices could not exceed 120 percent of the average prices paid in six other developed countries with government-dominated health systems, including Canada, France, and the United Kingdom. These price controls would reduce drug companies’ revenues by \$1 trillion over 10 years, according to the Congressional Budget Office. Based on the Council of Economic

Advisors’ assumptions, that means firms will devote roughly \$200 billion less to research and development, resulting in 100 fewer new drugs over the next decade. Meanwhile, the Senate Finance Committee is pushing its own price control bill. The legislation would bar companies from raising prices faster than the rate of inflation. And it would effectively levy taxes on drug companies by increasing their cost-sharing liability in Medicare’s prescription drug benefit. All told, the bill would cost biopharmaceutical firms \$100 billion over the next 10 years. Once these price controls, taxes, and other penalties begin depleting their revenue, firms will curtail research and development – and thus lay off American workers. According to a recent poll, 45 percent of drug firms said that “significant” reductions in research and development could force immediate job cuts and facility closures. Let’s hope our leaders in Washington reconsider proposals that would cripple one of America’s largest and most innovative industries – and leave patients without the lifesaving drugs they need. Why am I receiving this notice? On May 27, 2020, Golden State Water Company (Golden State) filed Advice Letter No. 1818-W with the California Public Utilities Commission (Commission) regarding the acquisition of Sutter County Water Works District No. 1's (VWD1) Robbins Water System (Robbins)1.

The following are proposed in Advice Letter No. 1818-W:

- (1) Golden State will provide service and water supply for Robbins customers;
- (2) Robbins will be served through Golden State's Arden-Cordova Customer Service Area (CSA),
- (3) The water rates Robbins customers currently pay will remain in effect for 12 months after the acquisition, then rates will be adjusted to be consistent with the Arden-Cordova CSA's metered rates;
- (4) Approval to construct the needed infrastructure investments to improve water quality and supply reliability for Robbins customers;
- (5) Funding from grants for infrastructure improvements and establish tracking accounts for unanticipated repair costs,

tax liabilities and expenses.

In addition, Robbins customers will benefit from:

- (1) Golden State's 24-hour Customer Call Center and MyGSWater website portal allow customers to manage their accounts from the convenience and safety of their home or business. Golden State also provides customers with information and resources via a website, Facebook, and Twitter.
- (2) Golden State's technical, financial, and managerial resources to maintain the local water system reliability and ensure water quality meets federal and state drinking water standards.
- (3) There will be no noticeable impact to water service during the transition and service will continue without interruption.

Rate Impact Robbins residential customers who use 14 Ccf (10,472 gallons) each month will see a bill decrease of approximately \$15.71 when they are transitioned to metered service, based on Arden Cordova's current rates.

Copies of the current and proposed tariff sheets can be found in Exhibit 4 of Advice Letter No. 1818-W.

How does the rest of this process work? This advice letter will be reviewed by staff in the Water Division of the CPUC. They will determine if the request is reasonable, propose any necessary modifications, and put together a resolution regarding the request.

Protests and Responses to Advice Letter No. 1818-W Anyone may respond to or protest this advice letter. The deadline to do so is within 20 calendar days from the filing date, or no later than July 9, 2020.A protest must set forth the specific grounds on which it is based. These grounds are:

1. The purchase agreement between Golden State and VWD1 was established on March 14, 2011 and was adopted in Commission Decision No. 14-06-051 (A.08-08-022 Settlement Agreement).

- (1) The utility did not properly serve or give notice of the advice letter;
- (2) The relief requested in the advice letter would violate statute or CPUC order, or is not authorized by statute or CPUC order on which the utility relies;
- (3) The analysis, calculations, or data in the advice letter contain material error or omissions;
- (4) The relief requested in the advice letter is pending before the CPUC in a formal proceeding;
- (5) The relief requested in the advice letter requires consideration in a formal application filing or formal hearing before the CPUC, or is otherwise inappropriate for the advice letter process;
- (6) The relief requested in the advice letter is unjust, unreasonable, or discriminatory (provided that such a protest may not be made where it would require re-litigating a prior order of the Commission).
