Unique Programs to Help Rancho Cordova Businesses

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - Businesses throughout the Rancho Cordova community are feeling the impacts of COVID-19/coronavirus. In an effort to ensure Rancho Cordova businesses have direct access to professional assistance during this time, the city has developed unique programs to ensure they are getting access to the tools they need.

"We want our businesses to know that we care deeply about their future and that we are here for them," said Amanda Norton, Economic Development Manager for the City of Rancho Cordova. "Our team has worked hard to get our businesses

access to the tools they need as quick as possible in this evolving situation," she added.

The City of Rancho Cordova and the Rancho Cordova Chamber of Commerce are teaming up with professional business consultants to form the Rancho Cordova Business Action Team. This team is now offering free consultation services to businesses in Rancho Cordova. Schedule an appointment to speak with a professional business consultant by contacting the city's Economic Development team at EconDev@cityofranhocordova.org.

The Rancho Cordova City Council approved \$1 million in funds for very low-interest loans to local

businesses affected by COVID-19/coronavirus. The city partnered with Lift Investing to direct \$1 million of its existing investment accounts into a community financial institution that will provide low-interest loans with deferred principal and interest payments for the first three to six months to local businesses to help them retain or create jobs.

On March 27, 2020, the City Council voted in favor of halting evictions for residential and commercial tenants during this crisis. Learn more about this moratorium at CityofRanchoCordova.org/coronavirus.

Newsom Administration Claims another '\$1.831 Billion Needed'

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - In a last-minute call last Thursday evening, Department of Finance officials notified the Legislature that Governor Newsom is transferring an eye-popping \$1.831 billion to the Disaster Response-Emergency Operations Account to spend through the current fiscal year with only limited details.

"The spending of billions of taxpayers' dollars must be reviewed and approved by representatives of the citizens of California. It is time for the Legislature to return to the standard separation and balance of power," said Vice Chair of the Senate Budget Committee Senator Jim Nielsen (R-Tehama). "There is too little transparency, oversight and accountability. The public deserves better."

Without sufficient evidence to support the need for this massive spending, the letter from the Department of Finance breaks down expenditures as follows:

\$1.3 billion to procure personal protective equipment; \$251.7 million to establish and support over 3,000 hospital beds; \$30 million for hotels for healthcare workers and support staff; \$159.4 million to cover costs for ongoing state response activities; \$98.4 million for statewide testing and contact tracing and tracking.

Californians have answered the call and slowed the spread of the virus. Hospitals are safe, and most have few, if any, COVID-19 patients. The U.S. Naval hospital ship Mercy has returned to the port in San Diego. The field hospital at Sacramento's Arco Arena will close at the end of the month after the state paid an outrageous \$1 million to house fewer than 10 patients.

Senator Nielsen said, "There is no surge in hospital demand in California."

As the Los Angeles Times editorial stated, "[T]he state is moving from the emergency response phase into one of recovery, the governor needs to start sharing power again with the Legislature, as the state's constitution intends. That means no more COVID-19 blank checks."

"Long standing processes and procedures to establish the balance of power in our government must be strictly

such as mandatory face coverings for both barbers or stylists and clients. State public health leaders noted that Californians staying at home and exercising caution when out helped flatten the COVID-19 curve. Public health leaders acknowledge that

today's announcement is also possible based on statewide indicators such as PPE, testing capacity, hospital surge capacity and hospitalizations.

Permitted activities include services that can be provided with both the worker and

customer wearing face coverings throughout the service. These include haircuts, hair coloring, blowouts, weaves and extensions, braiding, lock maintenance, wig maintenance and hair relaxing treatments.

City of Rancho Cordova COVID-19/ Coronavirus Update

Dear Rancho Cordova Residents and Businesses,

I have some good news to share. Following the stay-at-home orders and practicing social distancing has made a measurable difference in reducing the number of COVID-19 cases. As a result, Sacramento County is approved to move more broadly into Stage 2 of the Governor’s Resilience Roadmap, which means re-openings for many businesses.

As I have since March, I want to update you on the new County Public Health Order and announce new services to assist you during this time.

Sacramento County’s Public Health Officer issued a new Public Health Order effective today, May 22, 2020 at 11:59 AM. The new order continues to direct residents to stay at home, recommends wearing face coverings, and relaxes restrictions on businesses that are considered low risk. Read the new Public Health Order at CityofRanchoCordova.org/coronavirus.

The new Public Health Order continues to allow activities from previous health orders and adds these additional activities:

Full public transportation; Dine-in at restaurants; Pet grooming, car washes; Micro enterprise retail, shopping malls; Agricultural food and beverage cultivation, process and distribution (by appointment); Plumbers, electricians, exterminators, arborists, landscapers, gardeners; Small offices when telework is not possible; Childcare, day care and family day care; Drive-through religious services; Outdoor museums and art galleries; Drive-through graduation ceremonies

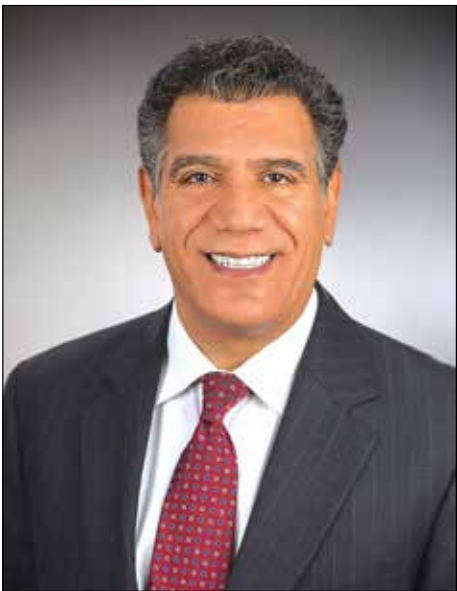
To mitigate a resurgence of COVID-19 cases, businesses must strictly follow State Guidelines at <https://covid19.ca.gov/industry-guidance/>.

This new Public Health Order emphasizes that it is critical to continue to stay at home especially if you’re ill, maintain social distancing of six feet or more, and wash hands or use hand sanitizer frequently. What is new is a County recommendation to wear face coverings when social distancing is not possible. Please read the health order’s very detailed explanation of what a face covering is and when to use one at CityofRanchoCordova.org/coronavirus.

The city has three new programs to help during this time:

Great Plates is a free meal program for seniors, and the meals are delivered daily to seniors. To see if you qualify and to sign up for this service, more information at the end of this letter.

The city is offering up to 1,000 free face masks for city businesses, depending on the number of employees and while supplies last. Contact EconDev@cityofranchocordova.org for more information.

As restaurants re-open dine-in services, the city is offering a free and fast temporary permit to allow restaurants to expand safely into parking lots to create more dine-in capacity.

Free grocery delivery is available to our residents. Rancho Delivers provides free grocery delivery from Raley’s Supermarkets and Safeway.

A directory of community services was created to provide information about food pantry/school meal information and other family resources.

Small businesses have access to city resources, including a loan program, free consultation services, and a toolkit, plus many more resources from the state and federal government.

Many businesses are open for business during this time, including grocery stores, restaurants and other essential businesses.

Dignity Health Grants \$75K to Help More Low-Income Pregnant Women

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Sacramento Life Center, WellSpace Health and Bishop Gallegos Maternity Home have created a partnership to provide a continuum of care for women and teens from the Arden area who are low-income and pregnant, resulting in a recent \$75,000 grant from Dignity Health. The collaborative will help approximately 450 pregnant women and teens in the Arden area have the care they need to transition to parenthood, including a healthy pregnancy, safe home and parenting support. As needed, women will receive pregnancy tests and ultrasounds, assistance signing up for Medi-Cal presumptive eligibility, prenatal and postnatal medical care, pediatric care, housing, parenting education, diapers, clothing, formula and more. Sacramento Life Center and WellSpace Health will receive \$30,000 each, and Bishop Gallegos Maternity Home will receive \$15,000.

“This partnership has found an innovative way to quickly help pregnant women and teens in need receive an array of services,” said Marie Leatherby, executive director, Sacramento Life Center. “Through this collaborative, we will significantly increase the number of pregnant women in the Arden area who have access to prenatal care and other wraparound

services that will ensure each woman has a healthy pregnancy, safe delivery and support system in place once the baby is born.”

The Sacramento Life Center’s mission is to offer compassion, support, resources and free medical care to women and couples facing an unplanned or unsupported pregnancy. The Sacramento Life Center’s licensed Sac Valley Pregnancy Clinic includes a primary clinic and mobile clinic that provide all services for free, including pregnancy tests, STD tests, ultrasounds, patient advocacy for men and women, education and resource referrals. In 2018, the Sacramento Life Center achieved accreditation by the Accreditation Association for Ambulatory Health Care, which ensures the group has met nationally recognized standards for the provision of high-quality health care. The nonprofit also offers a school-based teen education program, 24-hour hotline and program for women who have experienced pregnancy loss. Social Security Matters

Are Social Security and Medicare Running Out of Money?

Dear Rusty: I have been hearing reports that Social Security and Medicare will run out of money by 2035 and will only pay approximately 75% of benefits. First, is that true about Social Security? And second, will they reduce benefits to people who are already on it or just the new people signing up? **Signed: Worried about the Future**

Dear Worried: The financial difficulties facing both Social Security and Medicare are well known by those of us who work with these programs every day, and Congress is equally and acutely aware of the issues. But Social Security and Medicare are two entirely separate programs which require two entirely separate answers.

Let's discuss Social Security (SS) first. The SS Trust Fund now has about \$2.9 trillion dollars in assets. These are reserves accumulated from past revenues which exceeded the cost of providing past benefits to recipients of Social Security. That seems like a lot of money but starting this year (2020) Social Security will need to use some of those reserves to pay full benefits. That's because benefits paid out to recipients in 2020 will be more than the money coming in (this was expected even before the pandemic exacerbated the problem). And that trend will continue, and worsen, as we go



forward in time. Without Congressional action, the SS Trust Fund reserves will be exhausted in 2035. And unless Congress acts before then to increase SS revenue and/or reduce SS expenses, when the Trust Fund is dry an across-the-board cut in benefits will affect everyone. That's because with the Trust Fund empty, Social Security can only pay out as much money as it receives in revenue and it's currently estimated that, in 2035, that will result in a cut of 21% for everyone. Sadly, the actions needed to correct Social Security's financial issues are well known; what's missing is bipartisan cooperation in Congress to implement the changes needed.

There is no doubt that Social Security needs reform to be able to sustain full benefits for future generations and, hopefully, Congress will step forward soon to make those changes. Historically, any changes made to Social Security do not affect those who are already collecting benefits (it would be political suicide to do that), but rather will apply to future beneficiaries (much more palatable politically). Of course, that cannot be guaranteed but, if history is our guide, changes will eventually be made which shore up Social Security's finances, and those changes will affect only those who are not yet eligible to collect benefits.

As for Medicare, part of the FICA payroll taxes paid by every American worker includes an amount (1.45%) to pay for Medicare Part A (hospitalization)

coverage for Medicare beneficiaries. Any excess collected goes into an "HI Trust Fund" reserved for paying Medicare Part A expenses. According to latest reports the HI Trust Fund is projected to run dry in about 2026 at which point, theoretically, only hospital expenses equal to revenue could be paid.

Medicare Part B coverage (for doctors and other outpatient services) is paid for from two sources – one source is the monthly premiums which are paid by every Part B beneficiary, and the other source is the Government's General Treasury (which picks up the difference between what is collected in Part B premiums and what is needed to pay healthcare expenses). Similarly, it's expected that the Government will shore up Medicare Part A as needed when the time comes (which it has in the past). So, while Medicare is clearly under a lot of financial stress from the ever-increasing cost of healthcare, it's highly doubtful that the program is in any danger going away. More probably, Congress will look to cut the program's expense structure, which would affect medical service providers more than individuals.

Census Bureau Opens for Operations in Select Northern California Counties

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The U.S. Census Bureau, in coordination with federal, state and local health officials, will begin to drop off 2020 Census questionnaire packets at front doors of nearly 150,000 households in Northern California that do not have regular mailing addresses, such as in rural areas or households that use post office boxes. That delivery is called the

"Update Leave" operation, and it began March 15 before all fieldwork was suspended March 18 due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Field staff have been trained to observe all social distancing protocols and will wear official government-provided personal protective equipment for their safety and the safety of the public. This operation is contactless and follows the most current federal health and safety guidelines.

People are strongly encouraged to respond promptly to the 2020 Census using the ID number included in the questionnaire packet. Responding with a census ID or the paper questionnaire helps ensure the best count of their community. People can respond online, by phone or by using the paper form in the packet. Salon activities that cannot be done with face coverings on both the worker and client – or that require touching the client's face – such as shaving, facial waxing, threading, eyelash services and facials – remain prohibited at this time in all counties. Likewise, nail salons remain closed.

"Together, Californians have limited infections in our state, and because of that work, many counties may make a decision to restart modified hair and barber services," said Dr. Sonia Angell, State Public Health Officer and Director of the California Department of Public Health. "However, COVID-19 is still present in our communities and we are still at risk. As we venture outside our homes, it is critically important to keep physical distance, wear face coverings in public, and wash hands frequently to help protect yourself and those around you."

Under the new guidance to reopen, salons and barbers must: Implement measures to ensure physical distancing

of at least six feet between and among workers and customers, except when providing haircutting and other close contact services; Provide temperature and/or symptom screenings for all workers at the beginning of their shift and any vendors, contractors, or other workers entering the establishment; Encourage workers and customers who are sick or exhibiting symptoms of COVID-19 to stay home; Screen customers upon arrival and be prepared to cancel or reschedule customers who indicate they have any signs of illness; Require workers and customers to use face coverings during the entire haircutting and other close contact hair services.

Aerojet Rocketdyne Powers Second Mission for U.S. Space Force

CAPE CANAVERAL, FL. (MPG) - Aerojet Rocketdyne supported the successful launch of the USSF-7 mission for the recently formed U.S. Space Force today. The mission carried the military's X-37B space plane into orbit aboard a United Launch Alliance (ULA) Atlas V rocket.

Aerojet Rocketdyne propulsion products supporting the launch included an RL10C-1 upper-stage engine, helium pressurization tanks on the rocket and a dozen MR-106 thrusters on the Centaur upper stage that provided roll, pitch and yaw control, as well as settling burns. This launch will carry the 1,000th MR-106 thruster to fly on an Atlas V launch vehicle.

"This launch marks the second successful launch for the United States Space Force since the new branch of our military was officially established last year," said Eileen Drake, Aerojet Rocketdyne's CEO and president. "We look forward to supporting many more

launches in the coming years for this new organization, which has the critical task of protecting U.S. and allied interests in space."

After the Atlas V lifted off the pad and the upper stage separated from the first stage booster, a single RL10C-1 engine ignited to place the payload into orbit. The RL10C-1 engine delivers 22,890 pounds of thrust to power the upper stage, using cryogenic liquid hydrogen and liquid oxygen propellants during its operation. ARDE, a subsidiary of Aerojet Rocketdyne based in New Jersey, provides the pressure vessels on the first and second stages on the launch vehicle.
