RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - Rancho Cordovans who died in the service of their country will be honored during a special display of American flags on Folsom Boulevard this Memorial Day.

"Flags on Folsom Boulevard" will feature hundreds of American flags posted on the south side of Rancho Cordova's central roadway, paying tribute to those who "gave all," as organizers shift to an observance which honors the sacrifice of veterans while complying with COVID-19 social distancing requirements.

In a normal Memorial Day setting, the Cordova Community Council would work with community residents, the Veterans Administration and Rancho Cordova River City Concert Band for a moving program staged at the VA Medical Center at Mather, or inside the Performing Arts Center at Cordova High School.

However, current conditions made both those settings impossible this

year, so fallen veterans will be honored as follows:

"Flags on Folsom Boulevard" is a 300-flag tribute on Folsom Boulevard. The flags will be installed on Friday, May 23, and remain on display through the Memorial Day holiday on May 25;

Memorial wreath at Memorial Plaza, located in front of the VA Medical Center, Mather. Republic Services is providing the tribute;

"Our Gratitude" billboard honors will acknowledge the contributions of 30 veterans of all branches of the service, who would have been spotlighted with a memorial brick ceremony during a standard Memorial Day salute. This Memorial Day, the veterans will be remembered in rotating displays on digital billboards along Highway 50, in cooperation with Clear Channel Outdoor and Outfront Media.

Cordova Community Council event specialist Marie Beckstaiger said the organizing committee for Memorial Day and Veterans Day salutes hope to

return to the more personal and moving tributes which have become a signature of Rancho Cordova's honoring of veterans, both living and deceased.

"This approach was not our first choice," she said. "But no matter what, we agree with the citizens of Rancho Cordova that honoring brave veterans, especially those who died in the service of our country, is non-negotiable. We hope everyone takes a drive down Folsom Boulevard and to the Memorial Plaza in their honor, and we look forward to the day when we can join together as a community again."

Commissioner Lara Expands Order for Insurance Companies to Partially Refund Premiums

California Department of Insurance

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Insurance Commissioner Ricardo Lara issued a Bulletin extending his previous order requiring insurance companies to return partial insurance premiums to consumers and businesses and provide much-needed financial relief amid the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic. The Department of Insurance will review all premium adjustments to ensure they are fair and adequate and reflect policyholders' reduced risk.

The Bulletin now includes the month of May, having already included the months of

March and April, covering at least six different insurance lines: private passenger automobile, commercial automobile, workers' compensation, commercial multi-peril, commercial liability, medical malpractice, and any other insurance line where the risk of loss has fallen substantially as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic.

The Commissioner's Bulletin 2020-4 requires insurance companies to provide an adjustment to the premium in the form of a premium credit, reduction, return of premium, or other appropriate adjustment as soon as possible, and no later than August 11, 2020. For most if not all consumers, this

will be a percentage of the premium - not 100 percent - and the Department of Insurance will validate each insurance company's plan so that refunds are adequate and reflect the reduced risk.

"With the vast majority of Californians still under 'stay at home' orders, the risk of accident and loss remains low for many lines of insurance and their premiums should reflect that," said Commissioner Lara. "While I appreciate companies that have already taken action to return premiums, the Department of Insurance will be checking that the reductions are adequate and consumers and businesses are not

shortchanged."

On March 18, Commissioner Lara issued a Notice, calling on all admitted and non-admitted insurance companies to provide their policyholders with a 60-day grace period to pay their premiums. With the deadline for this grace period fast approaching, Commissioner Lara today issued a second Notice requesting insurance companies to work with their policyholders who may be struggling financially to allow them an additional 60-days, effectively extending the grace period until July 14, 2020. After July 14, 2020, insurers are encouraged to work

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Warmer Weather Will Speed Snowmelt, Increase River Flows

With temperatures forecast to increase this week, California's snowpack will be melting faster, potentially filling rivers and streams with dangerously cold and swift moving water.

As some counties begin to ease shelter-at-home restrictions, Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) notes that California's stay-at-home order remains in effect, and it's important to continue practicing physical distancing. Californians may walk, run, hike and/or bike in their local neighborhoods as long as they continue to practice physical distancing of six feet.

For those who choose to venture near or in water, PG&E encourages them to take extra precautions when in or near rivers, especially around hydroelectric facilities and dams, where water flows can change rapidly. Anglers also are encouraged to take precautions as trout season has opened for most California rivers.

Although California's snowfall is below normal, runoff is expected to continue into early summer.

"Public safety is our

highest priority. We encourage everyone recreating in or near water to plan at all times how they can quickly and safely escape in case of changing water flows and cold temperatures," said Jan Nimick, PG&E vice president of Power Generation.

Most California rivers are fed by snowmelt, making them cold even in summer. Simple actions such as recognizing if the water is too cold or swift, knowing your limits, wearing a life jacket and simply not entering the water when conditions are deemed unsafe can save a life.

Below are some water safety tips:

Stay Out and Stay Alive - Stay Out of Canals and Flumes

Recreating in PG&E canals and flumes is strictly prohibited. Stay off elevated flumes and out of these water conveyances, regardless of who owns them, as they are very dangerous due to slippery sides and fast-moving cold water. Be mindful of signs and warnings. Stay out of areas that are signed as restricted, fenced off or buoy-lined.

Know the Risks

Prevention is the best way to save a person from drowning. By the time a person is

struggling in the water, a rescue is extremely unlikely and places the rescuer at risk.

Sudden immersion in cold water can stimulate the "gasp reflex," causing an involuntary inhalation of air or water. It can even trigger cardiac arrest, temporary paralysis, hypothermia and drowning. When faced with swift water, even the strongest swimmers can be easily overwhelmed.

Cold water entering the ear canal can cause vertigo and disorientation. This can confuse swimmers, potentially causing them to venture deeper into the water.

Cold water also reduces body heat 25 to 30 times faster than air does at the same temperature and causes impairment that can be fatal.

Learn About Self-Rescue Techniques

If you do fall into the water, here are some survival tips:

Don't panic. Try to control your breathing; don't gasp. A sudden, unexpected fall into cold water causes an involuntary gasp (or torso) reflex. It takes less than one-half cup of water in a person's lungs to drown. If you remain calm, you have a greater chance of self-rescue; If you have a boat, stay with it. It will help you stay afloat

and will be seen more easily by rescuers. If it's capsized and a portion of the craft is above water, try to climb on top; Stay afloat with the help of a life jacket, regain control of your breathing and keep your head above water in view of rescuers; If possible, remove heavy shoes. Look for ways to increase buoyancy such as by holding onto seat cushions or an ice chest; If you're in the water with others, huddle together facing each other to help everyone stay afloat and keep warm; If you do fall into a river without a life jacket, keep your feet pointed downstream and turn onto your back; If you fall into the water with waders on, roll onto the shore. Wear a belt with waders.

Know your Limits

Swimming in open water is more difficult than in a swimming pool - people tire more quickly and can get into trouble; Many unseen obstacles can be lurking below the water's surface - this is especially the case during spring and early summer snowmelt. Rising water can make these obstacles even more treacherous. Guided trips for inexperienced paddlers are recommended;

Wear a Coast Guard - Approved Life Jacket

Conditions change quickly in open water and even the best swimmers can misjudge the water and their skills when boating or swimming.

Adult Supervision

Actively supervise children in and around open bodies of water, giving them your undivided attention. Do not assume that someone is watching them. Appoint a designated "water watcher," taking turns with other adults. Use the buddy system and never swim alone. ★

Spring Storms Not Enough to Offset Dry Winter

The season's final manual snow survey at Phillips Station was conducted by the Department of Water Resources (DWR). The survey recorded 1.5 inches of snow depth and a snow water equivalent (SWE) of 0.5 inches, which is 3 percent of the May average for this location. The SWE measures the amount of water contained in the snowpack, providing a more accurate forecast of spring runoff than snow depth alone.

Measurements from the 130 electronic snow sensors scattered throughout the state indicate that the statewide snowpack's water equivalent is 8.4 inches, or 37 percent of the May average. The readings will help hydrologists forecast spring and summer snowmelt runoff into rivers and reservoirs.

"March and April storms brought needed snow to the Sierras, with the snowpack reaching its peak on April 9, however those gains were not nearly enough to offset a very dry January and February," said Sean de Guzman, chief of DWR's Snow Survey and Water Supply Forecast Section. "The last two weeks have seen increased

temperatures leading to a rapid reduction of the snowpack. Snowmelt runoff into the reservoirs is forecasted to be below average."

California's weather variability has been on full display this water year. Dry conditions in October and November were followed by precipitation in December that measured 120 percent of average. Very dry conditions returned to much of the state in January and February, with March and April storms leading to the snowpack peaking at just 66 percent of average on April 9.

In normal years, the snowpack supplies about 30 percent of California's water needs as it melts in the spring and early summer. The greater the snow water equivalent the greater the likelihood California's reservoirs will receive ample runoff to meet the state's water demand in the summer and fall.

The state's six largest reservoirs currently hold between 83 percent (San Luis) and 126 percent (Melones) of their historical averages for this date. Lake Shasta, California's largest surface reservoir, is 94 percent of its historical average and sits at 81 percent of capacity.

\$5 Million Allocated for Lead Testing in California Child Care Centers

State Water Resources Control Board

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - The State Water Resources Control Board has executed an agreement to provide approximately \$5 million in grant funds for testing and remediation of lead in drinking water at licensed Child Care Centers.

The passage of Assembly Bill 2370 in 2018 requires that all licensed child care centers constructed before Jan. 1, 2010 test their drinking water for lead and do so within a three-year window. Subsequent testing every five years after the date of the first test is also required. The testing requirement does

not apply when services are provided in the home of the caregiver.

Lead is a naturally occurring toxic metal used in many products and found throughout the environment including air, soil and water. Children are particularly susceptible to lead exposure. Lead can slow down growth and development, harm a child's nervous system and impact brain development. Studies have found that even small amounts of lead exposure can make it difficult for children to learn, pay attention and succeed in school. Children under six years old are most at risk, particularly infants.

The California Depart-

ment of Social Services regulates licensed child care centers and plans to issue directives to centers in early 2020 regarding the requirements for testing and remediation. Once issued, that information will be posted on the CDSS Provider Information Notices page.

A second 2018 bill, Senate Bill 862, appropriates \$5 million from the General Fund to the SWRCB and prioritizes centers serving infants and preschoolers. The bill gave highest priority for centers that serve infants, those that operate only one center and those with a majority of children receiving subsidized care. ★

2020 Census Deadline Extended, But Don't Wait

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Because of the public health crisis, the U.S. Census Bureau has extended the deadline for completing the census until Oct. 31, and the census has never been easier (or more important) to complete. You can respond online, by phone or by mail. It only takes a few minutes, so it's best to do so as soon as possible.

Census websites are now available in English and 12 other languages. Online surveys may be

completed on a computer, smartphone, laptop or tablet.

To complete the census by phone, call 1 (844) 330-2020. Telephone assistance is available from 4 a.m. to 11 p.m. daily. If there's a wait time, you can ask the Census Bureau to call you back.

For those who prefer a paper questionnaire, surveys have been mailed to households who have not previously responded. "U.S. Census Bureau" or "U.S. Department of Commerce" is printed in the return address. Simply complete the census and

mail it back in the return envelope provided.

It has never been more important for households to complete the 2020 Census. Many emergency preparedness and public health programs rely heavily on census data for federal funding. Sacramento County is eligible for hundreds of millions of dollars in federal stimulus from the Coronavirus Relief Fund (CRF) based on population figures provided by the Census Bureau.

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And Another Thing “Too Much Change in My Life Recently”

There are many things that have been affected by the coronavirus, and among those things is Memorial Day. Honoring our veterans on Memorial Day and Veterans Day at the VA Medical Center at Mather has been very gratifying since I was able to start the events there in 2006 on Veterans Day. Since then, we have only been stopped from holding an event once on Veterans Day, and that was because of smoke from wildfires in 2018. Now because of the coronavirus, we are changing how we honor our veterans on Memorial Day. There wouldn't be enough space in the Cordova High School Performing Arts Theatre to have the 400+ members of the audience be six feet apart, and gatherings remain prohibited. Instead, there will be a 300-flag tribute on Folsom Boulevard that will be installed on Friday, May 23, and remain on display through Memorial Day on Monday, May 25. A memorial wreath will be placed at Memorial Plaza, located in front of the VA Medical Center at Mather, by Republic Services. There will also be rotating displays on the digital billboards along Highway 50 to acknowledge the contributions of 30 veterans who would have been spotlighted with a memorial brick ceremony during the Memorial Day Observance.

I have been a member of the Mather Community Campus Oversight Committee since it began in 1994. Mather Community Campus was initially a transitional program run by Sacramento County, and it received two national awards during the first few years. As time went by and the national recession hit around 2008, the County had to find someone else to run the program or shut it down. The Volunteers of America was able to take it over, and the former homeless individuals who were in the program were able to continue, graduate and get back into society. It was so well run that many people didn't know it was there. It was a great program. Now, the program of Mather Community Campus is no longer a single program. I talked to city staff member Stefan Heisler to find out what was going on, and he provided the following information. There are at least four housing programs being run out of the Mather Community Campus. The Adolfo and family transitional housing is still being run by Volunteers of America, and our understanding is the County is going out for more bids on these programs. Volunteers of America also has a veterans transitional housing program. The program recently received additional grant funding and

will be expanding. There are also a few dozen open units for Next Move Sacramento as temporary housing for the County's flexible housing program until the program places participants in other housing. While the programs are still operating, I am keeping watch of them because I would hate to see some of those in the programs be told that the programs may be closed and find themselves homeless again. I have read quite a few books, pamphlets, magazines, etc., and in one of them, I read about how someone felt about the "stress and anxiety" of today. The person said, "There has been too much change in my life recently, and I feel overwhelmed. Because I try to be a responsible person, I sometimes forget that it is unwise for me to allow my sense of duty to override my common sense." After two months of staying home and not being able to eat out or go to a movie or go to a ball game etc., I definitely understand why so many people are in agreement about "too much change in my life recently" and why they feel overwhelmed. I am hoping like you that there will be a vaccine or medication soon that will let us get back, as close as we can, to the lives we lived. Expert Independent Review is Needed to Comb through PPE Contracts, Says Senate Budget Vice Chair

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The Assembly Accountability and Administrative Review and the Assembly Governmental Organization Committees will host panel discussions on the state's failed contract with one company - Blue Flame. News reports have since exposed more troubling failures in administration contracting efforts. Senator Jim Nielsen (R-Tehama) who, along with a group of lawmakers, has requested a thorough audit through the Joint Legislative Audit Committee of the sole source contracting practices in these multi-million dollar legal commitments, issued the following statement: "This hearing is a step in the right direction." "But taxpayers deserve a thorough forensic audit of how the state signed contracts committing hundreds of millions of dollars to bring federally certified masks but failed." "Lack of an independent, nonpartisan

audit by competent experts is not acceptable. Without a full investigation into the procurement process that transpired, there will be public mistrust." PLEASE NOTE: As stated on its website, "The California State Auditor is the only state entity that is given full access to all records of state and local agencies, special districts, and school districts. General powers of the California State Auditor include the ability to subpoena records, take depositions, and administer oaths. In all cases, information obtained by the California State Auditor that is legally confidential must be protected from release from the public." Elected to the State Senate in January 2013, Senator Nielsen represents the Fourth Senate District, which includes the counties of Butte, Colusa, Glenn, Placer, Sacramento, Sutter, Tehama and Yuba. with their individual policyholders who have been acutely impacted by COVID-19 and are still unable to timely pay their premiums.

“Consumers who have lost

their jobs or businesses due to this crisis deserve flexibility in paying their premiums, just like any other,” said Commissioner Lara. “I am asking insurance companies to be mindful of the revenue stream Californians

have consistently provided to insurers over the years, stand with their customers in this crisis and extend grace periods an additional 60 days.”

Commissioner Lara is also requesting that all insurance

agents, brokers, and other licensees who accept premium payments on behalf of insurers take steps to ensure that customers have the ability to make prompt insurance payments, if and where possible.

This includes alternate methods of payment, such as online payments, to eliminate the need for in-person payment methods in order to protect the health and safety of both workers and customers. ★

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PG&E Crews and Contractors Inspecting Gas Meters in Counties

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - As part of Pacific Gas and Electric Company's (PG&E) ongoing efforts to provide safe and reliable service to customers, utility workers will perform routine gas meter inspections in Fairfield, Sacramento, Suisun City, Loomis and Rocklin starting May 11. The inspections are expected to last throughout the month.

Safety is PG&E's most important responsibility. To help protect the health and safety of customers and employees during the COVID-19 pandemic, PG&E has taken precautions to maintain the recommended social distancing of at least six feet from customers when conducting routine safety inspections of gas meters.

PG&E employees and contractors with Underground Construction will be conducting inspections on foot with a mobile tablet, Monday through Friday, 7 a.m. to 6 p.m.

They will be wearing a hard hat, safety vest and carry photo identification, which they will present upon a customer's request.

If a person claiming to be a PG&E employee or contractor shows you his or her identification and you still feel uncomfortable, call PG&E's customer service line at 1-800-743-5000 to verify an appointment and/or PG&E's presence in the community. PG&E employees and contractors will walk up to the gas meters at homes and businesses but will not enter homes during these inspections.

During inspections, customers may see a PG&E employee or contractor on or near their properties as they access the gas meter. This work will not affect gas service. If we are unable to safely inspect the gas meter while maintaining a six-foot clearance from customers, we will contact you and schedule an appointment at a later date.
