Searching for Answers



RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - To find out what the business community is feeling, thinking, and needing, the Rancho Cordova Chamber of Commerce and City of Rancho Cordova have teamed up to produce a series of surveys to discover the impact of COVID-19. The Business Impact Assessment survey contains 42 questions, based on mainly two sources, said Amanda Norton, economic development manager for the City of Rancho Cordova. Some questions originated from Chamber research on the subject and communication through other chambers of commerce throughout the country. "A large percentage of the questions came from the International Economic

"A lot of these questions are being used in surveys by other people through the region, as well as some that people might use nationwide."

Responses are confidential and results will be reported only in aggregate, names

and contact information are optional and confidential as well. The survey asks responders questions related to the COVID-19 impact on their business, and what they expect for the future. Sections focus on different aspects including whether the business is open, its hours, and how

goods and services are currently being delivered. The option is given to include promotional information about the business that responders would like to have publicized.



Chamber and the City Economic Development team as they reviewed drafts of the survey. "It really is about wanting just to hear from (businesses), as far as what they're thinking," Runner said, "and depending on the results, what the actions might be to look at moving forward." When the survey answers have been compiled and evaluated, the City Council will assess the results as well.

In the meantime, businesses are struggling, each in its own way with its own individual situations and adjustments. Nonprofits are not immune to difficulties arising from the COVID-19 situation. Andrea Fournier founded sonder SOLUTIONS in 2016, working with the Department of Rehabilitation to provide employment services for those whose particular disabilities might not qualify them for the usual resources. "We tend to focus boots on the ground with getting people to work," Fournier said. "We prefer to empower people with the necessary tools so that when they find their job, it was their doing, with our support. They are the ones who get all the glory for it. They are the ones who put the work in, they're the ones who saw it all the way through."

Since the shutdown, the nonprofit's income has been cut by around 50%. "We act as employer of record to students who are working toward their work experience," Fournier said. The organization also provides a paid work experience for adults to identify what jobs they can and cannot do. Every one of those jobs, about 40 individuals, was obliterated by the current situation. "A lot of these individuals were on work permits through the schools," Fournier said. "When the schools shut down, any work permit is considered a school sponsored activity, which means it's been revoked."

sonders SOLUTIONS keeps operating expenses as low as possible, and are going to be all right for a while. But if the shutdown continues for a long period of time, even they would be wiped out. "You're talking about minimal income coming in versus maintaining the same level of expense," Fournier said. "I don't know any industry that would survive that."

The organization has recently started a program called Rancho Rises Up. It serves any resident of Rancho Cordova who is currently out of work as a result of COVID-19 and who is, or will be, actively seeking employment. "If you are currently out of work due to this global pandemic and would like assistance," Fournier said, "we urge you to reach out to us via e-mail at info@sondersolutions. org or by phone at 916-249-0203. All services are able to be provided remotely."

Runner is sure that this will not be the last time the Chamber and the City will want to hear from businesses. "I don't think that anybody has really dealt with a situation like this before from a business standpoint," Runner said, "where they have to figure out how to go from . . . operating 100%, then down to 0 and back up to 100%. What does that look like?"

Investigation is Underway on Police Use of Force and Juvenile Incident

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - On April 27, 2020, a Problem Oriented Policing (POP) Officer with the Department was proactively patrolling the area of Mills Station Road and Mather Field Road. The deputy was in the area due to complaints from citizens about handto-hand sales of alcohol, tobacco and drugs to minors.

It's important to put video footage into context, especially in relation to a use of force incident. In this case, the deputy saw what he believed to be a hand-to-hand and juvenile. As the deputy turned around, he lost sight of the adult, who left the area. When the deputy approached the juvenile, the juvenile was uncooperative and refused to give the deputy basic identifying information. He told

old. Having reasonable suspicion that criminal activity was occurring, the deputy attempted to detain the juvenile so he could conduct further investigation. The Rancho Cordova Police juvenile became physically resistive at that time, causing the deputy to lose control of his handcuffs, which landed several feet away. The deputy attempted to maintain control of the juvenile without his handcuffs and while alone waiting for his partners to arrive and assist him.

Ultimately, the deputy recovered tobacco products from the 14-year-old juvenile, which is presumably the reason for his resistance. exchange between an adult The juvenile was cited and released to his guardians.

This type of situation is hard on everyone--the young man, who resisted arrest, and the officer, who would much rather have him cooperate. The community should know our deputies have a heart for

the deputy he was 18 years the Rancho Cordova community, especially for the youth they serve through the schools, PAL sports, and our new Youth Center.

These are the facts as we know them. The Sheriff's Office and Rancho Cordova Police Department, however, have proactively started an investigation into the use of force by our deputy in order to gain a complete and thorough understanding of the events that took place during this incident. Maintaining the public trust and remaining transparent are of paramount importance to the Sheriff's Office and Rancho Cordova Police Department.

Note: These are the facts as we understand them at this time. This investigation is in its infancy and the facts as we understand them now are subject to change as we conduct a more thorough and complete examination of the circumstances surrounding this incident.



Social Security Matters

Should My Wife Take Her Social Security at Age 62?

Dear Rusty: I have been advised by my financial planner to start my wife's social security benefits at the age of 62 (she is now 61). I am 65 and still employed, not on Medicare, and not taking social security benefits. My wife's benefits are much less than mine. I hope to wait until age 70 before starting my benefits. My income is currently \$160,000. Do you see this as a wise choice to start my wife's SS benefits at age 62? Signed: Inquiring Wife

Dear Inquiring Wife:

Whether your wife should start her benefits at age 62 depends upon whether her own benefit at age 70 would be more than she is entitled to as your spouse at her full retirement age (FRA). You can get these estimates from Social Security. If her own benefit would eventually be higher than her spousal benefit from you, she can wait to get her own higher benefit at age 70 (as you are). But if her bene-



then claiming her own benefit before you claim yours could be a good choice, but there are some things to consider if she does that:

First, if your wife claims at age 62 (or any age before her FRA), that will mean that her eventual spousal benefit when she claims it (when you claim your SS) will be less than 50% of the benefit you are entitled to at your full retirement age. Taking her own benefit earlier than her FRA will mean her spousal benefit from you will be reduced to less than half of your FRA benefit amount, even if that spousal benefit starts after she has reached her FRA.

Second, if your wife is still working, by claiming her own benefit before her FRA she will be subject to Social Security's "earnings test" which limits the amount of money she can make without SS taking back some of her benefits. For 2020, the annual earnings limit is \$18,240 (changes annually) and SS will take back benefits equal to half of any earnings which exceed that amount. The earnings limit becomes less severe during the year your wife reaches her FRA and goes away entirely after she reaches fit as your spouse will be her FRA, but if she works the highest she can attain, while collecting early SS

benefits the earnings limit could affect her benefits.

Third, your wife's Social Security benefits will become part of your taxable income (assuming you file "married-jointly"). Taxation of your wife's Social Security benefits will be determined based upon your combined income if you file your taxes as a married couple. At your combined earnings level, up to 85% of your wife's SS benefits will become part of your taxable income.

I'm not suggesting you not follow your financial planner's advice; I only want to make sure vou're aware of all the factors involved when benefits are claimed early. Sometimes, a wife claiming at age 62 is a prudent choice as your financial planner has suggested. But sometimes understanding the above factors may lead to a different strategy.



New Measure for Transferring Property Tax Base Eligible for California's November Ballot

Secretary of State Press Release

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Secretary of State Alex Padilla announced that an initiative became eligible for the November 3, 2020 General Election ballot yesterday.

In order to become eligible for the ballot, the initiative needed 997,139 valid petition signatures, which is equal to eight percent of the total votes cast for governor in the November 2018 General Election.

A measure can become eligible via random sampling of petition signatures if the sampling projects that the number of valid signatures is greater than 110 percent of the required number. The initiative needed at least 1,096,853 projected valid signatures to become eligible by random sampling, and it exceeded that threshold yesterday.

On June 25, 2020, the Secretary of State will certify the initiative as qualified for the November 3, 2020 General Election ballot, unless it is withdrawn by the proponents prior to certification pursuant to Elections Code section 9604(b).

The Attorney General's official title and summary of the measure is as follows:

CHANGES REQUIREMENTS FOR TRANSFERRING PROPERTY TAX BASE TO REPLACEMENT PROPERTY. EXPANDS BUSINESS PROPERTY REASSESSMENT. INITIATIVE CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT. Removes the following requirements to transfer property tax base to replacement residence for homeowners over 55 or severely disabled: that replacement property be of equal or lesser value; that replacement property be in eligible county; and that transfer occur only once. Allows three such transfers. Removes location and replacement-value requirements for transfers of contaminated or disaster-destroyed property. Adjusts replacement property's tax base, based on market value. Limits tax benefits for certain transfers between family members. Expands circumstances requiring business property reassessment. Summary of estimate by Legislative Analyst and Director of Finance of fiscal impact on state and local governments: Local governments could gain tens of millions of dollars of property tax revenue per year, likely growing over time to a few hundred million dollars per year. Schools could receive similar property tax revenue gains. Other local and state revenues each could increase by tens of millions of dollars per year. County property tax administration costs likely would increase by tens of millions of dollars per year. (19-0003.)







Online Extortion Scams Increasing During the COVID-19 Crisis

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)

- The Internet Crime Complaint Center (IC3) has seen an increase in reports of online extortion scams during the current "stay-at-home" orders due to the COVID-19 crisis. Because large swaths of the population are staying at home and likely using the computer more than usual, scammers may use this opportunity to find new victims and pressure them into sending money. The scammers are sending e-mails threatening to release sexually explicit photos or personally compromising videos to the individual's contacts if they do not pay. While there are many variations of these online extortion attempts, they often share certain commonalities.

Scam Commonalities:

Online extortion schemes vary, but there are a few common indicators of the scam. The following characteristics are not all-inclusive but should serve as red flags. It is important to remember that scammers adapt their schemes to capital-

high-profile breaches, or new trends involving the Internet, all in an attempt to make their scams seem more authentic:

The online extortion attempt comes as an e-mail from an unknown party and, many times, will be written in broken English with grammatical errors; The recipient's personal information is noted in the e-mail or letter to add a higher degree of intimidation to the scam. For example, the recipient's user name or password is provided at the beginning of the e-mail or letter; The recipient is accused of visiting adult websites, cheating on a spouse, or being involved in other compromising situations; The e-mail or letter includes a statement like, "I had a serious spyware and adware infect your computer," or "I have a recorded video of you" as an explanation of how the information was allegedly gathered; The e-mail or letter threatens to send a video or other compromising information to family, friends, coworkers, or social network contacts if a ransom is not paid; The ize on current events such e-mail or letter provides a

as the COVID-19 pandemic, short window to pay, typically 48 hours; The recipient is instructed to pay the ransom in Bitcoin, a virtual currency that provides a high degree of anonymity to the transactions.

Tips To Protect Yourself:

Do not open e-mails or attachments from unknown individuals; Monitor your bank account statements regularly, and your credit report at least once a year for any unusual activity; Do not communicate with unsolicited e-mail senders; Do not store sensitive or embarrassing photos or information online or on your mobile devices; Use strong passwords and do not use the same password for multiple websites; Never provide personal information of any sort via e-mail. Be aware that many e-mails requesting your personal information appear to be legitimate; Ensure security settings for social media accounts are activated and set at the highest level of protection:

Verify the web address of legitimate websites and manually type the address into vour browser.


