What Your School District is Doing Now

As part of our COVID-19 updates, I wanted to pause and take a moment to offer my heartfelt gratitude to all of our staff, families, and students. Even in these trying, uncertain times, our students, staff, and families have shown great strength and resilience. I could not be prouder to be your Superintendent.

I hope you will take a couple of minutes to watch a special video message to our FCUSD family at the end of this update.

What changes can we expect now that Sacramento County residents have been ordered to stay at home?

On Thursday, March 19 Sacramento Public Health issued an order for all residents to remain in their place of residence. According to public health, education is an essential service. Though schools are to

remain closed, we are able to continue providing meals for students and to perform essential functions to facilitate distance learning.

What is the District doing now to prepare?

District leaders are working with staff to assess employee work-from-home needs. Employees are asked to please check their District email daily.

How will I get necessary supplies at my school so I can begin distance learning?

Principals will continue to work with staff and families to help them gather any materials or personal items needed for distance learning while ensuring appropriate social distancing measures.

What are the District's expectations for faculty teaching from home?

We are aware and sensitive to the

fact that many of our teachers and families, now working from home, are also balancing many different personal and professional obligations. Each family unit is unique with different needs, resources, and challenges.

We anticipate that distance learning will take many forms and may continue to adapt to our teachers' and families' needs. For example, lessons may be prepared ahead of delivery, and there may or may not be "live" access and instruction. Instruction may utilize technology and non-technology components.

Due to the variety of grades, curriculum and student needs served, our teachers are customizing instruction specific to their students. We ask for everyone's patience, flexibility and understanding as we figure out this new way of providing high quality education to all of our students.

The Produce Distribution in California is Guaranteed throughout Coronavirus Crises

LOS ANGELES, CA (MPG) - The potential coronavirus quarantine and panic buying shortages won't stop produce distribution in Southern California, according to the President of SGS Produce Carole Shandler.

SGS Produce is one of the founders of food distribution on the West Coast, operating since 1907 and guaranteeing food supply through two world wars, major natural disasters and 9/11. <http://www.sgsproduce.com>

The American produce industry is resilient and very well prepared to face such emergencies, and the USDA is being "very helpful and working fast to inspect

containers and release all the supply lines coming from the US and abroad", says Carole.

While some food distributors who specialize in schools and restaurants chains are facing lower demand due to shutdowns, and exports to Asia following the same path, local grocery retailers have immediate supply of produce available, particularly those with a shorter shelf-life such as fruits and vegetables. SGS is experiencing a low stock of just dry rice and beans and potatoes, forecasted to be back to normal levels in the next couple of days.

Produce distribution is guaranteed to reach all the regular demographics, including the low-income areas who depend on a more affordable supplying.

Besides maintaining short and long-term supply of produce in California, SGS's President says that all their employees are working with a touching sense of duty, as well as the truck drivers and the office team. "It is important right now that people have access to the food they are familiar with, in order to keep the emotional and physical comfort. That includes the ethnic varieties, which we are prepared to supply as well." At this point, Carole does not report any concerns with labor shortage in the industry.

SGS encourages retailers to campaign on clear information about how to sanitize your produce before consuming it, as well as the importance of not excluding

fresh fruit and vegetables of the daily diet in order to maintain a healthy immune system. "This is a time to work hard against consumer misconceptions and confusion"

Many industry members report that the COVID19 crisis has increased their sales, seeing the negative effects on travel and event cancellations, as well as on extra contingency meetings.

SGS is working hard with partners in the produce industry to keep the regular prices in times of uncertain demand, as well as to offer the best and fastest food distribution for the population of California.

PG&E is Committed to Providing Safe, Reliable Energy in These Challenging Times

SAN FRANCISCO, CA (MPG) - The COVID-19 pandemic is affecting countries and industries world-wide and is having many local impacts. People are rightfully concerned about the health and safety of their family and friends, the education of their children and their finances as more businesses temporarily close.

Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) has this message for our customers: "We'll keep working hard every day to keep the power and gas on for you."

"Our 23,000 employees remain focused on delivering safe and reliable gas and electric service to our customers. You'll continue to see our blue and white trucks and our hard-working crews in the field engaged in important work to safely supply energy to our customers," said Andy Vesey, PG&E Utility CEO and President.

"We see our role at PG&E during this very difficult time as helping to maintain essential services, no matter what. With inclement weather continuing across Northern and Central California, right now that means tracking weather systems and working with our workforce in the field to stage resources, inspect our equipment, make needed repairs and ensure we're prepared for what comes next," Vesey said.

Today, in its continuing response to the COVID-19 pandemic, PG&E announced:

It has formally activated its Emergency Operations Center to facilitate and coordinate the company's response to the spread of the virus. The company has had an Incident Management Team monitoring and responding to the virus for three weeks;

In an effort to maintain continuity of gas and electric service, the company has proactively determined that it will not engage in system upgrades or other work that results in a disruption of gas or electric service through April 7 in the six Bay Area counties under the shelter-in-place directives. This includes San Francisco, Santa Clara, San Mateo, Marin, Contra Costa and Alameda counties;

All PG&E's customer service centers where customers can normally pay their bills will be closed as of tomorrow

(Tuesday, March 17). This follows guidance on social distancing. Customers who typically pay their bills at one of these centers can call 1-877-704-8470, mail payments to PG&E, P.O. Box 997300, Sacramento, CA 95899, or go to pge.com to learn how to pay online or to find nearby Neighborhood Payment Centers.

Tom Dalzell, business manager of IBEW Local 1245, which represents most of PG&E's electric and gas workers, agreed that ensuring customers have the energy they need for their lives is more important than ever.

"We stand with PG&E during this challenging time, and the men and women of IBEW will be working as hard as ever to make sure the grid is working safely, gas is flowing reliably and that we are here for PG&E's customers," said Dalzell.

Power in PG&E's portfolio remains readily available and more than 80 percent GHG-free. PG&E operates several natural gas power plants, a nuclear plant in San Luis Obispo County and the country's largest privately held hydropower system. Additionally, the company gets power from solar and wind farms and other renewable sources. It all flows to our customers via electric transmission lines and gas transmission pipelines and then through distribution lines to homes and businesses.

On March 12, PG&E announced that due to the COVID-19 pandemic, it has voluntarily implemented a moratorium on service disconnections for non-payment, effective immediately. This suspension will apply to both residential and commercial customers and will remain in effect until further notice. DWR Awards \$47 Million in Grants for Groundwater Sustainability

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The Department of Water Resources (DWR) awarded \$47 million in grant funding to 53 applicants to support local agencies in development of plans to manage groundwater basins for long-term sustainability. These grants will support various projects including facilitating community outreach efforts, preparing feasibility studies for proposed actions to restore groundwater supplies, and installing monitoring wells to oversee groundwater levels.

This funding will provide important assistance in successful local implementation of the Sustainable Groundwater Management Act (SGMA), which establishes a framework for managing the state's groundwater resources.

"Sustainable management of our groundwater basins is a critical aspect of making our communities

more resilient" said DWR Director Karla Nemeth. "The investments we make today will ensure that groundwater, such a critical resource for our state, continues to be a part of California's water portfolio long into the future."

The grants were awarded to nearly 30 groundwater sustainability agencies for the installation of monitoring wells to better evaluate the needs of the groundwater basins in their area. Five other grant recipients will conduct aerial electromagnetic surveys to map aquifer conditions to better assess groundwater quality and storage conditions and to identify opportunities for recharge. These are just a few of the actions supported by this round of grant funding to further assist in developing groundwater sustainability plans.

Groundwater, which provides approximately 40 percent of California's total water supply during an average year, often serves as a buffer in

critically-dry years by providing a supplemental, clean water source when surface water resources are diminished. In the last decade, groundwater overdraft has severely depleted this valuable water source, impacting communities statewide.

Funding for these awards was made possible by Proposition 68, from which \$46.25 million was made available for competitive grants, and an additional \$1.2 million of Proposition 1 funds. DWR will begin working with grantees immediately to develop and execute grant agreements.

In 2022, DWR anticipates the launch of a competitive grant solicitation process to provide at least \$88 million in grant funding for plan implementation and projects that support local water supply and groundwater resiliency investments.

Folsom-Cordova Unified School District Brings Community to the Classroom

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG)

Inside the Peter J. Shields Elementary School library, the soft hum of talking and laughter fills the room. The walls are colorful with children's posters and the floors are covered with animal rugs. A first grader and his volunteer quietly read a Lego book and talk about the funny pictures inside. This is a normal Thursday for first grader Johnny and his volunteer, Lisa.

For the past six years, the Folsom-Cordova Unified School District has been helping young students improve their reading skills through a program called "Community Readers."

The Community Readers program is a tutoring program that matches volunteers from the community with K-3rd grade students who are struggling to read, according to Community Readers' coordinator and teacher at Peter J. Shields, Lori Moore.

Staff have found that students' overall reading skills have improved by 90 percent or more, according to FCUSD's 2016-2017 Community Readers annual report.

Angela Griffin Ankhelyi,

founder of the Community Readers program, worked closely with Moore to develop this program back in 2013.

Since the program first launched in the spring of 2014, about 200 students have received tutoring help from a community volunteer. To date, there have been over 100 volunteers that have been involved with the program either for one session or multiple years, according to Ankhelyi.

Moore said that her students love going to read with an adult volunteer and they look up to their volunteer immensely.

Volunteers for the program include retirees, parents, college students, and people from the community, according to Moore.

"There is absolutely no harm in an adult reading with a student and practicing new words with them," said Moore.

Moore added that she has seen great improvement in students' confidence and their attitude when they became involved with the program.

Lisa Bowling, Community Readers volunteer and parent, said she has been volunteering for the program for five years

and will continue to volunteer as long as she possibly can. She added that her favorite part of the program is seeing the growth of the students as readers and students.

"I love seeing the excitement that the students develop for reading over the course of the program," said Bowling.

Bowling mentioned that when students first begin the program, they usually do not want to read due to their lack of confidence. After a few sessions, Bowling said that students begin to gain confidence and they look forward to reading new books with their volunteer.

Tutoring sessions usually involve learning new vocabulary words, reading a short book to the student, and assisting the student as they read a story aloud, according to Bowling.

The program has three six-week sessions and meets twice a week for 30 minutes.

Students are chosen for the program by a teacher's recommendation and must have parental permission to join, according to Moore.

"One student's mom has noticed a big difference in her reading," said Moore.

Moore added that students' parents are very happy that their children are in the program and most parents have noticed a difference in their academic abilities.

"The way to become a better reader is to read a lot and practice," said Moore. "It's like a sport or learning to play the piano: the more touches you have on it, the better." ★

Buddy Benches Help Students Promote Kindness

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - Robert J. McGarvey Elementary School (RJMES) in Rancho Cordova has three newly installed buddy benches on campus. The benches provide students with a way to reduce social isolation during recess and at lunch times. The benches were made possible by a Community Enhancement Fund Grant from the City of Rancho Cordova.

The guidelines for students are simple: If they see someone sitting on the bench, they know to go say hi and ask if that student would like some company.

"Sometimes students sit on the benches because they are hoping someone comes along to ask them to play. Other times, two or more students may be seen just sitting together talking or playing a

game," said Michael Gulden, Principal at RJMES. "One young lady, a sixth grader, sits on the bench and reads. When others come by to ask her to come play, she politely tells them she is just waiting for someone to come along who might not have a friend," he added.

For RJMES, there are clear benefits of having the buddy benches on campus. Students have the opportunity to develop open-mindedness, social skills and leadership when they offer support to another in need. The school also believes that it helps convey the message that reaching out and empathizing with another person is effective in helping students process their own emotions.

The benches are integral to the school's overall culture of kindness and are used as tools to help teach the core values at RJMES: safety, open-mindedness, accountability and resilience. ★

And Another Thing

The City will need to alter or cease certain services other than essential services in response to this emergency.

On March 18th, the Rancho Cordova City Council had an emergency meeting at 4 PM in the Council Chambers. The subject of the meeting was A Resolution Proclaiming the Existence of a Local Emergency in the City of Rancho Cordova. Declaring a state of emergency does not mean we have a more serious situation; what this declaration does is it allows the city to be eligible for federal reimbursement of funds used to respond to the coronavirus. I think it is very important to place this information in my column because I know there are some who didn't have a chance to see the meeting. And it is extremely

important to keep everyone in our city up-to-date.

At the end of the meeting, we voted the following: "Now, therefore, be it resolved and proclaimed by the City Council of the City of Rancho Cordova: 1. That a local emergency exists throughout the City of Rancho Cordova. 2. That during the existence of said local emergency, the powers, functions, and duties of the City Council and City Manager shall be those prescribed by state law and the ordinances and resolutions of this City, and they are hereby empowered to respond effectively to COVID-19, provide appropriate relief and coordinate with non-governmental and governmental organizations to assist in mutual aid and relief in the community, and ensure the City is able to obtain reimbursement for its relief efforts. 3. That because

a substantial threat to public health and safety exists that has a substantial likelihood that serious harm will be experienced unless immediate action is taken, the City will need to alter or cease certain services other than essential services in response to this emergency. The City Manager is authorized to take any lawful personnel action that protects the health and safety of the workforce or the community. 4. That the local emergency shall remain in effect until such time that the Council determines that the emergency conditions have been abated." It was passed and adopted by the unanimous vote of the Council. For additional city-specific updates on COVID-19/Coronavirus, visit CityofRanchoCordova.org/Coronavirus.

Trump Didn't Dictate Coronavirus Response

What happens when the supposed dictator won't dictate? This is the conundrum confronted by the harshest critics of President Donald Trump who have gone from warning he is a budding despot to complaining he hasn't done enough to impose his will during the coronavirus crisis.

They can't believe that he didn't urge sports leagues to cancel their seasons, call for school systems to close, or tell bars and restaurants to shutter before this wave of closures began.

As a New York Times report put it, Trump "has essentially become a bystander as school superintendents, sports commissioners, college presidents, governors and business owners across the country take it upon themselves to shut down much of American life."

Ordinarily, tyrants aren't bystanders. They don't give other political players and civic institutions wide latitude to make their own decisions. They don't have

to be pushed to declare a national emergency unlocking various powers. They don't have to be lobbied to call out the military to deal with a domestic problem.

Trump has now declared an emergency and issued national guidelines against gatherings of more than 10 people, but his initial instinct was to urge people to stay calm and carry on.

The problem with Trump's mode of governance isn't that he's a would-be authoritarian. Rather, he has a highly personalized view of the presidency and an abiding belief that he can talk his way out of any difficulty -- including, initially, a public-health crisis not susceptible to spin. This deeply flawed approach contributed to his early stumbles in the coronavirus response, but it doesn't make him a falangist.

What we're likely to find is that Trump ends up leading a characteristically American effort against the outbreak. As Yuval Levin of the American Enterprise Institute points out, we usually fumble around in the early stages of a national crisis before bringing to bear massive resources to wrestle it to the ground.

For better or worse, the Great Depression prompted the creation of the most far-reaching economic programs in our history after a period of passivity and drift.

We responded to the perceived crisis of the Soviet Sputnik launch with the Apollo program that soaked up 4% of GDP. Hurricane Katrina overwhelmed New Orleans and initially FEMA, before we put an army general in charge of the relief.

The initial indications of a financial crisis in 2008 were greeted with denial and half-measures. Then, the federal government responded with a historic bailout of the banks and the Federal Reserve undertook an unprecedented program to pump liquidity into the economy.

The outlines of a similar response to the coronavirus are already evident. The move from relative normality to large parts of the country being shut down was remarkably swift -- it happened in the space of about a week. Testing has been slow to come online, but is ramping up now. If hospitals are overwhelmed, we will see the rapid retrofitting of additional space. The Federal Reserve and the federal government are embarking on major stimulus and relief programs.

Such is our robust, multi-layered society and system of government that much of this doesn't depend on the president, let alone a dictator.

Using IRA instead of Claiming Social Security; Disability Appeal

Dear Rusty: I am currently unemployed and drawing funds from my IRA. I am 62 years old. My financial adviser instructed me to not take Social Security because once I do that the percentage of increase would stop. He said to wait until the benefits increased to the point where I could then take Social Security and leave my IRA alone. Does that seem right? Also, I have applied for SS Disability benefits and have been rejected, but I am currently appealing that decision. Is my next step a lawyer? If so do you have any recommendations?

Dear Befuddled: If you take your Social Security (SS) benefits at age 62, your payment will be cut by about 27.5% from what it would be at your full retirement age of 66 ½. If you wait, your SS payment when you claim it will have grown for each month you delay. You only



get 100% of the SS benefit you have earned from a lifetime of working when you reach your full retirement age (FRA). The rate of benefit growth before you reach your FRA is a bit more than 6% for each year you wait, so I expect that your financial adviser compared that guaranteed growth to the interest you are receiving on your IRA and concluded that waiting to claim a higher SS benefit for the rest of your life is a better deal. Provided you are in good health, that seems like a prudent suggestion. And just so you are aware, if you delay claiming SS beyond your FRA, you'll earn an additional 8% for each year you further delay, up to age 70 when your SS benefit would be about 75% more than it will be if you take it now.

Regarding your disability appeal, I cannot recommend a specific attorney, but I suggest you seek one who specializes in Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI) claims. SSDI attorneys must adhere to Federal law and they are limited in what they can charge you. Usually that limit is 25% of

whatever back SSDI benefits they can secure for you (paid from those back benefits) to a maximum of \$6000. There should be no charge for an initial consultation, and you shouldn't be required to pay anything unless they win your case for you. The easiest way to find someone to assist you is to do a search for "SSDI attorneys near me" and then do some initial research on your search results before selecting. You'll be able to judge the strength of your SSDI appeal by whether the SSDI attorney accepts your case – they'll only accept your case if they believe they can win and be compensated for their efforts. Only you can judge if engaging an attorney is a wise idea at this point. You still have multiple SSDI appeal levels available to you, and an SSDI attorney can be engaged at any point you choose.

Here is what the District is doing:
 Principals are reaching out to teachers and families to assess existing access to technology. *Principals will work with teachers and families to gather materials from their classrooms to take home.*

The work done on March 23-26:
 Schools continued to work with the District to create materials and implement the District's formal distance learning plan; The District will deploy resources (Chromebooks, mobile devices, etc.) to students and teachers as need is identified; Principals and teachers will communicate with families periodically during the transition to ensure access to materials; The District will coordinate remote training for teachers who need assistance.

Monday, March 30: All schools tentatively launch remote lessons.

Will meal distribution continue?

Yes! If you are in a car, please stay in your car and we will hand-deliver your child's meal to you.

If you walk up, we ask all those who arrive to practice social distancing; stand six feet apart and remain in groups of no more than ten. Our principals and leadership will be on hand to help with line control.

School Staff Member Tests Positive for COVID-19

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - On March 20, the District was informed that a staff member at Riverview STEM Academy tested positive for COVID-19. This employee, who is not a classroom teacher and works with only a small student population, last worked on Thursday, March 12. This employee first experienced symptoms on Friday, March 13, and did not report to work that day.

This staff member is at home recovering and in isolation as per CDC and local Sacramento County Public Health guidelines. We received the positive COVID-19 confirmation from Sacramento County Public Health late last night (Friday, March 20). Federal health privacy laws prohibit us from releasing more information about this employee.

We understand this is a stressful situation for everyone. We are vigilant about working with county public health officials to investigate all reported or suspected cases of COVID-19. If at any time you have a fever, cough, and shortness of breath, public health officials request that you please reach out to your primary care

provider for further guidance. We are informed by Sacramento County Public that there is community spread of COVID-19. As testing is increasing, public health officials expect to see more results that are positive for COVID-19. This is why we as a school district have closed schools and why the State of California has issued the stay at home orders.

We request that you continue to follow these guidelines: continue to practice social distancing; wash your hands with soap and water frequently - even while at home; cover your coughs and sneezes; clean commonly touched surfaces with wipes; report any fever, cough, shortness of breath to your primary care provider and request to be tested.

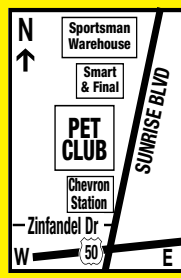
