Rancho Cordova Travel and Tourism Wins Silver Adrian Award

Marc Sapoznik started off at the February Rancho Cordova Luncheon by sharing a little bit about tourism. "When you're looking at tourism, really at the core of it is hospitality," Sapoznik said. "We're here to welcome people, to invite people to come in, and when they are here, to make sure that they're having a good time." Sapoznik is the executive director of Rancho Cordova Travel and Tourism (RCTT), and works closely with the hospitality industry in the Rancho Cordova area.

Lisa Jones is regional director of sales with Aimbridge Hospitality, which has three hotels in Rancho Cordova. She said that helping give a visitor their best experience has to do with understanding

the amenities that we have. "The diversity of the restaurants, the recreational activities, and then just the convenience to being in the center if you want to go to Sacramento... it's easy to access different areas of the Sacramento Area."

There are 17 hotels in Rancho Cordova. "It's far more than the hotels," Sapoznik said. "It's what's happening in the restaurants and other service industries." Some of those restaurants and services would not be in Rancho Cordova were it not for the visitors and tourists. There are over 3,000 people working in hospitality and tourism in Rancho. The \$7 million in transient occupancy tax from the hotels is split between the County and the City and can pay for things like firefighters, police, and other

community necessities.

In 2019 RCTT entered the digital marketing competition of the Hospitality Sales and Marketing Association International, up against such giants as the Marriott Bonvoy, who won the gold and had an agency of 55 people working on their digital marketing program. But with Rancho's 2 1/2 person staff, Sapoznik said, "We were able to come up with some pretty cool digital campaigns that were very effective. And so we received the Silver Adrian Award, which is a great honor for Rancho Cordova and really put us on a big stage there literally in New York just a few weeks ago."

Sapoznik said that RCTT is a tourism bureau, but he can't book you a cruise. "What we do is pretty unique in that we are bringing people into a

region - we don't control them, we don't own anything, but we are here to... promote everything that's going on here," Sapoznik said. "Beyond what the hotels are doing, beyond what they're doing at the restaurants and at the service level, all of you, really, in this community are part of that welcome team. Everybody here can be an ambassador for Rancho Cordova."

Diann Rogers, president and CEO of the Rancho Cordova Chamber, was talking after the luncheon about Sapoznik's address. She was impressed with the statistics he presented. "It's important for the residents of Rancho to know and understand the significant impact that our hospitality industry has," Rogers said, "when you talk about numbers like 600,000

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Sacramento County Detects 2019 Novel Coronavirus Case

Sacramento County Public Health reports the first confirmed travel-related coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19) case in a Sacramento County resident. The individual recently traveled from China, where an outbreak of the novel coronavirus has been ongoing since December 2019.

The adult returned from China to the U.S. on February 2. The individual took precautionary measures during travel and has self-quarantined since returning. During the quarantine period, the individual began exhibiting mild symptoms. In consultation with the individual's primary care provider, Sacramento County Public Health coordinated testing with the Center for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and the California Department of Public Health (CDPH). Currently, the individual is asymptomatic, but will remain home for mandatory isolation until cleared by Sacramento County Public Health. Sacramento County Public Health's investigation determined that currently, the public's risk of exposure is extremely low.

As a reminder to residents of Sacramento County, Dr. Peter Beilenson, Sacramento County Department of Health Services Director, said, "Cases in the U.S., including this first case in Sacramento County, have primarily been travel-related. The risk of COVID-19 to the U.S. public continues to be low. Sacramento County health providers are continuing to be vigilant, monitoring for acute respiratory illness, and gathering recent travel information to detect any new COVID-19 cases."

With state and federal health agencies, Sacramento County Public Health has a coordinated system with healthcare partners to identify possible cases, coordinate testing/diagnosis and management of suspect cases, lead investigations to identify those possibly exposed for infection control. Per guidance from the CDC, a clinical specimen was collected from the individual and was sent to CDC where laboratory testing confirmed the infection.

While the immediate risk of this new virus to the public is currently low, there are simple daily precautions that everyone should always take. CDPH and Sacramento County Public Health recommends additional information and status updates can be accessed on the County's Public Health website at SacCounty.net. ★

It's Time to Vote

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - It is time to vote! On March 3, 2020, Californians will participate in Super Tuesday voicing their preferences by voting for local as well as national candidates, State Proposition 13, local measures and the Presidential Primary Election.

California moved up its date in the election calendar and will be joining thirteen other states seeking to declare their preference for presidential candidates.

If you are not registered with a political party you will have received a ballot with no presidential candidates. You can, however, still participate in the nomination by requesting a ballot containing some party candidates or register to vote for the party candidates that require registration.

California's only statewide measure on the March 3 primary election ballot is Proposition 13, authorizing \$15 billion in bonds to build, repair and modernize schools in California. The Howard Jarvis Taxpayers Association says this



proposition should get a "No" vote. The ballot wording is claimed to be misleading. Please do your homework and read the ballot before voting.

California Law Allows Time Off to Vote on Election Day

To help ensure voters can get to the polls on Election Day, March 3, 2020 California law allows workers to take up to two hours off work to vote if they are unable to vote during non-work hours.

"Californians should make a plan now for how they will cast a ballot

on Election Day," Secretary of State Alex Padilla said. "Every registered voter has a right to cast their ballot before the polls close. If you can't make it to your polling place outside of working hours, you have the right to take time off to vote, without a loss of pay."

California Elections Code section 14000 allows workers up to two hours off to vote, without a loss of pay, if they do not have enough time to do so during their non-work hours. The law requires workers to notify their employers two working days before the election if they need to take time off to vote. Polling places are open between 7:00 a.m. and 8:00 p.m. on Election Day.

Also, every California employer is required to post, in a visible location, a notice informing employees of their rights at least 10 days before an election. California State Parks Reopens American River Bike Trail along Lake Natoma

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - After a three-year closure, California State Parks reopened the Jedediah Smith Memorial Trail, popularly known as the American River Bike Trail, on Saturday, Feb. 15, 2020. Reopening this section of the trail will once again allow the recreating and commuting public to enjoy the north shore of Lake Natoma.

The American River Bike Trail is part of Folsom Lake State Recreation Area's (SRA) 19,500 acres. The park has 95 miles of trails for hikers, bicyclists, runners and horseback riders. A paved, mostly accessible bicycle trail loops around Lake Natoma, linking Beals Point and the American River Bike Trail.

A large landslide covered portions of the American River Bike Trail, located between Nimbus Dam and the Negro Bar area of Folsom Lake SRA, during the winter storms of January and February 2017.

In late August of 2019, the U.S. Bureau of Reclamation in partnership with State Parks initiated repairs by removing the debris that covered the trail as a result of those storms. The second phase of the project utilized a geotechnical contractor to scale a portion of the bluff to remove loose rock from the face of the bluff directly above the trail. Following the scaling, crews removed the additional debris and repaved the damaged sections of the trail.

State Parks thanks the public for their patience and understanding as it worked with its partners to reopen this popular trail for everyone's enjoyment.

As with any outdoor activity, State Parks encourages its visitors to practice safe and environmentally-sound practices such as staying on designated trails, leaving no trace, controlling your speed and always wearing a helmet. Attention Anglers, Hook a Trophy Trout at Rancho Seco

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - Thousands of pounds of trout are up for grabs at SMUD's annual trout derby at Rancho Seco Recreational Area. Anglers reeling in the heaviest catches will win cash and prizes, including an adult and youth grand prize awarded each day for the heaviest trout caught.

Anglers can cast a line into the 160-acre lake from the shoreline or one of six fishing piers. Small boats with electric motors are also allowed (no gas motors). In addition to trout, the freshwater lake is home to bass, bluegill, redear sunfish, crappie and catfish. In preparation for the derby, Rancho Seco Lake was recently stocked with thousands of pounds of catchable trout.

Registration takes place on both days of the derby between 6 a.m. and 10 a.m., rain or shine. Derby tickets are \$5 per person plus a daily park fee available at the park gate. A valid California state fishing license is required for those 16 years of age or older. Anglers hoping to win a prize must weigh their fish at the official weigh station between 2 p.m. and 4 p.m. on the day of the catch. For complete rules, visit smud.org/RanchoSeco.

Mentoring Matters

Studies demonstrate mentoring has a significant positive effect on the lives of all youth, particularly at risk youth. A study of 18 to 21 year olds having engaged in mentoring reported having more positive visions of themselves and their futures, and achieved more positive outcomes in school, the workplace, and their communities (The Mentoring Effect, January 2014). The unfortunate truth is youth most need of mentor relationships are the ones least likely to have them as supported by this same research.

Studies seeking to quantify the return on investment of mentoring programs estimate return of approximately \$3 for each \$1 spent (Analyzing the Social Return on Investment

in Youth Mentoring Programs, March 2007). Cost savings is based on reduced teen violence and increased high school graduation rates.

Folsom Cordova Community Partnership (FCCP) believes in the power of mentoring and the importance of young people having healthy adult mentors to support and encourage their development. FCCP has been providing individual and group mentoring services to youth in Rancho Cordova, Folsom and the greater Sacramento area for the past 12 years.

In addition to working in partnership with FCUSD area schools and the City of Rancho Cordova to provide group mentoring to youth, FCCP recently received a grant through the Office of Refugee Resettlement to provide mentoring services to refugee and asylee youth who are recent arrivals in the United States (five years

or less.) Refugees and asylees are people who have been forced to leave their country in order to escape war, persecution or natural disaster.

The goals of this program are to assist in their integration to the United States by promoting civic and social engagement. Additionally, each youth receives support in developing goals in the areas of education and career exploration.

FCCP is looking for empathetic adults with shared immigrant life experience and/or a passion for connecting with refugee or asylee youth for mentor matches. Youth participating in this program are between the ages of 15 and 24 years old. Anyone interested in becoming a mentor can contact Hayley Cox at HCOX@TheFCCP.org. 

And Another Thing

I am really glad that the sports and our local news are in The Grapevine Independent

There hasn't been much in the news for a while about the two tunnels that would redirect the Sacramento River south, nor has there been much about the change to one tunnel instead of two. The "Peripheral Canal" was first discussed in the 1940s but hasn't been talked about since 2015. 2016 is when the new twin tunnels concept was proposed. Now, the only reason I brought up the water discussion was because of the article the *The Sacramento Bee* about the President talking to the water purveyors and farmers in Southern California who want more water than they already receive. More water for Southern California and less for Northern California with the President's "deal" would affect the cities, counties, farmers and the environment in Northern California. Time will tell if the Governor's planned lawsuit is effective and if the President is able to force more water

south. According to *The Sacramento Bee*, if we had the same amount of water this year that we received last year, we are talking about 1 million acre-feet of water more than usual. That is about 326,000 gallons per acre-foot times 1 million acre-feet. If my math is correct, that would be 326,000,000,000 gallons in addition to the regular water amounts that go south. That is more water for 25 million people south. What about the other 15 million people north?

It was sad that *The Sacramento Bee* filed for bankruptcy and that there is a firm in Chatham, New Jersey proposing to take control of McClatchy. I read that information in *The Sacramento Business Journal*. They, like other smaller newspapers, are providing information that can be very important. It can't cover the number of different areas, but it isn't the size of *The Sacramento Bee* either. Personally, I am very glad we still have our local paper *The Grapevine Independent*. I doubt that our Mitchell Marauders winning the Wrestling League Championship, the Cordova Girls Soccer

winning their first ever championship, and the playoffs underway for Cordova Winter Athletics would have been in *The Sacramento Bee*. Newspapers are either downsizing or closing completely, and I am really glad that the sports and our local news are in *The Grapevine Independent*.

And another thing, grant applications for our city's Community Enhancement Fund are now being accepted. Applicants can submit their proposals until March 20, 2020. If you have a plan or project, please turn it in. Applications will then be reviewed by staff, shared at the City Council meetings in April, and funding decisions will be made as early as the City Council meetings in May. There is a very informative article in the February 21, 2020 edition of *The Grapevine Independent* written by Danielle Hale who works for the city. Marinas and yacht clubs are also encouraged to participate. Participating facilities receive educational materials and tools to operate a clean boating facility and minimize water quality impacts. This program provides marinas with points towards the Clean Marina Designation. Participation in the Dockwalker Program counts towards the nomination of the Club of the Year under the community service category. In addition, yacht clubs and marinas are essential in spreading awareness directly to boaters.

In their play-in victory against Mira Loma on February 18, Brown led Cordova with 19 points. Bolden added 15, and juniors Allan Davis and Tavion Dominguez Thomas added nine points apiece. ★

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - Rancho Cordova’s own St. John Vianney School (SVJ) again made a strong showing in a regional basketball tournament. SVJ’s Varsity Boys Basketball Tigers claimed the Consolation Championship at the 43rd Annual St. La Salle Classic held at Christian Brother’s High School.

With nearly all the members of this team coming from the 7th grade, next year looks to be another promising year for boys basketball at SVJ and a likely continuation of their winning traditions.

Johnnie Brannon IV, an eighth grader at SVJ was honored and named to the All-Tournament Team.
