**SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)** - The Sacramento Metropolitan Fire District honors the sacrifices of its first responders who put their lives and health at risk in order to maintain safe communities. In earnest appreciation of this, on March 11, 2020, the Fire District took some moments to remember fallen firefighters and Fire Captain Jim "Peet" Peterson to dedicate Fire Station 65 in his name.

Peterson, who was born in

December 12, 1962, lived his life in the Sacramento area and left a strong legacy both in the community at large and the Sac Metro Fire family. "We are here to provide a constant memorial," said Fire Chief Todd Harms referring to "the significance of fallen firefighters [which] cannot be minimized," as he addressed a gathering of uniformed

personnel, family and friends.

Beginning in 1983, "Peet" served as a first responder in various

## DMV Offices to Continue Serving the Public during COVID Outbreak

Department of Motor Vehicles

**SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)** - The California Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) is moving to offer Californians essential services online starting next week to continue processing critical transactions during the COVID-19 pandemic. Field offices will be temporarily closed to the public statewide beginning March 27 and reopen, virtually, on April 2. All in-office appointments at this time will be canceled. Customers are encouraged to check the dmv.ca.gov website for future appointment availability.

DMV online services will continue to be available at dmv.ca.gov. Customers can also take care of many tasks at the hundreds of kiosks throughout the state or through available local business partners. DMV's customer service centers will continue to operate during normal business hours at 1-800-777-0133 or connecting via the live chat feature on the DMV website.

DMV field office employees will return on Wednesday, April 1 to process transactions and begin training on the DMV Virtual Field Office, which began in a limited pilot March 23. The Virtual Field Office gives customers the capability to take care of transactions that previously required an in-person office visit by virtually interacting with DMV staff. Beginning April 2, customers initially can complete vehicle title transfers and complex vehicle registration renewals by visiting virtual.dmv.ca.gov. The DMV will gradually add more transactions to continue to provide alternatives to an in-person office visit.

The DMV is concerned about the health and safety of its customers, including seniors and those at risk for COVID-19. Following deep cleaning of the offices, expansion of virtual services and development of new protocols, DMV will offer in-person services in each region. More updates on how DMV is addressing the needs of its customers will be announced soon on its website.

Californians who do not have an urgent need to go to a DMV field office should delay their visit, including those interested in applying for a REAL ID. The U.S. Department of Homeland Security has announced that the REAL ID enforcement date is October 1, 2021, and customers who want a REAL ID will have an opportunity to apply at a later date. ★

**RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG)** - Rancho Cordova's very own St. John Vianney school continues to shine academically, with some significant successes in this year's regional Academic Decathlon. The junior high level competition was held at Jesuit High School, in Carmichael on March 7th, 2020.

The St. John Vianney Academic Decathlon Team (ACADECA) performed well in all competition areas,

but particularly so in the Literature competition, where Mackenzie Santos scored a 3rd Place for the team in the region. Other top scorers included Justin Paredes in Science and Katrione Ramos in Fine Arts.

For several years now, St. John Vianney's (SJV) ACADECA team has been among the top contenders in this top regional academic competition, with leading scores in all three major components of the competition - the Logic Test, the

Individual Subject Tests, and in the ever-popular Super Quiz - a live-action competition that keeps the audience spellbound.

This year's theme for the competition was "water". That theme was applied to various subjects that make up the competition's core academic subject area challenges: Science, Fine Arts, Social Studies, Current Events, Math, English, Writing, and Religion. Each of those subjects appears in every

# SMUD Suspends Power Shutoffs for Non-payment

**SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)** - In response to the COVID-19 pandemic and growing economic challenges, SMUD announced it will suspend the practice of disconnecting power due to non-payment for residential and commercial customers. In addition, customers who are currently disconnected for non-payment will be reconnected, as long as the meter or other equipment has not been damaged and all other conditions are safe.

"We made this decision due to the impact that COVID-19 is having on our local communities," said Arlen Orchard, CEO and General Manager of SMUD. "We want to ensure that our most vulnerable customers have access to power during these times."

The suspension of power disconnection due to non-payment begins today and will last through April 17 as SMUD continues to monitor the evolving situation.

Customers who are behind on payment will still owe SMUD for service, they will just not lose power at this time. Customers are encouraged to contact SMUD to make payment arrangements or to inquire about energy assistance rates and other programs that could be beneficial.

As the nation's sixth-largest community-owned electric service provider, SMUD has been providing low-cost, reliable electricity for almost 75 years to Sacramento County (and small adjoining portions of Placer and Yolo Counties). annual competition, but they are refocused annually on the theme for that particular year.

Mackenzie Santos, in SJV's 8th Grade, and this year's Team Captain said, "I'm proud of my team, and of SJV in this competition. We've been near the top in the last few years because we've worked so hard. SJV has taught us to strive for our best and I've never studied harder for anything in my life. Our coaches and teachers really inspired us to never give up, and to push the boundaries of what we thought was possible."

The Junior High Academic Decathlon competition is a great preparation for learning later in a student's academic career. The competition is stiff, and students who succeed are

maximizing their study skills and mastering vast amounts of information. Successful team efforts like St. John Vianney's have students studying for 3-4 months to master the assigned books, puzzle types, study guides, and other materials that are assigned in the competition. Parents typically are amazed at how much information their students can learn, and most importantly, the team members themselves gain a new understanding of how much they can absorb and master with consistent effort. It's this later part that makes the Decathlon so valuable for students and the school at large.

"Nothing prepared me for the tough classes in High School as much as ACADECA. It's the only place for a middle school student where extreme learning happens

— students push their limits and are amazed about how much they can learn in a single subject if they put their mind to it. That's what prepared me for honors classes in high school more than anything else. And it's really fun!" said Gian Carlos Gonzalez, an SJV Acadeca Alumni from 2018.

St. John Vianney School is celebrating 60 years of educating kids in Rancho Cordova this year, providing an outstanding educational experience for their students, with full programs of extra-curricular academic and athletic offerings exceeding those found in other local schools.

The learning never really stops — the 2021 Academic Decathlon Team is already working on their logic puzzle skills in preparation for next year's event. ★

# The Center for Workers' Rights Launches Coronavirus Job Protection Helpline

**SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)** - The Center for Workers' Rights, located in Sacramento, California, has launched a telephone helpline for workers with questions regarding the impact of the Coronavirus. With support from the Sacramento Central Labor Council, the newly-launched helpline assists impacted workers with unemployment, paid family leave, FMLA, disability, sick leave, paid time off, and other questions related to the Coronavirus. The Center for Workers' Rights has years of experience assisting working people

with unemployment insurance and other claims. The free assistance is available to workers in both in English and Spanish.

In order to keep staff, volunteers, and working people safe, the program is currently being conducted remotely, by telephone. The service can be reached by dialing #211, or by calling the Center's helpline at (916) 905-1625.

"During this critical period, when so many members of our community have questions about the impact of the Coronavirus on their working lives, we're able to waive our eligibility requirements, and make these services available to all Sacramentans at

no cost. And the Center is always available to working people regardless of immigration status, which is particularly important right now," explained the Center's founder and executive director, attorney Daniela Urban. She also noted that the Center is providing individualized consultations to callers where needed, under the supervision of a licensed attorney. Trained volunteers include local law students, as well as labor and employment attorneys ready to help Sacramentans during this time.

This free helpline service is currently up and running, and can be reached from 9am to 5:30pm. ★

capacities throughout the Sacramento Fire District. Some of his many tasks included being stationed as a firefighter/paramedic in Citrus Heights, operating the HAZMAT unit in Carmichael at Fire Station 109, and also serving the Rancho Cordova and Gold River area from Fire Station 65 by training and specializing for water rescues along the American River.

Peterson is still well remembered by Sac Metro Fire crews for having an upbeat attitude, an eagerness to help and for creating strong bonds within the Sacramento Metro Firefighters Association. During those 25 years, he demonstrated an aptitude and character for community service and mentoring academy recruits, which led to his eventual promotion to Sac Metro Fire

Captain in March of 2008.

Unfortunately, Peterson never did officiate as captain due to a diagnosis of bladder cancer the same year of his promotion. In his last day, his crew, who appreciated him very much, honored the Fire Captain by giving him a heartfelt farewell ride in his captain's seat on board E109 during a special shift.

On December 15, 2008, Peterson passed away at the relatively young age of 46 years from the job related illness, which is recognized as a Line of Duty Death (LODD).

He is survived by his sons Firefighter/Paramedic Cody Peterson, Garth Peterson, as well as his wife, retired Fire Captain Tracey Valentine.

# Art Ambassador Shimo Brings Decades of East Meets West Art to Sacramento

**SACRAMENTO REGION (MPG)** - Being a successful “Art Ambassador” between two very different continents and cultures is no easy task. Especially when that success was cultivated and slowly emerged from the mind and soul of a young boy during one of the darkest periods in Chinese history.

That young man was Shimo, today one of the foremost recognized and respected masters of Neo-Expressionism art in the world. Today Shimo resides in Sacramento, returning to China regularly where he is Dean of the Dept of Fine Arts at Shanghai Institute of Visual Arts and where he holds weekly art classes with his students online.

Shimo has been active in the Sacramento region and beyond since 2003 when he came here with his wife, Winly and son, Michael.

He has a quiet, unassuming manner but not with a paint brush or his message. For almost 18 years Shimo has been actively sharing his expertise and love for the arts at venues from Los Angeles to San Francisco. His artwork hangs in the library at Hastings Law School in San Francisco, the Crocker Museum and Sacramento Convention Center (upon completion of its renovation). He has done demonstrations and lectures at UC Davis and Merryhill School in Sacramento, and has made numerous visits to California State University, Sacramento to share his art with the students.

Shimo has shown his work at Blue Line Art Gallery in Roseville. In 2012 and 2014 he put together joint exhibits at Blue Line with prominent California landscape artist Gregory Kondo, one of them titled “East Meets West”. One of Shimo’s reasons for coming to the United States has been to help bring the two art worlds together for all to see.

To this end Shimo and his wife ran the Shimo Center for the Arts in Sacramento from 2012 to 2019, showcasing dozens of local artists. The gallery closed last year to give Shimo more time for his job as dean at Shanghai Institute of Visual Arts

Kondo is one of the reasons Shimo settled in Sacramento in 2003. When he realized Kondo and Wayne Thiebaud, renowned popular culture artists both reside in Sacramento, he knew that is where he had to be. He also

loves the slower pace of life in Sacramento compared to his second home in Shanghai, China.

The Kondos Gallery is in Sacramento. Kondo just celebrated his 97th birthday at the John Natsoulas Gallery in Davis and Theibaud reaches his 100th year in November. Winly, Shimo’s wife, shared with this reporter that he still plays tennis.

In 2007 his painting, *Before the Storm* was donated to the Sacramento Convention Center and will be had again at its entrance when the renovations to the center are completed later this year.

In 2015 Shimo held a solo exhibition at the Crocker Museum in Sacramento entitled

“Flowers of Fire and Earth” which highlighted one of his passions, his blue and white porcelain vases featuring the iconic lotus flower. Today his “Onion-shaped Lotus Vase” and a painting, *Force Meeting*, are part of Crocker’s permanent collection.

Most recently locally, Shimo recently was invited to donate a piece of his art, *Mid-day Glow*, to the Asian Community Center’s newest Senior Living Community, Maple Tree Village in Sacramento. His work hangs predominantly in the Welcome Center. Gregory Kondo’s family donated a large collection of pieces depicting the Sacramento River Delta, making Maple Tree a virtual art museum within their home.

Shimo was born in 1962 in Shanghai, China. In 1966, when he was four, the 10-year Cultural Revolution began. It was led by China’s Communist leader, Mao Zedong, in an attempt to reassert his authority over the government and rid China of the influence of capitalism including old culture, old customs, old habits and old beliefs. Schools were closed. Members of China’s elderly and intellectual population were attacked and harassed. Traditional arts, music, art, literature, film and theater were banned. Artists could no longer pursue their craft; they were disgraced and reduced to doing menial tasks to survive. The government controlled everything.

Both of Shimo’s parents died as a result of the Cultural Revolution. His father died from high blood pressure when Shimo was only two months old. He and his family of eight older siblings and his mother lost their large two-story home and were forced to move into a small 100 square foot room.

However, if it weren’t for these terrible events, he would not be the famous artist he is today. Shimo says he knows he was lucky to be born when he was and to have lived in the French neighborhood in Shanghai where the best artists resided. Because of his young age, Shimo was not considered to be a threat by the new government. Once the well-known but disgraced artists heard about this young child with a strong desire to learn about (and hopefully draw and paint) the things around him, Shimo’s foundation for prominence in his chosen path was being laid.

No prodding was necessary. Learning to draw from the age of five, and later to paint under the tutelage of three great artists was easy. His mentors were just there to guide and help him perfect his craft.

In an interview using his cell phone voice translator Shimo said, “The key is that they (the government) see that I am very young so they are not afraid I will expose them (the artists). They said a lot of things from the bottom of their hearts to me, but in fact they thought I couldn’t understand it so would not report them to the government.” They knew they were safe as “they did not pay attention to the small children.”

Shimo continues to promote the culture and arts between the United States. ★

**RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG)** - Rancho Cordovans have come together in unique and inspiring ways to help mitigate the spread of the coronavirus, and Rancho Cordova businesses are no exception.

This week, J.J. Pfister Distilling Company and Gold River Distillery have each begun producing and selling hand sanitizer instead of the usual gin, vodka, rum and brandy.

Keck said they can produce 528 gallons of hand sanitizer in each batch and that their goal is to produce 5,000 gallons in total. In addition to selling the hand sanitizer, they also have plans to distribute some for free to certain communities, such as the homeless.

Gold River Distillery has begun selling hand sanitizer and has sold several 4-ounce spray bottles and 750-milliliter bottles to hospitals and other medical facilities.

"We saw a need in the community, and we have what it takes to fulfill that need," said Greg Baughman, Chief Executive Officer and Master Distiller at Gold River Distillery. "We want to make sure people get the hand sanitizer they need to keep themselves safe," he added.

# Social Security Matters

## Retiring from Work; When Should I Claim Social Security?

**Dear Rusty:** I turned 63 August 12th, 2019. I will be retiring June 30th, 2020 from my current job. I will have made approximately \$35,000 by then and am receiving severance pay of \$19,000 on June 30th. Will the pay I receive through June 30th affect what I can draw from Social Security? Also, how much of a difference would it be if I wait until August 12th, 2020 to officially start drawing Social Security? Is there any other information I should be aware of before I start drawing Social Security  
**Signed: Anxious to Retire**

**Dear Anxious:** First, let me assure you that the money you earned this year before your benefits start aren't counted as part of Social Security's "earnings test" which could affect your payment after your benefits start. When you claim, your Social Security benefit amount will depend upon two things – your "primary insurance amount" (or "PIA") which is determined from your highest earning 35 years (adjusted for inflation)

over your lifetime, and the age at which you claim your SS benefit. By claiming at age 64 in August, your benefit will be cut by about 15.6% from what it would be if you wait to claim at your full retirement age (66 plus 4 months). Your earnings for 2020 won't be applied to your SS record until after you file your 2020 taxes in 2021, so won't affect your benefits (if appropriate) until after that. If your 2020 earnings are more than any of those in the 35 years used to initially compute your benefit, your benefit will increase at that time. The day of the month you were born isn't significant, only the month. So, if you apply to start benefits in August of 2020, your benefit cut will be as stated above because you're claiming exactly 2 years and 4 months early. But if you wait longer you'll gain another 5/9ths of 1% (.556%) for each additional month you delay up until your full retirement age (FRA).

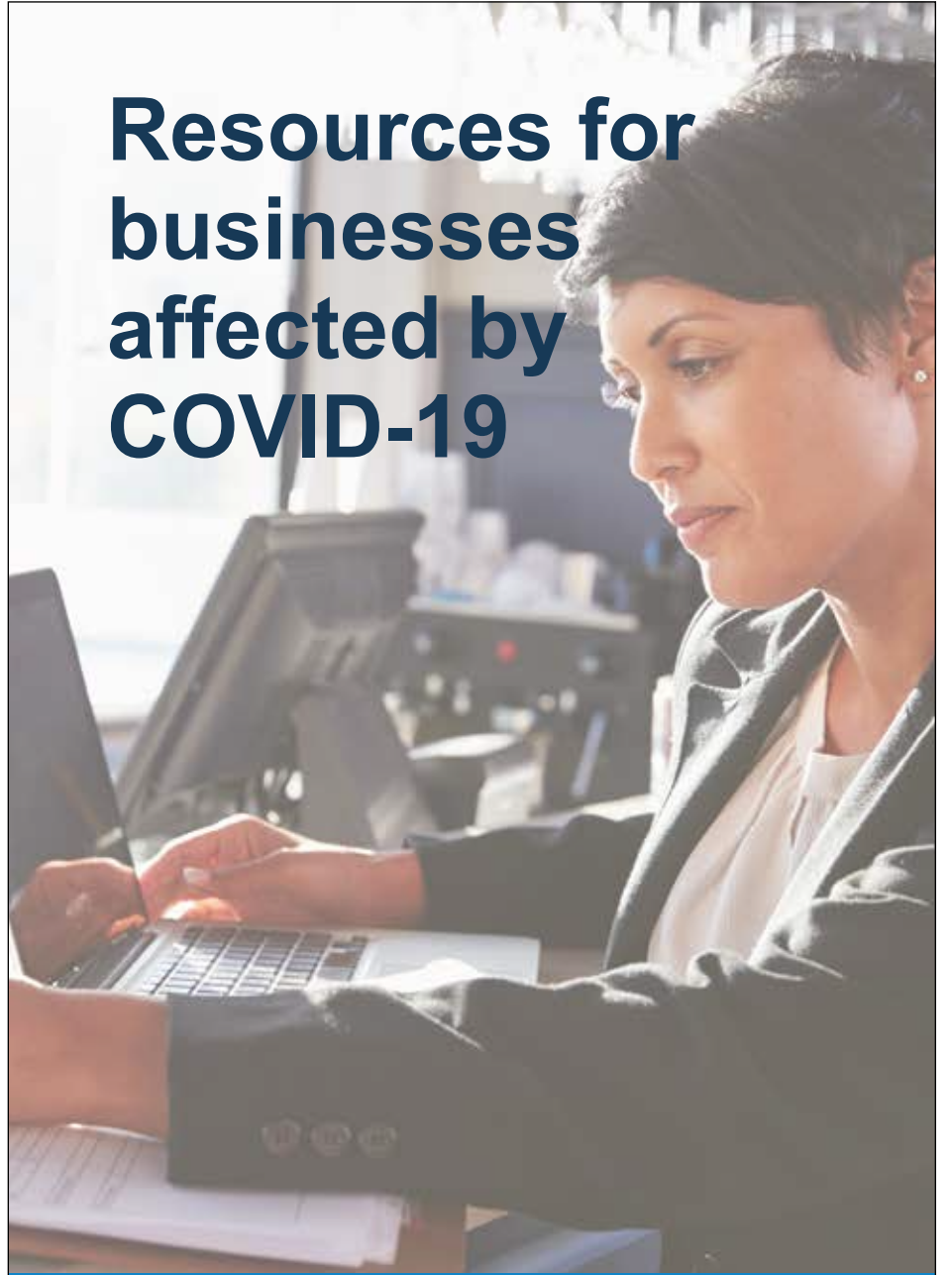
Although you plan to retire from work, be aware that if you decide to return you'll be subject to Social Security's earnings limit once you are collecting benefits before your FRA, and that will be the case until you reach your full retirement age. If you go back to work

after you start your SS and earn more than \$1,520 in any remaining month of 2020, you'll not be entitled to benefits for that month. Starting in 2021, you'll be subject to an annual earnings limit of at least \$18,240 (that's the 2020 limit – limits for future years aren't yet known but will be higher). Exceeding the annual limit will cause SS to withhold half of anything you earn over the limit. The limit is more, and the penalty is less in the year you reach your FRA and goes away once you have reached your full retirement age.

Finally, to be sure you're aware, you can actually defer claiming SS until age 70 if you wish. After you reach your full retirement age you'll earn delayed retirement credits (DRCs) of 8% per year of delay, which are added to your benefit when you finally claim it. That would give you a benefit which is 29% more at age 70 than it would be at your full retirement age.

# Rebuild CA Foundation Calls for Full Transparency and Accountability in Dealing with the Coronavirus Crisis

**SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)** - Doug Ose, Chairman of the Rebuild California Foundation (rebuild-ca.org), issued the following statement:

“All levels of government work best with full transparency and accountability. Transparency and accountability allow the voter to make informed decisions. Rebuild California Foundation strives to do the research and education necessary for an informed electorate.

As reported by the LA Times on Friday, California was prepared in 2010 for a pandemic: millions of masks, gloves and garbs for medical personnel; up to 21,000 beds of standby capacity; mobile capability to go where needed. Unfortunately, beginning in 2011, the Governor and the Legislature systematically dismantled the Health Surge Capacity Initiative. Consecutive budget year decisions by the Governor and the Legislature meant that the relatively small amount of funding necessary to preserve California's ability to respond to a pandemic was re-programmed for other purposes.

In addition, policy judgments by the Governor and the Legislature contributed to a reduction in the number of laboratories that can be utilized to combat medical emergencies. According to a report in the Sacramento Bee, the number

of laboratories that can do the testing needed has been reduced from 40 to only 29. In addition, funding for laboratory staffs has not changed since 2009; funding for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2020 for public health is the same as it was for fiscal year ending June 30, 2010.

Further, our research indicates that the Governor has access to significant sources of non-public information that can serve to give leaders an early heads up for a potential emergency. We have not been able to determine when Governor Newsom was first briefed about the threat posed by coronavirus.

Finally, we are not privy to any discussions Governor Newsom may have had with Legislative leaders about the coronavirus crisis.

Rebuild California Foundation will continue to examine issues affecting California and to educate the voters that live here.” ★
