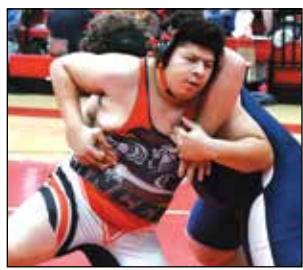

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## Underwater Wonderland

Mosaic Now Displayed at Kaiser Pediatric Department

### RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG)

When local mosaic artist Robin Moyher heard that Kaiser Permanente was refreshing their Rancho Cordova Medical Offices, she requested permission to make a mosaic wall hanging for the pediatric waiting room. "The actual location of the art was also something near and dear to my heart, having raised five children going through that pediatric waiting room," Moyher said. The previous artwork on the wall where hers now hangs was a 6

feet by 9 feet world map, which was not of much visual interest to her children. "However they all remember being attracted and fascinated by the small aquarium in the room. I knew an underwater themed mosaic would be my proposed application."

After four months for the contract application and approval process, and another four months to produce the artwork, it now graces the wall in Pediatrics. Her 3D mosaic shows a seaside scene composed of many elements: a mermaid, diver's helmet,

treasure chest with a guarding octopus, many types of sea life, animals, fish, and plants, with an unending display of sea-themed details. The whole thing includes abundant bits of glass, shells, and many other materials to depict numerous attention-holding objects, covered with acrylic glass for safety purposes. It complements the long-present aquarium. The room also has a framed giclée by Tennessee artist Nathaniel Mather portraying a colorful seaside scene. Kaiser Permanente,

which commissioned Moyher's work, said about its art selections, "Art programs in our facilities are designed to reflect the local community and provide the opportunity to showcase local talent and invest in the region. We embrace the message and tone of 'thrive.'"

Moyher was a home teaching mom for 26 years, and when her youngest son was a senior in high school she found that she needed something else to serve as her purpose in life, and she turned to mosaics, which

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## Court Grants Injunction for CTA, Independent Truckers

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The U.S. Southern District Court granted a preliminary injunction to enjoin enforcement of California's new employment classification test against motor carriers. This classification test was first set forth in the *Dynamex Operations West, Inc. v. Superior Court* (Dynamex) decision and was subsequently codified by the California Legislature in the form of Assembly Bill 5 (AB 5). The bill was set to take effect on January 1, 2020.

"This ruling is a significant win for California's more than 70,000 independent owner-operators and CTA members who have worked as independent truckers for decades, and who have invested hundreds of thousands of dollars to own their own vehicle and comply with California's strict environmental guidelines and regulations over the years," said Shawn Yadon, chief executive officer for the California Trucking Association (CTA).

The CTA filed the motion for a preliminary injunction as part of its November 2019 lawsuit challenging the constitutionality of AB 5, which would prohibit independent drivers from contracting and performing trucking services for licensed motor carriers in California. This preliminary injunction averts any irreparable damage to the 70,000 independent truckers prior to the court hearing on the merits of the case.

"With its decision, the U.S. Southern District Court validates our claim that the implementation of the new classification test could have been detrimental to the long-standing and historical place owner-operators have had in the transportation industry," said Robert R. Roginson, attorney for CTA.

In the lawsuit, which seeks declaratory and injunctive relief, plaintiffs argue that the Dynamex ruling should not be enforced because it is preempted under the supremacy clause of the U.S. Constitution, which sets the decision in direct conflict with a federal law passed by Congress in 1994 to prevent states from enacting punitive laws that affect a motor carrier's prices, routes and services of the trucking industry. ★

# Faith as a Foundation

## Higher Power Offers Faith-Based Recovery Program

**SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)** - Every Friday evening Higher Power Ministry holds faith-based recovery celebrations where Christian bands from a variety of genres perform. Music such as blues, country, and rock and roll are an essential component of the ministry. Lead Director of Recovery John Heath said, "The bands are central to Higher Power. We want to reach people where they are. ... The music feeds their spirits."

"God did something amazing," said Heath. "He opened the doors to some amazing top bands to play at Higher Power in the Sacramento area" — The Frank Aldrich Band, Sons of the Golden State, Salvation Army Band, Skuirrel, Machaira Band, Rhythm and Praise, Crimson Blues, The Lost and The Found, John Voelz Band, Reid Bartlett Band, Son House Band, Lisa Daggs, Marc Cooper, Andrew Marshall, Aaron Gayden, and Tom Schrader.

The bands don't sound like the typical Christian music one might expect, but the spiritual message emerges through the lyrics. James Croci of Rhythm and Praise said, "People need support — a place that gives them hope, help, and healing." Croci believes that the "Spirit of God gives them the strength to overcome."

On Friday, January 17, Crimson Blues performed at Higher Power's celebration. After the concert, Heath welcomed everyone and explained that the purpose of the Higher Power Ministry is to be "a refuge from the storm" and "a place we can take off our masks." He said, "We're here to walk alongside you."

Each week, a speaker talks to the group about their recovery from addiction such as drugs, alcohol, gambling, food addictions, sexual addictions, workaholics, co-dependency, and self-harm. Higher Power Theresa Nored was the featured speaker, and she has been clean for 24 years. She shared her story and her struggles with the group. "The details of the story don't matter," she said. "God brought redemption into my life." She said, "You have to get through the mess to reach the message."

She explained that the program is for "people who want a better way of life." She also spoke about the importance of removing the stigma surrounding addiction so that people aren't afraid to seek the help they need.

Tony T. is a member of Higher Power, and he has been sober for 34 years. He said, "A lot of people have addictions. They're dying in their homes. ... This is something really needed in this community."

Richard Mireles was released from prison 10 months ago after serving for 21 years. He brought his drug and alcohol addiction with him to prison: "I thought I would die in there." While serving his time in prison, Mireles got sober and turned his life around — even earning a degree in social and behavioral science and pursuing an MBA. He attributes his recovery to God, with "Him as my rock, my foundation."

Mireles said some of the hardest moments of his recovery were after his release from prison while transitioning back into society. He said that God "gave me a will to not go backwards." He now does a lot of advocacy work and encourages others to work toward recovery: "This is a source of staying sober — giving back. The true way to freedom is giving yourself up to service."

Higher Power has a strong spiritual support system: An Elder Board comprised of two recovery pastors — each with 30 years of sobriety — who give spiritual advice and guidance. Heath said that Pastor Gary Freitas from Manteca and Pastor Dale Marsh from Oroville provide "spiritual direction, protection, and correction in the ministry."

Pastor Freitas said, "There's a real need for this, so we support him 100 percent." He said that people are "searching for a higher power. They're searching for a relationship that means something — to fill that void, that emptiness."

Higher Power also helped start the Sacramento 12 Step Christian Recovery Network. Heath explained that the mission is to create "a community of believers under one banner whose primary purpose is to help other Christ-centered recovery ministries through support and fellowship." The network of recovery programs throughout the region are creating a website to collect all the recovery resources in one place. Anyone who is suffering can find services to help, such as addiction recovery programs, homeless shelters, food banks, safe houses for women, help for trafficking victims, etc. Heath said, "We're doing something that's never been done — to put all the faith-based meetings in one place to help

people get what they need to survive."

Pastor Marsh said, "For Higher Power and for us, it's really important to be part of the local recovery community. There's a huge value participating in the network."

Higher Power recovery celebrations are held each Friday at 7:00 PM at 755 Oak Avenue Parkway in Folsom where they serve free dinner, dessert, coffee, and other refreshments. Higher Power is a 501(c)(3) charitable organization; donation checks can be written to Higher Power Ministry and then mailed to Lakeside Church, 745 Oak Avenue Parkway, Folsom, CA 95630.★

**RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG)** - Lyndon Johnson was president, Ronald Reagan was governor. The Doors released their debut album and Elvis and Priscilla were married in Las Vegas. It all happened in 1967.

Closer to home, the third edition of the new Cordova High School Lancer Legends yearbook rolled off the press and today – some 53 years later – the Cordova Community Council is looking for a copy.

It's all part of an effort to assemble two complete sets of Lancer Legends yearbooks, now under way by the Cordova Community Council and Cordova High School Alumni group. The endeavor got a big boost last week when The Grapevine Independent bequeathed an

armload of Lancer Legends which were gathering dust at their facility.

Publisher Paul Scholl packed them up and delivered them to Cordova Community Council Executive Director Shelly Blanchard, who held her breath in hopes the elusive 1967 edition was among the treasures. No luck.

But Terry Behrens, a member of the Class of 1973, and the person beyond the popular Cordova High School Alumni Facebook page, now followed by 7,700 people, was ecstatic. Her collection grew by 10 volumes.

Lancer yearbooks are used by the Cordova Community Council for research – mainly for the Rancho Cordova Sports Hall of Fame. Photos and memories are scanned from the books to bring alive

sports history during the annual induction ceremony of star athletes of yesteryear, held each October.

Behrens is a powerhouse in that effort, but she reaches beyond. Those following the Cordova High School Alumni Facebook community receive lots of news about Lancer classmates, often accompanied by a photo that Behrens has scanned from a yearbook.

The newspapers in our country and around the world are disappearing as more and more people are depending on their smartphones and iPads, etc. But so far, we have been able to keep The Grapevine Independent. You can still hold it in your hands if you wish, or you can bring it up online. But at least it is still here. Shelly Blanchard, who was the editor of The Grapevine Independent some years ago, asked if I could let our readers know that she is looking for a yearbook from Cordova High School. As a matter of fact, she has been able to collect all the Cordova High School Lancer Legend Yearbooks from the beginning of 1964 to today. However, the 1967 yearbook is apparently very elusive. And another thing, there was a story in the news on January 17, 2020 about the Republic of Korea Ambassador to the United States in our region. Congressman Ami Bera's office hosted Ambassador Lee Soo-Hyuck and joined him at the State Capitol in a ceremony where he gave twelve Korean War Veterans the Ambassador for Peace Medal. The commemorative medal is an expression of appreciation from the Korean government to American service men and women who served in the Korean War. I have seen the medal when the Consulate General of the Republic of Korea gave the Ambassador for Peace Medal to Korean War Veterans here at our Memorial Day ceremony in May 2017. # Dave Ramsey Says

## Keep it Small, and Budget for It

Dear Dave, I'm trying very hard to get out of debt. I have my beginner emergency fund in place, and I'm living on a monthly budget. Is it okay to include a little wallet cash in my budget at this point, just in case?

— Andrew

Dear Andrew, It's probably not going to throw you off too much in terms of getting out of debt if you budget \$20 or so, just to have some cash in your wallet. I wouldn't recommend much more than that, though. The idea of having \$50, \$100, or \$200 in walking around money is pretty self-defeating when you're supposedly saving, budgeting, and working hard to get out of debt.

Think of it as a safety valve. Sometimes things come up in the course of day-to-day life that are just necessary, unexpected expenses — but not emergencies. Just designate a small amount of cash for it as part of your regular, monthly budget, and stick to that amount!

## Emergency Fund First, Then Investing

Dear Dave, Do you think I should stop making contributions to my 401(k) for a year, so I can save up an emergency fund? I'm 28, and debt-free, but I don't have anything saved for emergencies.

— Bryan

Dear Bryan, If you're debt-free and making decent money at your job, it shouldn't take a whole year to set aside an emergency fund. Just make it a priority in your monthly budget. And yes, my advice to you is temporarily stop making contributions to your 401(k) until you have a fully-funded emergency fund of three to six months of expenses.

I recommend people stop investing, or wait to start investing, until they are debt-free except for their home and have a fully-funded emergency fund in place. In some cases, depending on how much debt they have, it can take two or three years to do all this. I know that seems like a long time, but in the grand scheme of things it's really not.

If you don't have an emergency fund, but you're contributing to a 401(k), there's a good chance you'll end up cashing out your 401(k) if a large, unexpected expense comes along. Then, when you cash out a 401(k) early, you get hit with a penalty plus your tax rate. That's not a wise plan!

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## SMF's BARC Dogs Help to Calm Travelers' Nerves

**SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG)** - Air travel can be stressful for many people – whether it is a fear of flying, delays or just the stress of being away from home, Sacramento International Airport (SMF) is providing a furry and adorable solution.

SMF is one of 58 airports across the country partnering with a therapy dog group in an effort to improve the traveling experience.

SMF's Boarding Area Relaxation Corps (BARC) dogs and their handlers are members of the Sacramento-based nonprofit organization Lend A Heart Animals Assisted Therapy. BARC teams are experienced handlers and their pets who have additional training for this special program.

All BARC dogs wear blue vests that say "Pet Me," an open invitation for travelers to say hello.

For many, hectic travel days are often cured simply by the sight of the friendly-faced, tail-waggers trudging down the concourse.

"Many people either spend a lot of time in airports or are inexperienced or frightened flyers," said Kathy Prendergast, a BARC leader. "These dogs provide such a bright spot for what, in many ways, can be a harried day. You can just feel the strain go away when the dogs are around."

From lowering blood pressure to improving a traveler's moods, recent studies have shown there are many benefits to having a friendly dog to pet at the airport.

Like all BARC teams, Carol Abelson and her dog Woody have seen these benefits up close.

"On one visit we were walking through the terminal and a lady pointed out a teenager

who was obviously petrified about flying," said Abelson. "Woody and I walked over to her and she just grabbed him in a big hug for about 10 minutes. By the time she boarded, she was so much more relaxed. We see that all the time."

BARC dogs have been wagging their way around SMF since 2015. There are now more than 30 airport-approved BARC teams spreading their stress-busting affection through each terminal at least two times per week.

"The BARC teams bring so much to our airport," said Cindy Nichol, Director of the Sacramento County Department of Airports. "They alleviate stress and make people feel at home during what can be a hectic experience. They really are changing the dynamic of the airport environment."

Recognizing that not everyone loves dogs, airport therapy dog teams typically remain stationary. They can be found in open areas making it easy to pet the dogs while those not so fond can easily avoid them.

The Lend A Heart organization also has teams that visit hospitals, nursing homes and schools during finals week. The dogs and their handlers go through an evaluation and training process that usually takes a few months to complete. The dogs are matched with assignments based on factors like their age and temperament.

In addition to Lend A Heart's standard training and evaluation, airport-approved dogs have to be assessed as being able to focus while experiencing large crowds, elevators, noise and other working dogs such as security canines.

"It doesn't matter the size or the breed," said Prendergast. "What matters is that they enjoy meeting people. And at the very least they bring a smile to someone's face." ★

## "Gold Mountain: Chinese Californian Stories" at the California Museum

New Exhibit Underscores Chinese Californians' Often Overlooked but Significant Role in Shaping History

**SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)** - The California Museum began exhibiting the long-term installation "Gold Mountain: Chinese Californian Stories" on Sunday, Jan. 26, 2020. The new exhibit details the history of Chinese Americans in California from the 1840s to the present through a display of historic artifacts and photographs, accompanied by interactive video stations, games and activities. Underscoring Chinese Californians' often overlooked but significant role in history, the exhibit reveals parallels to immigration, race and civil rights issues impacting the state and nation.

"We're thrilled to present the new exhibit 'Gold Mountain,'" said Executive Director Amanda Meeke. "Although the role of Chinese Californians in building the transcontinental railroad is well-known, their other contributions to shaping our state over the last 175 years are often overlooked. This exhibit highlights their unsung

role in the state's past and present while revealing connections to current issues of race, nationalism and civil rights."

"Gold Mountain: Chinese Californian Stories" explores the Chinese American experience in California from the Gold Rush to the present in six themed sections. Highlights of Chinese immigrants' early achievements include their critical contributions to the completion of the transcontinental railroad in 1869 as well as to building other infrastructure and contributing to the state's agriculture, fishing and manufacturing. Later in the 19th century, the exhibit explores how Chinese Californians fought racist laws including the Chinese Exclusion Act of 1882, a federal law pushed by California that prohibited immigration by Chinese laborers, and its enforcement through the incarceration of Chinese immigrants at the Angel Island Immigration Station from 1910 to 1940.

The exhibit also showcases achievements by Chinese Californians who

have broken barriers in a wide array of pursuits. Among featured stories are those of Wong Kim Ark (circa 1873-1946), a native San Franciscan whose triumph in the landmark Supreme Court case United States v. Wong Kim Ark established birthright citizenship in 1898; and Anna May Wong (1905-1961), a Los Angeles native who became the first Chinese American movie star in the 1922 film The Toll of the Sea. The exhibit also presents the successes of local Chinese Americans. Examples include Frank Fat (1904-1997), an immigrant who started the popular restaurant Frank Fat's in 1939, and Lisa Ling, a Sacramento native who is the only female Chinese American journalist on national news today.

The California Museum educates visitors on California's diverse history, arts, culture and unique influence on the world. Through interactive exhibits and engaging programs, the Museum inspires visitors to make their mark on history. Learn more at <https://www.californiamuseum.org>. ★

**MEMORANDUM OF POINTS AND AUTHORITIES**

- I. INTRODUCTION**  
 Petitioner PAUL V. SCHOLL dba MESSENGER PUBLISHING GROUP (hereinafter "SCHOLL") hereby petitions to establish the newspaper known as the "Citrus Heights Messenger" (also referred herein as the "Messenger") to be a newspaper of general circulation.
- II. FACTUAL BACKGROUND**  
 Petitioner SCHOLL owns and operates the "Citrus Heights Messenger," which is a community newspaper serving the Citrus Heights, California area. The Messenger focuses on local, County, and State news, and currently has one hundred and one (101) paying subscribers in Sacramento County. The Messenger is published weekly on Fridays, and it has a distribution (for each weekly publication) in Sacramento County totaling 8,500, with an average gross circulation totaling 8,500. Distribution is made by U.S. Mail, home delivery and approximately 110 locations, (i.e. newsstands, retailers and restaurants).
- III. AUTHORITY AND ARGUMENT**  
 There are two code sections by which a newspaper can petition to be established as a newspaper of general circulation: Government Code § 6000, and alternatively, Government Code § 6008. "In 1974, the Legislature added section 6008 to the Government Code to provide an alternative to section 6000 for 'qualifying a newspaper as a newspaper of general circulation.'" (In re Tri-Valley Herald (1985) 169 Cal. App.3d 865, 871-872. Gov. Code, § 6008 was added to make it easier for local newspapers to benefit from centralized printing plants otherwise outside of their service area. (see In re Tri-Valley Herald (1985) 169 Cal.App.3d 865, 871). The requirements under Gov. Code, § 6000 are different than those under Gov. Code, § 6008. (In re Establishment of Eureka Reporter (2008) 165 Cal.App.4th 891, 897). The present Petition seeks adjudication under the requirements imposed by Government Code § 6000.

Government Code § 6000 defines a "newspaper of general circulation" as follows:

"A 'newspaper of general circulation' is a newspaper published for the dissemination of local or telegraphic news and intelligence of a general character, which has a bona fide subscription list of paying subscribers, and has been established, printed and published at regular intervals in the State, county, or city where publication, notice by publication, or official advertising is to be given or made for at least one year preceding the date of the publication, notice or advertisement." (Gov. Code, § 6000.)

**A. Petitioner SCHOLL and the MESSENGER meet all of the requirements for being established as a newspaper of general circulation and the Court should grant the present Petition.**

First, the Messenger publishes its content "for the dissemination of local or telegraphic news and intelligence of a general character" (Gov. Code, § 6000) because it provides general news stories, local business and real estate news, special announcements, news on events, local commentaries and editorials, church news, entertainment listings, seniors news, local sports, volunteer news, syndicated columnists, cartoons, and games to the general public.

Second, the Messenger "has a bona fide subscription list of paying subscribers" (Gov. Code, § 6000) because it currently maintains a list of one hundred and one (101) subscribing customers who pay for the newspaper to be delivered to their residence.

Next, the Messenger meets the requirement of being "established" under Gov. Code, § 6000 because it has been in existence under the specified name of the Citrus Heights Messenger for the whole of the one-year period preceding this Petition (see In re Molz (2005) 127 Cal.App.4th 836, 839).

Further, the Messenger meets the requirement of being "printed and published for regular intervals" (Gov. Code, § 6000) because the mechanical work of producing the Messenger occurs at 2100 Q Street, Sacramento, California, in the same county as the Messenger, and the Messenger has been (and continues to be) issued in the place where it is printed and sold and circulated (Sacramento County) for the whole of the one-year period. (see Gov. Code § 6004).

**IV. CONCLUSION**

In view of the foregoing authorities and facts, Petitioner SCHOLL respectfully requests that this Court order that the "Citrus Heights Messenger" be established as a newspaper of general circulation in the City of Citrus Heights, Sacramento County, in the State of California.

Continued from page 1 she had always admired. “I decided at the onset I was going to give 50 percent of my sales to Christian non-profits,” Moyher said. “I’m basically donating my labor, but you feel like you’re doing something of value.”

The mosaic at Kaiser was the most recent of what Moyher considers her “public art.” She also did a mosaic that was installed at the Veterans Hospital in Rancho Cordova, and the planter mosaics at Mather Veterans Village. Her 50 percent from the Kaiser piece, Moyher said, bought a freshwater well in Uganda. She has completed a total of six commissioned pet portraits, as well. “But the public art

is a real passion for me,” Moyher said.

It was Kaiser that paid for this artwork after some back and forth on funding and subject matter. Moyher applied for Measure H public art funds on this project, but the City decided since the work was inside a business, it did not meet the qualifications for public art. The program for the use of the Rancho Cordova public art funds is changing as it goes. At first there were not so many artists vying for the Measure H dollars, according to Moyher. As the arts community grows there is more competition for available dollars. “(Rancho Cordova) spent around \$50,000 last year

for public art, and there wasn’t enough grant money to pay for all the applications (submitted),” Moyher said. However, persistence paid off in the end for Moyher. “Having been given this opportunity has encouraged me as a public artist,” she said, “and I hope it helps me gain new opportunities to create art for our community.”

Kaiser advised that, “In general, there are art selection committees that decide how the commissioning and procurement process is conducted. Anyone with questions or interest can contact their local Kaiser Permanente to learn more or visit <https://healthy.kaiser-permanente.org/>” ★
