

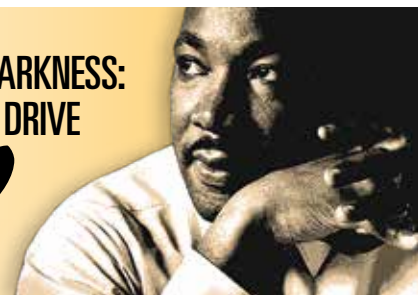

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Emergency Child Care Needed for Foster Families

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - To recruit more loving families for children in foster care, Sacramento County is making it easier to find and afford childcare services for resource families. The Emergency Child Care Bridge Program’s goal is to increase the number of resource families for children in foster care by helping families find the right child care provider, connecting families to long-term child care subsidies, and by providing vouchers to pay for childcare for up to six months. The

vouchers help ensure that a resource family has adequate support to balance work and home lives along with providing a smoother transition when welcoming a child into the home.

“There are new and exciting things coming to the Bridge Program in 2020,” said Gloria Bedford, Human Services Program Planner. “The program is receiving an additional \$750,000 from the California Department of Social Services that will go directly to child care vouchers to help more resource parents pay for daycare and help to stabilize foster placements more quickly.”

From its inception in May 2018

through October 2019, the program in Sacramento County served 190 families who were fostering 264 children and issued \$1,165,230 in vouchers to resource families.

“More parents are working outside the home, which makes the ability to recruit and retain foster parents more challenging,” said Michelle Callejas, Sacramento County Director of Child, Family and Adult Services. “The Bridge Program is vital to help the Department of Child, Family and Adult Services place more local foster children in homes where they will receive high-quality care and to

Are You Ready for The Presidential Primary?

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Once every four years, the state of California conducts a party Primary Election. The purpose of this election is for the voters registered within a party to help select a presidential nominee to represent that party in the November General Election.

Sacramento County Voter Registration and Elections just mailed out a Voter Registration Status Postcard to every registered voter. The postcard is specific to the voter and lists name, address and registered political party. It is very important that voters review the information to ensure it is correct before ballots are mailed out the first week of February.

Political parties can choose to limit participation in their party’s primary to only registered voters of that party. In other words, if you’re a registered Democrat, you wouldn’t be allowed to participate in the Republican primary. The same is true for any party that holds a presidential primary.

If a voter is registered with a political party, they will receive a ballot that contains presidential nominees for that party only.

If a voter is not registered with a political party, also known as “No Party Preference,” they will receive a ballot that does not contain any presidential nominees.

However, they have the option to crossover and choose to request a ballot that contains nominees for the American Independent Party, Democratic Party, or Libertarian Party, for this election only without changing their voter registration. To crossover, voters can do one of four things:

Visit a Vote Center between Feb. 22 and March 3

If they would like to vote for presidential nominees in the Green Party, Peace and Freedom Party, or the Republican Party, then they must be a registered voter with that party. To re-register visit the California Online Voter Registration website.

Eligible residents that are not yet registered to vote can do so on the California Online Voter Registration website and be sure to select one of the political parties.

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - The Department of Water Resources (DWR) conducted the first manual snow survey of 2020 at Phillips Station. The manual survey recorded 33.5 inches of snow depth and a snow water equivalent (SWE) of 11 inches, which is 97 percent of average for this location. The SWE measures the amount of water contained in the snowpack, which provides a more accurate forecast of spring runoff. "While the series of cold weather storms in November and December has provided a good start to the 2020 snowpack, precipitation in Northern California is still below average for this time of year," said DWR Director Karla Nemeth. "We must remember how variable California's climate is and what a profound impact

climate change has on our snowpack." More telling than a survey at a single location are DWR's electronic readings from 130 stations scattered throughout the State. Measurements indicate that statewide, the snowpack's SWE is 9.3 inches, or 90 percent of the January 2 average. "It's still too early to predict what the remainder of the year will bring in terms of snowpack," said Sean DeGuzman, chief of DWR's Snow Surveys and Water Supply Forecasting Section. "Climate change is altering the balance of rain and snow in California. That is why it is important to maintain our measurements of the snowpack to document the change in addition to having critical information to forecast spring runoff." California traditionally receives about 75 percent of its annual precipitation during December, January and February, with the bulk

of this precipitation coming from atmospheric rivers. Similar to last year, California experienced a dry start to this water year followed by cold, wet December storms that brought the state up to 74 percent of average annual precipitation for this time of year. Climate change is expected to lead to continued warming and fewer but more intense storms impacting the snowpack of the Sierra Nevada. These changes continue to impact the distribution of snow across elevations, its pattern of accumulation, and rate of melt. DWR conducts five media-oriented snow surveys at Phillips Station each winter in January, February, March, April and, if necessary, May. On average, the snowpack supplies about 30 percent of California's water needs as it melts in the spring and early summer. For more information visit <https://water.ca.gov/>

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - At its biennial conference on December 4, 2019, the Association of California Water Agencies (ACWA) elected Director Pam Tobin as vice-president for the 2020-21 term which began on January 1, 2020. Director Tobin is only the second vice-president of ACWA from the Sacramento region during the Association's 110-year history and is the fourth woman to serve in that role. ACWA is the statewide trade association that represents 400+ public water agencies in California.

I look forward to contributing to the Association's ongoing success in furthering the interests of its members and, through them, those of all Californians," said Tobin. As vice-president, Director Tobin will serve as a member of ACWA's leadership team that will guide the Association's advocacy and collaboration with the Newsom Administration, California Legislature, Trump Administration and Congress to protect and promote California's water interests. ACWA vice-presidents normally become president of the Association for the two-year term following

their vice-presidency and then serve as immediate past president for another two years. Consequently, Director Tobin will be involved at the highest level of ACWA leadership for the next six years. Tobin brings a wealth of regional and statewide experience to the position, serving: For the past two years on the ACWA Board of Directors as Chair of ACWA's Region 4 (covering Sacramento, San Joaquin, Solano, Stanislaus and Yolo counties); As a member of the Association's Federal Affairs and Local Government committees; And on the Board of the ACWA Joint Powers Insurance Authority. She also served as chair of both the Sacramento Regional Water Authority and Sacramento Groundwater Authority. While Director Tobin

is responsible for representing all members of ACWA in carrying out her leadership duties, her presence in ACWA leadership will ensure that issues of importance to San Juan Water District and the Sacramento region are addressed. support these families who open their homes and hearts to foster children."

There are three major components of the Bridge Program:

Emergency child care vouchers that are issued to eligible families to cover child care costs for children ages 0-12 for up to six months;

Support from a child care navigator who will work with families to find a child care provider, assist with completion of child care applications, and develop a plan for long-term child care;

Trauma-informed care training so child care providers can learn strategies for working with children in foster care, many of whom have experienced trauma.

Families who are eligible for the Bridge Program include:

Resource families that have completed the Resource Family Approval (RFA) process; ★

Foster family agency-approved or county-approved foster homes;

Families who care for foster children in an emergency placement;

An approved relative or a non-related extended family member who is caring for a foster child;

Parenting foster youth and non-minor dependents; and

Those who have foster children placed with them for a compelling reason.

And Another Thing

It is also time for the United States Census 2020

The Cordova Community Council and Rancho Cordova Chamber Luncheon on Friday, January 17 will have speaker Mayor David Sander who will look ahead at the City of Rancho Cordova in the year 2020. It is a new year, a new decade, and a leap year all in one. So, if you are planning on getting things done this year, that means you have an extra day to get them done.

And another thing about this year, it is also time for the United States Census 2020. The 2020 Census counts every person living in the 50 states, the District of Columbia, and five U.S. territories (Puerto Rico, American Samoa, the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands, Guam, and the U.S. Virgin Islands). Each home will receive an invitation to respond to a short

questionnaire – online, by phone or by mail. This will be the first time you can respond to the census online. Actually, the count is mandated by the Constitution and conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau, a nonpartisan government agency. It is in Article 1, Section 2 of the Constitution, and mandates that the country conduct a count of its population once every 10 years. The 2020 Census will mark the 24th time that the country has counted its population since 1790. And participating in the census is required by law.

I received some very helpful questions and answers online about the Census. “The 2020 Census will ask: 1. How many people are living at your home on April 1, 2020; 2. Whether the home is owned or rented; 3. About the sex of each person in your home; 4. About the age of each person in your home; 5. About the race of each person in your home; 6. About whether a person in your home is of Hispanic, Latino, or Spanish origin; and 7. About the relationship of

each person in your home.” The Census will never ask certain questions like, “Your Social Security number; money or donations; anything on behalf of a political party; or your bank or credit card account numbers. If someone claiming to be from the Census Bureau contacts you via email or phone and asks you for one of these things, it’s a scam, and you should not cooperate.”

A lot of the information in my column I received from the Census Bureau. But anytime you are uncertain, remember, “The Census Bureau is bound by federal law to protect your information, and your data is used only for statistical purposes.” You can learn more about the Census Bureau and how it must protect your information. I hope some of the information is helpful, but if you go online, you can find out that there are several ways you can contact the Census Bureau for support or information.

Dear Paula, You've told me you're having money troubles, and at the same time you're throwing money out the window every week? Honestly, the small amount you're talking about doesn't make a difference. Even if it's just two or three bucks a week, that action represents a lot of financially irresponsible behavior in your life. I'm going to be very blunt with you. The lottery is a tax on the poor and people who can't do math. Your chances of winning

are bleak at best. Did you know the odds of winning the Powerball jackpot are about 1 in 292,000,000? There are plenty of other very unusual things that are much more likely to happen to you than winning the lottery. Your chances of making a hole-in-one on the golf course are about 1 in 12,500. Even your odds of having quadruplets are around 1 in 11 million. When times are tough and you're strapped for cash, the last thing you need to do is spend what little you have on gimmicks. My advice is to focus on working hard, living on a tight budget that cuts out all unnecessary expenses, and saving every penny you can. Unlike the lottery, this is a plan that works every time. When you start living on a budget and get out of debt, it provides a little bit of breathing room in your life. You might even feel like you got a raise! Don't let your finances—and your dreams—be hijacked by the lottery.

Cordova Alums Had Stellar Athletic Careers

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Cordova High School alumni and Rancho Cordova Sports Hall of Famers Randy Lerch and Gerald Willhite are among five Sacramento-area athletes to be inducted into the Sacramento Sports Hall of Fame Class of 2020 at 7 p.m., Saturday, January 25, 2020 at Thunder Valley Casino Resort.

Lerch (Class of 1973) and Willhite (Class of 1977) join Trevor Matich (football), Fernando Vina (baseball), and Diego Corrales (boxing) as 2020 inductees. Corrales is being inducted posthumously as he tragically died in a 2007 automobile crash.

Lerch compiled a 60-64 record during an 11-year career with the Philadelphia Phillies, Milwaukee Brewers, Montreal Expos and San Francisco Giants. His best seasons were 1978-79, when he compiled 11-8 and 10-13 records for the Phillies.

During his Cordova varsity career, the left-hander pitched to a 24-2 record, including a 13-0 senior campaign in 1973. As a junior in 1972, he was one of four Lancers named to the Sacramento BEE/KFBK/KOVR All-Area team, joined by teammates Jerry Manuel, Mike Ondina and Nyls Nyman.



Lerch recently authored "God in the Bullpen," a 256-page autobiography and personal story of faith and the personal challenges he faced during life in professional baseball.

Willhite is the best known football player never to have played football at Cordova. However, he was an exceptional wrestler, and went on to play football for American River College and San Jose State. During a two-year career with the Spartans, Willhite rushed for 2,403 yards and 20 touchdowns before being drafted in the first round by the Denver Broncos in the 1982 NFL draft.

During a 7-year career with the Denver Broncos (1982-1988), Willhite was a dual threat as both a runner and pass catcher out of the backfield. He totaled over 3,400 yards in his career with 22 touchdowns averaging 4.4 yards per carry.

Developing Safe Routes to School Master Plan

City of Rancho Cordova

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - During the development of the City of Rancho Cordova's Pedestrian Master Plan (adopted 2011) and the Bicycle Master Plan (adopted 2016), City staff worked with school administrators to identify concerns and opportunities to access Rancho Cordova's school sites. In general, school administrators were looking for more visible pedestrian crossings of streets adjacent to schools, along with signing that alerts drivers to student activity. The information identified led to the need for a Safe Routes to School (SRTS) Master Plan, focused specifically on access to and from schools in Rancho Cordova.

The development of the SRTS Master Plan will be performed through interaction with appropriate stakeholders from the City, school districts, students, parents, and community members to identify infrastructure and program improvements needed to provide a safe and connected network that will promote walking and bicycling to schools. The project will also include the initial planning work necessary to enable the City to be competitive in seeking Active Transportation Program funding to finance needed infrastructure improvements.
