## Partnership Brings Holiday Cheer to Students In Need

**RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG)** - On December 12, Cordova Recreation & Park District (CRPD) staff donated \$835 in various gift cards to students-in-need at Cordova High School. In partnership with the Folsom Cordova Unified School District, CRPD continued a tradition of holiday donations, reflecting a fierce commitment to their mission to serve community needs.

CRPD's General Manager Patrick

Larkin, Human Resource Manager Andrea White and Office Manager Sharday White met with Principal Jerad Hyden and Counselor Mark Levy to drop off the holiday gifts. Each homeless student will receive an envelope with gift cards to restaurants, clothing stores and/or entertainment centers, and a hand-written note from a CRPD staff member.

Cordova High School's Principal Jerad Hyden wrote a letter to Mayor of Rancho Cordova Robert McGarvey, acknowledging CRPD for their efforts. "We are truly

speechless... to think of the combined efforts in raising this amount of money for our most vulnerable students is a task worthy of the highest level of praise," Jerad said. "The remarkable caveat, this money was raised internally, that is to say, it was completely donated by the wonderful staff of CRPD!"

"A huge thank you to Patrick and his staff for making a difference in the lives of students who often have very little to look forward to and be thankful for given this time of the year. Our

## Adoption Event Shares Joy, But More Youth Need Families

**SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG)** - Sacramento Superior Court and Sacramento County collaborated to host a National Adoption Day event at the William R. Ridgeway Family Relations Courthouse on Saturday, Nov. 23, 2019. By the end of this special day, 54 children from foster care finalized their adoptions into 42 families — each finding their forever home.

"This has been a joyous event for every child and family. However, right now, roughly 350 foster children still need forever homes," said, Michelle Callejas, director of the Sacramento County Department of Child, Family and Adult Services. "This day is a great reminder to community members that they can become a resource or adoptive parent and open their homes and hearts to foster youth in need."

On the day of the event, the courthouse, normally serious, instead buzzed with excitement and jubilation of children excited to embrace their new families. Suzanne Goldwire, a Resource Parent many times, who after fostering Jessi and Tianna for 10 months, celebrated at the Adoption Day event with hugs and poignant tears as she took the final step to welcome Jessi and Tianna into their forever family with the rest of her family and grandchildren present in support.

"Today is the day I adopted Tianna and Jessi. I've been fostering them for 10 months... and now we just made it official and they fit right in with my nine grandkids. It's important that the kids know that they can be loved even though they are not your biological child," said Suzanne. When asked about the upcoming holidays, Suzanne said, "I'm excited about expanding the family and having everybody get together... this Thanksgiving will be extra special because I've added two kids to our family - and now they are official with us - I'm thankful for that."

At the event when asked about the process to foster/adopt, Suzanne shared that the process was easy and the agency will walk people through the process. Data shows that outcomes for foster youth improve greatly with the permanency of a family.

## RCPD Receives Traffic Education and Enforcement Grant

**RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG)** - The Rancho Cordova Police Department was awarded a \$55,000 grant by the Office of Traffic Safety (OTS) for a year-long traffic safety education and

enforcement program. In addition, the Rancho Cordova Police Department and Mercy San Juan Medical Center are once again joining forces to provide child safety seat, bicycle and pedestrian education to our community.

"The Rancho Cordova Police Department is

proud to partner with the California Office of Traffic Safety to proactively provide traffic safety outreach and education in the City of Rancho Cordova," said Rancho Cordova Assistant Police Chief Jeff Schelldorf. "We look forward to partnering with our residents to keep our community safe on our roadways."

The grant will support various education and enforcement activities for the 2020 federal fiscal year (Oct. 1, 2019 to Sept. 30, 2020):

Driving under the influence (DUI) checkpoints and saturation patrols take alcohol and drug-impaired drivers, as well as those driving without a license or a revoked or suspended license, off the road;

Patrols targeting violations of California's hands-free cell phone law and vehicle code violations by drivers, motorcyclists, bicyclists and pedestrians that put other roadway users at risk;

Speeding, red light and stop sign enforcement;

Checking for seat belt and child safety seat compliance;

Conduct child safety seat checkups to promote correct usage at community locations;

Traffic safety education presentations for youth and community members on distracted, impaired and teen driving, and bicycle and pedestrian safety;

Compilation of DUI "Hot Sheets" identifying repeat DUI offenders;

Specialized DUI and drugged driving training to identify and apprehend suspected impaired drivers;

"Getting in a vehicle remains one of the most dangerous things we do," said OTS Director Barbara Rooney. "We must continue to work with our partners in law enforcement to shift that realization and make traveling on our roads safer."

Funding for this program was provided by a grant from the California Office of Traffic Safety, through the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration. ★

# SAFE Credit Union Awards UC Davis Medical School Student With Scholarship

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - SAFE Credit Union awarded UC Davis Medical School third-year medical student Angelina Mikityuk with a scholarship during a ceremony at the UC Davis Mind Institute.

Medical school students on average graduate with around \$200,000 in student loan debt, a heavy load to bear as they enter the medical field in their 30s. That debt can affect where they choose to work, in which disciplines, and delay their other important life decisions such as buying a home and starting a family.

SAFE Credit Union’s pillars of philanthropy include health care and education, and this scholarship combines both missions by assisting a medical student who will in turn share her expertise with the Greater Sacramento community.

“This scholarship is an immense help as I finish my last two years of medical school and begin choosing my specialty,” says Mikityuk, a Sacramento-area native who plans to practice medicine in the Greater Sacramento area after becoming an MD. “Your support is incredibly valuable to medical students like me. It helps me worry less about increasing my debt and instead focus my energy on learning how to give the best possible care to those in our community.”

Mikityuk knew she wanted to become a physician since she was a child. She attended undergrad at UC Davis where she graduated with a degree

in Anthropology before applying to medical school. “I love Sacramento. I want to practice here,” she says.

“SAFE is so pleased to be able to support UC Davis Medical School students like Angelina,” says said Amanda Merz, SAFE Credit Union community and advocacy engagement manager. “I’m so impressed by her dedication and commitment to serve her community. She exemplifies the ‘people helping people’ mission the credit

Resource parents and their families make a vital and positive difference in the lives of foster children by providing love, parental care, guidance and stability to children until they can either return to their parents or provide a permanent home through adoption or legal guardianship. Anyone able to provide a loving and affirming home can become a resource parent – and there is a tremendous need for resource

families for teens, LGBTQ youth, African-American children, sibling sets, children with medical needs, and emergency, short-term placements and homes.

While reuniting children with their biological families is the primary goal, when reunification is not possible, Sacramento County staff can help resource parents to adopt or to provide legal guardianship. Sacramento County supports, trains and offers guidance, resources and assistance to

resource families to make sure the journey is a positive transition.

Dear Meg,

If you know me, you probably have a good idea what's coming next. I'm not a huge fan of layaway programs, because they're not the answer to a problem. I mean, *Christmas* comes at the same time every year. It's not like it

snuck up on you. What's wrong with just saving up money for Christmas ahead of time?

Here's a good rule of thumb: if you don't have the money on hand, you can't afford it. Now, sometimes there are instances when certain popular items are on sale, and you can take advantage of them through layaway if you don't have enough cash at that very moment. I don't have a huge problem with this sort of thing, as long as it's not habitual behavior, and you're already saving money and living on a budget. Still, I would never, ever recommend using a layaway plan with fees attached.

It may be too late to budget for this Christmas, but I want you to make plans to start living on a written, monthly budget in January. Make it a resolution! Give every dollar a

name, on paper, before the upcoming month begins. You can include Christmas spending in those monthly budgets, too. If you set aside a little bit each month from January until next December, you won't have to worry about layaways or Christmas *debt*.

Remember, Christmas is about God and it's about love. There are many, many ways to bless people and make them happy without overextending yourself financially!

# The Senate's New Drug Bill is Socialism Lite

House Speaker Nancy Pelosi has a radical new plan to let the federal government set drug prices. Republicans are holding up Senator Chuck Grassley’s Prescription Drug Pricing Reduction Act as a more moderate

alternative. That’s a mistake. While Grassley’s bill isn’t as radical as the Pelosi’s, it includes similarly dangerous reforms. Neither bill would do much to save patients money. And both would make it harder for Americans to access new drugs. Pelosi’s bill empowers government officials to set prices for a variety of drugs. The bill instructs the Secretary of Health and Human Services to “negotiate” the prices of up to 250 medicines. These negotiations would hardly be fair. The bill caps the negotiated prices at 120 percent of the average price paid for these drugs in six other countries. Any

company that refused to negotiate would have to pay the government 65 percent of last year’s sales for the drug in question. Grassley’s bill also contains its fair share of government price setting. Like the section that prohibits drug companies from raising Medicare prices faster than the rate of inflation. Firms that raise prices too quickly would have to pay a rebate to the government, equal to the difference between the old and new prices. Like all price setting, this so-called “inflation penalty” would prohibit drug companies from setting market prices. But that won’t lower costs for patients. Over time, companies will begin

launching drugs with artificially high prices, to avoid having to raise prices and face the penalty down the line. The Senate plan would also tax manufacturers for certain drugs sold in Medicare Part D. Once Part D beneficiaries spend \$5,100 out of pocket on prescriptions, the government begins paying for the majority of each drug they take. Under Grassley’s bill, drug makers would have to pay for 20 percent of each drug sold in this “catastrophic phase.” But most Part D beneficiaries never reach the catastrophic phase. So this reform won’t do anything to lower their drug costs. In other words, the

government is the primary beneficiary of this new tax on drug makers. The Senate bill would raise taxes on pharmaceutical firms by \$100 billion. And as any Republican senator should know, raising taxes is bad for business. This is especially true for the drug industry, where developing just one new medicine costs an average of \$2.6 billion. The more money researchers have to fork over to Uncle Sam, the less they’ll have to spend on research. Price setting also makes it harder for patients to access new drugs. Consider that Americans had access to almost 90 percent of all new medicines released between 2011 and 2018.

Meanwhile, patients in the United Kingdom only had access to 59 percent of those drugs. Canadian patients had access to just 46 percent. Grassley’s plan may be a slightly better alternative to Pelosi’s. But watered-down socialism is still socialism and would be equally disastrous in the long run. Let’s hope Republicans come to their senses and drop this bill before it’s too late. Sally C. Pipes is president, CEO, and Thomas W. # Marine’s Best Friend Still Serves

**SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)** - Retirement did not signal an end of watch for US Marine bomb-detector dog Ingrid. For five years, the canine served the US Marines and reached the rank of Staff Sergeant. When her handler died in a 2014 Afghanistan car bombing, Ingrid suffered deep scrap-metal wounds. On recovery, she was re-trained for a new life in service.

The German shepherd is now companion to fellow Marine Kelly Park (54) of Sutter, CA. Both Purple Heart warriors drew admiring glances at Sacramento Veterans Hospital last week. When the thirsty dog snagged a water bottle, removed its top, poured and slurped from a gutter, a

bystander exclaimed that surely no smarter dog ever drew breath.

“She’s smart and she’s sensitive,” agreed her boss. “If I drop something, Ingrid brings it back to my wheelchair. She senses when I’m going to have a seizure, before even I know. She puts her paws and head on my chest and warns me to brace myself. She’s playful as a baby but when her jacket (with official Marine insignia) is on her, she knows she’s on duty.”

Separate tragedies united hero and heroine. On his 19th tour of duty, Chief Warrant Officer Third Class Park and comrades were ambushed during a house-to-house search in Iraq. Park pushed his captain and a

radio operator from a grenade. Its explosion destroyed his left leg and caused a concussion that still brings seizures. At 49, the Marine came home with a Purple Heart, a Navy Cross, a Bronze Star and with one leg gone.

Bred in Virginia, Ingrid was selected for bomb detection as a puppy. By her sixth year, she had served the 4th Marine Pacific Fleet and earned a campaign medal.

She and her unit also shared a Presidential Citation. After injury and retirement, the Wounded Warrior Project re-trained her to detect seizures in veterans. “My neurologist recommended me for a service dog,” recalls Park. “When I first saw Ingrid’s red coat, I thought she was a big fox. She bounded right up to me and we bonded instantly. I’d had dogs before but none like her. We’re together 24-7.”

The veteran once suffered a seizure and fell from his chair in the street. His companion howled for help but wouldn’t let anyone touch him. “The Sheriff showed up and she recognized his uniform and trusted him,” says Park. “If I’m seeing my doctor, she sniffs out his surgery; then she sits down and gives me a look to say it’s okay. Anytime the doctor touches me, she watches him like crazy.”

Ever loyal, ever dutiful, Ingrid nevertheless has time for fun. “She learned to play soccer in the Marines,” explains Park. “She’s a terrific goalie. I live by a school and the kids come every afternoon and ask if she can play soccer with them. They love her and she loves them. But she’ll only take food from me. I’m the only one she trusts. My life isn’t easy but Ingrid makes it better. I’d built a wall around myself, but with her in my life, I’ve opened up to people again. Without Ingrid, I wouldn’t want to be here.”
