# RCPD Receives Traffic Education and Enforcement Grant

## RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG)

- The Rancho Cordova Police Department was awarded a \$55,000 grant by the Office of Traffic Safety (OTS) for a year-long traffic safety education and

enforcement program. In addition, the Rancho Cordova Police Department and Mercy San Juan Medical Center are once again joining forces to provide child safety seat, bicycle and pedestrian education to our community.

"The Rancho Cordova Police Department is stop sign enforcement;

proud to partner with the Safety to proactively provide traffic safety outreach and education in the City of Rancho Cordova," said Rancho Cordova Assistant Police Chief Jeff Schelldorf. "We look forward to partnering with our residents to keep our community safe on our roadways."

The grant will support various education and enforcement activities for the 2020 federal fiscal year (Oct. 1, 2019 to Sept. 30, 2020):

Driving under the influence (DUI) checkpoints and saturation patrols take alcohol and drug-impaired drivers, as well as those driving without a license or a revoked or suspended license, off the road;

Patrols targeting violations of California's hands-free cell phone law and vehicle code violations by drivers, motorcyclists, bicyclists and pedestrians that put other roadway users at risk:

Speeding, red light and

Checking for seat belt California Office of Traffic and child safety seat compliance;

> Conduct child safety seat checkups to promote correct usage at community locations;

> Traffic safety education presentations for youth and community members on distracted, impaired and teen driving, and bicycle and pedestrian safety;

Compilation of DUI "Hot Sheets" identifying repeat DUI offenders;

Specialized DUI and drugged driving training to identify and apprehend suspected impaired drivers;

"Getting in a vehicle remains one of the most dangerous things we do," said OTS Director Barbara Rooney. "We must continue to work with our partners in law enforcement to shift that realization and make traveling on our roads safer."

Funding for this program was provided by a grant from the California Office of Traffic Safety, through the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration.

# **Adoption Event Shares Joy**, **But More Youth Need Families**

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Sacramento Superior Court and Sacramento County collaborated to host a National Adoption Day event at the William R. Ridgeway Family Relations Courthouse on Saturday, Nov. 23, 2019. By the end of this special day, 54 children from foster care finalized their adoptions into 42 families - each finding their forever home.

"This has been a joyous event for every child and family. However, right now, roughly 350 foster children still need forever homes," said, Michelle Callejas, director of the Sacramento County Department of Child, Family and Adult Services. "This day is a great reminder to community members that they can become a resource or adoptive parent and open their homes and hearts to foster youth in need."

On the day of the event, the courthouse, normally serious, instead buzzed with excitement and jubilation of children excited to embrace their new families. Suzzanne Goldwire, a Resource Parent many times, who after fostering Jessi and Tianna for 10 months, celebrated at the Adoption Day event with hugs and poignant tears as she took the final step to welcome Jessi and Tianna into their forever family with the rest of her family and grandchildren present in support.

"Today is the day I adopted Tianna and Jessi. I've been fostering them for 10 months... and now we just made it official and they fit right in with my nine grandkids. It's important that the kids know that they can be loved even though they are not your biological child," said Suzzanne. When asked about the upcoming holidays, Suzzanne said, "I'm excited about expanding the family and having everybody get together... this Thanksgiving will be extra special because I've added two kids to our family - and now they are official with us - I'm thankful for that."

At the event when asked about the process to foster/adopt, Suzzanne shared that the process was easy and the agency will walk people through the process. Data shows that outcomes for foster youth improve greatly with the permanency of a family.

# **New NASA Hubble Exhibit Launches** at the Aerospace Museum

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - The air is cool and still. Lights from illuminated panels give off an unearthly glow as the soft whine of computers suspend the passing of time. Hushed voices can be heard discussing stardust and light waves and the edge of charted space. Have you stumbled upon a secret governmental lab? A starship pulled from science-fiction? No, you're at the Aerospace Museum of California, in the midst of the official NASA Hubble Space Telescope Traveling Exhibit!

Blast off to the Aerospace Museum this holiday season and be a part of history as the NASA Hubble Space Telescope Traveling Exhibit debuts for the first time in California! Experience the magnificence and mystery of the Hubble Space Telescope and its unique mission through interactive stations, guided tours and engaging activities for explorers of all ages! Visitors are invited to explore the vast reaches of space through Hubble's iconic images, learn the history and purpose of this technological marvel in a space station environment, and look to the future of space exploration with the James Webb Telescope.

The Exhibit features a 1:15 scale model of the Hubble Space Telescope, a real-time GeoSphere that displays earthly phenomena and a collection of tools that have actually flown into space to serve one of five servicing missions Hubble has required since its launch in 1990. Visitors will experience a deeper appreciation for Hubble's mission and a sense of child-like wonder at the sheer size

The Inspector General ensures the integrity of the citizen complaint process and the thoroughness and fairness of related Sheriff's Department investigations, while fostering positive relations with the community. The Inspector General works independently on items detailed in the scope of services. In addition, the Inspector General may investigate other non-personnel matters as requested by the County



Evenson is an experienced police executive with 32 years of law enforcement experience. Of those years, 20 were in middle and senior management levels, and 10 years were as Chief of Police for the City of Brentwood.

Additionally, Evenson has extensive experience as an Internal Affairs investigator, a commander and has demonstrated leadership success in police accountability, citizen complaint investigations and community/police relations.

The Office of the Inspector General is a contract position. A start date for the Inspector General will be announced when contract negotiations are complete and there is a signed contract.



# The Senate's New Drug Bill is Socialism Lite



Commentary by Sally C. Pipes

House Speaker Nancy Pelosi has a radical new plan to let the federal government set drug prices.

Republicans are holding up Senator Chuck Grassley's Prescription Drug Pricing Reduction Act as a more moderate

That's a mistake. While Grassley's bill isn't as radical as the Pelosi's, it includes similarly dangerous reforms. Neither bill would do much to save patients money. And both would make it harder for Americans to access new drugs.

Pelosi's bill empowers government officials to set prices for a variety of drugs. The bill instructs the Secretary of Health and Human Services to "negotiate" the prices of up to 250 medicines.

These negotiations would hardly be fair. The bill caps the negotiated prices at 120 percent of the average price paid for these drugs in six other countries. Any

negotiate would have to pay the government 65 percent of last year's sales for the drug in question.

Grassley's bill also contains its fair share of government price setting. Like the section that prohibits drug companies from raising Medicare prices faster than the rate of inflation. Firms that raise prices too quickly would have to pay a rebate to the government, equal to the difference between the old and new prices.

Like all price setting, this so-called "inflation penalty" would prohibit drug companies from setting market prices. But that won't lower costs for patients. Over time, companies will begin



SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - Retirement did not signal an end of watch for US Marine bomb-detector dog Ingrid. For five years, the canine served the US Marines and reached the rank of Staff Sergeant. When her handler even I know. She puts died in a 2014 Afghanistan car bombing, Ingrid suffered my chest and warns deep scrap-metal wounds. On me to brace myself. recovery, she was re-trained for a new life in service.

The German shepherd is now companion to fellow Marine Kelly Park (54) of Sutter, CA. Both Purple Heart warriors drew admiring glances at Sacramento Veterans Hospital last week. When the thirsty dog snagged a water bottle, removed its top, poured

bystander exclaimed that surely no smarter dog ever drew breath.

"She's smart and she's sensitive," agreed her boss. "If I drop something, Ingrid brings it back to my wheelchair. She senses when I'm going to have a seizure, before her paws and head on She's playful as a baby but when her jacket (with official Marine insignia) is on her, she knows she's on duty."

Separate tragedies united hero and heroine. On his 19th tour of duty, Chief Warrant Officer Third Class Park and comrades were ambushed during a house-to-house search in Iraq.

I'd had dogs before but none like her. We're together 24-7."

Ever loyal, ever dutiful, Ingrid nevertheless has time for fun. "She learned to play soccer in the Marines," explains Park. "She's a terrific goalie. I live by a school and the kids come every afternoon and ask if she can play soccer with them. They love her and she loves them. But she'll only take food from me. I'm the only one she trusts. My life isn't easy but Ingrid makes it better. I'd built a wall around myself, but with her in my life, I've opened up to people again. Without Ingrid, I wouldn't want to be here."
