Food Locker Ribbon Cutting Coincides with Holiday Food Drive

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - Since its inception in 1987, the Cordova Community Food Locker has provided food for over 17 million meals for residents in our community. On November 8, 2019, the Food Locker officially commenced its holiday season food drive, along with a ribbon cutting, sponsored by the Rancho Cordova Chamber, for the launch of its new website. "We're going to have the ribbon cutting ceremony," Executive Director Walter Little said at the event, "and I would like all Very Important People to come on this side of the ribbon. If anybody remains standing on that (other) side, you don't understand how important you are, so get over here on this side while we take a picture."

The website, developed by Susan Dakuzaku, has a lifetime hosting license contributed by Beth Walter of McNellis Partners. At <https://www.ranhocordovafoodlocker.org>, the website allows donations to be made online and gives information about the Food Locker and its programs, patrons, and partners.

Sacramento County District 5 Supervisor Don Nottoli attended the event. "It is just tremendous that they continue to build on that really strong foundation of community service here in helping people put food on the table," Nottoli said. "The whole operation is a real credit to the community."

After the ribbon cutting, Mayor Robert McGarvey presented a check of \$10,000 on behalf of the City of Rancho Cordova, consisting

of \$5,000 each for food for the Thanksgiving and Christmas food distributions. The City previously this year provided a \$49,000 grant to the Food Locker from the Community Enhancement Fund for purchase of a commercial freezer, creation of the website, and other program operations and maintenance.

After that, a parade of enthusiastic donations followed: Catholic Charities, Diocese of Sacramento donated \$2,500; Franklin Templeton regional Rancho Cordova office \$2,500; River City Christian Church \$2,000; EMEC \$1,000; KP Market \$1,000; Father Dan Madigan \$1,000; Golden State Water \$1,000; Ross and Sandy Johnson \$1,000; Optimist Club of Rancho Cordova \$350.

In addition, Ron and Julie Belka - Roth Staffing Companies, will be

CA Trucking Assoc. Files Suit to Prevent Application of AB 5

California Trucking

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The California Trucking Association (CTA) and two California independent owner-operator truck drivers filed an amended complaint with the U.S. Southern District Court seeking declaratory and injunctive relief against the employment test set forth in the Dynamex Operations West, Inc. v. Superior Court (Dynamex) decision, which was subsequently codified by the California Legislature in the form of Assembly Bill 5 (AB 5). AB 5, (Lorena Gonzales, D - San Diego), was passed by the California Legislature and signed into law on September 11, 2019, by Governor Gavin Newsom.

"AB 5 threatens the livelihood of more than 70,000 independent truckers," said CTA's CEO, Shawn Yadon. "The bill wrongfully restricts their ability to provide services as owner-operators and, therefore, runs afoul of federal law."

In the suit, plaintiffs argue that the classification test in the Dynamex decision and codified by AB 5 is preempted by the supremacy and commerce clauses in the U.S. Constitution and is in direct conflict with the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Act (FMCSA) and the Federal Aviation Administration Authorization Act of 1994 (FAAAA).

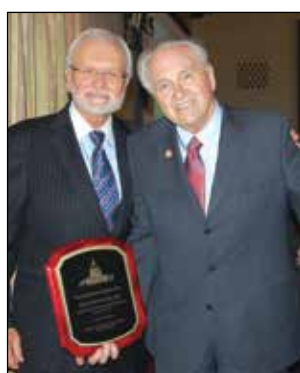
The new test denies a significant segment of the trucking industry the ability to continue operating as independent owner-operators in California, forcing them to abandon \$150,000 investments in clean trucks and the right to set their own schedule and become their own boss.

AB 5, rather than addressing the issue of employee misclassification for all California workers, replaced a long-standing multi-factor test for determining independent contractor status with a one-size-fits-all method, consisting of highly restrictive criteria, riddled with carve-outs and exemptions for specific businesses and industries. Under the new test, independent truckers will be forced to work as employees.

"AB 5 has implications that go beyond employment classification in California," said Robert R. Roginson, an attorney for CTA. "With more than 350,000 independent

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The Family Business Association of California, the

only organization advocating exclusively for California's thousands of family businesses, has named Sen. Jim Nielsen, R-Tehama, as its Outstanding Legislator for 2019.

He serves as Vice Chair of the Budget & Fiscal Review and Elections & Constitutional Amendments committees and is a member of the Governmental Organization, Governance & Finance and Veterans Affairs committees.

He has been recognized by numerous taxpayer and small business groups for his leadership on state budget issues and for his unrelenting fight against profligate government spending. He is also a leader in protecting and strengthening private property rights and for reforming state regulations and out-of-control spending.

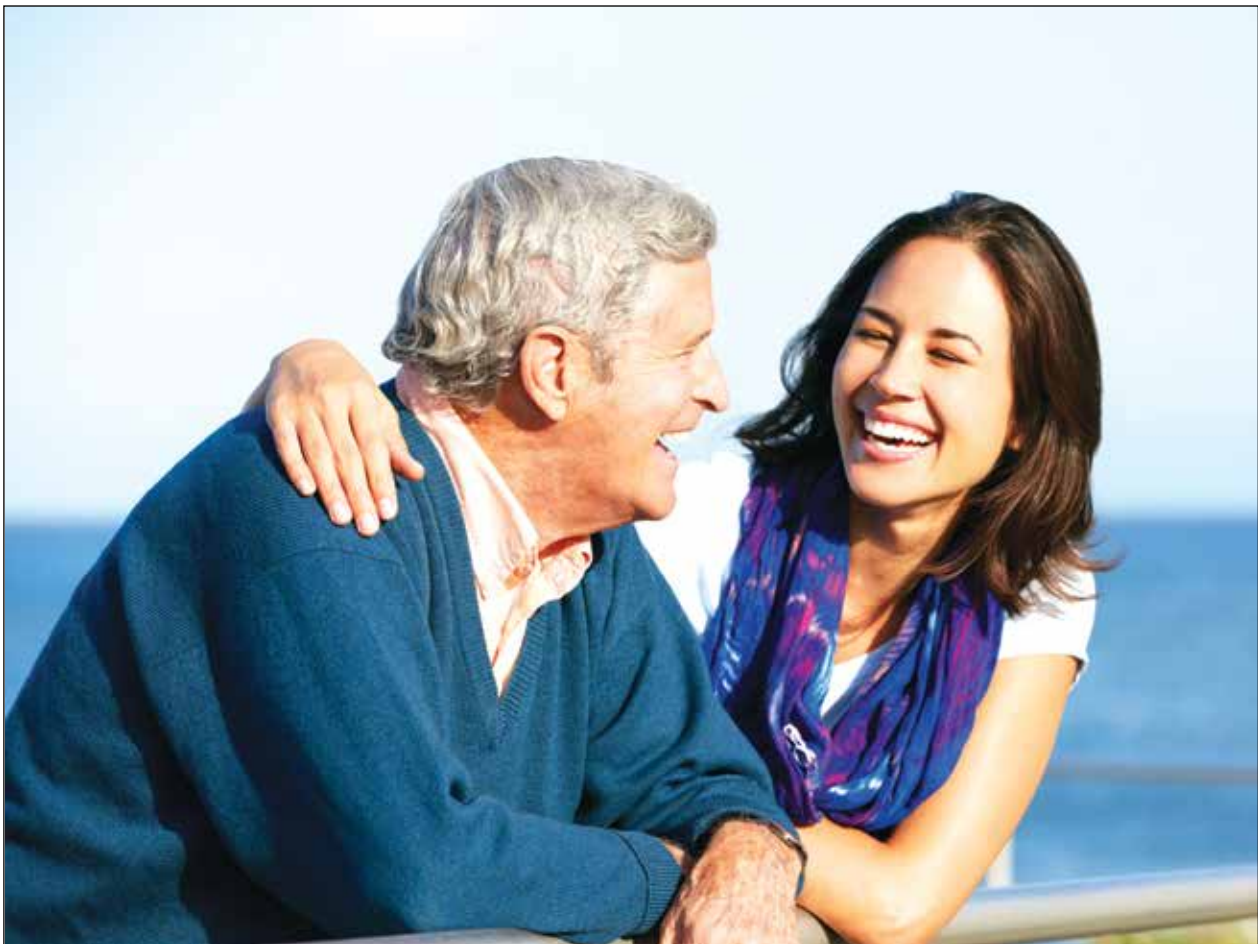
Caregiving Around the Clock

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - This season is all about being thankful, so it is only fitting that November is National Family Caregivers Month. Sacramento County Senior and Adult Services and the Caregiver Action Network would like to recognize, honor and thank those who provide care for someone who is aging, disabled or chronically ill. This year's theme is #BeCareCurious about your loved one's care to ensure they are happy and healthy. This theme is also an important reminder to be thoughtful of the caregivers and their personal health as this responsibility can be physically and psychologically stressful.

A family caregiver is anyone who helps take care of a family member or friend without any professional training. These caregivers want their loved ones to have the best care possible – at the doctor's office, at the hospital and at home.

"Family caregivers are instrumental to our society," said Ruth MacKenzie, Senior and Adult Services Division Manager for the Department of Child, Family and Adult Services. "They fill a gap in our medical system and National Family Caregiver Month is a great way to highlight everything caregivers do for their loved ones. This month, or anytime, thank a family caregiver, show

your appreciation as often as you can and step in to assist when possible."

Senior and Adult Services encourages family caregivers across the country to explore #BeCareCurious, ask questions, explore options and share in the care decisions that affect the health and well-being of their loved ones.

5 Things to #BeCareCurious About Your Loved One's Goals

You know your loved one better, and spend more time with them, than anyone else. Talk to them about what their goals are

for treatment and their care in general. It can be hard to talk about goals when facing a disease, but these talks help make sure your loved ones are getting the care they want.

Treatment Options

Is your loved one responding well to treatment? If not, ask your doctor if there are other options. New treatments are available every day. Whether it's a different dose, a new medication or a new procedure, speak up and ask your doctor if there are options you and your loved one should consider.

Research

The internet is a great research tool, but it can also be full of conflicting, and even dangerous, advice – so don't stop there! Be curious about that article you just read. Is it from a reliable source? Talk to friends, family and doctors to ask as many questions as possible to learn about your loved one's condition.

The Care Plan

If your loved one is in the hospital, be sure to ask what happens next. Will they need home care after being discharged? Are there new medications or

procedures you will need to manage at home? Will you be trained on what to do and how to do it? A lot of care happens at home and you need to be prepared to provide that care.

Coverage

Don't be shy about asking questions about insurance coverage. Is your parents' Medicare plan the best option or should you change plans during open enrollment? Was a medication switched for a medical reason, or because your insurance no longer covered it? If coverage was denied, what can you do

to change their minds?

If you or someone you know is a family caretaker, it is important to check-in with that person regularly as they have taken on a very stressful role. Senior and Adult Services suggests offering to provide "respite," so the caregiver can have a chance to rest and recharge. Caregiver.org offers helpful self-care tips for the caregiver.

"If family caretakers aren't able to take the time needed for self-care, they may experience a health scare themselves," said MacKenzie. "Caregiver burnout can be associated with serious health issues including depression. Families and communities need to develop sustainable care plans that do not just rely on a single individual."

Families can look for respite care by asking friends and family or looking at government-funded programs including the U.S. Administration on Aging's Eldercare Locator, the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs and Legacy Corps or nonprofits including but not limited to Alzheimer's Foundation of America. You can also check with adult daycare centers, faith-based organizations, coworkers and online communities.

owner-operators registered in the United States, the new test imposes an impermissible burden on interstate commerce under the U.S. Constitution's commerce clause and infringes upon decades-old congressional intent to prevent states from regulating the rates, routes and services of the trucking industry."

For decades in California,

more than 70,000 predominantly minority-owned truckers have built their businesses as independent owner-operators. These truckers have just recently invested hundreds of thousands of dollars in their vehicles to meet the nation's strictest air quality laws.
"Independent truckers are typically experienced drivers who have previously worked as employees and

have, by choice, struck out on their own. We should not deprive them of that choice. Some of the country's most successful trucking companies were started by entrepreneurial independent truckers," Yadon added. "We can protect workers from misclassification without infringing upon independent truckers' right to make a living in California." ★

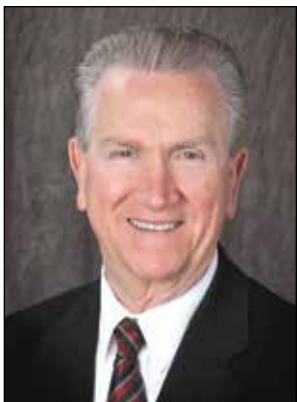

Elizabeth Warren's Fail on 'Medicare for All'

The clear loser of the Democratic primary is "Medicare for All."

First, it demonstrated the unreliability of Kamala Harris out of the gate, when she endorsed it before quickly backing off. Now, it has blunted the momentum of Elizabeth Warren, made a mockery of her claim to be an uber-wonk and shredded her implicit appeal to Bernie Sanders supporters as an equally committed left-winger without the baggage.

Under pressure for weeks for details related to her version of the proposal, Warren has now backed all the way down to promising to pass Medicare for All by the end of the third year of her presidency.

This is an implicit concession that she won't do it at all. No presidential candidate ever pledges to do something important in Year 3. That's when, if history is any guide, a president has suffered a midterm drubbing and lost all legislative momentum. Warren wants us to believe that this would be the opportune

time for her to pass perhaps the most sweepingly intrusive government measure in American history.

Warren's fundamental mistake was to believe, like almost all the Democrats early in the race, that she had to chase Bernie Sanders around the track, which inevitably involved backing his signature health care proposal. But it became immediately evident that it's one thing to promise to eliminate all private health insurance if you are a self-declared socialist; it's quite another if you imagine yourself anything short of that.

As soon as another erstwhile Bernie band-wagoner, Harris, uttered out loud that she'd end private health insurance, it created a controversy that she was clearly uncomfortable with. As a way to wiggle out of it, she came up with her own plan.

Warren lasted longer. Her undoing was that her resolute unwillingness to say that she'd raise middle-class taxes to pay for the program undermined her self-image as a woman with a "plan for that." She had to jerry-rig a financing program built on such outlandishly rosy assumptions about costs and revenues that even her journalistic cheerleaders have been skeptical. As she continued to take fire, Warren announced her "transition" plan, effectively saying the program is not a first-term priority.

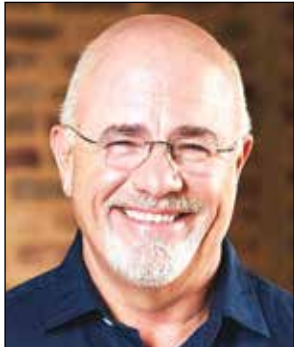
In so doing, she has managed to bring on herself the worst of both worlds. Democratic purists will be disappointed in her, and Sanders voters feel confirmed in any doubts they already had about her commitment.

It should have been foreseeable that proposing a ruinously expensive, enormously coercive health program would present political problems. Even Democratic primary voters aren't fully sold on a Medicare for All plan that eliminates all private insurance.

Sanders has gotten away with it because socialism is his brand and conviction. He hand-waves away questions on the specifics — what do they matter, when the revolution will make all things possible?

In contrast, Warren let the critics get into her head, just as she did over her purported Native American heritage, and stumbled into a messy, self-destructive response, just as she did with her DNA test last year. Democrats have to be wondering, over and above her struggles with Medicare for All, if this is really who they want to send up against the endlessly combative and needling Donald Trump next year.

I understand the joy that goes along with having a child. I have three kids, and we were absolutely ecstatic each and every time one was born. And, of course, we wanted good photos of them all. But right now, I think you're trying to rationalize a phone upgrade based on the emotion of a new baby. As an exercise of your value system, that's a tendency you need to break. This is a test, Jamie. What you're talking about here is a luxury, not a necessity. Rationalization is one of the prime causes of overspending.

Please understand, I'm not picking on you and I don't mean to be harsh. We've all flunked this test at times. But this is an

The Pilgrim's Failed Socialist Experiment

Few realize that New England's first form of government under the Pilgrims was communalism (socialism) where "each produced according to his ability and each received according to his needs," applied in practice more than two centuries before Karl Marx first penned the above quote. The result, "share the wealth," then and now was, and always will be, shared poverty.

William Bradford, Plymouth colony's governor its first 30 years, wrote of the agreement between the 102 Pilgrim Mayflower passengers and the financial "Adventurers" in his book Of Plymouth Plantation. He noted that the seven-year contract signed July

1, 1620, before leaving Plymouth England, stipulated that the Pilgrims were to pool, for common benefit, "all profits and benefits that are got by trade, traffic, trucking, working, fishing, or any other means of any person or persons..." It further noted "that at the end of the seven years, the capital and profits, viz. the houses, lands, goods and chattels, be equally divided betwixt the Adventurers and Planters..."

During this time the colonists were to "have their meat, drink, apparel, and all provisions out of the common stock and goods of the said colony." It doesn't get more socialistic than this because the government divvied out the goods and loafers received the same as those who worked.

The first two years the result was shortages and starvation. Half the colonists died. No one did more than the minimal because the incentive to excel was destroyed by the contract. The industrious were neutralized. Bradford wrote of the scarcity of food "no supply was heard of, neither knew they when they might expect any." The contract, Bradford added, "was found to breed much confusion

and discontent and retard much employment that would have been to the benefit and comfort. For the young men, that were most able and fit for labour and service, did repine that they should spend their time and strength to work for other men's wives and children without any recompense..."

In other words, socialism made strong men lazy. Bradford spoke of another problem because of the government created famine—thievery. Even in this Christian community, "much was stolen both by night and day..." to alleviate the prevailing condition of hunger.

The "feast" of the first Thanksgiving did fill their bellies briefly, and they were grateful, but abundance was anything but common. Harvests were not bountiful in that year nor the next. Why did this happen? Because they had fallen victim to the socialistic philosophy of "share the wealth." This disincentivized the productive base of society.

After two years of such, with the survival of the colony at stake, they contemplated upon "how they

might raise as much corn as they could, and obtain a better crop than they had done, that they might not still thus languish in misery." They opted to abandon the incentive killing socialist contract in favor of the free market. And so they "assigned to every family a parcel of land, according to the proportion of their number, for that end..."

The effects were almost immediate. A delighted Governor Bradford wrote: "This had very good success, for it made all hands very industrious, so as much more corn was planted than otherwise would have been by any means the Governor ... could use, and saved him a great deal of trouble, and gave far better content. The women now went willingly into the field, and took their little ones with them to set corn; which before would allege weakness and inability; whom to have compelled would have been thought great tyranny and oppression."

Then suddenly, as though a night changed to day, the crop of 1623 was bounteous, and those thereafter as well, and it had nothing to do with the weather. Bradford wrote, "Instead of

famine now God gave them plenty and the face of things was changed, to the rejoicing of the hearts of many, for which they blessed God." He concluded later, "any general want or famine hath not been amongst them since to this day."

One variable alone made the difference and ended the three-year famine. They abandoned the notion of government (or corporation) owning the means of production and distribution in favor of the individual having property and being responsible to take care of himself. Before, no one benefited by working because he received the same compensation as those who did not. After the change everyone kept the benefits of his labor. Those who chose not to work basically chose also to be poor and the government (corporation) no longer confiscated from those who produced to give to those who did not.

In other words, the free market (capitalism) is a much greater stimulus than governmental force. The Pilgrims now wished to work because they got to keep the benefits of their labor.

Secure property rights are the key to prosperity for all who wish to work. When this right is threatened by confiscatory taxation or outright confiscation of property, or by excessive government rules and regulations governing such, whether planned as in a contract enforced by the government at Plymouth, or gradual as in our day, work and production slow and can eventually stop. The answer for them was to extract socialism immediately from their midst, as it is for us today as well. May we have the wisdom to do so?

donating 1,500 turkeys, equivalent to \$15,000. "Their turkey drive is a big thing for us," said Ross Johnson, who serves on the Cordova Community Food Locker Board.

Sean Twilla, Water Distribution Superintendent, pledged 200 turkeys for Golden State Water, equivalent to \$2,000, besides their \$1,000 dollar monetary donation.

The donation goal is \$50,000 for this holiday season, enough to provide Thanksgiving and Christmas meals for 2,000 families, an estimated

8,000-10,000 people. To date, \$26,000 has been raised. Donations can be made and information obtained online at the new website or in person at the CCFL, 10497 Coloma Rd., Rancho Cordova, next to St. John Vianney Catholic Church.

In the 1980s when Coloma Road was called church row because of the abundance of churches there, the Rev. Walter Little sat down with church leaders and asked, "What is it that you need that we can provide?" The food locker came up at that time, though Little said his idea of a food locker was

New Management Announced for Gibson Ranch

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Gibson Ranch Regional Park is getting a new management team. This park has been managed by GRP 2011, LLC since April 2011, and, effective Sunday, Dec. 1, 2019, the Sacramento County Department of Regional Parks will take over management.

"When Regional Parks acquired this property in 1962, the goal was to retain the atmosphere of the ranch," said Liz Bellas, Director of Regional Parks. "We are excited to continue working toward this goal, while also providing a large-scale regional park and offering facilities and unique recreational experiences not generally available in local or neighborhood parks."

Gibson Ranch Regional Park is a 355-acre park that has an equestrian center and includes roughly 100 acres of pasture, a multi-use field and five miles of equestrian trails. Within the central core of Gibson Ranch are a Ranch House suitable for weddings and other gatherings; large stable and barn; numerous storage barns; paddocks; corrals; a horse arena and cabins, which can be used as overnight facilities for camp programs or other events. The park also contains group and family picnic facilities, restrooms and a large fishing lake.

In preparing for this management transition, Regional Parks has opened four full-time positions and awarded Trail Brothers, LLC a five (5) year contract for equestrian services.

Trail Brothers, LLC will operate and provide horse trail riding, lessons, training, and horse boarding services, at reasonable rates, to enhance park visitors' recreational and educational experiences at Gibson Ranch Regional Park.

Regional Parks will be hosting a community volunteer event at Gibson Ranch on Sunday, Dec. 8, from 9 a.m. – Noon. The public is welcome to join Parks staff as we complete some volunteer projects around the park.

The history of Gibson Ranch goes back to the early 1800s when the area now known as Rio Linda was part of Rancho Del Paso Mexican Land Grant. At that time and in later years, the area began to be homesteaded by a few families and was called Dry Creek. Originally, the ranch was homesteaded by the Wood family who built a home there in the 1870s. The land passed through several owners until the 1950s when approximately 1,700 acres were owned by the R.H. Gibson family. The County of Sacramento purchased a portion of the property in 1962 from the Valley Investment Company and created Gibson Ranch Regional Park. Subsequent land acquisitions in the 1970's and beyond brought the total acreage of the park to 355 acres.

The vehicle entrance fee for Gibson Ranch Regional Park, and all other County Parks, is \$5. Regional Parks Annual Pass holders receive free daily entry. For more information on parks passes, visit the Regional Parks website. ★
