RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - The City of Rancho Cordova is making great progress toward its goal of developing a civic amenity for our community. Recently, city staff updated the City Council on the status of the Civic Center project, now known as the Mills Station District project.

As you might recall, the City Council has held four public work sessions with residents, businesses and interested parties to refine the vision for the project, select a location, and review various site layouts. The site selected for the project is the Mills Station Property, which is a city-owned 10-acre parcel located on Folsom Blvd. adjacent to Folsom Lake College/Rancho Cordova Center and across the street from the Mills Station Arts & Culture Center (The MACC). The City Council, after much public input and discussion, has prioritized the potential uses for this project to a space for performing/ visual arts, a recreational and

housing space, a space to accommodate meetings, and an outdoor area for community gatherings.

With the location and a more focused vision for the project determined, the city next turned to the task of seeking a public-private partnership to develop the project. In July 2019, the city issued an Offering Memorandum (OM) to seek development partners and, in late September, received eight letters of interest from teams made up of local, statewide and national organizations. Now, city staff will convene an evaluation committee with representatives from numerous local and regional organizations to review the letters of interest and narrow the the December 2019 or pool of potential development partners to three. The three will be asked to present at a December 2019 or January 2020 City Council meeting or work session. Based on the presentations, these potential development partners may be asked to date.

California State **Parks Thanks** Military, Providing Free Admission at **State Parks**

California State Parks Press Release

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - California State Parks is honoring the service of veterans, as well as active and reserve personnel, by offering free admission to 144 state parks on Veterans Day, Monday, November 11.

"We invite our veterans and active/reserve military personnel to wear their uniforms with pride while visiting one of our beautiful parks," said California State Parks Director Lisa Mangat. "We thank them for their service and sacrifices to our country. This is a small gesture of our gratitude and appreciation."

A valid military ID must be presented to park staff in order to receive free admission to the California State Railroad Museum (Sacramento), Railtown 1897 State Historic Park (Jamestown), eight state vehicular recreation areas and 134 state parks accessible with the "California Explorer" Annual Pass. A list of participating park units is available at www.parks. ca.gov/VeteransDay2019.

Participating parks include sites that honor historic military sites or veterans from the Mexican American War to the Cold

AB 150 (Olsen), signed by Governor Edmund G. Brown, Jr. in 2013, authorized California State Parks to offer veterans, active duty, and reserve military personnel from the United States Armed Forces and the National Guard of any state a reduced or free-day use at participating state parks.

California's 280 state parks and the recreational programs supported by the department are a gateway to the well-being of environments, economies and all people. They offer the opportunity for families, friends and communities to connect through various recreational opportunities such as off-highway motor vehicle recreation, boating activities, horseback riding, on and off-road cycling, hiking, camping, rock climbing, tours, school group enrichment and special events.

Before leaving for a park, find out if any roads, trails and/or campgrounds are closed by visiting the park's webpage or the park's social media accounts. Check your destination's and route's weather conditions and prepare accordingly. And remember, safely share the road. Be prepared for equestrians, pedestrians, joggers, wildlife, rocks, tree limbs, etc., in the roadway.






A little baby girl came dressed as a butterfly for Halloween at Hagan Community. Photo by Rick Sloan

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

Changes to Plan F... Causing Medicare **Supplement Renewal Premiums to Rise!**



Toni,

We have received a 20% increase in our Plan F Medicare Supplement. I'm a 70-year-old female in decent health, but my husband is undergoing cancer treatment. Also, his cardiologist has advised him that he may need a pacemaker.

I've understand told that Medicare Annual Enrollment is our time to change our Medicare Supplement plans. I'm concerned that with the Medicare Supplement increase that we may not be able to afford the premiums with future increases. Would a Medicare Advantage plan be a good option to change to with Fred's cancer issues? What we should do? Signed Cathy from Virginia

Cathy, you were given wrong information because you do not have Annual Supplement change. You can change your Medicare Supplement any time during the year. Medicare Annual Enrollment is a time to change your Medicare Advantage plan or Medicare Part D Prescription Drug plan You are not alone with receiving a Medicare Supplement

plan F increase. It seems that the Plan F renewal increase is more than the Plan G or other Medicare Supplement plan increases. Most insurance agents are finding out about the increases via an email from the insurance company informing of a renewal rate adjustment,

In 2015 Congress passed legislation called "Medicare Access and CHIP Reauthorization Act of 2015" (MACRA) to help the medical industry by correcting the "Doc Fix" proposal. MACRA also made changes to Medicare Supplement's plans F and C which begins January 1,

Those who want to change their current Medicare Supplement plan and have had their Medicare Part B longer than 6 months must now answer underwriting questions regarding their health as you and your husband will have to do.

Cathy, you have an option to change from Plan F to other Medicare Supplement plans such as plan G or N, but you must qualify medito wait until Medicare cally. If you cannot qualify Enrollment because of a health issue, to make a Medicare then there is a Medicare Advantage plan which puts you in control of your healthcare called a Medicare Savings Account (MSA).

Let's discuss the difference:

• Medicare Supplement Plan G: offer lower rates and the same Medicare the Medicare Part B deductible is not covered tonisays.com.

and will be paid for by the enrolled Medicare beneficiary. Part B deductible for 2019 is \$185.

- Medicare Supplement Plan N: generally, has lower premiums than Plan G with generally more out of pocket. There is a \$20 co pay for a doctor visit with \$50 co pay for emergency room. Part B deductible is not covered, and Part B excess charges are not paid for by the insurance company which Plan G includes.
- Medicare Advantage MSA (Medicare Savings Account): high deductible Medicare Advantage health plan plus a special savings account for medical expenses. No network...see any Medicare provider or facility that will bill the MSA plan. More MSA (Medicare Savings Account) plan information in next week's article)

Caution: You can change your Medicare Supplement policy at any time. 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

Sentenced for Insurance Fraud, Accessory After the Fact

DATE: October 29, 2019 CASE: Jose Leyva & Leticia Leyva (Case #19FE004862)

PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Suzanne Salazar, Insurance Fraud Unit

The Honorable Michael Savage sentenced Jose Leyva to 90 days and Leticia Leyva to 60 days in county jail. Both defendants were ordered to pay \$9,277 in restitution. On October 16, 2019, Jose Leyva pled to felony insurance fraud and Leticia Leyva pled to

misdemeanor accessory after the fact. Jose Leyva and his wife, Leticia Leyva, owned a car, which was being driven by their adult son. Their son was driving the car in the middle of the night when he crossed over into the opposite traffic and hit a car head on. The collision caused serious bodily injury to the son's passenger and the other driver as well as damage to both vehicles. Immediately following the crash, the son fled the scene on foot. Soon after, he called and spoke to his father twice. When dispatch contacted Mr. and Mrs. Leyva to inquire about the vehicle, they claimed the car had been stolen. They also insisted that their son was home asleep. The facts showed Mr. Leyva's cellphone was tracked from his residence in Sacramento to the area of the collision in Woodland. Mr. and Mrs. Leyva then attempted to file a stolen vehicle report with law enforcement and continued to insist the car was stolen to their insurance company.

Defendant Convicted of Shooting, Murdering Partygoer

DATE: October 23, 2019 CASE: Dayshawn Jackson (Case #18FE007348)

PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Laura West, Gangs & Hate

Crimes Unit Dayshawn Jackson was convicted by a jury of the second-degree murder firing from the car.

A few minutes past midnight on August 27, 2017, Dayshawn Jackson was inside the car he was driving when he fired a gun multiple times at people outside of a party that was taking place. The victim was struck in the torso and killed as he stood in front of the party talking with friends.

The court found that Jackson had previously been convicted of a strike, first-degree residential burglary. Jackson faces a maximum sentence of 55 years to life in prison. Sentencing is set for December 13, 2019, at 9:00 a.m. in Department 24 before the Honorable Shelleyanne Chang.

Defendant Convicted of Murdering Girlfriend at Hotel

DATE: October 17, 2019 CASE: Lucas Sanchez (Case #17FE016812)

PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Allison Dunham, Homicide

On October 4, 2019, Lucas Sanchez was convicted by a jury of the firstdegree murder of Jennifer Rutter. The jury also found that Sanchez personally used a deadly or dangerous weapon in the commission of the murder. Sanchez entered a plea of not guilty by reason of insanity. On October 16, 2019, the jury found Sanchez was legally sane when he committed the murder.

Sanchez and the victim were in a relationship. On the morning of September 11, 2017, Sanchez and the victim were sleeping at a local hotel. Sanchez woke up paranoid and delusional from using methamphetamine. He took a closet rod out of the closet and beat the victim in the head as she slept. The victim fled out of the hotel room naked and bleeding. Sanchez proceeded to beat her in the head with the closet rod in the hotel hallway. A public safety conference was taking place at the hotel that morning. Law enforcement officers arrested Sanchez on the scene. An autopsy determined the victim died from seven to 10 blunt force blows to her head causing multiple facial and skull fractures.

Sanchez faces a maximum sentence of 26 years to life in prison. Sentencing is set for November 14, 2019, in Department 20 before the Honorable Michael Sweet.

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California Can't Keep the Lights On

California is staying true to its reputation as the land of innovation — it is making blackouts, heretofore the signature of impoverished and war-torn lands, a routine feature of 21st-century American life.

More than 2 million people are going without power in Northern and Central California, in the latest and biggest of the intentional blackouts that are, astonishingly, California's best answer to the risk of runaway wildfires.

Power — and all the goods it makes possible — is synonymous with modern civilization. It shouldn't be a negotiable for anyone living in a well-functioning society, or even in California, which, despite its stupendous wealth and natural splendor, has blighted itself over the decades with misgovernance and misplaced priorities.

The same California that has been the seedbed of world-famous companies that make it possible for people to send widely

The same California that has boldly committed to transitioning to 50 percent renewable energy by 2025 — and 100 percent renewable energy by 2045 can't manage its existing energy infrastructure.

overpriced electricity. California could have, if it wanted, pushed the utilities to focus on the resilience and safety of its current infrastructure — implicated in some of the state's most fearsome recent fires — as a top priority. Instead, its public utilities commission forced costly renewable energy initiatives on the utilities. Who cares about something as mundane as properly maintained power lines if something as supposedly epically important — and politically fashionable as saving the planet is at

Meanwhile, California has had a decadeslong aversion to properly clearing forests. The state's leaders have long been in thrall to the belief that cutting down trees is somehow an offense

viewed short missives of against nature, even though thinning helps create healthier forests. Biomass has been allowed to build up, and it becomes the kindling for catastrophic fires.

As Chuck DeVore of the Texas Public Policy Foundation points out, a report of the Western Governors' Association warned of this effect more


than a decade ago, noting that "over time the fireprone forests that were not thinned, burn in uncharacteristically destructive wildfires."

In 2016, then-Gov. Jerry Brown actually vetoed a bill that unanimously passed the state Legislature to promote the clearing of trees dangerously close to power lines. There shouldn't be any doubt that California, susceptible to drought through its history and whipped by fierce, dry winds this time of year, is always going to have a fire problem. But there also shouldn't be any doubt that dealing with it this poorly is the result of a series of foolish, unrealistic policy choices.

California's overriding goal should have been safe, cheap and reliable power, public good so basic that it's easy to take for granted. The state's focus on ideological fantasies has instead ensured it has none of the

Also, if the bank you're considering doesn't have a name-brand you recognize, find out the amount of its deposits.



Constitutional instructions for impeaching a president of the United States are very specific. Actually, reading the Constitution should easily put to rest the proposed impeachment of President Donald J. Trump. His enemies obviously have not

Impeachment means tried by the U.S. Senate for "treason, bribery, or other high crimes and misdemeanors," whether found guilty and removed or acquitted and remain in office. It begins in the House of Representatives who formulate the alleged charges then passes to the Senate for trial.

> For Bill Clinton the "crime" was "high crimes and misdemeanors." Lancers Season Ends with Heartbreaking Loss Versus Valley

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - With slightly more than three minutes remaining and nursing a five-point lead in their season finale versus Valley this past Friday, the Cordova Lancers' varsity football team was in position to end their season on a high note in front of their home crowd inside Lancers Stadium.

But in what seemed to be a microcosm of their season, the ball just didn't bounce their way as the Lancers fell 14-12 after a late collapse.

Following a fumble recovery by Lancers' senior running back/defensive lineman Kenny Brown, Cordova had the ball on the Vikings' 14-yard line with a chance to put the game out of reach. On third-and-nine from the eight yard-line however, a bad snap was recovered by Valley, giving the Vikings (4-6 overall, 3-1 Greater Sacramento League) hope with under two minutes to go. That was all they needed.

Nine plays later, Vikings' senior quarterback Isaiah Tongson lofted a screen pass to junior tailback Will Mapp, who sprinted into the endzone from 19 yards out. The extra point was the icing on the cake, as Cordova would not be able to counter with just 26.8 seconds left.

Following the game, Cordova head coach Jason Bumbaca spoke of the tough loss, and what ultimately was a tough season in his first year at the helm as the Lancers finished 1-9 overall, including a 1-3 record in the Greater Sacramento League.

"It's tough," Bumbaca said. "As a coach you don't want to have the record we do, but sometimes that happens. The ball bounces the wrong way. Nobody knows what goes on inside this program except for us, and we know what went on. The seniors are great guys, I love them, and they put the work in. A lot of

them are going to be able to go play at the next level.'

One of those seniors, senior all-purpose threat Brandon Gray, stole the show on Senior Night for the Lancers with a stellar second half performance. Gray entered the game at quarterback for senior quarterback Joey Estrada to start the second half after a scoreless first two quarters of play, and provided his team with both its scores in the fourth quarter. Gray would keep it himself from two yards out early in the quarter to score the first touchdown of the contest, and would follow that up with an 80-yard kick return following an ensuing Valley touchdown that gave the Vikings a 7-6 lead. Gray would put Cordova ahead briefly before the late score by Valley to end the game.

Gray finished the game with 13 carries for 112 yards and a touchdown on the ground, and tallied 32 yards passing on two completions to go along with the 80-yard kick return in a valiant effort that drew the praise of his coach.

"The young man is a dynamic player," Bumbaca said of Gray. "He's been our top athlete all year. The young man can do whatever he wants on the field. He's a wide receiver by trade, but he's just an all-around athlete."

After winning the Greater Sacramento League title and earning a postseason berth a year ago, the Lancers find themselves outside of the playoffs this season in what has been a learning year for coach and player alike. Even so, Bumbaca couldn't help but gush about his teams' effort this year.

"I told them I was proud of them," Bumbaca said of his message to the team following the game. "I'm proud of how far we've come, not only on the field but in the classroom. They've done a good job on campus of trying to be good student athletes. That's the ultimate goal."

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - The Monday night meeting of the Rancho Cordova City Council included presentations, public comment, some serious staff reports and tough topics.

The Community Enhancement Fund awarded monies to checks to the Mather Wrestling Club, Rancho Cordova HART (Homeless Assistance Resource Team), the FCUSD for musical instruments, the Sierra Service Project and PRO Youth and Families.

"The Mather Wrestling Club is a youth sports and fitness club providing an outlet for

youth (girls and boys) between assist the homeless community. the ages 8 to 14. The club will offer the benefits of exercise in a controlled positive and fun environment during the summer months," according to founder Coach Joe Zilles.

Rancho Cordova HART defines itself as, "a group of congregations, businesses and individuals who care about those in Rancho Cordova who are currently without a home. Together we aim to be a resource for the homeless and ultimately to end homelessness in Rancho Cordova." The completely volunteer staff offer mentoring, storm season shelter assistance and other services to address and
