Remembering Calvin in the White Rock Community

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - This month Cordova Recreation & Park District (CRPD) added a significant item of remembrance and meaning to White Rock Community Park: a memorial bench dedicated to Calvin James Augusta who passed away in August of 2018. A leading wide receiver for the Cordova High School Lancers and varsity basketball national scoring leader, Calvin's impact on his community went beyond athletics. He was friends with everyone, smart, charismatic and vital to the Mentees at Cordova High program (M.A.C.H.).

Calvin's mother Sharea Thomas reached out to the District in May to propose this memorial bench project to honor Calvin's life. When he passed away, Sharea said she cremated her son, not knowing how important it would be for the community to have a place to sit and talk to him. When the community asked for a space to be with him, she began working with CRPD's Park

Planning & Development team to provide this safe space for the community to grieve.

In June, at the Regular Meeting of CRPD's Board of Directors, over 40 community members including Calvin's family, friends and mentors, flooded the Council Chambers to express their need for this bench, reflecting a fierce commitment to their mission to bring awareness to mental health and suicide prevention.

Sharea was the first to step up to the podium, showcasing her son's role in his community. "He passed away by means of suicide August 14th, 2018, four days before his 18th birthday," Sharea said. "He was a pillar to his community, a pillar to his friends and a pillar to his school, a Cordova High alumnus, a two-sport athlete... He did everything for everybody, and he was everything to everybody," Sharea said. "This bench will be so much more than a bench. It will be a safe place for the community to grieve and a place of awareness for mental health and suicide prevention. This bench will speak volumes beyond

providing counselors, suicide hotlines and other resources," Sharea said.

Director of the M.A.C.H. program, Conrade Mayer, brought a group of young men to the podium to speak on what Calvin meant to them. During this process, he mentioned these boys would be an ally to the District, especially White Rock Community Park, the home of Calvin's memorial bench. "The bench will be sparkling clean, the area will remain clear of trash, and nothing will be allowed to happen to it because these boys won't allow it," Conrade said.

M.A.C.H., a mentoring program for at risk and underperforming high school students in Rancho Cordova, strives to empower youth to make choices that enable students to maximize their potential. These young men and women focus on academic improvement and community service, including mentoring younger students, clean-up days, volunteering and more. Many of the boys who spoke are, or were, part of this program and grew up with Calvin as a brotherly figure.

County Offers Alcohol, Drug Treatment Expansion

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Sacramento County Health Services received approval from the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services on their submission for the Drug Medi-Cal Organized Delivery System Waiver. This accomplishment is a massive overhaul that will expand treatment of substance use disorders for Sacramento County residents. The waiver is effective June 28, 2019, through June 30, 2021.

The Drug Medi-Cal Organized Delivery System Waiver is part of a statewide initiative that offers counties the opportunity to expand access to high-quality care and increase alcohol and drug treatment services. Before the waiver, Medi-Cal patients suffering from substance use/abuse had a small selection of addiction treatment services and did not have an organized system to help them find quality care.

Under the approved waiver, Sacramento County Alcohol and Drug Services can provide a broader range of services, while also having additional resources to coordinate and manage those services, monitor the quality of care and provide more affordable rates. Services will be offered to Sacramento County Medi-Cal beneficiaries, both adults and youth.

"The approval of this waiver is huge for Sacramento County, with the new services, we can treat more patients than ever before," said Sacramento County Alcohol and Drug Services Division Manager, Lori Miller. "Implementation will give the County greater administrative oversight to support patients. The County will also have the ability to improve care, be more efficient with our resources, implement evidence-based practices in substance abuse treatment, and coordinate with other systems of care to help residents get treatment."

"Sacramento County is excited to expand local networks of high-quality providers, as well as improve substance use disorder services and coordination with other hospitals, health and behavioral health systems," said Behavioral Health Director, Ryan Quist. "The waiver will create alignment with new cross-system initiatives with law enforcement, criminal justice and child welfare."

SMUD Hits a Milestone in Fleet Electrification

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - SMUD hit a major milestone in its efforts to electrify its fleet this week by putting up its last gas-powered sedan for auction and announcing the addition of 16 Chevy Bolts to its lineup. That brings the total number of electric and/or hybrid sedans to the SMUD fleet at 53.

"We're excited to hit this milestone on our way toward fleet electrification," said Casey Fallon, SMUD's director of Procurement, Warehouse and Fleet. "As we work to bring more mobility options and infrastructure to the Sacramento

region, we are showcasing the ability for large fleets to make the transition to cleaner cars and demonstrate the benefits."

In fact, SMUD just added three electric service trucks to its fleet that allow for heat and air conditioning to run while the engine is turned off to reduce the amount of diesel emissions and noise. It's also adding additional charging infrastructure at its two Sacramento locations.

"The effort comes from out-of-the-box thinking in how we view our fleet and our transportation needs," said Fallon. "There are a lot of factors that play into this long-range effort including

technology advancements, vehicle lifecycles, reduced maintenance expenses and how we rethink what types of vehicles are needed for various operating activities in the field."

SMUD has long been a supporter of electric vehicles, having worked with major automakers and a wide variety of technology companies for the past 30 years to help test and optimize electric vehicle equipment and demonstrate real-world effectiveness.

SMUD's efforts and partnerships have already brought electric vehicles to underserved communities; electric school buses to local districts; clean public

transportation; mobile battery charging stations and more.

SMUD's Charge Free for Two Years electric vehicle incentive offers a choice of \$599 cash (enough for the average electric vehicle driver to charge at home for two years), or a free high-powered level 2 electric vehicle charger for SMUD customers who purchase or lease a new plug-in electric vehicle.

SMUD's commitment to sustainability and mobility will improve the air quality in the Sacramento region and increase access to its residents.

California Veterans Board Appoints New Advocates for Veterans

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - With the appointments of Zoe Dunning, Ed Campbell, and Robin Umberg, the California Veterans Board has added three new members in 2019. Dunning and Campbell were appointed by Governor Gavin Newsom. Governor Jerry Brown appointed Umberg in December 2018. She was sworn in on January 2.

The seven-member board hears appeals by veterans who were denied services, including for a home loan, student waiver, or admission into one of CalVet's eight veterans homes.

Zoe Dunning joined the board on August 2. A retired commander in the U.S. Naval Supply Corps, the 56-year-old was on active duty from 1985 until 1991. After leaving the military, she worked as a manager for the Deloitte Consulting and A.T. Kearney firms. She then worked in operations leadership positions at Webvan and Chestnut Company before serving as a change management consultant with various firms.

She currently serves on the U.S. World War I Centennial Commission, the San Francisco Library Commission, and is on the advisory board for the nonprofit Vets in Tech. Dunning holds a Master of Business Administration in strategy and operations from the Stanford

University Graduate School of Business.

Ed Campbell, American Institute of Architects Emeritus, has designed projects nationwide during his illustrious career. A native of Santa Barbara, he joined the Naval Reserve at 17, then enlisted in the Air Force at 19, serving in drafting or logistics duties at Travis Air Force Base, in the Azores, and at the Air Force Flight Test Center at Edwards Air Force base.

He was an architect at USA Architects and Engineers from 1974 to 2014.

Campbell, 80, helped found a home for girls in Connecticut. He also helped create the Ventura Music Festival, where he is a resident at the Veterans Home of California-Ventura. It is one of the eight veterans homes owned by CalVet. His list of professional honors includes a citation from the president of the American Institute of Architects for his work in response to the collapse of high-rise buildings in Bridgeport, Connecticut in 1987.

Robin Umberg brings the experience of her 36-year Army career to the board. She commanded the 6253rd and 4211th Army Hospitals and deployed twice overseas. She earned her Bachelors of Science in Nursing from the Walter Reed Army Institute of Nursing and a Master of Business Administration from the University of Northern Colorado. She was

appointed by President Clinton to the West Point Board of Visitors in 2005 – the same year she was promoted to Brigadier General – and ended her military career as the Chief, Professional Services, for the 3rd Medical Command at Ft. Gillem, GA. She focused on battlefield readiness for the more than 27,000 medical personnel. Umberg was inducted into the Order of Military Medical Merit in 2006 and she retired from the Army in 2010.

A year later, Governor Brown appointed her deputy secretary for Veteran Homes at CalVet, and later upgraded her position to undersecretary. She left two years later to beat a battle with cancer. Umberg serves on the Public Private Partnership for Justice Reform in Afghanistan, and is a member of the Veterans Alliance of Orange County. She and her husband, retired Army colonel and current State Senator Tom Umberg, live in Orange County.

Campbell, Dunning, and Umberg join Board Chair Hugh E. Crooks, Jr., who was appointed in 2014; Charlene Taylor, appointed in 2012; Todd Trotter, appointed in 2015; and John Busterud, appointed in 2017.

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - The Natural Wonders exhibit at the Mills Station Arts & Culture Center is actually three exhibits in one: Pollinators, Mushrooms, and Seeds. "We try to have a little bit for everybody; concert for those that want to hear some blues and some music – (also) some painting, and some lecture," said Cheryl Gleason, MACC event coordinator and curator. "This will be a great show." Since funding for the show is provided by Measure H grant, Gleason said, "We never charge for any of the events, workshops, any of that, because the taxpayers have already paid for it."

The Pollinators part of the exhibit shows the diversity, needs and obstacles of pollinators, the various processes of pollination, and what can and is being done to support them. Mushrooms introduces viewers to a wide range of mushroom-producing fungi and their valuable roles in the environment. Seeds shows visitors a wide range of seed dispersal mechanisms and their valuable roles in the environment, ensuring species survival, diversity, and seed banks for the future.

All three exhibits use large, close-up and detailed photos and supplemental materials, based on photographs of flora and fauna in wild and garden settings, primarily taken by Northern California plantsman and naturalist, John Whittlesey. "We were lucky to partner with the Gateway Science Museum at CSU Chico to travel to these three exhibitions," said Amy Cohen, executive director of Exhibit Envoy. Jennifer Jewell originally curated these exhibitions at the Gateway Science Museum.

"Our exhibitions reflect the diversity and

richness of life in California," Cohen said. "These three exhibitions do much the same, highlighting the wonders and diversity within the worlds of pollinators, mushrooms, and seeds."

The opening reception for Natural Wonders will be 5:30-8 p.m., Wednesday, Sept. 4, at the MACC, 10191 Mills Station Rd., Rancho Cordova. After the reception, the exhibit will be open 3-8 p.m. on Thursday and Friday, Sept. 5 and 6, as well as Sept. 12 and 13. Saturday times will be 11 a.m.-4 p.m.

Lectures: Lecture nights are 6-8 p.m. Thursday, Sept. 5, with Dr. Chris Casey of Haagen-Dazs speaking about bees and their importance. Soil Born Farms will tell about their nonprofit farming project in Rancho Cordova starting at 6 p.m., Thursday, Sept. 12, upstairs at the MACC. Music @ the MACC will present Mick Martin's Big Band on the porch from 7-9 p.m., Friday, Sept. 6. Movies @ the MACC will show the Bee Movie animation at 5:45 p.m., Friday, Sept. 13.

Workshops: For those 13 and over, the Small Mural Graffiti Project workshop will present a hands-on experience from 11:30 a.m.-3:30 p.m., Saturday, Sept. 7 outside the MACC. "As we become a more artful city, we will be wanting large murals around Rancho Cordova," said Gleason. "We don't have a breadth of artists that have that skill set, so we're going to grow them—literally."

All ages can make their own paper hive at the My Hive Art Workshop, 12-2 p.m., Saturday, Sept. 14.

"He was a great listener... caring and always the first person to check up on you, even if you didn't know him well," one of the boys named Miguel said.

"He was something special. He always brought that good vibe, great energy that nobody else has," another named Jamie said.

"(White Rock Community Park) is a park where we all live, the kids play on it, it feels like our park. There are good people here, and we raised the money for this bench. We want to show how much Calvin meant to us and have a place for them to heal," Donna Brown said.

"We want that bench to represent a safe place to express emotions. Everyone has sadness and experiences loss of some kind," Constance Goins, Calvin's aunt and Sutter Health psychiatric department employee, said.

All members of the Board shared moving sentiments and approved the bench placement without hesitation.

Aug. 18, over 200 members of the Cordova community united to support, recognize, and honor Calvin and his family during a Celebration of Life at White Rock Community Park on what would have been Calvin's 19th birthday. To honor him and celebrate the addition of the memorial bench, CRPD donated White Rock Community Park's event space for the celebration, which included a 3 v. 3 basketball tournament on the basketball courts Calvin loved.

T-shirts and necklaces with photos of Calvin were made for the event and worn to signify unification and commitment to spreading awareness. Promise Taylor, Calvin's former girlfriend, felt this event truly connected the community, and encouraged them to heal together. It was a reunion of sorts, and it was so nice to see these kids who have grown up together remember Calvin and show the impact he had on them," Terry said.

Other attendees also said there was a feeling of togetherness. "That would have been the part Calvin would've loved the most, it's the part of Calvin I loved the

to and say 'hey Calvin, I'm going to give you the opportunity to go talk to this kid before I do and set them up for success,' and he always seemed to have his head on his shoulders, was responsible and respectful, especially to adults," Brian said.

Traits like this demonstrate why Calvin's dedication to the community was gifted back to him by his church basketball league. "Calvin played in River City Christian Church's spring basketball program for over five years. His basketball legacy and personality impacted the league so much that the league has established the Calvin Augusta Award for a player(s) who reflect Calvin's encouraging and inspiring persona during the season," Terry said.





the nonprofit organization Boys Town. The almanac is a very interesting book with information about turkeys, among other things. There are some interesting things about turkeys in the almanac. When we are with our grandchildren, they can look for the turkeys almost everywhere in Rancho Cordova. I am sure information such as that will be very helpful in everyone's life in Rancho Cordova, but I think I'll have to write down the "wattle" and the "snood" before it is easily remembered.

There are more items

in the almanac like cookie recipes, if animals can predict weather, winter lore, if cold weather can give you a cold, honey natural remedies, why is it called Halloween, how to carve a pumpkin, and other stuff I'm sure you can't live without. But, The Old Farmer's Almanac is a nice change from what I usually read, and it may be much more interesting to children who definitely haven't grown up with reading material like the almanac.

Usually, there are too many events, responsibilities and paying attention to our families for us to notice how much people and material things have changed. My wife and I have been given the chance to watch some of our grandchildren as they get smarter and taller, go through school, and well...grow up. They haven't grown up completely yet, but all of a sudden, you are doing so many things differently by necessity. I can't think of a better way to go through life than by seeing some of our dreams come true. We have watched our children grow up, and we hoped we could watch and help our grandchildren too. Some things seem to take too much time, and others go too fast. But as Earl Nightingale said, "Never give up on a dream because of the time it will take to accomplish. The time will pass anyway."







Lancers Football Shut Out In Season Opener

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - Well, that certainly wasn't the way new Cordova varsity football coach Jason Bumbaca wanted his first game to go.

The Lancers never really got going in their season-opening 58-0 loss against visiting Vista Del Lago last Friday, who seized momentum early and never looked back en route to the victory.

Cordova (0-1) found themselves in a deficit quickly after the ball was snapped out of the back of their own endzone from the six-yard line on their second possession of the contest,

resulting in a safety which gave the ball right back to the Eagles (1-0). Two plays later, junior tailback Ethan Menezes punched it in from two yards out, giving Vista Del Lago a 10-0 lead in short order.

On the Eagles' ensuing possession, junior quarterback Aydan Edwards would connect with junior wideout Nathan Zan for a five-yard score, and the Lancers found themselves trailing 16-0 after the first quarter ended.

The quick scoring drives would be the theme of the night for Vista Del Lago, who added 14 points in the second quarter to take a 30-0 halftime lead, as the Lancers were forced to punt on five of their first seven possessions.

The snowball effect continued in the second half, as the Eagles compounded matters with 28 additional points.

"It was a rough beginning obviously," Bumbaca said afterward. "I thought we played a good first quarter, but that isn't going to get the job done. A lot of things went wrong tonight, but it's something to build on and grow from."

With Bumbaca implementing a new veer-option offense to a team that previously was known for a spread attack, the growing pains were visible in their first outing. The team was unable to sustain drives throughout much of the contest, with junior quarterback Niko

Santana only attempting four passes, two of which were intercepted, with one returned for a score in the second quarter. The lone bright spot offensively on the night was senior running back Salvador Bautista, who contributed four carries for 42 yards to lead the Lancers.

Vista Del Lago put up some gaudy numbers, with Edwards converting 10 of 19 pass attempts for 179 yards and three scores. More impressively, the duo of senior tailback Jaxson Hansen Menezes combined for 20 carries, 203 yards, and four rushing touchdowns.

Cordova will look to bounce back Friday as they host visiting Davis, with kickoff scheduled for 7:15 p.m. inside Lancers Stadium. ★

Love led Cordova offensively with seven kills on the night, with seniors Gabriella Maduri and Jalsia Palik each recording aces in the serving department. The Lady Rams were led by senior Jasmine Lewis, who tallied five aces.

After home games against Galt and Antelope this week, the Lady Lancers will return to the court on Thursday, September 5, when they host Union Mine at 6:00 p.m. inside the new Cordova gym. ★
