## \$1 Million in Grants Available to Area Nonprofits

**SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG)** - The County Board of Supervisors will provide \$1 million through the 2019 TOT Grant Program to support non-profit organizations located in Sacramento County that carry out community-based programs and/or services in the areas of economic and workforce development, arts and culture, community development, or health and human services. The County began setting aside funding for this purpose in 2017.

Grants will be allocated through a competitive process and applicants must meet eligibility and funding requirements. Applications will be accepted online beginning July 26 through the County's Office of Economic Development with a deadline of August 26, 2019.

Funding for the TOT Grant Program will come from County Transient Occupancy Tax (TOT) revenues. Transient Occupancy Taxes are levied on guests who occupy rooms in hotels, motels and other temporary lodging accommodations in the unincorporated area of the County.

## Eppie's Race is Back On



**SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)** - Businessman Ken McGuire last year feared was the end of an era when the "final" Eppie's Great race was announced.

Co-founder of Innovations Health Systems - a network of health-centered services and facilities in the Bay Area - McGuire (52) never actually competed in the annual event.

"I felt it was too great a tradition to let die," he explains. "People came here from all over the USA to compete. Eppie's was a boost for our national profile. We Sacramentans talked about the great race in the same conversation as Kings Basketball games and the California International Marathon. It helped charities. For all sorts of good reasons, keeping Eppie's alive seemed critical."

Now, thanks to McGuire, the world's oldest triathlon has not quite ended, after all. Steered by the Sacramento businessman, the contest that the late Eppie Johnston began in 1974 has new branding. From the starting gun July 20, and for future summers, it will be run as The Great American Triathlon. The endurance epic will again follow the American River Parkway in foot, bicycle

and kayak stages. While benefitting charities, it will endure as one of our area's great summer events.

Via many meetings and phone calls, McGuire persuaded major Eppie's supporters to keep paddling. In January, Sacramento County gave approval for the new parkway event.

Capital City Road Management will continue to manage the race. Former volunteers have rallied, and more than 20 companies have agreed to co-sponsor. McGuire's business partner, Carmichael resident Dan Niccum, is onboard for brand development.

The new race will continue restaurateur Eppie Johnston's philanthropic drive that raised more than a million dollars for

non-profits over 48 years. "Our fundraising for the American River Parkway Foundation and children's health charities is important," confirms McGuire. "We hope to write big checks for good causes. But above all, we want to maintain a community event that defines summer in Sacramento."

The world's oldest triathlon will set a cracking pace through the accustomed river stretches of Arcade, Carmichael, Fair Oaks and Rancho Cordova. Starting line is at William Pond Park. Athletes will follow a six-mile route to the Guy West Bridge near CSUS, and then grab bikes to pedal 12 miles to the beach below Sunrise Boulevard (Fair Oaks). There is no

swimming stage; contestants will board kayaks, brave the San Juan Rapids and follow the river downstream to Rancho Cordova. Thousands of supporters, onlookers and volunteers traditionally cheer athletes through all stages. Après-race celebrations will include live music, food trucks and a beer garden beside the River Bend Park finish line.

Entry in the Great American Triathlon costs \$40 for athletes 18 and under; \$150 for adult competitors; junior relay is \$110; adult relay is \$225. Tandem water craft admission is \$300. 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# Hikers Need to be Prepared for Wildfire Season

**SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)** - The second of two wildfire seasons has started in California. The first fire season is between October and April when the Santa Ana winds are most prevalent, and the second season typically runs from June through September when heat and lots of dried ground cover provide breeding grounds for the flames. This is a good time, then, to reiterate some of our tips for hikers who are going out during the hotter summer months when wildfires can be a factor.

Before heading out, check with the local fire services for notices about possible burns or risk concerns in the area. Take the time to not only plot the course of your hike, but also to plot escape routes. Remember: getting away from the burn is more important than getting back to your car or the trailhead.

Tell friends and family where you're going and when you expected to be back, so they'll know where to direct emergency personnel to start looking if you don't come home on time.

Bring something shiny with you, like a mirror, to signal with if you're trapped by the fire. Wear bright clothing, so you're easy to spot at a distance or from above. Don't wear synthetic clothing, as synthetics can melt directly onto your skin if the fire overtakes you.

Watching for signs of fire is another good defense against getting

trapped by a wildfire. The acrid scent of smoke or seeing smoke are obvious indicators that a fire is nearby. If you see ash or sparks in the air, it means the fire is probably less than a mile away from you and you should take immediate measures to safely leave the area. Even small fires can loom large in just a short amount of time, so don't underestimate the danger of tiny floating sparks.

When trying to escape a fire, face the wind and move downhill whenever possible. Remember, heat rises, so fire will run up the side of a hill or embankment much quicker than it will move down it. Moving down into shadier areas also moves you down into spots where streams and ground water may help to keep the plant-cover moister. Also be aware of the plant life around you. Some plants are highly flammable: manzanita, for example. Its roots are shallow and vulnerable to heat, and the bark is thin and peels off with age, so it offers the shrubs little protection from wildfires.

Whenever possible, move along areas that won't provide the fire with any additional tinder, such as wide dirt trails or fire breaks, paved roads, or rocky and gravelly areas.

Some believe that going back over areas that have already been burned may provide some protection because the fuel there has already been consumed. Be aware, however, that such areas may still be extremely

hot to walk on, and extra heat on an already hot day is not your friend. Also, some fire-remnants can often smolder deep in the root cavities of the burned shrubs and trees and can reignite without warning.

If you do find yourself trapped by the fire, and you can't get out into a large water source (such as a deep stream or lake) do NOT douse your clothes with water. If the fire reaches you, it can cause the water on your clothes to super-heat and turn to scalding steam.

If the fire is going to overtake you, find a relatively clear space on the ground, pull up any weeds or brush you can, and create a shallow depression to lie in. The bigger the space you can clear for yourself, the better. Take off your backpack but keep it nearby in case you need to use it as a heat shield. Then lay face-down in the depression with your feet in the direction of the fire.

As horrifying as being trapped by a wildfire may seem, keep in mind that if one does overtake you, it may pass over you in less than a minute or so.

# Arrest Made in Cold Case Through Multi-Agency Efforts

City of Sacramento Police Department Press Release

**SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)** - This press release is a summary of the facts known at this time, as this incident is actively being investigated. The information contained in the press release is subject to change. Additional details will be released as they become available.

On Friday, June 28, 2019, agents from the FBI Office in Atlanta, Georgia and detectives from the Sacramento Police Department arrested 59-year-old Mark Manteuffel on multiple charges related to three separate incidents that occurred between 1992 and 1994 in the City of Davis, the County of Sacramento and the City of Sacramento.

The arrest came after a collaborative and extensive investigation with the

Sacramento County Sheriff's Office, the Davis Police Department, the Sacramento County District Attorney's Office, Yolo County District Attorney's Office, FBI - Sacramento Field Office, and the Sacramento Police Department.

The Sacramento Police Department encourages any witnesses with information regarding this investigation to contact the Sacramento Police Investigations unit at (916) 808-0650 or Sacramento Valley Crime Stoppers at (916) 443-HELP (4357) or submit an anonymous tip using the free "P3 Tips" smartphone app. Callers can remain anonymous and may be eligible for a reward up to \$1,000.

**Grant Application Review Period**

August 27 - September 3, 2019

**Budget & Debt Management** staff will review applications for completeness and compliance with minimum eligibility requirements. Applicants will be notified electronically if proposals meet the minimum qualifications and moved to the evaluation process. Qualifying organizations will receive the Board of Supervisors Hearing schedule where final recommendations and approval

will be made in October 2019.

**September/October 2019 Subject Area Expert Panel Application Review:** Subject area experts will review, evaluate, and rank qualifying applications and may contact organizations with follow-up questions.

**Grant Program Hearing Notification:**

Applicants will receive a second electronic notification of schedule for the Board of Supervisors Hearing where recommended award selections will be made.

**Grantee Award Approval** November 2019

The Board of Supervisors will make the final determination and approval for all TOT Grant Program recipients.

**Budget & Debt Management** will notify applicants of funding selections within five business days of Board Hearing approval. All notifications will be made electronically.

**Budget & Debt Management** will draft and administer agreements between the County and grantees.

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# Bikers Against Child Abuse and The Child Abuse Prevention Center Put Safety First

**RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG)** - Children's safety was the focus at this month's Folsom Cordova Community Partnership's Connections Café with presentations by Tim Libey of Bikers Against Child Abuse (B.A.C.A.) and Arwa Al-Rakabi, AmeriCorps Health Educator from The Child Abuse Prevention Center (The Cap Center).

Libey commanded the floor with his smile and stories. Retired from the Air Force, Libey works, he says, to pay the bills so he can do what he loves, what he is passionate about – being involved with B.A.C.A. and empowering children who have been abused.

Child abuse may be physical, sexual, or emotional. It is also neglect. According to statistics listed on The Child Abuse Prevention Center's website, "half a million children are reported abused in California each year."

B.A.C.A. "exists with the intent to create a safer environment for abused children." The group makes itself available to children in several ways and works "in conjunction with local and state officials who are already in place to protect children."

The 5000 members of the international organization are volunteers and include men and women from all professions, including CEOs and moms. They are motorcycle enthusiasts who care deeply about children. Founded 25 years ago in Provo, Utah by a licensed child therapist, the organization has chapters throughout the United States, in Australia, Sweden, Italy, Iceland, Canada,

Greece, and other countries.

Libey shared the founder's story of bringing friends from his local motorcycle club to meet with a child after obtaining permission from the guardian and the child. They simply hung out with the child, gave rides on the bikes, and let the child know they were there. Prior to the meeting, the child feared going out. After the meeting, the child was able to venture into the world and hang out with friends.

The organization was born when the founder saw that abused children could be empowered by knowing they had people there for them. There is never a cost to the family, and each child receives a backpack with some tangible items to connect to the group. These items include a teddy bear,

special nightlight, vest, and fleece blanket and are presented by the group.

Before a local chapter can respond, Libey explained that the abuse must have been reported to a mandated reporter.

Mandated reporters, established under the Child Abuse and Neglect Reporting Act (CANRA) passed in 1980, are required to report suspected abuse or neglect and normally have regular contact with children. These include child care workers, teachers, firefighters, clergy, public health employees, and a long list of others mandated in California. The list also includes psychological assistants; unlicensed marriage, family, and child therapist interns; and commercial film and photo

processors.

If the legal guardian of the child has reported the abuse to a mandated reporter, B.A.C.A. will arrange, with the permission of both guardian and child, to meet the child. If no report was made, the guardian is advised to file one.

Children between three and eighteen are eligible, but they are part of B.A.C.A. for life. Libey shared that a young woman contacted them after she had finished college and met the man she would marry. She did not have anyone to walk her down the aisle. B.A.C.A. responded. They walked her down the aisle and filled her side of the church. She was part of their family.

B.A.C.A. will also, if necessary, escort the child to school or court and will,

with the judge's permission, sit in the court gallery in an effort to empower the child who must face the abuser.

Abuse, said Libey, steals two things from a child – power and choice. Both are given to the child by B.A.C.A., which is on call for the child around the clock, including Christmas mornings.

"These children have the strength in them," said Libey. "We help them find it."

He shared an informational video and passed out a copy of a study that had evaluated B.A.C.A.'s services. He also handed out a brochure and explained the symbols. White represents children's innocence, and the fist represents B.A.C.A.'s commitment to stop child abuse.

Al-Rakabi's organization also works to protect children. She presented information about a pilot program promoting dental hygiene which includes dental products packets and assistance to Medical recipients to access their Denti-Cal benefits. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) has recommendations for hygiene for infants, children, and pregnant women and suggests visiting a dentist by the child's first birthday.

She also discussed The Cap Center's Safe Sleep Baby program. From birth to one year, babies should sleep alone, in a crib, and on their backs. Toys and other items should be removed, smoking should never take place around the baby, and the baby should not be overdressed.

Home visits, workshops, and partnering with other agencies like Birth & Beyond are some of the myriad ways they reach families. According to the organization's website, a baby dies while sleeping every other week in Sacramento County. Half of those babies are African American.

"We try to fight infant sleep related disorders," said Al-Rakabi.

**RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG)** - Students from the Rancho Cordova campus of San Joaquin Valley College (SJVC) hosted a Costumed 5K Ventilator Relay Race, Open House, and BBQ on June 28. The campus (located at 11000 Olson Dr., #100, Rancho Cordova) offers accelerated healthcare career training in respiratory therapy and surgical technology.

Six teams (five respiratory therapy cohorts and one surgical technology cohort) chose their themes, decorated Mark 7 Ventilators from their labs, and attached the ventilators to various non-motorized wheeled carts. Members of each team dressed in costumes matching their themes (Zombie Hospital, Disney's Up, Hawaii, Coachella, Super Girls, and Toy Story 4) and took turns pushing their entries around the campus parking lot — racing toward the finish line

while a crowd of onlookers cheered them on.

The students set up booths with food and activities, and gave out raffle prizes. Last year they donated the raffle proceeds to the Folsom Cordova Community Partnership, and this year the proceeds will go into a fund for their practice exams.

Campus president Jeff Rutherford said they've been hosting the event since 2011: "We wanted to create a little bit of camaraderie and open it up to the community to come out and see exactly what it is we do here. It's a fun event for the students."

Surgical technology program director Josephine Williams Cody said the purpose of the event is to educate people about lung health and to create "community awareness of the multitude of lung diseases affecting our community."

The open house portion of the event helped "to bring awareness to not only what a respiratory therapist does and how we

facilitate lung health, but to bring awareness to the community on how we can improve lung health by not smoking/vaping, and limiting exposure to harmful behaviors that compromise lung health," said Williams Cody. "[And] we are proud to introduce our newest program — surgical technology — to the community and continue the tradition of excellence in education to that program."

Respiratory therapists (RTs) and surgical technologists (STs) have vital roles in the healthcare field. RTs evaluate, treat, and manage patients with respiratory illnesses and other cardiopulmonary disorders. STs are responsible for maintaining sterile instruments, equipment, and areas for surgical procedures — in addition to assisting surgeons with patient care.

## American Beauty

We live in an era of public ugliness, of architects who deliberately make their forms unsightly and inhuman, and of public art installations that are invariably ridiculous.

The most obvious exception is the ballpark, which has gotten more beautiful rather than less in a great example of renewal through a return to tradition.

Paul Goldberger, a former architecture writer for The New York Times, traces this journey in his wonderful new book "Ballpark."

He rightly calls the ballpark "one of the greatest of all American building types" and argues that "as much as the town square, the street, the park, and the plaza, the baseball park is a key part of American public space."

Ballparks went from delightfully peculiar structures shoehorned into city streets, to monochromatic multiuse facilities with all the charm of public-works projects, before rediscovering the old forms.

The first ballpark was built in Brooklyn in 1862 and called "Union Grounds." Amazingly enough, "The Star-Spangled Banner," not

yet the national anthem, was played before the first game. The wooden parks of the 19th century tended to burn down, sometimes spectacularly (a fire at the South End Grounds in Boston took out 200 buildings in Roxbury).

The 20th century brought the age of steel, brick and concrete, and "the Golden Age" of 1912-14. It gave us Crosley Field, where the Reds played until 1970, with an upward slope known as the "terrace" in left field; Tiger Stadium, quirky and cozy (a flagpole stood in the field of play in deep center); and especially the "jewel boxes" of Fenway, Wrigley and Ebbets.

Subsequent decades brought a flight from cities, and from idiosyncrasy. Cleveland previewed what was to come in the 1930s with its publicly funded, gargantuan, usually half-empty, symmetrical, multisport Municipal Stadium, or the "Mistake by the Lake."

The truly dreadful, indistinguishable concrete doughnuts, made for football and baseball but manifestly unsuited for the latter, arrived beginning in the 1960s.

The turning point was Camden Yards in Baltimore, opened in 1992. Originally conceived as another multisport suburban facility, it instead decisively moved baseball beyond such hybrids. Camden Yards

has a red-brick exterior and exposed steel supports inside, eschewing the concrete of the doughnuts. It limits foul territory to bring ground-level seats closer. The stands are arranged asymmetrically to avoid a deadening sameness, and frame a view of the Baltimore skyline, anchoring the park in the city.

It was such a triumph that its retro style has become a design cliché. Its influence stamped the best of the new parks: PNC Park in Pittsburgh, which, outside of Fenway and Wrigley, might be the most charming place to watch a game in the country; Oracle Park in San Francisco, which is everything its execrable forbear, Candlestick, wasn't; T-Mobile Park in Seattle, which is enchanting despite a retractable roof.

Goldberger writes of how the ballpark, with its lush field at the center of an enclosure of concrete and steel, is the garden in the city, a sports combination of the Jeffersonian agrarian tradition and the Hamiltonian emphasis on cities and industry.

It's a wonder we managed to mess it up, but we did, before the current revival that shows there's always a way back.



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


