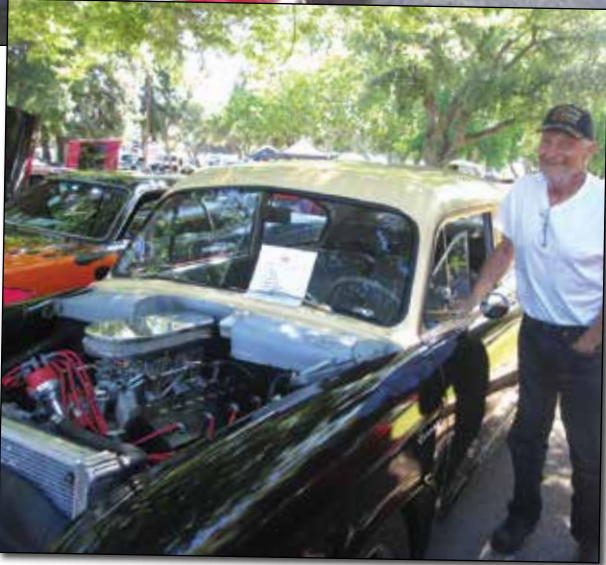

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Fund Established for Officer Tara O'Sullivan

CAHP Special Release

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - On June 19, 2019, at approximately 6:10 p.m., Sacramento Police Department Officer Tara O'Sullivan, 26, was shot at the scene of a domestic violence incident. She was transferred to UC Davis Medical Center where she tragically died. Officer Tara O'Sullivan was a dedicated, young officer who had only been with the department for a year. This is the first line-of-duty death of a Sacramento Police Officer in twenty years.

At 5:41 p.m., Officer Tara O'Sullivan and fellow officers responded to a domestic disturbance. Approximately thirty minutes later, shots were fired by an armed gunman inside the house. Officer O'Sullivan was struck while trying to help a woman move her items outside of the home.

With Officer O'Sullivan down, the gunman continued to fire at officers which prevented any form of rescue. An armored vehicle arrived in response and officers were able to transport her to the hospital where she succumbed to her injuries.

The standoff lasted for multiple hours until the gunman surrendered at 1:54 a.m.

Officer O'Sullivan was a recent graduate from Sacramento State's Law Enforcement Candidate Scholars Program. After which, she graduated from the Sacramento Police Academy.

"The loss of Officer O'Sullivan is devastating, grievous, and a reminder that police work invokes heartbreak," said Brad Houle, CAHP Credit Union President. "She displayed heroism while protecting an individual in our community. Her family, friends, and colleagues will always remember that she selflessly sacrificed her life to ensure the safety of another."

Hot Fireworks Season in Store for Area

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - Baseball, hot dogs, apple pie and ... crazy bugs?

If TNT Fireworks has its way this Fourth of July, area revelers will embrace cracked creepy-crawlies as a new symbol of Americana for the nation's 243rd birthday. Crazy Bug Fountain is one of nine fireworks debuting this season by the two largest distributors of consumer fireworks.

The pyro-passionate period runs June 28 through July 4 in Sacramento County. Roseville, Rocklin and Lincoln in Placer County are also among the 295 jurisdictions that allow consumer fireworks in the Golden State.

TNT is rolling out a handful of new fountains in addition to Crazy Bug, which, despite its name, shows promise as a sane addition to your private display. Priced at \$29.99, the fun-labeled firework features a multi-effect performance of colorful sparks and crackling flowers. Rounding out TNT's newbies are crackle-charged Laser Master, \$24.99; effect-loaded Freedom, \$19.99; colorful Main Squeeze, \$14.99; whistle-happy Hot Point, \$14.99; and spaced-out USA Rocket Fountain, a buy-one-get-one for \$8.99.

Phantom Fireworks is coming out with three new fountains this season. Sold as a

bundle for \$39.99, the trio makes up Phantom's newly branded "Super Hero Series," not to be confused with superhero The Phantom. Each has a different shape and name, and valiant sounding they are: Professor Flame, Iron Master and Majestic Lightning.

Returning from last year's impressive freshman class are Phantom's delightful Red White & Blue Jubilee (\$25.99) and long-lasting Illuminati Triangle, still a solid deal at \$39.99 with a Brew Haha or Dragon's Tears fountain thrown in. TNT's response is an exceptionally strong sophomore lineup, headlined by the dazzling Tasmanian

Cyclone (\$39.99), super-charged Wild Side (\$25.99) and intense Electrolytes (\$29.99 for two).

A third player, Discount Fireworks Superstore, will have a few stands in the area. Brands carried by DFS include Winda, Black Cat, Showtime, Brothers and Freedom.

Because state-approved consumer fireworks can only be sold in California by non-profit organizations, hundreds of the county's 501c3s are banking on big profits from pyrotechnics peddled to the patriotic and philanthropic. Volunteers will be braving the summer heat to do such good as sending kids to church

camp, suiting up youth sports teams and getting adolescents off drugs.

Working in the groups' favor this year is the day on which the Fourth of July falls. A Thursday Independence Day is a friend to the fireworks industry, contrary to a Wednesday which is traditionally a one-day holiday for America's workforce. U.S. resellers generally reported flat sales in 2018 due to the hump day holiday.

"Thursday is a great day for the Fourth of July," said Cathy Castilone, Sacramento-based vice president of American Promotional Events, the wholesale distributor for state-approved TNT fireworks. "Many people take the next day off when the fourth is on a Thursday."

The competition concurs. Jeff Kreman, Phantom's Northern California regional manager, said he expects sales to increase from last year.

"A lot of companies will give employees Friday off, and when the Fourth falls on a four-day weekend sales are good," said Kreman, also based in Sacramento.

Be sure to check local laws and take all safety measures before buying and lighting.

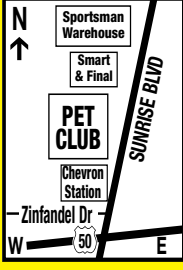

It's a Celebration and Smiles for WWII Veteran Tony Borrero

- Tony I. M. Borrero was born in Milpitas, raised in Hayward, and settled in Rancho Cordova in the mid-1960s where he forged a second career with the Sacramento Army Depot. In February of 2020, he will celebrate his 100th birthday alongside his wife who will celebrate her 96th this October. The couple met when Borrero was stationed at Camp Kearns, an Army Air Force base in Utah during WWII. Tony and Ludivina were married in August, 1946. Her advice for a long marriage is simple: "A lot of patience and respect."

the baseball field left him with a broken wrist and a new assignment with a Coast Artillery Squadron. Another mishap saved his life and cost many others theirs said Anthony. After the attack on Pearl Harbor, Tony and his squadron, part of Operation Plum, headed from Pearl Harbor towards the Philippines where they planned to reinforce the group of islands from Japanese attack. A quick stop in Australia to resupply went a bit awry. Tony missed the ship's movement and did not reach the Philippines. "Other servicemen from Operation Plum landed in the Philippines and were

atrocities in modern warfare" in a story for the USO. Tony went on to serve with the 480th Service Squadron 5th Air Force in Australia and New Guinea between 1941 and 1944. He returned to the United States after the war and married his sweetheart in 1946. He retired from his first career in 1965 as a Senior Master Sergeant, one of the most difficult enlisted positions to attain. He remained with Headquarters 20th Air Force at March Air Force Base in Riverside, CA where he retired from his first career, according to his son, Anthony. When Tony was sent to Japan, Ludivina lived with her mother for a year in Utah until she could join her husband. The couple traveled the world, living in Japan for three years, where Anthony was born, and in Morocco for two years around 1969. "We lived in Casablanca a year before we moved onto the base. We had a big villa we rented from a Frenchman," she said. "It overlooked the ocean." After leaving Rancho Cordova in 1992, Tony and Ludivina returned to Utah where her sister and brother live. Although Tony no longer has his greenhouse where he grew flowers and does not work much in stained glass these days, the couple continues to be active in their community. "We are lucky and blessed to still have them in our lives!" wrote Anthony in an email. ★

One of those days was September 17, 2018 when two officers of our Rancho Cordova Police Department responded to a "regular" call. It didn't end like a "regular" call when the suspect at the Pep Boys Auto Parts Store shot at our two officers when they arrived. Officer Mark Stasyuk was shot in the upper body, and his partner Officer Julie Robertson was shot in the arm. Officer Stasyuk died from his injuries, but fortunately, Officer Robertson was able to recover from her wounds. We were sympathetic for the Stasyuk family and our police family, and we are very proud of our Rancho Cordova Police Officers who start each day fully aware of the issues they face every day.

officers arrived, Officer O'Sullivan was shot by a rifle type firearm. The suspect continued to shoot ever rapidly, and it was 50 minutes before the police officers were able to come in with an armed car to rescue her and get her to the hospital. Unfortunately, even after the surgery was done, Officer O'Sullivan wasn't able to survive the gunshot wound.

I know the loss of Officer Stasyuk has lingered in our thoughts and prayers. As you drive through Rancho Cordova, there are still some of the blue ribbons residents put up to show support for our police officers and the Stasyuk family. We will be thinking of Officer O'Sullivan's bravery and praying for her family as the year goes on.

As you have already seen on TV, in newspapers, on Facebook, etc., the team from the City of Rancho Cordova was waiting with 19 other cities for the results of the judge's decisions for the 2019 All-America City awards on Sunday, June 23. The National Civic League announced, "We are happy to designate Rancho Cordova as an All-America City. They showed today that they do a great job in engaging the whole city in creating a healthier community." They

said, "Rancho Cordova helps residents Eat.Stay.Love. through: Soil Born Farms—turns urban residents into farmers and teaches good nutrition; a mentorship and community services program for at-risk youth; and Mather Veterans Village—a housing community for homeless veterans." I was very happy to be able to be there and cheer for our City when Rancho Cordova was given the title. Congratulations to everyone on that team.

In the not too distant future, I will go through the records and write a column that will consist of what your city has been able to accomplish in its 16 year history as a city, but also what a distinguished community Rancho Cordova was before it became a city. It grew with Mather Air Force Base and Aerojet General, and it was willing to try new things, like asking for volunteers when the Sheriff wanted to try and see if a Sheriff's Service Center would or wouldn't work. Bera Urges President to Consult on Iran

WASHINGTON, DC (MPG) - Representative Ami Bera, Chairman of the Oversight and Investigations Subcommittee of the House Foreign Affairs Committee (HFAC), made the following statement on recent tensions with Iran, including the President's decision to approve then

cancel a military strike against Iran.

"We are currently in a dangerous situation with Iran, and it's incumbent on the Administration to work towards deescalating tensions through diplomacy and by working closely with our allies," said Rep. Bera. "Iran is the world's leading state sponsor of terrorism and seeks to destabilize our allies and security in the Middle East, and their decision to shoot down an American drone was a reckless and provocative action. While we have the right and obligation to defend ourselves, the President must consult with Congress before taking any military action that can put our brave

servicemembers in harm's way."

Rep. Bera previously raised concerns about the decision of the Administration to declare an emergency declaration to bypass Congress in authorizing weapon sales to Gulf countries. In a June 12 HFAC hearing, Rep. Bera questioned R. Clarke Cooper, Assistant Secretary for Political-Military Affairs at the Department of State on the origins of the Department's memo justifying the arms sales, and has sought further information from the Department related to who wrote and cleared the memo.

RESOLUTION OF THE INTENTION TO LEVY ASSESSMENTS FOR FISCAL YEAR 2019/20, PRELIMINARILY APPROVING ENGINEER'S REPORT, AND PROVIDING FOR NOTICE OF HEARING FOR THE PARK MAINTENANCE AND RECREATION IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT



WHEREAS, the Board of Directors of the Cordova Recreation and Park District, acting as the legislative body of the Park Maintenance and Recreation Improvement District, has previously ordered through Resolution 06/07-1 the formation of an assessment district pursuant to the provisions of the Landscaping and Lighting Act of 1972, known as the Park Maintenance and Recreation Improvement District, for the purpose of financing certain park and recreational improvements, and for the purpose of funding maintenance operations of the District; and
WHEREAS, Streets and Highways Code sections 22622, 22623 and 22661 authorize the preparation of an Engineer's Report on an annual basis which shall describe any proposed new improvements or any substantial changes in existing improvements, set forth an estimate of the costs of any improvements and/or annual maintenance costs for the park and recreational improvements specified in the Engineer's Report, specify a diagram for the assessment district and specify the amount to be assessed upon various types of assessable lands within the assessment district; and
WHEREAS, an Engineer's Report for Fiscal Year 2019/20 as authorized by the Board of Directors has been presented to the Board of Directors for its consideration and approval, which Engineer's Report generally describes the general nature, location, and extent of the new improvements or any substantial changes in existing improvements, provides an estimate of the costs of any proposed new improvements or substantial changes in existing improvements and refurbishments, specifies the costs of maintenance of park and recreational improvements within the district, and sets forth a diagram for the assessment district; and
WHEREAS, the Board of Directors has adopted a Resolution approving and filing an Engineer's Report for Fiscal Year 2019/20 as required by Streets and Highways Code Section 22623, which Engineer's Report sets forth plans and specifications for the improvements or any substantial changes in existing improvements, an estimate of the costs of these improvements, an estimate of the cost of maintenance with respect to such improvements, a diagram of the assessment district, and a description of the net amount to be assessed upon assessable lands within the assessment district which Engineer's Report is incorporated herein by this reference.

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Summer Dangers and Safety Tips for Pets

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - RedRover, a national animal welfare organization dedicated to bringing animals from crisis to care, has shared a list of summer safety tips for pets to help get families through the warm months.

“Our pets are like family, and we want to ensure they are kept safe as they are exposed to changing conditions. Just as you should never leave your child alone in a hot car, the same goes for your pets, as temperatures can rise swiftly in a very short amount of time and turn deadly,” said Nicole Forsyth, President & CEO of RedRover. “Prevention is key, so remembering these quick and easy tips can make the summer more enjoyable for the whole family.”

Hot Surfaces: Surfaces such as asphalt, sand and concrete can burn your pet's paws. Try to walk your pet early in the morning or later in the evening as the temperature cools down or walk them on the grass. If that isn't possible, check the ground temperature by placing the back of your hand on the ground for at least 10 seconds. If it's too hot for your hand, it is too hot for your pet's paws.

Cars: Leaving your pet in your car, even in 70 degree weather, can lead to deadly consequences. A Stanford study found that a car's interior can heat up by an average of 40 degrees F within an hour, regardless of ambient temperature, and 80 percent of the temperature rise occurs within the first half-hour. Cracking the windows makes little difference on the internal temperature, so it is best to leave your dog at home where it is cool.

Dehydration: Make sure to check your pet's water dish several times a day,

and refill it with fresh, cool water. Ice cubes or frozen broth cubes can be added to encourage them to drink more. Adding wet food to their diet can also keep them hydrated.

Heat Stroke: In addition to making sure your pet is hydrated, keep them in the shade as often as possible when outdoors. While dogs and cats like to bask in the sun, direct sunlight can overheat them and cause heat stroke.

Pools: While pools can be a great way to cool your dog down and prevent heat stroke, chlorine can upset a dog's stomach and irritate their skin. Watch to make sure they don't drink more than a mouthful of water, and don't forget to rinse your dog with fresh water after their swim. A “kiddy pool” filled with fresh, cold water is a safer option.

Fireworks: Loud noises can be very scary for animals. Try to keep your pet indoors when you know fireworks are planned. If you can't, be sure to double-check your gate/fencing to ensure your pet won't try to escape when startled.

Sunburn: Animals can sunburn too, especially those with short, thin or light-colored coats. Sunburns can be painful,

and overexposure to the sun can lead to skin cancer. Ask your veterinarian about animal-safe sunscreens and how to apply them properly.

Barbeques: Food that is stuck to a barbecue after cooking can be too tempting for your pet to resist - licking the barbecue grate can result in serious burns to an animal's tongue or mouth. Make sure to clean the grill thoroughly and close the lid, if possible. Lighter fluid is a poison, so store it out of your pet's reach.

Coalition Applauds Assembly Education Committee for Passing SB 428

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - The California Assembly Education Committee passed SB 428 by a bipartisan vote (5-0). It now moves ahead to the Assembly Health Committee for approval. The bill would require a percentage of staff and teachers in each school be trained in a program like Youth Mental Health First Aid (YMHFA). YMHFA is a comprehensive training specifically designed to equip educators, family members, and caregivers with the skills and knowledge to identify, understand, and respond to the signs or risk factors of mental illness and substance use disorders in youth. The purpose of the bill is to increase school and community-level capacity to tackle California's growing youth mental health crisis.

SB 428 is supported by a broad coalition led by Born This Way Foundation, California Council of Community Behavioral Health Agencies (CBHA), County Behavioral Health Directors Association (CBHDA), and Children Now. Following the assembly's action today, Le Ondra Clark Harvey, a spokesperson for the coalition and Director of Policy and Legislative Affairs for CBHA said:

“Our coalition came together in support of this bill because the mental wellbeing of students is critical to their ability to lead healthy lives. As representatives of service providers and experts in the field, we believe there are actionable solutions to California's growing youth mental health crisis. This coalition strongly supports SB 428, which seeks to better equip teachers and school staff on the frontlines of this crisis, and to increase access to mental health trainings in schools. We thank Senators Pan and Portantino for introducing this important piece of legislation, and we thank the Assembly Education Committee for their support with passing the bill out of committee.”

Rimmi Hundal, Director of MHSA and Ethnic Services at the Tri-City Mental Health Services, and Andrea Zimmerman, a retired teacher and school administrator and current YMHFA trainer with Wellness Together provided testimony alongside Senator Pan at the hearing.

“I think about all the missteps I could have avoided as a teacher and an administrator if I had Mental Health First Aid training at the beginning of my career, and the impact that would have multiplied across all teachers and schools. Our youth deserve learning environments where they're surrounded by adults who are trained to respond to their mental health needs,” said Andrea Zimmerman.

California Council of Community Behavioral Health Agencies (CBHA) is a statewide association of county funded non-profit community agencies dedicated to the proposition that the people of California deserve a rational, comprehensive, community-based behavioral health system that is adequately funded to serve all those in need of services. We are their voice at the Capitol and with state agencies, and work to ensure that state and county programs support integrated services for children, youth, adults and the elderly which includes physical health, behavioral health, housing, social services, education, substance abuse services and vocational rehabilitation.

Fracking Opponents Make It Harder to Keep Warm

Many U.S. households are just starting to recover from record-setting cold temperatures. Several major cities -- like Denver and Chicago -- used more fuel than last winter to stay warm, according to a recent AccuWeather analysis.

But many low-income Americans, who already struggle to pay their heating bills, couldn't afford to pay for more fuel. For the nation's poorest families, energy costs eat up more than a fifth of after-tax income.

Leaders in Washington and around the country could help lower those heating bills by encouraging the development of domestic natural gas -- a clean, affordable heating fuel that America happens to possess in abundance. Yet several lawmakers are doing their best to suppress natural gas production.

As long as these politicians persist in their campaign against natural gas development, staying warm during a long winter will remain an unaffordable luxury for America's least advantaged citizens.

Heating costs are already unmanageably high for many households around the country. For instance, the average price of heating one's home with propane is a whopping \$1,676. Those burning heating oil spent \$1,506, on average, while electric heat cost the average household over \$965.

But not all families faced such hefty heating bills, thankfully. In fact, the nearly half of American households using natural gas to stay warm spent a mere \$634. For a household living at the poverty level -- which is currently \$21,330 for a family of three -- the financial savings that come from natural gas can be life-changing.

The surge in domestic natural gas production in recent years has already reduced the cost of living in the United States dramatically. Thanks to advances in the energy exploration technique known as hydraulic fracturing, or "fracking," household spending on natural gas dropped by more than a quarter between

2008 and 2014. In 2015 alone, natural gas helped deliver \$1,337 in additional disposal income to the average U.S. family.

And by making it cheaper to do everything from ship goods to power factories and, yes, heat one's home, the natural gas boom will likely contribute an additional \$533 billion to the nation's economy by 2025.

So it's discouraging that so many lawmakers known for championing the economically disadvantaged stand opposed to domestic energy development.

Sen. Bernie Sanders (I-VT), for instance, wants to ban fracking across the country, just as lawmakers have already done in his home state of Vermont. New York implemented a fracking ban back in 2015, as did Maryland in 2017.

Opponents of fracking insist that the practice poses real threats to the environment. But virtually every concern has been debunked. And anyone truly concerned with the future of our planet should welcome a growing supply of low-cost natural gas -- a fuel that emits roughly half as much CO2 as coal, and considerably less than propane, gasoline, or diesel.

America's broadscale transition away from less clean energy sources like coal and toward natural gas is a main reason why national CO2 emissions have hit their lowest levels in nearly two decades.

Of course, the vast majority of Americans are well aware of the benefits of natural gas. According to one recent poll, 77 percent of voters want more domestic oil and gas production, not less.

It's no surprise why. Policies that restrict the production of natural gas -- and keep energy prices needlessly high -- make little sense in any season. But when Americans face record-setting cold weather, those reforms are downright inhumane.

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors of the Cordova Recreation and Park District, acting as the legislative body of the Independence at Mather Landscaping and Lighting Assessment District, has previously ordered through Resolution 00-8 the formation of an assessment district pursuant to the provisions of the Landscaping and Lighting Act of 1972, known as the Independence at Mather Landscaping and Lighting Assessment District, for the purpose of financing certain park and recreational improvements, and for the purpose of funding maintenance operations of the District; and

WHEREAS, Streets and Highways Code sections 22622, 22623 and 22661 authorize the preparation of an Engineer's Report on an annual basis which shall describe any proposed new improvements or any substantial changes in existing improvements, set forth an estimate of the costs of any improvements and/or annual maintenance costs for the park and recreational improvements specified in the Engineer's Report, specify a diagram for the assessment district and specify the amount to be assessed upon various types of assessable lands within the assessment district; and

WHEREAS, an Engineer's Report for Fiscal Year 2019/20 as authorized by the Board of Directors has been presented to the Board of Directors for its consideration and approval, which Engineer's Report generally describes the general nature, location, and extent of the new improvements or any substantial changes in existing improvements, provides an estimate of the costs of any proposed new improvements or substantial changes in existing improvements and refurbishments, specifies the costs of maintenance of park and recreational improvements within the district, and sets forth a diagram for the assessment district; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors has adopted a Resolution approving and filing an Engineer's Report for Fiscal Year 2019/20 as required by Streets and Highways Code section 22623, which Engineer's Report sets forth plans and specifications for the improvements or any substantial changes in existing improvements, an estimate of the costs of these improvements, an estimate of the cost of maintenance with respect to such improvements, a diagram of the assessment district, and a description of the net amount to be assessed upon assessable lands within the assessment district which Engineer's Report is incorporated herein by this reference.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Directors hereby declares its intention to levy and collect assessments pursuant to Streets and Highways Code section 22624 as follows:

- The Board of Directors of the Cordova Recreation and Park District, acting as the Board of Directors of the Independence at Mather Landscaping and Lighting Assessment District, hereby adopts the Preliminary Engineer's Report dated June 19, 2019, and files said Engineer's Report with the Clerk of this Board as approved pursuant to the requirements of California Streets and Highways Code section 22623.
- Said assessments will be levied and collected within the boundaries of the Independence at Mather Landscaping and Lighting Assessment District, the boundaries of which are specifically described in the Engineer's Report. - The Board of Directors declares its intent to levy and collect assessments for the Fiscal Year 2019/20 within said district at an assessment rate of \$173.12 per year per single family residential parcel as set forth in the Engineer's Report. These assessments are based on the same formula as those levied in fiscal years 2000/01 through 2018/19. The total number of parcels to be assessed and an estimate of total annual assessment revenue are contained within the Engineer's Report.

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - On June 15, The Playmakers Organization held a free one-day Football Camp at El Camino High School. The Playmakers Organization, founded by Greg “Coach Roz” Roeszler, is a local non-profit that provides free “Character Academy” camps for local youth. Joe Bodnar and Joe Simeone are long-time friends of Coach Roz, and they support the Playmakers mission by volunteering at the Character Academy Football Camps. Bodnar said, “It introduces the

kids to the sport. It gives them a self-esteem boost; they get to be in the spotlight.” Simeone explained, “The sport is the platform to talk about character. It provides an opportunity to ask kids, ‘What are you doing off the field? What are you doing in the classroom?’” The Playmakers’ programs focus on reaching at-risk and special needs kids, and Simeone said the kids often go on to become mentors to younger participants, taking on leadership roles in the program. Playmakers board member Bill Hutto described why he got involved in the organization: “My heart is with at-risk youth, and

Playmakers does a lot for these kids.” After retiring from a career in the California Department of Corrections, Hutto knows how important it is to provide at-risk kids with early intervention to keep them out of the prison system. “Giving them the opportunity to build their confidence and learn positive attitudes at a young age helps them become productive citizens,” said Hutto. Harrison Phillips, NFL defensive tackle with the Buffalo Bills, helped host the football camp. “This is a really cool initiative,” said Phillips. “I’m happy to come out and unite a lot of different people through sports;

it’s amazing the power of the sport to bring people together. It’s about teaching these kids character, team building, and working together — all the positive attributes of this sport that these kids might not get a chance to experience without this program.” NFL player Jordan Richards played football at Folsom High School and college football at Stanford before playing with the New England Patriots, the Atlanta Falcons, and recently signing with the Oakland Raiders. Richards has been involved in Playmakers since he was 13, attending Playmakers football camps as a teen.

“I didn’t know it at the time, but the lessons I learned here — who I am as I person, who I am as a man — I learned through the game. I’m so thankful for the time I had growing up with Coach Roz.” Richards met Phillips at Stanford and recruited him to become a Playmakers sponsor. Richards said, “In a way, we grew up together — and we still encourage each other.” Richards spoke of the bonds of friendship created through football, explaining it as “the guys who helped build me, and I helped build them.” Richards, Phillips, and numerous volunteers (including students from

local high schools El Camino, Rio Americano, Western Sierra, and Mira Loma) ran a series of football drills with the Playmakers kids. Coach Roz is grateful to have the support of Richards and Phillips: “These guys contribute so much to the organization, not just financially, but by taking the time to show up.” “The growth you get from this game really does last a lifetime,” said Richards. “Football taught me a lot about life, and a lot about myself. It takes a lot of people to make a team. It’s a family.” He urged the kids to take advantage of this opportunity: “Be a part of all this. It truly is special.” ★

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The Climate Trap for Democrats

The more the climate debate changes, the more it stays the same. Polls show that the public is worried about climate change, but that doesn't mean it is ready to bear any burden or pay any price to combat it. If President Donald Trump claws his way to victory again in Pennsylvania and the Upper Midwest, his path will likely go through abortion and climate change, two issues on which the Democrats are most confident in their righteousness and willing to embrace radical policies that appeal to their own voters much more than anyone else. Joe Biden, the moderate, is subject to these forces. He dumped his long-time support for the Hyde Amendment prohibiting federal funding of abortion and released a climate plan that, even if more modest than the "Green New Deal" (a low bar), is clearly derived from it. There's no doubt that climate is a top-tier issue for

Democrats. In a CNN poll, 96 percent of Democrats say it's very important that candidates support "taking aggressive action to slow the effects of climate change." It's doubtful that mom, baseball and apple pie would poll any higher. Among the broader public, according to a survey by climate change programs at Yale and George Mason universities, 70 percent believe that climate change is happening, and 57 percent believe that humans are causing it. It's easy to overinterpret these numbers, though. An Associated Press/University of Chicago poll asked people how much they were actually willing to pay to fight climate change, and 57 percent said at least \$1 a month, or not even the cost of a cup of coffee at Starbucks. The political experience of other advanced democracies is a flashing red light. In Australia last month, the liberal opposition lost what was supposed to be "the climate change" election, against all expectations. Polling showed that about 60 percent of Australians thought the government should address climate change "even if this involves significant costs." It turned out that it was one thing to tell that to pollsters and another to vote to make it happen. In France, gas and diesel hikes as part of a

government plan to reduce carbon emissions by 75 percent sparked the yellow vest movement in car-dependent suburbs and towns, and had to be ignominiously reversed. The politics of climate change will be problematic for the duration, for several reasons. The voters most opposed to the costs of climate action tend to be "deplorables" most easily dismissed by center-left parties at their own peril: voters in rural Queensland in Australia, economically distressed residents of unfashionable rural and semiurban areas of France, working-class voters in the Rust Belt in the U.S. Bearing real costs for the sake of the climate will always be a sucker's game for any one country so long as there isn't a global mandate for emission reductions. Finally, whatever the costs, no one is going to feel any climate benefits anytime soon, or likely ever. The supposed upside of plausible policies adopted by the U.S. would be minuscule changes in the global temperature decades from now. All this should counsel caution rather than apocalyptic rhetoric and policies, although Trump has every reason to hope it doesn't. Rich Lowry is editor of the National Review. A RESOLUTION OF INTENTION TO CONTINUE TO LEVY ASSESSMENTS FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2019-20, PRELIMINARILY APPROVING THE ENGINEER'S REPORT AND PROVIDING NOTICE OF HEARING OF THE MISSION OAKS RECREATION AND PARK DISTRICT PARKS AND RECREATION MAINTENANCE AND IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT

WHEREAS, the Mission Oaks Recreation and Park District, Parks and Recreation Maintenance and Improvement District was authorized by an assessment ballot proceeding conducted in 2006 and approved by 68.78% of the weighted ballots returned by property owners, and such assessments were levied by the Advisory Board of Directors by Resolution No. 2006-04 passed on May 2, 2006; and

WHEREAS, on April 9, 2019 by Resolution No. 2019-01, the Board ordered the preparation of an Engineer's Report for the Parks and Recreation Maintenance and Improvement District (the "District") for fiscal year 2019-20; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to said Resolution, the Engineer's Report was prepared by SCI Consulting Group, Engineer of Work, in accordance with 22565, et. seq., of the Streets and Highways Code (the "Report") and Article XIID of the California Constitution; and

WHEREAS, said Engineer's Report was filed with the Secretary of the Board of Directors and the Board of Directors has reviewed the Report and wishes to take certain actions relative to said Report.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Advisory Board of Directors of the Mission Oaks Recreation and Park District ("Board"), that:

SECTION 1. The Report for the "Parks and Recreation Maintenance and Improvement District", on file with the Secretary of the Board, has been duly considered by the Board of Directors and is hereby deemed sufficient and approved. The Report shall stand as the Engineer's Report for all subsequent proceedings under, and pursuant to, the foregoing resolution.

SECTION 2. It is the intention of this Board to continue to levy and collect assessments within the District for fiscal year 2019-20. Within the District, the existing and proposed improvements ("Improvements") are generally described as the installation, maintenance and servicing of public facilities, including but not limited to, landscaping, sprinkler systems, park grounds, park facilities, landscape corridors, ground cover, shrubs and trees, street frontages, playground equipment and hardcourt areas, senior and community centers, drainage systems, lighting, fencing, entry monuments, basketball courts, tennis courts, running tracks, swimming pools, other recreational facilities, security guards, graffiti removal and repainting, and labor, materials, supplies, utilities and equipment, as applicable, for property owned and maintained by the Mission Oaks Recreation and Park District. Installation means the construction of recreational improvements, including, but not limited to, land preparation, such as grading, leveling, cutting and filling, sod, landscaping, irrigation systems, sidewalks and drainage, lights, playground equipment, play courts, recreational facilities and public restrooms. Maintenance means the furnishing of services and materials for the ordinary and usual maintenance, operation and servicing of said improvements, including repair, removal, or replacement of all or part of any improvement; providing for the life, growth, health and beauty of landscaping; and cleaning, sandblasting and painting of walls and other improvements to remove or cover graffiti. Servicing means the furnishing of electric current or energy for the operation or lighting of any improvements, and water for irrigation of any landscaping or any other improvements.

SECTION 3. The District consists of the lots and parcels shown on the assessment diagram of the District on file with the Secretary of the Board, and reference is hereby made to such map for further particulars.

SECTION 4. Reference is hereby made to the Report for a full and detailed description of the Improvements, the boundaries of the District and the proposed assessments upon assessable lots and parcels of land within the District. The Engineer's Report identifies all parcels which will have a special benefit conferred upon them and upon which an assessment will be imposed.

SECTION 5. The assessment is subject to an annual adjustment tied to the Consumer Price Index-U for the San Francisco Bay Area as of December of each succeeding year (the "CPI"), with a maximum annual adjustment not to exceed 3%. Any change in the CPI in excess of 3% shall be cumulatively reserved as the "Unused CPI" and shall be used to increase the maximum authorized assessment rate in years in which the CPI is less than 3%. The maximum authorized assessment rate is equal to the maximum assessment rate in the first fiscal year the assessment was levied adjusted annually by the minimum of 1) 3% or 2) the change in the CPI plus any Unused CPI as described above. The change in the CPI from December 2017 to December 2018 was 4.49%. Therefore, the maximum authorized assessment rate for fiscal year 2019-20 is increased by 3.00% which equates to \$54.44 per single family equivalent benefit unit. The estimate of cost and budget in the Engineer's Report proposes assessments for fiscal year 2019-20 at the maximum rate of \$52.07 which is less than the maximum authorized assessment rate.

SECTION 6. The public hearing shall be held, before this Board at Mission Oaks Community Center, located at 4701 Gibbons Drive, Carmichael, California 95608 as follows: on Tuesday, July 23, 2019 at the hour of 6:00 p.m. for the purpose of this Board's determination whether the public interest, convenience and necessity require the improvements and this Board's final action upon the Report and the assessments therein. The Secretary of the Board is hereby authorized and directed to cause a notice of the hearing to be given by publishing a notice once, at least ten (10) days prior to the date of the hearing above specified, in a newspaper circulated in the District.

River Cats’ Dave Brundage Leads PCL at Triple-A All-Star Game

WEST SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Sacramento River Cats manager Dave Brundage and Buffalo Bisons skipper Bobby Meacham have been tabbed the managers of their respective league’s All-Star teams for the 2019 Ronald McDonald House Charities Triple-A All-Star Game. The 32nd annual contest will take place at Southwest University Park in El Paso, Texas on Wednesday, July 10 at 7:05 MT.

In his career, PCL skipper Dave Brundage has amassed over 1,500 managerial victories in nearly two decades of managerial experience. Brundage, who made his managerial debut in 1995, is in his third season managing the River Cats. Prior to his time with the San Francisco Giants affiliate, Brundage spent four seasons with the IL’s Lehigh Valley IronPigs (Philadelphia Phillies Triple-A) compiling a 286-289 (.497) record while leading the club to an 85-58 record in 2016, the second-best mark in all Triple-A baseball. A former fourth-round selection by the Phillies in 1986, the Portland, Oregon native spent 10 seasons in the minors with the Phillies and Seattle Mariners organizations.

Joining Brundage’s staff will be pitching coach Pat Rice (Salt Lake Bees), coach Eric Martins (Las Vegas Aviators) and athletic trainer Dan Turner (El Paso). In his first season with the Bees, Rice previously served as pitching coach for the Double – A Mobile BayBears in 2018 and spent five years as the pitching coach for fellow-PCL club Fresno Grizzlies. Martins is currently in his fifth season overall as a hitting coach in the Oakland Athletics organization, and in his first year with the Aviators after spending the previous three seasons with the Nashville Sounds (2016-18) and one season with Double-A Midland of the Texas League in 2015. Turner rounds out the PCL field staff, serving as the athletic trainer, is in his ninth season with the Padres organization and has served as athletic trainer for the Chihuahuas over the last three years.

The RMHC Triple-A All-Star Game will be broadcast live on MLB Network. All-Star festivities in El Paso will begin with the Jarritos Triple-A Home Run Derby on Monday night, July 8.
