**Keep Cool
This Weekend
But Stay Off
The River**

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - With temperatures on the rise, a trip down the American River may sound like a great way to beat the heat, but, with water releases from the Nimbus Dam expected to be at or above 15,000 cubic feet per second (cfs), Sacramento County Regional Parks is warning residents to find other ways to beat the heat.

"Most raft rental companies in the area stop renting rafts to the public when planned releases from Nimbus Dam are between 8,000 - 10,000 cfs," said Liz Bellas, Director of Regional Parks. "A typical Sacramento summer sees outflows to the American River at around 2,000 cfs or less. Releasing about 15,000 cfs during the last week, it's just not safe for people to be on the river."

While the river may not be the safest way to cool down this weekend, there are other options.

"Staying cool when the weather is hot is very important", said Dr. Olivia Kasirye, Sacramento County Public Health Officer. "To stay cool, remember to take drinks of cool water, wear lightweight loose-fitting clothing, and limit your exposure to the sun by staying indoors in an air-conditioned place. Remember to also check on your neighbors if they are sick or elderly." Young children, the elderly and people with chronic disease conditions are more susceptible to the effects of the heat.

and many advanced to the California State Conference. Students competed in a variety of subjects, including: 3-D Visualization and Animation, Cybersecurity, Early Childhood Education, Interactive Application and Video Game Development, Medical Math, Robotics Urban Search and Rescue and several other areas. CTE pathways provide students with industry input, enriched subject learning and access to career opportunities.

Caring for Our Environment

Two student teams at Sacramento City Unified School District's George Washington Carver School of Arts and Science in Rancho Cordova placed in the Top 10 out of 550 proposals submitted at the Caring for Our Watersheds Competition! One student team submitted a proposal that would enhance habitats for bees and other pollinators while another team focused on ways to reduce waste at school. Both projects are already being implemented on campus by switching out plastic "spork" packets for real silverware and introducing a pollinator garden.

Riverview Robotics
Students from Rancho Cordova's Riverview STEM Academy joined together to create the Riverview Rockets team which competed in three tournaments in Davis, CA and came away

winning two design awards and a sportsmanship award. And get this – the team was invited to the state championship at Sierra College and placed 7th out of 11 teams in the competition!

One of our students from Riverview STEM who is on a middle school team, CyborgX with Riverview alumni got 1st place in the middle school category and went on to participate in the world championships!

The City of Rancho Cordova's Community Enhancement Fund has funded the school's robotics program for the past three years.

Spelling Whiz
Out of the Elk Grove Unified School District, we saw Robert J. McGarvey Elementary School student Swapnil Dasari take a deep dive into his dictionary to spell his way to the Regional Round Spelling Bee. Swapnil had to conquer spelling "behest," "fomented," "carpel," and more as he

Wilton History Group is Honored as Nonprofit of the Year

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - On Wednesday, June 5th, Assemblyman Ken Cooley (D-Rancho Cordova) honored the Wilton History Group as the 8th Assembly District's 2019 Nonprofit of the Year.

Each year, the California Legislature hosts the California Nonprofit Day Celebration to recognize the many nonprofit organizations that make significant contributions to their communities and California.

"The Wilton History Group is a jewel of the southern region of Sacramento County. The dedication of the Group's membership and volunteers clearly demonstrates the talent and pride these individuals have in preserving the rich history and hard work by our early settlers that created the Wilton community," said Assemblyman Cooley. "I am very proud to honor the Wilton History Group as this year's Nonprofit of the Year, and have the opportunity to share a local gem in our community."

The Wilton History Group was founded on December 10th, 2003 with the intent of collecting and preserving records of historical and sentimental value to the Wilton community. Named after Seth Wilton, a rancher who donated his land in 1908 for the building of the Central California Traction Railroad line, this group has been inspired to keep their small town history and values alive.

Wilton History Group utilizes a variety of research sources and detective skills to collect information

on Wilton's colorful history. Wilton residents often donate items left by elder family members, many of whom were original settlers of Wilton. The Wilton History Group is able to collect newspaper articles and artifacts from the Wilton area, such as original photographs which are duplicated on acid-free paper and stored in their archives for future generations to enjoy. Committee members and volunteers seek out the area's earliest residents to interview memorable occurrences in Wilton.

Wilton History Group generously gives back to the community with annual events, such as the Memorial Day Observance in late May at the Post Office and History Day in early October at Dillard Elementary School. At many of these events, the community enjoys various displays of local veterans and historical items that provide a strong sense of pride and respect for the people who had a dream and created Wilton.

"It's a grand honor for the Wilton History Group to

be recognized," said Edgar Monroy, President of the Wilton History Group. "We are genuinely humbled and energized to press on in our journey to preserve our beautiful history. The quality of giving defines the fiber of a good society, we are thankful to be part of this good process and humbled by the recognition."

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SMUD and CDFW Stock Thousands of Trout in Reservoirs

EL DORADO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - SMUD and the California Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW) are again stocking three Sierra reservoirs with rainbow trout. The fish planting will run into August with SMUD stocking 25,000 pounds of fish into Union Valley, Ice House and Loon Lake reservoirs in El Dorado County. This is the fifth consecutive summer SMUD and CDFW have combined efforts to stock the reservoirs.

The trout plants are intended to enhance angling opportunities for the public. Surveys say fishing tops the reasons folks visit the Crystal Basin Recreation Area. On average, the stocked trout weigh one to two pounds each, including some trophy fish. SMUD, along with the owners of the Ice House Resort, have installed the “Crystal Basin Bragging Board” where anglers can post pictures of their catch from Crystal Basin reservoirs. There is also a scale available if anglers wish to weigh their catch and claim biggest-fish bragging rights. Anglers are also encouraged to tag SMUD on social media and show off their catch.

SMUD proactively works to improve the quality of life in El Dorado County, where many SMUD employees call home and work, and where the electric utility owns and operates the Upper American

River Project (UARP), a system of hydro-electric generation facilities.

SMUD was awarded a new 50-year license by the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) in 2014 to continue operating the UARP, which provides nearly 700 megawatts of low-cost, clean, non-carbon-emitting hydro power, enough to provide about 15 to 20 percent of SMUD’s energy capacity during an average water year.

The fish-stocking effort helps SMUD meet conditions of operating its FERC license for the UARP.

SMUD will coordinate six separate trout plantings starting in early June and continuing into early August. Union Valley, the largest of the three reservoirs, will get 9,600 pounds; Loon Lake, 7,750 pounds; and Ice House, 7,650. The fish provided by SMUD will come from Mount Lassen Trout Farms of Payne’s Creek. The company also stocks SMUD’s Rancho Seco Lake, which annually hosts the very popular Trout Derby.

Fishing licenses are available for purchase from more than 1,400 license agents throughout the state and can also be obtained online at wildlife.ca.gov/licensing.

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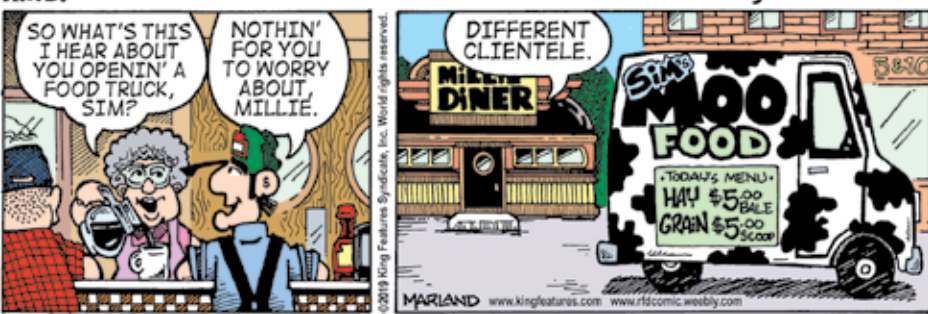
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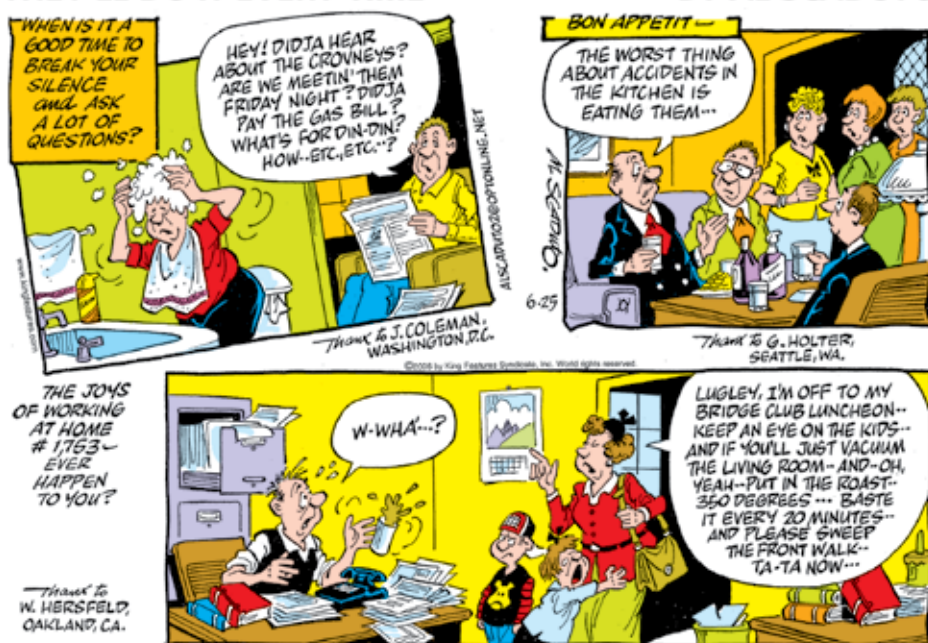


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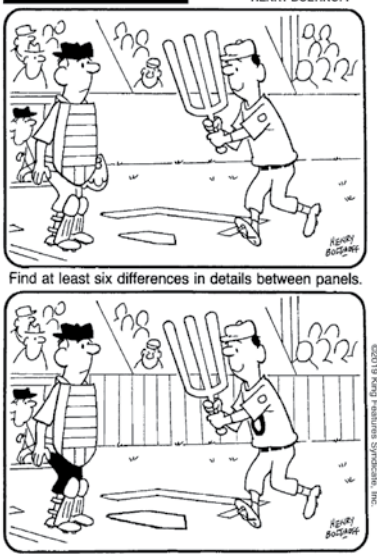

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Thousands of Distracted Drivers ‘Caught in the Act’

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - Despite a state-wide public education campaign about the dangers of distracted driving, the California Highway Patrol (CHP) issued 19,850 citations during the month of April to drivers who violated California’s hands-free cell phone laws. This total represents a 3.6 percent increase from April 2018. As part of the campaign, the CHP identified two statewide, zero-tolerance enforcement days, April 4 and 19. During that time, the CHP issued 2,459 citations to drivers for violating the handsfree law.

The CHP, the California Office of Traffic Safety (OTS), Impact Teen Drivers (ITD), local law enforcement, and other traffic safety partners worked together throughout Distracted Driving Awareness Month to educate drivers on the dangers of distracted driving. Only statistics from the CHP were available for release.

In addition to phones, other serious distractions include eating, grooming, applying makeup, reaching for fallen objects, using a vehicle’s touchscreen, knobs, dials or buttons, changing clothes, or any other task that takes your eyes or mind off the road.

“Citations are just one tool law enforcement has at its disposal for combating driver distraction,” said CHP Commissioner Warren Stanley. “Our ultimate goal is compliance with California’s handsfree law so

that nothing diverts a driver’s attention or interferes with their ability to safely operate a vehicle.”

The OTS continued its “Go Safely, California” public awareness campaign for the month of April and early part of May with a focus on distracted driving. The education effort included TV and radio spots, social media posts, and outdoor billboards with messages encouraging Californians to put down the phone while driving.

“Drivers on their cell phone are a stubborn problem that will continue to require extensive education about the dangers and enforcement of laws against using cell phones behind the wheel,” OTS Director Rhonda Craft said. “It is a bad habit that may be hard for some to break, but is something that far too often leads to tragic consequences,” she added

ITD, a Sacramento-based nonprofit that educates teens on the dangers of reckless and distracted driving, kicked off Distracted Driving Awareness Month with a Teen Safe Driving Roundtable at California State University, Sacramento. ITD hosted the event with the CHP and the National Transportation Safety Board to discuss ways to improve teen driver safety where driver distraction is the primary cause of crashes.

“Seventy-five percent of teen fatal car crashes do not involve drugs or alcohol but everyday behaviors become lethal when a new inexperienced driver chooses to engage in them behind the wheel,” said ITD Executive

Director Dr. Kelly Browning.

The OTS hosted an event April 12 at Sacramento’s Inderkum High School to educate students on the importance of driving free of distractions. Students even had the chance to experience first-hand how distractions impact your driving ability through simulator goggles.

The OTS is holding a statewide distracted driving video and billboard contest for high school students, with \$15,000 in total cash prizes. All California high school students ages 14 to 20 are eligible to participate. The OTS is still accepting entries through May 20. For details on rules and how to enter, visit gosafelyca.org.

Distracted driving remains a top concern for California drivers. According to a 2018 public opinion survey conducted by University of California, Berkeley, nearly half of all drivers surveyed listed distracted driving because of texting or talking on a cell phone as their biggest safety concern on roads.

“Many drivers understand the risks they take looking at or using their phone, but do it anyway,” Director Craft said. “Drivers must use self-discipline and make it a habit to stay off the phone.”

California has had distracted driving laws since 2008. The CHP, the OTS, and ITD remind drivers that under the handsfree cell phone law, drivers are not allowed to hold a wireless telephone or electronic communications device while operating a vehicle. Drivers under the age of 18 are not allowed to use a cell phone for any reason, including hands-free. ★

Regional Parks Open Space Safety Tips

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Sacramento County Regional Parks offers miles and miles of multi-use trails and over 15,000 acres of open spaces for residents and visitors to explore. Whether hiking, biking or horseback riding, we want to make sure our parkway users are safely enjoying our beautiful open spaces.

Here are some tips to help you do just that: Pay attention to your surroundings; Bikes are not allowed on unpaved trails outside of the off-paved cycling area; Horses are only allowed on the equestrian trails; Pedestrians should use the left shoulder of paved trails when available;

Make yourself known; Bikers – use your voice and/or bells to let others know you are approaching; Horseback Riders – call ahead and communicate to other trail users how to approach; Hikers/Walkers/Runners – make eye contact with other trail users. Don’t be afraid to say “hello!”; Make sure you can hear other trail users. This may mean limiting the use of headphones/earbuds;

Know who has the right of way. Those traveling uphill and horses have the right

of way. If traveling downhill on a narrow path, step aside to allow uphill traffic to pass. When necessary, travel single files and do not block the trail.

Watch your speed. The MAXIMUM speed on Regional Parks multi-use trails is 15 mph. If you can’t see well ahead of you, slow down!

All dogs must be on leashes. Leashes must be no more than 6 feet in length;

Yield to horses and don’t crouch. Horses are naturally skittish animals; always ask for permission before approaching or touching a horse. Watch out for snakes. As the weather warms up, the snakes come out.

Obey all posted signs; Emergency call boxes can be found along the multi-use trail. If you require assistance and are not near an emergency call box, call 911. For non-emergencies, you can call 916-875-PARK (7275) or make a report through 311.

Other tips for enjoying your Regional Parks: Please do not litter. Take out what you bring in; Be kind to your surroundings; Be careful when touching plants and do not remove them from the ground.

Tips to Keep Teen Drivers Safe While Driving

WALNUT CREEK, CA (MPG) - The 100 days between Memorial Day and Labor Day are considered the most dangerous for teen drivers. In the past five years, during that time, nearly 3,500 people across the country were killed in crashes involving teen drivers.

New data analyzed by the AAA Foundation for Traffic Safety reveals that the three most common behaviors that contribute to the spike in teen crashes during the summer months are speed, impaired driving, and distracted driving.

Following are some impressive facts on the issue:

More than a quarter (28%) of teen crashes involve speeding; One in six (17%) teen drivers test positive for alcohol in fatal crashes; More than half (60%) of teen crashes involve distraction.

“As an advocate for safe roads, AAA wants parents and guardians to be concerned about scary, but true, teen driving statistics,” said Michael Blasky, spokesperson for AAA Northern California. “Through education, training, and parental

Using a Good Router

Last week we provided 10 Safety Best Practices to keep your MAC or PC free from outside threats. Number 1 on that list was to put your computer behind a good router.

What is the Router anyway?

Part 1. A modem that converts the signals coming from your ISP into an ethernet format that the router will use to provide signal to your local area network (LAN).

Part 2. The actual router with (at least) one Wide Area Network (WAN) port that takes the ethernet signal from the ISP and splits it up into 4 or more ports on the LAN. These LAN ports are used to attach the "wired" computers, printers, and other devices in your home or business. If more wired devices need to be added, then connect a "switch" to one of the LAN ports and more devices can connect to the switch.

Part 3. A WiFi section that allows you to connect even more devices wirelessly to your LAN.

For most homes and businesses the router is a combination device that your Internet Service Provider (ISP) gave you when the internet connection was installed. It typically combines at least 3 things:

a funnel where all of the wired and wirelessly connected devices on your LAN have their signals combined into a stream of data that goes out the WAN port(s) to your ISP who sends it to the internet.

Remember that all the wired and WiFi traffic has only the WAN port(s) to get to the internet. So the higher the speed that your ISP has provided, the more devices you can add and the faster they will be.

To picture how it works, imagine

Inside the Router

The secret sauce in the router that provides more internet safety to you is Network Address Translation (NAT). That is the programming that makes sure that the data coming and going to the internet through your router's WAN port(s) finds its way to the correct LAN port that made the original request. You wouldn't want the website content from another workstation to show up on your computer by accident would you? NAT programming ensures that that won't happen.

It does it by giving each port on the LAN its own address. Because the address your ISP assigns to you is not the address your router uses to manage your devices, the result is that you are much safer behind your router than if the computer was just sitting on the internet without it in between.

It's not perfect protection, but it cuts back attack threats significantly. And thanks to your ISP, you're most likely getting it automatically.

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There Really Are No Trump Mysteries

The surprise about the big New York Times story on Donald Trump's tax returns is that there are no real surprises. Trump's taxes have been an obsession of the left since he, in violation of a long-standing norm, reneged on his promise to release his returns during the 2016 campaign. Democrats counted as one of the advantages of taking the House that they could demand Trump's returns. The dispute resulting from the administration's refusal to turn them over is now probably headed to the Supreme Court. All the while, the expectation, or at least the suspicion, was that the returns contained some awful secret, perhaps evidence that he is a tool of the Russians. And here, The New York Times has obtained Trump's tax information spanning a decade from the mid-1980s to mid-1990s, and the revelation is that

he wasn't doing as well as he said in public and lost a boatload of money in a period that nearly destroyed him. In other words, exactly what anyone paying any attention would have expected. Yes, the amount of the reported loss, \$1.17 billion, is remarkable (although inflated for tax purposes) and some of the details memorable, but can anyone say that they are surprised? Trump himself, the Washington Examiner notes, talked about his precarious financial state in this period on the first episode of "The Apprentice." In fact, he may have exaggerated, saying that he had been "billions of dollars." in debt. As for Trump's use of tax loopholes, he said in a debate with Hillary Clinton that if he didn't owe any tax liability, that made him "smart." There really are no Trump mysteries. His flaws aren't hidden away. He often attests to them himself, or demonstrates them publicly. For someone who cares so much about his image, and so assiduously crafts it, he's a relative open book. No blockbuster report has more than a passing effect because each dispatch is, ultimately, another dot in a pointillist portrait of the president that was largely completed long ago.

This is also why the hope that we are one investigation, tax return or subpoena away from the revelation that will finally bring Trump down -- or even make a difference -- is almost certainly forlorn. Obviously, it was news that he had paid off a porn star during the presidential campaign, and highly embarrassing. This is why Trump denied it for so long. But he'd already told us about his womanizing in his own words, often on "The Howard Stern Show." Likewise, the most blameworthy conduct regarding Russia's election interference in 2016 was out in the open -- the Trump campaign was happy to derive any possible advantage from the WikiLeaks disclosures, and Trump tried to deny the obvious Russian involvement. We didn't need a 400-page special counsel report to break this news. None of this is to defend or excuse Trump's business practices, or his conduct in office. It is merely to say that he's an extravagantly known quantity, and will likely win or lose in 2020 based on what we already know rather than the fruits of further investigation and fact-finding. Defendant Convicted for Series of Armed Robberies
DATE: May 30, 2019
CASE: Alvon Surrell (Case #16FE011674)
PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Sydne Jones, Career Criminal Prosecution Unit

Alvon Surrell was convicted by a jury of four counts of robbery. The jury also found true allegations that Surrell personally used a firearm in the commission of the robberies, and that he suffered two prior strike convictions for robbery. On March 17, 2016, Alvon Surrell entered a bank in Antelope. Surrell pulled a gun from his backpack, pointed it at the teller and demanded she give him the money in her cash drawer. Surrell then ordered the victim to go to the bank vault before fleeing with approximately \$4,600. On March 26, 2016, Surrell returned to the same bank and robbed another teller at gunpoint. As Surrell was leaving the bank, he ordered another bank employee to go into the back room before fleeing with approximately \$975. On April 9, 2016, Surrell entered a Walgreens in Antelope, pointed a gun at an employee and ordered the victim to give him money from the store safe. Surrell fled the store with approximately \$4,500. On April 22, 2016, Surrell entered a Walgreens in North Highlands. He again pointed a gun at an employee and ordered the victim to give him money from the store safe. Surrell fled the store with approximately \$4,500. Surrell will be sentenced under California's Three Strikes Law and faces a maximum sentence of 120 years to life in prison. Sentencing is set for June 21, 2019, at 9:00 a.m. in Department 36 before the Honorable Stephen Acquisto.

the victim's mother was working. The night of the incident, the victim's mother came home from work at 4:00 a.m. and found the three-and-a-half-year-old victim was awake and terrified. The victim told her mother how Wells had hurt her. The victim's mother immediately took the victim to the hospital. Law enforcement responded, and the victim underwent a sexual assault exam. DNA evidence collected during the exam was a match to Wells. Wells faces a maximum sentence of 33 years to life in prison. Sentencing is set for June 12, 2019, at 1:30 p.m. in Department 31 before the Honorable Geritt Wood.

Defendant Convicted for Barbershop Murder
DATE: May 7, 2019
CASE: Dwayne Sullivan (Case #18FE000912)
PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Maria Wilson, Gangs & Hate Crimes Unit

Dwayne Sullivan was convicted by a jury of the first-degree murder of Terryon Bean and personally using a firearm in the course of that murder. Sullivan was also convicted of being a felon in possession of firearm and the jury found that Sullivan had been previously convicted of negligently discharging a firearm, which is a strike under California law. On January 13, 2018, the victim went to the Upgrades Cuts & Styles barbershop for his weekly haircut. Dwayne Sullivan entered the barbershop, walked directly toward the victim and shot the victim multiple times at point blank range before fleeing. The victim was transported to the hospital and died 18 days later. Detectives reviewed video from a neighboring business and observed Sullivan walking toward the barbershop. About 10-15 seconds later, Sullivan ran from the barbershop, jumped into the passenger side of a car and fled. Detectives sent out an Information Bulletin with still shots captured on the neighboring business's surveillance system. Sullivan's probation officer recognized him and notified detectives. Sullivan faces a maximum sentence of 80 years to life in prison. Sentencing is set for May 31, 2019, at 9:00 a.m. in Department 29 before the Honorable Geoffrey Goodman. ★
