SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - Homelessness and housing instability forces families to make hard choices about the necessities of life and can make a significant impact on a family's overall well-being. For families receiving reunification and family maintenance services through child welfare, Sacramento County is helping to address these housing needs with the Bringing Families Home housing program.

The goal of this program is to reduce the number of families experiencing homelessness, increase family reunification, and prevent foster care placements.

Bringing Families Home is a California Department of Social Services grantfunded program that began July 2017 and has already supported 87 families in need of housing services. Over the next year, the program will secure hous-

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - The Playmakers Organization is a local nonprofit that coaches character through leadership and provides free programs to underprivileged and at-risk youth. Playmakers hosted their 10th annual fundraising dinner on Saturday, April 27 at Divine Savior Church in Orangevale.

The evening's festivities included live and silent auctions to raise money for the organization. Proceeds from the event will fund Playmakers' free six-week all-day Summer Character Academy. Playmakers founder Greg "Coach Roz" Roeszler said, "We seek out the kids whose families cannot afford any kind of summer enrichment, so it is extremely important we have funding for our trained coaches and volunteers." The Summer Character Academy will serve at least 100 kids, teaching them teamwork and improving their self-confidence.

Phil Oates, part-owner of the Sacramento Kings, was the keynote speaker of the event. Oates explained that the most important part of coaching is character development. He said, "Coaches sacrifice for their teams and always put the kids first."

"Playmakers are making a difference for kids," said Oates. "They are very fiscally responsible with the contributions they receive. ... They'll make you proud."

The dinner was donated by Chicago Fire and was served by players from the Rio Americano and El Camino football teams. The teams are working together as part of a unique reconciliation effort after a brawl last season forced them to forfeit the final game.

The fundraiser's title sponsor was Fitguard president Ryan Meier. Playmakers sponsor Harrison Phillips of the Buffalo Bills was honored at the event, and Stanford defensive linemen Michael Williams and Jovan Swahn attended as honored guests.

Thanks to many generous donations, Playmakers raised more than \$30,000 to fund their Summer Character Academy. The largest donations came from the Country Club Optimists and the Azevedo Foundation.

Coach Roz thanked Playmakers civic group participants — Rotary, Optimists, and Lions — and all of the donors and volunteers for making it possible to help so many kids in the region. "Sometimes kids need extra attention. It's about investing time," said Coach Roz. "That's what we do at Playmakers. That's what we do as coaches. We never give up on the kids." \star



There Really Are No Trump Mysteries

The surprise about the big New York Times story on Donald Trump's tax returns is that there are no real surprises.

Trump's taxes have been an obsession of the left since he, in violation of a long-standing norm, reneged on his promise to release his returns during the 2016 campaign.

Democrats counted as one of the advantages of taking the House that they could demand Trump's returns. The dispute resulting from the administration's refusal to turn them over is now probably headed to the Supreme Court.

All the while, the expectation, or at least the suspicion, was that the returns contained some awful secret, perhaps evidence that he is a tool of the Russians.

And here, The New York Times has obtained Trump's tax information spanning a decade from the mid-1980s to mid-1990s, and the revelation is that he wasn't doing as well as he said in public and lost a boatload of money in a period that nearly destroyed him. In other words, exactly what anyone paying any attention would have expected.

Yes, the amount of the reported loss, \$1.17 billion, is remarkable (although inflated for tax purposes) and some of the details memorable, but can anyone say that they are surprised?

Trump himself, the Washington Examiner notes, talked about his precarious financial state in this period on the first episode of "The Apprentice." In fact, he may have exaggerated, saying that he had been "billions of dollars." in debt.

As for Trump's use of tax loopholes, he said in a debate with Hillary Clinton that if he didn't owe any tax liability, that made him "smart."

There really are no Trump mysteries. His flaws aren't hidden away. He often attests to them himself, or demonstrates them publicly. For someone who cares so much about his image, and so assiduously crafts it, he's a relative open book.

No blockbuster report has more than a passing effect because each dispatch is, ultimately, another dot in a pointillist portrait of the president that was largely completed long ago. This is also why the hope that we are one investigation, tax return or subpoena away from the revelation that will finally bring Trump down -- or even make a difference -- is almost certainly forlorn.

Obviously, it was news that he had paid off a porn star during the presidential campaign, and highly embarrassing. This is why Trump denied it for so long. But he'd already told us about his womanizing in his own words, often on "The Howard Stern Show."

Likewise, the most blameworthy conduct regarding Russia's election interference in 2016 was out in the open -- the Trump campaign was happy to derive any possible advantage from the WikiLeaks disclosures, and Trump tried to deny the obvious Russian involvement.

We didn't need a 400page special counsel report to break this news.

None of this is to defend or excuse Trump's business practices, or his conduct in office. It is merely to say that he's an extravagantly known quantity, and will likely win or lose in 2020 based on what we already know rather than the fruits of further investigation and fact-finding.

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Antiques Roadshow Returned to Sacramento

SACRAMENTO CA (MPG) -Approximately 22,000 people sent emails in hopes that they would be selected to have their treasures appraised when Antiques Roadshow pulled into Sacramento and set up shop Monday, May 13th at Crocker Art Museum. Two thousand pairs of tickets were distributed to fans and casual viewers from the Sacramento area and far beyond. Each person was invited to bring two items for appraisal, along with the story behind each object.

This is the show's second visit to Sacramento. and according to one lucky viewer and collector of treasures who won tickets both times, this visit was quite different. The first time, the event was held in the Convention Center nearly ten years ago and long lines were normal.

"This time, Antiques Roadshow was a welloiled machine," said Mattie, who has watched the show since its inception and followed its precursor, "The Collectors."

"We didn't have to search for parking because a parking lot was reserved for attendees and a shuttle bus took us to and from the Crocker."

The show issued tickets with times spaced thirty minutes apart, which helped keep lines to a minimum, although some lines were definitely busier than others. The clock appraisers were hoping for people, while lines for Asian art, jewelry, and paintings were longer.

Defendant Convicted for Multiple Shootings, Attempted Murders DATE: May 16, 2019 CASE: Leo Austin Carrillo

(Case #17FE012477) **PROSECUTOR:** Deputy District Attorney Matthew Moore, Career **Criminal Prosecution Unit**

Leo Austin Carrillo was convicted by a jury of two counts of attempted first-degree murder, assault with a semi-automatic firearm, felon in possession of a firearm and ammunition, and hit and run causing injury. The jury also found true allegations that Carrillo personally used a firearm and inflicted great bodily injury.

On June 24, 2017, Leo Austin Carrillo got into an argument with the victims outside of the Bonfare Market. When the victims left the market, Carrillo followed them in his car and fired multiple shots at them. Two of the bullets hit one of the victims, causing serious injuries.

On July 4, 2017, Carrillo drove past a house while his front passenger fired several shots at a group of people in front of the house. One of the bullets grazed the victim's head. As Carrillo was driving away from the shooting, he struck a car driven by an unrelated citizen. The passenger in that car, who was pregnant, was injured and taken to a hospital.

Carrillo was on probation for a 2016 robbery conviction at the time of these offenses.

An allegation that Carrillo suffered a prior strike conviction for robbery will be determined at the sentencing hearing. If that allegation is found true, Carrillo faces a maximum sentence of 120 years to life in prison. Sentencing is set for June 14, 2019, at 1:30 p.m. in Department 41 before the Honorable Helena Gweon.

Defendants Convicted for Murder at Surf Motel

DATE: May 14, 2019 CASE: James Martin Baca & Rebecca Irene Temme (Case #17FE005228) **PROSECUTOR:** Principal Criminal Attorney Caroline Park, Homicide Unit

James Martin Baca and Rebecca Irene Temme were convicted by a jury of the first-degree murder of Leonora Montoya with the special circumstance that the murder was committed during the commission of a robbery. Baca and Temme were also convicted of two counts of robbery. The jury found that Baca personally used a firearm in the course of the murder and robberies. Baca was also convicted of being a felon in possession of a firearm and his prior strike conviction for burglary was found true.

On March 19, 2017, the defendants met the victims in the North Sacramento area and drove to the Surf Motel for a tattoo. Upon entering the room, James Martin Baca pointed a gun at the victims and demanded their cell phones. The defendants also demanded Ms. Montoya's car keys. When Ms. Montoya didn't comply, Baca shot her. Both defendants then rummaged through Ms. Montoya's pockets, took her car keys and fled in her car. The defendants were later located in Redwood City. With the assistance of law enforcement agencies in Redwood City, Menlo Park, and CHP the defendants were apprehended after a vehicle and foot pursuit.

Baca's criminal history includes convictions for assault with a deadly weapon; possessing dangerous weapons; destroying or concealing evidence for the benefit of a street gang; battery against a peace officer; possession of dirk or dagger; threatening a public officer; and domestic violence.

Temme's criminal history includes convictions for battery upon a peace officer while in custody; aggravated battery while in custody; felony evading a peace officer; and felony vehicle theft.

Both defendants face a maximum sentence of life in prison without the possibility of parole. Sentencing is set for June 28, 2019, at 11:00 a.m. in Department 34 before the Honorable Ernest Sawtelle.



Modern Warfare 2 Doesn't Feel So Modern

There's no better way to tell how far you've come than by looking behind you, and by replaying the singleplayer story of 2009's Call of Duty: Modern Warfare 2, it's easy to see how much video game design has changed and progressed over the past decade.

Modern Warfare 2 is, to this day, often considered to have the best single-player story and level design of any Call of Duty, and is frequently regarded as the peak of the shooter design in the late 2000's. It includes famous levels like "Cliffhanger," a stealthy snowstorm infiltration of an enemy base, and "No Russian," the controversial chapter that forces players, embodying a secret American agent, to participate in a terrorist attack so as not to blow their cover. The variety and production values are truly impressive, weaving a consistent story throughout a Michael Bay-like series of action sequences.

And yet, even playing on the relatively easy "normal" difficulty, I found myself dying over and over rather than living the dream of being the best soldier on the battlefield. The habits programmed into me by the past ten years of first-person shooters (including some of the more recent Call of Duty games) were not easily undone; my fingers have learned to dance across the controller or keyboard, jumping, leaping, and dodging past bullets in a ballet of movement and agility. Modern Warfare 2, instead, asks me to sit behind a wall, peak out every few seconds to pop off a few enemies, and retreat behind the wall again.

As a result, used to the aggressive forward momentum of 2016's Doom or the agile acrobatics of Titanfall 2, I found myself rushing headlong into the bullets like an over-militarized Captain America...and dying time and time again for my transgression.

While these later shooters create dynamic systems that allow for improvisation and selfexpression, Modern Warfare 2 feels obsessed with controlling the player. You're funneled from encounter to encounter, all of which play out in almost exactly the same way for every person.

This strategy has not aged well. Plenty of video games feel tailored to create a power fantasy, but, crucially, Modern Warfare 2's fantasy includes little of the player themselves. Playing Doom or Titanfall 2, I'm trained, through clever design, to think like my avatar would, and because of the systems' room for improvisation and openendedness, the avatar, in turn, behaves how I think. In Modern Warfare 2,

that relationship is onesided; I might be forced to embody my military action hero, but developer Infinity Ward's vision of that hero's mechanics is so specific that the action hero fails to bring any of the person behind the buttons into the game world

That wasn't necessarily a problem at the time; Modern Warfare 2 was released at a period of tremendous innovation where developers were just starting to figure out how to tell robust cinematic stories in games. But more recent shooters have shown us that we can have our cake and eat it too, that we can both tell cinematic, engaging stories with thrilling moments and leave room for the player to selfexpress (something that other video game genres in 2009 time had already learned). As a result, despite its major significance for aficionados of video game history, Modern Warfare 2 feels reduced from its pedestal as one of the best first-person shooter experiences in gaming to a merely entertaining diversion.
