Sacramento County, CPS Address Family Homelessness

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - Homelessness and housing instability forces families to make hard choices about the necessities of life and can make a significant impact on a family's overall well-being. For families receiving reunification and family maintenance services through child welfare, Sacramento County is helping to address these housing needs with the Bringing Families Home housing program.

The goal of this program is to reduce the number of families experiencing homelessness, increase family reunification, and prevent foster care placements.

Bringing Families Home is a California Department of Social Services grant-funded program that began July 2017 and has already supported 87 families in need of housing services. Over the next year, the program will secure housing for a minimum of 100 Sacramento County families who are completing court-ordered services and working towards family reunification.

"Housing is a basic need and when parents are experiencing homelessness and housing instability, this need is often prioritized over the required services needed for reunification," said Sacramento County Program Planner, Niku Mohanty-Campbell.

To address the housing needs of Child Protective Services families, the Sacramento County Department of Child, Family and Adult Services has partnered with the County's Department of Human Assistance along with the Sacramento Housing and Redevelopment Agency, and other organizations to provide families with an initial assessment, service and support to obtain housing, and short term case management once housing is located.

Launching in May, FHP will help resolve homelessness for up to 600 households.

On Friday, June 14, the United States Army will celebrate its 244th birthday! Many people will come and join in the Celebration of the Army's Birthday Cake Cutting Ceremony from 10 AM to noon at Village Green Park, 3141 Bridgeway Drive in Rancho Cordova. The flyer I received said that there will be refreshments provided. On June 14, 1775, the Second Continental Congress formed the Continental Army as a means for the 13 unified American colonies to fight the forces of Britain. George Washington was unanimously elected Commander-in-Chief of the fledgling Army, and he would lead the colonies to victory and independence. The Army's soldiers have fought and many have died throughout the centuries in the many wars and skirmishes that have been part of our country's history. American soldiers are honored for their vigor and bravery in combat.

In the Josephson Institute writings, I read a commentary called "Making Lives." It said, "A speaker, a former middle school teacher named Taylor Mali, who was talking about the topic of education came up and a successful business executive said, 'The problem with our education system starts with teachers. What can we expect from people who think teaching is the best way to make a living? Those who

can, do. Those who can't teach.' A guest protested, 'I've been a teacher for 20 years, and that's simplistic and unfair.' 'Really?' the executive said. 'Then be honest, what do you make?' 'I suppose you are thinking of money,' the teacher replied. 'I earn enough, but let me tell you what I make. I make children read, write, wonder, and talk about important things - such as the world and their role in it. I make them appreciate the value of education so they will become interested and interesting lifelong learners able to find out whatever they want to know. I make them try things they think they can't do, work harder than they want to and accomplish more than they thought possible and, whenever they do their best, I make them feel proud, capable and worthy. I make them understand that the quality of their life will be determined by their choices, and I make them take responsibility for their actions. I make them appreciate the importance of integrity and honor in a world that too often shows little regard for either.'"

I could continue to quote more of what Mr. Mali said, but I just wanted to stop there and say I agree with him about teachers and how much more they do than they are given credit for. Unfortunately, so many teachers today aren't able to continue teaching because of disrespect and stress that they never thought would be part of their planned teaching career. I think that all of us can think of a teacher from our past who maybe gave us the encouragement and support that was needed

at a critical time during our lives. And remember, the first teachers of our lives were our parents, and the first teachers of your children's lives are you.

This year, Memorial Day is being honored and celebrated on Monday, May 27. This Memorial Day will be a combination of last Veterans Day and Memorial Day, because as you know, we had to cancel our Veterans Day Observance last year because of the terrible smoke in the air from the Camp Fire. We will be celebrating the 100th birthday of Mather Air Force Base and Mather Field and its history. We will read the names on the bricks from last November and then have the regular ceremony for the bricks this year.

Something that really struck me was the picture on the cover of the May issue of Comstock's Magazine. Artist Shane Grammer painted portraits of what was remaining of the lives of people who lived in Paradise, California, and photographer Terence Duffy documented it through pictures. I am paraphrasing some of what the article said but in essence, the photographer drove through a neighborhood in Paradise, got back in his motel room, and he said he began touching things around him and feeling how tactile it was. "Then I went to go wash my face and saw how much soot was on me and I looked in the mirror, and I just lost it," Duffy said.

From the photos in the article, to me, it looked like the artist had painted the faces of some of the people who lost everything there. He was able to put a face on the side of a



There Really Are No Trump Mysteries

The surprise about the big New York Times story on Donald Trump's tax returns is that there are no real surprises.

Trump's taxes have been an obsession of the left since he, in violation of a long-standing norm, reneged on his promise to release his returns during the 2016 campaign.

Democrats counted as one of the advantages of taking the House that they could demand Trump's returns. The dispute resulting from the administration's refusal to turn them over is now probably headed to the Supreme Court.

All the while, the expectation, or at least the suspicion, was that the returns contained some awful secret, perhaps evidence that he is a tool of the Russians.

And here, The New York Times has obtained Trump's tax information spanning a decade from the mid-1980s to mid-1990s, and the revelation is that

he wasn't doing as well as he said in public and lost a boatload of money in a period that nearly destroyed him. In other words, exactly what anyone paying any attention would have expected.

Yes, the amount of the reported loss, \$1.17 billion, is remarkable (although inflated for tax purposes) and some of the details memorable, but can anyone say that they are surprised?

Trump himself, the Washington Examiner notes, talked about his precarious financial state in this period on the first episode of "The Apprentice." In fact, he may have exaggerated, saying that he had been "billions of dollars." in debt.

As for Trump's use of tax loopholes, he said in a debate with Hillary Clinton that if he didn't owe any tax liability, that made him "smart."

There really are no Trump mysteries. His flaws aren't hidden away. He often attests to them himself, or demonstrates them publicly. For someone who cares so much about his image, and so assiduously crafts it, he's a relative open book.

No blockbuster report has more than a passing effect because each dispatch is, ultimately, another dot in a pointillist portrait of the president that was largely completed long ago.

This is also why the hope that we are one investigation, tax return or subpoena away from the revelation that will finally bring Trump down -- or even make a difference -- is almost certainly forlorn.

Obviously, it was news that he had paid off a porn star during the presidential campaign, and highly embarrassing. This is why Trump denied it for so long. But he'd already told us about his womanizing in his own words, often on "The Howard Stern Show."

Likewise, the most blameworthy conduct regarding Russia's election interference in 2016 was out in the open -- the Trump campaign was happy to derive any possible advantage from the WikiLeaks disclosures, and Trump tried to deny the obvious Russian involvement.

We didn't need a 400-page special counsel report to break this news.

None of this is to defend or excuse Trump's business practices, or his conduct in office. It is merely to say that he's an extravagantly known quantity, and will likely win or lose in 2020 based on what we already know rather than the fruits of further investigation and fact-finding.

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Big Day of Giving

SRCF Expressed Gratitude for Generosity of Sponsors

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - During this past Big Day of Giving, nonprofits in the Sacramento region raised nearly \$8.4 million from over 23,000 donors who gave 44,000 donations, exceeding the \$7.4 million raised last year and bringing the total generated since the inception of this annual giving day to nearly \$40 million.

“Yesterday, our community came together to celebrate the nonprofits that strengthen our region and build a better Sacramento area for everyone who lives here,” said Linda Beech Cutler, chief executive of the Sacramento Region Community Foundation, which has organized the day-long giving challenge since its beginning in 2013, when research demonstrated local philanthropy lagged national averages.

“When we launched Big Day of Giving, we aimed to grow giving in the capital area by making philanthropy something everyone in our community feels they can do. All these years later, it is incredibly heartening to see a philanthropic spirit thriving,” said Cutler.

“This community-wide movement is successful when the people who live here make a difference by chipping in to give back – during Big Day of Giving and every other day of the year, too,” she said, noting that the majority of the donations

made through the Big Day of Giving website were under \$50.

In all, nonprofits in the capital area generated \$8,357,897* on May 2, and each of the 601 participating nonprofits received donations.

The organizations that topped the leaderboard represent a breadth of nonprofit sectors – the arts, human services, youth development, the environment, and animal services:

The amount each participating nonprofit raised is available to view on the website.

Along with helping nonprofits raise much-needed funds, the Foundation offers a robust training program to help build the capacity of participating nonprofits in areas such as donor engagement, board development,

collaboration, marketing outreach, and storytelling prior to Big Day of Giving.

“Big Day of Giving has been essential to our work,” said Nicholas Haystings, Executive Director of Square Root Academy, which raised \$8,335 on May 2 to fund the free STEM education it offers in underserved Sacramento neighborhoods. “We are a relatively new organization, so the Big Day of Giving networking and skill-building trainings have been essential to helping our small staff engage new supporters and grow interest in our programs—which means we can focus more on growing our impact.”

Gifts made during Big Day of Giving 2019 will fund diverse services throughout the region. Along with Square Root Academy’s classes, Big Day of Giving

donations will make possible Runnin’ For Rhett’s purchase of 682 pairs of running shoes to educate area youth about the value of living a healthy lifestyle. Donations will also fund 14 weeks of Food Literacy Center’s classes at a local school, and ensure thousands of high school baseball players can access Keep Playing Baseball’s resources to succeed as collegiate student-athletes.

Nonprofit organizations held more than 100 events throughout the region to promote their missions and generate donations on Big Day of Giving, many of which were the result of collaborations between multiple participating organizations and local businesses. Creating alliances like these among nonprofits is a key goal of the Foundation’s initiative to strengthen the

nonprofit sector, Expanding Philanthropy and the Social Economy.

In addition to Big Day of Giving donations raised off of the website and during events—which organizations had to add to their totals—many participating nonprofits raised pools of match funds to motivate day-of gifts; this year, organizations raised almost \$1.5 million in matching funds.

Donors who gave through Donor Advised Funds at the Foundation and its partner, Yolo Community Foundation, made a significant impact during this year’s giving day, too. In all, gifts from Foundation fundholders totaled \$758,290 of the final tally.

Big Day of Giving was made possible with lead sponsorship by Western Health Advantage, in

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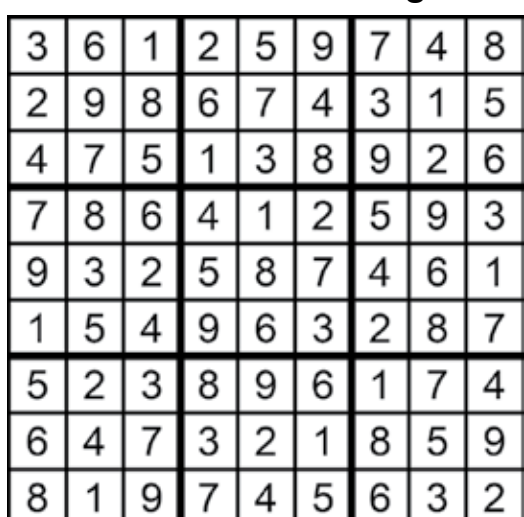
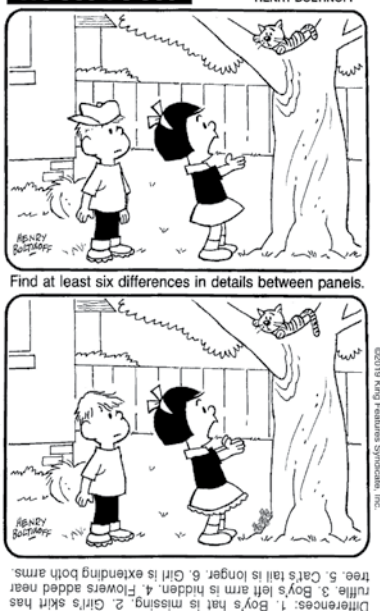
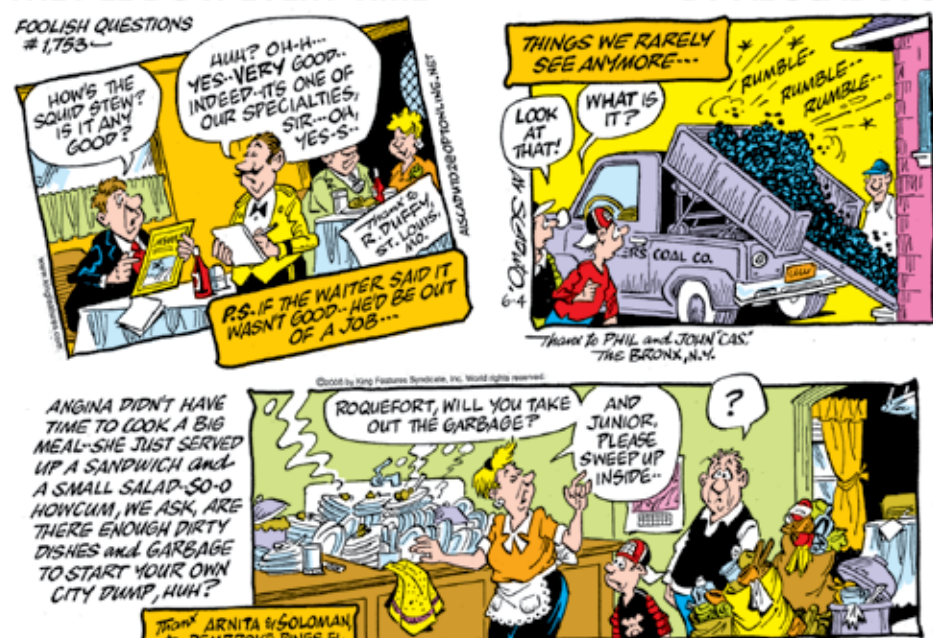
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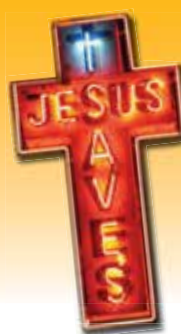
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Antiques Roadshow Returned to Sacramento

SACRAMENTO CA (MPG) - Approximately 22,000 people sent emails in hopes that they would be selected to have their treasures appraised when *Antiques Roadshow* pulled into Sacramento and set up shop Monday, May 13th at Crocker Art Museum. Two thousand pairs of tickets were distributed to fans and casual viewers from the Sacramento area and far beyond. Each person was invited to bring two items for appraisal, along with the story behind each object.

This is the show's second visit to Sacramento, and according to one lucky viewer and collector of treasures who won tickets both times, this visit was quite different. The first time, the event was held in the Convention Center nearly ten years ago and long lines were normal.

"This time, Antiques Roadshow was a well-oiled machine," said Mattie, who has watched the show since its inception and followed its precursor, "The Collectors."

"We didn't have to search for parking because a parking lot was reserved for attendees and a shuttle bus took us to and from the Crocker."

The show issued tickets with times spaced thirty minutes apart, which helped keep lines to a minimum, although some lines were definitely busier than others. The clock appraisers were hoping for people, while lines for Asian art, jewelry, and paintings were longer.

A triage appraisal area was set up in the Crocker's dining area

where preliminary appraisals determined which lines people needed to visit. A watch, it turns out, could end up in the collectibles line if it was a Mickey Mouse watch.

The show works regularly with 150 appraisers who volunteer their time, and KVIE's marketing

guru, Sarah, said that Sacramento's event had about 70 appraisers on hand, including Brian Witherell, COO and Consignment Director of Witherell's Auction House located in Sacramento.

The event also enlisted the help of 125 volunteers who performed an array of

duties from greeting people to guiding them to their appropriate destinations. Some appraisers were in the courtyard and others were on the second floor in the Crocker ballroom and adjacent gallery rooms.

As fans of the show know, there is always a story behind the object

and of the expected 4,000 attendees, 150 segments would be taped based on suggestions from the appraisers. Of those segments, the show hopes to pull together three one-hour episodes to air in 2020.

One of those stories was discovered near the feedback booth, something that

was not available when the show visited in 2010. Al and Virginia brought in a doll that she believed to be French. It was German and the clothes were not original. She still loves the doll. Al discovered that his pistols are something that he needs to further pursue by contacting Smith and Wesson as suggested by his appraiser.

This couple did not win the lottery pull for tickets, but they were offered a second chance through a program called "Knock Our Socks Off."

The painting Al carried was given to him by the artist, Jerry Crandall. Al explained that the painting was payment for his legal work for Crandall's divorce.

"Allegedly a lawyer carried this with him," he said about the tiny circa 1855 pistol pointed toward the painting.

Look for Al and Virginia when the credits run next year during one of the Sacramento episodes.

Sacramento police officers secured the street in front of the museum and manned a table in order to examine firearms which include pistols and rifles older than 1899 for the California visit.

Several attendees came in costumes ranging from top hats to Victorian Era dress.

Show fans might have recognized Leila Dunbar, the baseball expert, and Nicholas Lowry, the poster and print expert who looked dapper in his brown plaid suit and waxed mustache.

The consensus from attendees was that the event was fun, well organized, and everyone had a smile.

Defendant Convicted for Multiple Shootings, Attempted Murders

DATE: May 16, 2019

CASE: Leo Austin Carrillo
(Case #17FE012477)

PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Matthew Moore, Career Criminal Prosecution Unit

Leo Austin Carrillo was convicted by a jury of two counts of attempted first-degree murder, assault with a semi-automatic firearm, felon in possession of a firearm and ammunition, and hit and run causing injury. The jury also found true allegations that Carrillo personally used a firearm and inflicted great bodily injury.

On June 24, 2017, Leo Austin Carrillo got into an argument with the victims outside of the Bonfare Market. When the victims left the market, Carrillo followed them in his car and fired multiple shots at them. Two of the bullets hit one of the victims, causing serious injuries.

On July 4, 2017, Carrillo drove past a house while his front passenger fired several shots at a group of people in front of the house. One of the bullets grazed the victim's head. As Carrillo was driving away from the shooting, he struck a car driven by an unrelated citizen. The passenger in that car, who was pregnant, was injured and taken to a hospital.

Carrillo was on probation for a 2016 robbery conviction at the time of these offenses.

An allegation that Carrillo suffered a prior strike conviction for robbery will be determined at the sentencing hearing. If that allegation is found true, Carrillo faces a maximum sentence of 120 years to life in prison. Sentencing is set for June 14, 2019, at 1:30 p.m. in Department 41 before the Honorable Helena Gweon.

Defendants Convicted for Murders at Surf Motel

DATE: May 14, 2019

CASE: James Martin Baca & Rebecca Irene Temme
(Case #17FE005228)

PROSECUTOR: Principal Criminal Attorney Caroline Park, Homicide Unit

James Martin Baca and Rebecca Irene Temme were convicted by a jury of the first-degree murder of Leonora Montoya with the special circumstance that the murder was committed during the commission of a robbery. Baca and Temme were also convicted of two counts of robbery. The jury found that Baca personally used a firearm in the course of the murder and robberies. Baca was also convicted of being a felon in possession of a firearm and his prior strike conviction for burglary was found true.

On March 19, 2017, the defendants met the victims in the North Sacramento area and drove to the Surf Motel for a tattoo. Upon entering the room, James Martin Baca pointed a gun at the victims and demanded their cell phones. The defendants also demanded Ms. Montoya's car keys. When Ms. Montoya didn't comply, Baca shot her. Both defendants then rummaged through Ms. Montoya's pockets, took her car keys and fled in her car. The defendants were later located in Redwood City. With the assistance of law enforcement agencies in Redwood City, Menlo Park, and CHP the defendants were apprehended after a vehicle and foot pursuit.

Baca's criminal history includes convictions for assault with a deadly weapon; possessing dangerous weapons; destroying or concealing evidence for the benefit of a street gang; battery against a peace officer; possession of dirk or dagger; threatening a public officer; and domestic violence.

Temme's criminal history includes convictions for battery upon a peace officer while in custody; aggravated battery while in custody; felony evading a peace officer; and felony vehicle theft.

Both defendants face a maximum sentence of life in prison without the possibility of parole. Sentencing is set for June 28, 2019, at 11:00 a.m. in Department 34 before the Honorable Ernest Sawtelle. ★

Game Plots

Modern Warfare 2 Doesn’t Feel So Modern

There’s no better way to tell how far you’ve come than by looking behind you, and by replaying the single-player story of 2009’s Call of Duty: Modern Warfare 2, it’s easy to see how much video game design has changed and progressed over the past decade.

Modern Warfare 2 is, to this day, often considered to have the best single-player story and level design of any Call of Duty, and is frequently regarded as the peak of the shooter design in the late 2000’s. It includes famous levels like “Cliffhanger,” a stealthy snowstorm infiltration of an enemy base, and “No Russian,” the controversial chapter that forces players, embodying a secret American agent, to participate in a terrorist attack so as not to blow their cover. The variety and production values are truly impressive, weaving a consistent story throughout a Michael Bay-like series of action sequences.

And yet, even playing on the relatively easy “normal” difficulty, I found myself dying over and over rather than living the dream of being the best soldier on the battlefield. The habits programmed into me by the past ten years of first-person shooters (including some of the more recent Call of Duty games) were not easily undone; my

fingers have learned to dance across the controller or keyboard, jumping, leaping, and dodging past bullets in a ballet of movement and agility. Modern Warfare 2, instead, asks me to sit behind a wall, peak out every few seconds to pop off a few enemies, and retreat behind the wall again.

As a result, used to the aggressive forward momentum of 2016’s Doom or the agile acrobatics of Titanfall 2, I found myself rushing headlong into the bullets like an over-militarized Captain America...and dying time and time again for my transgression.

While these later shooters create dynamic systems that allow for improvisation and self-expression, Modern Warfare 2 feels obsessed with controlling the player. You’re funneled from encounter to encounter, all of which play out in almost exactly the same way for every person.

This strategy has not aged well. Plenty of video games feel tailored to create a power fantasy, but, crucially, Modern Warfare 2’s fantasy includes little of the player themselves. Playing Doom or Titanfall 2, I’m trained, through clever design, to think like my avatar would, and because of the systems’ room for improvisation and open-endedness, the avatar, in turn, behaves how I think. In Modern Warfare 2,

that relationship is one-sided; I might be forced to embody my military action hero, but developer Infinity Ward’s vision of that hero’s mechanics is so specific that the action hero fails to bring any of the person behind the buttons into the game world.

That wasn’t necessarily a problem at the time; Modern Warfare 2 was released at a period of tremendous innovation where developers were just starting to figure out how to tell robust cinematic stories in games. But more recent shooters have shown us that we can have our cake and eat it too, that we can both tell cinematic, engaging stories with thrilling moments and leave room for the player to self-express (something that other video game genres in 2009 time had already learned). As a result, despite its major significance for aficionados of video game history, Modern Warfare 2 feels reduced from its pedestal as one of the best first-person shooter experiences in gaming to a merely entertaining diversion.
