## State Fair Keeps Brewing for Craft Beer Competition

**SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)** - The California State Fair is home to the third largest Commercial Craft Beer Competition in the country! For the 2018 Competition, there were more than 1550 Craft Beer entries. Breweries from all over the state compete for Best of Show, Brewery of the Year and Best of Category. In 2018, Captain Fatty's, located in Santa Barbara County placed first for Best of Show and Mraz of El Dorado County won Brewery of the Year.

The California State Fair announces a new Lead Judge for the 2019 California State Fair Commercial Craft Beer Competition, David Teckam. Teckam has taught beer enthusiasts the art of judging for the past 14 years. He judges competitions all over the state. For the past 22 years, Teckam has judged the CA State Fair Commercial Craft Beer Competition and the CA State Fair Homebrew Competition.

"I've been in the Beer Judge Certification Program since 1997. I am currently at the rank of Grand Master 6, and I teach beer and mead judging in Northern California. I have judged at over 200 competitions," said David Teckam, Lead Judge CA State Fair Commercial Craft Brew Competition. "The California State Fair Craft Beer Competition is twice as big as other competitions in the state."

There are only three other people in the world that out rank Teckam as a Grand Master 6 judge. The veteran in the beer world will continue to bring a wealth of knowledge and experience to the competition as lead judge.

Breweries from across the State can enter the California State Fair Commercial Craft Beer Competition. The deadline for entries is May 24, 2019.

The Best of Show and Brewery of the Year winners will be publicly recognized at a press event at the Capitol on Thursday, June 27, 2019. The winners are also invited to pour their award-winning brew at the Best of California Tasting Reception prior to the California State Fair Gala later that evening and at Best of California State Fair Brewfest on Saturday, July 20th during the 2019 CA State Fair.

## Soil Born Farms Pollinates Student Learning at White Rock Elementary

**RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG)** - Bees, bats, birds, butterflies, and beetles have one thing in common, and a group of students at White Rock Elementary learned the connection between these mammals, insects, and birds. Each is an important pollinator.

"We use these main groups to help students remember many of the pollinators and become familiar with their various needs and also their various skills," wrote Shannon Hardwicke, Soil Born Farms Youth Education Manager.

Although there are other pollinators, including moths, she explained that this was a good start for students, especially in a limited time setting.

By the end of the lesson, students were able to identify the type of flower one pollinator might prefer

over another. Some pollinators, like beetles, hide inside flowers. Others prefer purple flowers over red. Students sat in a circle on mats, listened, asked questions, and responded to a host of questions to help engage their critical thinking skills.

Students learned that butterflies need flowers with

"large landing pads," so narrow petals would not necessarily be the best. Hummingbirds love red, cylindrical flowers and might be found near gladiola. Bats, on the other hand, are drawn to white or light blue flowers.

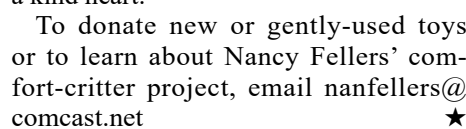
"What color are bees attracted to?" Several responses were

given, including red flowers. Bees can't see red, but students knew hummingbirds preferred red flowers.

With all that was covered, students performed well, said Hardwicke. They were enthusiastic, raising their hands to share what they had learned. Besides listening and responding, they were Continued on page 3

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - Congressman Ami Bera’s office rewarded teenage artists during a recent presentation at Sacramento Fine Arts Center, Carmichael.

Sponsored by the Congressional Institute, the contest annually seeks entries from across the nation. In 37 years, more than 650,000 high school students have participated.

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# Soil Born Farms Pollinates Student Learning at White Rock Elementary

also actively engaged with a matching game. Each student received a card, either a pollinator or a flower, and sought a match, keeping in mind the preference and needs of each pollinator.

Students also dissected a plant and examined the flower. This project, Hardwicke said, was a condensed version due to time constraints and location. Instead of microscopes, students received a magnifying glass. This lesson provides a base on which to build.

In addition to the talk and activities, students also tended the garden which includes several crops – corn, zucchini, tomatoes, strawberries, snap peas, and dill. Flowers are planted in order to attract pollinators. Students eagerly pulled weeds in order to prepare the beds for a new planting of watermelon seeds. Others harvested radishes, which they also washed and shared with the class.

The main purpose of this class, which built upon the prior week’s class, was “connecting the unique pollinators to their functions with the flower,” said Hardwicke, who explained that the lesson built upon the prior week’s lesson about the critical role that pollinators play in the environment and to the food we consume.

The program at White Rock Elementary is growing and the current six classes will double to twelve next year, said Principal Peterson.

Soil Born Farms comes out to work at the school weekly throughout the academic year. It also works with other schools as part of the Our Growing Together School Garden Initiative begun in South Sacramento. Hardwicke’s team serves six school sites in two districts, three in Rancho Cordova.

“We work with all low income populations with the goal of improving connections to healthy food, science standards and

environmental stewardship,” she said. Gardens, she added, are sometimes the place where a student can shine and lead others and can be a place of safety.

“They learn firsthand, not in a book,” said Mayor McGarvey about the Measure H funded program.

For home gardeners who want to attract pollinators, they might consider asking these students or provide a variety of flowers that bloom throughout the year. Hardwicke advises purchasing plants from Soil Born Farms, nurseries, or other locations that do not treat the plants with chemicals.

On May 19, Soil Born Farms will host its Day on the Farm event with classes, activities, plants, and much more.

“What I find really powerful is we’re giving kids healthy habits,” said Principal Peterson.

Lancers JV Swim Team Place 4TH at CIF

**RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG)** - The false start buzzer sounded even before the Cordova Lancers Swimmers took to the blocks and dove into the water. For a swim season to take shape, a team must secure a coaching staff at least one-hundredth of a second before the start of the upcoming season. Blocks and water, preferably in a competitive lap pool with lane lines, are among other must-haves for a High School swim team.

The Lancers have been without a home pool for a number of years, so the challenges to be overcome this season have also included the inconveniences and hardships of an hour plus of round-trip transportation to a borrowed pool.

There was real doubt that Cordova would be able get it together and overcome the rip-current of challenges to compete in the 2019 High School Swim Season, but the resilient spirit of the Lancers is not to be underestimated in rising above challenges and having one of the most successful swim seasons in Lancer memory.

The Cordova Lancers small but swift swim team competed against the following larger teams: Florin, Johnson, Natomas, Valley, and West Campus in Greater Sacramento League Division IV.

After a scoring controversy, the Cordova Lancers sank to 2nd place at the Division IV Championships, despite the Lancers having more 1st place medals and wins than all other teams. Florin was awarded 1st place. The Lancers had hoped to be the first swim team in Cordova's history to proudly have a Division

Champions banner on display at Cordova High.

Five (5) Lancers met qualifying time standards to compete against the best swimmers from over 100 schools at 2019 California Interscholastic Federation (CIF) Sac-Joaquin Section Swimming Championships held at Tokay High School, Lodi, California during May 02-04, 2019.

Junior, Anne Cocker, qualified for Sections seeded 47 out of 50 with a qualifying time of 26.50 seconds for the varsity girls' 50-yard freestyle. Anne finished 35th and dropped 0.20 second for a new personal best time.

Sophomores, Josiah West (Captain), Caleb Lynch, Gabriel Tadlock, and freshman, Kove Pena earned a spot on the Boys Junior-Varsity 200-yard medley relay. Their qualifying time of 1:47.05 ranked them at 4 out of 34 teams going into prelims. With a time of 1:45.01 going into the finals they dropped into 6th out of 16 relay teams. The final touch at the wall had them medaling in 2nd place with a final time of 1:44.38.

Caleb Lynch, entered prelims with a seed time of was 52.85 seconds for the JV boys' 100 yard freestyle placing him at 31st of 35 racers. Caleb darted to the medals heat in 2nd out of 16 with a time of 50.07 seconds. He earned a 2nd place finish with a final time of 49.78 seconds.

Gabriel Tadlock, prelim

placement for JV boys' 500 yard freestyle was 41 of 41 with a seed time 5:34.00 and finishing 32nd with an improved final time of 5:30.60.

Lancers swim captain Josiah West, qualified for JV boys 50 yard freestyle with prelims time of 23.86 seconds placing him at 31 of 36. He finished 19th with final time of 23.52 seconds.

In the JV boys 100 yard freestyle Josiah started at prelims with a time of 51.91 in 13 of 35 and with a final time of 54.18 seconds took 33rd place.

Freshman, Kove Pena entered prelims seeded 11th out of 39 for the JV boys 100 Yard Fly with a time of 57.12 seconds. After a trials swim of 55.96 seconds, Kove entered Finals in 8th place out of 16. Kove advanced to finish 7th overall with a time of 56.03 seconds.

The Junior-Varsity boys 400 Yard Free relay team qualified for the Section Championships ranked 17th out of 37 teams, with a qualifying time of 3:40.06. A time of 3:31.21 in Trials moved them up to 7th out of 16 for the medals heat. After the fingertips touched the wall and the splashing settling down the boys turned in a 3rd place finish with a Lancer record - breaking time of 3:26.75.

The 2019 Lancer Fresh-Soph Boys beat the 2018 Lancer Varsity Boys Record Breaking 400 Relay time of 3:27.11 by nearly a half-second with their 3:26.75 swim.

The Cordova Lancer Junior-Varsity boys placed 4th overall and 2nd in Division II at 2019 California Interscholastic Federation (CIF) Sac-Joaquin Section Swimming Championships despite swimming in the lower Division IV during the season. ★

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# Newsom Requests Preparation of Water Resilience Portfolio

**SACRAMENTO CA (MPG)** - As climate change continues to threaten the state’s water infrastructure and reliability, Governor Gavin Newsom today signed an executive order directing his administration to think differently and act boldly by developing a comprehensive strategy to build a climate-resilient water system.

The order seeks to broaden California’s approach on water as the state faces a range of existing challenges, including unsafe drinking water, major flood risks that threaten public safety, severely depleted groundwater aquifers, agricultural communities coping with uncertain water supplies and native fish populations threatened with extinction.

“California’s water challenges are daunting, from severely depleted groundwater basins to vulnerable infrastructure to unsafe drinking water in far too many communities. Climate change magnifies the risks,” said Governor Newsom. “To meet these challenges, we need to harness the best in science, engineering and innovation to prepare for what’s ahead and ensure long-term water resilience and ecosystem health. We’ll need an all-of-above approach to get there.”

The order directs the secretaries of the California Natural Resources Agency, California Environmental Protection Agency and the California Department of Food and Agriculture to identify and assess a suite of complementary actions to ensure safe and resilient water supplies, flood protection and healthy waterways for the state’s communities, economy and environment.

The order directs the state to think bigger and more strategically on water by directing the agencies to inventory and assess current water supplies and the health of waterways, future demands and challenges. The agencies will seek input over the coming weeks and months through listening sessions, information workshops and other public meetings to help inform the water resilience portfolio that will be recommended to the Governor.

# Legislation to Stop the Text Tax Clears First Hurdle

**SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)** - The Assembly Communications and Conveyance Committee approved AB 162 on a 8-0 vote, a bill authored by Assemblyman Kevin Kiley (R-Rocklin) to statutorily prohibit the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) from taxing text messages or any other technology classified as an “information service” by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC). The bill now moves forward to a full vote on the Assembly Floor.

“I am very encouraged by the bipartisan support this proposal received today,” Kiley said. “It is important that the Legislature deliver a strong message to the people of California that we want to keep their text messages tax-free.”

The bill’s 25 coauthors are the third most of any bill this year, making it one of the top three most popular bills in the Legislature according to CALmatters.

The CPUC’s proposal to add a surcharge to text messages was set to be considered in January 2019 before the FCC issued a declaratory ruling classifying text messages as an “information service.” While the CPUC has statutory authority over the regulation of telecommunications technology, this legislation will explicitly prohibit surcharges on information services under state law.

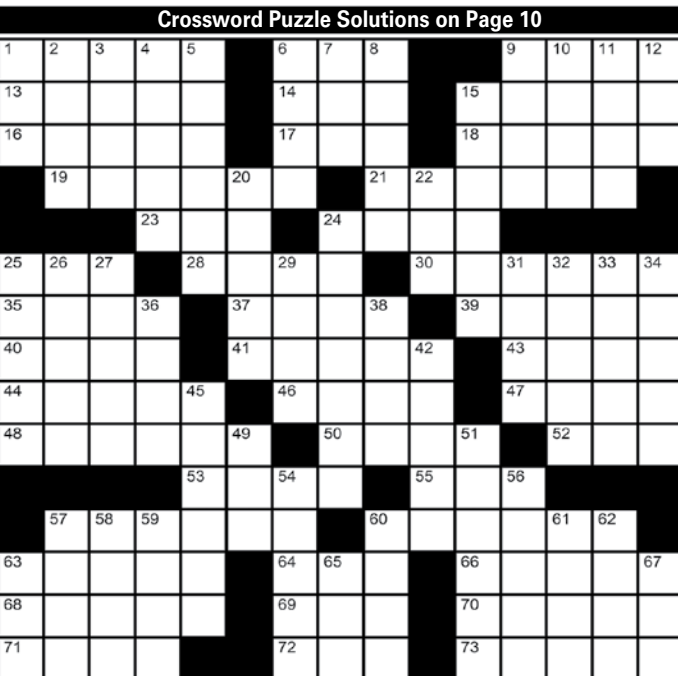

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# Sacramento Police and Sheriff's 17th Annual Remembrance Ceremony

**WOODLAKE, SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)** - On Friday, May 2, officers from several agencies, including Sacramento Police Department and Sacramento Sheriff's Department, descended upon the quiet Woodlake neighborhood for the 17th Annual Remembrance Ceremony, and to commemorate a new memorial plaque for Officer Mark Stasyuk who lost his life in the line of duty on September 17, 2018.

The ceremony included a procession of law enforcement officers from Sacramento Police Department and Sacramento Sheriff's Department led by the Sacramento Firefighters Pipes and Drums.

Officer Paul Brown, President of the Sacramento Police Sheriff's Memorial Foundation welcomed officers, fallen officer families, dignitaries, fellow officers from outside agencies, and the general public.

"Today, let us remember our Sacramento fallen," said the 20 year Sacramento Police Department veteran.

Pastor Anthony Sadler of Shiloh Baptist Church gave the invocation prior to guest speakers.

"It is in times like these that we realize how fragile we are and how quickly our loved ones can be taken away from us." Each officer, he added, to be remembered had paid

the ultimate price, as did the fallen officer's family, in order to protect the citizens.

"Today we are saddened, and also honored, to add yet one more hero to the rank." He then called for prayers for Deputy Mark Stasyuk and his family.

"We honor Deputy Stasyuk for his extraordinary bravery in the face of imminent danger," he stated.

Throughout the invocation, the bells of Sacramento Regional Transit's light sounded gently. The memorial, a living monument, is situated across the street from Woodlake Park and behind the light rail station on Arden Way. Land was donated by North Sacramento Land Company, wrote Rotary

Club of North Sacramento President, Stephen Lemmon. His organization, along with Woodlake Improvement Club worked with the land company.

"Since we had a great working relationship with the Sacramento Police Department, the idea was hatched for a memorial," Lemmon wrote, adding that Rotary Club member Dennis Tsuboi submitted the design and the club contributed \$10,000.

In 1992, "a foundation was formed including both unions for Sac PD and Sac Sheriff, reps for the Chief and the Sheriff, the Rotary Club, Woodlake and the Council Member," wrote Lemmon.

A list of major funders, board of directors, and past board members is etched in

granite beside the dedication stone that reads, "For all those who served & sacrificed wearing the badge, we are eternally grateful."

Sacramento Police Department Chief Daniel Hahn spoke first.

"Welcome to these sacred grounds," he said. "We will never forget the sacrifice that you have made for our entire community."

Chief Hahn spoke several minutes about current challenges for law enforcement, community, and how these men and women "know what it takes to protect our community, to protect our values and our way of life."

"We pray that this will be the last year that we add a name to this very important memorial," said Hahn.

Sheriff Scott R. Jones spoke next, thanking Supervisor Susan Peters, general public, and fellow officers.

"I love coming to this place. I come from time to time. It seems like things are a little quieter, things are a bit more contemplative. It seems like I'm able to be a little bit more reflective. I love the fact that the community takes care of this place. It is truly hollow ground," he said, adding that he also hates that there needs to be a place like this and that another name needs to be added this year.

Mark Stasyuk's name joined twenty other Sheriff's department officers, District Attorney Investigator Grant Wilson, Galt Police Department Officer Kevin Tonn, and

sixteen Sacramento Police Department officers.

"His life made a difference," said District Attorney Anne Marie Schubert.

Chief Todd Sockman, Galt Police Department, spoke about the family of law enforcement and the family that includes the community.

"As a family, we can get through this," he said.

Following the guest speakers, the name of each of the 39 fallen officers was called, with a moment of silence, and the placement of a yellow rose on each memorial plaque by members of each respective agency. Each officer was honored with a white-gloved salute by a member of his agency.

Sheriff Jones said of 4 1/2 year veteran Mark Stasyuk, that he "exemplified what it meant to be a law enforcement officer."

Yellow roses were presented to members of the Stasyuk family who carried the flowers and placed them on his memorial.

Following a moment of silence, the rider-less horse was led in and through the memorial, a bugler played "Taps," followed by a 21-gun salute, and a fly-over of helicopters in the missing flyer formation.

"If one member suffers, all suffer together," said Sacramento Police Officer William J. Conner in the benediction. "We are all part of something greater than ourselves."

## We've Heard Enough From Robert Mueller

The last thing the world needs is more of Robert Mueller's commentary, but Congress is determined to have him hold forth at a public hearing.

It's not as though we don't already have the special counsel's version of events. He mustered enormous investigate resources and took two years to write a 400-page report that is available to the public and presumably carefully written (although not necessarily carefully thought through).

That should be enough for Mueller to stand on, and enough for Congress to make a decision to impeach or not impeach, or otherwise dispose of the matter as it sees fit.

Instead, Mueller is going to be asked to expand on his already-expansive report that not only blew through Justice Department regulations, but inverted the long-standing burden of proof in the Anglo-American legal tradition.

As a prosecutor, Mueller's

job -- his sole job, really -- was to decide whether or not the president was guilty of a crime. He declined to do this, choosing instead to write a nearly 200-page volume on obstruction cataloging what he found in the course of not making the only decision he was supposed to make.

The relevant regulations say that at the conclusion of the special counsel's work he or she "shall provide the Attorney General with a confidential report explaining the prosecution or declination decisions reached by the Special Counsel."

On obstruction, Mueller reached no such decision, and he didn't write a confidential report, either -- his report was clearly meant for public consumption. Besides that, he's a stickler for the rules.

Worse, as Trump's special counsel Emmet Flood set out in an excoriating letter, by stipulating that the evidence prevented him "from conclusively determining that no criminal conduct occurred," Mueller stood the presumption of innocence on its head.

By Mueller's standard, the prosecutor doesn't have to prove guilt -- the target has to prove innocence. And if the target doesn't, he will be disparaged in a long-form quasi-indictment spelling out why he's not exonerated.

If anyone not named Donald J. Trump were subjected to this new

prosecutorial standard, it would occasion widespread comment and -- one hopes -- consternation.

Now, Congress wants Mueller to compound the offense by speaking publicly. It doesn't want facts from him. They are already in the report. It wants opinions and sound bites, especially any embarrassing to the president. Congress wants him to spend a couple of high-profile hours further "not exonerating" the president.

If Mueller had a proper understanding of his role, he would decline the congressional invitation. But the fact is that Mueller and Congress have a symbiotic relationship. For two years, Mueller was acting as, in effect, the lead counsel for an impeachment inquiry -- bizarrely housed within the executive branch -- while Congress wants to use his moral authority as a crutch at a time when it is vulnerable to charges of partisan overreaching.

This, too, is not supposed to be how the system works. But we are long beyond anyone caring. For a swath of the political world and much of the media, all that matters is that Mueller "not exonerate" Trump, and the more, the better, in whatever format or forum.

### Defendant Sentenced for Shooting at Family Members in Front Yard

**DATE:** April 4, 2019

**CASE:** Markees Brown  
(Case #17FE017680)

**PROSECUTOR:** Deputy District Attorney Nicholas Johnson, Targeting Armed Recidivist Gang Enforcement Team (TARGET)

The Honorable Ernest Sawtelle sentenced Markees Brown to 258 years to life in prison. On November 6, 2018, a jury convicted Brown of three counts of first-degree attempted murder with premeditation and deliberation, three counts of assault with a semi-automatic firearm, three counts of shooting at individuals from a car, shooting at an inhabited dwelling and felon in possession of a firearm. The jury also found true multiple firearm enhancements.

Allegations that Brown suffered three prior strike convictions for first-degree residential burglary were found true at the sentencing hearing.

Markees Brown was dating a young woman who was in an ongoing dispute with members of a family who lived in the Strawberry Manors neighborhood. On September 11, 2017, members of that family were out in the front yard, including a 4-year-old boy. Brown and another individual drove up to the family's residence. Brown then got out of the car, pulled out a semi-automatic handgun and shot four times at the residence. No one was struck by the gunfire. Brown got back into the car and drove away. Several family members were able to identify Brown as the shooter.

### Defendant Convicted for Multiple Robberies

**DATE:** May 7, 2019

**CASE:** Theo Simmons  
(Case #16FE008671)

**PROSECUTOR:** Deputy District Attorney Scott Schweibish, Career Criminal Prosecution Unit

Theo Simmons was convicted by a jury of four counts of robbery. The jury also found true that Simmons personally used a firearm during two of the robberies.

On New Year's Eve 2015, Theo Simmons and a juvenile accomplice entered a Walgreens in Rancho Cordova armed with a firearm. Both defendants went to the pharmacy and jumped the counter looking for drugs. Simmons jammed the gun in the side of a victim

and forced her in the back where the drugs were kept. The juvenile grabbed the other victim and ordered her to provide him with drugs. They placed the pill bottles into a backpack and fled the store to a waiting getaway vehicle.

On February 29, 2016, Simmons and the juvenile robbed the same Walgreens. In this robbery, the pair took a pill bottle with a tracker on it, which was tracked back to an apartment complex. Officers did not locate the suspects, but they did find the getaway vehicle. Inside the vehicle, officers located clothing consistent with clothes worn by the suspects as well as a pellet gun. Simmons and the juvenile were later arrested in San Joaquin for committing a similar robbery. They were both linked to the Sacramento robberies through clothing and prints. Simmons pled guilty to the robbery in San Joaquin County.

Simmons faces a maximum sentence of 21 years, 4 months in prison. Sentencing is set for May 28, 2019, at 9:00 a.m. in Department 28 before the Honorable Richard Sueyoshi

### Defendants Convicted for Murder of Teenage Brothers

**DATE:** May 7, 2019

**CASE:** Hieu Hoang & Richard Saterfield  
(Case #17FE008865)

**PROSECUTOR:** Deputy District Attorney Jeff Hightower, Homicide Unit

Hieu Hoang and Richard Saterfield were convicted by a jury of two counts of murder for the shooting deaths of 19-year-old Daniel Murti and 15-year-old Sergio Murti. The jury also found that both Hoang and Saterfield personally used a firearm in the course of the murders, and that both committed the special circumstance of multiple murders.

On May 11, 2017, Richard Saterfield initiated a confrontation with the victims. Saterfield obtained a gun from his vehicle and gave it to Hieu Hoang, who shot both victims. Sergio collapsed and died where he was shot. Daniel attempted to flee through a parking lot. Hoang and Saterfield got in their car and chased Daniel. Saterfield fired several additional shots at Daniel, who collapsed in the parking lot and died.

Both defendants face a maximum sentence of life in prison without parole. Sentencing is set for June 7, 2019, at 9:00 a.m. in Department 41 before the Honorable Helena Gwaon.

The Cougars (18-8 overall) would add 11 more runs in the bottom of the second inning, as well as a deep solo home run by outfielder Jamison Smith in the bottom of the fourth inning to cap off the scoring barrage, resulting in the game being called after the top of the fifth inning due to the CIF's 10-run mercy rule.

Even so, Lancers (9-13 overall) head coach Doug Hughes was proud of the way his team continued to compete despite the game being out of hand early on. "My kids don't quit," he said. "They absolutely don't quit. We started six freshmen in this game, and for them not to quit against a team that has 12 seniors, I couldn't ask any more of them."

That senior-laden Cougars team also had one distinct Cordova connection, as former longtime Lancers head coach Guy Anderson is on the Capital Christian staff as an assistant coach. Anderson, who spent 45 years at the helm

of the baseball program at Cordova, was candid when discussing facing his former team for the first time since he was relieved of his duties as head coach in 2015.

"I was a little nervous coming in," Anderson said. "It was hard for me to see them (Cordova) get beat like that," he added.

Capital Christian was led by senior Kenyon Bower, who tallied six RBI on three hits offensively. From the mound, three pitchers allowed just one hit by Cordova.

Despite the lopsided defeat, Hughes feels it will present quite the learning experience for his young club going forward. As he put it, both he and the team are already chomping at the bit to bounce back.

"I think this game is going to be absolutely huge," he said regarding learning from their mistakes and improving in all areas of play. "They want next year to start right now." ★

Falcon Golfers Finish 4th in State Championships!

**FOLSOM, CA (MPG)** - The Folsom Lake College men's golf team put the finishing touches on their 2019 season on Monday with a solid fourth place finish in the CCCAA state championship tournament, held at Napa's Silverado Resort. The 36-hole, one-day tournament is a grueling affair, beginning at 8 am and not concluding until almost 12 hours later.

The fourth place was the Falcons' highest finish in the 10-year history of the FLC golf team, but was disappointing for a team that had a goal of bringing home a trophy.

"We wanted a top three finish," noted head coach Barry Zarecky. "To play 36 holes - 768 shots! - and miss a trophy by two strokes, it's just heartbreaking." Third place team Cypress College - last year's state champions - needed a stellar round by their final player to secure

After the morning round of 18, College of the Canyons - the eventual team champion - was already 10 strokes ahead of their nearest rival and expanded that lead in the afternoon to win by 18 strokes over runner-up Santa Barbara. Meanwhile, the Falcons found themselves in a crowded field after 18 holes; five teams were separated by just three strokes for places 2 through 6, with the Falcons tied for fifth with Mt San Antonio and just one stroke behind Cypress.




With five teams all in pursuit of a trophy and no one knowing how the other teams were doing, it was a wild afternoon of emotional swings.

FLC's "Mr. Consistent", Max Menconi, struggled in the afternoon (he shot 80, only his second round in two years that was not in the 70's), and freshman Kaden Ward stepped up to

fire a 76. Sophomore Ethan Serrano had a very solid day - both morning and afternoon - with identical 76's. Sophomore Krishton Trimp had to limp through the afternoon round after straining a knee ligament in the morning, yet still managed to shoot 77, four strokes better than his morning round. And sophomore Brandon Kelly, as he's done most of the season, led the team with rounds of 74 & 75 to finish off a fine career at FLC.

Still, the tension at the clubhouse scoreboard was evident as coaches and players alike waited in suspense for the final groups to finish, calculating scores in their heads and on their phones. Four teams (Cypress, FLC, Reedley, and Mt. SAC) all had legitimate hopes for a trophy. But when Cypress' final player carded a 72, the suspense was over.
