## Rejuvenating Homes Together

**RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG)** - Volunteers arrived as early as 7 a.m. Saturday morning to help repair, rebuild, and rejuvenate thirteen houses in Aspen Creek, Cordova Lane, and Walnutwood neighborhoods. Rebuilding Together, volunteers from Teichert, and others took up paint brushes, hammers, screwdrivers, and other tools to perform tasks that included tree trimming, completely renovating a bathroom, electrical work, fence replacement, and painting.

Patrick and Diane Crocker have lived in their home for half a century, raised their three children, and collected a lot of treasures throughout the years. On Friday, volunteers arrived to clear the garage.

Like many homeowners, Patrick and Diane were not sure what to think

when City of Rancho Cordova Community Engagement Assistant Matt Buland approached them and started talking about the program which fixes up houses free of charge to the homeowners. With so many scams being played out in neighborhoods across the nation, there were many doubters.

"What can I lose?" Patrick accepted the application from Buland, completed it, listed everything he and Diane would like to have done, which included fence replacement, and submitted it.

The Crocker's application was one of 65 received from residents in the three neighborhoods.

"Getting the applicants is the hardest part," said Community Engagement/Volunteer Coordinator Lorianne Ulm.

Homeowners, she said, think it may be too good to be true. Letters are mailed to every homeowner within the neighborhood, notices are posted in newsletters and on Nextdoor, and people like Buland canvas each house, sometimes returning at different

## Honoring the Legacy of Lenard Yates

**RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG)** - On April 28, 2019, members of the Lenard Yates American Legion Post 709 hosted their five-year anniversary celebration. Michael Hughes, CEO of Mather Veterans Memorial Hall and president of the George S. "Spanky" Roberts chapter of the Tuskegee Airmen Association, founded Lenard Yates Post 709 in 2014 after his dear friend, Lenard Yates, passed away in 2013 at the age of 87.

Yates was an original member of the Tuskegee Airmen, the first African American military aviators in the U.S. Army Air Corps (later known as the U.S. Air Force). The Tuskegee Program trained pilots, navigators, mechanics, and other maintenance

and support staff at the Tuskegee Army Air Field in Alabama.

Yates was born in Alabama in 1926. After high school, he entered the Tuskegee Institute and enlisted in the reserve

unit of the U.S. Army Air Corps ROTC 2164, where he served from 1943 until 1945. He was a Certified Airplane Maintenance Technician and received his pilot's license in 1944.

From 1945 until 1975,

Yates served as a Supply Specialist in the United States Air Force. During his service, he was promoted to the rank of Chief Master Sergeant and was assigned to various Air Bases around

the world, including Germany, England, France, Spain, Sweden, Greece, Egypt, Libya, Thailand, and Japan.

Yates retired from active and reserve duty in 1975, after serving for more than 30 years. In 1976, Yates began working with the Northrop Aircraft Corporation as an Inventory Management Specialist, providing training to Royal Saudi Air Force personnel. He later worked for McDonnell Douglas Services where he coordinated all training phases for Royal Saudi Air Force trainees. He retired in 1981.

Hughes, Adjutant of Post 709, said he wanted to dedicate the post to Yates because of their many years of friendship and to honor Yates' legacy as one of the original Tuskegee Airmen.

Before the founding of Lenard Yates Post 709, there was no American Legion post in Rancho Cordova. One of the missions of Post 709 is to assist local veterans in the area. Hughes said that Rancho Cordova has a large population of homeless veterans: "They came home with PTSD

(post-traumatic stress disorder) or TBI [traumatic brain injury], and they're just not getting help. They medicate themselves on drugs and alcohol."

Post 709 runs an outreach program for homeless veterans. "If they need a place to stay, or food, or something like that, we help them with that," said Hughes. Post 709 also helps veterans find jobs and connects them to other resources that can help them get back on their feet.

Post 709 meets in a Volunteers of America building at 10618 Schirra Ave. in Mather, CA, where the five-year celebration event took place. Present at the celebration were members of Yates' family, local veterans, and members of the George S.

"Spanky" Roberts chapter of the Tuskegee Airmen Association.

Don Nottoli, Sacramento County District 5 Supervisor, spoke at the event and expressed his appreciation for Yates and all of the Tuskegee Airmen for "their important role in the defense of this country." Nottoli also recognized the members of Post 709 and their families for their "honorable service to our country."

Valerie Talley, Yates' daughter, said it means so much to her that the post is named after her father. "I am honored," she said. "I am just proud — proud of him, and proud of the life he honored me with. I know he would just be smiling right now about this.... He would think this is a hoot." ★

times or on different days in hopes of contacting the homeowner.

Buland, a personable fellow who Patrick spoke highly of, was hired in November. His approach was simple — walk the neighborhood and start a conversation.

"It feels really good," he said. "I get used to 'no.'"

He reached over 100 homeowners, spoke to about 30 percent. About half were "kind of interested," and one third of those he felt would follow through.

It is, he added, an opportunity for him to meet new folks, learn more about the neighborhoods, and "help citizens be more active" in their community.

Several neighbors came out to see the work being done at the Crocker house and chatted with city staff, perhaps considering what they might need done when the applications open again.

The program is funded through both a \$150,000 grant from the Community Enhancement Fund and Rebuilding Together, a non-profit organization whose roots date back to 1973 when a group of neighbors banded together to fix up homes in their neighborhood. More than 6,700 Sacramento county homes have been serviced since 1991.

"This was our fifth Rebuild Event," wrote Rebuilding Together's Executive Director Carrie Grip, in an email, referring to rebuilds in Rancho Cordova. "65 homes were homes improved during the Rebuild Events with Community Enhancement Funds. We have provided

home safety and minor energy services in over 140 additional homes in Rancho Cordova over the years."

Applications are forwarded to Sandy Econome, Program Manager — Rebuild Day Events at Rebuilding Together for review. She checks the requests to see what both skilled and unskilled volunteers can do and what can be done in one day.

"We focus on health and safety issues," she said, as well as curb appeal.

The Crocker home required new paint, downspout work, a garage makeover which will include new shelving and bins, electrical work, and a brand new fence.

"Neighbors get a benefit, too," said

Jason Theriault, Teichert estimator by day and site house captain for the Crocker house rebuild.

Many Teichert employees from all areas and with various skill sets once again showed up to help in the community.

Jud Riggs, Teichert's CEO by day, was a laborer on Saturday.

"We should be serving," he said, adding that his volunteer employees are "eager to come and help." He referred to the opportunity to team build and the firm's core value of giving back.

"We're putting feet to that belief."

"Teichert has been a great supporter," said Rebuilding Together's Econome, adding that this is the third year they came for a Friday preparation day to lighten the load for Saturday's heavy work. The number grows each year, she said.

"This year we had 100!"

Rebuilding Together supplies tools, including a brand new auger it purchased this year.

"Republic donated all the dumpsters for the event," she said.

The plan is for the program to be non-invasive. Volunteers enter the home only if there is work to be done inside.

The goal is for the volunteers to do all of the work, but if the homeowner can physically participate, they are invited to do so. If not, they are encouraged to chat with the volunteers.

The rebuild day takes place each April as part of National Rebuilding Month and is one of several programs Rebuilding Together offers. More than 25 organizations, including banks, SMUD, realtor associations, construction, and engineering firms also contributed to the rebuild event.

"This is a blessing," said Patrick and Diane Crocker, who look forward to many more years in their home.

President Donald Trump signed an Executive Order on Tuesday, March 5 aimed at preventing the persistently high number of veteran suicides and urging expanded outreach by awarding grants to community programs. The order creates a cabinet-level task force that will seek to develop a national roadmap for suicide prevention and bring in state and local organizations to raise awareness among this high-risk group. It directs the task force led by United States Secretary of Veterans Affairs Robert Wilkie to finalize a plan in 12 months. The President said that veteran suicide is a tragedy of staggering proportion at a signing ceremony surrounded by military families

and veteran's organizations. "Today, we can help end this crisis," he said.

According to the Executive Order, currently about 20 service members and veterans die by suicide each day, which was about one and a half times higher than those who haven't served in the military in 2016. Nearly 70 percent, or 14 of those 20, are not under veterans affairs care, pointing to a need for improved outreach. I hope the cabinet-level task force created by the President will be able to come to fruition sooner rather than 12 months later and help veterans who need assistance today. The families of veterans who are in need will be watching and hoping for the help their family desperately needs. These veterans gave years of their lives in the military protecting our freedom. While it usually takes longer than it should for the federal government to accomplish a new directive,

I will be asking our elected officials in Washington D.C. to support this program by getting it done sooner. Waiting for 12 months to get something like this done is waiting too long because that is 7,300 suicides during that year.

Broadcaster Tom Brokaw said, "Whoever wins the presidential election has a responsibility to put a fractured America back together." Interesting how history repeats itself, and repeats, and repeats, and repeats. I could go on but you get the picture. I don't think the 2016 election put a fractured America together again, and unless there is quite a change, the fractured America will continue until the 2020 election. Peter Marshall said, "May we think of freedom, not as the right to do as we please, but as the opportunity to do what is right."

# Trump Medicare Reform Could Save Patients Billions at the Pharmacy

Drug company CEOs recently ventured to Capitol Hill to testify before the Senate Finance Committee.

The executives got an earful from lawmakers, who are rightly concerned about drug spending. Senators are under pressure from voters, 80 percent of whom say "taking action to lower prescription drug prices" should be one of Congress's top priorities this year.

To this end, the Trump administration recently proposed a rule that could save patients billions at the pharmacy. The rule would make it easier for Americans suffering from chronic diseases to afford needed medications. The reform could even drive down national healthcare spending.

The rule targets pharmacy benefit managers. Insurance companies hire these middlemen to administer prescription plans and negotiate with drug companies for discounts. Manufacturers offer discounts in exchange for PBMs agreeing to include drugs on "formularies," the lists of medications that insurance plans cover.

The discounts secured by PBMs are substantial. Total discounts and rebates offered by drug companies ballooned to \$150 billion in 2017. These discounts amount to roughly one-third of a drug's list price.

If drug companies are offering ever-larger discounts, why do medicines seem to be getting more expensive for patients? It's because insurers and PBMs keep these discounts to reduce premiums.

The lower premiums are nice, of course. But they provide minimal help to those who rely on medications and face high out-of-pocket costs.

For instance, a drug might have a list price of \$300, but the insurer might acquire it for just \$150 after rebates.

However, insurers don't calculate coinsurance based on the negotiated price. If patients face 20-percent coinsurance, they'll have to pay \$60 every time they refill their prescriptions. If patients could pay coinsurance based on the discounted price, they'd pay just \$30.

That \$30 difference adds up for patients who take multiple drugs to manage their chronic diseases.

The Trump administration's proposed rule would end this. It would prohibit PBMs from collecting rebates or discounts for medicines sold through Medicaid or Medicare Part D. Discounts and rebates would only be permitted if they were passed to patients at the pharmacy.

The reform would make it easier for America's sickest patients to afford their medications. That could drive down overall healthcare spending.

Here's why. Patients struggle to follow their treatment regimens when they face high out-of-pocket costs. When drug copays double, adherence falls by as much as 45 percent.

Non-adherence, a factor in 10 percent of all hospitalizations, costs our healthcare system between \$100 billion and \$289 billion each year.

Reducing out-of-pocket costs would improve medication adherence, thereby helping prevent needless suffering while saving our country billions.

Right now, the sickest patients pay a disproportionately high share of drug costs. The administration's proposal would reduce out-of-pocket spending, helping more Americans afford the prescriptions they need to stay healthy.

inspirational speakers to share their personal stories of hope and inspiration at an upcoming event.

It is estimated that one in every five people will experience a mental illness during their lifetime. In Sacramento County alone, more than 300,000 residents live with mental illness. But two-thirds of these individuals do not seek support or treatment because they worry they will lose their jobs, their friends or

family, or be isolated because of the stigma and discrimination associated with having a mental illness.

To fundamentally alter negative attitudes and perceptions about mental illness, seven years ago, the Sacramento County Division of Behavioral Health Services (DBHS) initiated a multimedia and community outreach project that aims to replace myths and stereotypes with examples of wellness,

recovery and hope.

# Lions Donate \$150k to Society for the Blind

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Society for the Blind recently received a Vision 2020 campaign donation of \$150,000 from the Northern California Lions Sight Association (NCLSA) and the Lions Clubs International (LCIF) to support the expansion of the group's Low Vision Clinic and training space for people who are blind or have low vision.

NCLSA donated \$75,000 to purchase equipment and vision testing devices for the clinic and secured an additional matching grant of \$75,000 from LCIF to add an indoor orientation and mobility course.

"Lions Clubs across the world have a long history of supporting organizations that help people with vision loss, so we are deeply honored that the Lions chose to invest in Society for the Blind here in Sacramento," said Shari Roeseler, executive director, Society for the Blind. Roeseler continued: "As the only comprehensive vision rehabilitation center in the Sacramento region, Society for the Blind is a critical resource for people who are blind or have low vision. The generosity of the regional and international Lions means

that more people across California who are experiencing vision loss will have access to critical assessment and treatment."

Society for the Blind's Low Vision Clinic is one of the longest running community-based clinics in the region. The Low Vision Clinic provides care, vision rehabilitation, low vision devices and transportation assistance to more than 375 people each year.

Clinics are staffed by three optometrists with special training in low vision eye care and serve patients with cataracts, glaucoma, age-related macular degeneration, diabetic retinopathy and other congenital and degenerative eye diseases.

Clinic staff includes a vision rehabilitation therapist who works with patients with some functional vision, teaching them techniques to use their remaining vision safely and effectively and providing training on assistive devices.

"It's in our Lions Club DNA to help organizations like Society for the Blind," said Douglas Wight, governor, Lions District 4-C5. "Across the world, we work to bring greater stability and independence to people with vision loss by providing services and supporting organizations that do this work."

# SB 24 Passes Senate Education Committee

The California State Senate Education Committee just passed Senate Bill 24, which would require all public universities to provide medication abortion at on-campus student health centers, with a 5 to 2 vote. The bill, which is widely supported by California voters, passed the Senate Health Committee earlier this month and now goes on to the Senate Appropriations Committee.

Statements from those that testified in the hearing: **Senator Connie M. Leyva, D-Chino, author of Senate Bill 24:**

"While some legislators in other states are actively turning their backs on the needs of women, I thank

my Senate Education Committee colleagues for approving SB 24, which supports the academic and personal success of college students by ensuring that reproductive health services are available to all students who might need them without unnecessary barriers. SB 24 is a clear step forward for Californians seeking to access their constitutionally protected right to abortion, including students on college campuses.

"It's critically important that college students don't face unnecessary barriers in accessing their rights, particularly when these services can be provided at on-campus student health centers where students already receive other health care services. Students should not be

forced to delay important medical care, travel long distances or miss class or work responsibilities when medication abortion can be offered by trained health care providers on campus."

**Dr. Daniel Grossman, Professor in the Department of Obstetrics, Gynecology and Reproductive Sciences at the UCSF, and director of ANSIRH:**

"Abortion care on campus is necessary to improve access and decrease barriers for students. Medication abortion is safe and clinically simple to provide, and with the funding committed in Senate Bill 24, it would be very feasible to offer medication abortion at student health centers. There is no reason to exclude medication abortion care from services already provided." ★
