## Republicans Propose Making California More Affordable

**SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)** - Now that Tax Day is over, Assembly Republicans are releasing a list of 15 things California could do right now to soften the blow and make the Golden State more affordable.

California has a \$21 billion surplus, yet our state ranks 49th in the nation in affordability. With wallets around the state feeling a little lighter today, there are a few solutions that could make life more comfortable.

**For education:** Eliminate sales tax on school supplies; Increase the income ceiling on the Middle Class Scholarship; Create a tax incentive for homeowners who rent rooms to a college student; Eliminate the sales tax on college textbooks; Forgive medical school loans for doctors who practice in underserved areas.

**For transportation:** Reduce the vehicle license fee; Stop the proposed increase in the state's fee on new tires.

**For taxes:** Get rid of the cell phone tax (and definitely don't add one for texts); Help people save for their first home with a tax credit; Reduce the state sales tax; Create a tax credit to offset development fees that drive up the cost of housing; Increase the state's renter tax credit; Lower professional license fees.

**Finally:** Increase support for caregivers of elderly or disabled Californians; Provide clean water to all Californians without a new tax on water.

California's high taxes add up, making life in the Golden State more expensive than just about anywhere else. Republicans recognize that too many Californians are struggling to make ends meet and want to stop new taxes that add to the burden. ★

# Sacramento Life Center Receives \$10,000 in Grants to Provide Medical Services for Low-Income Pregnant Women

**SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)** - Sacramento Life Center in Arden has received \$5,000 each from the Leonard Family Foundation and Kelly Foundation to provide free medical services to low-income pregnant women and teen girls through the group’s primary clinic located in the Arden area and its Mobile Medical Clinics that travel throughout the Sacramento area.

“We are grateful to the Leonard Family Foundation and the Kelly Foundation for this generous funding,” said Marie Leatherby, executive director, Sacramento Life Center. “The Sacramento Life Center has seen a 30 percent increase in women and teen girls seeking our services since our move to Arden. The majority of them are low-income, and half have no medical insurance. These grants will help thousands of mothers and their children receive the medical care they need.”

The Sacramento Life Center’s mission is to offer compassion, support, resources and free medical care to women and couples facing an unplanned

or unsupported pregnancy. The Sacramento Life Center’s licensed Sac Valley Pregnancy Clinic includes a primary clinic and two Mobile Medical Clinics that provide all services for free, including pregnancy tests, STD tests, ultrasounds, peer counseling for men and women, education and resource referrals.

The nonprofit also offers a school-based teen

education program, a 24-hour hotline and a program for women seeking support after having an abortion. # Rock Your Blue and Gold for AMGEN

number of attendees at the actual event. It's over a million people who watch this in person," said Sapoznik.

AMGEN, he added, is a precursor to the Tour de France. This year, Rancho Cordova was selected as the host city for the start of the Stage Two Men's race, which will leave from in front of City Hall on May 13. Riders will travel east on White Rock Road, cruise through the city, and travel a total of 121 miles to reach Lake Tahoe. Riders will travel through Placerville, follow the Mormon Emigrant Trail, climbing in elevation along Highway 88 where they will cross Carson Pass at nearly 8,600 feet and are expected to reach South Lake Tahoe in approximately 4.5 hours.

"It's pretty amazing."

The race draws the best riders globally and is viewed worldwide. Riders and attendees may travel from Bahrain, Mexico, Africa, and from all sections of the United States. Peter Sagan, Mark Cavendish, and Marcel Kittel are among the big names who will tour California.

"Our own US cycling team which is not usually a part of the AMGEN is going to be riding in the race this year," he said, referring to the team that will compete in the 2020 Tokyo Olympics.

"This is an international event." Nineteen teams representing 30 countries will participate, making Rancho Cordova a perfect fit for this race, he said.

"We're the 28th most diverse community in

the nation."

The race is expected to draw attendees from around the region and generate an estimated \$600,000 to \$1 million dollars. While it is not the largest event in terms of revenue, it will be the largest in terms of exposure to what Rancho Cordova has to offer. A series of commercials highlighting the sights, sounds, people, and tastes of the city are scheduled to air throughout the race.

The city has been on the periphery for some time, always the bridesmaid and never the bride, but many of the riders have lodged in the city while on the race.

"It's our time!"

Sapoznik turned the microphone over to Ashley Downton, City of Rancho Cordova Communications Officer.

"Rancho Cordova will be everywhere!"

A meet and greet event will take place on May 13 at 8 a.m. giving spectators and cycling enthusiasts the opportunity to meet riders from the various teams. At 9:05 a.m., the festivities heat up with the singing of the national anthem by local Cordova High School student, Agnes Budge. The Cordova High School Air Force Junior ROTC will present the color guard.

"At 10:05 a.m., the race is going to begin, and you'll be able to cheer on the riders."

Fifteen minute rolling road closures may impact traffic from Prospect Park Drive heading east to the eastern city limit, along White Rock Road and will affect all intersections including Sunrise Blvd. Downton suggests planning

time accordingly or taking an alternate route. The website provides alternate routes and parking options.

"One of the ways we're hoping that you'll participate is by joining us in showing us your blue and gold!" said Downton. "And we're really hoping to paint the town in them."

In order to give the men's team a proper Rancho Cordova welcome, businesses and residents can choose from four different ways to participate. Blue and gold welcome signs can be downloaded from the city's website and hung in businesses or homes as can pinwheel templates which can be made and showcased.

Blue and gold cheering items will be available on the day of the race to cheer the riders on, and Downton also suggested spectators wear blue and gold clothes as they line the streets on race day.

By rocking your blue and gold colors in advance of the race, photographing your efforts, and posting them to social media or emailing communications@cityofranchocordova.org between April 22 and May 3, you might win two VIP tickets to the Stage 2 Men's event, said Downton.

Sapoznik invited people to come out and have a good time.

"This is a city that knows how to have a good time."

**RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG)** - Rancho Cordova's very own St. John Vianney School has had another strong academic showing with their 2019 Academic Decathlon Team taking 3rd Place in the regional Academic Decathlon Competition for middle schools.

In their third year of heated competition, St. John Vianney's (SVJ) team has steadily improved their level of performance, and now clearly ranks among the elite academic schools of the region.

The Academic Decathlon competition challenges students in two team events — the Logic Quiz and the Super Quiz — as well as in individual competition on specific subject matter tests.

The content of the tests generally varies from year to year, following different themes and assigned books. This year's theme was the Great Depression. Individual tests are given to team members who specialize in subjects like Math, English, Literature, Science, Fine Arts, Social Studies, Current Events, and more.

A combination of individual test performance as well as scores in the Logic Quiz and Super Quiz determines a team's final score and standing.

The SVJ team, made up of 6th-8th grade students, finished 2nd in the highly competitive and exciting Super Quiz portion of the Decathlon and 4th in the Logic portion, in addition to having some outstanding individual achievements like Makena Gatlin's 3rd

place finish in the Literature individual tests.

The only team to outscore SVJ in the Super Quiz was St. Ignatius, and that team then went on to win the statewide Academic Decathlon competition.

One of the benefits of this team academic competition is that students are challenged to learn far more on a specific topic than middle school kids normally are in school. This teaches the team members that they can learn vast amounts of information in a subject and that gives them more confidence to undertake very challenging classes in high school and beyond.

St. John Vianney students are exposed to very rigorous standards from TK to 8th Grade at the school, and this level of achievement in academic competition is directly related to how well these kids are educated and their enhanced interest and capacity for learning.

Academic Decathlon is one of many extracurricular activities available to all students at SVJ from Kindergarten through 8th grade — with sports like basketball, track, volleyball, football, golf, cross country and other activities including band, chorus, code academy, drama, and more.

This unusual diversity of extracurricular options for elementary and middle school students allows for great preparation for life, and of course for the Academic Decathlon for which the school is now well known.

Where do they go from here? Well, up of course! SVJ is already working to train a great team of Academic Decathletes for next year's competition. ★

Weep for Notre Dame

“I believe that this church offers the carefully discerning such cause for admiration,” the 14th-century French philosopher Jean de Jandun wrote of Notre Dame, “that its inspection can scarcely sate the soul.”

A cultural calamity played out on live TV when the Paris cathedral that has been a focal point of Christendom for so long was apparently gutted by a raging fire, destroying a significant part of an inheritance built up over hundreds of years in a few hours.

Notre Dame stands for so many qualities that we now lack -- patience and staying power, the cultivation of beauty, a deep religious faith, the cultural confidence and ambition to build a timeless monument of our civilization -- that the collapse of its spire was almost too much to bear.

The great novelist Victor Hugo, author of the “Hunchback of Notre Dame,” wrote how “every surface, every stone of this

venerable pile, is a page of the history not only of the country, but of science and art.”

It was the work of generations, completed across three centuries, in a triumph over considerable architectural and logistical challenges. Thousands of tons of stone had to be transported from outside Paris, one ox cart or barge at a time. To achieve its soaring height and hold up its ceiling and walls, it relied on the architectural innovations of the rib vault and flying buttress.

France built 80 cathedrals and 500 large churches across this period, but there was only one Notre Dame of Paris, a Gothic jewel whose towers, prior to the advent of the Eiffel Tower, were the tallest structure in the city.

It is -- or, one hates to think, was -- adorned by what are significant cultural artifacts in their own right.

The statuary meant to illustrate the story of the Bible, and to awe worshippers who couldn't read.

The stained-glass windows that took ingenuity to embed in stone walls and are themselves artistic marvels.

The organ with more than 8,000 pipes.

The bells, with their own names, including the largest, the masterpiece Emmanuel, dating back to

the 15th century and recast in 1681.

Not to mention the religious relics that mean so much to the Catholic faithful.

It has been the site of countless processions and services to petition and thank God on behalf of the French nation. It was where illustrious marriages and funerals occurred, where Napoleon crowned himself emperor, where Charles de Gaulle attended a mass to celebrate the liberation of Paris in 1944, rifle fire echoing outside.

It survived the rampages of iconoclastic Huguenots in the 16th century, the depredations of radicals during the French Revolution in the 18th century (they transformed it into a shrine to the Cult of Reason, used it as a warehouse and wanted to melt down the bells) and incidental damage during two world wars in the 20th century.

Notre Dame has been thoughtfully restored and preserved over the years, to our credit. But it's difficult not to discern a distressing message in the wanton destruction that ravaged the iconic cathedral -- what prior generations so carefully and faithfully built, we are losing.

**SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)** - The Sacramento Regional Transit District (SacRT) today announced that General Manager/CEO Henry Li received the first annual Good Governance Award from the Sacramento Taxpayers Association for Outstanding Leadership in Defending Taxpayer Funds.

“Since I began with SacRT three years ago, I have pushed to get the district back on track financially and provide a cleaner and safer environment for our riders,” said GM/CEO Henry Li. “Being

recognized with this coveted award is reflective of our efforts to cut our debt and provide the community with better public transit choices.”

SacRT Cost Cutting Initiatives Implemented under Henry Li include: Reducing fare evasion from over 15% three years ago to below 4% today; Lowering fares for the first time in the agency's 47-year history; Implementing business process optimization policies that led to more than \$6.5 million annually in cost reductions through debt restructuring and renegotiating vendor contracts; Cutting debt by \$45 million and cost avoidance of

\$75 million in five years; Building up reserves to nearly \$20 million; Reformed retirement benefits program and reduced 20% retirement costs by converting a defined benefit plan to a contribution plan for hires dedicated to new services.

SacRT is currently seeking public comment in the Fiscal Year 2020 Operating and Capital Budget. The SacRT Board of Directors is expected to adopt the budget on June 10.

The Good Governance Award was presented during the Sacramento Taxpayers Association annual member meeting on April 15. ★

# Pumping the Breaks on Electric Vehicle Hype

German auto giant Volkswagen just announced plans to produce 50 million electric cars in the coming years. The news comes as more and more evidence suggests that across the globe, consumers are embracing electric vehicles.

Already, 1 million EVs have sold in the United States. One estimate concludes that U.S. roads will carry over 18 million EVs by 2030.

The future, it seems, has arrived. While EVs were once a quaint curiosity, they're now a viable mass-market product – and could drive down global carbon emissions. Or so the thinking goes.

The problem is, though, that EVs have plenty of dirty secrets. Mass adoption would not do nearly as much as good as the public thinks, because these vehicles pose many unique environmental threats.

Take the batteries running these vehicles. The nickel and graphite that goes into them comes primarily from mines in Australia, Canada, Indonesia, Russia, and the

Philippines. This process produces huge volumes of noxious chemicals, including sulphur dioxide, which has been linked to severe public health problems in nearby populations, including genetic deformities and fatal lung conditions.

Harvesting these engine components also generates substantial carbon emissions. A study published in the journal PLOS One calculated the global warming impact of over sixty frequently mined metals and ranked them by severity. Nickel was in the top ten.

So, yes, while an electric car's engine may burn clean, the process that produced that engine is anything but.

Also consider where the electricity that powers these vehicles comes from. Many power plants still run on coal, one of the most carbon-intensive fuels in the world. For electric cars that get their power from such sources, the electricity required to travel a thousand miles equates to about 290 pounds of burned coal, releasing about 310 kilograms of CO<sub>2</sub>.

That figure is only about 40 kilograms less than emissions released from a regular, gas-guzzling vehicle.

The sad truth about electric vehicles is that they do not substantially cut emissions. They simply switch the source, moving it from the car engine to the production plant.

That's rendered the net benefits of these vehicles negligible, at best. According to the Manhattan Institute, electric vehicles will account for just one half of one percent of total domestic energy emissions reductions over the next four decades. That's a rounding error.

If Americans are serious about reducing carbon emissions, they need to look past the hype. There is a real opportunity to dramatically decrease energy-related carbon emissions, but it's not in the car – it's in the power plant.

Over the last decade or so, domestic gas production has rapidly expanded. Developers have invented powerful new drilling technologies like fracking to drive domestic gas production to unprecedented heights.

Natural gas is a cheap substitute for coal in electricity production. It also burns much cleaner, producing about half the emissions.

Power plants have already started to switch over. And the United States is now world leader in emissions reductions.

Electric vehicles are a classic case of hype outpacing reality.

There may be good reasons to find ways to capture carbon and commoditize it outside the policy prescriptions being offered up by global warming hysteries. And it's reasonable to be engaged in a search for cheaper ways to produce the energy that powers our vehicles and heats and cools our homes. Policymakers should be looking for ways to accelerate this transformation.

# Lions Donate \$150k to Society for the Blind

*Funds to expand the Low Vision Clinic*

**SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)** - Society for the Blind recently received a Vision 2020 campaign donation of \$150,000 from the Northern California Lions Sight Association (NCLSA) and the Lions Clubs International (LCIF) to support the expansion of the group's Low Vision Clinic and training space for people who are blind or have low vision.

NCLSA donated \$75,000 to purchase equipment and vision testing devices for the clinic and secured an additional matching grant of \$75,000 from LCIF to add an indoor orientation and mobility course.

"Lions Clubs across the world have a long history of supporting organizations that help people with vision loss, so we are deeply honored that the Lions chose to invest in Society for the Blind here in Sacramento," said Shari Roeseler, executive director, Society for the Blind. Roeseler continued: "As the only comprehensive vision rehabilitation center in the Sacramento region, Society for the Blind is a critical resource for people who are blind or have low vision. The generosity of the regional and international Lions means

that more people across California who are experiencing vision loss will have access to critical assessment and treatment."

Society for the Blind's Low Vision Clinic is one of the longest running community-based clinics in the region. The Low Vision Clinic provides care, vision rehabilitation, low vision devices and transportation assistance to more than 375 people each year.

Clinics are staffed by three optometrists with special training in low vision eye care and serve patients with cataracts, glaucoma, age-related macular degeneration, diabetic retinopathy and other congenital and degenerative eye diseases.

Clinic staff includes a vision rehabilitation therapist who works with patients with some functional vision, teaching them techniques to use their remaining vision safely and effectively and providing training on assistive devices.

"It's in our Lions Club DNA to help organizations like Society for the Blind," said Douglas Wight, governor, Lions District 4-C5. "Across the world, we work to bring greater stability and independence to people with vision loss by providing services and supporting organizations that do this work." ★

# You Can Help Prevent Animal Cruelty

**SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG)** - To hold animal abusers accountable, the Sacramento County District Attorney's office launched an Animal Cruelty Task Force in our region in January 2018. Since then, many animal abusers have been brought to justice, and the County's Bradshaw Animal Shelter has helped with nearly 30 of those cases.

April is Prevention of Cruelty to Animals month. Since animals cannot speak for themselves, it is up to us to help.

Did you know animal cruelty may result in a misdemeanor or felony?

In California, it is illegal to: Organize dog fighting; Tether a dog to a stationary object for more than three hours; Leave pets unattended for extended periods of time: in vehicles in extreme weather; or without food and water; Maliciously and intentionally maim, mutilate, beat, torture, torment, wound, or kill an animal or overdrive, overload, or overwork animals.



April is Prevention of Cruelty to Animals month. Since animals cannot speak for themselves, it is up to us to help.

In Addition It Is Illegal To: Deprive animals of necessary sustenance, access to water, shelter, veterinarian care, and adequate exercise; Poison animals belonging to another person; Abandon an animal; Fail to provide proper care for animals in pet shops and cruelly transport animals in a vehicle

Here are a few ways you can help prevent animal cruelty: When reporting an animal cruelty incident, make sure you are not in danger; Collect as much information as you can, including descriptions,

photos and videos, if possible; To report an emergency, such as to rescue a dog in a hot, locked car, call 9-1-1; To report a non-emergency animal abuse and neglect incident immediately, dial 3-1-1 or (916) 874-4311.

Remember ... If you see something, say something. Be alert to animal cruelty – even when it's not Prevention of Cruelty to Animals month. More information about reporting animal abuse and cruelty can be found on the Bradshaw Animal Shelter website. ★

Late Lapse at Florin Costs Lancers

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - As is often the case with young teams, you'll see flashes of brilliance one minute and complete meltdowns the next during the course of a game. Unfortunately for the Cordova Lancers varsity baseball team, a late-inning letdown cost them a victory in their 11-5 loss at Florin on Monday in their first game back from spring break.

A spirited rally by the Lancers (2-11 overall, 1-4 Greater Sacramento League) in the top of the fifth inning saw the team score four runs and take a slim 5-4 lead entering the bottom of the frame, but the excitement in the visiting dugout would be short lived. The Panthers (9-9 overall, 6-4 Greater Sacramento League) would pile it on in the bottom of the inning, compiling seven runs.

An RBI double to right field by Florin junior David Padilla would start the spurt, followed by a three-run triple from junior Kayleb Iwami to give Florin a three-run lead. Three batters later, Panthers freshman Anthony Keole would provide the highlight of the evening with a three-run inside the park home run after costly errors at second and third base allowed Florin to bring home three. Just like that, it was a seven run game and the damage

had been done.

"We're young," Cordova head coach Doug Hughes said. "They're inexperienced. That killed us. It all fell apart after that."
