Call 811
Before
You Start
Digging

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Spring is the time to begin outdoor projects. From small projects like planting a tree or building a fence, to big ones like putting in a swimming pool, be sure to call 811 before you dig.

Notifying Underground Service Alert North 811 (USA) a minimum of two full business days before beginning to dig will determine if there are any dangerous underground utilities such as electric power lines in the area. The service is free.

Whether you are doing the job yourself or hiring a professional, smart and safe digging means calling 811 or visiting usanorth811.org to request a utility-locate before each job; using the website for your notification can save time. The notification is valid for 28 days, so if the excavation project goes beyond this timeframe, notify USA North 811 again.

SMUD and other area utilities such as gas, water and telecommunications will be contacted to determine whether they have underground facilities, and if so, the locations will be marked at the excavation site. Underground utility lines are not always located in the street; some utilities may be located in backyard easements. Digging into an underground electrical line can cause power outages and personal injury or death.

Be aware, it is the law to notify USA North 811 before you dig. Besides the legal requirement, it's the way to stay safe and avoid financial and legal responsibility for repairs and/or injuries. ★

A Warning to Anglers and Outdoor Recreationists

Beware Cold-water Hazards During Spring Snowmelt

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - With the exceptional California snowpack melting as temperatures rise, rivers and streams are full of dangerously cold and swift moving water this spring. Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) encourages water enthusiasts to take extra precautions when in or near rivers, especially around hydroelectric facilities and dams, where water flows can change rapidly. Anglers are also encouraged to take precautions as trout season opens April 27 for most California rivers.

California’s snowpack measured 175 percent of normal in early April, ensuring cold runoff well into summer.

“Public safety is our highest priority. We encourage everyone recreating in or near water to know at all times how they can quickly get out or away. Put safety first, especially while outdoors,” said Debbie Powell, PG&E’s vice president of power generation.

Most California rivers are fed by snowmelt, making them cold even in summer. Simple actions such as knowing if the water is too cold or swift, knowing your limits, wearing a life jacket or simply not entering the water when conditions are deemed unsafe can save a life.

Stay Out of Canals and Flumes

Recreating in PG&E canals and flumes is strictly prohibited. Stay out of these water conveyances, regardless of who owns them, as they are very dangerous due to slippery sides and fast-moving cold water. For a number of reasons, not all areas are open for recreation. Keep out of canals and off elevated flumes. Be mindful of signs and warnings. Stay out of areas that are signed as restricted, fenced off or buoy lined.

Know the Risks

Prevention is the best way to save a person from drowning. By the time a person is struggling in the water, a rescue is extremely unlikely and places the rescuer at risk.

Sudden immersion in cold water can stimulate the “gasp reflex,” causing an involuntary inhalation of air or water. It can even trigger cardiac arrest, temporary paralysis, hypothermia, and drowning. When faced with swift water, even the strongest swimmers may be easily overwhelmed.

Cold water entering the ear canal can

cause vertigo and disorientation. This may confuse swimmers, causing them to venture deeper into the water. Cold water also reduces body heat 25 to 30 times faster than air does at the same temperature and causes impairment that can lead to fatalities.

Learn About Self-Rescue Techniques

If you do fall into the water, here are some survival tips:

Don’t panic. Do control breathing, don’t gasp. A sudden unexpected fall into cold water causes an involuntary gasp (or torso) reflex. It takes less than ½ cup of water in a person’s lungs to drown. When someone remains calm, they have a greater chance of self-rescue.

Stay with your boat. It will help you stay afloat and will be seen more easily by rescuers. If it’s capsized, try to climb on top. Stay afloat with the help of a life jacket, regain control of breathing, and keep head above water in view of rescuers.

If possible, remove heavy shoes. Look for ways to increase buoyancy such as seat cushions or an ice chest. If you’re in the water with others, huddle together facing towards each other to help everyone stay afloat and keep warm. If you do fall into a river without a life jacket on, keep your feet pointed downstream and turn onto your back. If you fall into the water with waders on, roll onto the shore. Wear a belt with waders.

Know your Limits, Wear a Life Jacket

Swimming in open water is more difficult than in a swimming pool – people tire more quickly and can get into trouble. Many unseen obstacles can be lurking below the water’s surface - this is especially the case during spring and early summer snowmelt. Rising water can make these obstacles even more treacherous. Guided trips for inexperienced paddlers are recommended.

Conditions change quickly in open water and even the best swimmers can misjudge the water and their skills when boating or swimming.

Adult Supervision

Actively supervise children in and around open bodies of water, giving them your undivided attention. Do not assume that someone is watching them. Appoint a designated “water watcher,” taking turns with other adults. Use the buddy system and never swim alone. ★

during an annual review of 17 categories of security and emergency preparedness elements. The review evaluates several aspects of a transit agency’s operations including: the security plan; security training; drills and exercise programs; public outreach efforts; and background check processes.

“SacRT’s designation as a Gold Standard Award winner puts the agency in the top tier of transit agencies, recognizing its hard work and unwavering commitment to security,” said Sid Hanna, TSA Federal Security Director in Sacramento. “TSA looks forward to a continued partnership with SacRT and applauds its continued focus on the security of its customers.”

“The safety and security of our passengers and employees is our top priority every day,” said Henry Li, SacRT General Manager/CEO. “We are honored to have been recognized for our work and we will continue to strive for the highest level of excellence in the years to come.”

“I applaud SacRT for prioritizing safety and security in recent years during their

historic transformation,” Congresswoman Doris Matsui said. “The TSA Gold Standard Award is recognition for implementing best in industry security practices and for emphasizing the customer experience first.”

“I am delighted that SacRT is being recognized for its commitment to transit security and emergency preparedness,” said Congressman Ami Bera. “This prestigious award reflects SacRT’s implementation of security programs that benefit the Sacramento community.”

TSA has oversight of 6,800 public transit agencies in the country. Every year the TSA assesses a select number of transit agencies nationwide for evaluation through its Baseline for Security Enhancement (BASE) program. A select few achieve scores high enough to receive the Gold Standard Award.

In the most recent round of BASE evaluations, TSA reviewed 92 transit agencies. SacRT scored an exceptional 98% on its assessment. This is the first time SacRT has earned the Gold Standard Award.

SacRT operates



approximately 70 bus routes, including fixed-route, dial-a-ride and microtransit, 43 miles of light rail and ADA paratransit services. It serves a 400-square mile area throughout Sacramento County, which includes service in the cities of Citrus Heights, Folsom, Rancho Cordova and Elk Grove. Sacramento buses and light rail trains operate 365 days a year. SacRT’s entire bus and light rail system is accessible to the disabled community.

SacRT was one of seven transit agencies nationwide to be honored with the award during the most recent evaluation phase.

Other agencies that received the Gold Standard Award are North County Transit District in North County San Diego, Calif.; Pinellas Suncoast Transit Authority in Pinellas County, Fla.; Denver Regional Transportation District in Denver, Colo.; MetroLink St. Louis in St. Louis, Mo.; Regional Transportation Commission Washoe in Reno, Nev.; and the Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Authority in Washington, D.C. ★

Twenty five years ago, the Sacramento County Board of Supervisors decided to use some of the buildings and properties at Mather Field, a former air force base, for a homeless program that was initially financed by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). There were quite a few meetings between the supervisors and citizens of Rancho Cordova. The biggest meeting at the Sacramento County Board of Supervisors Chambers was jammed full of citizens from Rancho Cordova who were against the initial program. I was there and asked by a young man who was homeless why we were against it. I told him it was fear. The idea of having hundreds of homeless suddenly in your neighborhood made many people afraid of the unknown. When the dust settled, there was a Community Advisory Committee that kept our citizens advised about Mather Community Campus (MCC), the program being developed at Mather, and that the homeless were going to reside at the campus versus roaming through their neighborhoods.

The Community Advisory Committee included an at-large community resident, the Cordova Community Council, a business at Mather Field, the Folsom Cordova Unified School District and its PTA, a homeless advocate, a legal advocate for the homeless, the Mather Resident Council, a nearby community resident, a Rancho Cordova

business, the Rancho Cordova Chamber of Commerce, and the Sacramento County Sheriff's Department. At its beginning, in addition to members of the now City Council, there were quite a few residents from outside of Mather and residents of MCC who attended the committee meetings.

I was one of the initial Community Advisory Committee members in 1994, and for all intents and purposes, I still am. I had a meeting this week with representatives of Volunteers of America, which took over the program when the county had to leave operating functions at the campus. Volunteers of America have been doing a great job helping formerly homeless citizens get back into life. The vast majority of residents have graduated from MCC programs, and many are successful residents of Rancho Cordova.

HUD has changed its attitude and is no longer financing transitional housing programs, such as MCC. It is really a shame because MCC was recognized twice nationally as one of the most successful transitional housing programs. Now, however, HUD's focus is "housing first" and is really making it hard to continue the programs at MCC. There is still drug testing done at MCC, just like there are some drug tests done in industry on occasion. If someone is found to have gone back on drugs, they have to leave MCC and only have one chance to get back into it again. There is still a waiting list to get into MCC.

Here are some figures I gathered about the program today. There are 183 formerly single homeless individuals in the programs at MCC. There are 60 families in MCC programs, and they have

anywhere from eight children to one child. There are over 100 children who live at MCC, and many of them go to Navigator Elementary School in the Stone Creek Neighborhood. Events are held at MCC, such as a job fair a couple weeks ago that included 12 businesses offering residents information about possible jobs. There are so many programs that help formerly homeless individuals and families at MCC get back into life. Many thought they would never get out of the situation that they found themselves in. But MCC has helped so many people, and I try to attend the graduations held each year.

I haven't said much about MCC for a while, but I know that there are many new citizens in the City of Rancho Cordova who don't know about the program itself. As a matter of fact, the program is run so well that there are many longtime residents who don't know about it either. Today, there are about 350 formerly homeless individuals who live at MCC, and there are so many who don't even know the program exists. When Mather Veterans Village is completed this year, there will be over 500 formerly homeless individuals who have found a home off of the streets and are becoming successful between both locations. At MCC, about 20 percent of these individuals are veterans. We care about and take care of as many people as we can in the City of Rancho Cordova through these programs. While they are "secret" success programs that are not known by many, we will continue to do all we can to support them as we work on our own and with others.

The McCarthyite Crusade Against Chick-fil-A

The fast-food chain Chick-fil-A is wanted on suspicion of aiding and abetting Christian organizations.

The home of the “original chicken sandwich” was banned from its second airport in two weeks for the offense of contributing to Christian groups deemed anti-gay by its critics.

The San Antonio City Council voted to exclude the restaurant from its airport, and Buffalo, New York, soon followed suit, thus denying travelers the option of juicy chicken sandwiches and waffle fries in the cause of social justice.

This is about punishing the Georgia-based company for the faith of its leadership. The official bans are anti-Christian, unconstitutional and a harbinger of a larger effort to hunt down and punish any organization that has uncongenial views on sexual morality.

In San Antonio, the leader of the anti-Chick-fil-A effort, City Councilman Roberto Trevino, explained that, “Everyone has a place here, and everyone should feel welcome when they

walk through our airport.” The irony of discriminating against Chick-fil-A in order to demonstrate the city’s famous open-ness was, of course, lost on him.

The hostility to Chick-fil-A stems from a controversy back in 2012 when its CEO, Dan Cathy, made statements opposing gay marriage, and the foundation established by the company’s founder contributed to politically engaged social-conservative groups. There was nothing wrong with this, but since most profit-seeking enterprises don’t like controversy, Cathy said the company would back off the gay-marriage debate and focus on the chicken.

It has, but its critics still detect a lingering stench of Christianity.

The left-wing outfit ThinkProgress issued a report cited widely in the press and among Chick-fil-A opponents accusing the company’s foundation of “anti-equality” giving. By which it means it donated to the Salvation Army and the Fellowship of Christian Athletes (and a small Christian home for troubled young men in Vidalia, Georgia).

Needless to say, a lot of other people are guilty of the same offense, given that the Salvation Army raises about \$2 billion a year. To consider all that the Salvation Army does -- its thrift shops, aid for the homeless, disaster relief, anti-trafficking

programs, Christmas gifts to needy children and much, much more -- and reduce the organization to an allegedly anti-LGBT group is perverse.

For its part, the Fellowship of Christian Athletes stands accused of seeking “to spread an anti-LGBTQ message to college athletes.” It’s true that FCA asks its leaders to forswear homosexual acts, but it also wants them to pledge not to engage in heterosexual acts outside of marriage and, for that matter, refuse to use drugs, alcohol or tobacco.

According to Chick-fil-A, its donation to FCA supported sports camps and school programs for inner-city kids -- not exactly controversial causes. And its gift to the Salvation Army went to youth camps and Christmas presents for thousands of Atlanta kids.

The latest campaign against Chick-fil-A is based on the idea that it is impermissible for it to associate with any group with a traditional Christian understanding of sex and marriage, for any purpose whatsoever, no matter how unobjectionable or noble.

It is the enemies of Chick-fil-A who are intolerant and out-of-the-mainstream. They desperately need to abandon their tawdry McCarthyite crusade and “Eat Mor Chikin.”

It only had a single main processing chip, ran at 1 MHz, and stored instructions in 1K of RAM. If you wanted to save what you were working on, you put it on a cassette tape or 5-1/4" floppy disk. All that plus a power supply, keyboard, and a whole lot of wires would have been sprawled all across the desk. A Hobbyists delight!
Now 40 years later, PCs are much more than toys for hobbyists. They are indispensable tools seen at home and on nearly every work desk in companies all over the world. They are thousands of times more powerful, utilizes millions of times more memory, and files can be saved on drives a billion times larger using a simple key stroke. A laptop can be so small that you can effortlessly work on it from bed!
Today, whether you are into the IBM-based PC's or an aficionado of the comparable Apple's Mac computers, what you can do with your system is almost endless. Send and receive emails, write letters, create presentations, keep schedules, play games, draw pictures, edit photos, network with others, save important information, and maybe even program your "next big thing."
On the internet, you can get questions answered, visit websites, shop for products, do banking, find partners to date, and even attend an auction.
In the next weeks we'll talk about doing these things safely, best practices, maintenance "must dos", and many tips and tricks that you'll want to know.

Spring Break Message from Dr. Koligian

Dear Folsom Cordova families and community members,

It is hard to believe that when we return from Spring Break, we will soon be closing out another successful school year! Sometimes it feels as though we are moving at lightning speed, but I want to pause and acknowledge each of you and your partnership in supporting student success.

Throughout the year you have heard me and other District team members refer to our focus on the ABCs of Attendance, Budget, and Culture. Today, I want to spend some time digging deeper into the "B" and "C" as we reflect on the weeks ahead.

BUDGET

All of us in public education are grappling with what many are calling the "silent recession" in California schools. The economy is strong, so why are school districts facing serious budget deficits? In short, rising employee costs - primarily driven by pension costs that are out of our control - are outpacing any revenue growth we experience through enrollment and other sources.

While state lawmakers are exploring solutions to some of those bigger issues, we have a responsibility to our taxpayers to budget within our means. If not, our district could be facing significant shortfalls in future years: in 2020-21, our deficit is projected to be almost \$1 million, and the following year it could balloon to nearly \$5.5 million.

During yesterday's Board of Education budget study session - our fourth public forum this school year - our elected leaders, bargaining team members, employees, and community members continued to explore potential long-term solutions, including redesigning programs and school schedules, eliminating some vacant positions, reducing travel and conference expenses, and more. You can see more details in the link to yesterday's study session presentation.

Finding solutions will require sacrifice, and we are fortunate to have positive working relationships with our employee leadership groups. Earlier this year the Board of Education approved an early retirement incentive for teaching staff that will result in considerable financial savings over the next five years. To realize those savings, we also had to eliminate 15 vacant teaching positions. Without this measure - identified in partnership with our teachers union - our projected deficit would be far worse.

In the meantime, we recently concluded another round of Education Town Halls and are digging into the rich feedback from students, families, teachers, staff, and community members about our evolving needs and priorities. If you didn't get a chance to attend, we invite you to take our survey at www.fcusd.org/LCAP, which is open until 11:59 p.m. on April 23.

We will continue to keep our school communities updated and provide opportunities for input. Together, I am confident we can find creative solutions while protecting resources for students.

CULTURE

As I visit schools across the District, I am proud to see how many teachers, support staff, and administrators are practicing a growth mindset focused on culture, climate, and connectedness. This hard work gives every child a chance to learn, while helping students build the social and emotional skills needed to succeed in the classroom, on the playground, and in their careers and lives after school.

Much of this work has included trying new strategies for handling discipline. These are just a few of the many examples throughout our schools:

- Sutter Middle School has implemented a program called "iLoss" - it stands for "In Lieu of Suspension Service" - that is making a positive impact. This program uses multiple strategies to reduce suspensions through alternatives, such as student meetings with counselors or mental health specialists.
- Our elementary school leaders are working in cohorts this year to explore and share effective practices. "Cool-off" periods, buddy classrooms, written reflections, and recess alternative assignments are just some of the many common, successful strategies underway.
- Four of our schools have volunteered to pilot a mindfulness curriculum designed to help students manage their emotions and practice controlling their reactions. Watch for yourself in this video.

I recognize that as we are asking our administrators, teachers and support staff to change how we respond to behaviors, it is imperative the District provide consistent and ongoing training and support. Just last month, an estimated 340 teachers and dozens more administrative assistants participated in such trainings, and we look forward to rolling out more in the months ahead so that all educators and support staff can strengthen our leadership in equity, diversity, and discipline.

TIME TO REST AND RECHARGE

While I am hopeful that we can reflect together on these challenges and opportunities, I also encourage our families and students to enjoy and savor your time with loved ones, and indulge in some hard-earned self-care. I can't wait to return with all of you, energized and ready to finish the school year on a strong note!

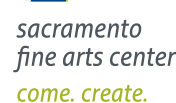

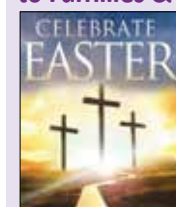

Is A New Twilight Zone A Good Idea?

Question: I have to admit that reviving/rebooting *The Twilight Zone* is a much less egregious “sin” than reviving shows as iconic or classic as *Magnum P.I.* or *Full House* since an anthology series is a different thing. But: How fresh is *TZ* in 2019 when we have *Black Mirror*? Even movies such as *Get Out* and *Us*. I found it rather run of the mill. – Tyrell

Matt Roush: The fact that you reference *Gen Out* and *Us*, both from Jordan Peele (who's the face and creative engine of the new *Twilight Zone* revival), is reason enough to cut the new *Zone* some slack. I remember reading a comment by Peele that while he's a fan of *Black Mirror*, which has often been likened to a "technological *Twilight Zone*," the cynicism and darkness of so many of those episodes was why he

wanted to delve into the more humanistic world of fantasy established so long ago by Rod Serling. There's a timelessness to *Twilight Zone* at its best that argues for a remake in the right hands – although as with any anthology, the new *Zone* is unquestionably uneven. But having seen four to date, I'm eager to see more. (The episode, "Replay," with a #BlackLivesMatter context in a story about a magical camcorder, feels like a classically topical *Zone* allegory to me – and I loved the new twists on the "Nightmare at 30,000 Feet" episode.)

New Rate Study Confirms Republicans' Calls for Increase Funding for Persons with Developmental Disabilities

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The California Department of Developmental Services released a long-awaited study last Friday evening regarding payments for services for persons with developmental disabilities.

The study indicates that if provider rates are set fairly, the state would need to increase the budget by more than \$1.8 billion dollars to provide adequate services for this community.

Prior to the rate study release, Senate Republican Leader Shannon Grove (R-Bakersfield) delivered

a letter from all Senate Republicans to the Chairs of the Senate and Assembly Budget Committees requesting several budget actions. One of the requests included an 8 percent across-the-board payment rate increase as a down payment for providers who serve the developmentally disabled

community. Advocates and stakeholders agree there is a need for a transitional rate increase in this budget to sustain services while the state determines how to implement the larger rate study, including improved accountability and transparency.

"The recent rate

study supports Senate Republicans' request to place a higher priority for persons with developmental disabilities and their families. The state made a promise to serve this community, but that promise falls short if we do not provide enough money for necessary services.

"My colleagues and I stand united in advocating for some of California's most vulnerable population. With an anticipated \$21 billion surplus in the state budget, let's do the right thing. The developmentally disabled community deserves better," said Leader Grove.
