Haven Tops List of Outstanding Volunteers

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - Founding father of the City of Rancho Cordova, a 25-year police department volunteer, a pair of brothers who ran into a burning building to save young children and an entire symphony orchestra were among the outstanding volunteers honored during the 20th Annual Community Volunteer Awards hosted by the Cordova Community Council on March 8.

Curt Haven, a longtime Rancho Cordova volunteer, Chamber of Commerce chief and first employee of the City of Rancho Cordova, was honored as the "Rancho Cordovan of the Year" - an award reserved for those whose lives have made unparalleled contributions to Rancho Cordova.

Haven's early contributions to bring about incorporation of the city, his leadership of the Rancho Cordova Chamber of Commerce following the challenging closure of Mather Air Force Base, and service to citizens as the first employee of the City of Rancho Cordova were all honored by this "lifetime achievement" award.

"Do what I have done," said Haven, shaking a finger at the audience. "Surround yourself with wonderful people as I have, and you will be successful."

Haven was among eight volunteers and organizations honored at "May the Volunteer Force be With You," a Star Wars-inspired theme

party and awards ceremony. Hosted by Vice Mayor David Sander, the theme was brought to life by some Jedi

Knight training and a Star Wars Cantina which included Jabba the Hutt himself.

Other honorees included for the Distinguished Community Service: Karen Donovan, a Sacramento County Sheriff's Department and Rancho Cordova Police Department volunteer, who followed up a 32-year Mather Air Force Base career by serving local law enforcement for a quarter century, writing reports, tracking crime statistics and providing support which enables officers to spend less time behind a desk and more on the beat.

For Distinguished Community Business Partner: Paul Schubert of Golden State Water Company, whose generosity and dedication to the community through business and community leadership, Rancho Cordova Rotary and Chamber service, has enriched community events, brought resources to children in the community and ensured the Cordova Food Locker is well-stocked with Thanksgiving turkeys over the years.

For Outstanding Service to Youth: Soroptimists of Rancho Cordova and Gold River, an organization which

quietly focuses on needs of girls and women, is filling in gaps which hold girls back. The club provides undergarments to homeless girls, comfort kits to domestic violence survivors and more, searching for life-changing assistance in areas which often go over-looked.

For Distinguished Community Service Organization: Symphony d'Oro, whose 60 volunteer musicians provide countless free musical experiences to citizens in Rancho Cordova, act as musical ambassadors for the city across the region, and lift the soul of the community as only beautiful music can.

For Outstanding Teen Service: Mentees at Cordova High School (MACH), a team of teens, who against all odds, engage in community service projects that bind them together, provide valuable services to the Rancho Cordova community and build a network of caring adult and peer friendships. The program

Now the Innocent Can Protect Themselves

If home invaders, hell-bent on rape and murder, kicked down your door, would you want to have more bullets than they had?

What a great victory for innocent families in California!

A federal judge in San Diego has ruled as unconstitutional a 2016 voter initiative limiting ammunition to 10 rounds in the magazines of handguns, shotguns, and rifles.

On March 29, U.S. Judge Roger Benitez, an anti-communism, Cuban-born, constitutional judge — who President George W. Bush nominated in 2003 — has ruled that the Second Amendment of the Constitution of the United States of America defeats the bad law passed three years ago by foolish or anti-family California voters.

Benitez ruled that in response to "a few mad men with guns and ammunition," California's law "turns millions of responsible, law-abiding people trying to protect themselves into criminals." Benitez wrote that "Individual liberty and freedom are not outmoded concepts."

The judge also said that Proposition 63 "hits at the center of the Second Amendment and its burden is severe."

Prop. 63's path to the ballot was led by Democrat Governor Gavin Newsom, who raised money and collected signatures statewide. His unconstitutional heart must be aching over his unexpected defeat. He must hate that this constitutional judge got here to California!

What's next? You can expect that uber-liberal California Attorney General Xavier Becerra will appeal this just and constitutional ruling to the full Ninth Circuit federal appeals court. But win or lose, I expect this issue to ultimately go to the U.S. Supreme Court and win for family protection nationwide.

Meanwhile, you can still match bullet for bullet any home invasion attacker. He will never obey limits on guns and ammunition, and thanks to a pro-Second-Amendment judge who didn't lie about his allegiance to the United States Constitution, you can have as many bullets as a would-be killer has. Because whoever has the most rounds in his gun - wins.

Personally, I'm relieved that I can keep my 15-round magazines that go with my home-defense handgun without fearing that firing it to save innocent lives could result in me going to jail for a year under Prop. 63. What nonsensical tyranny Gavin's initiative is and was! ★

Golden State Killer Deserves Death, but Newsom's Moratorium May Save Him

Shortly after Lyman and Charlene Smith drifted off to sleep, they were awakened by a bright beam of light shining in their eyes. A strange voice ordered them to get out of bed.

Blinded, shaken,

frightened - they complied. The intruder demanded Charlene tie Lyman's hands. He then dragged Charlene into another room and raped her. The attacker bludgeoned his victims. Lyman's 12-year-old son found the bloody bodies bound with drapery cords.

Neighbors in Ventura

County were shocked. Lyman, a well-respected attorney, had just been notified that Gov. Jerry Brown was about to appoint him as Superior Court judge.

The brutal rape and murders were not the killer's first crimes.

In Rancho Cordova, a young, newlywed couple

was shot and killed while walking their dog. Nearly four decades later, DNA evidence identified Joseph DeAngelo of Citrus Heights as the killer of both couples.

Dubbed the Golden State Killer, the East Area Rapist and the Night

Rotary Club Holds Fundraiser for Sac Law Enforcement Chaplaincy Community Support Vehicle

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - On Saturday, April 13, 2019, 11:00 am to 3:00 pm, the Rotary Club of Rancho Cordova, along with many other community groups, is holding "Cordova Cares Funfair," an event to raise funds for a community support vehicle for the Sacramento Law Enforcement Chaplaincy Program.

The event will be held at Hagan Community Park, 2197 Chase Drive, Rancho Cordova, and the all-access wristband is a \$10 tax deductible donation with children 1 year and under free with a paid adult.

"We are pleased to be able to support the purchase of a vehicle that will help the Sacramento Law Enforcement Chaplaincy team better serve our community by providing a safe place out of the public view where loved ones and first

responders can rest and find refuge in a crisis situation," states Chris Donhost, Event Coordinator. "This will be a first of its kind mobile van that can be taken out to the location of drownings, missing persons, hostage situations, and other critical incidents that the Chaplaincy team serves."

According to Mindi Russell, Senior Chaplain, "This is such an exciting opportunity for the Chaplaincy Program to be able to have a support vehicle to better care for and support families and others who are going through traumatic events. Our ability to obtain this vehicle is only possible with the support of such groups as local Rotary and Kiwanis Clubs, our local first responders and others who understand how important the work is that we do."

The day's events will include train rides by

the Sacramento Valley Live Steamers Railroad Museum, an animal petting zoo, \$5 hot dogs for lunch, bounce houses and kid-friendly activities, law enforcement K9 team, and displays by the Chaplaincy Program and other first responders.

The Cordova Community groups that are partnering together to hold the event include the Rotary Club of Rancho Cordova, Sacramento Valley Live Steamers Railroad Museum, Kiwanis of Rancho Cordova, Sacramento County Park Rangers, Rancho Cordova Police Department K9 Team, and Sacramento Metro Fire Department.

information about the programs that are being used today. I have been on the oversite committee since 1994, but with some changes that have been going on with the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development and the rest, an update will be greatly appreciated. I'll pass it on to you.

Board Members for the Fisher House Foundation, who we have met with in Washington D.C. in the past, said it would be very helpful if we could bring in partners who can contribute financially to bring a Fisher House to the Sacramento VA Medical Center at Mather. For the moment, our position on the list of new Fisher Houses is around number 25 or 30. The more donors (partners) we can bring in, the sooner our Fisher House could be built. There are many locations in the United States where those homes are a tremendous help to families of veterans who want to be close to their family member while they are being treated at the VA. The Fisher Houses that are going to be built next are all on the waiting list, and ours is on that list. The Fisher House will cost around \$6 to \$8 million. If you know someone, or they know someone, or they know someone who knows someone, etc., please contact me at (916) 851-8815. As soon as I get the information, we can start the wheels rolling. Thank you

before you begin.

Chrysanthy Road and Rancho Cordova Parkway are now open to traffic, and four new signals on Douglas Road are turned on flash. For those who have had an opportunity to travel through the Anatolia Neighborhood, you know that people were waiting for Chrysanthy Road to be opened. Chrysanthy Road has been extended east to Rancho Cordova Parkway, and Rancho Cordova Parkway has been extended north to Douglas Road. Now, you can go south on Sunrise Boulevard all the way to Kiefer Boulevard, east on Kiefer Boulevard to Rancho Cordova Parkway, and north on Rancho Cordova Parkway to Douglas Road.

These road openings now allow residents to go straight toward their destination without having to cut through other neighborhoods, like they have in the past. I am very proud of the workers who put in so much time preparing roads, like Douglas Road, and continuing to improve safety. Our City staff was very involved in the plans and the work that was recently finished. We are very fortunate to have the staff we have working for us, and they are working on plans for the future already. But that is what they do. Thank you all.

Providing a SAFE Space for Sacramento County Youth

SACRAMENTO COUNTY (MPG) - To reduce the stress and trauma experienced by children who are victims of sexual abuse and violent crimes, Sacramento County Department of Child, Family and Adult Services; local law enforcement agencies; and the District Attorney's Office team up at the Sacramento County Special Assault Forensic Evaluation (SAFE) Center.

The SAFE Center is an accredited member of the National Children's Alliance and provides a safe and comfortable place for a child to be interviewed by a specially trained social worker, called a Forensic Interview Specialist.

"The SAFE Center conducts a thorough forensic interview in the least intrusive way possible, and the child only has to be interviewed once, rather than being questioned multiple times by different agencies," said Michelle Callejas, Sacramento County Director of Child, Family and Adult Services. "Since the Center opened in 1991, we have conducted 12,000 interviews and last year alone we provided a safe space for over 350 children and youth."

To reduce the stress on the child, the Forensic Interviewer is the only other person present in the room during the interview. The Forensic Interviewers have many hours of specialized training and years of experience talking with children about difficult subjects. They also use interviewing techniques that preserve the integrity of the investigation. The interviews

are conducted in a room with a one-way mirror so law enforcement, the District Attorney's office and Child Protective Services staff can observe.

The SAFE Center interviews are an efficient way to investigate child abuse cases and are core to identifying new leads and gathering evidence in a case. Although the interviews cannot be used in lieu of testimony and children may still have to testify in court, this approach greatly reduces the trauma of having to repeatedly talk about the abuse they have endured.

The SAFE Center moved in February of 2018 to 3701 Power Inn Road to join services and co-locate with the Sacramento Regional Family Justice Center. The co-location has enabled the SAFE Center and the Department's Adult Protective Services program to have a stronger working relationship with the Family Justice Center in serving the community.

"We could not be more excited about our new location and collaboration with the Sacramento Regional Family Justice Center," said Darby Geller, SAFE Center Director. The Center now acts as a multifunctional place for families to receive services

pertaining to abuse, counseling, safety planning and so much more. I'm proud to see how the program continues to grow, evolve and become such an important asset to the community."

The partnership with Sacramento Regional Family Justice Center allows the SAFE Center to offer new opportunities in 2019 which include on-site therapeutic crisis intervention, assessment, psycho-education and ongoing therapeutic treatment through the addition of a trauma-informed mental health clinician. These additional services were made possible through a grant funded by the California Office of Emergency Services (CalOES) and will be provided by the UC Davis CAARE Center, a long-standing partner in providing trauma-informed services for children and families in Sacramento County.

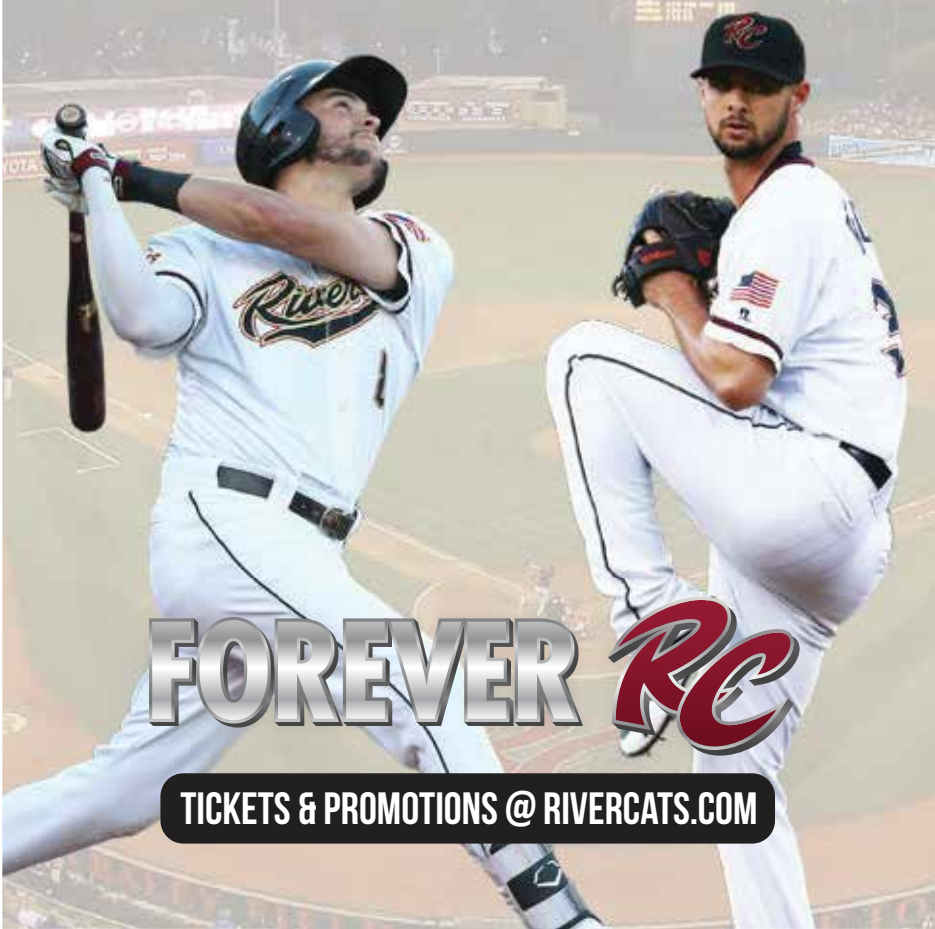

IRS Provides Various Payment Options for Taxpayers Who Owe But Can't Pay in Full

INTERNAL REVENUE SERVICE, WASHINGTON - As the 2019 tax filing season gets into full swing, the Internal Revenue Service reminds taxpayers who owe of the many easy payment options.

The IRS anticipates that most taxpayers will be affected by major tax law changes. While most will get a tax refund, others may find that they owe taxes, many of whom may qualify for a waiver of the estimated tax penalty that normally applies. See

Form 2210, Underpayment of Estimated Tax by Individuals, Estates and Trusts, and its instructions for details.

“The IRS understands there were many changes that affected people last year, and the new penalty waiver will help taxpayers who inadvertently had too little tax withheld,” said IRS Commissioner Chuck Rettig. “We encourage people to check their withholding again this year to make sure they have the right amount of tax withheld for 2019.”

The IRS urges people

with a filing requirement and a balance due to file by the April 15 deadline even if they cannot pay in full. Taxpayers in this situation should pay what they can and consider a payment plan for the remaining balance.

To help taxpayers allocate the appropriate withholding to their paychecks throughout the year in 2019, an updated version of the agency’s online Withholding Calculator is now available on IRS.gov. It’s never too early to check your withholding. While it’s a good idea any

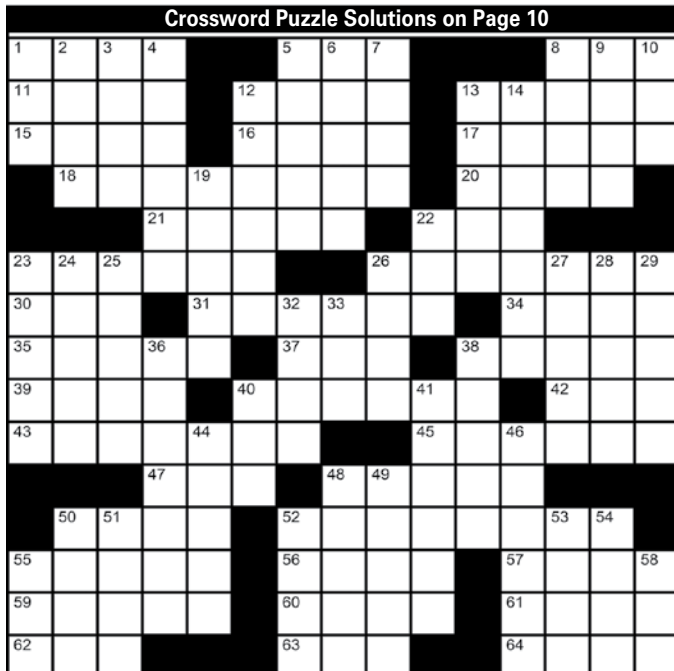

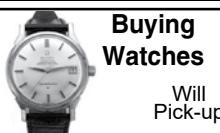

Defendant Sentenced for First-Degree Murder of Wife

DATE: March 26, 2019

CASE: Joshua Childers
(Case #17FE005883)

PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Scott Schweibish, Career Criminal Prosecution Unit

The Honorable Ernest Sawtelle sentenced Joshua Childers to 50 years to life in prison. On January 31, 2019, a jury convicted Childers of the first-degree murder of Victoria Vasquez. The jury also found true a use of firearm enhancement.

On March 28, 2017, a Placer County 911 dispatch received a call from a man reporting he had shot his wife and she could be found in a mobile home park in South Sacramento. A record check of the phone number used to call 911 located an address associated with the phone number. Officers responded to the residence and found a deceased woman in a bedroom. Law enforcement then located Childers by pinging his phone and he was taken into custody the same day.

Early Prison Releases:

March 2019 Update

Since 2015, 374 inmates sentenced from Sacramento County have been granted early prison release by the Board of Parole Hearings (BPH) as of March 29, 2019.

Many of the offenders who are granted early prison release have violent and lengthy criminal histories. District Attorney Anne Marie Schubert feels it is important for the public to be aware of the so-called "nonviolent" offenders being released early from prison into our neighborhoods. Press releases are issued to provide the public with a sampling of recent noteworthy offenders, including:

Inmate Convicted of Shooting, Paralyzing Victim & 25+ Year Criminal History (Julio Luna – Case #15F01091) – Julio Luna has a prior 1993 strike conviction for assault with a deadly weapon. In that case, Luna and his friends got into an argument with the victim. Luna ended up shooting the victim at close range. The bullet lodged in the victim's spinal cord resulting in

paralysis. This level of violence and the seriousness of the resulting injury makes this a highly aggravated crime. Since this strike conviction, Luna has been paroled nine times and has returned to custody on nine separate occasions due to violations and new offenses. He continued committing crimes including assault with a firearm, making criminal threats, felony evasion from police, various kinds of theft and larceny, illegal gun and ammunition possession and domestic violence. In his current commitment offense, Luna and a friend went into a store and tried to buy six Best Buy gift cards with a fraudulent credit card. When employees attempted to detain Luna, he pulled out a knife. The employees let Luna leave, but reported his license plate number to law enforcement. When officers located Luna in his vehicle, he fled. In the process of the evasion he ran three red lights, several stop signs and ran into a curb. He continued his evasion after his vehicle got a flat tire, and officers had to use a PIT maneuver multiple times before they could eventually detain him. Luna endangered the store employees, other drivers and the pursuing officers. He was convicted of identity theft and evading officers. The Board of Parole Hearings found this inmate to be a nonviolent offender who does not pose an unreasonable risk of violence to the community and granted release on March 13, 2019.

The Sacramento County District Attorney's Office takes an active role in evaluating NVSS and NVPR cases. For inmates who appear to pose a danger to the public, the office writes opposition letters to BPH with an overview of the inmate's criminal history and current commitment offense, and an opinion on the public safety risk if an inmate is granted early release. NVPR cases are especially concerning since prosecutors are denied access to records of the inmate's behavior behind bars, which is critical to rehabilitation, and do not have a right to appeal an early parole decision.

Society for the Blind Receives \$25,000 from M&M Whitmire Family Foundation

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Society for the Blind recently received \$25,000 from M&M Whitmire Family Foundation in Roseville to provide classes and training for seniors with vision loss and blindness. The grant will fund the group's Senior IMPACT Project that empowers people age 55 and older with alternative, non-visual techniques and skills that enable them to perform day-to-day tasks and activities so they can maintain or increase independence.

"One out of four seniors in Sacramento is struggling financially, and most seniors in California do not have retirement accounts," said Shari Roeseler, executive director, Society for the Blind. "As this rapidly growing population begins to lose their vision, programs like the Senior IMPACT Project can help these seniors achieve their goals and gain skills that allow them to stay independent. Thanks to this vital funding from M&M Whitmire Family Foundation, hundreds of seniors with vision loss can enjoy life to the fullest."

The Senior IMPACT Project includes an eight-day retreat offered monthly at Society for the Blind that gives seniors an immersion experience where they learn alternative techniques and skills to travel

safely, efficiently and independently. They practice alternative techniques and use adapted tools to perform tasks of daily living including cooking, cleaning, shopping, home maintenance, organization, personal finance and more. They learn how to use the latest in assistive technology to operate computers and mobile devices for home, school and work, and they learn Braille.

Participants receive individualized attention from instructors and mentors who are blind or low vision, and they have the opportunity to join in discussion groups with peers on issues around vision loss and participate in community activities. For those unable to attend retreats, Society for the Blind sends instructors to their homes to teach skills and offer resources. The Senior IMPACT Project includes monthly peer support groups for English and Spanish speakers and workshops throughout the year.

"We are extremely honored to work with Society for the Blind on the ongoing support, programs and tools they provide to individuals and families with a wide variety of vision impairments," said Jessika Cano, director of senior outreach, M&M Whitmire Family Foundation. "The Senior IMPACT Project is such a unique program that is much needed in our

community, so we are humbled to be able to donate to such a program. Individuals with little to no vision have so much to offer our community and we are so glad that Society for the Blind is here locally to facilitate such training and support for individuals to maintain their independence and have their families keep flourishing in our community."

Celebrating its 65th anniversary this year, Society for the Blind has created innovative ways to empower individuals living with low vision or blindness to discover, develop and achieve their full potential. Society for the Blind has grown from a dedicated group of volunteers to a nationally recognized agency and the only comprehensive rehabilitative teaching center that provides services for a 27-county region of northern California.

The nonprofit provides low-vision eye care, life and job skills training, mentorship, and access to tools to maintain independence for more than 5,000 youth, working-age adults and seniors experiencing vision loss each year. Brown Catching on Quickly with Lancers Volleyball

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - For someone who has never played volleyball before, or even knew when the Cordova Lancers' boys varsity volleyball team was going to be playing, 6-foot-3 junior right side hitter Kenny Brown has quickly become quite the impressive force on the volleyball court.

"It was in his first matches that he really started to shine," Reuter said. "I think competition and pressure made a lot of things click for him, and being able to watch the other team do things well made him adjust and fix things that I hadn't gotten to yet."

Fast forward to this point in the season, and Brown has become one of the unquestioned leaders on the team due to his presence in the frontcourt for the Lancers, who look to him in critical moments.

"Kenny has become a leader on the team due to his performance, and during matches he is a player

that we rely on in pressure situations," Reuter said.

"Even with no experience in volleyball, he is a very talented athlete in general. He is very coachable and it doesn't take much for him to realize 'the why' behind what I'm saying and apply it in his own way. This means that he learns from every experience and has quickly figured out what his role is on the team. He's our offensive workhorse when we need a kill, and his position typically stacks him up against the better hitters of the other team, so his block is essential for our defense to be effective," Reuter added. ★

Northwest Student Exchange Seeks Host Families for 2019-20 School Year

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - Responsible parents looking for ways to supplement the educational and personal growth opportunities for their children should consider hosting a teenage exchange student for an academic semester or year. Children and adults alike, by interacting daily with a new, international family member, broaden their perspective on the world and discover new facts and ideas.

NorthWest Student Exchange places international high school students with families all over the country, including here in our community. Exchange students add a dimension to the family dynamic that cannot be achieved in any other way.

The benefits to the exchange student are obvious: honing their English language skills; learning about the educational system in this country; understanding U.S. social, political, and cultural values; and establishing international friendships. Benefits to the

hosts are similar: Not only can host families learn about another culture and its values; they can view the U.S. through another's eyes, and thereby gain a broader understanding of our own country.

Families do not need to have children at home to host! Many childless couples, empty nesters, and single-parent families have enjoyed exchange students. NWSE places students from dozens of countries who have varied interests. I will do my best to match a student to your family's lifestyle and interests.

Those unable to host, can earn up to \$175 for every student placed with people you refer to me, who do host. While host families are not compensated for hosting, tax deductions may be available. Check with your tax preparer.

NWSE exchange students are closely screened for appropriate motivation, academic and language skills; our students have solid emotional and practical support from NWSE professional partners abroad, and from the students' natural parents

in their own countries.

Our students come with their own spending money and health and accident insurance. Hosts are not expected to be tour guides. Students are here to go to school to improve their English, not be tourists. NWSE local Academic Coordinators, like me, recruit, screen and orient local host families and provide close support throughout the program.

There are flexible hosting terms available. You may host for as little as a month as a Welcome Host, or, if you're unsure if hosting is right for you, you may host on a trial basis. If everything works out, you may continue for a longer term. In other words, if you're unable to continue hosting for any reason, you're not "stuck" with hosting the student.

Stalker for his calculated and vicious rapes and murders, DeAngelo's campaign of terror spread across California. Between 1976 and 1986, DeAngelo, a former police officer, is responsible for at least 12 killings, 45 rapes and 120 burglaries.

Prosecutors in Sacramento, Orange and Ventura Counties have brought murder charges against DeAngelo. Stunned victims and surviving families breathed a sigh of relief. The serial murderer was in custody and facing charges that could result in the death penalty.

Now - even before trial - Gov. Newsom wants to ensure that Joseph DeAngelo will escape the death penalty he so richly deserves.
