# The Butterfly Effect



SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - The Western monarch butterfly population has declined, according to Xerces Society, by 99.4% in fewer than four stand the impact and Pollinator Ecologist at Xerces Society, said that although this species' numbers have been declining since the 1980s, the "sharp drop in numbers this year is alarming."

Extinction is a possibility for this iconic brown and orange species. Environment California, Xerces Society, lawmakers, ecologists, and citizens throughout the state are working to preserve the Western monarch.

Several factors come into play," sne said, "and one is the loss of habitat and loss of food." She is currently working with City of Sacramento District 3 councilmember, Jeff Harris, to plant a butterfly garden at Niños Parkway in South Natomas and encourages others to do the same.

Since the majority of the overwintering land is located on private property, residents and land owners may be the best hope for the species, whose numbers are down to an estimated 200,000 from its high of 10 million in the 1980s.

Native milkweed is necessary for the butterfly's survival and is being lost due to land development and herbicide use. It can, however, be planted, as Laws



# Richard Pan Breaks **Another Promise**

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) -State Senator Richard Pan, the author of SB 277, a law that requires kindergartners to get twenty-seven different doses of medication and fifteen different shots or forego a public education, has introduced SB 276, a bill that would require government permission for a doctor to opine that certain vaccines could harm a patient. This is an unprecedented and dangerous intrusion into the doctor-patient relationship, likely violates doctor's free-speech rights, and contradicts Pan's own public promises from just a few years ago.

a problem with "medical exemptions" – i.e., official opinions by a doctor that if a child is vaccinated, that child could suffer harm. Medical exemptions are extremely rare, and doctors grant them only if a child or a family member suffers from things like a debilitating disease (such as leukemia), or if a child or a family member had a well-documented negative reaction to a vaccine or one of its ingredients. Just 0.7% of students obtain such an exemption, up from 0.2% before the passage of SB 277, a change that is not statistically significant. The total number of children exempt from the state's vaccine requirements

Pan has claimed there is (i.e., including those 1.1% exempt due to disabilities) has actually dropped since the passage of SB 277, going from 2.6% to 1.9%, indicating that Pan's plan is a solution in search of a problem.

Pan's legislation would require doctors to get permission from a government department -- the state Department of Public Health, before issuing an opinion for a patient on this issue. Such interference in the doctor-patient relationship is unprecedented, and the only analogous laws have been in state's requiring state approval of abortions -- something that has been universally deemed improper.

Pan's planned attempt

would almost certainly get in the way of a doctor making an evaluation based on empirical, scientific evidence. "Imagine being the parents of a child who the federal government concluded was injured because of a condition that made them susceptible to vaccines, and then your family doctor tells you she is too terrified to exempt your younger child from those same vaccines, because the thought police might take her license," said Christina Hildebrand, President and Founder of A Voice for Choice Advocacy, a nonprofit that advocates for medical freedom. # Cruisin' for Kids SMUD Rates to Go Up?

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - The Cappuccino Cruisers has a lot to celebrate as it enters its 25th year in the Sacramento Region. This classic car club is open to vehicles from 1979 or earlier and is probably the longest running weekly event in Northern California, according to Ray Marchese, the group's contact.

From mid-April through October each year, car owners and enthusiasts gather to share information, show off a bit, and celebrate classic cars. On Wednesday evenings, they gather in Folsom from 5 -8 p.m. and they welcome newcomers and any make or model of classic car.

Woodies, wagons, and delivery trucks are a favorite with enthusiasts as are the T-buckets, rat rods, and hot rods. Rancheros and El Caminos also have quite a following.

One of the nights features orphans, which include Tuckers, Edsels, Vegas which Ralph Nader loved, even an amphibious car from the 1960s. Police Department's K-9 unit. Music, raffle prizes, food, and a display of new vehicles will be on hand.

Memorial Day weekend brings the group to the Folsom Zoo. "With the help of sponsors, we buy and give away up to 500 passes," said Marchese. Home Depot supplies plants and the club also hosts a how-to clinic where children can pot a plant to take home.

July is the "Nostalgic Cruise of Dreams" in Folsom, and for those who cannot make it to Reno for Hot August Nights, this group will have a "Hot August" in Cameron Park. The "Denio's 9-11/First Responders Tribute" is scheduled for September as is the annual Carmichael favorite, "Picnic in the Park." Cappuccino Cruisers will close the year with its annual "Christmas is for Kids Toy Drive" in Folsom.

To date, Marchese estimates the club has donated more than \$200,000 in canned foods, toys, and money to various local organizations. And the group does it while having fun and working very hard to put on the shows and events.

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - The SMUD Board of Directors is holding two public workshops and a public hearing to discuss proposed rate changes.

The Chief Executive Officer & General Manager's Report and Recommendation on Rates and Services, released by SMUD CEO & General Manager Arlen Orchard, outlines a proposed rate increase of 4.75 percent in 2020 and 4.50 percent in 2021 for all customer classes, a commercial rate restructure, and a proposed charge for on-site renewable electricity generation.

While SMUD has been able to reduce its overall costs by 2 percent, there continue to be new spending requirements that cause SMUD rates to increase. The rate increase will be used for wildfire mitigation, including the increased cost of wildfire insurance and additional vegetation management; additional capacity to ensure reliability during peak demand; technology to support cybersecurity and customer experience; and, investments for new renewable energy resources, and building and transportation electrification to meet carbon reduction goals.

Also included in the report are the following proposals: A grid access charge for customers with on-site generation facilities, such as solar, that access the SMUD grid.

The proposed grid access charge will be effective January 1, 2020 and includes grandfathering provisions for existing customers with on-site generation facilities. Under the proposal, the cutoff deadline to be grandfathered is March 31, 2019;

for customers with on-site generation facilities who are also on our low-income **Energy Assistance Program** Rate (EAPR). Proposed also is a rate restructure for businesses and other non-residential customers that better reflects the cost of providing services, and to improve consistency which will make it easier for business customers to transition between rate classes.

Detailed information on the proposed rate action and a complete copy of the Chief Executive Officer & General Manager's Report and Recommendation on Rates and Services can be found on smud.org/RateInfo, and at all Sacramento County Public Libraries.

SMUD will work closely with customers and other stakeholders - including community groups, service organizations, business groups, elected officials and more — to discuss these changes.

In addition, two Board of Directors' workshops and a public hearing will be held for customers to learn more about the process and comment on the proposed changes. All three meetings will be held at SMUD's Customer Service Center, Rubicon Room, 6301 S Street; Sacramento, CA 95817. The Public Workshop will be on Tuesday, April 23, 2019 - 10:00 am; The Public Workshop will be on Thursday, May 9, 2019 -6:00 pm; The Public Hearing will be on Tuesday, June 4, 2019 - 6:00 pm

# **Monetary Theory Equals Socialism**

you, Thank Representative Alexandria Ocasio-Cortez. The Green New Deal (GND) she has unveiled is most illuminating. It is now unmistakably clear that AOC, Bernie Sanders, and other democrat socialists in the Democratic Party don't want "socialism lite" but rather they want the federal government to take control of the "commanding heights" of the economy. Although they may settle for the variant of socialism in which businesses remain nominally private, even as the government dictates what they must do, they plainly want central economic planning, albeit with a 10-year rather than fiveyear plan.

This is no exaggeration. The GND essentially calls for conscripting the American workforce and putting us to work in accordance with what the elite government planners want instead of what "we, the people" want. They propose to replace our market economy, in which privately owned businesses compete to see who can best supply the needs and wants of the people, with a command economy in which government is the master and citizens build what the planners say must be built.

Here are some planks in AOC's GND:

• The elimination of fossil fuels in 10 years, which would entail the closing of all gas stawith electric-charging retooling tens of millions of vehicles that travel by land, sea, or air (with the alarming acknowledgment "we aren't sure that we'll be able to get rid of ... airplanes [in 10 years]"); replacing all power plants that use fossil fuels with wind and solar, and eliminating all jobs involved in the exploration, extraction, refining, and transportation of fossil

- "Retrofit every building in America."
- "Overhaul agriculture."
- "Provide job training and education to all."
- "Guarantee a job with family-sustaining wages"
- "Provide high-quality health care [and] housing."
- "Ensure universal access to healthy food ..." and much, much more.

What the GND proposes essentially, rebuilding America's physical plant and infrastructure from top to bottom - is physically impossible to do in 10 years. In fact, it couldn't be done in 100 years. The economy would collapse long before then in the chaos that socialist economies always experience as the inevitable consequence of replacing market prices with government edicts.

The GND is economically impossible, too, although its proponents seem to think that they can bypass economic reality by implementing what is called MMT—Modern Monetary Theory, a new label for the old, failed practice of printing more

stations; replacing or currencies are not backed by anything material but are created out of thin air and rely on legal tender laws to compel people to accept them as payment for goods and services.) Using its monopoly power over money, MMT in practice would give the federal government unlimited purchasing power. That would enable the government to outbid all private interests for labor, materials, equipment, etc. In short, what the government wants, the government gets, and private individuals and businesses are correspondingly deprived.

What about inflation wouldn't printing all those additional fiat dollars cause prices to rise? According to MMT, the government can prevent inflation by draining purchasing power away from the private sector through higher taxes. Thus, while printing more money increases the government's purchasing power, inflationary pressures would be offset as government removes purchasing power from the private sector. MMT is a game rigged so that the government always wins and the private sector always loses. No wonder socialists love MMT!

There is a well-known word that describes overwhelming power that government wields over people: tyranny. MMT boils down to government using its monopoly over money to dictate and control production, obliterate free markets, suppress private enterprise, and impoverish the people—i.e., socialism. A more apt name for MMT is Money Monopoly Tyranny. Indeed, MMT is a destructive tool tailor-made to assist the implementation of the socialistic Green

and Harris are doing, in gardens and other locations. The milkweed is critical since it is where the butterfly lays its eggs and the caterpillar feeds on the plant so that it can grow and become a monarch.

Native nectar plants are also necessary since they provide the food for the adult monarch. Both plants need to be available in order for the monarch to thrive through its complete lifecycle and during overwintering.

According to Xerces Society, "the Sacramento Valley, Sierra Nevada Foothills, and Coast Range are vital to the survival of the first generation of monarchs

produced each spring," and the group is urging the state to work to protect the butterfly by protecting its habitats from pesticide use, better manage overwintering sites and restore breeding and overwintering habitats.

Other ways that individuals can help are to contribute to citizen science by making and logging observations of the monarch, stop using insecticides and herbicides which not only harm the butterfly, but these can also kill milkweed. Xerces Society and Environment California also encourage people to encourage others to do the same.

According to Tierra Curry,

a senior scientist at the Center for Biological Diversity, increased habitat has helped the Eastern monarch butterfly numbers to rebound, but she said that a single good year is not an indicator of future years and calls for continued

protection. In June, the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service will make a determination whether to add the monarch to the list of threatened species under the Endangered Species Act of 1973. USFWS has been reviewing data since the request was submitted in 2014.

# **United Way Announces Sacramento Foster Youth Summit in April**

#### SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - United Way is gathering foster youth and community leaders working on foster care issues for its inaugural Foster Youth Summit on April 5 from 9 am-3 pm at the Sacramento State Ballroom, 6000 J Street.

The summit will identify opportunities to increase the number of foster youth who graduate from high school and go on to complete postsecondary education. Summit findings will be released as a report that will determine the direction of United Way's foster youth programs. For more information and to sign up: YourLocalUnitedWay. org/FosterYouthSummit.

Stephanie Bray, president and CEO of United Way California Capital Region, announced the summit to 300 supporters at United Way's 17th Annual Women United Luncheon on March 21. More than \$78,000 was raised through the luncheon for United Way's programs that are preparing foster youth for success in college and career. Since 2002, United Way's Women United action group has raised more than \$2 million for programs for local foster youth.

"It's time to take our work to the next level," Bray said at the luncheon. "For far too

long, we have talked about the drop-out and homelessness rates for foster youth. We know that no one person or organization can do this alone. So we are convening a public forum to discuss how we move the needle on high school graduation and college or career attainment for foster youth so that fewer struggle as they transition into adulthood."

Nonprofit service providers, state and county foster vouth advocates, school districts, foster youth and other supporters will come together for a deep dive into community level data, a foster youth panel on realworld implications of the data, breakout sessions and a keynote speech by Jennifer Rodriguez, JD, executive director of Youth Law Center and a former foster youth.

At the luncheon, Bray cited a 2018 Annie E. Casey Foundation report that noted without any support, California foster youth drop out of high school at a rate of 24 percent, 30 percent do not have stable housing and 51 percent are unemployed.

"That is so much lost potential," Bray said. "We at United Way believe that every child, including each foster youth, has the opportunity to achieve. Imagine the impact if we don't invest in our foster youth's potential."

Bray referred to luncheon keynote speaker September Hargrove as an example of how foster vouth achieve success, not only for themselves but for communities across the country. Hargrove, a former Sacramento foster youth who volunteered with United Way a decade ago. is now VP of global philanthropy at JPMorgan Chase & Co., leading the company's \$150 million commitment to Detroit through neighborhood revitalization, small business, financial capability

For nearly 100 years, United Way California Capital Region has brought local people together to make community change happen. Today, the nonprofit is bringing people together across Amador, El Dorado, Sacramento, Placer and Yolo counties for its Square One Project, a 20-year promise to significantly increase the number of students in our region who graduate from high school ready for success in college and beyond.

# **Sacramento County DA Reports**



**Defendants Convicted for Robbery** Spree of 14 Businesses

**DATE: March 26, 2019** CASE: Malcolm Brewer, Glen Conway & Shane Williams (Case #17FE023299)

PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Satnam Rattu, Homicide

Malcolm Brewer was convicted by a jury of 14 counts of robbery with 11 enhancements of being personally armed with a gun and two additional enhancements where another participant in the robbery was armed with a gun. He was also convicted of being a felon in possession of a gun. A separate jury convicted Glen Conway of three counts of robbery with two enhancements of being personally armed with a gun and an enhancement where another participant in the robbery was armed with a gun. Conway was also convicted of being a felon in possession of a gun.

A third defendant, Shane Williams, pled no contest to seven counts of robbery and seven enhancements where another participant in the robberies was armed with a gun.

The three defendants and two other perpetrators went on a robbery spree from November 10, 2017 to December 13, 2017. Over this time, they committed 14 separate robberies at fast food restaurants, gas stations, convenience stores and gaming stores. There were 19 separate victims, including both employees and customers. In most instances, the defendants wore masks, gloves and had a getaway driver waiting when they fled the scene. The defendants were identified through clothing, vehicles, phone records and DNA.

Allegations that Brewer and Conway each suffered a prior strike conviction for residential burglary under California three strikes law will be determined at the sentencing hearing.

Brewer faces a maximum sentence of 79 years in prison. Conway faces a maximum sentence of 33 years in prison. Brewer and Conway will be sentenced on April 26, 2019, at 9:00 a.m. Williams faces a maximum sentence of 13 years and 4 months in prison. His sentencing

is set for April 12, 2019, at 9:00 a.m. All three sentencing hearings will be held in Department 42 before the Honorable Allen

**Defendant Convicted of** Multiple Real Estate Fraud Charges

**DATE: March 21, 2019** CASE: Richard John Canacari (Case #18FE022389)

PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Susan Nelsen, Real Estate Fraud Unit

Richard John Canacari was convicted by a jury of two counts of filing or causing to be filed a false or forged document in a public office, two counts of possession of a forged document with intent to defraud, two counts of passing a forged document, and one count of grand theft. The jury also found true aggravated white-collar crime allegations.

Canacari and the victim were married, but separated in 1991. The victim owned a home as her sole and separate property. On July 6, 2016, Canacari recorded a forged Grant Deed transferring the home owned by his estranged wife to himself. He then used a forged and fraudulent Sacramento County Superior Court Judgment and Order that purportedly granted him the home, which he used to obtain a \$200,000 loan with the home as security. In his effort to secure the loan, he signed an additional Grant Deed on March 23, 2018. The lender funded the loan on May 9, 2018, based on Canacari's fraudulent documents and representations.

Canacari has a prior 1992 felony grand theft conviction for fraudulently borrowing \$40,000 with the same home as security and without his estranged wife's permission.

Canacari faces a maximum sentence of 12 years state prison. Sentencing is set for April 19, 2019, at 9:00 a.m. in Department 29 before the Honorable Geoffrey Goodman.

This case was investigated and prosecuted by the Sacramento County District Attorney's Office Real Estate Fraud Unit.


