Black Child Legacy Campaign **Nationally** Recognized

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - On March 2, 2019, The National Association of Counties Health Steering Committee unanimously approved a resolution in support of the Sacramento County Black Child Legacy Campaign.

Sacramento County Supervisor Phil Serna (District 1) presented a resolution in support of the campaign aimed at reducing deaths of African American children by 10 to 20 percent by the year 2020 in Sacramento County. Supervisor Serna shared with the Steering Committee promising results over the past six years of the community-driven movement aimed at reducing black infant mortality.

"The fact that Sacramento County is successfully saving young lives is resonating at a national level," said Supervisor Serna. "It's clear we're perceived as a model to address disparate childhood deaths in the African American community, and I couldn't be more proud of our effort," he continued.

On January 29, the Steering Committee on African American Child Deaths, which is managed by The Center at Sierra Health Foundation, along with the Sacramento County Child Death Review Team and the departments of Child, Family and Adult Services, Human Assistance, Probation as well as First 5 Sacramento went before the Sacramento County Board of Supervisors to present a report of the FY 2017-2018 progress of the Black Child Legacy Campaign. Those in the countywide initiative were proud to share that in three of the four leading causes the rate of child deaths in the African American community has decreased due to County investments.

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) -The Sacramento History Museum is proud to announce a new season of popular, fun and interpretive tour offerings at the Old Sacramento Waterfront. The new season officially kicks off the weekend of April 6 & 7, 2019 for both the Gold Fever! games and Old Sacramento Underground tours, which is celebrating its 10th season this year.

Guests to the Old Sacramento Waterfront can experience what it was like to catch gold fever while getting actively involved in the intriguing Gold Fever! games. Participants take on personas of characters in history – or "real-life rascals" - who scratched and clawed their way to make this area the center season, Old Sacramento

Gold Fever! games relive Sacramento's early days when gold fever ruled amid horrible disasters that threatened fates and fortunes. To spice things up even more, elements of chance are introduced that could change the fate of tour guests. Through the course of the lively tours that meander through the historic district, visitors discover if they successfully escaped the many floods, if they managed to keep their gold dust (or lost it all at the gambling tables) and if they survived the fires, disease and occasional steamboat explosion. Gold Fever! games last approximately one hour, are great fun for all ages, and cost \$12 for adults and \$8 for children 6 to 17 (children ages five and under are free).

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the same experience twice, guests the unique opportunity to explore what has been hidden beneath the city for more than 150 years, while uncovering the facts and legends that lie below historic buildings and sidewalks. Tour guests explore excavated foundations, enclosed pathways and interesting archaeology exhibits while hearing sounds of 1860 street life. Entertaining and knowledgeable tour guides lead the way while recounting tales of the devastation, perseverance, and determination that led to California's only successful street-raising project. Tours of the underground last approximately one hour and cost \$18 for adults, \$12 for youths (ages 6-17) and are free for children five and under.

All tour tickets include complimentary admission to the Sacramento History of the Gold Rush. Never Underground tours give Museum. Guests who

book an Old Sacramento Underground tour and Gold Fever! game at the same time (even if the tours take place on different days) receive special combo pricing as follows: \$25 for adults and \$15 for youths. State Pays for Pregnancy Centers' Win

Press Release from Liberty Counsel

LOS ANGELES, CA - A California federal district court has ordered the state of California to pay Liberty Counsel \$399,000 for attorneys' fees and costs regarding the victory in Mountain Right to Life v. Becerra, which now prohibits the state from enforcing the California Reproductive FACT Act, a law which compelled pro-life crisis pregnancy centers to promote abortion.

Court ruled in National Institute of Family and Life Advocates (NIFLA) v. Becerra that crisis pregnancy centers cannot be forced to promote abortions, the state agreed the law was unconstitutional and a permanent injunction was entered blocking the law. Now California is required to pay \$399,000 to Liberty Counsel for attorney's fees and costs.

Liberty Counsel represents three pro-life crisis pregnancy centers in Southern California: Mountain Right to Life, known as the Pregnancy and Family Resource Center (San Bernardino), His Nesting Place (Long Beach) and Birth Choice of the Desert (La Quinta).

The three pro-life crisis pregnancy centers are faith-based and offer women pregnancy resources, counseling, advice and alternatives to

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abortion. The California Reproductive FACT Act directly opposed their mission and forced them to endorse the government language promoting the abortion message on their front door, in their waiting room, online and in every advertisement for the crisis pregnancy center. The message had to be printed in 48-point font and in up to 13 languages or the centers could be fined \$500 for the first violation and \$1,000 for each additional violation.

"This is a great victory After the Supreme for children, mothers, and families," said Mat Staver, Founder and Chairman of Liberty Counsel. "Pro-life pregnancy centers will no longer be compelled to speak a message that goes against their mission to save the lives of babies and women. The law violated freedom of speech. The First Amendment protects the right to speak and the right not to speak. Faith-based pro-life pregnancy centers cannot be forced to promote human genocide," said Staver. The announcement was made February 12, 2019.

She and several other leaders in Sacramento completed a Multi-System Integration Certificate Program at Georgetown University and have implemented practices to reduce the number of foster children that cross over to She began her career the Juvenile Justice system.

The team also worked with other community partners to develop a county-wide protocol to identify and serve child victims of commercial sexual exploitation. She is currently co-leading efforts to develop a county-wide prevention plan that focuses on strengthening families and preventing child abuse.

I consider it a privilege to serve our community and want to acknowledge the dedicated staff in the Department of Child, Family and Adult Services who are serving and supporting children, families and adults each and every day in District 8 and the larger Sacramento area," said Michelle.



Medicare for All Could Mean Pizza for None

Under Medicare for All, Government May Micromanage Your Pizza Order

It sounds ridiculous. But look at what's happening in the United Kingdom, where the government runs the health system.

To combat the country's obesity epidemic, officials proposed limiting the number of calories permitted in thousands of foods. A single-serving pizza would be allowed a maximum of 928 calories. A savory pie, no more than 695.

Invasive measures like these might sound like the stuff of a totalitarian dystopia. But when the government foots the bill for our medical expenses, it has a financial incentive to micromanage our health. If Democrats succeed in establishing a single-payer

system here, Uncle Sam mandatory daily exercise could have a plausible case for dictating our diets, too.

British officials face a constant challenge -- how to keep a lid on medical spending when patients have no incentive to moderate their use of "free" healthcare services.

One way to reduce public healthcare spending is to change consumers' behaviors. Under socialized medicine, what foods we eat, how much we exercise, how we commute, and virtually all other private decisions become matters of public concern.

In April, the government implemented a tax on highsugar drinks. Officials are considering other intrusive measures -- like banning the sale of sweets at the checkout counter, nixing junk food advertisements on television, preventing people under 18 from buying energy drinks, and taxing milkshakes and sugary iced coffees.

This is likely just the start. As public health minister Steve Brine declared, the state is "willing to do whatever it takes to keep children healthy and well in this country."

Whatever it takes? Are how to implement it without

programs and cameras that monitor what people eat far wasted. According to a off? Will people have to turn to the black market to get their french frv fix?

Here in the United States, Obamacare has already begun making demands of us in exchange for state-sponsored health insurance.

The law ordered insurers to help obese people lose weight. Most health plans must provide screening and counseling for obesity at no extra charge to patients.

In addition, Obamacare mandated that chain restaurants, grocery stores, movie theaters, amusement parks, and vending machines include calorie counts on their menu items. The thinking was that this would encourage -- or embarrass -- people to cut their caloric intake.

The government spent a substantial amount of time and public money figuring out how to define terms like menu, menu board, restaurant food, and restaurant-type food. The rule was delayed multiple times over four years as officials tried to determine

bankrupting businesses.

All that effort was likely wealth of academic research, displaying calorie counts doesn't prompt people to change their diets.

Medicare for All's price tag would eclipse \$3 trillion a year. Even doubling the Treasury's tax take would be insufficient to cover that tab. So if Democrats take over the country's healthcare system by implementing Medicare for All -- with its outright ban on private coverage -- they'll have 3 trillion reasons to do all they can to curb health spending.

Great Britain has responded to this cost conundrum by trying to tell people what they can and can't eat. For the sake of our pizza -- and our privacy -we mustn't bring socialized medicine here.

Defendant Convicted of Child Sexual Assault, Special Allegation

DATE: March 7, 2019 **CASE:** Jon Humes (Case #17FE004862)

PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney TeriAnn Grimes, Special Assault & Child Abuse Unit

Jon Humes was convicted by a jury of seven counts of child sexual assault charges. The jury also found true a substantial sexual conduct allegation.

Humes was a family acquaintance of the victim. When the victim was 4 years old, Humes started sexually assaulting her. He bought the victim sex toys, sent her child pornography and continued to sexually assault her until she was 14 years old. In December 2015, the victim began cutting herself and was placed on a 5150 (involuntary psychiatric commitment) hold. At that time, she disclosed the abuse she had suffered for years.

Humes faces a maximum sentence of 37 years to life in prison. Sentencing is set for April 3, 2019, at 3:00 p.m. in Department 11 before the Honorable Trena Burger-Plavan.

Defendant Sentenced for Shooting at Downtown Club

DATE: March 5, 2019 CASE: Adrian Calderon (Case #17FE014783)

PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Casey Sinclair, Gangs & Hate Crimes Unit

The Honorable Raoul Thorbourne sentenced Adrian Calderon to 35 years and 4 months in prison. On October 15, 2018, a jury convicted Calderon of attempted voluntary manslaughter with the personal use of a firearm, two counts of assault with a semi-automatic firearm and enhancements relating to using a firearm and causing great bodily injury. Calderon was also convicted of intimidating a witness and being a felon in possession of a firearm.

On August 11, 2017, Adrian

Calderon was at the Parlare nightclub when he got into an argument with another patron, who took a swing at Calderon. When the club security guard went to intervene, Calderon pulled out a firearm and shot the other patron at close range. The bullet went through the security guard's hand and into the neck of the patron, seriously injuring both victims. After Calderon was arrested and incarcerated, he had an accomplice contact the security guard to encourage him to change his story and to meet with the accomplice. The victim declined to meet with the accomplice and notified law enforcement. A subsequent investigation revealed jail calls and visits between Calderon and two accomplices detailing the plan to contact the security guard. A search of one of the accomplice's residence uncovered a letter written by Calderon to the victim asking him to state in court he was mistaken when he identified Calderon as the shooter. The letter also offered money, help finding employment and other benefits.

An allegation that Calderon has a prior strike conviction for assault with a firearm was also found true.

Former Coach, Radio Personality Sentenced for Child Sexual Assault

DATE: February 22, 2019 CASE: Gregory Kosanke (Case #17FE013259)

PROSECUTOR: Principal Criminal Attorney Nancy Cochrane, Special Assault & Child Abuse Unit

The Honorable Helena Gweon sentenced Gregory Kosanke to 6 years in state prison.On December 3, 2018, a jury convicted Kosanke of two counts of child sexual assault.Kosanke is a former park and recreation assistantbasketball coach and a former radio personality. In March 2016, he sexually abused the young friend of one of his family members.During the pendency of sentencing, two additional victims came forward alleging Kosanke sexually assaulted them as well.He is pending a preliminary hearing in that case (#19FE000164) on February 28, 2019. ★

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



Here's Looking at You Kids!

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - According to the American Optometric Association (AOA), children's eyes rapidly change by the time they are six years old. Vision screenings focus on how well the child can see distant objects, and they are the only requirement under California law. Most screenings are performed in pediatrician offices or in schools, including some preschools.

On Wednesday, March 6, Rancho Cordova Library hosted free vision screenings for children between three and five years of age. Kiyo Sato, RN, MN, PHN, performed the screenings with the assistance of four volun-

practice in 1985. She also served as Captain of the USAF Nurse Corps, is listed in the Who's Who in American Nursing, and received prestigious awards. Her career spans 70 years, during which time she developed the Blackbird Vision Screening System.

Her system, she explained, differs from the eye charts many people are familiar with. She does not use the tumbling E chart or the shapes charts which are frequently used in pediatrician offices or schools. Nor does she use Snellen letters or numbers, which are recommended by the American Academy of Family Physicians to be used with children six years or older.

"Kids don't know the letter or shape charts,"

telling the story, she moves the card in the appropriate direction while the children listen and watch.

She then tells the children that she has magic glasses and asks who wants to try them and play a game. It did not take long before a handful of children raced to be first. Children sat on one side of the community room and Sato sat on the other. Each child was fitted with a pair of disposable glasses with doors that open and close to block one eye while testing the other. These occluders prevent children from peeking and are more sanitary than reusable pairs.
