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California DTFA Reports Cannabis Tax Revenues for Fourth Quarter of Last Year

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The California Department of Tax and Fee Administration (CDTFA) reported revenue numbers on February 19, 2019 for cannabis sales for the 4th quarter of 2018. Tax revenue reported by the cannabis industry totaled \$103.3 million for 4th quarter returns due by January 31, 2019, which includes state cultivation, excise, and sales taxes. It does not include tax revenue collected by each jurisdiction.

As of February 14, 2019, California's cannabis excise tax generated \$50.8 million in revenue reported on 4thquarter returns due by January 31, 2019. The cultivation tax generated \$16.4 million and the sales tax generated \$36.1 million in reported revenue. Retail sales of medicinal cannabis and medicinal cannabis products are exempt from sales and use taxes if the purchaser provides a valid Medical Marijuana Identification card and valid government-issued identification card.

Previously reported revenue for 3rd quarter returns was revised to \$100.8 million, which included \$53.3 million in excise tax, \$12.6 million in cultivation tax, and \$34.9 million in sales tax.

Revisions to quarterly data are the result of amended and late returns, and other tax return adjustments.

In November 2016, California voters approved Proposition 64, the Control, Regulate, and Tax Adult Use of Marijuana Act. Beginning on January 1, 2018, two new cannabis taxes went into effect: a cultivation tax on all harvested cannabis that enters the commercial market and a 15 percent excise tax upon purchasers of cannabis and cannabis products. In addition, retail sales of cannabis and cannabis products are subject to state and local sales tax.

CARMICHAEL, CA (MPG) - Some eye-popping antiques slip easily through a buttonhole. At the California Button Society's March 9 expo, you might snag a Civil War tunic fastener for \$50. If you lust for hand-painted 18th century pieces, be prepared to unbutton your billfold.

What astonishes at such bazaars is the availability of seriously old stuff. Snipped from long-ago rotted garments, many are thumb-nail masterpieces. "We often look at old buttons and imagine the stories they could tell,"

says Button Club treasurer Susan Rhoades. "They were traded, stolen and inherited. Lives were lost in making them; pearl dust and mercury (for gold plating) killed many. "You learn so much about history, art and manufacturing from buttons."

In the Middle Ages, no material was too grand for the button makers' art. Georgian aristocrats later bespoke Gainsborough-style portraits – sometimes of their pets – to fasten vests. When Queen Victoria took to wearing jet specimens, society followed. Though zippers have revolutionized modern fastening, nifty little buttons

have never been completely undone. "People visit our shows show seeking that one perfect item," says Sacramento collector Faye Wolfe. "One lady brought a vest she'd sewn; she wanted buttons for it. In the end, she chose four, each different. Who says they have to match? Our button world is full of eccentricity."

The Button Bazaar runs from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Saturday, March 9, at the La Sierra Center, 5325 Engle Rd, Carmichael. The show offers a free service for valuing buttons. Admission is by \$2 donation. For information, contact fwolfe@surewest.net. ★

FBI Teen Academy Provides High School Juniors Unique Opportunity

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Are you a high school junior who wonders if TV shows featuring the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) are realistic, what the FBI really does day-to-day, and what it really takes to work for the FBI? If you are a teen currently attending school within the area the FBI's Sacramento field office serves, you can apply to attend the Spring 2019 FBI Teen Academy to find out. The application is available for download online on the FBI Sacramento Field Office's Community Outreach page.

The FBI Sacramento Field Office will host its Spring 2019 FBI Teen Academy at its headquarters in Roseville on Friday, April 12, 2019. All high school juniors—whether enrolled in public, private,

charter, or home school—may apply by downloading the application located on the FBI Sacramento Field Office's Community Outreach web page. When complete, the application package includes three mandatory elements: application, essay, and release forms. All applications must arrive at the FBI Sacramento Field Office by 4 p.m. on Monday, March 11, 2019. Email and electronic submissions are not accepted.

Students chosen for the class spend an informative, interactive day at FBI Sacramento Field office headquarters in Roseville. The class learns about the FBI's investigative priorities, participates in unique, interactive experiences, and engages directly with FBI personnel. After completing the class, students are familiar with the FBI's mission and what personal and academic choices

one may make to be eligible to become a member of the FBI workforce. Students are also more aware of the threats their communities face, they fully understand the challenges of the online environment, and they are better prepared to mentor their peers.

The FBI Sacramento Field Office serves 34 California Counties: Alpine, Amador, Butte, Calaveras, Colusa, El Dorado, Fresno, Glenn, Inyo, Kern, Kings, Lassen, Madera, Mariposa, Merced, Modoc, Mono, Nevada, Placer, Plumas, Sacramento, San Joaquin, Shasta, Sierra, Siskiyou, Solano, Stanislaus, Sutter, Tehama, Tulare, Tuolumne, Trinity, Yolo, and Yuba.

The FBI Teen Academy is a no-cost experience for students; however, families may incur personal expenses for any travel necessary to attend the class. ★

U.S. Department of Transportation Announces Cancellation of Grant Funds to CA High-Speed Rail Project

WASHINGTON - The U.S. Department of Transportation announced today that the Federal Railroad Administration (FRA) intends to cancel \$929 million in Federal grant funds yet to be paid for the California High-Speed

Rail project envisioned to connect the L.A. Basin to the San Francisco Bay Area. In addition, the Department announced it is actively exploring every legal option to seek the return from California of \$2.5 billion in Federal funds

FRA previously granted for this now-defunct project. FRA Administrator Ronald L. Batory notified the California HSR Authority (CHSRA) of this action in a letter today, February 19, 2019.

Sutter urgent care centers or video visits, in addition to traditional office visits with a primary care doctor within Sutter's network of care.

"We want to reserve emergency departments for complex and life-threatening illnesses, rather than having people with minor medical problems going there because they have no other option," Foss said. "At the same time, allowing patients to receive non-urgent care and vaccinations quickly, near where they live or work, should help free up doctor-office visits for those with more serious issues." Grant Applications Now Open for City's Community Enhancement Fund

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - The City of Rancho Cordova is now accepting grant applications for the 2019/2020 fiscal year, and applicants will have until March 15, 2019 to submit their proposals. The City will accept applications from individual residents, organizations, businesses, and community partners who are interested in enhancing the Rancho Cordova community. The grants awarded in this call for applications are part of the estimated \$8 million budget in 2019/2020 for the City's Community Enhancement Fund. The City's Community Enhancement Fund is funded by the Measure H, ½ cent local sales tax measure approved by voters in November 2014.

Of the estimated \$8

million, the City anticipates awarding \$1.6 million in community grants in the categories of arts, culture, history, entertainment, and sports; education; and for other projects. The remaining funds are allocated to other community priorities, such as community development, economic development, public safety, public works, and more. The actual budget may vary based on final approved funding allocations.

Grant applications that include a project or program operating on a K-12 school site must request the endorsement of the applicable school superintendent(s) and must be submitted to the school district representative with the draft grant proposal no later than March 8, 2019.

After applications are received by the City, staff will review each application and supplemental

materials and will share the initial review of applications with City Council in April. Applicants may be contacted to present their project during the May 2019 City Council meetings. Funding decisions could be made as early as May and formally adopted in early June 2019. City staff intends to notify all applicants of the funding decisions by late June 2019.

Those interested in submitting a grant proposal can apply through an online application or submit a written funding request. The grant application and other important information for the Community Enhancement Fund can be found on the City's website at www.cityofranhocordova.org/CommunityEnhancementFund.

TEEN HEART SCREENING

INVITED: All teens and young adults ages 12 to 25 years are invited to participate in Via Heart Project's heart screening event.

WHY: It is estimated 1 in 500 school-aged children suffer an undiagnosed heart defect, which can lead to sudden cardiac arrest and death. A typical annual physical does not screen for advanced heart abnormalities. **This screening does not take the place of your annual or pre-participation sports physical.**

WHAT: Screenings take 60-90 minutes (wait times may vary). A team of medical volunteers; including cardiologists, sonographers, and nurses from the Sacramento and Bay area, will conduct a health history questionnaire review an EKG test, and if warranted, an echocardiogram. The entire process is non-invasive—no needles or x-ray exposure—and we ensure each teen's confidentiality, privacy and individual modesty is respected throughout all aspects of the screening.

HOW: Your child must be registered online in advance. **Please bring their completed Health Form to the event.** Please register and access forms at <http://viaheartproject.org/screenings> Registration is open now and closes at noon on February 22nd. Registration is limited to 750 students.

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Every year, Sacramento County employees participate in an employee-organized fundraising campaign to support local and global nonprofit organizations. To report on the success of the 2018 Employee Giving Campaign, the Campaign's Chair and Director for the Office of Economic Development, Troy Givans, presented the results on Jan. 29 to the Board of Supervisors.

The theme of this year's campaign, "Sacramento County Cares," highlights the generosity and concerns that employees show when they support the causes that improve the quality of life in their local communities and

the world around them. This year's campaign included a new online donation system, Giving Matters 365, which expanded the County's paperless initiative and streamlined donations through only payroll deductions, and credit/debit card contributions.

Giving campaign events included the annual 5K race/walk held at Discovery Park and a successful golf tournament held at Ancil Hoffman Golf Course.

Donations were provided to six federations of charitable organizations, as well as 17 non-profit Sacramento County programs that serve our communities.

The grand total of the 2018 donations came to \$273,024.

Lady Lancers' Season Ends at Nevada Union

GRASS VALLEY, CA (MPG) - After enjoying an impressive turnaround this season, the Cordova Lady Lancers' 2018 campaign came to an abrupt halt following a 62-47 loss at Nevada Union in the first round of the CIF Sac Joaquin Section Division III basketball playoffs on Tuesday, February 12.

The No. 12 seed Lady Lancers had no answer for No. 5 seed Lady Miners' senior forward Meadow Aragon, who tallied an impressive 26 points and 17 rebounds in the win to

lead Nevada Union. "Her off-ball movement is what really set her apart," Cordova head coach Kim Little said of Aragon's play against Cordova. "We struggled playing with her and moving in the man-to-man as she was able to hit on us a lot with backdoor screens."

Despite the performance from Aragon, Cordova made things interesting throughout the contest as they battled back from big deficits on multiple occasions. The Lady Miners (20-10 overall) jumped out to an early 19-4 first quarter lead, only to see the Lady Lancers (19-8 overall) go on a run of their own in

the second quarter as they pulled within four points at 26-22. An ensuing 6-0 run by Nevada Union would create a 10-point margin at half-time, however.

Cordova would again attempt to seize the momentum in the third

quarter as they began the second half on a 12-5 run to pull within three points, but the hole they dug themselves early on

proved to be too deep. The Lady Miners would end the

on a 12-2 run and Cordova was unable to pull within fewer than 10 points in the final quarter.

"In the first quarter we dug ourselves a hole," Little said. "We missed 14 shots and they outscored us. The remaining quarters were pretty even, so I think that first quarter is what kind of hurt us."

The Lady Lancers were led by a pair of sophomores in Emika Love and Eva Graf, who scored 12 points apiece on the night.

The loss certainly was not the way the Lady Lancers wanted to end

their season, as they have been enjoying quite the revival after a subpar 2017 campaign where they finished 6-21 overall. With that in mind however, Little is proud of the way her team played this season and views this season positively as they appear to be headed in the right direction.

"I'm very encouraged and very proud of the girls," she said. "The Nevada Union game is not a complete disappointment to our season. If we think about the entire season, we're just ecstatic from the huge turnaround from last year. It's been an amazing ride. It's breathtaking how well we did." ★



Second Quarter Stumble Impacts Lancers' Loss at Manteca

MANTECA, CA (MPG) - After falling in the first round of the CIF Sac Joaquin Section Division III playoffs the past two seasons, the Cordova Lancers boys' varsity basketball team hoped the third time would be the charm. Unfortunately, the Lancers will have to try again next season after a 66-51 loss at Manteca on Wednesday, February 13.

After the first quarter resulted in an 11-11 stalemate, it appeared that No. 13 seed Cordova was prepared to give No. 4 seed Manteca as much as they could handle. Outside of the second quarter the Lancers would do just that, however a Buffaloes stampede in that fateful second quarter proved to be the difference in the contest. Manteca outscored Cordova 21-9, taking a 32-20 lead into

halftime that they would not relinquish.

"They became very aggressive driving to the basket," Lancers head coach Fletcher Johnson said of the Buffaloes' spurt prior to halftime. "We weren't getting stops, and their athleticism just kind of took over."

In the second half Cordova (17-12 overall) was only outscored by a three-point margin, but the damage had

been done. Junior guard Isaiah Bolden led the Lancers with 23 points in the loss, and sophomore DeShawun Lawon tallied 11. Manteca (21-9 overall) had three players score in double figures, including senior guard Jorge Sedano (18), senior forward Domonick Victor (14), and junior forward Jordan Burciaga (13).

"It was a good game, they (Manteca) were a lot better than they appeared


on tape," Johnson said. "Very athletic team, very strong. A good team with nice size and nice athleticism."

Despite the loss, the Lancers are proud of what they were able to accomplish this season as they captured the Greater Sacramento League title with a perfect 10-0 league record. The team also dealt with roster turnover at times due to injuries and off-court

circumstances, which Johnson felt hampered his team. All things considered however, the team isn't disappointed in how their season ended.

"We're disappointed in that we didn't win against Manteca, but not disappointed based on the fact of who we played. Any time you can play a team like Manteca on the road with what we had, it was a good effort." ★
