

A Proactive Approach to Illegal Marijuana Grows

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG)

The Rancho Cordova Police Department (RCPD) and the City of Rancho Cordova Code Enforcement Division are partnering to take a proactive approach to identify and halt illegal marijuana grows in the City of Rancho Cordova.

We are able to identify these illegal marijuana grows in the City through community tips and investigations.

Since June 2018, RCPD and the City have: Served search warrants at 10 residential locations; Seized

and destroyed 3,704 marijuana plants; Made eight arrests, with an additional five arrest warrants being submitted; Recovered four firearms.

According to the Rancho Cordova Municipal Code, the City can levy penalties for illegal marijuana grows. All locations that were illegally growing marijuana had building and safety violations. Penalties have been assessed as appropriate against violating property owners. These locations were cited as uninhabitable (red-tagged). We need you to continue to be our eyes in our community to help stop illegal marijuana grows. You may be able to identify an illegal



marijuana grow in your neighborhood if you smell marijuana, or see windows that may be boarded from the inside or window dressings that are always closed.

New Roadway Safety Laws for 2019 Begin

New laws approved by the California Legislature in 2018 will affect roadway safety in several ways, including helmet use on bicycles and motorized scooters, hit-and-run on bicycle paths, modified exhaust systems, and enhanced safety for refuse collection vehicles. To support its mission of providing the highest levels of Safety, Service, and Security, the California Highway Patrol (CHP) is highlighting several of these new laws.

Bicycle hit-and-run on bike path (AB 1755, Steinorth): The provisions of the felony hit-and-run law are extended to cyclists on Class I bikeways (bike paths). Currently, in the California Vehicle Code, a driver involved in a collision resulting in death or injury to another party is required to stop at the scene. This law clarifies that the same vehicle code also applies on Class I bikeways and allows law enforcement to hold individuals accountable for reckless behavior.

Bicycle helmets (AB 3077, Caballero): Persons under age 18 not wearing a helmet on a bicycle, scooter, skateboard, or skates will receive a "fix-it" ticket. A citation is considered non-punitive and correctable if proof that the minor has completed a bicycle safety course and has a helmet that meets safety standards is presented within 120 days to the issuing law enforcement agency.

Helmet use on motorized scooters (AB 2989, Flora): Bicycle helmets are no longer required for riders of motorized scooters who are age 18 or older. Motorized scooters may operate within a Class IV bikeway as well as a Class II bikeway and on highways with speed limits up to 25 miles per hour. Local jurisdictions may pass ordinances to allow motorized scooters on highways with speed limits up to 35 miles per hour. It is still illegal to operate a motorized scooter on a sidewalk.

Certain vehicle exhaust violations no longer correctable (AB 1824, Committee on Budget): A fine will become mandatory, not correctable, when loud motor vehicles and motorcycles are cited. Previously, a driver or motorcyclist who was cited for modified or excessively loud exhaust or muffler systems could correct the violation to avoid a fine.

Passing waste service vehicles (AB 2115, Santiago): When approaching or overtaking a refuse collection vehicle with its amber lights flashing, drivers must move into an adjacent lane, if possible, and pass at a safe distance. If it is not possible, drivers must slow to a safe and reasonable speed. This law provides a safety margin for sanitation workers while they are actively working. ★

A Vital Emergency Bridge Program for Foster Children

Counties throughout California are working to recruit loving families to care for foster children, but some families may feel they cannot afford to bring a foster child into their home due to budget constraints. To increase the number of foster parents and meet the needs of foster children, the Emergency Child Care Bridge Program for Foster Children was established for counties to help caregivers pay for child care until they find other subsidized child care or are able to pay for child care themselves.

Introduced in January 2018, the Bridge Program aims to increase the number of stable, sustainable family placements for children in foster care. The program provides eligible

caregivers vouchers to pay for child care. These vouchers help ensure that caregivers have adequate support to balance work and home lives and increase the likelihood of a smooth transition.

In 2018-19, 46 counties opted in to receive a portion of the \$31 million allocated to provide Bridge Program services. As of November 30, the program in

Sacramento County had served 72 foster children in nearly 60 foster families.

On December 11, the Sacramento County Board of Supervisors approved a nearly \$500,000 increase of the Bridge Program contract funding to expand child care support services. The \$1.3 million budget for Fiscal Year 2018-19 will be used to contract with Child Action, Inc., the local

College Costs are Holding Students Back

Out-of-pocket Costs at UC, CSU Actually Lower than Community Colleges

OAKLAND, CA - California students might be surprised by the findings of a new study on college costs. What College Costs for Low-Income Californians, released by The Institute for College Access and Success (TICAS), finds that low-income students and families actually pay less to attend each of the nine University of California (UC) campuses than they would at Cal State (CSU) or California Community Colleges (CCC) in the same region.

Students pay more at community colleges despite lower published tuition - called the "sticker price" - because tuition and fees only tell part of the story when it comes to college costs. Books, meals, housing, and other costs add to the overall price tag. More importantly, grant aid to help students cover costs varies widely across the three California college systems. Despite paying less in tuition, community college students face similar living expenses and receive substantially less financial aid. The findings of this report have vital implications for both students and policymakers.

"Don't assume a college is or isn't affordable based on the sticker price; find out what you'll actually pay including financial aid and living expenses. A four-year degree at UC or CSU might be more affordable than the local community college," said TICAS executive vice president Debbie Cochrane. "This should also be a wake-up call in Sacramento. Most full-time California community college students pay no

tuition, but there isn't nearly enough financial aid to bring their other costs of college in reach. It's time to prioritize true college affordability for low- and middle-income Californians."

Because California state financial aid has historically been tied to tuition, UC students receive three times the amount of grant aid. This means that students at California community colleges - which disproportionately serve low-income families - are stuck footing higher bills. While experts agree that students should not work more than 20 hours per week while enrolled, the net prices at the vast majority of public colleges surveyed - including most UC campuses - would require a typical low-income student to work more than this amount.

There is increasing consensus that California's financial aid programs need reform to better meet student needs. In recent years, TICAS, the California Student Aid Commission (in collaboration with The Century Foundation) and the Legislative Analyst's Office have proposed ways to reform and expand financial aid to better support students in paying for the full costs of college.

California lawmakers can take immediate steps towards reform by expanding

need-based aid to serve all eligible applicants and better covering non-tuition costs like housing, meals, and school supplies. Currently, fewer than 5 percent of CCC students receive a Cal Grant, even though many more are eligible. Legislators can help by immediately increasing the number of competitive Cal Grants available to students who have been out of high school for more than a year and increasing the Cal Grants' maximum award to better cover non-tuition costs.

"College costs are holding too many students back from earning the credentials they seek and that the state needs," said Laura Szabo-Kubitz, associate California program director at TICAS. "Our new governor takes office facing many critical challenges, but he must make it a priority to put college truly within reach for every Californian."



 child care resource and referral agency, for Child Care Vouchers, Navigator Services and Trauma-Informed Care Training/Coaching.
 “With more parents working outside the home, the ability to recruit and retain foster parents is becoming more challenging,” said Michelle Callejas, Sacramento County Director of Child, Family and Adult Services. “The Bridge Program is vital to help the Department of Child, Family and Adult Services place more local foster children in homes where they will receive high-quality care. The amendment of the contract will allow our department to support even more families who open their homes and hearts to foster children.”
 The Bridge Program is

comprised of three major components. This includes emergency child care vouchers that are issued to eligible families to cover child care costs for children ages 0-12 for 6 to 12 months; support from a child care navigator who will work with families to find a child care provider, assist with completion of child care applications, and develop a plan for long-term child care; as well as trauma-informed care training so child care providers can learn strategies for working with children in foster care, many of whom have experienced trauma.

There are many types of families in the foster care system who are eligible for the Bridge Program: Resource families that have completed the Resource Family Approval (RFA) process; Foster Family

Agency-approved or County-approved homes; families who care for foster children in an emergency placement; an approved relative or a non-related extended family member; parenting youth and non-minor dependents; or those who have children placed with them for a compelling reason.

15-Minute Light Rail Service on Weekends Began January 6

SACRAMENTO, CA - The Sacramento Regional Transit District (SacRT) is increasing light rail service on weekends starting Sunday, January 6, 2019. Light rail service will increase from 30 minutes to 15 minutes during peak travel hours.

“By offering more frequent service on the weekends, people will be able to travel to their destinations as safely and quickly as possible,” said

Henry Li, SacRT General Manager/CEO. “All of these historic improvements reduce barriers for people to ride public transit, and show SacRT’s commitment to our customers and the community.”

On Saturdays, the 15-minute service will operate from approximately 9 a.m. to 9 p.m. On Sundays and holidays, the 15-minute service will operate from approximately 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. All other times on Saturdays and Sundays/holidays as well as service to Folsom stations,

light rail frequency will be 30 minutes. Visit sacrt.com to view the schedules.

This service improvement is just one of many customer initiatives that SacRT has implemented over the last year. SacRT expanded service hours to Folsom light rail stations in June, lowered fares in October, brought back the 25 cent transfer ticket, and reduced the student monthly pass from \$55 to \$20.

In the past year, bizfile was expanded to allow Californians to file trademarks and servicemarks and form Limited Liability Companies (LLCs) online. Now, Californians can use an online form to terminate their LLC. Click here for the new LLC Termination tool.

“Bizfile California is making it easier to do business in our state,” Secretary of State Alex Padilla said. “Expanding bizfile California helps entrepreneurs avoid the lengthier review turnaround time associated with paper filings. As we increase our online business tool offerings, we’re also decreasing the rejection

rate for common business filings. As California business owners and entrepreneurs are preparing for end of year filings, they can avoid the lines at the office by going online and utilizing bizfile California.”

Tools available through bizfile California:

- LLC Statement of Information Online Submission Tool. Since the initial bizfile launch in June 2017, 606,285 online LLC Statements of Information filings have been processed.
- California Business Search Tool. Over 13.6 million Corporation, LLC, and LP records are available for free download.
- How to Start a Business in California brochure and

check list.
 • Online Trademark Submission Tool. There have been over 4,626 submissions since tool was launched January 2018.

• LLC Formation Online Submission Tool. Launched in May 2018, the documents required to form an LLC can now be filed online. Since launch, we have processed 54,693 LLC Formation online submissions

• Eureka Chatbot. Our new artificial intelligence search assistant—launched May 2018—helps customers easily navigate business resources on the Secretary of State’s website. Eureka has already answered over 29,778 questions.

High School students who apply to competitive University of California schools earn admission.

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - Cordova High School was in The Sacramento Bee last week being named as one of the top 10 schools with the highest University of California (UC) admission rates in the Sacramento region. I am going to quote from the Folsom Cordova Unified School District Digest article that can be found online. "Nearly three-quarters of Cordova High School students who apply to competitive University of California schools earn admission - one of the highest acceptance rates in the Sacramento region, according to recent data from the UC system. At a 72 percent admission rate, Cordova High ranks eighth out of 88 among the Sacramento-region high schools provided in the latest data. Schools with International Baccalaureate Programmes, such as Cordova High's growing program, fared among the best in their admission rates, according to an analysis of the data in a recent Sacramento Bee article. Folsom Cordova's other comprehensive high schools UC admission rates: Vista del Lago High (65 percent), Folsom High (58 percent)." I can't say anything more than congratulations to the students, teachers and admission staff at Cordova High. Keep shooting for the stars. I am going to Washington D.C. later this month to

join other Mayors at the United States Conference of Mayors Winter Meeting. One of the statements from the United States Conference of Mayors President and Columbia (SC) Mayor Steve Benjamin on the federal government shutdown was this, "Every day, mayors across this country put aside their partisan differences and find common ground on even the most difficult of issues. We do not have the luxury of turning our backs on our residents. It's time for Washington to take a page out of our playbook." I couldn't agree with him any more. There will be many meetings, speeches and comparisons as we examine the similarities or dissimilarities of local government and federal government. At the moment, the major similarity I can find is that every person, in local or federal government, were hired (elected) to do the job they said they would do. And they seem to forget that they were hired by their fellow citizens.

One major question right now is whether it will be realistic for me to go to the conference, or even if it will be held. The storms that are going through California will be hitting the East Coast for days or weeks, and the last picture of Washington D.C. showed 10 inches of snow there. With the federal government now on its 4th week of shutdown, and with D.C. stopping because of the weather, I may have to cancel going to this mayor's conference. The pre-check, which usually helps going through the airports, is taking three hours

because of the government shutdown and security people not coming to work, so it may be better not to go for now. I'll know soon, but I have to get this column turned in.

Today at the Rancho Cordova Luncheon, I had the pleasure of talking to everyone who had a chance to come to the luncheon about some of the many things that have happened in Rancho Cordova since I was Mayor in 2015 and what is coming in 2019. Now, some of the things are finished, while a few are still in progress. For example, when I presented at the Rancho Cordova Luncheon in January 2015, the Rancho Cordova Center of Folsom Lake College was under construction. Mather Veterans Village Phase I was under construction. The Performing Arts Center at Cordova High School was under construction. Measure H had been passed, but we had not held our public meetings yet, so we were waiting to hear how our residents wanted their sales taxes spent. I was definitely unaware of the honor of having the new elementary school in the Anatolia neighborhood being given my name, and it wasn't even under construction yet.

For now, I have to move forward and get more done here at City Hall, but there is much that still needs to be done. Looking out of the window, I can tell that we are definitely going to get rainy, windy weather for the next few days.

Secretary of State Offers 2018 Year in Review

Thanks to the hard work and dedication of our entire agency staff, 2018 was another milestone year at the California Secretary of State's office. We registered more voters than ever before, allowed entrepreneurs to form their LLCs online, launched six new digital archive exhibits, are revamping our Cal-Access website, upgraded our IT infrastructure, and conducted an election with the largest turnout for a midterm in over 35 years!

Cyber threats to our elections has become the new normal. This year, to combat these threats, our office worked with the State Legislature and the Governor to secure funding to strengthen our IT infrastructure and election security. The 2018-2019 state budget allocated \$134.3 million for counties to replace aging voting systems. Fully leveraged by a dollar-for-dollar match from counties, this will result in \$268.6 million towards improvements for election equipment, marking the first significant funding towards voting systems in California in 15 years. California also received \$34 million from the US Elections Assistance Commission through the Help America Vote Act (HAVA).

Thanks to an additional \$3 million in the State Budget, we established the new offices of Election Cybersecurity and Enterprise Risk

Management. In addition, we enacted new efforts to combat election misinformation online and launched VoteSure™, a first-ever public education campaign urging voters to be vigilant about election misinformation online. As threats to our elections evolve, so will we — and we are already preparing for the 2020 Presidential Election.

Through the Secretary of State's Democracy at Work Program, businesses, government agencies, and nonprofit organizations partnered with our office to promote voter registration and participation. Whether Californians were requesting a ride with Uber or buying a cup of coffee at Starbucks, the successful partnerships reached millions of Californians ahead of the Primary and General Elections.

Five California counties—Madera, Napa, Nevada, Sacramento, and San Mateo—implemented the Voter's Choice Act for the first time in 2018. In these counties, every registered voter was mailed a ballot, and voters had the option of returning their ballot by mail, at a ballot drop box, or any vote center open in their county. Voters took advantage of expanded access, with all five counties exceeding the statewide turnout rate in both the Primary and General Election. Every California county is eligible to adopt this new model for conducting elections beginning in 2020.

In 2018, California saw a record number of voter

pre-registrations across the state. 290,000 16- and 17-year-olds have pre-registered to vote since the launch of the program in late 2016. This was a part of the Secretary of State's priority to engage young people across California in the electoral process. The California Students Vote Project expanded, partnering with the Association of Independent California Colleges and Universities (AICCU) to register students to vote. This expansion led to the launch of the first ever California University and Ballot Bowl Competition, with the aim of increasing civic engagement and voter participation among the students attending the major institutions of higher learning in California. To encourage students to become active voters when

they are old enough to cast a ballot, the Secretary of State's office facilitated the California Student Mock Election in October of this year. The California Student Mock Election had 477 participating schools cast over 55,000 ballots for Governor, United States Senator, and eleven statewide measures that were on the November 6, 2018 General Election ballot.

Our Business Programs Division continued to make it easier to do business in California by expanding online filing options through bizfile California. For the first time, Californians can form LLCs and file trademarks online.

The Secretary of State's office is the first state-level Department or Agency to utilize Microsoft's Artificial Intelligence to

launch the Eureka Chatbot to assist customers with basic business filing questions. This showcases how public-private partnerships can benefit and modernize the state's capacity to serve customers. This innovation was recognized by the Center for Digital Media, which awarded the Secretary of State's Eureka with the Best of California Award, for Best Application Serving the Public.

In the past year, the California State Archives has made great strides in digitizing their collections. In partnership with Google Arts and Culture, the California Digital Archives released 5 new exhibits covering: Voting by Mail during the Civil War (in English and Spanish), the Incarceration of Japanese Americans during World War II, the 50th Anniversary of the Assassination of Robert F. Kennedy, and the Art and Architecture of Alfred Eichler. The California Digital Archives was recognized by the National Association of Secretaries of State (NASS) with the 2018 Innovation, Dedication, Excellence & Achievement in Service (IDEAS) Award.

The federal government is considering the addition of a citizenship question to the 2020 Census which has the potential to intimidate millions of California residents from participating. California is suing to prevent the question from being added to the survey. We also launched

"All Californians Count," a Census 2020 initiative to ensure a fair and accurate count in line with the United States Constitution.

The Safe at Home program is California's confidential mail program, which was expanded this year to include victims of human trafficking, now victims of domestic violence, stalking, sexual assault, human trafficking, and reproductive health care workers all have access to safety and security in their own homes. This program provides participants with a substitute mailing address, which is accepted by California state, county, and city government agencies in lieu of a residential or other mailing address where the victim can be personally tracked down, keeping the residence address confidential and out of the hands of abusers. The Safe at Home program website was also revamped, providing easier access to apply for the program, and for participants to contact the program.

The California Automated Lobbyist and Campaign Contribution and Expenditure Search System, or CAL-ACCESS, is a vital tool to track money in politics. Our Political Reform Division is working on updating and improving the tool. We launched a new web portal to keep the public informed about the important changes coming soon. ★

Dear Dave,
My husband and I have about \$20,000 in credit card debt, plus payments on a new truck. We also have a camper he bought before we got married that we're still making payments on. I recently received a \$50,000 inheritance, and I'd like to use that money to help get us out of debt and open a savings account. My husband says he is onboard, but he keeps buying things we don't have the money for. I don't want the inheritance to go to waste, so what can I do?

—Tessa
Dear Tessa,
I want you guys to get control of your finances and have a better life, too. But until your husband is willing to get rid of the camper and the truck, I'd hang on to the inheritance money.

Right now, you need more than his words—you need his actions. At this point, the real issue isn't the debt or the idea of using the gift you received to pay off the debt. The issue is you can't see a future where

your husband isn't going to repeat the same financial stupidity. You need to have that future cleared up, and it isn't going to be cleared up until he proves he has changed his heart and his ways. In his case, that means showing he has become a grown-up and isn't buying toys he can't afford anymore.

I know where you are, and I know where he is right now. I've been there. Years ago, I was a "grown man" but I was still really a little boy buying things I couldn't afford to impress people I didn't even know. This guy likes stuff. He likes shiny trucks, shiny things to pull behind shiny trucks, and that sort of thing.

But it's time for him to sell all the crap, grow up, and start putting you and your family first. Keep talking to him. Explain how important it is to you that you're both on same page financially and in every other aspect of your marriage. Until he proves he's ready to do that, though, I'd say just hold on to the inheritance money.

Point 27 Honors 11 Fallen California Officers

ATLANTA, GEORGIA (MPG) - Point 27, an Atlanta-based global nonprofit, has sent Thin Blue Line scripture-inscribed dog tags called Shields of Strength to the agencies of the 12 California police officers killed in the line of duty in 2018.

Point 27 also sent scripture-inscribed Folded Flag Pendant Necklaces for family members of the fallen officers.

Point 27 honored every fallen officer across the country who died in the line of duty in 2017 and 2018 and their families.

California officers killed in the line of duty in 2018 are: Newman Police Cpl. Ronil Singh, Stanislaus County Deputy Sheriff Tony Hinostrroza III, Gardena Police Officer Toshio Hirai, Ventura County Sheriff's Sgt. Ronald Lee Helus, Sacramento County Deputy Sheriff Mark V. Stasyuk, California Dept. of Corrections and Rehabilitation Corrections Officer Armando Gallegos Jr., Costa Mesa Police Officer Oscar Adrian Reyes, California Highway Patrol Officer Kirk A. Griess,

Marin County Deputy Sheriff Douglas Zirkle, Pomona Police Officer Gregory Casillas and Los Angeles County Deputy Sheriff Steven Belanger.

US Army (Ret.) Col. David Dodd serves as director of Point 27, with a stated mission of honoring fallen officers, fallen soldiers, veterans and their families—not just one month a year, but every month of every year.

Dodd commanded a battalion of the first troops deployed to Afghanistan following 911. He wore a Shield of Strength inscribed with Joshua 1:9 next to his government-issued dog tags, and equipped each of the soldiers in his command with a Shield of Strength before they deployed.

Dodd says he hopes the scripture on the Shields of Strength encourages these officers and the families of the fallen, who are making and have made tremendous sacrifice for their communities.

"We are forever grateful for these brave men and women in law enforcement. We will never forget the ultimate sacrifice they made, and we will not forget their families," Dodd said. "We present the Thin Blue Line Dog Tags

to thank the officers for their putting their lives on the line to protect Americans. The dog tag is engraved with a Bible verse and serves as a physical reminder that God is with them day and night as they patrol and protect the streets of their communities. The face of the Thin Blue Line Shields of Strength shows an engraved silver American flag face designed with one flag stripe of blue. The back of the dog tags is inscribed with Matthew 5:9; "Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called

children of God." The Folded Flag Pendant necklaces are engraved with John 15:13; "Greater love has no one than this; to lay down one's life for one's friends."

Dodd served 27 years in the military, and after his military retirement, he founded Point 27 to share the scripture-inscribed dog tags, that encouraged him and his troops, with members of the military and veterans. Since -- and by request of law enforcement -- the outreach has expanded to include the Thin Blue Line Shields of Strength for law enforcement officers. ★


First to hit the mats at Sutter Middle School were the JV boys on Friday January 11th. Cordova wrestlers top finishers competing
