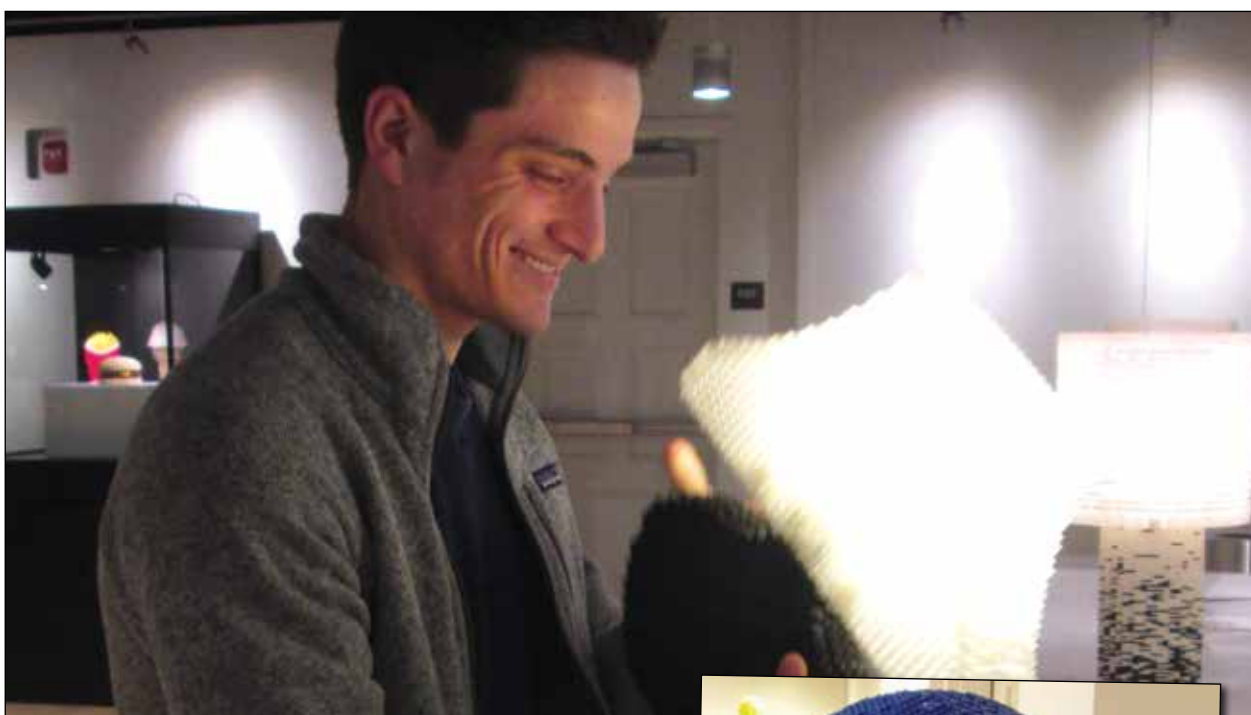

Bricking Bad Showcase

LEGO Bricks as an Art Form at MACC

- David Truman Tracy's smile shines as brightly as the many lamps on display at Mills Station Arts & Culture Center's (MACC) first exhibit of 2019. The lamps illuminate the gallery and showcase Tracy's interest in working with what he first encountered as a toy when he was a child. Tracy has turned STEM (science, technology, engineering, and math) into STEAM (science, technology, engineering, art, and math) through his interest in building functional, fun, and decorative works from LEGO bricks.

Since part of LEGO's philosophy surrounding quality play during childhood is that it "lays the foundation for later adult life," it seems only fitting that Tracy has taken his childhood interest into adulthood.

He studied under internationally known Nathan Sawaya, learning how to sculpt with the bricks which Tracy has molded into three dimensional objects like his lamps, some of which have been on display at Sacramento's Lumens Light and Living; a 6 ft. tall green male figure entitled "Pensive;" a

hamburger created live on video network Tastemade; and a scale model of Earth.

These items, plus a collection of two-dimensional LEGO paintings of Wonder Woman through the decades, and other two and three dimensional pieces are on display at MACC through January 12, 2019. The show opened just three days into 2019 with a reception that drew people from near and far. "The space was packed with people of all ages," wrote Tracy in an email.

Lamps comprise the bulk

of the exhibit and showcase his exploration of color, fun, playfulness, and sophistication. Lamps in the "Splash of Color Series" were created, he said, to showcase what he could do with the LEGO colors.

"I love LEGO as a

medium," he wrote. "The colors are vibrant and beautiful."

More sophisticated lamps tend to be done in black and white, and two of these patterned lamps are currently on view. These, he said, are carefully thought out patterns. As with his other lamps, they are topped with crystal shades constructed from LEGO bricks. The exhibit also includes a tire shaped lamp and yellow matchstick lamp.

"I've always been interested in lighting, even before architectural school," he wrote in an email. "To me, it's a functional art form which means everyone has room for a piece in their home."

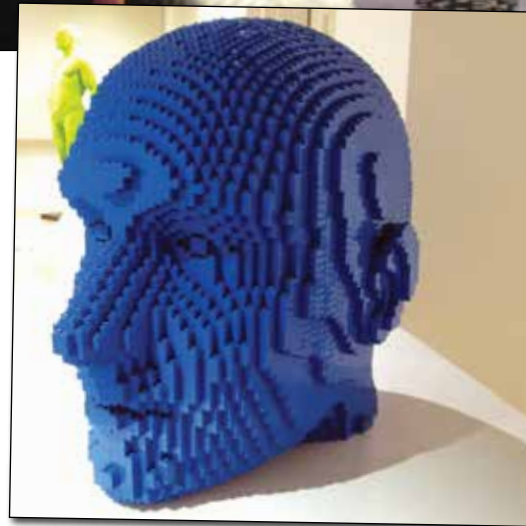
Tracy studied architecture, is currently pursuing his MBA at the University of Chicago, has travelled

internationally, and says a normal bike ride might take him 60 to 80 miles.

Not one to back down from challenges, he appreciates the ones inherent in working with LEGO bricks, especially he says, with large sculptures like "Pensive," which consists of approximately 75,000 bricks or designing a scale model of Earth that is, he said, accurate to within a single LEGO brick. He also appreciates, he wrote, the texture that is not found in other media.

He sometimes collaborates with others, sketches out designs that might be sparked and thought out while working out at the gym, and moves the ideas and sketches to a digital model from which he works. In the case of the globe, he purchased a globe

Roadway Winter Prep and Storm Response

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - The Sacramento County Department of Transportation (SACDOT) is prepared to provide quick response to roadway maintenance incidents that result from weather conditions. Crews provide year round response for weather-related incidents, roadway hazards, urgent roadway repairs, pavement maintenance problems, traffic control and detour-signs twenty-four hours a day, seven days a week.

Crews are in the field every day all year long performing landscape maintenance, roadside ditch cleaning, roadway repairs, culvert replacement, and street sweeping to remove leaves that can block storm drains. Every year before winter sets in, a "Pothole Sweeps Week" is implemented for the unincorporated street system to get roads ready for inclement weather. Crews also pull debris out from under bridges and complete erosion control projects to protect critical infrastructure.

When winter weather hits, crews are available 24/7 for emergency response to clear roadways, remove fallen trees, repair streetlights, fix traffic signal malfunctions and keep traffic moving safely. Flooded roads are monitored and closed when necessary. When roads are flooded, they are posted to the SACDOT website to allow you to check routes for problem areas.



When winter weather hits, crews are available 24/7 for emergency response.

Although crews are in the field every day, your assistance, especially during bad weather conditions, is important. Report roadway issues listed below by calling 311 (or 875-4311) or reporting online at <http://www.311.saccounty.net>. You can also report with a 311 app on your phone.

Fallen Trees and Branches: During severe weather conditions, crews may clear just the material in the roadway and move on to the next incident. Additional cleanup work is performed when crews have handled all incidents that require immediate attention.

Please note: Trees or branches that fall on private roads or property are the responsibility of the property owner. Property owners should contact a private tree service for fallen trees or branches on private property.

Flooded Roads: Crews respond immediately to flooded roads and attempt to clear what is causing the problem right away. If the flooded road cannot be cleared, signage will be placed to close the road and maintenance crews will work to continue to clear the roadway.

Plugged Culverts: (a

tunnel carrying a stream or open drain under a road or railroad.) If a culvert is plugged, SACDOT crews will flush the culvert until it's clear.

Traffic Signal Out: Technicians are dispatched immediately to make repairs to traffic signals that are out or malfunctioning.

Downed Street Signs and Stop Signs: Street signs will be replaced as soon as possible. Downed stop signs are a priority and SACDOT's goal is to have them back up within two hours of notification.

Street Light Out: When reporting a problem, have the pole number or property address available. The pole number can be found on a sticker approximately 8 feet high, usually on the traffic side of the pole.

Plugged Storm Drains: A major cause for localized street flooding. Call 311, give the location and the Department of Water Resources will dispatch crews to remove leaves and/or other debris from the drain.

Sandbag Sites: If your property has a history of flooding, get sandbags in advance at Sacramento County's sandbag self-serve sites. ★

Commentary from AMAC

Is it really the millennials who are leading the way when it comes to start-up companies? "The truth is that older Americans are in the vanguard of America's small businesses. A study conducted by the information services company, Experian, puts the average age of these entrepreneurs at 50.3 years old," according to Dan Weber, president of the senior advocacy organization, AMAC.

Guidant Financial, small business funding, estimates that a third of small business owners are in their fifties and another 21% are 60 years of age or older.

What drives seniors to start up a new business? Weber says it's because many of them have the know-how, skills and Rolodex - in other words, they are well prepared for the vagaries and surprises of their marketplaces. "Oh yeah, the fact that the fastest growing segment of the population is made up of us older folk probably has something to do with it."

The Small Business Administration, in fact, claims that "the perfect time to leverage experience, passions, hobbies and resources to launch or purchase a small business" is when you are in your 50s, 60s and even your 70s.

The great majority of employers in the U.S. are small businesses. "The statistics show that small

businesses are a principal driver of the economy. Companies with fewer than 500 employees account for an amazing 99.7% of American businesses. Even more startling, 89% of employers have fewer than 20 employees," notes Weber.

Small businesses consistently account for as much as two thirds of new jobs created in the U.S., according to the Bureau of Labor Statistics. And business is so good these days that the National Federation of Independent Business [NFIB] reports that the small business sector has 38% more job openings than they can fill.

"The U.S. regained the top spot in the World Economic Forum's ranking of the most competitive country (out of 140), after losing that position with the advent of the regulatory onslaught of the previous Administration," says the NFIB.

Weber agrees that the Trump administration can take credit for the booming economy and job market, "notwithstanding former President Obama's boast that it is all due to him. Whatever personal opinion one may have regarding President Trump, you must admit that it is his direct support of business, in general, and small business, in particular, that have been driving growth over the past two years."

And, the president of the Association of Mature American

Citizens adds that 40% of the entrepreneurs who have created new small businesses represent a true cross-section of the U.S. population. Weber cites a report by the Kaufman Foundation, which found that they include Hispanic [24%], African-American [9%] and Asian [7.5%] men and women.

In 2017, the first full year of Mr. Trump's presidency, the nation saw "an 82 percent increase in the proportion of minority business owners, specifically with a higher percentage who identified as Hispanic and African American," compared with 2016, the last full year of Mr. Obama's term, says Guidant Financial.

NFIB president Juanita Duggan put it this way: "Main Street optimism is on a stratospheric trajectory thanks to recent tax cuts and regulatory changes. For years, owners have continuously signaled that when taxes and regulations ease, earning and employee compensation increase."

- Over 240 homeless teen girls in the Folsom Cordova school district, are now passing their P.E. classes because they are no longer ashamed to change into their P.E. uniforms, allowing their peers to see their beautiful new undergarments and are doing better in school in general, because of their higher self-esteem and confidence, due to the new bras and panties we bought for them, over the last 8 years.
- Over 1200 domestic violence survivors, over the last 7 years, feel more normal and loved because they received one of our Comfort Kits.
- Over 300 children of domestic violence survivors, over the last 4 years, also "felt the love" and are also able to restart their young lives with their very own Comfort Kid kit.

- Approximately 150 girls per year, since 2014, stayed in school, because 15-30 minutes of using a heating pad, that we provided to the school nurses at both Cordova and Kinney High schools, relieved their menstrual pain enough so they could return to class, rather than be sent home for the day.

- A total of 200 kindergartners and 1st graders, over 2 years at a Rancho Cordova elementary school, had personal time with Santa, received 2 free 5x7 portraits with Santa, a Christmas party and a book as a gift, who would have ordinarily been denied this holiday tradition because of their family's extreme poverty in December 2012 and 2013.

- We've helped make 15 homeless high school senior girls, over 3 years, feel like a princess for their Senior Ball, with a new dress and shoes, mani/pedi, hairstyling and makeup consultation. These girls would have missed this high school tradition and memory, if not for our club's assistance.

- We raised enough money to buy 40 Solar Cookers for families fleeing the genocide in the Sudan.

- Over 750 girls won't be a target of traffickers due to the hundreds of Dress

a Girl Around the World dresses that we helped make between 2015 and 2016.

Our club has helped approximately 4,185 women and girls over the last nine years. We would love you to be a part of our club's success; to continue existing programs, like the ones described above, as well as offer even more programs like "Life Preparation" workshops for teens. Service Line Protection Now Available for Golden State Water Customers

HomeServe will be mailing information to Golden State Water customers detailing the service plans designed to cover unanticipated costs and minimize inconvenience associated with piping system repairs. This program is optional, offered as a courtesy, and customers are under no obligation to make any purchases.

Bricking Bad Showcase LEGO Bricks as an Art Form at MACC

Continued from page 1 and used the object's latitudinal and longitudinal lines and other markings to retain accuracy. He worked with a graphic artist friend on "Pensive" to pursue his interest in the human figure.

His collaboration with Belgium DC comic artist Judit Tondora resulted in several large scale reproductions of Wonder Woman from 1950, 1970, 1990, and the 2000s. The three foot by five foot LEGO murals are displayed side by side with Tondora's artwork in the front gallery. MACC has one-upped the internationally recognized Comic Con with the exhibition of these pieces.

He first met Tondora in Hungary where he had traveled to partner with a teacher who had begun an after school program there. "I created designs for them

that the students built." Tondora had been working with them and had some familiarity with the LEGO medium, he added. "She was excited to do something that was completely novel, and we spent six months or so developing that project."

Unlike paint, ceramics or other traditional art media, Tracy says that LEGO is easier to work with when it comes to organizing and cleaning up. And, he said, the bricks will not dry out. Similar to more traditional media is the amount of time involved. His current projects may take months of planning and execution to complete instead of the hours he spent as a child. And he keeps a digital archive of every creation.

As for his thoughts about LEGO kits versus LEGO bricks, he wrote that "it's cool that Star Wars fans can build a Millennium Falcon,

architecture nerds can geek out on the Eiffel Tower, and people like me can buy 500 pounds of bricks and follow their passion."

MACC will present "The Lego Batman Movie," featuring the voices of Conan O'Brien, Mariah Carey, Brent Musburger, and Channing Tatum, among a host of others, on Friday, January 11 at 5:45 p.m. The gallery will be open on January 12, closing day, from 11:00 a.m. until 4:00 p.m.

New Business Ringing in the New Year

Enjoy the Area's Newest Animals, Dead and Alive

As we ring in the new year, let us also welcome three wonderful new additions to our neighborhood. Two are across Sunrise, one is across town, and all three are reincarnations of failed real estate – as in a disgusting IHOP, a low-performing Dickey's Barbecue Pit and a doomed Sports Authority.

Here's my review of these exciting rebirths featuring animals living and dead:

Side Burn BBQ and Brew – My eyes didn't shed a tear when overpriced, mediocre Dickey's closed in November. Gave the barbecue chain two chances to win me over, which it never did. Well, now it's the franchisee's turn to give BBQ a second chance at the busy intersection of Sunrise and Coloma.

Based on my first impression of the reborn eatery in Rivergate Shopping Center, I'd say that former Dickey's franchisee Jared Katzenbarger has a hit on his sauce-covered hands. After seven years with the Dallas-based chain, the Elk Grove businessman had his fill not of pit-smoked barbecue, but of the parent company's misguided changes to the recipes and menu items. His seven Dickey's restaurants are now Side Burn, named

for a smoker process, not the style of facial hair that Katzenbarger doesn't even have and is one word, anyway.

Like the free-range chicken he proudly serves from Petaluma Poultry, Katzenbarger is finally uncaged to try out his own recipes, menu and suppliers, as did I in advance of last month's grand opening. Sublime were the pulled pork and pork ribs that paired perfectly with their own sweet and spicy mango habanero BBQ sauce. Loved the jalapeno jack sausage. The brisket was juicy, tender and flavorful. The sliced turkey was done right with just a bit of seasoning. The "Meaty Side Beans" was tasty and true to its omnivorous name.

Another plus, products are locally sourced when available.

Prices are fair: \$11 for a one-item plate of one meat, two sides, sauce and a roll or cornbread; \$13 for two items; \$16 for three; \$15 and \$20 for rib plates, pork and beef, respectively. A la carte BBQ sandwiches start at \$6, and there's a California-style BBQ burrito I want to try next for \$7.50, but my diet will probably have me ordering the Classic Smoked Salad with brisket for \$6, hold the fried onion strings, cheddar cheese and ranch dressing, dang it. 2320 Sunrise Blvd., sideburnbbq.com, 916-858-8195.

Gangnam Ave. – Goodbye Rooty Tooty Fresh 'N Fruity Pancakes,

hello spicy baby octopus! An all-you-can-eat Korean barbecue restaurant has taken over the abandoned IHOP across Sunrise, and it shows tremendous

sore need of CPR.

Winners: Beef bulgogi, garlic chicken, mung bean pancake, fried chicken wings, potstickers and off-menu squash and fish

and phone number at press time.

SeaQuest – If you prefer your octopi in a tank instead of on your plate, check out SeaQuest in Folsom's Palladio outdoor mall. Taking up 28,000 square feet of a liquidated Sports Authority store, the first SeaQuest in California is 28,000 square feet of aquatic, avian and amphibious awesomeness. Insects, reptiles and small mammals round out a menagerie built primarily on adoption, rescue, rehabilitation and professional breeding, according to GM Pete Mordwinow.

Marine life in residence includes the black tip reef shark, bamboo shark, Southern stingray, bat ray, black pacu, white sturgeon, rainbow trout, seahorse, and a giant Pacific octopus named Octavia. Outside the water are a reticulated python, Guyana caiman lizard, baby pigs, tortoise,

potential. Young Choi and his lovely wife, Sylvia, opened Gangnam Ave. last month, giving 12-year-old standard-bearer Oz on Bradshaw Road added competition besides 2-year-old Blue House on Howe Avenue. They also own terrific Sushimono in Citrus Heights.

Unlike the other two Korean BBQ restaurants off the 50, there's no a la carte menu at Gangnam Ave. Everyone must order all-you-can-eat, which, at \$27 (\$14 for children 5-10), matches the most popular unlimited option at Blue House and runs \$2 higher than Oz. This long-time restaurant critic prefers to give sit-down restaurants a few months before sharing a review, but the food, service and ambiance experienced pre-grand opening bode well for a shopping center in

cake side dishes. Tasty and unique, at least for this Caucasian American, was jjukkumi, or whole spicy baby octopus. Despite its name, baby octopus is fully grown octopus of a small species. Felt less guilty after finding that out.

Two final notes: What a perfect name for a Korean restaurant located just south of the American River. Although named for the district in Seoul, made famous here by PSY's monster hit of 2012, "Gangnam Style," it's cool that gangnam means "south of the river." What's not cool are the dozens of typos and misspellings on the menu, which doubles as a disposable placemat. This does offer patrons a fun and educational table game called "Circle the Errors." Beat the 23 I found and you win a baby octopus! 2216 Sunrise Blvd.; no website

lorikeets, silkie chickens, Mandarin ducks, peafowl, and a keel-billed toucan who will eat melon right out of your hand. In fact, most of the animals can be fed, touched or both. Starting this month, for just a \$30 upsell, you can even snorkel with sharks, stingrays and tropical fish in a 40,000-gallon habitat.

Single-day admission runs \$15 for adults with discounts for seniors, students and military. Children 11 and under are \$10. Annual passports are a popular money saver for families. Feeding tokens can be purchased separately for as low as \$1.50 each, right next to the gift shop. 430 Palladio Parkway #1801; folsom.visitseaquest.com; 916-673-9972.

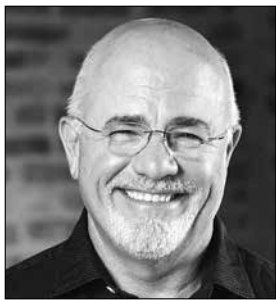

My mom is 75, and I'm the executor of her estate. She has \$500,000 in retirement accounts, and the only debt she has is around \$70,000 on her mortgage. Most of her money is in the stock market, with only \$20,000 in a money market account, and this worries me. She lives well within her means, so am I wrong to be concerned? Also, do you think she should go ahead and pay off her mortgage?

—Keith

Dear Keith,
Yes, I would recommend she go ahead a pay off the mortgage. If she can do that at age 75, and still have \$430,000 left, that's the way to go.

Now, being in the stock market at her age sounds like a shock to you. I don't think it's a bad thing at all. It's not what the typical

financial planner tells you to do. For the most part, they'll tell you to get super conservative with your money as you get older. But from what you've said, she's not going to use this money. She's going to use the income from this money. So, the money's going to be left alone. If she's in good mutual funds, and not single stocks, I'm not worried about her.

Let's pay off the mortgage, and then she can start taking her income off the remainder. With the house payment out of the way, she won't need as much in terms of income, because she won't be sending money to the bank to pay the note on the house anymore. I'm comfortable with that. I'm 58, and I'm 100 percent into stocks through mutual funds. I don't have anything else, and I really don't ever plan on changing that!

Game Plots

Approaching "Fun" in the Digital West

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - Red Dead Redemption 2 has been universally considered the best game of the year, if not one of the best of all time. Its sweeping vision of the Old West in 1899 is as visually impressive as it is rich with stories, wrapping the player in a Spaghetti Western straight from the mind of Sergio Leone. It is undoubtedly one of the most ambitious and fully realized games ever created, and despite its near perfection, it isn't very much fun.

I've been playing through *Red Dead Redemption 2* at the same time as another big-budget rural-America open-world: Ubisoft's *Far Cry 5*, released earlier this year. While the former is a complete artistic vision, *Far Cry 5* is an utter mess, sometimes deathly serious, sometimes ridiculously goofy (my two in-game companions are a grim hunter who speaks of how the villains gruesomely murder innocents and a diabetic grizzly bear named "Cheeseburger"), and always cowardly

stepping back from any sort of commentary or message. Nevertheless, *Far Cry 5*, though inferior as a piece of art, is unarguably the better "game," delivering thrill after thrill, fun moment after fun moment, and, despite its juvenile nature, consistently treating the player like an adult capable of creativity and improvisation.

Red Dead Redemption 2 does none of the above. It has been so lovingly crafted that the developers are clearly paranoid about ensuring that the player experiences it in the "right" way. Story missions keep tight control over the player. Small instructions on the bottom of the screen micromanage every move; while *Far Cry 5* might tell you to "Get to X" and allow you to do so by any means possible, *Red Dead Redemption 2* will individually tell you to "Get on your horse," "Ride with Y to X," "Get off your horse," "Hitch your horse," and "Enter the building." Attempts at improvisation or creativity are most often met with instant mission failure.

Even while randomly exploring the open world,

the two games take vastly different approaches. While *Far Cry 5* has only a few simple repeating scenarios that can be approached in dozens of ways, *Red Dead Redemption 2* uses its vast landscapes like a canvas on which to tell numerous structured short stories, all well-written, but all of which are experienced in the exact same way for every player.

These differences aren't a criticism of *Red Dead Redemption 2*; the idea that a game must be "fun" is one of the primary restrictions that has held back the medium of video games from developing artistically. The two games, released only a year apart, are simply a case study in how attitudes towards games have evolved and changed. *Far Cry 5* couldn't care less about immersion or realism, shooting only towards a simple, stupid, repetitive, but incredibly entertaining and player-driven, concept of fun. *Red Dead Redemption 2* does precisely the opposite, telling poignant, beautifully realized stories, but stories where the player feels

almost like an unwanted chaotic variable in this otherwise perfect world. It seems to ask the player to simply be the projectionist on its set-in-stone film reel.

"Fun" was considered such an integral concept to video games because, as the only truly interactive medium, games are uniquely equipped to create it, even if they sacrifice artistic quality in the process. The fact that *Red Dead Redemption 2* and *Far Cry 5* were released so close together shows that the market still has room for both types of experiences, but also that both should take lessons from the other. *To respond to noah's articles email him at digitalartsnoah@yahoo.com* ★

Are Netflix Shows Too Short?

Question: Why is Netflix suddenly making series with only six or eight episodes? Now we feel like we just got into the show and it's over. —Jean

Matt Roush: You are really barking up the wrong critical tree by griping to me about this issue. I am and always have been of the "less is more" school when it comes to binge-watching, and I can think of almost no Netflix series

of the 13-episode variety that wouldn't benefit from significant trimming. I've gone on record saying many of Netflix's originals would be twice as good at half the length, and "Netflix bloat" has become almost a critical cliché. (Case in point: I admired some things about the Netflix version of The Haunting of Hill House, but even at 10 long episodes, some clocking in at over an hour, it felt egregiously padded to me.)

Two of the best Netflix series of recent months—the British import Bodyguard

(at a taut six episodes) and Chuck Lorre's The Kominsky Method (at eight)—were distinguished and elevated by their economy of storytelling. (Same for Amazon Prime's Homecoming, with its half-hour episodes.) Bodyguard was just as long as it needed to be—British series tend to be tighter and shorter, and that suits me fine—and if Kominsky left me wanting more, that's a rather rare feeling these days. Now if Netflix would just go ahead and renew it!

Year, Wayne Harmer, who, from all of the activities he was engaged in and continues to be engaged in, is a force of his own. He's played Santa Claus, cleaned debris from jet engines at the annual California Capital Air Show, and directed traffic at the Heartstoppers Haunted House. He's known for his July 4th floats, and has been spotted whirling about the city checking on signage after big winds like those that hit the region on January 5 and 6.

Or the force might be a bit more low key and neighborhood focused like 2018's Neighborhood Champion, Kris McCall, whose focus is Lincoln Village. She is also married, works full time, and is raising two children. Not all volunteers are adults. In 2017, eight grader Anthony Lacayo was recognized for his contributions. At the other end of the age spectrum is Bill Kong, who was 91 years young when he, with co-recipient Walt Little, received the 2018 Distinguished Community Service award for their work at the Cordova Community Food Locker.

Volunteers come in all shapes, sizes, and from all backgrounds, and Blanchard wrote in an email that "the Cordova Community Council believes that the volunteer spirit is what builds a community in which we all want to live."

This year's categories include Distinguished Community Business Partner (business or individual). Last year's

recipient, ECMC, helped fund the Sacramento Children's Museum Explorability program and the van for the museum's "Van-Go" program in addition to purchasing 50 coats for a community coat drive for homeless students.

Past recipients of the Distinguished Community Service Organization award, also up for nomination this year, include Moose Lodge, Whisker Warriors, and Cordova Neighborhood Church Respite Club. Another category for nominations is the Distinguished Service by a Faith Community whose most recent recipient was Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints.

Outstanding Service to Youth is a category which considers educators, faith leaders, coaches, or groups serving youth in the community. Past recipients include Stacy Lynch, Blessings in a Backpack, Rancho Cordova Police Activities League (PAL), and individuals and groups.

The Couldn't Have Done It Without You award is the broadest category of all and has honored Dennis Lamantia for his work with Rancho Cordova youth sports, David McFarland, Republic Services for its work with many community volunteer organizations, Linda Nunes, and Straw Hat Pizza.

The awards, now in its twentieth year, were begun by former Cordova Community Council board member, Alan Withers, said Blanchard.

He wanted to highlight the contributions and activities of volunteers in the community of Rancho Cordova, which would incorporate as a city a few years later.

Withers' idea grew into what Blanchard calls "the most prestigious awards program in Rancho Cordova." A wide net has to be cast to uncover and discover volunteer efforts and the people who make them happen. "Celebrating and inspiring volunteerism in Rancho Cordova is the core mission of the Cordova Community Council," wrote Blanchard, who added that anyone can be a volunteer and everyone can do something and that the council is "proud to take the lead in pointing out these remarkable people and achievements."

Eight categories are open for nominations from the community, volunteer organizations, and community leaders. Nominations close promptly at 5 p.m. on Friday, February 1, 2019 and may be done online or with a paper copy that can be mailed or hand delivered to the council's office. Recipients will be honored at an event in March.

"We are especially looking for the contributions which would otherwise get overlooked. There are a lot of unsung heroes out there," wrote Blanchard in an email.
