RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - On December 17, Cordova Recreation & Park District (CRPD) staff donated 40 gifts to 10 homeless children in partnership with the Folsom Cordova Unified School District Homeless Student Services. CRPD “adopted” these four homeless families for the holiday season, reflecting a fierce commitment to their mission to serve the needs of their diverse and growing community.

Director of this endeavor, CRPD’s Administrative Specialist Gail Bair, reached out to the school district a few years ago to see how CRPD could help the homeless in the community. “The children we provide for are in kindergarten through high school who live locally but don’t have homes. The wonderful thing about the Homeless Student Services program is that

throughout the year they provide basic needs that we take for granted like clothes, hygiene products and school supplies, for these children. So, what is magical about this partnership during this season is we can step it up a notch and help give these kids elements of a childhood with games, coloring books, stuffed animals, etc.” Bair said.

CRPD staff members were honored when leadership presented them with this opportunity to give back. “I love to give back because there are so many families in need out there and I have the opportunity to help them have the best Christmas possible. It’s part of why I love working here,” Office Assistant Jacqueline Yoos said.

First 5 to Administer Prenatal Care Contract

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - On Tuesday, Dec. 11, the Sacramento County Board of Supervisors authorized the Department of Human Assistance to execute an agreement with First 5 Sacramento Commission (First 5) in the amount of \$4,800,000 for the coordination, oversight and monitoring of the CalWORKs Home Visiting Initiative Program.

Program implementation will begin on Jan. 1, 2019 and runs through Jun. 30, 2020.

The purpose of the CalWORKs Home Visiting Initiative (HVI) is to support positive health, development, and well-being outcomes for pregnant and parenting women, families, and infants born into poverty, expanding their future educational, economic, and financial opportunities, and improving the likelihood that they will exit poverty.

Combining home visits with CalWORKs provides an opportunity to connect

parents with necessary professional resources to assist in improving their parenting skills and household order, and ensuring that their children have a safe and nurturing environment that allows them to thrive and grow.

New parents and caretakers receiving CalWORKs will be paired with student nurses and other trained professionals who will make regular visits to the participants' homes to provide guidance, coaching, access to prenatal and postnatal care, and other health and social services.

"We are thrilled to award this program funding to First 5. They will get the HVI program off the ground and running," said Ann Edwards, Director of the Sacramento County Department of Human Assistance. "Providing mothers and their unborn and young children care and resources is our number one priority. These services will set them up for success and a positive life outcome."

Homeless Initiatives are Working — County Expands

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - In 2017, the Sacramento County Board of Supervisors approved funding and implementation of four major initiatives to address critical needs of those experiencing homelessness and to help reduce the homeless population. Subsequently, two associated augmentations were added to further address the needs of all vulnerable population groups. The first programs began in October of 2017, several began in 2018 and many are in the process of becoming operational. In just one year's time, the County has achieved phenomenal results from these new initiatives.

- Improve the Family Crisis Response and Shelters (October 2017)
 - o 146 families served in shelter
 - o 50 moved to permanent housing
- Preserve Mather Community Campus (October 2017)
 - o 351 individuals served in transitional housing
 - o 116 moved to permanent housing
- Full Service Rehousing Shelter (March 2018)
 - o 91 individuals in scattered-site shelters
 - o 19 moved to permanent housing
- Flexible Supportive Re-housing Program (February 2018)
 - o 191 individuals enrolled
 - o 94 moved into permanent housing
- Transitional Aged Youth (May 2018)
 - o 115 served with prevention, diversion and intervention services
 - o 35 moved to permanent housing
 - o 32 maintained housing through services
 - o 17 entered emergency

shelter

- Unincorporated County Navigation Services (April 2018)
 - o 177 served through outreach and rehousing services
 - o 30 moved to permanent housing

In total, 416 individuals have moved into permanent housing since the start of the first initiative in October 2017.

"We are thrilled to share the success that our programs have had in this first year. In some programs, success has been demonstrated in mere months," said Ann Edwards, Director of the Department of Human Assistance. "We are reaching people we have never been able to engage and they are seeing a real difference in their lives."

On Oct. 16, 2018, the County Board of Supervisors endorsed the investment strategy for nearly \$20 million in new State funding to combat homelessness in partnership with Sacramento Steps Forward and the City of Sacramento. On Dec. 11, the Board of Supervisors approved the acceptance of more than \$11 million that the Department of Human Assistance will directly administer, building of the existing initiatives to reduce homelessness.

State funding comes through the State's new Homeless Emergency Aid Program (HEAP) and the California Emergency Solutions and Housing Program. The funds will provide additional emergency shelter for both families and individuals through Emergency Family Shelter and the Full Service Rehousing Shelters (FSRS). The FSRS is a scattered-site model using master leasing of vacant homes in the region to house up to five persons

in addition to a fulltime house monitor. Residents are provided with intensive case management services and rehousing assistance to help them exit the program into stable, permanent housing with the support they need.

The funding also will create a Flexible Housing Pool (building on the Flexible Supportive Rehousing Program) that will offer both services and re-housing assistance to help households in shelter or working with navigation programs to move into housing more quickly.

For the first time, clients experiencing homelessness who are engaged in Adult Protective Services or jail diversion will be offered this practical assistance to resolve their homelessness. The County will also administer a new expungement clinic to help remove barriers to housing and employment.

To be eligible to administer and receive the HEAP funds, the Board of Supervisors declared a shelter crisis on Oct. 16. Other cities declaring a crisis and participating in the program include the City of Sacramento, Elk Grove and Citrus Heights.

On Dec. 12, The Board of Supervisors heard and adopted the proposed Sacramento County Homeless Plan that is required to facilitate participation in the State's No Place Like Home (NPLH) program. This program provides funding for new permanent supportive housing for people who are experiencing homelessness, chronic homelessness, or who are at risk of becoming chronically homeless, and who are also living with a serious mental illness and in need of mental health services. In NPLH developments, the County will provide

a 20-year commitment to comprehensive services, including behavioral health services.

In addition to meeting State requirements for NPLH, the County's Plan serves as a building block for all partners within Sacramento County to implement shared strategies that make a measureable impact on homelessness. The Plan was endorsed by the City of Sacramento and County Continuum of Care on Dec. 12.

"The County Homeless Plan reflects countless hours of collaboration with County departments, community groups, stakeholders and other jurisdictions within our region," said Cindy Cavanaugh, Director of Homeless Initiatives. "The Plan lays out comprehensive strategies and concrete actions for Sacramento over the next several years. While pleased with early results of our homeless initiatives, this Plan says that, as a community, we are not letting up."

Sacramento County will be eligible for \$5,087,737 through the noncompetitive NPLH funding for housing developments, and is eligible to apply for a share of \$400 million in competitive funds. The Board of Supervisors will approve development applications for the first round of NPLH competitive funding on Jan. 29.

With the initial success of the Sacramento County homeless initiatives and additional funding sources for expansion, collaborative community partnerships, and dedicated service providers, Sacramento County recognizes that change is possible for our community and the lives of its valued residents. ★

Johnson Controls partners with FCUSD for \$3.9M in LED lighting improvements

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - Johnson Controls will improve lighting infrastructure in eight schools within the Folsom Cordova Unified School District (FCUSD) in Folsom and Rancho Cordova, California. The installation of intelligent LED lighting fixtures will help modernize school infrastructure, initiate energy savings throughout the growing district and improve the environment for student and faculty performance.

The installation project will take eight months according to the plan developed by FCUSD school officials and Johnson Controls Performance Infrastructure™ leaders. This plan leverages an energy savings performance contract (ESPC),

projecting savings of \$4.8 million over 20 years, as well as funds granted by Proposition 39, The California Clean Energy Jobs Act.

"We're thrilled to find an innovative way to help Folsom Cordova Unified School District improve schools and respect their budget," said Mike Kozlowski, Performance Infrastructure™ account executive, Johnson Controls. "Proposition 39 allows the school district to receive the money upfront to design and build the project, and still receive the expected payback in reduced utility costs of an equal or greater amount through the energy savings performance contract."

Each lighting unit will be manually dimmable and have a daylight harvesting sensor that will

automatically dim fixtures if natural light is available. The fixtures will also have motion sensors that will interconnect with all of the other lighting elements in a room in order to reduce the amount of equipment and wiring needed.

"Our district is focused on creating a positive learning environment for our more than 20,000 students to do their best work and having modern, updated facilities is an important part of achieving that goal," said Dr. Sarah Koligian, superintendent, Folsom Cordova Unified School District. "By collaborating with Johnson Controls to fund this project through the help of Proposition 39, we are able to implement the improvements to meet our goals without dramatically impacting our operating budget." ★



Growing Together to Support All Students' Success

Dear Folsom Cordova community: As we close out 2018 and prepare for the holidays ahead, I want to acknowledge and thank our staff, families, and community partners for your tireless efforts to support our students, especially in the evolving work around culture, climate, and connectedness. I encourage us to reflect deeply about the good work we have done, the challenges ahead, and the actions necessary to accelerate our efforts. Doing that means embracing a growth mindset that can strengthen our work around equity, diversity, and discipline. Because our results do not show the reality any of us want: Our African American students, foster youth, and students with disabilities are suspended and expelled, and chronically absent, at rates far higher than their peers. The work ahead: Folsom Cordova was recently notified that it is one of only three educational systems in the region to be awarded a \$500,000 grant that will allow us to start taking immediate steps around equity, diversity, and discipline. This grant will supplement the work our team has begun developing - with input from our employees, families, and students - to address the persistent, disproportionate outcomes for our most vulnerable children. Our focus areas will include:

- Implicit bias training for staff and leaders across our entire school district.
- Restorative practices training that will build our schools' capacity to

help students reflect on behaviors and increase time in classrooms. There are and will continue to be serious consequences for serious behavior, but we must also use all the tools we have to help disrupt cycles of inequity. Training for students and staff to support social-emotional and mental health needs in our schools. **Our work's foundation:** With the help of a strategic plan developed by our school communities nearly four years ago, Folsom Cordova has made it easier to report and respond to suspected acts of bullying and harassment - such as through our online bullying reporting form - invested heavily in mental health professionals and training across our District, and developed more consistent programs both inside and outside of the classroom designed to improve student connections and school culture. The results are promising: reported incidents of suspected bullying have dropped 68%

since the 2014-15 school year. However, if even one student is feeling disenfranchised, bullied or unsafe, our work is not done. **Critical conversations moving forward:** To be successful, we must make sure we have diverse voices at the table. We can do that by continuing to ask students and families whose voices are not typically represented to share their honest experiences and perspectives, and by reaching out to community partners who play a key role in our success. Just as critical as asking is listening - and turning those words into action. It is a habit we practiced through our 2018 Education Town Halls, and one we intend to strengthen. These are not new issues for Folsom Cordova - or for any public school system in our nation - and our District has a strong track record of facing these difficult conversations head-on. Upon returning in 2019, I intend to work with my Cabinet and leadership team to plan how we intensify this work throughout our entire District. I have confidence Folsom Cordova's communities are up to this task. I want to thank everyone on Team FCUSD - our staff, families, and community partners - for empowering student achievements. I am eager to return alongside you energized and ready to tackle the tough work ahead. *Sincerely, Superintendent Sarah Koligian, Ed.D.* *Source: From FCUSD Media* ★

Holiday Treecycling



December 26, 2018 to January 11, 2019
Rancho Cordova residents can recycle their holiday tree at no additional cost!

Simply put your tree out on the curb on your regular collection day and Republic Services will pick it up and recycle it.

Artificial trees, flocked trees, or trees containing ornaments or other décor will not be accepted.

Dare to Live Without Limits

The Power of Listening



You learn by listening. Education is a lifetime process. There is always more to be learned. What you know pales in comparison to what you don't know. However, too many people have very ineffective listening skills.

A variety of factors limit the effectiveness of your listening. There are also numerous strategies which boost your listening power. Let's first examine some common listening inhibitors and how to overcome them and then look at how you can boost your listening power.

When you are formulating your response while someone is speaking, you are no longer listening to what they are saying. Stay focused on what the other person is expressing. There will be an opportunity to respond.

Daydreaming, or being distracted by your surroundings, diminishes your listening ability. Instead, concentrate on the message the other person is striving to convey. You want to discover what they are wanting, feeling, thinking, and saying.

Jumping to conclusions, or judging the speaker, causes you to stop listening. When you assume you know what will be said, you have no need to pay further attention. Hear out the other person without making any judgments. Once you have all of the information from them, you can form your conclusions.

Assessing a speaker based on appearance, social status, financial status, occupation, or any other factor, affects your listening mode. When you feel someone is beneath you, in any way, you assign little or no value to what they are saying. Closing your mind in this matter restricts the quantity and quality of the information you take in.

Becoming defensive, or taking things personally in response to what is being said, pushes you into rebuttal mode. This reaction shuts down your listening along with lowering your ability to think clearly. Listen carefully to what is being said before deciding on an appropriate response.

Selective listening is another detriment. In this mode, you hear only what you want to. You subconsciously tune out anything you don't agree with or which contradicts your beliefs. This approach closes your mind to new and different ideas. As a result, your learning ability is greatly diminished.

Here are some strategies to enhance the power of your listening. First and foremost, always keep an open mind. You never know from whom, or when, you will find valuable information. You can learn something from everyone. Constantly look for new knowledge you can acquire by listening. Often, you will be able to acquire additional information about what works or

what doesn't.

Ask questions to clarify your understanding of what the other person is saying. What you think is being said is not necessarily what the other person means. Begin questions with something like, "I just want to make sure I understand correctly. Please correct me if I'm wrong."

Take notes while you are listening. It forces you to pay close attention. Written notes are more reliable than memory. Taking notes is especially valuable when listening on the phone. There is no point to listening if you can't remember what was said.

The most educated people are those people who have developed exceptional listening skills. They have cultivated the habit of listening with an open mind. They listen far more often than they talk.

Examine your listening skills. Identify and correct any bad listening habits you have. Monitor yourself closely when others are speaking so you can stay focused with an open mind. As you enhance your listening ability, your knowledge and expertise will grow. The power of listening will serve you for a lifetime and greatly enhance your success.

It sounds like you're in a really good place, Isaac. Pay cash for school, and if you can't buy a home outright when the time comes, make a down payment of

at least 20 percent. That way, you'll avoid having to pay private mortgage insurance!

Cash out stock for emergency fund?

Dear Dave,
I'm 45, married, and we have a household income of around \$85,000 a year. We have no debt, except for our home, and we owe about \$70,000 on it. I recently stopped contributing to my 401(k) temporarily in an effort to help us build an emergency fund, but things are moving slowly. We also have \$25,000 in stock. Should we cash out the stock, and use the money for an emergency fund?

Dear Nate,
Yes, that's what I would do. Basically, your

emergency fund is in stock right now. That's not a good place to keep an emergency fund, because you never know when life will throw unexpected expenses your way or the stock market will go down.
I would cash out that stock as soon as possible. Put the money in a simple money market account—one with check writing privileges and no penalties for early withdrawals. You

always want your emergency fund to be safe and easily accessible. Then, make sure you keep pushing forward and take care of Baby Step 4, investing for retirement; Baby Step 5, save money for college if you have young children; and Baby Step 6, pay off your home early.
Baby Step 7 means building wealth and giving like crazy. These things are easy once you have the

other Baby Steps out of the way. Good question, Nate!

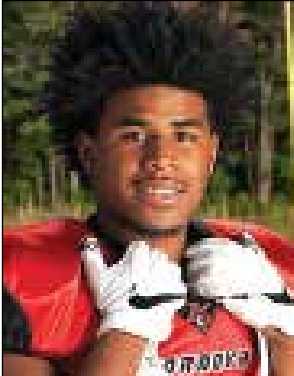

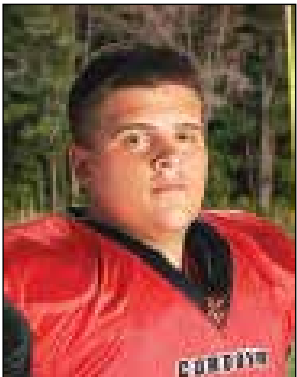

Club Volleyball has also

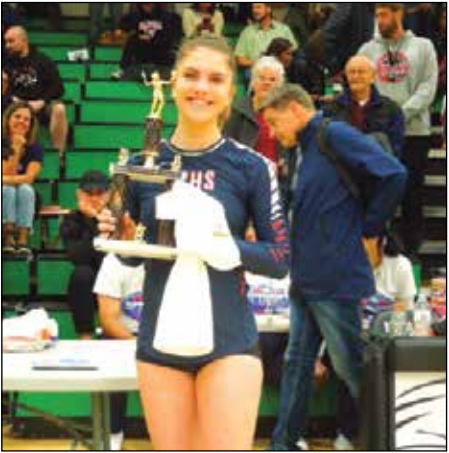
