Kiyo Sato Tells Story of WWII Internment

"I am prisoner 25217C and a suspected spy in 1942," said internment camp survivor Kiyo Sato to a packed to the rafters group of students, families, former internment camp survivors, family members, Holocaust survivor Bernard Marks, and

local Tuskegee Airmen chapter president Perry Woods. Sato's story begins at the location where Mills Station Arts and Culture Center (MACC) currently stands and across Folsom Blvd. where the building, and her family, first resided.

Sato recalled fond memories of school, a hitching post, big garden tools, and one of those old gasoline

pumps – the kind that required the user to hand pump the gas up to five gallons. Most of the audience was too young to remember those, but a few heads nodded as though they'd seen or used them.

A particularly fond memory was going to Mr. Studarus' store where she'd get stamps, two loaves of Rainbow white bread and bologna for lunch, but it was the books that really drew her in. She said that she'd "sit on the floor and read all sorts of books," recalling one in particular – Lillian Wald's Windows on Henry Street, published in 1934.

Sato returned to why she'd written her book, Kiyo's Story, originally titled Dandelion Through

the Crack, which she began when she turned 80. She is currently a young-looking 95 year old who credits her youthful exuberance to eating her vegetables and moving her body, which she certainly did throughout the evening, never missing a beat. She stopped long enough for a period of four years to pen her story in a donut shop.

Sato was animated, energetic, witty, and passionate as she spoke about strawberries, Miss Cox and the 52 students in her class (all but thirteen were removed), and of reading. She was the oldest of thirteen children that included a civil engineer, four teachers, two nurses, a secretary, and a soil analyst. She was attending

Yes on Prop 6 Campaign Vows to Recall AG Xavier Becerra Over False and Misleading Ballot Title

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - "If you steal our gas tax funds and then steal our votes by lying to us on our election ballots when we seek to repeal the tax, we will RECALL you from office!"

That's the threat issued today by the Yes on Prop 6 Gas Tax Repeal campaign as it announced it has filed a committee with the Secretary of State's office to Recall California State Attorney General Xavier Becerra from office over his decision to slap an intentionally deceptive title on Prop 6 – the Gas Tax Repeal Initiative.

"Voters who wanted to vote YES on Prop 6 have been deceived into voting NO – all because the Attorney General bowed to special interest pressure to remove the words 'Gas Tax Repeal Initiative' from the ballot and replace them with an intentionally false and deceptive title," said Carl DeMaio, Chairman of Yes on Prop 6.

"We are working hard to warn voters that there is an error on their ballot because state politicians intentionally mislabeled Prop 6 in an attempt to deceive them – and that a YES Vote on Prop 6 is actually for the Gas Tax Repeal Initiative," DeMaio said.

"We still believe we will win Prop 6, but if we fall short because voters were defrauded of their intent to vote Yes on Prop 6 the Gas Tax Repeal Initiative, we fully intend to Recall Xavier Becerra from office as a punishment and to set an example to state politicians that they cannot lie on our ballots to trick voters into voting NO on something they intended to vote YES on," DeMaio promised.

DeMaio presented polling evidence showing the damage done to Prop 6 because the words "Gas Tax Repeal Initiative" were intentionally struck from the title of Prop 6. In a recent Survey USA poll, 58 percent of California voters said they would vote YES to repeal the gas tax and only 29 percent would vote No. However, when the misleading ballot title for Prop 6 is read to voters, the numbers substantially change – while a Thomas Partners Strategies poll taken during the same three day period as Survey USA showed Prop 6 tied - 35 percent NO to 35 percent YES.

The Soldiers Project

Providing Service to Those Who Have Served

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)

- Founded in 2004 by Dr. Judith Broder, The Soldiers Project was created to help a new generation of service members reintegrate into the community. The Soldiers Project offers free, confidential, and unlimited mental health services for post-9/11 veterans and active duty service members all across California. Since its inception, The Soldiers Project has provided treatment and assistance to thousands of military service members and their families.

The Soldiers Project originally began as a sponsored project of the Los Angeles Institute and Society for Psychoanalytic Studies Trauma Center and was operated by volunteers. In 2010, The Soldiers Project became a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization. Funding for the project comes from grants and donations, which cover the program's operating costs. All the mental health services are offered pro bono by licensed therapists and social workers.

The organization is unique because they will provide treatment to any service member, regardless of their branch of service, combat experience, or discharge status. The United States Department of Veterans Affairs only offers benefits to those who are discharged under honorable conditions, but that leaves those who were discharged under other conditions in a vulnerable and potentially untenable position. So The Soldiers Project steps in to assist those who might otherwise fall through the cracks in the system.

The Soldiers Project helps service members deal with an array of mental health issues, such as PTSD, survivors guilt because they are alive while their friend isn't, substance abuse, marital issues,

and reintegrating into civilian life. Shing Long, the Northern California Chapter director of The Soldiers Project, said, "Transitioning can be hard. Some are on the verge of homelessness. So we help them become self-sufficient. During intake, we find out what kind of help they need, and then we can direct them to the appropriate agencies" for job placement, housing assistance, and pursuing veterans benefits.

The pro bono therapists who donate their time to The Soldiers Project come from a variety of backgrounds and have diverse specialties. "We allow them to use their own tools, so treatment is not cookie cutter. They are able to choose what works best for each client," said Long.

Long joined The Soldiers Project three years ago. She is a military spouse, and her husband, Daniel Long, was an E6 and Linguist in the Navy for 12 years. During that time, they were stationed in Hawaii, Japan, and Fort Meade in Maryland. After spending so many years among military families, Long realized "this is my passion. Vets are so important to me, and especially helping those who don't have the right paperwork...Because of my husband's experience, and seeing the people he worked with, helped me want to get involved."

Veterans Day on November 11 is a reminder to honor those who have served, but Long explained that for some veterans the day is a painful reminder of some of their worst experiences. Some don't feel worthy of the day, and a day designed to celebrate them can make them feel even more alone.

"There's such a stigma behind seeking services. They feel like they're alone. And they feel like they have to be strong, [especially if] they are male, and because they are service

members. I want them to feel like they can reach out for help," said Long.

In 2016, Long said that there were five veteran suicides in a matter of weeks, between October and November, just in the Sacramento area. With the holiday season fast approaching, Long stated that there is an even greater need for mental health services among the veteran population. The holidays are a wonderful time for families to spend together, but it can also cause additional stress, which can in turn increase the risk of suicides.

There are approximately 95,000 veterans in the Sacramento area, and in addition to providing mental health services, The Soldiers Project also offers education and training opportunities to the community so they can learn how to interact with members of the military and recognize signs that someone may be in need of assistance. "As with any special population one has to serve, cultural competence can go a long way in being more effective. So, we offer free trainings to the community as well as mental health professionals who are interested in learning more. Topics include Military Culture, Moral Injury, [and] Suicide Prevention in the Military Population," said Long.

The community can help The Soldiers Project by volunteering at community events or donating to the organization. If you know licensed social workers or therapists who would like to volunteer as counselors for The Soldiers Project, "we are always looking to recruit more therapists," said Long. Yes on Prop 6 Campaign Vows to Recall AG Xavier Becerra Over False and Misleading Ballot Title

Over 1 million Californians signed a petition with the title "Gas Tax Repeal Initiative" on it to get Prop 6 placed on the ballot. After the No on Prop 6 campaign did extensive polling and focus groups to determine what words to use to defeat the Gas Tax Repeal Initiative, the Attorney General struck that title and replaced it with "Prop 6: Eliminates Certain Road Repair and Transportation Funding." Not a single word of Prop 6 eliminates road repair funding, and a recent Legislative Analyst Office study proved you could actually increase

road repair funding by dedicating 100 percent of the original gas tax rate to roads.

The Recall threat is credible because the Yes on Prop 6 campaign already successfully led the Recall of State Senator Josh Newman from office earlier this year - winning a lopsided 59% removal vote in a Democrat-leaning district despite being outspent 8-to-1. Unlike ballot propositions, state politicians cannot change the ballot title on a Recall Election as the ballot will simply read "Should Xavier Becerra be recalled from the office of Attorney General?" A simple YES or NO is then

asked of the voter.

"Sacramento politicians think they are being clever by deceiving voters with a misleading ballot title on Prop 6, but have they thought about what will happen when millions of Californians wake up the next day and realize they were tricked into voting NO on something they wanted to vote YES on?" DeMaio asked.

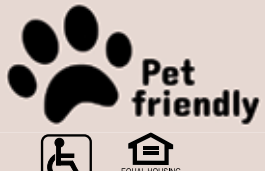

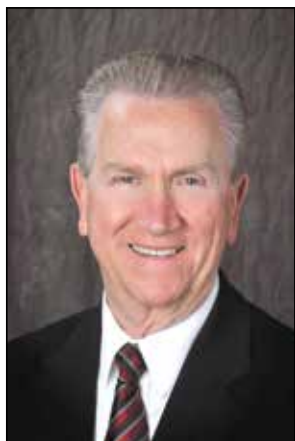

communications, it may be sooner than is expected. But for now, I am very glad that those in need of help can also use text.

Well, the end of October is here for all intents and purposes. While writing this column, I realized that the regular school year is over two months into session. My wife and I are able to help our grandkids, and our son and daughter-in-law, but like the song says, "Where is the little girl I carried? Where is the little boy at play?" Looking at the five grandkids who only live a mile or so from us, four boys and one girl in their family, I see that they have changed so rapidly.

The oldest boy is 19 and has graduated from Cordova High School; the 15-year-old is going to Cordova High School; the 11-year-old is going to Mitchell Middle School; the nine-year-old is going to Riverview STEM Academy; and the three-year-old girl is learning very rapidly from her four older brothers. This school year is so different because none of the kids are going to the same school. The three-year-old is learning very rapidly, like her brothers anyway, because her grandmother is a credentialed teacher.

The Mather Community Campus is still operating very well. Like in the past, the 300 people who were unfortunately homeless

now have a chance to get support from the Mather Community Campus and can enjoy their lives again. I was told that about 20% to 25% of the people at the campus are veterans who were homeless, and with the programs at the campus, as well as living across the street from the VA Hospital, they can learn from many resources. I am very glad that the Mather Community Campus is still operating from when it began in 1994.

Mather Veterans Village is building very rapidly because the weather hasn't stopped the building of the three-story apartments, nor has it affected the work that is now being done on the two-story building where the offices and classes will be on the first story, nor slowing down placing the 50 temporary beds that will be located on the second story. I am very pleased about the progress that is being made, even though we need rain and are hoping for it very much.

Unfortunately, the last weather forecasts I have seen for the next two weeks still predict no rain. We do not need for this rainy season to be very short in rainfall! Whether you pray, hope, cross your fingers, etc. to get the rainfall we need by the end of the rainy season, go ahead and do it.

I am repeating part of an email that I received on Friday about Text to 9-1-1. "The Rancho Cordova Police Department, in partnership with other local law enforcement and fire agencies, are announcing that you can now send a text message to 9-1-1 from your mobile phone or handheld device. Call if you can - text if you can't! If you can, always contact 9-1-1 by making a voice call.

Text to 9-1-1 is intended to be used in three emergency situations: for an individual who is deaf, hard-of-hearing or has a speech disability; when it's too dangerous to call 9-1-1; or in a medical emergency that renders an individual incapable of speech." Currently, our communications center cannot receive photos or videos. When they will be able to receive them, I do not know. With the increasing speed of advanced

Conditional Voter Registration Allows Californians Who Missed Traditional Deadline Another Opportunity to Register to Vote

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - There is a new option for Californians who missed the October 22 deadline to register or update their voter registration for the November 6, 2018, General Election. A new option known as *conditional voter registration* allows eligible citizens to register and vote on the same day, today through Election Day.

"There is a new opportunity for California citizens who missed the voter registration deadline — *conditional voter registration*," Secretary of State Alex Padilla said. "If you

missed the regular voter registration deadline you may not be able to vote at your local polling place or by mail, but you still have an opportunity to cast a ballot. Between now and Election Day, you can go to your county election office or a designated satellite location to complete the conditional voter registration process by filing out a voter registration card and a ballot. Once county elections officials complete the regular voter registration verification process, your ballot will be processed and your vote will be counted. This

is yet another step we are taking to expand voting rights in California."

"If you are unsure of your voter registration status, you can quickly check it at voterstatus.sos.ca.gov," Padilla added.

Voters in Madera, Napa, Nevada, Sacramento, and San Mateo counties can access conditional voter registration at any Vote Center in their county. These counties are adopting the Voter's Choice Act. To learn more about the Voter's Choice Act, visit: <http://voterschoice.sos.ca.gov>

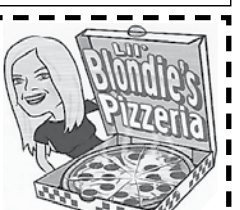

Billionaires Battle to Get Your Vote

Most do not fully understand the influence of the billionaire class on our elections—many times more than Russia or China put together. Before voting in the mid-terms it might be wise to assess what billionaire influences you support.

Liberal news outlets, which are all the major networks except Fox News, and some radio talk shows, want followers to know that the Koch brothers, Charles and David, unduly fund Republican Party candidates and causes on the right side of the political spectrum. Liberal newspapers include almost all big city newspapers and most major national news magazines.

Conservative news outlets often fail to mention the Koch brothers and speak only of George Soros as the big funder for most liberal outlets. Neither mentions the other, leaving the impression that only the other is buying elections. Candidates cross and crisscross America with alms bowls in hand begging the mega-rich to buy them.

First let us consider George Soros. His money, exceeding \$32 billion, is targeted for influence and political power over this nation and the world—all directed to the far left side of the political spectrum and the globalization (code for world government) of the world. Prominent among his myriad of well-funded socialist organizations are: ACORN, the Tides Foundation, Sojourners, The Quantum Fund, and Media Matters. Some of these organizations operate in other countries, as for example, The Open Society Institute (spends \$25million a year on socialist causes) and Friends of the Earth, designed to build support for an international network of organizations dedicated to

the environment. The Center for American Progress schedules their “experts” for talk show events even developing talking points for them. The Apollo Alliance played a major role in the development of the Stimulus Bill in 2010. The American Constitution Society defends far-left interpretations of the Constitution. And, MoveOn.org organizes action alerts to followers via the Internet.

No other one person, outside deceased David Rockefeller’s Council on Foreign Relations (CFR) and the Trilateral Commission (organizations remaining the most powerful special interest groups in the U.S.), each also promoting the left and world government, has as many organizations as combat ready and as highly financed, as does George Soros. He hosted fundraisers for President Obama and made numerous visits to the White House. There is reason to believe that Soros greatly influenced the Obama presidency on: The Stimulus Bill, Cap and Trade, opposition to the extension of the Bush tax cuts, and banking reform.

Even now he is believed to be financing the communist/socialist/anarchist Antifa, the hundred or so demonstrations against President Trump the past two years, and the present impeach Trump and Brett Kavanaugh demonstrations. Most of the “yellers” in the Kavanaugh Supreme Court hearings and those pounding and scratching the doors of the Supreme Court to force unlawful entree, just days ago, are believed to be funded by him. Still, the left side of the political spectrum fails to see this as threatening and dangerous to our republic.

Democrats accuse Koch-backed groups of airing tens of millions of dollars in negative ads against incumbent Democratic lawmakers in the past and of helping the Republicans win a majority in the Senate. They also accuse them of funding the Tea Party movement—a charge without foundation. As far as we can document the Koch brothers have not funded demonstrations, street violence resulting in property damage, or confrontation with police and followers do not wear face coverings to hide their identities, like Antifa.

Obviously funding candidates and founding organizations pushing ideology is the game of some billionaires on both sides. The candidate with the most money and publicity usually wins and the rich, by their funding, select contenders long before the people vote. Some may argue, since both sides are doing the same thing that it is, in this respect, fair. But both parties project the image that only the other party invites billionaire influence.

This columnist, however, is unable to find the right side of the political spectrum, funding a single riot, or “yeller” dragged out of a committee hearing for disruptive behavior, or mob activity in the streets blocking traffic or damaging automobiles, or driving out of restaurants conservatives (even Senator Cruz) dining with their spouses, or cornering senators in elevators threatening them if they do not change their vote, or attempting to force entree into the Supreme Court. None!! So although billionaire candidates and organizations dominate both political parties there remains quit a difference.

So the question is, what billionaire buys your vote? One problem, however, is that since the media personnel haven’t themselves, as a group, voted less than 80% for a Democrat in the White House for the last 50 years, most Americans only hear about the Koch brothers as buying elections. ★

This year's legislative session ended in September but you'll feel the damage to

your pocketbooks for years to come.

I will give my Democrat colleagues credit for consistency, at least, because every year they come up with new and creative ways to spend taxpayer money, but I question whether it materially improves our citizens' lives.

This year, Governor Brown signed legislation that will add an additional \$680 million annually in general fund spending. Remember, this is not growth in existing spending; it's brand new spending that stacked on top

of the already heavy taxpayer burden.

But as bad as that sounds, it actually gets much worse. That already big number excludes the premier budget-busting bill that will cost taxpayers billions every year while at the same time making them less safe and breaking down social order, Senate Bill 10.

SB 10 eliminates cash bail in California and replaces it with a court-operated pre-trial risk assessment program, meaning that the government will be eliminating the

huge, privately funded and taxpaying bail bond industry with a massive increase in government employees and bureaucracy. Estimates based on similar bail reform in New Jersey and Washington, D.C. suggest that California's new, additional taxpayer cost resulting from this change could be a staggering \$7.8 billion a year.

Adding insult to injury, eliminating cash bail will lead to fewer people showing up for their trials and more criminals out on the streets, creating new victims

and further eroding the quality of life in the Golden State. Increased costs plus decreased safety is not much of a deal for the taxpayer but it's becoming the California way.

In the past five years, California general fund spending surged roughly 44 percent, from \$96 billion to \$139 billion. Meanwhile, the state's population grew by roughly 5 percent. Spending grew about 9-times faster than population growth! Remember that sobering statistic the next time anyone praises Governor Brown for his fiscal discipline.

It's an unearned reputation entirely unsupported by facts.

California government creeps into every aspect of our lives, from what pronouns we can legally use, what therapies we can try, what bags we can get at the grocery store, to what straws we can have, but apparently, it's still not big enough or intrusive enough to satisfy my liberal colleagues.

Spending is taxes. After this legislative session, California taxpayers can look forward to putting more and more of their paychecks towards an ever-expanding state. ★

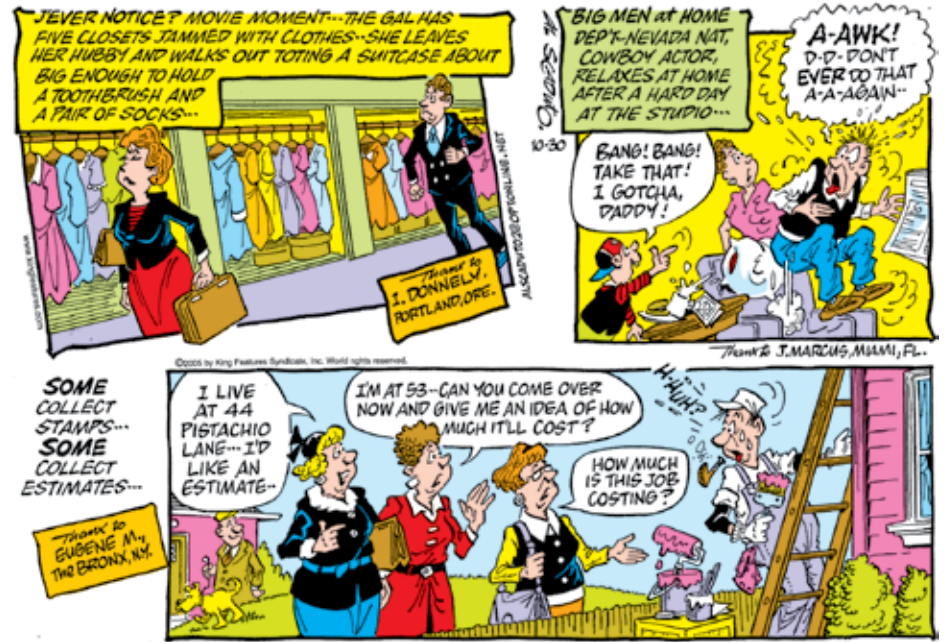

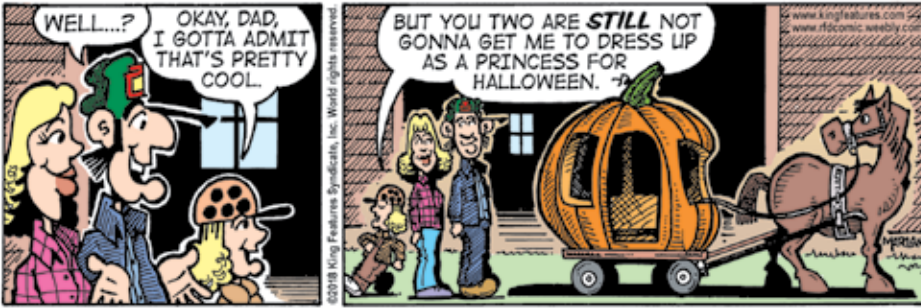

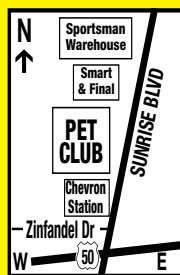

In collaboration with the Humane Society of the United States, the San Diego Humane Society arranged for a transfer of 93 dogs from three shelters located in Florida to create space for animals displaced by Hurricane Michael.

The shelter transport arrived back at the Sacramento SPCA Friday evening. "After the dog's arrival, our priority was getting them comfortable and settled into their new housing," said Sacramento SPCA Animal Services Practice Manager, Karalyn Aronow. "Medical assessments and close observation of the animals will continue over the next week to determine when they will be available for adoption".

The dogs are medium to large-sized mixed breeds, primarily consisting of lab, pit bull, and hound mixes under five years of age. Ten

of the fifteen dogs are Heartworm positive and will undergo Heartworm treatment.

The incoming pets are not direct victims of Hurricane Michael. They are adoptable dogs who have been in animal shelters in the Florida Panhandle area. They were transported out of the area to create room for pets who have been lost, strayed or abandoned due to the hurricane.

"The category 4 storm that recently devastated the Florida Panhandle and the record-setting wildfire season in California are harsh reminders of how important disaster preparedness is for us and our pets," said Sacramento SPCA CEO, Kenn Altine. "I witnessed, first-hand, the devastation and displacement of families and pets impacted by natural disasters while helping with Hurricane Katrina relief efforts in 2005, and

even closer to home this August, while assisting Haven Humane Society with relief efforts during the Carr Fire".

These reminders come just as the California Department of Water Resources encourages communities to participate in Flood Preparedness Week. Local preparedness events and exercises are being held throughout the state to educate communities on what to do during extreme weather events.

A Flood Preparedness Funfair will be held in Sacramento at the Miller Regional Park on Saturday, October 27 from 10:00 am - 2:00 pm. In partnership with the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), California Department of Water Resources (DWR), and Sacramento Municipal



Utility District (SMUD), event attendees will learn how keep their family and pets safe during an emergency, fill sandbags, find evacuation routes, sign up for emergency alerts, and watch rescuers in action as they perform water rescues.

Kiyo Sato Tells Story of WWII Internment

Sacramento Junior College at the time when the American dream for many was, she said, becoming a reality.

"Then this happened." Executive Order 9066, signed by President Roosevelt, was issued to remove all persons with more than 1/16 Japanese blood.

"I couldn't finish my first year of college," she recalled. "In May, we were ordered to leave."

A long list of contraband items included cameras, long knives, and radios.

"Even knitting needles were contraband," she said. "Can you believe that?"

Upon receiving the ten day notice to leave with only what they could carry, Sato's family, because of the quick and forward thinking of her father, packed all sorts of items in their bedrolls.

"What do you think he had in the bedroll?"

Seeds was the response from those who answered.

"Hammer, nails, a saw – all these tools he hid in each one of our bedrolls," she said. "A bucket." And those seeds were also hidden.

"Every one of those things he took was in demand and came in so handy."

Her talk was accompanied by a display behind her and a series of photographs, including one of the bedroll. She talked about how the hammer and nail were used and how they used scrap lumber and made nails from wire.

Her talk addressed the 4th Amendment when she recalled the day she came home from school to find three FBI agents in the house. One was in her room looking at her diary. The feisty young woman wanted to tell him to stop, but she didn't because the situation could have been made worse for the family.

She had plenty of artifacts to share with the audience including a copy of the evacuation

order poster, nearly half her size, which had been attached to fence posts, buildings, and telephone poles along Routier Road, just a stone's throw from her home and the MACC. She showed a copy of a Japanese Hunting License, which she read and horrified the audience, some who recalled Bernard Marks' words from a week earlier. She also held up a framed letter from the White House offering its apology and signed by President George H.W. Bush.

Sato's family was taken to Poston, Arizona where that bucket came in handy when the many sandstorms hit and to obtain potable water. Seeds were planted and somehow grew in temperatures that often topped 120 degrees. Poston was one of only ten camps across the United States for 120,000 people of Japanese descent. Camps were also located in California, Idaho, Colorado, Wyoming, Arkansas, and Utah. German-Americans and Italian-Americans were sent to different camps.

Sato took numerous audience questions and engaged with many after the event.

"We need to learn to be respectful of one another," she said. "We need to teach children to respect each other. It concerns me that we're not being respectful of the other person."
