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For the Glory Days

4th Annual Sports Hall of Fame Inducts Eight Women

The 4th annual Sports Hall of Fame inducted eight female athletes this year, the largest number yet, 46 years after the ground-breaking Title IX. Good Day Sacramento's Ken Rudolph, Cordova High School alumni and self-pro-

claimed "Lancer for life,"

returned as the sold-out event's

emcee.

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) -

Shelly Blanchard, Cordova Community Council's executive director, said that the event was "a true homerun, with more than 250 attendees and plenty of Cordova Lancer love." It was, she added, a mix of awards event and Cordova

sports reunion. Athletes, teams, and coaches have been honored in football, baseball, softball, tennis, track and field, swimming, cross country, golf, running, basketball, boxing, rugby, soccer, and mixed martial arts. Nominations come from the public and are reviewed by a panel of sports experts for recognition in three categories - athlete, coach, and heart of a champion.

It's the "Heart of a Champion" category that sets this hall of fame apart. This category, wrote Blanchard, recognizes and honors Rancho Cordova athletes like 2016 inductee Eppie Johnson, founder of Eppie's Great Race which ended a 45 year tradition in January, "people who made huge contributions to local sports in other ways."

John McFann, one of three inductees in this category, played baseball and basketball at Cordova High School but chose the Air Force over professional sports. McFann attained rank of three-star general, received numerous medals including Humanitarian Service and Distinguished

Service medals.

Thelma King, the lone woman in this category, coached soccer teams for Cordova High School and other groups beginning in the 1970s. First introduced to soccer while at Mather Air Force base, she passed her love and passion for the sport to numerous young women, including three generations in

her family. One of the younger athletes is Angie Matheu, who was honored as "one of the most successful female swimmers to emerge from Cordova High." She set records in butterfly, freestyle, backstroke, and relays, and she received the 2002 Athlete of the Year while at American River College.

Hub Morphew is one of

two coaches inducted this year. He spent nearly four decades coaching at Cordova

High School and American River College. He had signed a professional baseball contract with the Orioles but decided basketball was more to his liking. He was inducted into the LaSalle Club Coaches and Officials Hall of Fame in 2014 and is currently enjoying

Yes on 6 Exposes Waste, Fraud and **Abuse of Gas Tax Funds**

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - With the election just weeks away, the Yes on Prop 6 Gas Tax Repeal Campaign has released government documents and records showing numerous examples of "epic levels" of waste, fraud and abuse of gas tax funds and other taxpayer resources at Caltrans and local transportation agencies throughout California.

The records and documents were obtained through the California Public Records Act (CPRA) process and cover only materials received back from the CA Dept. of Transportation (Caltrans), local transportation agencies in San Diego, Los Angeles, Orange County, the Bay Area, and Sacramento. Other local government agencies also receive and spend gas tax funds - raising the question of how many more examples of waste of gas

"These examples of outrageous waste of the gas tax and other taxpayer resources provide the best reason to vote YES on Prop 6 the Gas Tax Repeal Initiative," said Carl DeMaio, chairman of the campaign. "Our existing gas tax funds are being wasted and we demand that these revelations of outrageous expenditures be immediately reformed before we give hese people any more of our taxpayer dollars," noted DeMaio.

"These outrageous examples of waste of our gas tax funds is proof that voters cannot trust California government agencies with even a penny more of their money until efficiency and accountability reforms can clean up these excessive expenditures," said Carl DeMaio, Chairman of Yes on Prop 6 Gas Tax Repeal Campaign. "Voters can send a strong message by voting YES on Prop 6 to repeal the costly and unfair gas and car tax hikes," DeMaio concluded.

Facts about this massive hike:

- -Voting Yes on Prop 6 will repeal the car and gas tax, and ensures that any future car and gas taxes must be approved by the voters
- On Nov 1, 2017, Californians became subject to an additional tax of 12.5 cents more per gallon (20 cents more for diesel)
- Estimates suggest it will cost an average family of four \$779 or more per family, per year
- The tax also hits business owners who rely on transporting goods, raising the cost of everything from apples to bread, and everything in between
- Vehicle license fees (car tax) will increase as much as \$175 a year - striking the wallets of hard-working families across the state
- The tax revenue goes into the state's General Fund, meaning there's zero guarantee the money will be used to actually fund the transportation "fixes" they claim will happen
- Nearly 1 million signatures were collected to qualify the measure on the November ballot; just over 550,000 were required

SMUD and D.R. Horton Agree to Build All-electric Homes

Electric Utility Aims to Reduce Greenhouse Gases Through "Electrification"

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - SMUD and top national homebuilder D.R. Horton are teaming up to build 104 all-electric homes in two new neighborhoods. These "all-electric communities" - "Juniper," which is planned to include 66 homes, and "Independence," which is anticipated to include 38 homes, are both located in North Natomas and will be priced for first-time homebuyers. The homes are included in the SMUD Smart Home program and are part of a broader electrification effort by SMUD, the first of its kind in the USA.

Groundbreaking for the subdivisions began earlier this summer. The model homes are completed, and the communities are open for sale. Construction will continue through 2019. If built as planned, SMUD will provide \$466,000 in incentives to D.R. Horton for including appliances and equipment to make the homes all-electric. These include heat pump heating and cooling, heat pump water heating, and induction stoves—appliances that are typically more energy efficient and can deliver lower overall energy bills.

Heat pump water heaters can reduce electricity use by up to 60 percent compared to electric resistance water heaters. Instead of using electricity to create heat, heat pump water heaters use a refrigerant cycle to transfer heat from surrounding ambient air into the hot water tank. They also cool the area where they are located, usually in the garage. Induction stoves may cook 50 percent faster than electric resistance stoves, and often as fast as gas. They also use less energy than traditional electric stoves and offer digital control of the temperature, and they have no open flame. The absence of combustion

in all-electric homes may result in greater occupant safety.

These homes will help community-owned SMUD meet its aggressive commitment to reach 90 percent reduction in greenhouse gas emissions by 2050 and surpass the state's greenhouse gas reduction goals of 80 percent by

These D.R. Horton homes are part of the SMUD Smart Home program, which offers incentives to builders and developers of up to \$5,000 for new single-family homes, and up to \$1,750 for new multifamily units, built to be all-electric. The homes must have allelectric appliances and mechanical systems—no gas line in the home, and no gas service at the property—in order to meet the minimum program participation requirements.

SMUD customers who own existing homes in the SMUD service territory can also qualify for up to \$13,750 for existing homes that convert from gas to electricity. For example, owners of existing homes may receive up to a \$4,500 incentive to replace an existing gas furnace by installing an electric heat pump space heater. A homeowner may receive up to a \$3,000 rebate to switch out an existing gas water heater for an electric heat pump water

There are also rebates available from SMUD for traditional efficiency measures such as duct sealing, insulation, and windows.

Community members are invited to go underground on Oct. 27 to attend Cabaret on K, an evening of musical performances with a nod to Halloween, featuring a haunting mix of cabaret, jazz, classical and musical theatre pieces by Sacramento group Rogue Music Project. Guests are welcome to come in costume and will enjoy complimentary desserts and drinks for purchase.

The event, sponsored by Capital Public Radio, will take place in the Capitol Plaza Ballrooms basement, 1025 9th Street in Sacramento, and will raise funds for Women's Empowerment's job-readiness programs for homeless women and the group's onsite center for homeless children. Nearly a dozen local artists will display and sell their work, with 50 percent of art proceeds donated to Women's Empowerment. Tickets are \$50 at www.womens-empowerment. org. Guests must be age 21 or older.

"Cabaret on K is the perfect opportunity to have a positive impact on your community while celebrating Sacramento's thriving arts scene," said Lisa Culp, executive director, Women's Empowerment. "Guests will enjoy live music and art while helping to end homelessness for women and their children."

Women's Empowerment is offering the most comprehensive job-readiness program in the

Sacramento area designed specifically for women who are homeless and their children. The award-winning organization has graduated 1,543 homeless women and their 3,710 children. Last year, 92 percent of graduates found homes and 77 percent found jobs or enrolled in school or training. The program combines self-esteem courses, job training, health classes and support services to help homeless women across diverse ages, races and cultures. Women's Empowerment is funded through private donations from the community and receives no government funding except for in-kind rent from the County of Sacramento. her diaries, film, television, and theatre, but Cheryl Gleason, director of Mills Station Arts and Culture Center (MACC), reenvisioned the familiar subject.

"Here's an ordinary family," she said, "but then what happens to the warm, very normal family" is what she presents through two intertwined exhibits. The first, along the gallery walls, offers a glimpse into everyday life through the lens of Otto Frank. The photos, she added, rarely travel unlike the exhibit that takes over the central portion of the gallery leading off with a more than life-size image of Anne Frank. Rounding out the exhibit are artifacts on loan by Kiyo Sato and Bernard Marks.

Visitors circulated throughout the gallery, reading, looking, discussing, and considering what had happened. They were invited upstairs for Marks' talk at 6:30 p.m.

"We should have rented an auditorium," said Gleason who introduced Marks, a man of diminutive stature who instantly commanded the audience's attention and held it for the next ninety minutes. He presented a powerful, thought-provoking, and at times, horrifying, talk to an overflow crowd that had people sitting on the floor and standing shoulder to shoulder along the walls. Sitting a few rows back was Japanese Internment Camp survivor Kiyo Sato who will speak on October 18.

Homeschooler Penelope Oliver attended with her parents and plans to return to hear Sato speak. Also in the audience were students from Capital Christian School who were "very impressed" with the exhibit. One student travelled from Suisun Valley K-8.

Marks is one of only five members of his extended family of 200 who survived the

Holocaust, thanks, he said, to his father's quick thinking and altering young Marks' birthdate to make him appear five years older. The older age, Marks explained, meant that he would live but he also had to go to work under conditions that the students and many audience members could not imagine.

Interspersed with his talk were images of the camps, of life before the Nazis, of documents including food rations broken down along ethnic lines and proclamations, propaganda photos of a seemingly normal life inside the camps, and short videos.

"We will never forget" is a phrase that Americans hear and use after horrific events. Marks definitely does not want anyone to forget that Germany had been a democracy, that neighbors turned on neighbors, and he warned that it could happen again. He pointed to the internment of Japanese American following the bombing of Pearl Harbor as one example.

His research has been extensive and the octogenarian does not appear to be slowing from his mission to educate students and adults on the Holocaust. After a series of audience questions, he invited each and every student to submit work to the "Eleanor J. Marks Holocaust Foundation: A World Wide Essay Writing Project," an opportunity for students from 6th grade through university level to write and be published, but mostly, to learn.

Students from local schools will also visit the exhibit and will "receive a free copy of The Diary of a Young Girl by Anne Frank, thanks to the City's Community Enhancement Fund," said Communications Officer Ashley Downton.


Response from exhibit visitors was an overwhelming "amazing," with one visitor saying that it was "beautiful, yet somber" and another saying how she liked how MACC tied in the Japanese Internment.

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

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - I remember reading a letter in The American Legion Magazine that I have commented about in the past, and while I can't find the letter, I do remember the jest of the story. A World War II veteran was being interviewed by a reporter from the high school student newspaper, and was asked why he and millions of others were so willing to go overseas, fight and possibly die in other countries. The G.I. said that between battles, he and a buddy of his were eating in a foxhole and talking about things back home. He said they both knew what could happen back home if Hitler and others like him weren't stopped. They were fighting for the people back home and everything their country stood for. Then he stopped, looked at the teenager, and said to the student who was interviewing him that he worried about that student's generation. He knew what his generation was willing to die for, but he didn't think that student's generation even knew what they were willing to live for.

I read that letter about 20 years ago, and I wonder if that G.I.'s opinion has changed, and if he is still worried. I know some student's opinions changed right after 9/11/2001. I was substitute teaching in high school when that happened, and more than the usual number of students in my classes said they were going to join the United States Air Force, Army, etc. Being attacked in New York, Washington, D.C. and who knew

where next had them thinking quite differently than reading about a war in a textbook about us in another country. I haven't heard lately about the number of today's students who join the military, but that would be interesting. Something else is that the students I taught then were 14 to 18 years old when we were attacked. Today, they are 31 to 35 years old, and when the calendar shows 9/11, I wonder. After all, it is now their history and their war. They are reminded by that calendar.

History books showed World War II ending May 8, 1945 in Europe and ending in the Pacific on September 2, 1945. The Korean War began on June 25, 1950 and ended on July 27, 1953. The Vietnam War began on November 1, 1955 and ended on May 15, 1975. There were many other conflicts that occurred after Vietnam. The war(s) that seem to be part of the 9/11 terrorist attacks are seen by some as part of the many dimensions of the wars and conflicts that continue today.

Now another thing has crossed my mind is something that has nothing to do with war or battles themselves, but music. Quite a switch, I know. Fortunately, our minds can and do travel from one end of the mental spectrum to the other. That's without being completely "mad." Music can go from classic to rock and roll to blues, and everything in between, like the weather. I like the cooler weather and nature's delicate and subtle changes; changes in the color of the leaves, grass and even the trees. Not every tree can change to a Halloween tree, with dimensions and shapes all of its own. But some trees, when their leaves are gone and there are stormy grey clouds behind them, all you see are their silhouettes of black, and they work extremely well for storytelling.

I've always enjoyed the music and the story about "The Legend of Sleepy Hollow," for example, that Walt Disney presented to his audience in October 5, 1949 in the theatres. His animated cartoon adaptation of the story and having it narrated by Bing Crosby was, and I think it is still, quite a treat around Halloween time for many kids of all ages. Washington Irving wrote the story where he lived, and according to the encyclopedia, "On November 28, 1859, on the eve of the Civil War, Washington died at Sunnyside, surrounded by his family. He was buried in the Sleepy Hollow Cemetery at the Old Dutch Church in Sleepy Hollow".

Washington Irving created his own writing style that can be seen in "Rip Van Wrinkle," in which he shows his writing style by using humor, imagery and satire (making gentle fun of something.) Music has had a tremendous impact on lives across and around the world. At times, the music that was popular during the wars lifted almost everyone's morale, spirit and their souls. Music helps many times, even when everyone was pretty low because of natural disasters or war. And like music, writers can help people get through some tough times.

Time marches on no matter what you are doing, and I am out of time to add more to this column. So, I think I'll stop for now and pass on a thought about autumn. A tree seems to let its leaves go very quietly. They float to the ground, pile up, and then wait for children to jump and run and laugh through them. It's a shame we can't continue to relish, enjoy and share such simple joy all through of our lives.

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

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - The Folsom Lake women's soccer team found themselves in an early hole on Tuesday afternoon and could never quite dig themselves out. Playing at Delta College in Stockton, the Falcons allowed two goals in the first twenty minutes to fall behind 2-0. The Falcons cut the deficit in half with a goal by Michaela Mayer just before halftime, but there would be no more scoring in the game as the Mustangs held on to win, 2-1.

The loss leaves the Falcons alone in third place in the Big 8 Conference at 7-3. They'll visit second-place Santa Rosa on Friday afternoon, hoping to avenge a mid-September 2-0 loss while playing for a chance to overtake the Bear Cubs for second place.

Twenty minutes later, freshman Emma Thompson took a pass from Sarah Scott and found the net for another Falcon goal. With a 2-0 lead, the Falcons continued to pressure on the offensive end, but were even more focused on defense as they shut down the Beavers. Izzy Chinchay recorded the shutout with eight saves.

Men's Soccer

Though a little road-weary and perhaps licking some wounds from last Friday's tie and Saturday's loss, the Falcons headed south again on Tuesday, but this time with a much better result as they defeated West Hills in Lemoore, 6-2. The Falcons scored all six goals in the first half, their biggest offensive output of 2018. With three players at six feet or taller, the Panthers had a decided height advantage, but it did not seem to intimidate the Falcons. Caitlin Dillon, Alicia Wilson, Kristen Whitney, Jasmin Sowell-Scott, and Valerie Hutton all combined to make their presence felt at the net, whether with blocks, big hits, or quick dumps over the Panther blockers.
