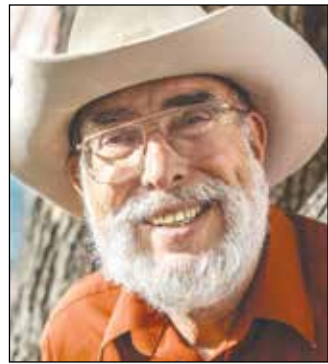

Symphony d'Oro Celebrates Community, Heroes, New Name



The newly renamed Symphony d'Oro Rancho Cordova first performed as the Rancho Cordova Civic Light Orchestra in May 2013 and celebrated Rancho Cordova's ten year anniversary of cityhood with its second full concert.

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - The Rancho Cordova Civic Light Orchestra has a new name and a new event as it opens its sixth season. The newly renamed Symphony d'Oro Rancho Cordova will celebrate heroes big and small through its free concert, "Heroes: Celebrating All Who Make a Positive Difference in the World," on Saturday, October 13 at River City Christian.

Maestro Pete Nowlen will conduct the volunteer symphony orchestra and solo violinist, Chase Spruill, through four centuries of classics by Ludwig van

Beethoven, Antonín Leopold Dvořák, Gordon Jacob, Felix Mendelssohn, and Antonio Vivaldi.

The composers were specially selected for this concert because they "had other aspects to their lives that make them the kind of people we want to celebrate," said Lorraine Crozier, president of Symphony d'Oro.

Beethoven composed many of his greatest works in his late 40s and early 50s when he was going deaf, and the first four notes of his "Symphony No. 5" is the most widely recognized line after "Happy Birthday," she said. Between 1803 and 1812, Beethoven composed 116 complete pieces including an opera. Dvořák



"was brought to America to develop the concept of American classical music," said Crozier. Jacob served in WWI, was held captive, and formed a small camp orchestra using instruments fashioned out of whatever could be found. He set himself apart with his fondness for Baroque music at a time when it was not fashionable and for his ability to compose for wind bands.

Mendelssohn, said Crozier, supported his sister's musical talent, often seeking her critique on his works. The child prodigy composed operas and symphonies including "Overture to a Midsummer Night's Dream," his most recognizable composition, at age seventeen.

Vivaldi composed more than 200 concerti for solo violin, wrote operas, composed sacral

Sacrificing the Parkway

*Appeals Case Impacts
Illegal Camping Ordinance*

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - A federal court decision has ruled that illegal camping ordinances are unconstitutional and that local governments cannot cite or arrest anyone sleeping on public property.

On September 4, 2018, the Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals ruled on the case Robert Martin v. City of Boise, stating that enforcing anti-camping ordinances when adequate shelter beds are unavailable is unconstitutional.

Because of that ruling, the Sacramento County Department of Parks stopped enforcing the City of Sacramento's anti-camping ordinance and the County ordinance prohibiting camping without a permit.

Since January 2018, Sacramento County rangers have issued 1,834 citations for unlawful camping under the County ordinance, and 224 citations for unlawful camping under the City of Sacramento ordinance.

The County is currently evaluating enforcement options under existing laws and regulations and will provide information to the Board on next steps.

Sacramento County Rangers will continue to enforce ordinances including but not limited to campfires, littering, dogs off leash, possession of a shopping cart and environmental degradation.

"As soon as I found out about the ruling, I suggested our board meet to discuss its implications, especially for my constituents who rightfully demand a clean and safe Parkway," said First District Supervisor Phil Serna, who represents the lower reach of the American River Parkway.

"I have many questions, including why County Counsel advised that park rangers not enforce the illegal camping ordinance without notifying or coordinating with board members," he continued. ★

Alumni will be invited to join the class floats in a parade at halftime of the football game, a 7 p.m. Greater Sacramento League contest against Florin.

Miller also mentioned an alumni dinner before the game "so that people can reunite." ★

“Teacher Night” a First at Aerospace Museum

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - After a full day of teaching school, instructors came from as far away as El Dorado Hills to attend the Aerospace Museum of California’s first Teacher Night on September 27. From preschool to high school, teachers inside and outside of the STEM (science, technology, engineering, and math) fields came together to learn what the museum has to offer their students and discover new ways to integrate STEM learning in the classroom. Refreshments and a sneak peek at the museum’s new exhibit, “Our Solar System: an interactive journey,” including a teacher’s exhibit guide, were part of the evening’s curriculum.

The museum is located on McClellan Air Force base where it began in 1986 as McClellan Aviation Museum. Director Tom Jones, who has held the position since March, says that the museum is committed to STEM education for students of all ages and to becoming the best on the West Coast. As a Smithsonian Air and Space Museum affiliate, exhibits like the 2018 “Art of the Airport Tower” and 2017 “DaVinci Inventions” can be brought to Sacramento.

On the main floor, nestled between airplanes, an SR71 jet propulsion engine, and a history of space

exploration, were activities for children of all ages, and the teachers took full advantage by seeing how parachutes

function or engineering with marbles. Others learned why the moon turns blue and viewed photos of nebulae on one of

the many monitors that will accompany the exhibit. Each visitor was treated to a docent led tour of the museum and its grounds.

Upstairs, at the far end, tucked in a hallway, teachers made their way to the Flyers Flight Zone to experience simulated flying on one of the six high-end gaming machines. Museum volunteers, led by Flyers Flight Zone Director Warren Searls, educated the educators and allowed each some hands-on flight time.

“There is a huge shortage of pilots worldwide,” Searls said, adding that the Flight Zone is a way to interest fifth through twelfth grade students in flight and perhaps becoming pilots. In 2017, 10,000 students visited the Flight Zone, and many from Title 1 schools received scholarships for the flight simulations. He wants teachers to encourage students to remain in school and consider taking those STEM classes.

Miss Naomi Endsley, from Orangevale’s Almondale Academy,

was one of the first teachers to try the simulator.

“I didn’t crash,” she said, a sentiment echoed by other teachers who took turns at flying to New Zealand, Switzerland, and San Francisco.

Endsley teaches second and third grades and said that she definitely picked up new ideas for her students. Like many others that evening, she had never been to the museum. She said that she’ll bring her students and let them have the chance to see a piece of history and what technology really is. She engaged in conversation with Karen Jones, the museum’s development director and Tom Jones, museum director, about what technology holds in store for the future.

Twin Rivers Unified School District teachers agreed that they would definitely bring their students, one of several school districts the museum currently facilitates STEM, history, and art learning opportunities with. San Juan Unified School District, UC Davis, Sacramento State University, American River College, University of the Pacific, and charter schools are others.

Director Jones said that the museum has a formal mentorship program with the UC Davis Department of Mechanical and Aerospace Engineering. Sacramento State undergraduate history students are conducting research on the museum’s airplanes and will create videos that may be accessed with QR codes to enhance the static exhibits. At least one Sacramento State graduate student is working on his master’s thesis by building an upcoming exhibit about Bob Hoover who, among other things, was a revolutionary in aerobatic flying. Sacramento City College owns the Fed Ex jet parked in the outside exhibition area and uses it as its classroom.

Even the youngest students can benefit from STEM learning as Kimberly Dillon, preschool teacher at Discovery Learning Center in Fair Oaks, said. She has brought her students to the museum for several trips and said that they really enjoy climbing the planes. Her guest that evening was her son, Anthony.

“Very cool for kids,” was the phrase most often heard from teachers.

vocals, and he contributed to the classic three movement concerto.

The fifty musicians who perform in the full orchestra are doctors, lawyers, architects, nurses, retired, and college students. Some are recent members. Others, like Crozier, have performed since the group's inception in 2012 during a Sacramento State chamber music summer workshop.

The symphony first performed as the Rancho Cordova Civic Light Orchestra in May 2013 and celebrated Rancho Cordova's ten year anniversary of cityhood with its second full concert. Maestro Nowlen has been with the orchestra since he led that summer workshop and is active in orchestral and chamber music circles throughout the Sacramento region and San Francisco Bay Area.

Musicians and volunteers travel from Auburn, Davis, and from the San Francisco Bay Area, said Crozier, adding that about half of the musicians, including one cellist in her 80s, have been members since the beginning. They perform as a full orchestra in four free concerts annually and one fundraiser. Many also perform in smaller ensembles for activities at Mills Station Art and Culture Center (MACC) and Rancho Cordova special events.

"Playing in a musical ensemble is a special thing," said Crozier. "It's a great feeling. That is why we do it."

They also help support Cordova Community Food Locker (CCFL), founded by a group of volunteers in 1987, which provides food for about 5,000 people monthly. Crozier said that CCFL also provides turkey dinners at Thanksgiving. During intermission, donations may be given and music lovers can meet the musicians.

And the reason for the name change, she said, goes



to the heart of the orchestra and society.

"In ancient languages gold and treasure were often the same word," wrote Crozier in an email. "Music, and the rich musical heritage that has evolved over many centuries, is something for all humans to enjoy, preserve, and value. In sharing music we share the greatest of artistic treasures and help to preserve it for future generations." In Spanish and Italian, the word for gold or treasure is Oro.

"The arts are really the heart and soul of the community," she said, and refers to the compromise required when fifty talented musicians come together to perform a "team sport where everybody wins."

As for who heroes are, she said that "a hero gives up a seat on the bus to a person who needs it."

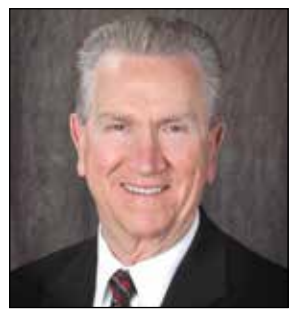

Business License Fees Waived for Eligible Veterans

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - At its September 25 meeting, the Sacramento County Board of Supervisors approved an ordinance amending the County Code relating to general business license fees for Veterans. The approved amendment will provide eligible Veterans a fee waiver of 100 percent on general business licensing fees.

As a way to recognize eligible veterans that operate service-related businesses, the Board of Supervisors

passed Sacramento County Code (SCC) 4.06.072 in 2007. SCC 4.06.072 provides eligible veterans a fee waiver of 50 percent on general business license issuance and renewal fees.

"We're adopting this ordinance to honor and support our local veterans" said District 3 Supervisor and Board Chair Susan Peters. "Veterans have made tremendous sacrifices for our country, and this is one way we can acknowledge their dedication and service."

To be eligible for this fee waiver, an individual must be a Veteran of the armed services, who has been honorably discharged or released from active duty under honorable conditions from any branch of the United States military. The Tax and License Collector may require documentation as proof of military service and honorable discharge or release status to verify applicant eligibility.

During the FY 2018-19 Recommended Budget

Hearings, the Board elected to make a line item appropriation of \$24,585 to fund a 50 percent reduction in General Business License fees. Since the enhancement provides a 100 percent fee

waiver an additional \$24,585 will be needed for a total General Fund cost of approximately \$49,170, annually. An Appropriation Adjustment Request will be submitted after the adopted ordinance

takes effect to reflect the additional line item appropriation.

Creativity Gone Wild

Local Nonprofits Help Young Authors' Dreams Come True

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - How many children do you know who have written illustrated, and published their own book? In Citrus Heights, 125 students, 1st through 5th grade, at the Mariposa Avenue Elementary School have added "author" to their resume, which will follow them through high school and beyond.

This unique program called "Creativity Gone Wild" is taught by members of the Mariposa Literary Academy in Citrus Heights and is designed to inspire students to stretch their minds and use their imaginations in new ways.

The program was the brainchild of Karen Szakacs, a kindergarten teacher at Mariposa in 2014, and Marsha Robinson, a local author of children's books. Together with Chereilyn Martello, the three women launched the first academy in 2014.

The spark that ignited the idea for the student authored books came when a kindergarten boy at Mariposa heard Robinson read her book "Rescuing Humphrey" to the class and afterwards raised his hand. He asked her to write another book about Humphrey. She answered by suggesting he write it. He replied, "I don't know how," and the Mariposa Literary Academy was born.

Since January, 2014 the Academy has taught 11 after-school academies (two per year) with 125 young authors to-date proudly producing their own hard cover fiction books at the end of the 16-session academy. A maximum of 12 students are chosen by their teacher to participate in each academy.

The entire book is the work of the student author. They come up with their own fictional story, with a beginning, middle and conclusion, along with illustrations. They begin with a normal life experience such as a camping trip in the woods with their family. They are told to enhance it using

their imagination, such as being transported to another planet by space aliens. The results have truly been mind-boggling.

To help teach the authors how to illustrate their own books, Peter Blueberry, alias Lance Pyle - a children's book author and illustrator, volunteers his time explaining the art of illustration and helping students with their own work.

Shutterfly, an American internet-based publishing service, prints the books for about \$15 each. Each student receives a hardcover book for themselves, a hardcover book to sign for the school library and the Academy receives a paper copy of each student's book. They have become the most popular books checked out by students.

While instruction and the printed books are free to participants, actual cost per pupil averages \$50. In addition to the cost of publishing, funds are used for items such as paper and art supplies, snacks, and photography.

Financially, the Literary Academy, Creativity Gone

Wild, is managing to stay solvent with the help of two philanthropic organizations and other donations.

Through word of mouth the Rotary Club of Citrus Heights and Soroptimist International of Citrus Heights immediately stepped up and have continued to provide the largest portion of the over \$6,000 needed to fund the program for the last five years. The Optimist Club of Citrus Heights and Mariposa Parent Faculty Organization have also provided funds.

Robinson stated in an email, "I would like to show my thanks to the organizations that have supported this program, to the volunteers that help us run the program, and to the school itself for allowing us to use their campus."

She would also like to invite other schools to look at the "possibilities that an academy like this can provide students" in their schools. The Mariposa Literary Academy would love to share their experiences with local elementary school teachers. ★

Defendant Convicted of Sexually Assaulting Multiple Children

DATE: September 25, 2018
CASE: Steven Sommer (Case #17FE004388)
PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Catrina Skor, Special Assault & Child Abuse Unit
 Steven Sommer pled no contest to five counts of committing a lewd act upon a child, and admitted to the allegation the conduct was committed against more than one victim.
 Between 1993 and 2002, Sommer sexually assaulted five children whose ages ranged from 4 to 11 years old at the time of the assaults. Sommer would lure the victims to his house, where he showed them pornography and had them engage in sexual activity. The first victim reported the sexual abuse in 2013, which launched a larger investigation. The investigation led to four other victims, who reported Sommer abused them for years. When the Sacramento Valley Hi-Tech Crimes Task Force searched Sommer's computer, it revealed dozens of images of child pornography and searches related to child pornography.
 Sommer faces a maximum sentence of 33 years to life in prison. Sentencing is set for October 15, 2018, at 9:00 a.m. in Department 30 before the Honorable James McFetridge.

Jury Determines Sexually Violent Predator Will Stay in Hospital

DATE: September 26, 2018
CASE: Robert Sims (Case #93F03509 & 04F05695)
PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Denise Halstead, Mental Health Litigation Unit
 A jury found true a petition of civil commitment against Robert Sims as a Sexually Violent Predator (SVP). In 1993, Sims was convicted of rape by force or fear. In that case, the 16-year-old victim was walking to school when Sims got her into his car, used a knife to threaten her and then raped her. He received 3 years in state prison. While incarcerated on a parole violation in 2004, Sims used force to sodomize his cellmate and was convicted of sodomy. He received a 32-month sentence. Sims violated parole in 2007 when he failed to register as a sex offender. As a result, the District Attorney's Office filed a petition to civilly commit Sims as an SVP.
 While in the hospital, Sims assaulted a staff member in a sexual manner and displayed sexual behavior during an interview by an expert called to evaluate him. Doctors from the Department of State Hospitals had the opinion that Sims represents a danger to the health and safety of others, in that he is likely to engage in sexually violent predatory criminal behavior.
 Deputy District Attorney Denise Halstead states, "Sims has shown he will sexually offend in the community, in jail and in the state hospital. The jury determined that Sims continues to present a substantial danger and a serious risk to commit such crimes if free, and our community is safer with this finding." ★

Second Defendant Sentenced for Murder, Attempted Murders

DATE: September 28, 2018
CASE: Dashawn Tinsley & RV Watson Jr. (Case #16FE016082)
PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Matt Chisholm, Adult Sexual Assault Prosecution Unit
 The Honorable Curtis Fiorini sentenced RV Watson Jr. to 207 years to life in prison. Dashawn Tinsley was previously sentenced to 141 years to life in prison.
 On June 5, 2018, Dashawn Tinsley and RV Watson Jr. were convicted by a jury for the first-degree murder of Andrew VanHunnik and three counts of premeditated attempted murder. The jury also found true that both defendants fired firearms causing great bodily injury or death to three separate victims.
 On December 24, 2015, one victim drove to his mother's Citrus Heights home. As he exited his car, he was shot three times and suffered a broken left arm from one of the bullets. On December 28, 2015, law enforcement responded to a shooting in Citrus Heights and found a car riddled with bullets. Inside the car was Mr. VanHunnik, who was deceased from multiple gun shots. Two other victims who were also in the car survived. One victim escaped the car after being shot five times, and the second victim escaped without being shot. Detectives from the Citrus Heights Police Department were able to locate witnesses and physical evidence which established both Tinsley and Watson as the shooters in the murder and the earlier attempted murder.

Defendant Sentenced for Sexually Assaulting Woman on Train

CASE: Jerron Rolon (Case #17FE020552)
PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Bret Wasley, Adult Sexual Assault Prosecution Unit
 The Honorable Eugene Balonon sentenced Jerron Rolon to 25 years to life in prison. On August 6, 2018, a jury convicted Rolon of sexual assault by foreign object while the victim is unconscious and assault with intent to commit mayhem, rape, sodomy, oral copulation.
 On October 31, 2017, Rolon boarded an Amtrak train. The 20-year-old victim boarded the same train and was assigned a seat next to Rolon. The two chatted for a few hours until the victim decided to go to sleep. The victim woke up to Rolon sexually assaulting her. The terrified victim told Rolon she needed to use the restroom and sat next to someone else. When the train arrived in Sacramento, the victim told a train attendant about the assault. Rolon was arrested on the train.
 Rolon's two prior 2012 strike convictions in the state of Washington for child sexual assault were also found true at sentencing. ★

Big-Play Lancers Light Up Johnson

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - With the Cordova High School football team pinned at its own 1-yard line and only 21 seconds left before halftime, Johnne Sanders would have succeeded simply by staving off a safety.

Instead the Lancers quarterback slipped through the middle, weaved through traffic and cut across the field en route to a 99-yard touchdown that put an early exclamation point on Cordova's 46-8 road win on September 28 over Hiram Johnson High.

The Lancers needed just six offensive snaps to go up 14-0 and led 40-0 by halftime of the Greater Sacramento League victory played at Rosemont High.

"We're now 2-5 and there's going to be some teams that are going to be scared of us because of the athletes that we have," Cordova head coach John McCoy said.

Sanders wasn't the only Lancer to show off big-play prowess. Wide receiver Alvin Banks took an end-around sweep 63 yards for a score and lineman Andrew Turner scooped up a fumble before dashing 60 yards for a touchdown.

"Once I tucked it, I was gone," Turner jubilantly told teammates on the sideline afterward.

Raymond Fite had a key block on that return and also ran for three touchdowns. Along with 115 yards passing, Sanders added another score on the ground. Cordova finished with 259 yards rushing.

"I give credit to the offensive line," McCoy said of the team's offensive explosion. "Those holes were huge."

The starting offensive line was comprised of Austin McCoy, Sergey Kalashyan, Anthony Patterson, Anthony Curry and Turner.

Defensively, the Lancers were led by Elijah Jenkins (11 tackles) and Dumaurier Hackett (eight). Tim Apole forced the aforementioned fumble and Jeremiah Bankett had an interception.

Johnson's only touchdown came in the final minute of the game.

"We shut them down," Cordova assistant head coach Gary Lawrence said. "Before that last drive, when we had a lot of subs in, they probably only had 90 yards of total offense. We did our film work, we did our homework and we knew what they were going to run." ★

Sacramento's Measure U Tax Increase is a Slush Fund for Greedy Politicians

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - Sacramento voters are once again faced with tax increases on the November ballot because Mayor Darrell Steinberg and most of the members of City Council can't or won't be honest about their gross spending and particular taste for other people's money. So here we are again, solving Sacramento's latest budget/spending crisis with hefty tax increases.

Sacramento city revenues are more than \$120 million up from 2010, and up 16 percent in just the past two years. This is not counting the \$50 million Measure U brings in every year. Measure U was a half-cent sales tax sold to voters as necessary to restore the city services cut during the recession. Okay, we're good.

But we're not. Measure U is a slush fund for greedy politicians; more is never enough.

Voters are faced with yet another Measure U on the ballot, and this one doubles the half-cent sales tax and makes it permanent, raising Sacramento's sales tax to 8.75 percent.

California is already ranked at the number 1 top sales tax state in the country with the highest state-level sales tax at

7.25 percent, and a combined rate of 8.54 percent, according to the Tax Foundation. And Sacramento is knocking on the door of even higher sales taxes. Yet, high tax rates cause lower real tax revenue collection, and serve to punish lower income families far more.

What Happened?

In 2012 when Jerry Brown was getting his statewide Proposition 30 sales and income tax increase on the top 1 percent wealthiest Californians, Sacramento city voters also passed Measure U, a "temporary tax" to allow the City to enact a half-cent sales tax for six years with all revenue going to the City's General Fund.

Proponents claimed the "temporary measure" was needed to stop the loss of city services and jobs blamed on the recession. The City of Sacramento said Measure U was needed to restore and protect City services. "The intent was to restore police and fire services, park maintenance and other essential services that were cut between 2008 and 2013." The city made it appear unthinkable that voters would deny police, fire and parks their rightful budgets.

Most city residents already noticed the loss of city services along with skyrocketing city utility/services bills, in addition to increasing taxes.

"Budget officials initially projected the tax would generate \$31.8 million in the current fiscal year," sacbee.com reported in 2015. "Instead, Measure U dollars are now expected to reach \$41.5 million this year and remain nearly \$10 million above original projections for the next four years."

There's no such thing as a temporary tax — this lie is used by politicians to get their tax increases passed by gullible

voters. Measure U is set to expire in March 2019. So what does Mayor Darrell Steinberg and the City Council do? They put Measure U back on the ballot for November, to double the size of the tax and make it permanent, saying "inclusive economic growth" makes it necessary. "I'm confident when people see what we can do with a full penny, they will respond favorably," Steinberg said.

Yah, it's just another penny... If you aren't familiar with "inclusive economic growth," you may want to pour a stiff whiskey when you read, "Inclusive growth is economic growth that is distributed fairly across society and creates opportunities for all," according to many "Sustainable growth" organizations. It's largely used in third-world countries, so I'm curious why Sacramento Mayor Darrell Steinberg chose this feel-good wording... unless perhaps he agrees that Sacramento is turning into a third world city.

In 2017, a city report found a 30 percent spike in homelessness over the past two years, which many in the region felt underestimated the problem.

All Tax Increases Are 'Pension Taxes'

At the root of the financial problem in nearly every California city, as well as at the state, is swelling pension obligations, — though no one in Sacramento City Hall wants to admit this is what the Measure U tax increase is really about. "As the costs of pensions and employee salaries increase, the city of Sacramento is forecasting budget deficits beginning next year," sacbee.com reported. "Those gaps are expected to reach \$25 million by 2022."

The biggest problem with the old Measure U and the new Measure U is that it is

a general tax, which goes directly into the General Fund, without any specific earmarks, as the Mayor would have voters believe. It doesn't go to pay down the Calpers obligation for unfunded city pensions, nor is it specifically designated to repair and maintain city parks, or to address the exploding homeless population.

Measure U is another blank check for the Mayor and City Council in their quest to turn Sacramento into a "World Class City." They think they need the money to attract more professional sports teams, build more five star hotels and \$4 million condos.

With taxes maxed out on the rich, the Mayor and City Council are now targeting the poor and middle class to keep funding the city government employee pension black hole. There's no talk among council members of spending cutbacks or real reforms.

Last month, Mayor Steinberg showed his true colors when he forced a collective bargaining agreement with trade unions, without any input from the public. He even shut down two council members who questioned the cost and accountability to taxpayers. Under the agreement, any public construction job in the city costing more than \$1 must use union labor. This is another gift to his union thug friends. No one at the city knows what this will cost taxpayers, and Steinberg doesn't care.

Mayor Darrell Steinberg doesn't deserve more of taxpayers' hard-earned money. He's incapable of fiscal prudence, is tied at the hip to labor unions, and feels nothing about taxing middle-class and low income families more to feed his greed.

Vote NO on Measure U this November. ★

Game Plots

God of War: Relationships Over Story

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - 2018's *God of War* represents one of the most significant reversals in the history of a modern video game franchise. Though its ultra-machismo is still part of its DNA (Kratos, the character the player controls, is a buff, gruff brute who roars through combat, pummeling enemies with his bare fists before chopping into them with his massive axe), the tone has shifted. *God of War* has chosen not to focus on Kratos's bloody vengeance as he chops his way through a mythological pantheon, as its series has done since the first entry more than ten years ago, but on the interactions between Kratos and his young son Atreus. In doing so, *God* locks in a trend that games have been spiraling towards since 2013's *The Last of Us*. Let the other artistic genres master the art of storytelling. Games, instead, should focus on individual relationships.

Though *God of War* is by all means one of the best games of the year (expect high praise when rewards time comes around) its plot, by traditional standards, deserves to be booed offstage. Kratos's wife, Atreus's mother, has died, and her last wish was for her ashes to be scattered at the top of the highest peak in all the realms. Kratos and Atreus attempt to go to the highest peak...only to be told that what they *thought* was the highest peak is actually the second highest, and to get to the highest they have to go to another realm, which requires a magic chisel, which belonged to a long-dead giant...and around and around we go. At some point the story veers off into the realm of the elves and the Norse underworld, both times to fetch Things so meaningless in-and-of-themselves that I've forgotten what they are entirely.

But *God of War's* praise revolves not around its pointless time-killing plot, but in the way it fills its runtime with dialogue between Kratos and Atreus. It's heavily implied that Atreus had little interaction with his father before his mother's death, and over the course of the game we see the cold, stoic warrior gradually

warm to his young son, adopting the role first of a teacher, than of a mentor, and finally of a caring parent. His love for his son exposes deep self-hatred and uncertainty that his chiseled muscles and grizzled beard can't cover, and while lesser writing would resort to bold scenes full of teary-eyed music, the complexities of their relationship are built into the simple moments of routine necessary for a video game of this length and complexity.

And that's how *God of War* takes advantage of its medium. No other genre can reasonably have hours of quietly canoeing across a lake; *God of War* uses this as an opportunity to have Atreus ask his father about the beautiful world around them. Combat offers an opportunity for direct bonding, as the player works together with Atreus to take down vicious foes, and Atreus, afterwards, will often eagerly ask his father how well he did.

Video games have often been criticized, rightly so, for their tendency to drag out their plots simply for the sake of more, repetitive content. *God of War* doesn't reverse this trend but rolls with the punches, using it as an opportunity to build a relationship slowly, over time, through small, minute, seemingly insignificant interactions. In this way, it mirrors relationship-building in real life, and feels all the more genuine as a result.
