**SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)** - The first week of "Century of Service – 100th Anniversary of Mather Field" wrapped up with a Mather reunion twenty five years after the base closed. Saturday's weather was just right for folks to drive, walk, or ride Light Rail to the Mather Arts and Cultural Center (MACC) to view the exhibit that opened Wednesday, September 5 with a ceremony featuring Rancho Cordova Mayor Linda Budge, Col. Robert Martinelli, USAF Ret., Assemblyman Ken Cooley, and Cordova Community Council Executive Director Shelly Blanchard. The first week has been one non-stop activity flight.

Thursday's author presentation, "Panoramic History of Mather AFB," with Sacramento Room librarian James Scott drew nearly four dozen people.

# Anything is Possible

## Ainsley's Angels Inspires Hope

**SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)**  
- Ainsley's Angels is a national nonprofit organization aimed at servicing the special needs community through their race series, consisting of athlete riders and runners who participate in races across 30 states and over 60 cities.

The inspiration for all this is Ainsley, the daughter of Marine Corps Major Kim and Lori Rossiter. Before turning four, Ainsley was diagnosed with Infantile Neuroaxonal Dystrophy (INAD), an extremely rare terminal illness that slowly causes global paralysis. Most children diagnosed with INAD pass on before reaching ten years of age, as there is no cure or treatment to help slow down this very progressive and terminal disease. Ainsley passed away in 2016 at the age of 13, but not before she completed over 100 races, including nearly 20 half-marathons.

Sacramento's chapter of Ainsley's Angels is in its third year, founded and directed by Russ Howell – the organization uses the title “ambassador” rather than chapter president.

Howell identifies as a life-long endurance athlete. He

undertook his first 100 mile bike ride at 12, ran track in high school, and stayed in shape in his adult life through a stint in the Army where he was a member of a COLT team deployed to Kosovo. In 2010, Howell and his wife had a son born with serious medical complications and he stopped participating in endurance activities. When his son passed away shortly before his second birthday, Howell got back into running as form of escape and therapy. Running helped him keep centered and deal with grief.

A year later, Howell's second child was born. As a baby shower gift, his family pitched in and got him a very nice running stroller. From then on,

Howell, now an accountant, put in twenty to thirty miles a week with his son. Time passed, and eventually his son grew too big to fit in strollers, but Howell was eager to keep up with his running. One day, Howell came across an article on Ainsley's Angels in Running World, and sent an email to the president of the organization. Sacramento has a vibrant running vibe, with many races in the area, he told her. It would be a great area for the organization to expand and a perfect way for him to take his running to the next level and give something back.

Howell started the new Sacramento chapter from ground zero and began fundraising, recruiting members, reaching

out to race directors, and getting the Ainsley's Angels name out to local hospitals and care centers. Thanks to Howell's connections within the racing community and the people he met while caring for his first son's health complications, the group was immediately accepted and progress quickly snowballed. Today there are close to 200 members, ranging from as young as five years old to two adult riders who are in their thirties. The group has also raised enough money to purchase eleven racing chairs for its riders to keep and use with their families.

“Ainsley's Angels taught me that you don't need to run, or even walk, to be an athlete,” says adult rider Emily Crosgrove. “What's more important is having the will to get out there.”

The organization provides a 100% free service to the disabled community, which is no easy feat – racing chairs can coast nearly \$5,000. There are three levels of chairs which vary depending on the age, size, and disability of

the rider. Every chair has three wheels and a fixed front wheel, which provides stability and keeps the chairs from going off course.

“The smiles, the celebration, the joy, that's what it's all about,” says Howell. “To see that level of excitement for people that would never be able to experience a race, showing up to the something like the California International marathon (one of Ainsley's partners) surrounded by 10,000 amazing athletes. It takes them out of their world.”

Sacramento's Angels are set to run their first ultra-marathon in November, the 200-mile Napa RAGNAR relay that runs from SF up the coast and back down to finish in Napa. Six athletes and two riders will participate.

“There's no better feeling than the wind in my hair as I glide through a sea of fast moving bodies, encouraging staggers to never give up,” Crosgrove added. “If myself and my team could be out there on the road, then *anything* is possible.” ★

"The talk was fabulous," said Patty Benkel, who attended with her husband Rudy. "He could have talked forever." The couple returned for Saturday's Mather reunion event, enjoyed Dave's Dawgs, talked with Col. Robert Martinelli, artist Vincent Bode, and shared their story with others while sitting outside where forties-era swing and big band music provided the exhibit's aural element.

"I was here at the end," said Rudy Benkel, who served as Mather's chief dentist. "I came in with the idea of being a pilot, then of being a navigator, then returned to school."

Visitors with and without Mather ties visited the exhibit, sometimes quietly reflecting in front of a display of photographs or artifacts, sometimes listening to others share their stories. Young Matthew Fabretti who nibbled on chips while exploring the exhibit with his dad John wants to be a pilot. Others dropped in while on the way to somewhere else, perhaps lured by the sight of Dave's Dawgs. The complimentary chips, drinks, and hot dogs were enjoyed inside and outside of the MACC.

Cheryl Gleason, Cordova Community Council's events specialist, seemed to be everywhere at the same time. She handed out free Dave's Dawgs tickets, chatted with folks, and explained to visitors that the exhibit moves along the wall through the gallery and pointed to a good starting place. Panels highlight time periods, accomplishments, and emphasize the work of women and artists like Wayne Thiebaud and Vincent Bode.

Bode, whose work is displayed next to a panel discussing Thiebaud's nose art, gave an impromptu talk about his 1964 watercolor painting of the view from his position in Mather's air traffic control tower. "This was done during one of the last shifts I had before I got out," he said.

There is another painting hanging at City Hall.

Bode came to Mather from New York when he was eighteen and said "I was flying a Cessna 150 before I drove a car."

A quiet man wearing a fisherman hat, it's hard to imagine that he might have been a bit of a rabble rouser, but Airman Vincent Bode was when he created "The Professionals," a comic strip that, in his words, "made fun of the SAC," referring to Strategic Air Command.

"The SAC sacked me," he said. "I was young at the time."

One of the day's many visitors was Jim Dale who served as an instructor at Mather in the 1980s. Dale brought several items from his personal collection – a helmet, sextant, pair of bomber dividers, and a T43 model airplane – to loan to the exhibit. Items were presented to Cheryl Gleason and Shelly Blanchard.

Gerald and Masae Corbett, Ron Gehlen, Ricky Davis, and Manual Jaramillo were among some of the visitors who'd been stationed at Mather. Corbett was at Mather in 1965 and Gehlen served from 1963 to 1966. Blending in with the local visitors reminiscing and reflecting

was a family visiting from Kansas City.

Interest in the exhibit ranged from those who recalled their days at Mather to younger visitors interested in the history of WWII. Impromptu talks popped up throughout the gallery, moved outside to the patio, then back inside.

"This is a great exhibit for Rancho Cordova to know about Mather," said docent Virginia Johnston.

The exhibit closes on September 15 with a talk at noon by George Hudson, a Rancho Cordova resident and original Tuskegee Airman, and Col. James Crump, Jr. at noon. On Friday evening at 5:45 p.m., the MACC will present a special viewing of The Tuskegee Airmen starring Lawrence Fishburne.

"Century of Service – 100th Anniversary of Mather Field" closes September 15 at 5 p.m. The gallery will be open three days each week on Thursday, Friday, and Saturday. Gallery and event hours vary.

Being able to provide hands-on education to children at the Airshow can open the doors for their future. We had good coverage on many of the local TV stations.

As I drive through Rancho Cordova, there are finally a few trees whose leaves are beginning to change to the autumn colors. The sun is rising later and going down sooner, and we begin looking around to find our warmer fall and winter clothes, which I know I put in a good place so I wouldn’t

## Local Area Centurion Genevieve Sinclair Honored by General John A. Sutter Chapter, NSDAR

**RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG)** - The General John A. Sutter Chapter, Sacramento, National Society Daughters of the American Revolution (DAR), is pleased to honor 58-year chapter member Genevieve Glock Sinclair as she celebrates her 100th birthday this October.

Genevieve joined DAR in 1961 in her home chapter in Columbus, Platte County, Nebraska. Encouraged by her father to join DAR, Genevieve traced and documented her lineage to American Revolutionary Patriot Peter Bobb who served under Captain Andrew Stewart and Colonel Robert Elder in the Lancaster County, Pennsylvania 10th Battalion Militia. Genevieve’s sister, Naomi Ficke, was also a member of DAR.

Born in the small farming community of Rising City, Nebraska, Genevieve grew up with two siblings: one brother and one sister. Upon graduation from high school, she graduated from Midland University in Fremont, Nebraska, earning a degree in both commerce and English. After teaching for a time in Bristow, Nebraska, Genevieve decided to move to a larger city, Torrington, Wyoming, where she worked as a teacher, and eventually held the position of secretary to the school district superintendent.

Genevieve met her husband, Kenneth Sinclair, in Nebraska where he was working for her uncle. Kenneth had grown up in an orphanage and was eventually invited by her uncle to work on his farm for a summer church project. Upon graduation from high school, Kenneth returned to work on her uncle’s farm for a short time prior to enlisting in the United States Army during World War II. It was at this point that Genevieve and Kenneth made the decision to write to each other, which blossomed into a classic tale of World War II romance. Prior to

his being shipped overseas to serve, Genevieve and Kenneth were married in South Carolina on 4-4-44, a date she noted was one that was always easy for her husband to remember.

After the war, the couple resided in Nebraska until their move to Rancho Cordova in 1966. Genevieve transferred her DAR membership to the General John A. Sutter Chapter in 1968 where she held the position of Chapter Recording Secretary prior to serving a two-year term as Chapter Regent from 1973 to 1975.

During their 54 years of marriage, the couple raised four children at their Rancho Cordova home: David, Philip, Kay and Kent. Genevieve has also been blessed with five grandchildren, thirteen great-grandchildren, and four great-great grandchildren. Kenneth passed away in April of 2000. Of all her lifelong accomplishments, Genevieve is most proud of her family.

When asked what advice she would give to young people in this day and age, Genevieve stated that she would remind them to listen to their parents,

and to seek God and have communication with Him.

On the subject of her 100th birthday, she attributes her longevity to good genes and heritage, noting that she had an Aunt that lived to the age of 104, and a Grandmother who lived to age 103.

“Faith in God is paramount. Faith combined with positive attitude is also a major component for a long and productive life,” Genevieve stated when asked what advice she would give for healthy living. “Genes and clean living do play a part but you also have to have a sense of humor, good attitude, and always look for the best in people,” she added. Genevieve continued by quoting one of her mother’s favorite sayings. “There is a little bit of good in the worst of us, and a little bit of bad in the best of us,” a very wise mantra for all to consider.

Genevieve Sinclair is truly an inspiration and a special gift to all who have had the pleasure of knowing her.

The Value of Quantity over Quality

**SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)** - The most common criticism of major big-budget video game studios is their reliance on repetitive, unoriginal filler. Ubisoft, in particular, has become synonymous with their game-world maps filling up with copy-and-paste icons, each indicating a meaningless collectible or busy-work sidequest. To complete these tasks, so goes the classic critique, is to be reduced from elite soldier, ancient assassin, or (insert video game avatar here), to little more than an errand runner for wealthy studio executives who care only about writing “50 hours of gameplay!” on the back of the box. Quality, the gaming community screams, is always preferable to quantity. But as my life has progressed from middle schooler (when I first started writing this column), to high schooler, to now college student with a job, these filler distractions in big-budget games have begun to take on increasing value. I find myself struggling to progress through *God of War*, the newest blockbuster extravaganza (and likely universal Game of the Year winner), instead returning

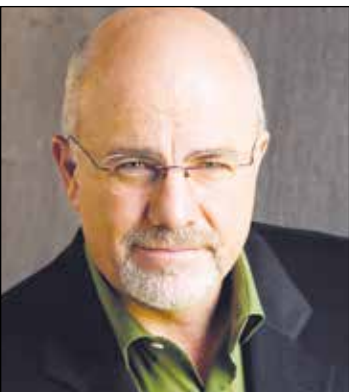
again and again to *Mass Effect: Andromeda*, a mediocre 2016 release, to complete a few of the menial tasks that for so long I despised. As I slowly shift into the world of adult commitments, I simply have less time and less mental energy to invest in a sprawling, dramatic, tightly-constructed cinematic story like *God of War*. Though the dynamic between that game’s two main characters (a father and a son) is irrefutably engaging, I prefer to spend my limited relaxation time exploring *Mass Effect: Andromeda*’s familiar planetscape than investing in *God of War*’s emotionally heavy intra-family drama. As such, these pieces of busywork drivel that I have, for so long, seen as a blight upon otherwise competent games have taken on new meaning and new importance. The value in games, now, has shifted from their immense storytelling potential to simple escapism, a way to temporarily project my brain out of the worries of this world and occupy it with the trivialities of another. The simple ability to exist in these spaces, even for short spurts of time, is what matters, especially

because the multi-hour blocks of free time necessary for story-based experiences have become increasingly rare. As a result, I finally understand why Ubisoft-esque games are so popular with adult gamers whose tastes, supposedly, are refined enough to know what they’re missing. As the gaming hobby slowly gives way to other commitments, quantity is as good as quality when it comes to the primary reason why most people play video games: to, for a short time, inhabit another body and visit another world.

**VIGILANTE “PEPPERMINT” BRUTAL REVENGE STORY; “YOU” ON TV**

**PEPPERMINT (Rated R)**

Long ago, Charles Bronson perfected the righteous vigilante in “Death Wish.” In recent times, we have had Liam Neeson in the “Taken” series and Denzel Washington in “The Equalizer” films to pick up the mantle of heroes exacting revenge on stereotyped bad guys.

“Peppermint” brings a new twist to this genre in that a strong female character gets into the action of meting out personal justice. Jennifer Garner, who showed her action chops in the TV show “Alias,” mirrors what Liam Neeson brought to his action hero role in “Taken.”

Garner’s Riley North, a working mother living in a Los Angeles suburb with her husband Chris (Jeff Hephner) and young daughter Carly (Cailey Fleming), has a life that seems fairly typical of the average family.

Chris, who runs an auto repair shop, is looking to get ahead financially on an unfortunate deal that would put him in the crosshairs of a Mexican drug cartel. Backing out of an ill-advised scheme comes too late for him.

Near the Christmas holiday on an outing to a local carnival, Chris is gunned-down in a hail of machine gun fire, while Carly is also caught in the crossfire, all of it happening while Riley witnesses the tragedy.

The justice system fails Riley in epic fashion when her identification of three gang members in court gets tossed by a corrupt judge. Only two LAPD detectives seem to have taken her interest for justice to heart.

Disappearing for five years, Riley returns to Los Angeles as an avenging angel seeking street justice. During her absence she trained in martial arts and all sorts of weaponry to become the female equivalent of Jason Statham.

The three thugs that got off scot-free are found hanging from a Ferris wheel and the corrupt lawyers are also dispatched. It doesn’t take long then for the detectives (John Ortiz and John Gallagher, Jr.) to figure out that Riley North is back in town with a vengeance.

While the crooked judge is confronted to a brutal demise, Riley’s primary focus is going after the cartel operation of Diego Garcia (Juan Pablo Raba), who was responsible for the hit placed on her husband.

To sum up what takes place, suffice to say that Riley goes on a rampage through the cartel’s warehouse and Garcia’s heavily-armed estate with the kind of shootings and explosions that Keanu Reeves employed to take out his adversaries in “John Wick.”

“Peppermint” is almost certain to offend the sensibilities of pretentious critics who object to brainless vigilante violence.

It’s no coincidence that the film is directed by Pierre Morel, the director behind “Taken.” This means that “Peppermint” is designed for the same audience and not for the art-house crowd.

Whether “Peppermint” turns out to be your flavor or not

depends on how you may have reacted to other films in the same genre. It does check all the boxes for an action-filled revenge fantasy.

**“YOU” ON LIFETIME**

Obsession is nothing new to the type of dramas, whether in movies or series, that are the staple of the Lifetime Channel. “You” delivers a ten-part series that explores the dangers of dating in the social media age.

The basic story is the twisted courtship of a seemingly mild-mannered manager of a Manhattan used bookshop specializing in rare editions and a poetry grad student who happens to be browsing the shelves.

Penn Badgley’s Joe Goldberg, exuding an outgoing charm, finds Elizabeth Lail’s attractive Guinevere Beck looking through the stacks for literature of interest and he is immediately smitten.

His notice piqued by her perky nature, Joe wastes no time

checking her out through social media, discovering that she goes by her last name and hangs out with snooty friends at local bars.

In fairly short order, by stalking like a perverted voyeur, he spies on the ground-floor apartment where the large windows allow a peak into Beck’s private life, noticing that her boyfriend appears motivated solely by a booty call.

Things turn disturbing and unnerving very quickly when Joe tricks Beck’s sleazy boyfriend Benji (Lou Taylor Pucci), an obnoxious rich-boy promoting a brand of artisanal soda, into the soundproof basement of the bookstore.

Not having gone deep into the series, I am just wondering what fate awaits the lecherous professor who put the moves on Beck during an after-work meeting to discuss her position as a teaching assistant. Whatever the case, “You” looks to have a lot of surprises in store. ★
