RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - With 12 neighborhood parties across the city, National Night Out 2018 proved to be another success for community groups and police who team up each year to hold

The Grapevine stopped in at one large party last week--hosting dozens of neighbors in the Lincoln Village neighborhood--organized by the It Takes a Lincoln Village group.

One ITLV organizer, Sheri Rush, said she's been holding block parties on National Night Out for at least 20 years in the places she's lived.

"When we first joined (ITLV), National Night Out was suggested as one of our first

projects," she said.

National Night Out is a campaign that started in the 1970s, but took its current form in 1984 with block parties becoming

a major way to bring neighbors together, often driven by neighborhood watch groups and police. In this way, National Continued on page 3

It's Back to School Safety Month

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) -

It's that time of year again when children wrap up their summer vacations and get ready to start the new school year. August is Back to School Safety Month, and the California Office of Traffic Safety (OTS) wants to remind parents, caregivers and roadway users to be extra cautious around schools.

It is a busy time for a lot of families who are handling back-toschool preparations, but that should not take away from the importance of making sure children are safe heading to school.

"Children are our future," OTS Director Rhonda Craft said. "We all need to do our part to provide a safe environment for children to get to and from school. It starts with being alert and aware, and exercising good roadway habits around schools."

OTS offers a few safety tips:

Parents

- Plan your route ahead of time. · Always keep an eye out for
- children.
- · Avoid driving distractions.
- If your child is biking or walking to school, map out the safest route. Teach them about traffic signals and signs, urge them to not wear earbuds and to stop and look both ways before using crosswalks.
- If your child takes the bus, remind them to line up five steps away from the curb and to always look out for cars.
- Always buckle up. Be aware of school buses.
- Overhead flashing yellow lights mean you should prepare to stop, hazards flashing yellow lights means drive with caution and overhead flashing red lights means stop. The law requires you to stop from either direction until children are safely across the street and the red lights stop flashing.

Everyone

- Always use the crosswalk at an intersection with a stop light or
- Turn down the volume on your earbuds and don't text while walking.
- Stop, look, listen, then cross.
- Obey all traffic laws.

Tips for Cleaning Your Property of Wildfire Ash

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) -

The Sacramento area has been surrounded this summer by wildfires and the effects have been smoky skies and falling ash. Breathing the bad air has been tough enough, but what's

been falling from the sky is adding another environmental problem for our waterways.

Ash contains wood and vegetation, but also chemicals from homes and other buildings caught up in the flames

then sent adrift to fall over the Sacramento region. We can help keep more from ending up in the water by being careful about how we remove the ash on our property.

If ash covers your home,

walkway or vehicle, avoid breaking out the hose and washing it down gutter. That untreated ash can pollute the storm drains and eventually the creeks and rivers. Sweeping up the ash from around your home and depositing it in your trashcan is the best way to remove the pollutants.

When it comes to cleaning your vehicles, you should get rid of the ash on your vehicle as soon as possible because it can harm the paint. Taking your vehicle to a carwash will keep wastewater out of the storm drain system by diverting the wastewater to the sanitary sewer system or to a landscaped area where it will not pollute our creeks, rivers and waterways.

County Enters Agreement for EV Charging at SMF



Several locations throughout the county have been identified as prime locations for EV charging stations, including Sacramento International Airport, a crucial component of the regional transportation infrastructure.

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)

- The Sacramento County Board of Supervisors approved an agreement with Electrify America, LLC (EA) to install and operate up to eight electric plug-in vehicle charging stations near the ARCO AM-PM gas station at the entrance to Sacramento International Airport.

"With today's approval, the County is adopting stateof-the-art solutions to reduce greenhouse gas emissions," said Supervisor Susan Peters, Chair.

The fee-based DC fast-chargers are envisioned to serve as EV filling stations. Customers can use a credit card to charge most electrical vehicle batteries up to 80 percent in 20 minutes.

Several locations throughout the county have been identified as prime locations for EV charging stations, including Sacramento International Airport, a crucial component of the regional transportation

infrastructure.

"I hear more and more from constituents who want the convenience of charging their electric vehicles at Sacramento International Airport," said Supervisor Phil Serna, District 1, and California Air Resources Board member. "Today's action by the Board of Supervisors goes a long way to make that happen."

Sacramento International Airport currently has 12 Level 2 EV chargers and 12 level 1 chargers in the parking garage that serves both terminals, and four Level 2 chargers and one legacy paddle (for older EVs) in the daily lot. There is no fee to use the chargers.

The airport also leases space to SMUD in the Free Waiting Area for one DC fast charger and two Level 2 chargers, which are fee-based.

Charging stations are expected to be operational within 1-2 years.

approaching, and it's the time when many begin pre-winter outdoor projects. Whether it's small like planting a tree, a larger one like building a deck or fence, or a big project such as new landscaping, be sure to include a very important safety step prior to starting any digging job.

Notify Underground Service Alert North 811 (USA) a minimum of two full business days before beginning to dig to find out if there are any dangerous underground utilities such as electric power lines in the area.

Whether you are doing the job yourself or hiring a professional, smart and safe digging means calling 811 or visiting usanorth811. org to request a utility-locate before each job; using the website for your notification can save time. The notification is valid for 28 days, so if the excavation project goes beyond this timeframe, notify USA North 811 again.

SMUD and other area utilities such as gas, water and cable television will be contacted to determine whether they have underground marked at the excavation site. Underground utility lines are not always located in the street; some utilities may be located in front yard and backyard easements. Digging into an underground electrical line can cause power outages and personal injury or death.

Be aware, it is the law to notify USA North 811 before you dig. Besides the legal requirement, it's the way to stay safe and avoid financial and legal responsibility for repairs and/or injuries.

- When it comes to fiscal responsibility, the City of Rancho Cordova continues to practice strong governmental financial reporting with the goal of reporting finances accurately and transparently. This commitment by the city ensures that residents have access to how and where their money is being spent and this pledge has not gone unnoticed.

The Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in

Financial Reporting has been awarded to the City of Rancho Cordova for the 2016-2017 Fiscal Year by the Government Finance Officers Association of the United States and Canada (GFOA) for its comprehensive annual financial report (CAFR). The Certificate of Achievement is seen as the highest form of recognition in the area of governmental accounting and financial reporting.

The CAFR is judged by an impartial panel to meet the high standards of the program, which includes demonstrating a constructive "spirit of full

disclosure" to clearly communicate its financial story.

"Fiscal responsibility continues to be a fundamental objective for the City of Rancho Cordova and this recognition is a source of pride for the city," says Kim Juran-Karageorgiou, Administrative Services Director. RS-25 Engine Tests Modernization Upgrades


With NASA Administrator James "Jim" Bridenstine in attendance, Aerojet Rocketdyne marked a significant milestone in efforts to reduce costs on the RS-25 engine that powers NASA's new rocket, the Space Launch System (SLS), this week at NASA's Stennis Space

The occasion was a hot-fire test of an RS-25 development engine where its main combustion chamber (MCC), the very heart of the engine, was fabricated using a bonding technique called hot isostatic pressing (HIP), an innovative manufacturing process that saves considerable time and money over more traditional methods. Initial test data indicates the chamber performed flawlessly during the 319-second test, which represents the anticipated SLS flight profile.

Each SLS is powered by four RS-25 engines. Currently, the SLS program has 16 engines in its inventory remaining from the space shuttle, enough for four flights. New flight controllers are being made for these engines and today's development engine tested another flight controller to certify it is ready for integration with a flight engine. Engines produced for later flights will incorporate additional manufacturing updates to reduce costs for certain parts of the engine.

"As we develop a new generation of RS-25 engines, ensuring they continue to remain reliable while reducing costs is a major focus at Aerojet Rocketdyne," said Eileen Drake, Aerojet Rocketdyne CEO and president. "That's why we're working hard to drive down costs on the RS-25 by incorporating the most modern and efficient manufacturing techniques."

Aerojet Rocketdyne is under contract to manufacture an initial set of six new engines for future SLS missions. These

new engines will be fabricated using the components and techniques that are being validated now on development engines at Stennis. The test today also marked the fifth successful demonstration of an additively manufactured Pogo Accumulator Assembly. The "Pogo" is a critical component that dampens potential engine propellant pressure oscillations that can cause a rocket to become unstable in flight. The 3-D printed Pogo, which is about the size of a beach ball, continued to perform as designed during the test series, bringing the promise of further RS-25 cost savings via additive

manufacturing closer to reality. A HIP-bonded MCC is the latest component developed under the new engine contract to enter hot-fire testing. The HIP-bonding technique employs high pressure and heat to create bonds between engine details that can withstand extremely high stress applications. In the case of the RS-25 MCC, where the engine's "smoke and fire" initiates, that means withstanding combustion temperatures exceeding

6,000 degrees Fahrenheit and pressures over 3,000 psi.

"The HIP-bonded MCC is the single largest affordability improvement being incorporated into the new RS-25 engines," continued Drake. "It cuts in half both the cost and fabrication cycle time compared to the heritage Space Shuttle Main Engines. HIP bonding is also an extremely robust and predictable process, which greatly reduces process variation."

HIP-bonded combustion chambers are flying today on Aerojet Rocketdyne's RS-68A engines, the booster engine for United Launch Alliance's Delta IV satellite-launching workhorse. The process was also successfully validated during the J-2X upper stage and the X-33 Linear Aerospike engine development programs.

"We were incredibly honored to have Administrator Bridenstine witness an RS-25 engine and see first-hand the affordability initiatives we are undertaking with this engine and program," added Drake.



When we became a city in 2003, one of the first things we did that first year was to remove over 600 abandoned, trashed and stripped cars with old tags. The tags on many of the cars were there so long that you couldn't read them anymore. One of the most helpful things that helped that first year was the calls we received from our residents. They let us know where the abandoned cars were so the City could make sure they were towed away. Sometimes, the cars were right out in the open, but having a person point them out really helped. We have all had examples in which someone or something can be right out in front of you, like keys for example, and yet you can't "see" them. The moral of the story is that the people of our City are the eyes of our City in many ways. It helps tremendously when the information they have is passed on to their City so it, whatever it is, can be taken care of.

And another thing that we all have to remember is for residents to do their part of the job and call Republic Services at (916) 638-9000 when they have bulky items to pick up in front of their home. The trash will just sit there sometimes while the resident simply waits for the City to notice the pile and then pick it up. It doesn't work that way in Rancho Cordova. The bulky items pile isn't supposed to be outside of the home any longer than 24 hours. We notice when it takes much longer than that and people go through the pile during the night spreading it out on the street. And then others begin to add more stuff to the pile. You can have three free bulky item pickups

during the year, and that's just part of the regular bill. Just a reminder.

I had a friend drop by the other day, and during our conversation, we talked about the heat, smoke and fires that are affecting so many people in California. The fires are becoming more controlled recently, but let's hope they will be done soon. But, you might look up at the sky anyway, and maybe you'll see a shooting star. Good luck.

Environmentalists Are Lying About How Green Their Money Is

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)

- Some of America's most prominent environmentalist groups are secretly investing in oil and natural gas, even as they publicly push groups to divest from fossil fuels. That's the takeaway from an explosive new report from NBC.

These organizations aren't merely hypocritical -- they're actively harming the environment. By urging others to deprive energy firms of capital, environmentalists are ironically delaying the transition away from less environmentally friendly coal-fired power plants towards cleaner, natural-gas powered ones.

Green groups have long trumpeted their supposed divestment from fossil fuels.

In a public statement released in December 2015, the World Wildlife Fund praised investors who join "the global chorus saying enough is enough when it comes to dirty energy."

The American Museum of Natural History in New York City, which boasts a \$617 million endowment, has "formally requested that all of its investment managers take

change issues into account when reviewing their current investments."

The museum has said it eliminated direct investments in fossil fuel companies and reduced its overall fossil fuel investment from 4 percent to less than 2 percent of its endowment.

The Paradise Papers, a cache of more than 13 million leaked documents detailing shady offshore finance activity, tell a different story. The museum was selling snake oil to its donors.

According to the papers, the museum's 2 percent figure fails to account for its \$5 million pledge to private equity firm Denham Capital's "Fund V," which plowed money into fracking ventures in Ohio and Pennsylvania, as well as fossilfuel projects abroad.

Who else has a significant position in Denham V? You guessed it -- the World Wildlife

It's no mystery why these environmentalist groups continue to invest in oil and natural gas. The price of oil is currently near a three and a half year high, which has sent oil stocks skyrocketing. Analysts expect major gains in earnings per share.

Thanks to improved drilling techniques such as fracking, the United States is now the world's largest producer of petroleum and natural gas. Oil and natural gas companies support 10.3 million American jobs and contributing \$1.3 trillion to the U.S. economy.

In short, there's no way to Examiner.

environmental and climate reap the full benefits of investing in the American economy without at least dabbling in energy stocks. Even environmentalist institutions whose green bona fides require them to deny it.

The movement to disinvest from oil and natural gas firms -or at least pretend to -- has been spreading. Under activist pressure, institutions from Harvard University to the Field Museum in Chicago have pledged to rid themselves of these assets.

The irony is that the oil and natural gas industry itself has been responsible for a massive reduction in carbon emissions in recent decades. Now that fracking has boosted natural gas production and driven down prices, it's far cheaper to build and operate power plants that run on natural gas instead


Natural gas produces nearly 50 percent fewer carbon emissions than coal. Thanks to the natural gas boom, overall U.S. greenhouse gas emissions are at their lowest level in 25 years.

This production boom is enriching everyday Americans. By 2025, the average household will save \$3,500 per year as a result of lower natural gas



California Wildfires Caused by Radical **Environmentalists, Not Climate Change**

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) -

The United States Forest Service was originally founded to protect forests from the ravages of fire to preserve it for future generations. That thinking was abandoned in favor of the flawed "no-use movement," or the "rewilding" theory, which blames humans for the "degradation of our planet." "Rewilding the land can repair damage we've caused and reconnect us to the natural world," National Geographic claims.

For decades, traditional forest management was scientific and successful - that is until ideological, preservationist zealots wormed their way into government and began the 40-year overhaul of sound federal forest management through abuse of the Endangered Species Act

In my recent interview with Rep. Tom McClintock, he stated:

"Our forests are now catastrophically overgrown, often carrying four times the number of trees the land can support. In this stressed and weakened condition, our forests are easy prey for drought, disease, pestilence and fire. The U.S. Forest Service used to be a profitable federal agency," McClintock said. "Up until the mid-1970s, we managed our National Forests according to well-established and time-tested forest management practices."

"But 40 years ago, we replaced these sound management practices with what can only be described as a doctrine of benign neglect," McClintock said. "Ponderous, Byzantine laws and regulations administered by a growing cadre of ideological zealots in our land management agencies promised to 'save the environment.' The advocates of this doctrine have dominated our law, our policies, our courts and our federal agencies ever since."

Today, only privately managed forests are maintained through the traditional forest management practices: thinning, cutting, clearing, prescribed burns, and the disposal

McClintock said the forest service used to auction surplus timber harvested from national forests. This served two purposes: clearing, cleaning, and thinning the forest, and providing usable timber for a myriad of industries. The timber the forest service auctioned off more than paid for the entire federal agency, and then

some. Local governments even rules and guidelines, adding received 25 percent of the proceeds of the lumber auctions, while 75 percent went to the federal government.

"Revenues that our forest management agencies once produced - and that facilitated our forest stewardship - have all but dried up," McClintock said. This has devastated rural communities that once thrived from the forest economy.

Mcclintock Said There Were Once 147 Timber Mills; Now, There Are Only 29 in the Country

McClintock also pointed out that despite the growing population, visitation to national forests has declined significantly as the health of our forests has decayed. "We can no longer manage lands to prevent fire or even salvage dead timber once fire has destroyed it," he said.

Private forests are still managed properly, but not forests on public lands.

That sound practice grounded to a halt when the most radical environmentalists took over. Now thick, overgrown and diseased forests have become tinder boxes and are burning down in California, leaving a trail of death and destruction.

What Happened?

In 2012, the Obama administration issued a major rewrite of all of the country's forest

so many rules, regulations and layers of bureaucracy, grounding all forest management to a halt. McClintock said that to even cut one tree down in the national forest, forest managers were forced to apply to the federal government for a study. The other big problem is these burdensome regulatory requirements greatly inflate the cost of forest management, McClintock said. "Between the studies and litigation, the process was endless," McClintock added.

When forest managers attempted to address public lands ravaged by disease, beetles or fires, they were met with a wall of bureaucracy. "Public lands take years' worth of environmental review for studies," McClintock said. "By then, the timber has lost most of its commercial value. Essentially, the public land is abandoned. The laws make it cost prohibitive to salvage."

The Catastrophic Canard of Climate Change

Gov. Jerry Brown has spent a great deal of time jetting around the world spouting climate change propaganda, and now he calls these year-round wildfires California's "new normal."

Rep. McClintock pointed out the obvious: the same climate change impacts private lands as public lands, but private forests are not burning down because they are properly managed. Or if

a fire does break out on privately managed forest land, it is often extinguished more quickly and easily because the trees aren't so close together, and the underbrush has been cleared away.

We are now living with the result of radical environmentalism ideology - that we should abandon our public lands to overpopulation, overgrowth, and in essence, benign neglect, McClintock said. "Forest fires, fueled by decades of pent up overgrowth, are now increasing in their frequency and intensity and destruction."

He added, "Excess timber WILL come out of the forest in one of only two ways. It is either carried out or it burns out."

McClintock was able to pass legislation last year, which streamlined the environmental reviews for the Tahoe Basin. "The Forest Service regional manager told me it will take their review from 800 pages to 40 pages, and allow them to begin to get the forest there back to a sustainable level."

But meanwhile, California burns, while Jerry Brown claims these catastrophic infernos are "the new normal," blames climate change, declares a national emergency and collects billions of dollars from the American taxpayer in federal aid. No amount of money will ever fix California until they undo decades of dangerous climate change regulations and remove 129 million dead

Wait Time Scandal Shows DMV Still Doesn't Get It

- Benjamin Franklin famously said that there are only two things certain in life - death and taxes. In California, you could add a third - hatred of the DMV.

Anyone who has ever signed up for a driver's license or register a vehicle knows just how inefficient, and at times hostile, the DMV can be. They cling to outdated thinking, as if their primary mission is registering horse buggies to drive on California's roads.

The DMV is the poster child for an unaccountable government bureaucracy - and the current scandal over astronomical wait times at DMV offices shows they still don't get it. The federal REAL ID, enacted

in 2005, requires California to change its state-issued driver's licenses and ID cards to meet new federal requirements. By October 2020, every Californian will need a REAL ID to fly on an airplane or enter a federal government building. You must go to the DMV in person for ID verification before you can get one.

DMV wait times are Jean Shiomoto at a committee unbearable under normal circumstances. They are certainly ill-equipped to handle more than 23 million people expected to come through their doors through 2020.

Both Democrats and Republicans are outraged. They grilled DMV Director

The state has already given the DMV \$70 million in additional funds to open more offices, expand hours, and hire additional personnel to handle the influx. The DMV estimates it will need to spend over \$220 million over the next 6 years to process all the applications. That money clearly won't address the other problems identified in this week's hearings, namely the poor customer service culture and outdated/ inefficient thinking that goes into department operations.

Assemblyman Jim Patterson was fed up after receiving numerous angry complaints from constituents. He authored a request for the State Auditor to audit the DMV's activities and how they are spending

Patterson's audit would be one expenditure of public funds that's actually worth every penny. Taxpayers deserve to know just how bad things really are at the DMV and a nonpartisan audit is needed to document this and outline steps to reform the beleaguered agency and its operations.

Despite lawmakers showing their lack of confidence in Shiomoto's leadership, the audit request failed to get enough Senate Democrat votes to pass (the request needed 4 votes each from the Assembly and Senate), despite bipartisan votes in both houses. It's a shame that something both parties seemingly agree on falls victim to today's toxic political climate.

The DMV has long been overdue for a complete overhaul, and most important, an attitude adjustment. Hopefully, the Real ID wait time scandal will be the catalyst that forces much-need change upon a stubborn department clinging to the ways of the past.

The Curse of Gaming Nostalgia

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - The high level of nostalgia that flows through the video game world is rivaled only by antique stores, Star Wars, and drive-in diners. Because games were such an integral part of the childhoods of gaming's main age demographic (20-35 year olds), the industry is constantly looking to recapture the feelings of magic that were first unearthed on the Nintendo Entertainment System or Sega Genesis throughout the 80s and 90s. The issue, of course, is that nostalgia gilds reality, and most of the games of that era, by modern standards, range from bad to utterly unplayable.

The struggle to reconcile memory vs. reality has recently been embodied in Capcom's second collection of remastered. *Mega Man X* games and Square Enix's *Octopath Traveler*. The former fails entirely in its mission to revitalize the past, while the latter, despite it being an entirely new game and not a rehashed antiquity, is shockingly successful.

That's because the *Mega Man X* collection includes some downright terrible games, including some that were lambasted even at there original release, and does little to solve their numerous problems. Even some games that were decent at the time now feel dated, clunky, and unwieldy. Capcom was perhaps banking on its audience's nostalgia to pull the collection

over the sales targets, but as it stands, the few people who have actually purchased the collection have slammed it for its low quality.

But Octopath Traveler succeeds where Capcom failed. It doesn't copy the games it's based on (it contains updated graphical effects, modern quality-of-life gameplay improvements, and an innovative combat system), but it does preserve the experience at the core of the nostalgia with a style, in both art and design, that closely resembles the decadesold classics. In other words, despite the fact that it is objectively less genuine to its source material, it feels more accurate to play than the Mega Man X collection does.

Octopath appeals to our falsified memories, to what we thought playing those games as a child were like, rather than what they actually were like. Octopath is an idealized version of an older style of games, and so it feels consistent with our idealized memories. This simple insight often goes overlooked or forgotten among the dozens of developers pumping out arcadelike or classic-game-esque experiences, who often blindly follow authenticity towards reality rather than authenticity of experience. Those developers, unsurprisingly, fail more often than they succeed.

There are notable exceptions. *Axiom Verge* was a laser-precise spiritual remake of

Nintendo's *Metroid* from 1986, but that decision is only justified by Metroid's status as one of the few games of that era that remain agelessly fun to play today. And even then, *Axiom* utilizes the superior computing power of modern machines to create images and sounds that never would have been possible in Metroid, while still remaining loyal to its overall aesthetic.

Nevertheless, the exceptions make the rule, and nostalgiaoriented games, more often than not, fail to recognize the rough aging of their inspirational source material. Though even Octopath Traveler occasionally trips over itself in how loyal to stay to its source material (it includes, for example, the infamously annoying random enemy encounters that almost all modern games have moved past), it still serves as a well-made template for how to recapture the video game magic of childhood.

As an employer, if I've got a choice between the two, that's the one I want on my team!



Sacramento County DA Reports

Defendant Convicted of Sexually Assaulting 5 Year Old

DATE: July 30, 2018

CASE: Kevin Bailey (Case #15F03495) PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Monica Robinson, Special Assault & Child Abuse Unit

Kevin Bailey was convicted by a jury of two counts of committing forcible acts of child sexual assault on a child under 14 years of age.

From 2014 through 2015, Bailey sexually assaulted a friend's daughter when the child was 5 years old. DNA evidence corroborated the victim's descriptions of the assaults committed against her.

Bailey faces a maximum sentence of 20 years in prison. Sentencing is scheduled for August 22, 2018, in Department 41 before the Honorable Helena Gweon.

Felony Animal Cruelty Cases, One with Felony Domestic Violence

DATE: August 6, 2018

CASE: Ignatius Chavarria (Case #15F00622) & Tawuan Batiste (Case #18FE012950) **PROSECUTOR:** Deputy District Attorney Hilary

Bagley-Franzoia, Animal Cruelty Unit

Ignatius Chavarria was sentenced to 10 years in state prison after pleading to felony animal abuse as well as felony domestic violence. His plea involved his admission to committing a violent strike offense. After serving his prison sentence, Chavarria will be banned from owning, possessing, residing with, maintaining or caring for any animals for 10 years.

In 2013, Chavarria got upset with his girlfriend's 4-year-old neutered Maltese mix named "Tucker" because he had an accident in his crate after waiting in it to be relieved for several hours. Chavarria abusively scalded Tucker by holding him in a 143-degree hot shower, and then closing the door to confine him without a way to escape. Tucker suffered third-degree burns over 80% of his body. He was humanely euthanized the following day to end his suffering from the increasingly painful burns. Initially the case went unreported, but eventually a felony charge was filed. After bailing out on the animal abuse case, Chavarria reoffended by body slamming a female date onto concrete pavement. The victim sustained a broken hip, which required surgery. Chavarria's bail was increased, but not enough to avoid his bailing out a second time. After his second release, he again committed domestic violence on a different female victim.

Special appreciation is owed to DA Criminal Investigator Joyce Thorgrimson. Due to her limitless diligence and investigative skills, the

felony animal cruelty case was filed although it did not include the benefit of a forensic necropsy. Tucker's remains had already been cremated.

In the last 20+ years, statistics have been compiled showing that 71% of abused women report that their partners had killed, abused or threatened to abuse at least one of their animals. In a 2007 study, 12 different states in the U.S. reported that up to 48% of female domestic violence victims stay with their partner because they are worried about the safety of their companion animals.

Tawuan Batiste was sentenced to 180 days on felony animal abuse charges, and banned from owning, possessing or living with animals for the next 10 years.

In September 2017, Batiste beat a small dog to death after it urinated on his shoes. After the dog was seen bleeding from its mouth, Batiste carried the dog outdoors. He returned 15 minutes later carrying the nearly dead dog. The dog expired within seconds.

Although the abuse was reported that day, the owner buried her dog's remains in a public park. The dog was exhumed five months later by members of the Sacramento County Animal Abuse Task Force, which included Sacramento Sheriff's Detective Scott Brown and Sacramento County Animal Control Officers. While only a limited necropsy was conducted, it was enough to eliminate any natural cause of death and revealed a fresh rib fracture.

The public as well as veterinarians should be aware that abuse cases and evidence can be compromised unless the crime is reported in a timely manner. Veterinarians additionally have a mandatory duty to report animal abuse when they reasonably suspect it.

Defendant Sentenced for Murder of 16 Year Old

DATE: August 9, 2018

CASE: Mario Andreas Contreras (Case #15F03276)

PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Kevin Greene, Homicide Unit

The Honorable Michael Savage sentenced Mario Andreas Contreras to 50 years to life in prison. On April 23, 2018, a jury convicted Contreras of first-degree murder with use of a gun in the killing of Erik Ozee.

On May 31, 2015, Contreras approached a group of young people looking for Ozee, who he thought may have robbed him. Ozee ran from the group when Contreras asked for him. Contreras chased after Ozee and shot him in the head, killing him.
