RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - In early spring of this year, Patrick Larkin, the District Administrator for the Cordova Recreation and Park District, turned to community partner Rebecca Budge, a Program Assistant for the Folsom-Cordova Unified School District's Homeless Student Services, to find out what area youth need most.

Upon hearing the answer, the Cordova Recreation and Park District launched "We've Got Your Back," a backpack and underwear drive for elementary to high school aged youth. Last week, Cordova Recreation and Park District made their first delivery to Rebecca Budge, who will work to distribute donations to those that need them most. This first delivery included over 50 contributions made by a combination

of district residents and CRPD employees.

A number of teens, all members of the

HYDE Out Teen Center, also joined the "We've Got Your Back" effort. During their afterschool program, the teens personalized the district's plain collection containers, covering them with inspirational quotes, bright flowers and colorful designs.

# **ISIS Member** Arrested on **Eastern Avenue**

Held in Sacramento County Without Bail

#### SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - Last week the FBI arrested an ISIS member wanted for the mur-

der of an Iraqi police officer in June of 2014. The suspect, Omar Abdulsattar Ameem, 45, is also connected to other acts of terrorism and terrorist organizations. Federal Agents, with the aid of the Sacramento County Sheriff's Department and Metro Fire, raided an apartment in the Eastern Villa complex on Eastern Avenue on the morning of Wednesday, August 15.

"Ameen, originally of Rawah, in the Anbar province of Iraq, fled Iraq following the alleged murder, and later settled in Sacramento as a purported refugee," according to an official US Department of Justice release. "It is alleged that Ameen's family supported and assisted the installation of al-Qaeda in Iraq (AQI) in Rawah, and that Ameen was a member of AQI and ISIS. It is also alleged that he participated in various activities in support of those terrorist organizations, including helping to plant improvised explosive devices, and committing the murder that is the subject of the extradition request. Ameen concealed his membership in those terrorist groups when he applied for refugee status, and later when he applied for a green card in the United States."

The FBI Joint Terrorism Task Force has been investigating Ameen since 2016 for suspected violations, including fraud and misuse of visa, permits and other documents.

According to reports, Iraqi authorities want US officials to allow Ameen to be extradited back to his home country to face charges that could result in the death penalty. Ameen is currently being held in Sacramento County without bail and is seen as a flight risk and a danger to society.

# Six District Attorneys Unite to Consolidate Golden State Killer Case in Sacramento County

13 Additional Felony Counts of Murder with Special Circumstances Charges Filed

#### **SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG)**

- Sacramento County District Attorney Anne Marie Schubert announced today that the case against Joseph James DeAngelo, 72, Citrus Heights, will be prosecuted jointly in Sacramento County, where the defendant is being housed after his arrest on April 24, 2018. This joint prosecution will involve Contra Costa, Orange, Sacramento, Santa Barbara, Tulare, and Ventura Counties. An amended complaint charging all crimes together in one case, as well as 13 counts of kidnapping to commit robbery, was filed today in Sacramento Superior

DeAngelo now faces 13 felony counts of murder with special



circumstances allegations of multiple murders, murder during the commission of rape, robbery, and burglary. DeAngelo was charged today in an amended complaint with 13 felony counts of kidnapping

to commit robbery with sentencing enhancements for personal use of a firearm and personal use of a knife during the commission of the offenses. He faces a minimum sentence of life in state prison without the possibility of parole. DeAngelo is expected to appear in Sacramento County for arraignment on Thursday, August 23rd at 1:30 p.m. in Department 61.

In announcing this decision, District Attorney Schubert stated, "The joining of this case in one county is in the best interest of victims, the efficiency of the case and the fair administration of justice. I look forward to all counties working together collaboratively in seeking justice in this case."

# Multicultural Business Expo Relocates to Carmichael

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - Now in its ninth year, the Multicultural Business Expo has relocated to the Patriot Event Center at Milagro Centre on Fair Oaks Boulevard at Marconi Avenue. Olga Ivannikov, CFO of Russian American Media and the event's organizer, is excited about the new location. "The expo is going to be both outdoors with canopies and indoors with a hall filled with exhibitors," she said, adding that local restaurants, breweries, and wineries would be on hand with samples for hungry attendees and exhibitors.

More than 100 businesses and nonprofit agencies are expected to exhibit at this year's event, which, based on the event's continued growth, should draw more than 2,000 attendees from the greater Sacramento region. "This year we wish to make an emphasis on personal connections," she said. The face to face meeting is why the event draws so many people.

Some exhibitors will be familiar names throughout the region. SMUD's Supplier Emerging Enterprise Development (SEED) team will help small business owners learn about state certification and bid on SMUD contracts. "They'll provide an overview of our business contracting procedures and explain the SEED program in detail," said Chris Capra, SMUD's Public Information Specialist. Exhibiting at this business expo helps SMUD grow its pool of qualified potential contractors and helps business owners learn how to maneuver the state's certification program, a win-win for both. "SMUD also realizes reciprocal benefits by promoting the economic development of its customers who own the company," added Capra.

Other exhibitors, like Language World Services, Inc., may be less familiar. This translation and interpretation organization, located in Carmichael, provides services in more than 80 languages for healthcare, law enforcement, conferences, insurance, disaster preparedness, and many other areas. Job opportunities are available throughout the Sacramento region and San Francisco Bay Area.

Exhibitors will be on hand in three different areas. The business expo will feature government and corporate entities offering resources and contracting opportunities to small business owners. Joining SMUD will be Siemens, DGS, and others. Owners interested in business financing, presenting their products or services, investigating export opportunities, and reaching new customers should stop by with business cards.

Students and recent high school graduates may wish to peruse the educational opportunities area. Asher College, Sacramento Employment and Training Agency (SETA), Pacific Charter

Institute, and CSUS will be on hand with information about undergraduate programs, the transfer process for community college students, opportunities for working adults, and the all-important financial aid. The expo has grown each year and draws people from Sacramento County and surrounding areas. "We started out as a local community fair and grew into a major business exposition which is organized by a number of non-profits and all major chambers in the Sacramento valley," said Ivannikov. 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# **RCPD Welcomes New Motor Officers**

City of Rancho Cordova

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - The Rancho Cordova Police Department (RCPD) has three new motorcycle officers to support our community.

RCPD's Traffic Unit includes six motor officers whose focus is to enforce the vehicle code traffic laws, investigate serious and fatal traffic collisions. and assist patrol officers with traffic collision and driving under the influence investigations. The motor officers also respond to traffic complaints made by residents, proactively enforce bicycle and pedestrian laws, and provide traffic control for large community events.

RCPD is pleased to welcome three new motor officers to the Traffic Unit following the recent retirements of other officers. Two of these officers you may remember from the inaugural edition of The Dispatch when they graduated from motor school. Please help us welcome our new motor officers.

#### Officer Mark Baxter

Officer Mark Baxter began his law enforcement career in 1999 when he attended the Sacramento County Sheriff's Department Academy. Upon graduation, he became an officer with the Sacramento County Sheriff's Department and worked at the main jail and with Sacramento Regional Transit police.

Officer Baxter grew up in Rancho Cordova and attended Peter J. Shields Elementary, Mills Middle School and Cordova High School. When Rancho Cordova became a city in 2003, he joined RCPD as a patrol officer.

"I had lots of friends and family in the Rancho Cordova area," said Officer Baxter. "I wanted to play a role in ensuring Rancho Cordova was a safe and great community for everyone to live in."

Officer Baxter had always ridden motorcycles personally and decided to take a Sheriff's Motor Training Class in 2004. He then joined RCPD's Traffic Unit as a motor officer and served in that role until 2007.

Officer Baxter then served on the Problem Oriented Policing (POP) Unit for eight years. He often partnered with the Sacramento County Probation Department and City of Rancho Cordova's Code Enforcement team to address long-term public safety issues and properties with numerous

calls for service. The Unit also created the Christmas in Cordova program in partnership with the Folsom Cordova Community Partnership and other local organizations to support families in need during the holiday season.

In 2015, Officer Baxter had an opportunity to join the Investigations Unit and enjoyed learning the investigations side of law enforcement. However, he missed the opportunity to be out in the community and re-joined the Traffic Unit as a motor officer in 2018.

"It's an honor to be back serving the community as a motor officer," said Officer Baxter. "The motor team has always been a family to me, and I feel like I'm back with that family."

Officer Baxter also has been involved with the Rancho Cordova Police Activities League since its inception. He enjoys being able to make a difference, one child at a time.

After serving the majority of his law enforcement career in Rancho Cordova, Officer Baxter feels as if he's been able to play a role in serving his community.

"I became an officer because I wanted to help the community and enjoy interacting with people," said Officer Baxter. "Since incorporation, the city as a whole has improved and RCPD has always played a role in that by putting the community first."

#### Officer Ken Gouveia

Officer Ken Gouveia's grandfather was a Deputy for the Stanislaus County Sheriff's Department for 30 years, and he spent a lot of time at his

grandparents' house growing up. Due to his grandfather's example, Officer Gouveia knew he wanted to pursue a career in law enforcement at eight years old.

Officer Gouveia was taking courses at California State University, Sacramento when he decided to apply for the Sacramento County Sheriff's Department Academy. He attended and graduated from the Academy, and he became an officer with the Sacramento County Sheriff's Department in 2005. Officer Gouveia has worked at the Main Jail, North Patrol and East Patrol for the last 13 years.

Officer Gouveia always had an interest in doing motorcycle and traffic enforcement. In 2017, Officer Gouveia decided to go to the Sacramento Regional Drivers Training Facility's Basic Police Motor School class to get one step closer towards his goal. He graduated after completing 160 hours of pre-training and training to teach him how to safely ride a police motorcycle. In March 2018, Officer Gouveia joined RCPD's Traffic Unit as a motor officer.

"RCPD is unlike any other division in the Sacramento County Sheriff's Department," said Officer Gouveia. "Everyone is always happy and uplifting, both the people I work with and the residents who regularly wave to you when you're out in the community."

Officer Gouveia enjoys learning about a new spectrum of law enforcement as a motor officer that he wasn't familiar with before, including new procedures and laws.

"On top of it, who would not like to

have their job be on a motorcycle all day?" he said.

#### Officer Ron Sutter

Officer Ron Sutter came from a military family, and law enforcement was the closest career that didn't require him to move around. He also had a high school girlfriend whose dad was a former California Highway Patrol and often told him stories about his career. Both of these experiences influenced Officer Sutter to take criminal justice courses in college before applying for and attending the Sacramento County Sheriff's Department Academy in 1994.

Upon graduating from the Academy, he became an officer for the Sacramento County Sheriff's Department and served in various roles including the Rio Cosumnes Correctional Center, Main Jail, North Patrol, East Patrol and patrol in the Delta area.

His first experience with RCPD was on East Patrol in 2006 serving the unincorporated areas of Sacramento County. The Rancho Cordova Police Station houses officers serving both the City of Rancho Cordova and the East Division. After leaving to serve other communities, he was able to re-join East Patrol three years ago.

"I was born in Sacramento, and my dad was in the U.S. Air Force assigned to Mather Air Force Base," said Officer Sutter. "Our first house was in Rosemont. I am happy to now be working in the same area I grew up in."

In 2017, Officer Sutter had aspirations of working with the community as a motor officer. He decided to go to the Sacramento Regional Drivers Training Facility's Basic Police Motor School class to get one step closer towards his goal. He graduated after completing 160 hours of pre-training and training to teach him how to safely ride a police motorcycle. In March 2018, Officer Sutter joined RCPD's Traffic Unit as a motor officer.

"I am proud to be part of the Traffic Unit making a difference in the community," said Officer Sutter. "Each day, we are making people better drivers through traffic enforcement and getting drivers who are under the influence off the streets."

President Abraham Lincoln at the dedication at Gettysburg said, "The world will little note, nor long remember what we say here, but it can never forget what they did here." In it, Executive Vice President Phil Reed OBE said partially, "This mission grows increasingly important as the number of surviving heroes who fought and won World War II dwindles - and the memory of their remarkable deeds fade." and cemeteries were made to thank and remember the United States military that saved many countries and brought peace back to the world. There are, of course, many heroic things remembered by some for a while, but generations are replaced by new generations and many of those heroic events fade away. That is why remembering time, people and places are so important for the new generations to learn what the generation or two before them did and how it affects them. Maybe their own grandparents or great-grandparents did much more than they may ever know if they never ask.

Defendant Convicted for Murdering Jail Cellmate

**DATE:** August 16, 2018 **CASE:** Richard Russell Harden (Case #09F01356)

**PROSECUTOR:** Deputy District Attorney Satnam Rattu, Homicide Unit

Richard Russell Harden was convicted by a jury of the second-degree murder of Evaristo Ramirez and assault with a deadly weapon.

On February 16, 2009, Richard Harden walked into the Home Depot on Folsom Blvd. and attacked an employee with a hammer. Harden was booked into jail and placed in a cell with Evaristo Ramirez. The next day, Ramirez was found unresponsive in the cell. An autopsy revealed that Ramirez was strangled to death and had multiple blunt force injuries to his head and torso.

Harden faces a maximum sentence of 19 years to life in prison. Sentencing is set for September 14, 2018, at 9:00 a.m. in Department 19 before the Honorable Ernest Sawtelle.

#### Defendant Sentenced for Series of Armed Robberies

DATE: August 17, 2018
CASE: Taher Farraj (Case #17FE007880)
PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney
James Wax, Career Criminal Prosecution Unit

The Honorable Tami Bogert sentenced Taher Farraj to 31 years and 8 months in prison. On June 6, 2018, a jury convicted Farraj of three counts of robbery. The jury also found true gun use and intentional discharge of a firearm allegations. Prior to trial, Farraj pled to being a felon in possession of a firearm and being a felon in possession of ammunition.

On April 15, April 18 and April 24 of 2017, Farraj robbed the same convenience store on Fruitridge Road while armed. Farraj would either ask for change or make a purchase to get the clerks to open the cash register. He would then pull out a silver revolver and grab money from the registers. During one of the robberies, Farraj fired the gun off at the store ceiling. The three robberies were captured on surveillance cameras inside the store. A probation search of Farraj's residence and car revealed clothing that matched the clothes worn by the suspect during the robberies and a .22 caliber silver revolver, which was loaded with 6 rounds.

Farraj has prior convictions for being a felon in possession of a firearm and the sale/transport of marijuana.

### Gang Members Convicted of Gun Possession

**DATE:** August 20, 2018

CASE: Raheem Thomas, Adrien Hines, Isaiah Taylor (Case #18FE002528

**PROSECUTOR:** Deputy District Attorney Nicholas Johnson, Targeting Armed Recidivist Gang Enforcement Team (TARGET)

Raheem Thomas and Adrien Hines were convicted by a jury of being a felon in possession of a firearm with a gang enhancement. Isaiah Taylor was convicted of unlawful possession of a firearm with a gang enhancement.

On February 7, 2018, Sacramento County sheriff's deputies had information that Raheem Thomas had an outstanding warrant. When deputies contacted Thomas, he was in the driver's seat of a parked vehicle. When they went to remove Thomas from the vehicle, they found a semiautomatic handgun on the front passenger floorboard. The firearm was fully loaded with a round in the chamber. Thomas later stated that he was a gang member, but denied knowing about the firearm. Adrien Hines and Isaiah Taylor were with Thomas at the time. Hines later gave a statement that the gun will have his DNA and fingerprints on it, but denied owning, using or knowing it was in the vehicle. Deputies also found a firearm in Taylor's front left pocket. The firearm was fully loaded with a round in the chamber. Taylor later gave a statement admitting the gun was his, and that he was a gang member.

Additional allegations that Thomas has a prior 2016 conviction for carrying a concealed gun for the benefit of a criminal street gang and that Hines has a prior 2016 conviction for discharging a firearm at an unoccupied vehicle and a prior 2014 conviction for inflicting corporal injury on spouse will be determined at the sentencing hearing.

Thomas faces a maximum sentence of 17 years in prison. Hines faces a maximum sentence of 16 years in prison. Taylor faces a maximum sentence of 7 years in prison. Sentencing for Thomas and Taylor is set for September 12, 2018, at 9:00 a.m. Hines will be sentenced on October 5, 2018, at 9:00 a.m. Both sentencings will be in Department 39 before the Honorable David Abbott. ★

This individual is being sought as part of the FBI's Operation Rescue Me and Endangered Child Alert Program (ECAP) initiatives, both of which represent strategic partnerships between the FBI and the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children. Operation Rescue Me focuses on utilizing clues obtained through in-depth image analysis to identify the child victims depicted in child exploitation material, while ECAP seeks national and international media exposure of unknown adults (referred to as John/Jane Does) who visibly display their faces and/or other distinguishing characteristics in association with child pornography images. 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

# Incompetent CA DMV Had 13 Years to Implement Real ID Program

**SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG)** - Those incredibly long lines at California DMVs look more like the release of the iPhone X or ticket sales for Beyonce and JayZ. But they are not. People are stuck in long DMV lines just to renew and update their drivers licenses.

Yet the notorious California Department of Motor Vehicles is about to be rewarded for its ineptitude and failures by the California Legislature with an unlimited budget.

News outlets throughout the state have written about 4, 6, and even 8+ hour waits since the January implementation of the DMV's Real ID program

Republican Gubernatorial candidate John Cox has been traveling around the state visiting DMVs handing out bottled water and talking with the folks waiting in these long lines.

What's the problem at the California DMV besides plain old government

incompetence and arrogance?

#### Real ID Issues

The California DMV has had since 2005 to figure out how to implement the Real ID program.

But when the Department of Homeland Security announced that REAL ID enforcement would begin on February 5, 2018, California irresponsibly began its program, without a plan.

According to the Department of Homeland Security, "the REAL ID Act enacted the 9/11 Commission's recommendation that the Federal Government 'set standards for the issuance of sources of identification, such as driver's licenses.' Passed by Congress in 2005, The Act established minimum security standards for state-issued driver's licenses and identification cards and prohibits Federal agencies from accepting for official purposes licenses and identification cards from states that do not meet these standards."

So, despite having 13 years to implement a Real ID, as most other states already have, the California DMV asked for extension after extension — for 13 years. Then, they abruptly started issuing the Real ID in January –even though DHS has not yet approved California's

I contacted DHS and asked if the approval has not been granted because California issues California Drivers Licenses to illegal aliens under Assembly Bill 60, signed into law by Gov. Jerry Brown, because the California DMV has been spending vast amounts of resources on making sure illegal aliens have proper identification over California citizens being able to acquire the Real ID.

# **USDA Forest Service Announces New Strategy for Improving Forest Conditions**

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - "We commit to work more closely with The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) Forest Service (USFS) announced today a new strategy for managing catastrophic wildfires and the impacts of invasive species, drought,

and insect and disease epidemics. Specifically, a new report titled Toward Shared Stewardship across Landscapes: An Outcome-based investment Strategy(PDF, 3.7 MB) outlines the USFS's plans to work more closely with states to identify landscape-scale priorities for targeted treatments in areas with the highest payoffs.

"On my trip to California this week, I saw the devastation that these unprecedented wildfires are having on our neighbors, friends and families," said U.S. Secretary of Agriculture Sonny Perdue.

the states to reduce the frequency and severity of wildfires. We commit to strengthening the stewardship of public and private lands. This report outlines our strategy and intent to help one another prevent wildfire from reaching this level."

Both federal and private managers of forest land face a range of urgent challenges, among them catastrophic wildfires, invasive species, degraded watersheds, and epidemics of forest insects and disease. The conditions fueling these circumstances are not improving. Of particular concern are longer fire seasons, the rising size and severity of wildfires, and the expanding risk to communities, natural resources, and firefighters.

"The challenges before us require a

new approach," said Interim USFS Chief authorities created by the 2018 Omnibus Vicki Christiansen. "This year Congress has given us new opportunities to stand shoulder-to-shoulder with state leaders mitigate to identify land management priorities that include mitigating wildfire risks. We will use all the tools available to us to reduce hazardous fuels, including mechanical treatments, prescribed fire, and unplanned fire in the right place at the right time, to mitigate them."

A key component of the new strategy is to prioritize investment decisions on forest treatments in direct coordination with states using the most advanced science tools. This allows the USFS to increase the scope and scale of critical forest treatments that protect communities and create resilient forests.

The USFS will also build upon the

Bill, including new categorical exclusions for land treatments to improve forest conditions, new road maintenance authorities, and longer stewardship contracting in strategic areas. The agency will continue streamlining its internal processes to make environmental analysis more efficient and timber sale contracts more flexible.

The Omnibus Bill also includes a long-term "fire funding fix," starting in FY 2020, that will stop the rise of the 10-year average cost of fighting wildland fire and reduce the likelihood of the disruptive practice of transferring funds from Forest Service non-fire programs to cover firefighting costs. The product of more than a decade of hard work, this bipartisan solution will

ultimately stabilize the agency's operating environment.

Finally, because rising rates of firefighter fatalities in recent decades have shifted the USFS's approach to fire response, the report emphasizes the agency's commitment to a risk-based response to wildfire.

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




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

Ali Mollet takes the reins of the second-year women's basketball program, while the women's softball program is now under the guidance of Amber Grahlman. Both new hires have been working feverishly throughout the summer recruiting new student-athletes,

building their coaching staff, purchasing equipment, and relocating to a new area.

"We are absolutely thrilled to welcome these two new head coaches to the Falcon Family," remarked FLC Dean/Athletic Director Matt Wright. "They were both extremely well respected assistant coaches prior to coming to Folsom Lake and I have no doubt that they will hit the ground running here. She is still the school's all-time assist leader, and a member of the Del Mar High School Hall of Fame. Mollet played her college ball at Sacramento State, spending three seasons as part of the Hornets' backcourt corps. She received her bachelor's degree in Digital Media Communications from Sacramento State in 2008 before obtaining her master's degree in Kinesiology/Sport Performance from Sac State in

Coach Mollet looks forward to an exciting year as she welcomes eight new recruits to go with the seven returning Falcons from the 2017-18 inaugural season.

Amber Grahlman comes to FLC after serving as the cohead coach at Santa Ana College for three years, where she led the Dons to the CCCAA state playoffs each year. Prior to Santa Ana, Coach Grahlman spent 3 seasons (2012-2015) at Long Beach City College as an Assistant Coach, where she focused primarily on helping her student-athletes get to four-year universities and obtaining academic success. Amber has been coaching within the California Community College system for

over 12 years and has transferred over 40 of her student athletes to 4-year institutions with athletic scholarships.

Amber started her coaching career in 2003-2004 as an Undergraduate Assistant at her alma mater, San Diego State University, after playing catcher for the Aztecs from 2001-2003. While she played, the Aztecs' softball team won back to back-to-back Mountain West Conference Championships.

Coach Grahlman graduated from San Diego State with her Bachelor of Arts Degree in Social Science and later attended Azusa Pacific University to earn her Master's Degree in Physical Education.

# Ken Cooley: Reifying Participatory Government

#### RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) -

Assemblyman Ken Cooley joked about the origin of the word "politics" at the Rancho Cordova Luncheon on August 17. Cooley said, "It is derived from the Greek word poli, meaning many, and tics, meaning blood-sucking insects." However, Cooley's interest in politics began early. He still has the envelope with the Kennedy White House return address that he received in answer a letter he sent at the age of nine. When he was 11, living in Las Vegas, he spent a day shadowing the city manager, and at 17 had lunch with the city manager of Pacific Grove.

Cooley worked tirelessly with his colleagues for Rancho Cordova cityhood and he first ran for public office in Rancho Cordova. He was elected to the first city council when Rancho Cordova became a city in 2003. "It was sixteen years ago this month," Cooley said, that I started what is now very much my trademark going door to door and knocking on doors and talking

to people." He was reelected to the city council in 2004 and 2008, and served as mayor in 2005 and 2010. In November 2012, District 8 elected him to the California State Assembly.

council ever met there," Cooley said.

The August luncheon was attended by Mayor Linda Budge, Vice-Mayor Bob McGarvey, Council Member Donald Terry,

Sarah Koligian, Superintendent of Folsom Cordova Unified School District and also a member of the Senate Education Committee, said that Cooley hears from people like herself often on bills that have direct impact on education. "Last year he came out and visited all our preschool programs at Cordova Lane Center," Koligian said. "He was right there with the students and very much an advocate for early education and supports the First Five initiative."

Cooley talked about the neighborhood "walks with the mayor" he carried out, and the involvement of the public at an unofficial opening of the new Rancho Cordova City Hall in 2005. "We invited the community in to write messages to the future on the floor and walls of our chamber, so that our community would enter the building and own the chambers before the

The August luncheon was attended by Mayor Linda Budge, Vice-Mayor Bob McGarvey, Council Member Donald Terry, and many others who are regularly at the monthly luncheons. It was the first time attending for Allegra Pickett of Teichert Foundation. As grants manager for the foundation, Pickett said, "We are focused on helping the communities in specific ways that they need, and so this is a part of that, for getting to know Rancho Cordova and understanding more about what our needs are here."

One thing that stood out to Pickett about Cooley's address was his use of the word reify, applied to making participatory government more real. "I definitely feel part of my approach to being present in public life," Cooley said, "is being out, being visible, sitting at Starbucks . . . and connect(ing) people to the system of which it has been said, 'Democracy is the worst form of government, except for all the others."

As chair of the Joint Committee on Rules, Cooley has been involved in the Annex Project at the State Capitol. The West Wing of the capitol is invested with an abundance of symbols of our system of governance, while the Annex is totally devoid of those symbolic references. The purpose of the Annex Project is to re-establish a functional "People's House" that will support California's executive and legislative branches of government for the next century. This includes incorporating the

The completion of the Annex Project, Cooley said, is perhaps 10 years away. A new office building must be built and the legislature, now in the Annex, moved into that building temporarily. The Annex will be renovated, and the legislature moved back. "I at most can serve six more years, so I won't actually be in the legislature when this thing gets done," Cooley said. "A lot of professional endeavors

are like launching a ballistic missile. In a ballistic missile . . . it takes a very big motor to get the thing up off the ground and up high. Then little motors to steer it back wherever it's going. I sort of feel my job is to, with my team, be the big motor to get this thing up and running. So then when I'm not here, others can kind of step in and it will be a little easier to carry on."
