Western Wildfires: Red Cross Responds as Fires Grow

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - As many as 17 large wildfires are burning in California, destroying homes and other structures, forcing thousands of people from their homes. The American Red Cross is on the ground, providing shelter, relief supplies and comfort for those affected.

Over the weekend the Mendocino Complex Fire grew to 267,000 acres and is only 33 percent contained. The fire has destroyed 130 structures, including 67 homes. It is now the fourth largest wildfire in state history. The Carr Fire has burned 160,000 acres and is 43 percent contained. The sixth most destructive fire in California history, the fire has destroyed more than 1,500 structures, including 1,080 homes. The Ferguson Fire, which has closed Yosemite National Park, has burned more than 89,000 acres.

Large wildfires are also burning in Washington and Oregon where Red Cross disaster workers are providing shelter for those affected.

In California, more than 1,000 Red Cross disaster workers and nine emergency response vehicles are responding to the fires. The Red Cross has more than 20 shelters open and has provided more than 6,700 overnight shelter stays. Red Cross workers have also provided more than 73,000 meals and snacks and distributed more than 18,200 relief items. Health and mental health disaster workers have provided more than 6,100 services and caseworkers are meeting one-on-one with people to assist them in getting the help they need.

As evacuation orders are lifted in some areas and people return home, the Red Cross will continue working closely with state and local officials to ensure people get the help they need.

People can reconnect with loved ones through both the Red Cross Safe and Well website at redcross.org/safeandwell and by using the "I'm Safe" feature of the Red Cross Emergency App. The Safe and Well site allows individuals and organizations to register and post messages to indicate that they are safe, or to search for loved ones. The site is always available, open to the public and available in Spanish. Registrations and searches can be done directly on the website. Registrations can also be completed by texting SAFE to

Alice Cooper: Rock's Super Villain

A Paranormal Evening with the Godfather of Shock Rock

- "You can't shock an audience anymore - that died a long time ago," said Alice Cooper. One of the originators of shock rock, Cooper understands that times have indeed changed since he spearheaded a movement in the early 70s but that hasn't stopped him from continuing to embrace his role as the bad guy.

Rock's villain began playing out his own dark vaudeville in the earliest days of his career. "That started from the very beginning; that was always with us," said Cooper. "I think because we were art students and that was something I saw as being essential for rock and roll. I would see all these bands - that were great bands - and they were all heroes and I just kept thinking, 'Where's the villain?'"

That's when Cooper took it upon himself to become that villain and change rock and roll forever. "Every parent in America did not want their children to see this character," said Cooper. "People would make things up...by the time you got into town you were the worst person ever. We found that funny."

In a life well before the internet and social media, the stories took on lives of their own. "The more of the misinformation, the bigger we got. The parents hated us so much that the kids liked us."

From guillotines and blood to the black attire and mascara, it was all about giving the crowd something that they had never experienced before. "And if you really look at it, it was just really a lot of fun," recalled Cooper. "The audience was really having fun with us. There was nothing satanic about it."



Times may have changed, the stage antics may be a little less shocking, and the internet may have depleted art, but that won't stop the Godfather of his craft from putting on a vintage performance. "It will

be a very similar show (tonight) to the one in the 70s except now it will be accepted a little more as excitement and entertainment more than just shock value."

One way that Cooper has been able to continue performing at a high level for the better part of five decades is by interjecting his band with youth and energy. He prides himself not only on theatrics but on the quality musicianship that got him there to begin with.

"Everybody in my band is top of the line," he boasted. "Glen Sobel, our drummer, just got voted best drummer in rock and roll. Nita (Strauss) just got voted best female guitar player. So I've kind of got a premier band. That makes such a big difference to me when I get on stage that my band can blow just about anybody off the stage."

Cooper recently kicked off his "Paranormal Evening" tour. He is set to play locally at Jackson Rancheria on Wednesday, August 15 and his new live album A Paranormal Evening with Alice Cooper at the Olympia Paris drops on August 31. For more information visit www.alicecooper.com. ★



Women Veterans Writing Workshop Celebrates the Hero's Journey

- The Grant Program Veterans Connect @ The Library at the Rancho Cordova Branch Library, administered by the State of California Library and CalVet, are seeking women veterans and their relatives to participate in the second Women Veterans Writing Workshop being held at the Rancho Cordova Library.

Everyone has a story. The purpose of the workshop is to encourage women to experience the satisfaction of successful writing as they delve into who they are and what they have experienced in their life that makes them the heroes they are.

The concept for the workshop, "Hero's Journey" comes from the book of the same name by Joseph Campbell. It refers to a hero who goes on an adventure and in a decisive crisis finds victory and in return comes home

changed or transformed. This writing workshop is structured to help participants write about and understand this journey in their own lives.

These free workshops are open to women veterans and women with family members who are or were veterans, including a parent, grandparent, sibling or child.

The two-hour sessions move quickly, giving each participant a chance to read their assignment from the previous session and receive valuable and respectful feedback from the instructor and other students. Contributions can be in the form of prose, memoirs, poetry, and short stories.

Library Supervisor Jill Stockinger is responsible for bringing this program to her branch through Veterans Connect. Veterans Connect has created 56 Veterans' Resource Centers in California libraries through a federal grant. CalVet assists California veterans in many ways, including assisting women veterans.

The writing workshop is led by published author and volunteer instructor Kristine Mietzner. Her writing has appeared in several publications. Her comprehensive piece on the Vets home of California in Yountville entitled 'Yountville Summer' can be found now in the Local Happenings Magazine.

This workshop began July 14. The four remaining classes are on August 11, August 25, October 13 and October 20, from 10 am-12 noon. Participants can join at any time but registration is required. Contact: Kristine 2770@yahoo.com.

This workshop is just one of the many resources available to veterans through the Veterans Connect @ the Library program. The Resource Center at Rancho Cordova and other libraries offer a comprehensive program of services to veterans and their families. RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - I'm not a photographer. I just like to take pictures. Sometimes they end up better than I thought they would be, but over the last few weeks, I've taken pictures of the moon and the sun, and they are shocking. Not because of the quality of the picture, but because the smoke from the forest fires is changing their look in Northern California. It is so changed from what we usually see from our homes and offices with the smoky sky, poor air, and 100 degree

weather. Some of the parks, both national parks and state parks, are closed indefinitely. Two prime examples are Yosemite National Park and Clear Lake State Park. Both are closed indefinitely because of the forest fires. The Mendocino Complex, the largest wildfire in California history, will probably continue to burn the rest of August because of its size and the firefighters are spread out so thinly as they fight the rest of the wildfires in the state. It would be great if the weather would change in our favor, and we would see some rain sooner rather than later.

We were able to pass the Second Amendment to the Mather Veterans Village Phase 2 Disposition, Development and Loan Agreement at our City Council meeting on Monday. Phase 3 is already in the process of being built, and when that is done, there will be 50 more apartments in the village for more veterans. They will be permanent homes for veterans, and I can't tell you how glad I am that we had so many partners involved in the

process. No one can accomplish what needed to be done by themselves. When we have the ribbon cutting to open those apartments next year, everyone who is part of the program will be there and will be thanked for everything they did to complete the project.

There is quite a bit of work being done to finish the construction on Douglas Road. It is quite a pain for the people who use the road every day, but when it is completed, it will be a much safer and more beautiful road. Chrysanthy Boulevard is being extended to reach Rancho Cordova Parkway so you won't have to come to the end of the road and have to make a U-turn. Rancho Cordova Parkway is in the process of being completed to reach Douglas Road, and there are many residents in the Anatolia area who will be able to take advantage of that road too. We are also working on Folsom Boulevard so the multiuse bicycle and pedestrian path will go all the way to Bradshaw Road. There are more programs in the mill, and you can find out more on the City's website at http://cityofranchocordova.org/ currentprojects.

As I write this column, I think about the so many things that are being done in our city, such as road work, sidewalks, new businesses, new homes, and the many celebrations we are enjoying this year, including the 100th Anniversary of Mather Field. We still have many improvements that are either in the planning stages or are actually being done. I just want you to remember what we have been able to accomplish over the last 15 years and think about what else we will be able to do together.

2018 California State Fair Celebrates Many First-Ever Moments

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - The California State Fair has wrapped up our 2018 season, which featured the theme "Don't Miss A Moment." As we reflect upon the 17 days of the Fair, which ran from July 13-29, we celebrated many first-ever moments that happened on the CA State Fairgrounds. The California State Fair is a place where memories are made which represents the best of what California has to offer; both nationally and globally.

"The CA State Fair has enormous roots as a beacon of the achievements of Californians and our multicultural threads," said Rick Pickering, CEO of the California State Fair. "We measure success by the many positive experiences of our fairgoers and our competitors." Judging by all of the experiences listed below, the 2018 California State Fair was a huge success.

The CA State Fair partnered with local utility company SMUD and the Elk Grove Food Bank, each Monday of the Fair, to restock the empty food shelves that are common during the summer months. Fairgoers donated nearly 29,000 lbs. of food to help feed hungry families served by the Elk Grove Food Bank. In exchange for the food items the Fair provided free admission to the donors.

There were plenty of firstever exhibits as well. Silent Disco was a popular "Cool Spot" to visit in Expo Center. Over 26,000 fairgoers danced with headphones to the songs of their choice, creating memories, and taking lots of selfies in the process. Tiny Homes were showcased during the first weekend at the Fair to a large, interested crowd. In the California Building, fairgoers enjoyed the new Life's Big Ag-Venture game and the National Geographic exhibit, The Future of Food,



packed crowd.

which visually explained how California helps feed the world. Also sprinkled throughout the fairgrounds were selfie stations for guests to capture their best pics for social media.

Other firsts happened over at Papa Murphy's Park, which included concerts and being the new home of the CA State Fair Cornhole Championship on the final day of Fair. The S.M.O. Tour, Kidz Bop Live 2018 and ZZ Top with special guest George Thorogood and The Destroyers were the first three concerts held on the sports field during the CA State Fair's 17 day run. Before his July 26 performance, ZZ Top's Billy Gibbons toured the fairgrounds and got up-close to some of the CA State Fair's furriest animals.

Food and drinks saw their share of firsts too. There were six new food vendors for Fairgoers to enjoy. The Speakeasy Whiskey Lounge was a new site that was home to live music and a chance to use a secret word (hence the term "speakeasy") to get a special drink made. Over in the California Building, The Taste of California Experience Classes expanded to give fairgoers knowledge about wine, cheese, olive oil, and honey.

There were other great community outreach firsts too. The Rescue Dog Dive Day with Splash Dogs had 39 rescue dog participants; with the prize money being donated to a local animal shelter and two dogs adopted. Out At The Fair also became an official CA State Fair event this summer for the final day; featuring Out At The Races and a Diva Drop bungee-jump.

During Sacramento Navy Week, Admiral Scott Jones and CEO Pickering joined together in a touching wreath laying at Cal Expo's 9/11 Memorial. This was even more significant because Admiral Jones grew up in Sacramento. The Cal Expo Police Department also connected with the CA State Fair community in a new and unique way. Most nights of the Fair, the public was able to feed the police horse and

canines, or sit on one of the police motorcycles.

The 2018 California State Fair becomes a mini-city each day, and highlights the best of what California has to offer. Attendance ranged from 20,000 to 60,000 a day for a total of 572,250 this year. Extreme heat for 9 days of the CA State Fair contributed to a decrease overall in attendance; with guests spending over \$8.5 million in food and drink purchases. While county fairs celebrate their local communities, the CA State Fair showcases the achievements of people state-wide. This year competitors entered the Fair from 57 of California's 58 counties. Since many of the young competitors and exhibitors at the Fair can only travel to Sacramento in the summer, when they are not in school, the CA State Fair is held in July. 

Child Support Awareness: "Take a Leap of Faith"

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) -

August is Child Support Awareness Month. The California Department of Child Support Services theme for 2018 is: "They Don't Need Perfect, They Just Need You." This August, the Sacramento County Department of Child Support Services ("Sacramento County DCSS") would like to recognize parents who support their children in every way. As parenting coach Sue Atkins says, "There is no such thing as a perfect parent, so just be a real one."

Sacramento County DCSS encourages parents to collaborate with their staff to gain understanding regarding child support establishment, modification and enforcement. Children benefit financially and emotionally from the participation of both parents. Financially, a parent's support can provide housing, food, health insurance, transportation, day care, and for extra-curricular activities. Emotionally, a parent's active involvement in their child support case can improve a child's feeling of stability and peace of mind.

The Sacramento County DCSS staff are available to assist both parents paying support and parents receiving support with all aspects of the child support process. In the last federal fiscal year, Sacramento County DCSS staff have managed over 76,000 cases and collected over \$119 million in support.

To recognize and celebrate parents for Child Support Awareness Month this year, Sacramento County DCSS Caseworker Janae K. interviewed obligor Vinny V. regarding his experience throughout his child support case, which opened in 2013. He described himself as closeminded and in denial when his case first opened. Over time, his mindset changed and he has been able to successfully manage his case ever since, which has led to a positive co-parenting relationship with his child's mother. He encourages others to "take a leap of faith" and collaborate with Sacramento County DCSS on their cases. Here is

Question: What was your initial

reaction to being served?

Answer: I was happy that at least things were moving forward. [It gave me] an opportunity to show that in some way, shape, or form I can take care of my daughter. At that time, I didn't have any custody or visitation, so I was hoping child support would help the relationship with my child's mother.

Question: In what ways do you wish you had received more support or quidance?

Answer: In the beginning, a lot of my questions were about where the money was going and how it was being spent. Now I understand that that doesn't really matter as long as my child is being taken care of. It's great that [Sacramento County DCSS can] help us as parents avoid the constant debate and power play that goes with money.

Question: What would you tell a parent who thinks his or her child support order is unfair for some reason, such as not being able to see the child or afford the order?

Answer: Take a leap of faith - this works! At first I wanted immediate results, but it doesn't work that way. Life doesn't work that way. When I finally put my faith in the system, I started to understand that this is not for the parents, but for the kids. [Sacramento County DCSS] is automatically the enemy because [it is] taking licenses away and attaching wages, but I learned [Sacramento County] DCSS isn't trying to take sides. They're just there to do what's best for the child. Take a leap of faith.

Question: How has managing your child support case successfully changed your life for the

Answer: I have a much better relationship with my daughter's mom now. When you're trying to convince the opposing side that you're serious..., you've got to put your money where your mouth is. When [Sacramento County DCSS] makes sure the payment is made every month on time, then the other

person can't argue with that, they don't have a leg to stand on. When [my daughter's mom] saw that I was paying on time every month and offering her more beyond that, that made her a believer. She could see I changed my ways.

Question: Do you have any tips for working with Sacramento County DCSS to get through challenges?

Answer: Honesty, willingness and open-mindedness. A lot of people are in denial about their situation with the [other parent] and you've got to get honest with yourself about what happened and why you have to pay this money now. [Being] openminded [lets you] see that child support is for your child, it's not a weapon used by your ex to get at

The Path from Welfare to Workforce



Services division. Participants, through their case worker, can locate a community volunteer opportunity to build work skills, access a job matching tool that connects participants with opportunities through DHA's subsidized employment providers and direct hire program.

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - Unemployment often feels like a maze. It can be hard to know where to turn – for CalWORKsrecipients; the Career Connections Job Club

is there to help.

Offered through the Department of Human Assistance's Employment Services Division, Career Connections Job Club is an interactive employment training program that provides strength-based skills training and an enthusiastic support team to help clients get back on their feet. After being assessed by their caseworker to determine employment barriers and overall eligibility, participants referred to Career Connections Job Club receive child care and transportation assistance, interview practice, resume rewrites, guidance in pursuing specialized certificates and learn innovative strategies for competing in today's job market. Job Club staff work with participants to demystify the process and keep them on track with clear, achievable goals.

The journey to self-sufficiency can be particularly difficult for those without a strong support network. Before they even walk through the door participants have often already tackled a number of challenges that day finding safe and affordable childcare, navigating public transit or arranging a ride, coordinating their schedule to fit an eight-week course. Career Connections Job Club staff know this and work hard to ensure participants receive the encouragement they need. This often comes from other participants as well and many leave with valuable friendships as well as outside resources to help them stay focused.

In the words of a Job Club veteran, "I have truly grown so much since I first started over one year ago...what once was a laissez faire attitude of mine has been taken over with a whole new amazing outlook on life. I feel great. This is exciting and honestly I would not be where I am today without you." Another participant wrote to say, "I felt so down until you all believed in me, my courage then grew and

miracles happened." By the end of the nearly two-month training, participants feel differently about themselves. In addition to having one-on-ones with Workforce Coordinators, Vocational Assessment Counselors and Social Workers, participants receive any necessary referrals for services such as wellness counseling and homeless assistance to help tackle any personal barriers they may be facing. Participants found this approach so helpful that 96 percent of all survey respondents said they would recommend the program to

family and friends

Career Connections Job Club is one of several opportunities offered through DHA's Employment Services division. Participants, through their case worker, can locate a community volunteer opportunity to build work skills, access a job matching tool that connects participants with opportunities through DHA's subsidized employment providers and direct hire program. Participants who meet the criteria of a job are referred to the employer and scheduled for an interview. This provides employers with pre-screened candidates and CalWORKs families with quality jobs.

Employment is about more than just a paycheck. It provides purpose and drive, opens up new social communities and future possibilities. It's crucial not only because it pays the rent but because of the self-confidence it fosters. For parents in particular, finding employment has a lasting ripple effect on their relationships with their partners and children. For these reasons and more, Career Connections Job Club is just one of many employment assistance programs offered by the Department of Human Assistance for Welfare to Work participants. DHA strives to provide clients with every opportunity to overcome obstacles and improve their lives.

Be Garbage-Wise!

Sacramento County's Department of Waste Management and Recycling would like to remind residents to be careful when disposing of fireworks, hot coals or hot ashes from summer-time backyard bar-b-ques.

Coals, ashes, and fireworks may continue to be hot and smoldering long after the celebrations are over. They still have the ability to start a fire. If these items are not properly cooled prior to disposal, they can easily ignite a garbage cart, a garbage truck, or even the facility they are brought to.

How you can help!

- Hot coals, ashes, or fireworks, should NEVER be placed in your garbage, green waste or recycling carts.
- Cool coals, ashes, and spent fireworks for several days by placing in a grill, a fireplace, or a non-galvanized metal container.
- Never place used coals, ashes or fireworks in plastic, paper, or wooden containers.
- Do not place other combustibles in the cart with these items.
- Soak charcoal, ashes, and spent fireworks in water before disposing in your
- Place cooled items in a non-galvanized metal container with a tight lid before disposing in the garbage cart.





RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - The City of Rancho Cordova recently purchased a 10-acre lot at Folsom Boulevard and La Loma Drive. The property is across from the Mills Light Rail Station and west of Folsom Lake College/Rancho Cordova Center and is slated for future development.

"This land purchase gives the city the potential for realizing some interesting development ideas," said City Manager Cyrus Abhar.

"We think this property could be a very good candidate for mixed

The mostly undeveloped land was purchased for \$2.68 million and became property of the city on June 29, 2018. The City Council approved the purchase, which was made using general fund reserves, with the idea that the city would be able to recoup the cost of the land in the form of future property taxes and other tax revenue.

The lot is mostly undeveloped except for a vacant building that used to house a Taco Bell. Four parcels comprise the 10-acre property, and purchasing them as a whole would allow the city to attract more impactful development.

'These 10 acres are located in a key location on Folsom Blvd," said Mr. Abhar. "Purchasing the property is a good investment for the city and for future development."

While development isn't expected for 2-3 years, the next step for the city is to develop a vision and concept for how the land will



It's begun. We are having a debate over socialism.

Not over whether it's fair to call Democrats socialists. Not over whether socialism has been good for Venezuela or some other faraway, unfortunate country. But socialist policies right here in the United States.

The press attention to a new study of the costs of "Medicare for all," or universal health coverage paid for by the government that goes much further than Obamacare, is a sign that it is a live issue.

Popularized by Bernie Sanders, Medicare-for-all is not just a fringy left-wing talking point anymore. It's a plank of a growing element of the Democratic Party. A raft of prospective Democratic presidential candidates has endorsed the policy, while about a third of the Democratic members of the House have joined a caucus devoted to it.

The good news for Sanders and Co. is that, in the wake of the failure of an attempted GOP repeal of Obamacare, the health care debate is clearly moving left. The bad news is that Medicare-for-all is still a completely batty, politically unserious idea.

The new study of its costs, from the conservative Mercatus Center, concludes that Medicare-for-all would increase federal spending by almost \$33 trillion during the first 10 years. The study notes that "it would be less expensive to the federal government to triple all projected appropriations," and that "doubling all currently projected federal individual and corporate income tax collections would be insufficient to finance the added federal costs of the plan."

Supporters of the idea impeached the credibility of the findings based on

their source, yet a study by the centrist Urban Institute in 2016 found exactly the same thing.

The costs aren't merely a theoretical matter. Vermont, the home of Bernie Sanders, abandoned a single-payer proposal after the Democratic governor concluded that it wasn't fiscally sustainable. Despite its Democratic supermajorities, California gave up on a single-payer proposal last year for the same reason -- the projected cost was twice as much as the state budget.

The upside is that Medicare-forall purports to save on overall health care spending by ratcheting down payments to health care providers. Medicare does indeed pay less to hospitals than private insurers, but it's not clear that this would be sustainable if hospitals could count on only Medicare-level payments.

Since Medicare-for-all would eliminate insurance premiums and provide health care free of charge, it would create an incentive for more usage, and more health care expenditures.

All of this is why the natural gravity in a single-payer system is toward brute-force price controls and rationing to control costs.

President Barack Obama had to promise that if you like your health care you can keep it because any change to private insurance is so toxic. Medicare-for-all would replace the employer-based system entirely for more than 150 million people. It wouldn't matter how much they liked their insurance -- it would be gone as a matter of definition.

Republicans need to continue to develop and push their own ideas to reduce health care costs and adjust to the new reality where socialism doesn't simply represent a laugh line, but a battle that needs to be won.







The Sacramento Metropolitan Air Quality Management District, in consultation with Sacramento County Public Health Officer, Dr. Olivia Kasirye, is issuing a Smoke-Related Health Statement. Residents are advised to continue to take precautions and minimize outdoor activities due to smoke being transported into Sacramento County from fires in Northern California.

If you smell or see smoke, take the following actions:

- Everyone should minimize outdoor activities if you can see or smell smoke, even if you're healthy
- Children, the elderly and

people with respiratory or heart conditions should be particularly careful to avoid exposure when air quality is

- Stay indoors with doors and windows closed as much as possible
- Asthmatics should follow their asthma management plan
- Contact your doctor if you have symptoms of cough, shortness of breath, or other symptoms you believe to be caused by smoke
- Those with heart disease should especially limit their exposure since particulate pollution from smoke can cause heart attacks

"Smoke in the air from wildfires can aggravate pre-existing conditions for those with respiratory issues," says Sacramento County Public Health Officer Dr. Olivia Kasirye. "Older adults, people with chronic diseases and young children are most at risk and should avoid outside activities if they see or smell smoke."

Aerojet Rocketdyne Boosters Complete Simulated Air-Launch Tests

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - Aerojet Rocketdyne's advanced tactical booster program recently completed two successful hot-fire tests of a motor that had been conditioned to mimic extreme cold- and hot-soak conditions for air-launch application. The tests took place at the Air Force Research Laboratory (AFRL) at Edwards Air Force Base in California.

phase of flight. The motors were tested at extreme temperatures to verify they will perform as expected across the full range of anticipated operational conditions.

"Data from these tests will be used to confirm our ballistic, thermal, structural and ignition models as we develop the next generation operational booster rocket motor."

The solid rocket motors tested recently were designed and fabricated by Aerojet Rocketdyne for AFRL under a contract aimed at developing advanced booster technologies for use on future vehicles.

- A Rosemont neighborhood hadn't received mail for over two weeks because mail carriers "were bitten by fleas when delivery was attempted," according to U.S. Postal Service spokesper-

In a letter that was issued last week from the post office, it stated that mail carriers have been "experiencing flea bites while making deliveries to mailboxes in the 3600 to 3800 block of Thornhill Drive. It has been determined the entire three-block area of Thornhill Drive is infested with fleas."

Residents were told that they would have to pick up their mail from their local post office until the pest issue was resolved. However, after several complaints, USPS said they would begin servicing the neighborhood again on Monday – but not without the help of flea repellent.

It has been noted by several residents that there is a large population of stray cats in the area and that they hope the city and county can step in to help with the infestation.

County Supervisor Don Nottoli, however, says that the county cannot spray for fleas on private property.

But some neighbors and officials are skeptical of whether or not there is even a flea infestation at all, and if there is, how the mail carriers are being attacked without coming into direct contact with animals or furniture that they may be living on.

"I'm not certain that the county is the body that's supposed to come out and determine whether there's a flea infestation," said Notilli.

As of now, Sacramento County officials and the U.S. Post Office are counting on residents to take action and do their part in the alleged flea scandal.★
