Celebrating Freedom

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG)

The City of Rancho Cordova celebrated its 15th birthday over the 4th of July holiday. From the annual parade to a two-day festival at Hagan Park full of games, great food, vendors, a petting zoo, and capped with

music and fireworks, the weekend was yet another success for the city and community.

It was the city's 34th annual Independence Day parade, this year featuring a youth marching band competition that showcased seven different bands. The bands competed hard for a

\$5,000 prize. 10,000 people were estimated to be on hand to witness the parade that started at Coloma Rd and stretched for 1.5 miles.

Capping off the festivities, an estimated 30,000 people attended the holiday's grand finale fireworks show. The 22-minute show was synced to music and

fired off over 1,000 shells for the crowd. The city also handed out special wristbands that lit up to the show. It was a fitting end to the two-day celebration.

Rancho Cordova Sports Hall of Fame Inductees Announced

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - A Cordova Lancer who made the leap to the NFL, a track star who competed in the Olympics, a three-star Air Force General and the best high school baseball team in California in 1984 will be among those inducted into the Rancho Cordova Sports Hall of Fame this October.

The inductees will be honored during the 2018 Induction Ceremony slated for Saturday, Oct. 13 at Rancho Cordova City Hall. The class includes eight female athletes – the largest group of women to be inducted in a single year.

"Rancho Cordova has a uniquely powerful history of youth sports achievement," said David Sander, a Rancho Cordova City Councilman and president of the Rancho Cordova Athletic Association. "Our Hall of Fame memorializes that incredible history and should inspire our current youth athletes as well."

To be elected to the Rancho Cordova Sports Hall of Fame, inductees were judged to have attained significant achievements in or contributions to athletics, as well as exhibiting high standards of character and sportsmanship.

"The history of Rancho Cordova is closely linked with some of the most talented athletes in the country," said Conrade Mayer, chairman of the Hall of Fame selection committee. "We need to look at this amazing sports legacy and allow it to inspire our entire community, especially our youth."

The inductees will be honored during the 2018 Induction Ceremony slated for 6 p.m. Saturday, Oct. 13 at Rancho Cordova City Hall. Tickets for the event are \$25 and will include an appetizer and cocktail reception and awards program. Tickets will be limited to 350, and the event promises to be a sell-out.

Online tickets will go on sale Sept. 1 at www.cordovacouncil.org. The event is organized by the Rancho Cordova Athletic Association in partnership with the Cordova Community Council.

The Rancho Cordova Athletic Association was formed in 2013 to foster lifelong values of good sportsmanship, teamwork and healthy active lifestyles through development of excellent youth sports facilities and organizations, positive coaching and access to play for all.

Big Sing California Making Statewide History

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - SCSO Conductor Donald Kendrick to serve as the Sacramento region conductor for a mammoth statewide singing event, *Big Sing California*. This thrilling event is due to set a record statewide on July 21 in California for drawing together one of the largest, free group singing performances in our history.

American superstar composer Eric Whitacre will help lead this exhilarating event which will be simulcast out of Disney Hall in Los Angeles to five California hubs: Sacramento, San Francisco, Fresno, Riverside and San Diego.

"Singers participating in the Sacramento region will have an option of attending an optional free open rehearsal on Thursday, July 19 from 7 – 9:30 PM at the Sacramento Community Center Theater," says Kendrick. The doors will open at 6 PM for this rehearsal. Free Big Sing music books will be provided at this rehearsal and at the July 21st performance for all attendees. Singers also have the option of ordering their music book in advance for a modest fee of \$3.00.

People can register online for the Big Sing via the SCSO's website sacramentochoral.com. They can also order their music in advance there and also enjoy some outstanding tutorials on the music itself. This amazing statewide concert will be live-streamed on the *Big Sing California* website.

Big Sing California is open to the general public. "We want people who love singing to join us and sing as much of the music as they can. We hope that this event will inspire people to make singing, and the joy it brings, a regular part of their lives," says SCSO Conductor Donald Kendrick. "The program is open to all ages ranging from young students to seniors."

The songs selected for the participants range from straightforward sing-alongs

such as Lean On Me, This Land Is Your Land, and Hey Jude, to choral works by Eric Whitacre and Morten Lauridsen. The program also features an exclusive arrangement of Pentatonix's Sing by Grammy Award-winning arranger Ben Bram created especially for Big Sing California.

"We know that singing releases endorphins, causes a sense of joy and euphoria and creates a bonding with our Community members, says Kendrick. "To be able to do this on the scale of Big Sing California in Sacramento is nothing short of thrilling."

Ticket vouchers to all locations will be distributed via email 10 days prior to the event. Music books will also be distributed for free at the venues on the day of the concert and at the Thursday, July 19th rehearsal at 7 PM at the Community Center Theater.

The Espresso Book Machine: A Savory Vehicle for Sacramento Area Authors

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - Three hundred eighty authors and counting have published their works through I Street Press at the Sacramento's Central Public Library. On the second floor one will find the Espresso Book Machine (EBM). This isn't a venue for selling lattes to local bookworms. On the contrary, the EBM is state of the art machinery, and is budding writers' self-contained means of making their work known.

The first EBM was unveiled at the New York Public Library in 2007. Now more than fifty such contraptions exist in such far flung locations as Johannesburg and Abu Dhabi. Sacramento's unit, installed in 2011, is one of only two EBM's in California.

The machine occupies the space of two storage freezers one might have in their garage. But it's a heck of a lot more interesting to watch. Witnesses marvel as a book is molded and formed before their eyes. This includes binding the text to a cover with hot glue. Watching the EBM, one is reminded of the Everlasting Gobstopper machine from *Willie Wonka and the Chocolate Factory*. A 300-page volume takes about five minutes to print. Like the Everlasting Gobstopper, a single, self-contained unit comes out at the end. It's literally hot off the press. Wonka's magical candy was designed to last forever. Similarly, a new paperback is there for the ages.

On the introductory video for the I Street Press, Rivkah Sass, Director of the

Sacramento Public Library, describes the appeal of the EBM. "Most of us have a book inside us," she proclaims. "And I Street was really about how do we, as the library, become that center of community-based publishing for the Sacramento region."

Through I Street Press, authors can self-publish. Before such technology existed, a writer would traditionally send his/her work to a publisher, or possibly fifty publishers, with hopes that one of them would pick up their book. The sole way for a writer to earn his/her stripes was through a

publishing house. A would-be author could do it alone, but hiring a bookbinder was a costly vehicle. So-called *vanity publishing* had a negative implication in its very name. But now, the ball is in the author's court, as technology such as the EBM is allowing these individuals greater flexibility with their printed words. It's truly changing lives for authors of all levels.

One individual whose life was enhanced through the I Street Press is Lance Pyle. Pyle employs the nom de plume Peter Blueberry as the author of *The Agency of Obnoxious Laughter*. In the

tradition of Shel Silverstein, Pyle combines humorous poetry with illustrations. I Street Press got Pyle started, and now he has a series of more than twenty poetry books. Pyle's career as an architect flourished, and then his life took a dramatic turn when he was diagnosed with throat cancer. He was forced into retirement and "didn't have anything to do." That's when Pyle started dabbling with rhymes, accompanied by drawings. The prolific poet and artist has created his volumes without benefit of writing or art classes. Pyle says of newfound creativity,

"I didn't know I had it until I had to go find it." He has now sold more than 3,000 of his books independently.

Pyle, as all I Street Press authors, got started through an initial meeting with librarian Gerald Ward. Ward maintains the I Street Press as a one-person operation. While each book on the EBM is printed the same way, Ward recognizes that every author's needs are different. Some are accomplished writers, while others come to the I Street Press with merely an idea. No matter where one is in the writing process, Ward is happy to encourage the writer's endpoint of holding their very own book in his/her hands.

The initial librarian's consultation is free of charge. After assessing the would-be author's needs, Ward will point the individual in the right direction to get started on their book. This might include hiring an outside editor or taking a writing class. Ward states, "Whether 40 or 700 pages, there is a \$6 charge per book and 3 cents per page." The writer may complete a proof copy as part of the package. The fine-tuning process continues until the final copy is completed. The end product is an actual published book, complete with ISBN, copyright, and bar code. Additional fees for set-up and revisions are arranged between Ward and the author. The I Street Press is a non-profit organization. Fees paid by authors using the EBM are contributions to the library to help maintain its services.

July 1 Brings Higher Interest Rates on New Federal Student Loans

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - July 1 was an important date for students and families: it's when most changes to federal student aid - both loans and grants - went into effect. For the year starting July 1, 2018, the maximum Pell Grant became higher, and new federal loans for undergraduates, graduate students, and parents now have higher fixed interest rates than loans taken out the year before. To help inform college borrowing decisions, we have a new, easy-to-read chart with 2018-19 interest rates, loan amounts, and other useful information for the most common types of federal loans.

The coming changes include:

- On July 1, the maximum Pell Grant increased to \$6,095, up from \$5,920. Pell Grants help 7.5 million low and moderate income students pay for college and reduce how much they need to borrow.
 - o Even with the increase, the new maximum Pell Grant for 2018-19 will cover less than 30% of the cost of attending a public four-year college, the smallest share in over 40 years.
- On July 1, the fixed rates for new federal loans became higher than the rates for loans issued last year.
 - o Stafford loans for undergraduates, subsidized and unsubsidized: 5.05% for loans issued in 2018-19 (up from 4.45% for loans issued in 2017-18).
 - o Stafford loans for graduate students: 6.60% for loans issued in 2018-19 (up from 6.00% for loans issued in 2017-18).
 - o Parent and Graduate PLUS loans: 7.60% for loans issued in 2018-19 (up from 7.00% for loans issued in 2017-18).
- On October 1, origination fees will decrease slightly for new federal loans.
 - o For loans issued October 1, 2018 through September 30, 2019, fees will be 1.062% of principal for all Stafford loans (down from 1.066%) and 4.248% for all PLUS loans (down from 4.264%).

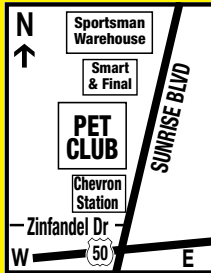

SMUD Invites Public Input on Proposed Rate Action

No Rate Increase Included in Proposal

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - The SMUD Board of Directors is holding two public workshops and a public hearing to discuss proposed rate changes. The proposal does not include an increase in rates. Instead, it recommends changes to encourage regional economic development, a change to the System Infrastructure Fixed Charge for residential customers transferring service, and some other changes.

The Chief Executive Officer & General Manager's Report and Recommendation on Rates and Services, released by SMUD CEO & GM Arlen Orchard, outlines the proposed changes. The report includes:

- A proposal to increase and extend the Economic Development Rate (EDR) discount and remove some of its eligibility restrictions in an effort to attract, retain and help businesses expand in the region. SMUD's Board

will consider a 10-year contract period for the EDR, options for disadvantaged communities and removing restrictions on qualification for the rate.

- A proposal to offset the fees charged to businesses to extend SMUD's infrastructure to provide their business with electricity.

- A proposal to prorate the System Infrastructure Fixed Charge for residential customers on bills with less than 27 days of service. By prorating, customers will pay only for the number of days their home received power from SMUD.

- A proposal to change the language of the Hydro Generation Adjustment to account for fluctuations in precipitation.

Dignity Health Hospitals Awarded for Dedication to Stroke Care

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - Dignity Health Mercy General Hospital, Dignity Health Mercy Hospital of Folsom, Dignity Health Mercy San Juan Medical Center, Dignity Health Methodist Hospital of Sacramento and Dignity Health Woodland Memorial Hospital have received the American Heart Association/American Stroke Association's Get With The Guidelines®-Stroke Gold Plus Quality Achievement Award. The award recognizes the hospitals' commitment to ensuring stroke patients receive the most appropriate treatment according to nationally

recognized, research-based guidelines based on the latest scientific evidence.

The hospitals, all part of the Dignity Health Neurological Institute of Northern California, earned the award by meeting specific quality achievement measures for the diagnosis and treatment of stroke patients at a set level for a designated period. These measures include evaluation of the proper use of medications and other stroke treatments aligned with the most up-to-date, evidence-based guidelines with the goal of speeding recovery and reducing death and disability for stroke

patients. Before discharge, patients should also receive education on managing their health, get a follow-up visit scheduled, as well as other care transition interventions.

measures developed to reduce the time between the patient's arrival at the hospital and treatment with the clot-buster tissue plasminogen activator, or tPA, the only drug approved by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration to treat ischemic stroke.

"We are pleased to recognize these hospitals for their commitment to stroke care," said Eric E. Smith, MD, national chairman of the Get With The Guidelines Steering Committee and an associate professor of neurology at the University of Calgary in Alberta, Canada. "Research has shown that

hospitals adhering to clinical measures through the Get With The Guidelines quality improvement initiative can often see fewer readmissions and lower mortality rates."

According to the American Heart Association/American Stroke Association, stroke is the No. 5 cause of death and a leading cause of adult disability in the United States. On average, someone in the U.S. suffers a stroke every 40 seconds and nearly 795,000 people suffer a new or recurrent stroke each year.

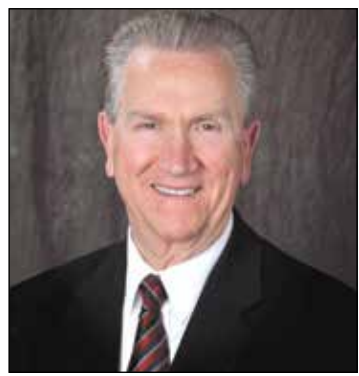

Metro Fire Structural Firefighter Training at 9501 Folsom Blvd.

MATHER, CA (MPG) - The Sacramento Metropolitan Fire District (Metro Fire or the District) will conduct structural firefighter training at 9501 Folsom Blvd Sunday (July 15) near Butterfield Way. Numerous Metro Fire personnel will perform evolutions at the drill site which will include live fire scenarios. Beginning at 0800, the training will focus on fire behavior and suppression techniques and tactics.

Efficient and safe firefighting requires training in the same conditions encountered during emergency response.

New Study Blames Prop 47 for California's "Smash-and-Grab" Crime Wave

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - Many Californians had high hopes for Proposition 47, a ballot initiative passed in November 2014 with 60 percent voter approval. The measure aimed to reduce penalties for some crimes, including certain drug violations, and to help relieve the overcrowding of state prisons.

While Prop 47 succeeded in meeting those objectives, it also triggered a major unintended consequence: It set in motion a wave of "smash-and-grab" motor-vehicle burglaries and a surge of retail shopliftings. For this reason, Prop 47 has earned the dishonor of receiving Independent Institute's fifth California Golden Fleece® Award, recognition given quarterly to state or local agencies that swindle taxpayers or break the public trust.

The main reason Prop 47 spurred an epidemic of theft and property destruction was its weakening of criminal penalties: By raising the monetary threshold for a felony theft to \$950 in property value, up from \$500 before the measure passed, Prop 47 lowered thieves' expected cost of getting busted.

"By reducing penalties associated with car break-ins, shoplifting, and other property crimes—and by making it more difficult to issue felony sentencing—Prop 47 de-prioritizes justice for California residents and businesses, who are now increasingly victims of vandals and thieves operating with near impunity," writes Independent Institute Senior Fellow Lawrence J. McQuillan, in his new report, California's Petty Crime Surge: Unintended Consequences of Proposition 47.

Among the report's findings and recommendations:

- Californians have been reporting significantly more vehicle break-ins than would be expected had crime trends continued on their pre-Prop 47 path. In 2015 and 2016, reported vehicle break-ins were up 21 percent and 27 percent, respectively, from the earlier trend line. In 2017, vehicles break-ins surpassed previous records, with a 24 percent increase above 2016 levels.

- In San Francisco, where the smash-and-grab epidemic is worst, on average one vehicle break-in was reported every 20 minutes. Overall, the arrest rate is below 2 percent, and the consequences for apprehended criminals are mere citations. People would likely report more crimes if they had greater confidence that law enforcement would secure arrests, prosecutions, and convictions.

- In 2015, the first year of Prop 47's relaxed sentencing requirements, shopliftings rose statewide nearly 11 percent above the previous five-year average, amounting to about 11,000 additional shopliftings. Organized crime gangs are involved.

- Policymakers and the courts could reduce vehicle break-ins and shopliftings by lowering the felony threshold from property valued at \$950 to an amount closer to the pre-Prop 47 value of \$500. When sentencing a thief, courts should be allowed to consider the total combined value of all stolen or damaged property across multiple incidents.

- Law enforcement should make property crimes a higher priority, pursuing arrests even for small crimes, so that records of criminal activity are established.

- Property owners, businesses, and concerned residents should step up their use of security technology, community involvement (including through social media), and police reporting. Ultimately, people will help by reporting more crimes when they gain more confidence that law enforcement is taking the problem more seriously.

"Property crimes produce real victims, and Californians deserve a legal system that provides real justice," McQuillan's report concludes.

not an investment. It's a rainy day fund, and its whole purpose is to sit there safe and wait until life throws unexpected expenses in your face.

Think about it this way. Insurance costs you money to protect things that make you money — like your home. It's also there to cover things you otherwise would not be able to afford. When you have an emergency fund in place, you don't have to dip into your 401(k), your IRA, or go into debt. Why? Because your emergency fund provides insurance against those kinds of things.

Let your emergency fund sit right where it is, Ferisa. Besides, it's a really bad idea to buy bonds in an environment where interest rates are increasing. Bonds have an inverse relationship to interest rates. So, as interest rates climb you'll lose out if you're playing around with bonds!

Keep it simple and safe

Dear Dave,

My husband and I finally have our full emergency fund in place. Like you recommend, we've kept it in a money market account with check writing privileges for easy accessibility. Recently, we heard about short-term bond funds with a higher interest rate than our current money market account. Our money would be available for withdrawal if needed, and we would only lose the interest. Is it okay to move half of our emergency fund into one of these bond funds to take advantage of the higher interest rate?

Dear Ferisa,

Absolutely not! Under no circumstances should you do something like that. An emergency fund is not an investment. You'll never build wealth and get rich off your emergency fund. That's not what it's there for.

I understand this might be the first time in your lives you've had a nice chunk of cash in the bank. I also get that it's hard to let it just sit there and make no money. But an emergency fund is insurance,

Allow them to earn it

Dear Dave,

Our daughter just turned 10 years old. Is now the right time to start giving her an allowance, and start teaching her about money?

Dear Danielle,

I'm glad you're going to teach your daughter about money. But in my mind, there's never a time for an allowance. I believe that kind of thinking, and using

words like "allowance," are some of the best ways to instill an attitude of entitlement in a child. I don't think you want your daughter growing up with the idea she deserves money simply because she's alive.

My advice is to develop a method by which she can earn commissions. Write down a daily or weekly list of jobs around the house that are age-appropriate she will be responsible for doing. Then, at the end of the week, she gets paid for jobs she completed — and she doesn't get paid for the ones she didn't do. The idea is to teach her that work creates money, and teach a healthy work ethic at the same time.

Of course, there are some things a child should be expected to do without financial reward. Everyone needs to pitch in, and do certain things to help when they're part of a family. And once you've taught her about the importance and rewards of work, make sure to also teach her about the three uses for money — saving, spending, and giving!

Looking at History of Mather Air Force Base as Capital Airshow Nears

Help Us Celebrate a Century of Aviation Adventure as Mather Airport Turns 100!

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - We look forward to welcoming some of the best military and civilian pilots in the world this September 21, 22 and 23, but as we prepare for the 13th annual California Capital Airshow we are also looking back at 100 years of aviation history at Mather Airport. The next chapter of Mather's magnificent history leads us through the Cold War and ends with the unfortunate closure of Mather Air Force Base...

Historical Overview III – The Cold War – 1946-1993

Following the 1945 Allied victory of World War II, demobilization and a return to a peacetime military were the orders of the day. However, enjoying the peace was short-lived as the United States and the free world were confronted with an aggressive new adversary—the Soviet Union and the threat of global communism that was rapidly devouring Eastern Europe in the aftermath of World War II. A U.S.-directed strategy of 'containment' and a buildup of strategic forces capable of deterring an aggressive communist menace drove the expansion of dispersed bomber assets and new basing which put Mather Air Force Base (Mather AFB) back into the spotlight.

Once Again a Vital Training Base

In 1946, Mather was transferred to the U.S. Air Force (USAF) Air Training Command and once again became a vital training base producing pilots, navigators and observers to crew a growing air arm of the nation's military might. With the 1964 closing of James Connally Air Force Base in Texas, all navigator training for the Department of Defense was consolidated at Mather AFB. In 1976, Interservice Undergraduate

Navigator Training was established bringing Navy, Marine and Coast Guard students to Mather AFB along with other students from numerous foreign countries, including the first women navigators. By the time Mather closed in 1993, over 32,000 USAF navigators, 3,100 USN naval flight officers, 280 Marine navigators and 3,500 navigators from 88 Allied nations had completed training at Mather AFB. This diverse mix of services and international families contributed significantly to the growth of what would become the City of Rancho Cordova, an All American City with a rich cultural background.

B-52 & KC-135 Arrive

The aircrews that were trained at Mather formed the backbone of strategic forces that

stood watch over America and her Allies ensuring the legacy of Freedom, hard won during World War II would endure. The 4134th Strategic Wing was assigned to Mather AFB bringing B-52 and KC-135 aircraft to the base along with the mission of nuclear deterrence. This wing became the 320th Bombardment Wing and was further augmented by the 940th Air Refueling Group (AFRES) later bringing additional KC-135 aircraft to the base.

Closure Leads to Civilian Development

The efforts of maintaining peace through strong military capability resulted in a victory at the end of the Cold War. With this victory, downsizing of the American military became inevitable and Mather AFB became

one of the bases identified for closure. Units were inactivated, the navigator-training mission was transferred to Randolph AFB in Texas and the base was officially closed in September 1993, opening the door for a community effort to develop Mather into an economic hub of commerce that would continue to benefit the Sacramento region. The Sacramento County Department of Airports and the City Rancho Cordova have been invaluable partners ensuring this important development continues.
