Scott Jones Re-elected as Sacramento County Sheriff

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Sheriff Scott Jones has been re-elected Sacramento County Sheriff, finishing with over 51.5% of the vote, easily outdistancing three other candidates by almost 30 points, and finishing over 75,000 votes ahead of his nearest competitor.

"I'm honored by the support from Sacramento County,"

stated Jones. "The campaign is over. Now it is time to get back to work."

"It sounds cliché, but I really am deeply honored and humbled by the support and encouragement I have received," said Jones. "There have been so many people doing so many things - from our extraordinary Deputies making me look good every day; to campaign

staff, donors, volunteers and community leaders working hard over the past four months to win this thing early. It really is humbling."

"The best campaign strategy ever is having a candidate who is already doing a great job for the office for which they are running," said Jones' consultant Tab Berg.

"Winning in a crowded field is difficult, especially when special interests are spending hundreds of thousands of dollars on negative attacks," said Berg. "But

voters overwhelmingly rejected their cynical tactics and partisan message - largely because Scott Jones has done an extraordinary job as Sheriff."

Former Sheriff John McGinness concurred, "Scott is one of the best to ever serve as Sacramento Sheriff. I see it. Leaders throughout the county see it. Voters clearly see it. Sacramento is better and safer with Scott Jones as Sheriff."

Senator Gaines Opposes Wasteful Budget

From the Office of Senator Ted Gaines

SACRAMENTO, CA (MPG) - Senator Ted Gaines (R-El Dorado) today issued the following statement regarding the Democrat majority-vote budget bill:

“I tip my hat to Governor Brown and his Democrat allies in the legislature; they can spend money faster and more irresponsibly than any group of people I’ve ever seen. This budget is – again – the biggest in Golden State history. We keep spending more and more but not getting better roads, better schools, or better anything besides wealthier public employee unions.”

“Brown had the nerve to point to a piggybank during his budget presentation, and to imply that he has saved the state some amazing amount of money since he’s been in office. That’s a farce! With just a bit of fiscal discipline we could have filled a dozen of those piggybanks. Brown taxed more and then Brown spent more. He was

the most predictable big-spending Democrat to ever roam the Capitol halls.”

“The Governor himself has repeatedly warned that another recession is headed our way. Instead of heeding that warning, we are increasing spending by billions to pay for things like the absurd High Speed Rail project, a minimum wage increase and pushing a billion-dollar make-over for the state capitol.”

“We are so dependent on Silicon Valley’s economic miracle that it’s frightening. Their prosperity obscures huge problems in the rest of the state, and our highly-progressive tax system means that if Silicon Valley coughs, the state budget catches pneumonia. A slight downturn could send us into a fiscal crisis in Sacramento. Far from being recession proof, we would be recession toast.”

“This is a budget that guarantees higher taxes for families around the state. Is it any wonder that working-class people are fleeing California as fast as they

can load their U-Hauls? How could they want to stay when their government treats them like ATMs? Democrats force them to pay the highest sales taxes, highest income taxes, some of the highest gas taxes and property taxes in the nation, and then celebrate when and brag about how much this year’s budget ‘invests.’ For once, I wish the Democrats would spend less and let the people invest in themselves.”

“This is Governor Brown’s last budget and thankfully so. He’s spent 8 years talking about fiscal discipline and prudence while supporting new taxes, fees and spending at every turn. He’s leaving behind a legacy of poverty, massive homelessness, and fiscal recklessness.”

Women’s Empowerment Receives \$11,500 from American River Bank Foundation

Donation to Go Towards Paid Job Training for Homeless Women

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - American River Bank Foundation recently granted \$11,500 to Sacramento non-profit Women’s Empowerment to provide paid job training for homeless women through the group’s Get A Job Kit small business. Funding also will support Women’s Empowerment’s new property management training program REstart in partnership with the Institute of Real Estate Management (IREM) Sacramento.

“American River Bank Foundation’s funding has been absolutely vital as we’ve grown The Get A Job Kit small business over the past four years,” said Lisa Culp, executive director, Women’s Empowerment. “We are so thankful to American River Bank Foundation and its continued investment in paid job training for women who are homeless. They stepped up to fund The Get A Job Kit, and now they’re making the same commitment by investing in our REstart program to train women in the field of property management.”

The Get A Job Kit was launched under Women’s Empowerment’s name in April 2014 after the business was donated by local entrepreneur Shirley Willey, who had created and run the business for nearly 25 years. The social enterprise trains graduates of Women’s Empowerment’s nine-week job-readiness program in the production, customer service, quality assurance, forklift operation, shipping and receiving industries. Over the course of five weeks, trainees are paid to assemble the Get A Job Kits, an all-in-one career organizer, to fill customer orders while receiving hands-on training, performance evaluations and relevant job

experience. Since launching the small business, Women’s Empowerment has sold 15,000 Kits to high schools, veterans programs, nonprofits, vocational and technical colleges and anti-recidivism programs.

Women’s Empowerment’s recent partnership with IREM Sacramento provides Women’s Empowerment graduates with paid training in property management, a career that provides both stable employment and housing on the property being managed.

“As homelessness increases in our community, and finding affordable housing becomes even more challenging, we developed a strategic partnership that provides both income and housing,” Culp said. “We are grateful to American River Bank Foundation for seeing the value of this new, innovative training program.”

The Get A Job Kit and REstart are two components of Women’s Empowerment’s programs that end homelessness for women and children in Sacramento. Women’s Empowerment was

featured on NBC’s The TODAY Show in 2015 for offering the most comprehensive job-readiness program in the Sacramento area designed specifically for women who are homeless and their children. The award-winning organization has graduated 1,503 homeless women and their 3,600 children. Last year, 92 percent of graduates found homes and 77 percent found jobs or enrolled in school or training. The program combines self-esteem courses, job training, health classes and support services to help homeless women across diverse ages, races and cultures. Women’s Empowerment is funded through private donations from the community and receives no government funding except for in-kind rent from the County of Sacramento. RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - I represent the City of Rancho Cordova in the Sacramento-Yolo Mosquito Vector Control District, which was ground spraying in the American River Parkway yesterday from Sunrise Boulevard to Watt Avenue. This was happening because a mosquito that was trapped in one of the District's mosquito traps in River Bend Park had tested positive for the West Nile Virus. The District is recognized statewide as one of the best control districts in the state, and is also recognized nationally when they go to Washington D.C. There are very few such districts that do their own testing in their labs, and grow hundreds of pounds of both mosquitofish and guppies in their fisheries.

They bring them to pools that are either in the abandoned pool program or ones that are untreated where mosquitoes thrive. They are also brought to creeks, streams and a few small wetlands where they know they have to remove the larvae. Just as an example, 118.13 lbs. of mosquitofish were used in the

month of May; a slight increase over April's usage of 101.7 lbs. The fish usage is increasing because of the increasing heat in the Sacramento area. There have been 830 treatments using mosquitofish and five treatments with guppies. Guppies aren't used as much, but work very well in specific locations.

You may notice at the movies in Village Green Park on Friday nights in June that there are free mosquito repellents available for pick up. There have been repellent requests from Rancho Cordova, Folsom, Elk Grove, and the Neighborhood Services Department of the City of Sacramento. They have been distributed to organizations serving the homeless population, as well as migrant farm workers through a partnership with the UC Davis Cooperative Extension. The Sacramento-Yolo Mosquito Vector Control District is very indiscriminate, just like mosquitoes. They don't care who they bite, so the district acts the same way when they "fight the bite." The Mosquito and Vector Control Association of California will disseminate a press release announcing that National Mosquito Awareness Week will occur June 24th to June 30th.

Recently, Gary Goodman, Manager of the Sacramento-Yolo Mosquito Vector Control District, talked about the

season moving along with crews responding to the West Nile activity with additional trapping and course radius for potential breeding sites. The State of California has detected less West Nile Virus activity in both birds and mosquitoes as compared to this time last year.

The Lad/Surveillance Department has reported that three mosquitoes, six birds and four humans tested positive. That department said that the exotic/invasive species surveillance program is using a variety of traps weekly. They are focusing on trapping at different sites, so as to sample as much of the district territory as possible over the course of the summer. They have concluded their tick and Lyme disease surveillance program until it resumes in October. It is quite different, I think, because I thought that most of the testing was done in the summer, but apparently not.

Their adult surveillance traps are an area of concern in south Sacramento County. There will be more results given to us in our next meeting next month. There are many types of traps that I am learning about as time goes by, because like everything else in this fast changing world, there is always something new to learn.

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - Meet the Rancho Cordova Police Department's (RCPD) Youth Services Unit. RCPD created a Youth Services Unit to enhance our efforts to build relationships with local schools and youth through youth-focused programs.

The Unit is comprised of a Sergeant, two School Resource Officers, a Youth Services Officer and a Rancho Cordova Police Activities League (PAL) Coordinator.

"The goal of the Youth Services Unit is to create positive interactions with youth in the Rancho Cordova community," said Sergeant Mark Hatzenbuehler, who oversees the Unit. "We want to connect with youth through mentoring and by being a positive influence on their lives."

The Unit manages three primary programs: School Resource Officer program, Rancho Cordova PAL, and Adopt-a-School program. In this edition, we are introducing you to our School Resource Officer program.

Our School Resource Officers partner with all 19 schools in Rancho Cordova to continue to improve safety for students, teachers and administrators. Officers proactively visit the schools to check on them and interact with students; respond to calls for service, issues or concerns; provide training and education for administrators and teachers; and more.

RCPD will soon expand the program with a third School Resource Officer who will be assigned to Cordova High School and Mills Middle School. The addition of an officer will give RCPD the opportunity to connect with students even more frequently and further respond to the needs of our schools.

Meet Our School Resource Officers
School Resource Officer
Lance Parker

Officer Lance Parker's path to law enforcement began when he was working in the high tech industry. During that 17-year career, he went from being a computer programmer to a Vice President of Sales for multiple companies. He had moved to California from New York, remarried, and his family became like The Brady Bunch. Officer Parker was traveling all the time in his sales job, when he really wanted to be home with his family doing something he was passionate about.

Things changed for him on 9/11. Officer Parker worked closely with people at the World Trade Center and the Pentagon, and he remembers his wife asking him, "How many signs do you need?"

In 2002, at 40-years-old, Officer Parker applied to the Sacramento County Sheriff's Academy, was accepted, and graduated near the top of his class. Over the next 13 years, he worked at the Main Jail, serving the contract City of Citrus Heights, Courthouse, Patrol and Crime Scene Investigation.

In 2015, he joined RCPD as a patrol officer and field training officer. He wanted to serve the Rancho Cordova community in the variety of roles that are available at the department.

In March 2018, Officer Parker became a School Resource Officer with a passion for supporting youth. His mother was a teacher and guidance counselor for over 36 years and his wife left the high tech industry to become a teacher. Officer Parker also supported a Safe Schools Program in northern California early on in his career.

"This role gives me the chance to affect multiple kids a day, and their futures, in a positive way," said Officer Parker. "I enjoy being able to partner with administrators, teachers and students, and

feel comfortable in the school environment."

School Resource Officer

Officer Steve LeCouve is third generation law enforcement. His grandfather was killed in the line of duty in Germany and his father is a retired police officer, which inspired him to follow their paths of service.

He joined a Law Enforcement Explorer program through Boy Scouts of America in 1983. At 18 years old, he became a reserve police officer in Modesto before joining and graduating from the Modesto Police Department Academy as the youngest recruit.

Officer LeCouve joined the Modesto Police Department and worked as a K9 Handler assigned to the SWAT team for five years, handling the police dog and assisting officers with in-progress crimes and locating suspects, evidence and missing persons. In 1996, Officer LeCouve joined the Sacramento Police Department as a pilot.

In 2002, Officer LeCouve joined the Sacramento County Sheriff's Department. Over the next 16 years, he worked in Motors, K9 Unit and air ops.

In February 2018, he joined RCPD as a School Resource Officer. He wanted to serve the Rancho Cordova community and thought it would be a new challenge with skills he could contribute from his 30-year career in law enforcement.

"I am passionate about working with younger kids because we can show them through positive interactions that officers are their partners," said LeCouve. "Our job is to be there to support local kids in becoming successful students and individuals."

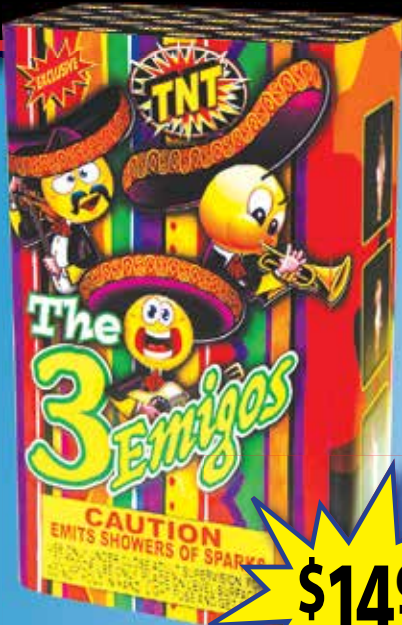

Defendant Convicted for Series of Armed Robberies

DATE: June 7, 2018
CASE: Taher Farraj (Case #17FE007880)
PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney James Wax, Career Criminal Prosecution Unit
Taher Farraj was convicted by a jury of three counts of robbery. The jury also found true gun use and intentional discharge of a firearm allegations. Prior to trial, Farraj pled to being a felon in possession of a firearm and being a felon in possession of ammunition.
On April 15, April 18 and April 24 of 2017, Farraj robbed the same convenience store on Fruitridge Road while armed. Farraj would either ask for change or make a purchase to get the clerks to open the cash register. He would then pull out a silver revolver and grab money from the registers. During one of the robberies, Farraj fired the gun off at the store ceiling. The three robberies were captured on surveillance cameras inside the store. A probation search of Farraj's residence and car revealed clothing that matched the clothes worn by the suspect during the robberies and a .22 caliber silver revolver, which was loaded with 6 rounds.

Farraj has prior convictions for being a felon in possession of a firearm and the sale/transport of marijuana.
Farraj faces a maximum sentence of 35 years in prison. Sentencing is set for August 3, 2018, at 9:00 a.m. in Department 14 before the Honorable Tami Bogert.

Sexually Violent Predator Who Assaulted Two Boys to Remain in Hospital Custody

DATE: June 7, 2018
CASE: Clay Jones (Case #80213 & 81875)
PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Denise Halstead, Mental Health Litigation Unit
A jury found true a petition of civil commitment against Clay Jones as a Sexually Violent Predator (SVP).
In 1988, Jones was convicted of 12 counts of child sexual assault against two boys ages 4 and 10. The assaults included sodomy and lewd and lascivious acts with a child under 14 years old, and forcible lewd act with a child under age 14. Jones was sentenced to 33 years state prison for these offenses. Upon his review for parole, he was referred to the Department of State Hospitals for consideration as a Sexually Violent Predator. Two psychologists gave an opinion that Jones had a mental diagnosis and because of this mental disorder he is likely to commit a sexually

violent predatory offense if released from the hospital.

Defendant Sentenced for Murdering Ex-Girlfriend

DATE: June 15, 2018
CASE: Dameshlo Green (Case #14F03237)
PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Kevin Greene, Homicide Unit
The Honorable Helena Gweon sentenced Dameshlo Green to 75 years to life in prison. On February 27, 2018, a jury convicted Green of the first-degree murder of Tamisha Ridge and being a felon in possession of a firearm. The jury also found true that Green personally used a firearm that caused the victim's death. The Court found that Green had suffered a prior conviction, felony assault with a deadly weapon, which is a strike under California's three strikes law.
Green and the victim had and on and off relationship for more than 10 years. After 5 years of no contact, they resumed their relationship until the victim broke up with Green a few months later. On May 14, 2014, Green entered the victim's residence, went into her bedroom and shot her in the head with a shotgun.

Defendant Convicted for Attempted Murder of Woman in Her Home

DATE: June 15, 2018
CASE: Jordan Lynch (Case #17FE014700)
PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Sam Alexander, Career Criminal Prosecution Unit
Jordan Lynch was convicted by a jury of attempted murder and burglary. The jury also found true allegations that Lynch personally used a deadly weapon and caused great bodily injury.
On August 9, 2017, Lynch attempted to enter the 47-year-old female victim's bedroom through the window. The victim woke up and closed the window before he could enter. Lynch then went to a sliding door and used a metal pole to smash the glass and gain entry. He immediately grabbed the victim and stabbed her in the side, lacerating her kidney. When she tried to get away, Lynch stabbed her in the neck. The victim was finally able to escape and neighbors were awakened by her screams. When Lynch tried to flee, the neighbors tackled him and held him until police arrived.
At sentencing, the Court will determine an allegation that Lynch has a prior 2016 strike conviction for robbery. If found true, Lynch faces a maximum sentence of 27 years in prison. Sentencing is set for July 13, 2018, at 2:00 p.m. in Department 21 before the Honorable Steve White. ★

They didn't ask for money, they just offered it as a chance to be part of things. I'm in good shape financially, and I could easily afford the cost. Morally, I wonder if I have a responsibility to help with things. Do you feel I'm obligated in any way?

Dear Julie,
I'm sorry for your loss. I'm sorry, too, about what happened with your father. I can't imagine the mixed emotions you must have in your heart. When someone asks me a question like this, I try to put myself in their shoes. Under the circumstances, I don't think you

have any obligation whatsoever — morally or legally — to help pay for anything. If you want to help, and you can afford to do so, then follow your heart. At the same time, I don't think you should lose one wink of sleep over this if you decide not to contribute.

Twenty-five years is long, long time. I don't know your dad, and I have no clue about his situation or state of mind back then and in the time since. I can't imagine doing that to a child of any age, though.

Do what you feel in your heart is best. But in my opinion, there's no obligation here. God bless you, Julie.

Step by step

Dear Dave,
When is the right time to buy a house when someone is following your Baby Steps plan?
- Samuel


Dear Samuel,
That's a good question. Let's start by going over the first few Baby Steps.
Baby Step 1 is saving \$1,000 for a beginner emergency fund. Baby Step 2 is paying off all consumer debt, from smallest to largest,

using the debt snowball. Baby Step 3 is where you increase your emergency fund to the point where you have three to six months of expenses set aside.

Once you've done all that you can begin saving for a home. I'll call it Baby Step 3b. For folks looking to buy a house, I advise saving enough money for a down payment of at least 20 percent. I don't beat people up over mortgage debt, but I do advise them to get a 15-year, fixed rate loan, where the payments are no more than 25 percent of their monthly take-home pay.

Doing it this way may take a little more time, and delay your dream of becoming a homeowner a bit, but buying a house when you're broke is the quickest way I know to turn something that should be a blessing into a burden!

and educated them about the high-quality outdoor recreational opportunities available at State Parks.

"It's important to teach them how to be safe on the water," said Paris Shaw of the Division of Boating and Waterways.

Each student who attended received their very own life-jacket to keep and hopefully use this summer and beyond with the good intention that they will pass their knowledge of water safety onto others.

Drowning is the third leading cause of unintentional injury death worldwide and the second leading cause among children ages one to 14, accounting for 7% of all injury-related deaths, according to the World Health Organization. There are an

estimated 360,000 annual drowning deaths worldwide.

Beyond teaching the students, each agency was able to learn from the demonstration as well as they all bonded and familiarized themselves with working together, preparing for the upcoming months.

Chris Dargan of Metro Fire was excited to be a part of the day. "This is our first year. Metro Fire was invited to participate and in addition to showing off the importance of water safety it allows inner agencies to practice working together."

Some of the activities and visuals on display for the students were:

- Mock Rescue involving a distressed and overturned kayaker.
- Life Jacket Station – Each



student learned about the proper fitting and laws of life jackets and received a new jacket courtesy of the Division of Boating and Waterways.

- Self-Rescue and Rescue Station – Students learned how to reach a paddle or pole, throw a rope, row or paddleboard to the victim and swim out.
- Basic Heat and Cold Related

Emergency Response Station – Students learned how to identify, treat and respond to emergency situations.

- Sacramento State Aquatic Center Inflatable Slide – Students were able to climb and slide off of a 20 foot slide into the water and/or use a hydrobike.

Interior Secretary Zinke's Offshore Plan Is On Point

Interior Secretary Ryan Zinke wants to vastly expand offshore oil and gas production -- and politicians from coastal states are livid.

The Senate Energy Committee recently hauled Sec. Zinke to Capitol Hill for intense questioning. Lawmakers from Washington, Oregon, and other coastal states demanded he delay his planned expansion. They're concerned that offshore drilling could harm the environment. Some state officials have even threatened to sue the administration to halt the plan.

Sec. Zinke shouldn't let this opposition shake his resolve. His offshore drilling plan will create hundreds of thousands of American jobs while safeguarding the environment.

Obama-era regulations banned energy production in 94 percent of the Outer Continental Shelf, which includes acreage off Alaska, the West Coast, the Gulf of Mexico, and the Eastern seaboard. Obama administration officials had planned to keep those areas closed to energy exploration through 2022.

Sec. Zinke plans to reverse that ban and open over 90 percent of total OCS acreage to oil and natural gas exploration through 2024. His plan would authorize new leases in 47 shelf areas, some of which have not been explored for a quarter century.

The plan would do wonders for the American economy. Opening the OCS to oil and natural gas development would add nearly \$600 billion to the U.S. economy within 20 years. It would also create more than 700,000 jobs.

In the Atlantic region, the plan could boost domestic crude oil production by more than 250,000 barrels per day within three years of the moment when companies drill the first well. Constant production would create 260,000 jobs over twenty years.

Development in the Pacific would generate 300,000 jobs within 20

years. Nearly 58,000 of those jobs would be created in states that don't even border the ocean.

The positions will help tens of thousands of families achieve the American dream. The average annual compensation for workers in the oil and natural gas sector is over \$94,000, significantly more than the \$45,000 median wage for American workers in 2017.

Energy production is expensive. Oil and natural gas firms would spend \$22 billion per year to develop oil and natural gas resources in Atlantic states and \$25 billion per year in Pacific states.

That spending would lead to higher employment in fields ranging from finance to food service. In the Atlantic region, drilling would create 135,000 non-oil and gas jobs within 20 years.

Americans need not worry about sacrificing the environment for these economic gains. Offshore drilling is safer now than it has ever been. Following the 2010 Deepwater Horizon oil spill off the Louisiana coast, technological advances and accident prevention and response strategies have improved safety practices across the board.

Since the spill, leading oil and natural gas companies have started the Center for Offshore Safety, which is responsible for setting new safety standards and compiling necessary performance metrics to identify areas for improvement.

As Scott Angelle, director of the Bureau of Safety and Environmental Enforcement, has noted, an increase in domestic energy production and safety and environmental protection do not have to be mutually exclusive.

More offshore drilling would boost wages and create jobs with virtually no risk to the environment. There's no reason for politicians in coastal states to fear Secretary Zinke's plan.

Sac Intl Airport Served Over One Million Passengers in May

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - The Sacramento International Airport achieved a significant milestone in May 2018, serving over one million passengers in a single month. The last time this benchmark was reached was in July 2007. CA Budget Invests \$134 Million in New Voting Systems, \$3 Million to Strengthen Election Cybersecurity

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - California Secretary of State Alex Padilla applauds Governor Jerry Brown and the Legislature for including historic investments in new voting systems and election cybersecurity in the 2018-2019 Budget. “Cyber threats, both foreign and domestic, have become the new norm in our elections,” said Secretary of State Alex Padilla. “The California Budget addresses cyber threats by providing \$134 million for counties to modernize aging voting equipment and \$3 million to create the Office of Elections Cybersecurity

and the Office of Enterprise Risk Management. These investments will improve the voter experience, strengthen existing security measures, and improve collaboration and coordination with county elections officials and our partners in the intelligence community.” The \$134 million budget allocation will allow the Secretary of State to support counties’ efforts to upgrade or replace voting equipment including the purchase of ballot on demand technology, electronic poll books, and open source voting systems. “While the White House remains in denial, our national security apparatus has verified that the Russian attacks on our democracy did not end with the 2016

election,” said Senator Henry Stern. “Cyberattacks and misinformation-based warfare continue today. California voters deserve secure elections and credible information leading into November. That’s why we’re establishing the Office of Elections Cybersecurity immediately. This office will bring California’s full expertise in technology and cybersecurity to bear to protect voters, and go after criminals who attempt to disrupt our democracy with hacking, voter confusion and vote suppression.” The Enterprise Risk Management Office will coordinate efforts between the Secretary of State and local elections officials to reduce the likelihood and severity of cyber incidents, as well

as establish cyber incident response best practices. The Office of Elections Cybersecurity will facilitate information sharing between federal, state, and local agencies on threats to election cybersecurity, risk assessment, and threat mitigation in a manner that is both timely and that protects sensitive information. The Department of Finance allocated the initial \$1 million to create the ERM and the California Legislature approved an additional \$2 million to supplement the office’s security and outreach efforts related to elections through the Office of Elections Cybersecurity. “Given the ongoing and increasingly sophisticated threats posed to our elections systems, creating an Office of

Elections Cybersecurity is an important step to ensuring that state and county elections officials have the information and the tools necessary to defend our democracy from cyber-attacks,” said Assemblymember Marc Berman. “I’m pleased that the budget passed by the Legislature today includes funding to create this critically important office.” The legislature’s funding will also support the Secretary of State’s Communications Department to develop immediate information-correction campaigns, better outreach to communities in rural and urban areas, and assist county elections officials and voters with up-to-date information about potential threats. ★
