SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - Seven Sacramento area museums will participate in Blue Star Museums, a collaboration among the National Endowment for the Arts, Blue Star Families, the Department of Defense and more than 2,000 museums across America to offer free admission to all active duty military personnel and their families starting the Saturday of Memorial Day weekend (May 26) and continuing through Labor Day (September 3), 2018. The seven local museums participating in Blue Star Museums include the following: Aerospace Museum of California, California Automobile Museum, California Museum, Crocker Art Museum, Fairytale Town, Powerhouse Science Center and the Sacramento History Museum.

SACRAMENTO COUNTY, CA (MPG) - Voting is officially underway in Sacramento County! Early last week, Sacramento County Department of Voter Registration and Elections (DVRE) distributed more than 728,000 Vote by Mail ballots, meaning that voters across the County can begin casting their ballots for the June 5 election.

So how exactly can you vote this election? With Sacramento County being one of five counties to implement the Voter's Choice Act, residents can now pick when, where and how they want to vote. Ensure you're ready for Election Day with the follow-

• Choose how you want to vote

• By Mail: Place the voted ballot inside the envelope provided,

sign the envelope and return. Note: Two stamps are required for postage and ballots returned by mail must be POSTMARKED on or before Election Day, June 5.

Drop Box: As of May 8, voted ballots can be placed in any of the 53 secure Drop Box locations throughout Sacramento County. A complete list of locations can be found online and in the Sacramento County

On a sunny day in 1981, I watched Diana Spencer marry Prince Charles. Their son Prince Harry was also blessed with a sunny wedding

day. There the similarities ended. Thirty-seven years have passed, and times sure have changed. Little boys when I last saw them, bridegroom Harry and brother William now parade balding Windsor pates. Two of

William's children were among bride Meghan Markle's junior attendants. Kate Middleton's middle-class family exuded more allure than their royal in-laws and celebrity wedding guests garnered more attention than anyone. Even the nuptial soprano claimed meeting George Clooney was the best part of her day.

With a showbiz bride at the altar, Hollywood did indeed meet Holyrood. But what really defined this event was an unapologetic decree that multi-culturalism rules in a marriage that represents the state of Britain's Commonwealth. Stunning in Givenchy, a mixedrace bride strode the aisle alone. She was not property to be given

away. She took her father-in-law's arm for a few final steps, allowing the stunning symbolism of a future king's blessing. The word "obey" was absent from her vows.

You begin as you mean to continue. This wedding indicates a non-negotiable path for a modern duke and duchess and an apparently accepting royal family.

Meghan's path to a splendid marriage was strewn with carpet tacks rather than rose petals. She hails from a crisis-prone clan. She's American and divorced. If this was enough to rule out Wallace Simpson as a royal bride in 1936, family baggage is now more common than coronets among Windsor ranks. She might be an actress but the happiness she has brought to the Queen's once-troubled grandson is no act Harry's wedding day tears were real. Moreover, the bride promises to be a stunning weapon for Windsor popularity. The arcane tradition of divine right survives only through adaptability and the new duke and duchess will help make royalty relevant to millions. As an actress, Meghan will smile and charm her way through a life-sentence of tedium; as humanitarians who bring attention and energy to good causes, she and her besotted husband will be fantastic ambassadors for the Windsor "Firm."

Thirty-seven years ago, no one could have told me Elizabeth II would hear a pulpit-thumping sermon steal her Archbishop of Canterbury's thunder; that her grandson would exit his wedding to gospel anthems and ululations from Middle Eastern fans. But she is wise to endure Meg and Harry's conquest. She accepts that millions will embrace the cosmopolitan couple like rock stars. Their children will endear royalty to future generations of her multicultural Commonwealth. Best yet, the Sussexes are too distant to the

throne to threaten succession! So, Meaghan may borrow Queen Mary's tiara any time she likes. The Windsors will bend over en arrière to avoid mistakes that alienated a previous people's princess. In his address, Episcopalian Bishop Michael Curry contended love was a fire – if harnessed – that could change the world. If the Sussex marriage is good, Meghan and Harry's love might just do that. Wish them well.

Voter Information Guide that has been mailed out.

• Vote Center: Beginning on May 26, voters can vote in person for up to 11 days, including Election Day at any open Vote Center throughout the County. Remember, voted ballots can ONLY be returned to a Vote Center during the dates they are open. If you'd like to return your ballot before May 26, please send via mail, return to the Elections Office or place in any Drop Box. A complete list of Vote Center locations and hours of

operation can be found online or in the Sacramento County Voter Information Guide that has been mailed out.

• If you miss the registration deadline, you can take advantage of the new Conditional Voter Registration option that begins on May 22. Offered at the Elections Office and any open Vote Center, this extends the existing traditional voter registration deadline to eligible voters, allowing them conditionally register and vote a provisional ballot from May 22 through Election Day.

• Did you become a naturalized citizen after close of registration? You can register to vote at the Elections Office or as of May 22, complete the Conditional Voter Registration form at any open Vote Center. New citizens must present a Certificate of Naturalization which must have a naturalization date that is after the closing date of registration and they must declare that they have established residence in Sacramento County.

Water Supply Allocation Increases Slightly for State Water Contractors

- The California Department of Water Resources (DWR) today increased the State Water Project (SWP) allocation for 2018 to 35 percent – up slightly from the 30 percent allocation announced in

In December, SWP contractors were notified of an initial 15 percent allocation that was later raised to 20 percent in January.

"Late season rain and snow in March and April salvaged what would have been a severely dry year, which allows us to make this slight increase in allocation," said DWR Director Karla Nemeth. "Our water storage is currently in fair condition, but the state's snowpack is still low, so Californians need to continue to embrace water conservation as a crucial part of our lifestyle."

The statewide snow water content dropped from 44 percent of average on April 21 to 15 percent of average today. Snowpack accumulation for the year is well below average because warm temperatures brought more rain than snow in the Northern Sierra.

Snow water content and res-

ervoir storage are among several factors used in determining allocations. Most of the state's major reservoir levels continue to be above their historical averages, but lower in percentage of capacity today than last month. San Luis Reservoir, the largest off-stream reservoir in the United States where water is stored for the SWP and Central Valley Project (CVP), is at 79 percent of capacity. Shasta Lake, the CVP's largest reservoir, is at 89 percent of capacity. Lake Oroville and New Melones Lake are at 69 percent and 83 percent of capacity, respectively.

DWR transports SWP water to 29 SWP contractors who serve more than 27 million Californians and about 750,000 acres of farmland. A 35 percent allocation amounts to 1,481,685 acre-feet of water.

DWR's California Data Exchange Center website provides current water conditions at the state's largest reservoirs and weather stations and measures current rain and snow precipitation.

The Force Holding Animal Abusers Accountable

- Animal abuse, neglect and cruelty is more prevalent in our region than most people know. Local animal regulation agencies work cases every day, pulling animals out of precarious living conditions or caring for animals that were victims of abuse or neglect.

One of the most popular recent situations was the puppy Thomas, found on the side of the road – clearly injured. X-rays showed he had been struck in the skull with a blunt object, shattering his skull causing severe injury to his head and eyes.

The Bradshaw Animal Shelter,

where Thomas was brought by a kind citizen after finding him, immediately began lifesaving treatment to manage his pain and treat the infection spreading in his body. Meanwhile, the shelter went public with Thomas's story – asking for any information about Thomas. No one came forward with information and Thomas's abuse/cruelty case is still unsolved.

The good news is that through the generosity of the shelter's non-profit, T.E.A.M. (Teaching everyone Animals Matter), Thomas was able to get brain surgery and is now living a nearly normal life.

Thomas is just one example of hundreds the area animal shelters see every year. Because of the serious nature of the crimes seen, the Sacramento County District Attorney's office launched an Animal Cruelty Task Force – comprised of representatives from each animal shelter in Sacramento County and the Sheriff and Police Departments.

Together, these agencies are working to identify, investigate and prosecute those responsible for abuse, neglect and cruelty to animals. Research shows that the link between animal abuse and

crimes committed against persons is strong. Often, animal abuse is a gateway to crimes against humanity. With the help of the task force, Sacramento County Deputy District Attorney Hilary Bagley is looking to put a stop to this progressively violent behavior.

Deputy District Attorney Hilary Bagley on why she felt this task force collaborative was critical:

"For too many years in Sacramento it has been the worst of scenarios for animals. Prosecution relies on both law enforcement and animal control to make animal abuse investigation more of a

priority within their agencies.

Law Enforcement more often than not, doesn't receive training in animal abuse. Like any other crime, animal abuse constitutes violations of the Penal Code and law enforcement is responsible for investigating them.

At the same time Animal Control agencies have lacked training their officers as investigators. The officers all need to develop the ability to take statements, write reports and understand their responsibilities to develop and investigate cases. Our community expects that both animal care and law

enforcement officers are performing their duties so that violators are

accountable. We have formed the task force to unite these agencies, share successes and learn from failures. Many on the force share an affinity for animals. We can only improve by communication, work-

ing together and joining all forces." The Animal Cruelty Task Force is just one example of progressive collaboration efforts across County agencies and across jurisdictional lines – all with the goal of creating a Sacramento County we all love.

Absolutely! You have a legal and moral obligation to pay your debts, and I'm glad this is something you recognize. But collectors have rules they must follow. They're governed by law

Be certain to keep your end of the agreement. Make your payments on time, or early, whenever possible. Then, if they call you at work again, remind them of your initial payment and the terms of the agreement already in place. Be polite, but firm, and demand that they never call you at your office again.

In addition, send them a certified letter, return receipt requested, so you'll have proof you sent the letter and they received it. In the letter, let them know that - according to guidelines set forth in the Federal Fair Debt Collection Practices Act you are demanding they not call you at your office again.

If they call you there after receiving this formal demand to stop, they'll be in violation of federal law. If that happens, let them know you'll talk to a lawyer and sue them.

Defendant Convicted of 12 Child Sexual Assault Charges

DATE: April 16, 2018 **CASE:** Chandler Ashford-Deshazo

(Case #17FE011458)

PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney TeriAnn Grimes, Special Assault & Child Abuse

Chandler Ashford-Deshazo was convicted by a jury of six counts of committing a sex act with a child under 10 years of age and six counts of committing a lewd act upon a child.

In 2016, Ashford-Deshazo began sexually assaulting two female family members, who were both 7 years old at the time. Neither of the victims told their parents or each other about the abuse. On April 7, 2017, a family member caught Ashford-Deshazo during one of the sexual assaults. Ashford-Deshazo fled the house and was later arrested that night for being drunk in public. He was released on that charge the next day and immediately fled to San Diego, where he was apprehended two months later.

Ashford-Deshazo faces a maximum sentence of 90 years to life in prison. Sentencing is set for May 11, 2018, at 9:00 a.m. in Department 36 before the Honorable Stephen Acquisto.

Defendant Sentenced for Murder of 21-Year-Old Man

DATE: April 20, 2018

CASE: Ricky Allen Freeny (Case #15F03530) PROSECUTOR: Supervising Deputy District Attorney Molly Steber

The Honorable Russell Hom sentenced Ricky Allen Freeny to 82 years to life in prison. On February 9, 2018, a jury convicted Freeny for the first-degree murder of Gregory Denzel King and discharging a firearm into an occupied vehicle. The jury found true allegations that Freeny discharged a firearm causing great bodily injury and death.

On June 12, 2015, Gregory Denzel King was a passenger in a car driven by Freeny's ex-girlfriend, Nicole Burch. Mr. Freeny became jealous and enraged that Ms. Burch and Mr. King were together. He chased them down in his car, and shot Ms. Burch in the forearm. Due to her injuries, she was unable drive the car much farther. When the car came to a stop, Freeny came up to the car and shot Mr. King nine times, resulting in his death.

Defendant Convicted of 13 Counts of Sexual Assault

DATE: April 23, 2018

CASE: Andy Kelly (Case #17FE019449) **PROSECUTOR:** Deputy District Attorney Monica Robinson, Special

Assault and Child Abuse Unit Forty seven year-old Andy Kelly was convicted by a jury of 13 counts of sexual assault including committing an act of oral copulation or penetration on a child 10 years old or younger, intercourse with a child 10 years old or younger, and lewd or lascivious acts with a child under the age of 14.

From 2015 to 2016, Kelly sexually assaulted a young family member. DNA evidence was recovered and corroborated the child's description of what happened to her.

Kelly faces a maximum sentence of 129 years to life in prison. Sentencing is scheduled for May 18, 2018, in Department 29 before the Honorable Geoffrey Goodman.

Defendant Convicted of Killing Drug Dealer

DATE: April 23, 2018

CASE: Macairo Villalpando (Case #16FE002927) **PROSECUTOR:** Deputy District Attorney Andrew Smith, Homicide Unit

On April 19, 2018, a jury convicted Macairo Villalpando of second-degree murder and use of a gun in the killing of Tony Brambila. On February 7, 2016, Villalpando went to the victim's home to purchase methamphetamine, which he had done on prior occasions. Villalpando claimed that the shotgun went off accidentally as he rested the butt of the gun on the ground. However, the pathologists testified that the wound track demonstrated the shooting did not occur in that manner.

Villalpando faces a maximum sentence of 40 years to life in prison. Sentencing is scheduled for June 1, 2018, in Department 27 before the Honorable Steven Gevercer.

Defendant Convicted of Murder

DATE: April 24, 2018

CASE: Mario Andreas Contreras (Case

#15F03276) PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney Kevin

Greene, Homicide Unit On April 19, 2018, a jury convicted Mario

Andreas Contreras of first-degree murder with use of a gun in the killing of Erik Ozee. On May 31, 2015, Contreras approached a group

of young people looking for Ozee, who he thought may have robbed him. Ozee ran from the group when Contreras asked for him. Contreras chased after him, shooting him in the head. Contreras faces a maximum sentence of 50 years

to life in prison. Sentencing is scheduled for June 15, 2018, in Department 33 before the Honorable Michael Savage.

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
