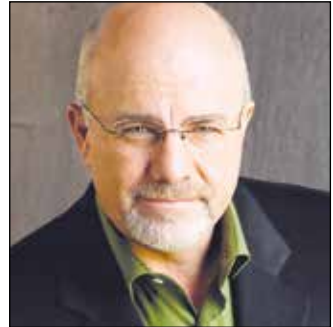

Invest \$10 Million
in Local Banks
Investment Supports
Local Economy
and Businesses**

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - The Rancho Cordova City Council voted to invest \$5 million each into Five Star Bank and American River Bank in connection with the Responsible Investment for a Stronger Economy (RISE) initiative.

"The decision to invest millions in local banks underscores the City of Rancho Cordova's commitment to supporting our local economy and businesses," says Mayor of Rancho Cordova, Linda Budge. "The RISE program is built on the strong presence of local banks in the community, which have been beneficial for the City's economic growth and development, while also meeting the individual needs of our residents."

The decision was made after Region Finance, a trade association of Sacramento Region Business Association which is comprised of community banks, reached out to ask that the City of Rancho Cordova adopt RISE as a new tool for economic growth and business expansion.

"We applaud the City of Rancho Cordova for choosing to help our economy RISE and thank the City Council for its leadership," said Josh Wood, CEO of Sacramento Region Business Association. "RISE is a groundbreaking yet

CRPD 60th Anniversary Honored at Fine Art Exhibit

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - The theme of this quarter's Rancho Cordova fine arts exhibit is "In the Park." The exhibit, to be displayed at Rancho Cordova City Hall through July 28, honors the 60th Anniversary of the Cordova Recreation and Park District. Artists and art lovers attended the reception on April 12 to see 53 works by 31 artists. Many of those chosen to be in the juried show have already had art works selected many times since the program started in 2012. This has provided an opportunity for the public to see the artists' talents emerge and evolve over a period of time. The show is put on by Rancho Cordova Arts and sponsored by the Cordova Community Council.

One of the frequent contributors is photographer Rick Sloan,

who also is on the board of directors of CRPD. "I'm an artist, a graphic designer, a photographer, and a park board director

Clean Sweep for Creeks

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - A party celebrating Creek Week caused a big splash – and vital lessons in water conservation – last weekend at Carmichael Park.

Many sponsoring agencies sent an unfiltered message: everyone must do their bit to save and protect water. Early that morning, 2,000 volunteers from youth and neighborhood groups formed an army to scour 85 locations. Creeks from the Delta to Folsom and from Elk Grove to Antelope benefited from the clean-up.

Four work areas within the Rancho Cordova community yielded 1,420 pounds of trash. City biologists also conducted a nature walk along the recently-restored banks of Cordova Creek. The tour celebrated revitalization of a formerly barren channel; Cordova Creek Naturalization Project replaced decades-old concrete creek lining with tons of river rock. Achieved in partnership between city, Sacramento County and the non-profit Water Forum, the three-mile effort has recreated 10 acres of vegetated habitat.

Now 28 years old, Sacramento County's Creek Week program aims to refresh dozens of waterways by removing garbage and invasive plants. The annual volunteer work force is swelled by the Sacramento Regional Conservation Corps, whose members recycle dumped rubber tires.

Beyond tires, mattresses and shopping carts, the 2018 junk-hunt gleaned many tons of smaller stuff alien to healthy arteries. Sacramento Area Creeks Council President Alta Tura noted that high waters from recent rains washed much trash downstream into river flows. "At the same time, more garbage entered

our creeks and was trapped by vegetation," she said. "Cigarette butts, plastic straws and fast food packaging are more damaging to wildlife than big stuff. Animals ingest plastic and can end up starving to death. Waterfowl can become entangled in discarded fishing lines. There's no place in our waterways for plastic in any form, yet thousands of plastic items were among the tons of junk we bagged. The volunteers did a stellar job."

At Carmichael Park, rewards for the weary army included clean tee shirts and hot dogs dished up by Carmichael Chamber of Commerce and Mission Oaks Park District volunteers. "The party celebrates everyone's hard work," said Tura. "It also teaches people about nature; how to save water and be better stewards of our environment."

zoom in and try to feel what it's like to be dancing or singing on stage, playing a tuba in a parade on a hot summer day, running with a football." Sloan also created the logo in use to celebrate CRPD's 60th anniversary.

Artist Ron Hall is another long term participant who has paintings in this exhibit. "I'm constantly trying to see and try new things and stretch outside my comfort zone," Hall said.

Marsha Mason used a different technique for her watercolor, "First Glance," that requires the artist to "pour" different colors onto the page. "Every time you pour, you have to let it dry," Mason said. "After trying that technique I decided it takes too long - I'm impatient." Mason is working on a sculpture for the next show. In June Mason will take her place as president of Rancho Cordova Arts and Ron Hall will become vice president.

Not all of the artists in this show have been around long term. Autra Oliver is a relative newcomer both to Rancho Cordova and to art. She works mostly in

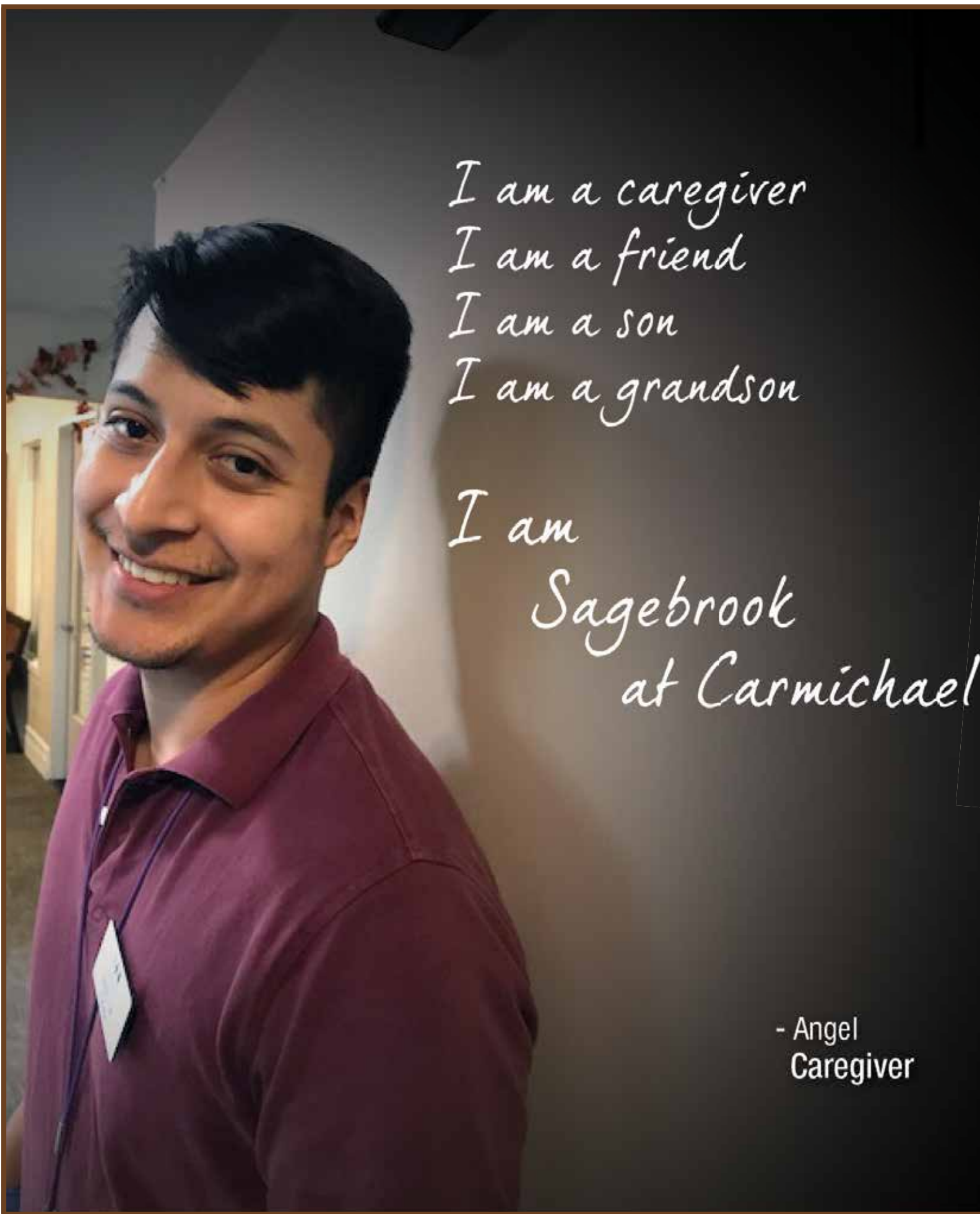

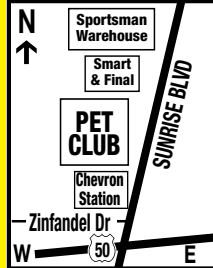

I received an email today that prompted me to write this article. I'd like to share it with you.

I first saw you two on a talk show where you talked about not feeling like making stuffing for Thanksgiving turkey so instead you put a Cornish game hen in cavity! Still chuckle about that and the next thing you said - that yes, it worked very well...the only problem being that it lead to a discussion on child birth...genius!
 I am a 63 year-old lawyer who is bombarded with recommendations for getting, and staying, organized. Nothing I have encountered is nearly as ingenious as your programs - and so much fun. You and Peggy first and now you on your own are brilliant and I'm not saying that to stroke your ego but because it is fact. Like so many others, my only regret is that I did not discover your organizational program until now. Why is this not taught in every high school in the nation? Just sayin'.....*

Loved your prediction for sales of one of your books that you expected to double your sales because people buying them are so disorganized they would lose them first time around. Am in process of getting myself together and have been getting everything of yours that I can (looked for

your 3x5 templates for at least a month). I reached the end of my rope around Christmas when I was overwhelmed and could not find my scissors. I love them and they were nowhere to be found. We have had a snowy winter here in Northern Michigan. It was not until last week when snow started melting that I found them - stuck to the hood of my car!

GRIPPING "CHAPPAQUIDDICK" DRAMA; TCM FILM FESTIVAL PREVIEW

CHAPPAQUIDDICK (Rated PG-13)

Partisans of Richard Nixon favored the bumper-sticker slogan "Nobody Died at Watergate," referring to the death of a female staffer when Senator Ted Kennedy plunged a vehicle in which they were traveling into a shallow pond on Chappaquiddick Island.

But President Nixon's political career came to an end, while the Senator served another forty years in the upper chamber of Congress, even though his presidential aspirations disintegrated that fateful night, a point made abundantly clear in the new movie "Chappaquiddick."

To capture the look of the Massachusetts solon, it falls to Australia native Jason Clarke to portray Ted Kennedy and Kate Mara takes the role of former Bobby Kennedy staffer Mary Jo Kopechne, the fatal victim on a July night in 1969.

"Chappaquiddick" recounts the night of a party that was a gathering of Robert F. Kennedy campaign workers, including the women who were affectionately known as "The Boiler Room Girls," of which Kopechne was a devoted member.

Screenwriters Taylor Allen and Andrew Logan assembled the script to tell the story by going back to the 1970 Edgartown's court inquest, after which the Senator was given a two-month suspended jail sentence.

Controversy followed the incident at Chappaquiddick, which was overshadowed in the news at the time by the Moon landing, to the extent that there was no end to conspiracy theories or even insinuations of an affair between Ted and Mary Jo.

The writers have said that they "pulled from objective facts to lay the groundwork - no insinuation, no innuendo, but the real truth." While the film is unflattering to Kennedy, it doesn't allege that the Senator was driving drunk or that sexual advances were made.

But there is plenty of things happening here that cast a very bad light for the last remaining Kennedy brother. For one, he swam back to Edgartown for the night without reporting the

accident to police until nearly ten hours later.

"Chappaquiddick" also reveals a lot of political maneuvering with old JFK operatives like Ted Sorensen and former Secretary of Defense Robert McNamara (Clancy Brown) on hand at the Hyannis Port compound plotting strategy to salvage a career.

Kennedy didn't help his case by making bone-headed moves, such as disregarding the wise counsel of his cousin Joe Gargan (Ed Helms) and even wearing an unnecessary neck brace to Mary Jo's funeral in a bid to gain sympathy.

As a historical drama, "Chappaquiddick," avoiding tabloid scandal fodder, nonetheless results in a gripping, suspenseful tale that is disturbing as well as thought-provoking about what might have been for the future of the Kennedy dynasty.

TCM CLASSIC FILM FESTIVAL PREVIEW

This column has touted the desirable experience of the annual TCM Classic Film Festival for many years, and once again cinema fans from around the world have the chance to descend on Hollywood for screenings over the four-day period of April 26th through April 29th.

The TCM theme this year is "Powerful Words: The Page Onscreen," celebrating the representation of the written word on the silver screen, from original screenplays to unique adaptations to portrayals of writers real and imagined.

Indeed, the foundation of great film is the written word. This concept may be underscored by the opening night presentation of Mel Brooks' "The Producers," for which he was both writer and director and won the Academy Award for Best Original Screenplay.

A film that holds up really well 50 years later is the Steve McQueen thriller "Bullitt," which inarguably has one of the most famous chase scenes in film history. The good news is that co-star Jacqueline Bisset will be on hand for a discussion at the screening of this taut police tale.

For great laughs, "The Odd Couple," also celebrating its golden anniversary, can't be missed as it explains why one

refers to a sloppy friend as Oscar and a neat freak as Felix, thanks to the classic comedy delivered by Walter Matthau and Jack Lemmon in their respective roles.

Celebrating its twentieth anniversary is another cult favorite, "The Big Lebowski," which has developed a devoted following at midnight screenings. At TCM, you won't have to stay up late to find out why the Dude abides.

The "Best Picture" Oscar went to "The Shape of Water," and now TCM offers the chance to watch the original inspiration with the 3D presentation of the 1954 "Creature from the Black Lagoon," a truly classic film.

Going to the TCM Classic Film Festival allows for a fan's experience at classic venues like the fabled Chinese Theatre and the Egyptian. Check out the TCM festival website for greater details. ★

Travelling Overseas is Such a Pleasure, and it Always Has a Great Ending!

For those of you who have travelled overseas, the experience of different cultures and different standards is always eye-opening. Whether it be the quality of the roads or the cost of food or the friendliness of the citizens, you know exactly what I mean when I say "This is different."

One of the travel advantages we have as Americans is that English is spoken in virtually every country, especially in the large cities. I can only chuckle at the likely chaos that would ensue in the countries we've visited if the residents didn't understand English better than I

understood their language.

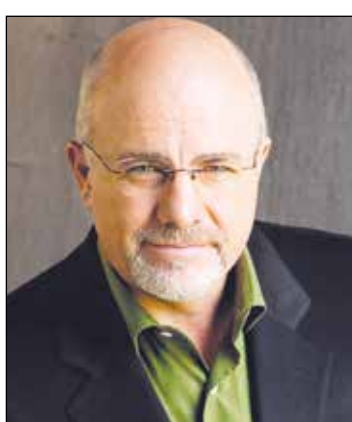
Our typical trip has lasted three to four weeks. Most of the visits have been free form travel: rent a car, get a map, pick a direction, press the accelerator. This has been particularly rewarding when touring through rural areas. We've encountered local residents who have opened their homes to us. Farmers who are major producers in their communities (cultivating up to twenty acres) have been willing to show us their operations. The small towns (1,000 residents more or less) are very hospitable.

Years ago, we were motorbiking through the dirt roads of the Azores and stopped in a small town for lunch. While eating, a large party of locals walked by escorting a young woman dressed in a spectacularly white dress to the local church for her wedding. We followed the group. In the town square sat the church. On the front steps of the church stood the groom, dressed impeccably in black, surrounded by his groomsmen, commanding the attention of all, strutting like a peacock. As the bride approached the

families gathered at the base of the steps in anxious anticipation. We chose not to intrude into the proceedings further, but it wasn't hard to envision that this local custom hadn't changed much in the preceding centuries. We returned to the cantina, finished our meal, hopped back onto the motorbikes and drove off to the next dot on the map.

My wife and I have sought to impress upon our children the wonders of travel. I suspect that many families have similar campaigns. There is no doubt that our kids have been to places they never thought about. That's the beauty of travel: going places you've never really thought about.

Oh yes, the great ending of each trip! Succinctly, there is no place like home. My experience is that while travelling abroad is certainly enlightening, I am always delighted to come back home where the roads are paved, the law is not uncertain and the water is safe to drink. What a great ending to every trip it is when those wheels hit the runway in the good old USA! ★

War II, the Korean War or the Vietnam War, and received an honorable discharge, may contact SCOE to receive their high school diplomas. SCOE also presents diplomas to Japanese American citizens forced to leave high school due to WW II internment. Individuals may request diplomas on behalf of themselves or qualifying family members, including persons now

deceased. Those who earned a G.E.D., or graduated from high school while in an internment camp, are still eligible for diplomas. To be considered for the spring 2017 awards ceremony, submit applications by April 26, 2017. Applications are available from the Sacramento County Office of Education by calling (916) 228-2416 or visiting scoe.net/or. ★

Mather Veterans Village Next Phases Break Ground

Additional Homeless and Disabled Veterans Housing Underway

City of Rancho Cordova

RANCHO CORDOVA, CA (MPG) - Mercy Housing, Veterans Resource Centers of America (VRC), the City of Rancho Cordova and the County of Sacramento broke ground on April 10, 2018 on the final two phases of Mather Veterans Village, the first permanent supportive housing development for homeless and disabled veterans in the Sacramento region.

Phase II will provide a 46-bed transitional housing program for veterans not yet ready to live independently, as well as a rich menu of supportive services including comprehensive case management, behavioral health treatment, employment, and a commercial kitchen and chef to provide healthy, delicious meals to residents.

Phase III will consist of an additional 50 permanent supportive homes on the site, including 44 one-bedroom and 6 two-bedroom homes. Phases II and III bring the total housing capacity to 146.

"The City of Rancho Cordova is a vibrant community with a strong military heritage that values its veterans," said Mayor Linda Budge, City of Rancho Cordova, one of the project drivers. "We are proud to celebrate another milestone in bringing our vision of Mather Veterans Village to life. The village has become a place for our nation's homeless and disabled veterans to live and heal, and we look forward to welcoming even more veterans home to Rancho Cordova once the project is completed."

Mather Veterans Village includes three phases of critically needed veterans housing and supportive services. Phase I of the project was completed in August 2016 and all 50 homes are occupied by now formerly

homeless and disabled veterans and their families.

The garden-style community - designed by Mogavero Architects, a local Sacramento firm - exceeds California's energy and water usage standards. The site includes landscaping irrigated by 100% onsite gray water, solar electric generation for tenant net metering, and a solar hot water system.

"The dedication of Mather Veterans Village Phase I was a very memorable and special

day; a day to be proud of the work this incredible team of partners has accomplished and proud of the important services we are able to provide," said President Doug Shoemaker, Mercy Housing California, the master developer. "To be here, 18 months later, to begin work on the final two phases of this remarkable project is truly something to celebrate. The Mather Veterans Village staff and our project partners look forward to welcoming many more homeless

and disabled veterans to their new homes next year when Phases II and III are completed. The completed village will not only be a place to call home but a place for all the veteran residents to live in hope!"

"The County of Sacramento is pleased to be a partner in helping to advance the Mather Veterans Village project," said Sacramento County Supervisor Don Nottoli, District 5. "Veterans in our community will benefit from this outstanding and much needed project, which will provide a safe and welcoming home and supportive services for many local veterans."

George Thomas, a resident at Mather Veterans Village, served in the U.S. Army from 1979-86 as a field radio repairman and earned the rank of E5 Sergeant. In 2010, he lost his father who was his best friend. George became addicted to drugs to try and stop the pain, which led to him becoming homeless. He didn't know if he'd be alive the next day or where his next meal

was coming from. George had a family that loved him and 11 grandchildren he wanted to see grow up, so one day he decided to make a change.

George reached out to VRC, the co-developer and master service provider for Mather Veterans Village, to ask for help. VRC provides a rich menu of supportive services at the village, including counseling, job training, medical assistance, group and individual therapy, and a healing environment.

"We as Americans made a promise to these brave veterans," said Burt McChesney, Executive Director of Veterans Housing Development Corporation and Board Member of VRC. "We said 'fight our wars, keep the wolves at bay, stand the wall, and when your watch is done, we will take care of you.' Often times we have not kept our part of the bargain. With Mather Veterans Village and this collaboration, we are. This is the finest example of not only keeping a promise but giving the best gift

you can give a veteran: hope." Thanks to VRC, George was placed on the waiting list for Mather Veterans Village. "I was living in my car and praying to God for the village to open one weekend. That Monday, I got the phone call that I could move in," said George. "I am now living in my new home and enrolled in a drug recovery program. I have hope for the future and believe I can set a good example for my grandchildren."

Over 92,000 veterans live in the Sacramento, CA region, and the area has the 10th highest number of homeless veterans in California counties. Despite this need, housing to support the unique needs of homeless and disabled veterans was virtually non-existent - until Mather Veterans Village went from idea to reality.

The Mather Veterans Village location couldn't have been more perfect than the City of Rancho Cordova, CA. It is on the site of the former Mather Air Force Base, providing a familiar setting to veterans with access to the nearby VA Hospital, located just two blocks away.

In addition, the following organizations provided funding to make this program possible: California Tax Credit Allocation Committee; Veterans Housing and Homelessness Prevention Program, a partnership with California Department of Housing and Community Development, California Department of Veterans Affairs, and California Housing Finance Agency; California Department of Finance; US Department of Veterans Affairs; VA Northern California Health Care System; The Home Depot Foundation; Exchange Bank; Wells Fargo Community Lending and Investment; Local Initiatives Support Corporation; and Sacramento Housing and Redevelopment Agency. ★
