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Retiring with a Lifetime of Rancho Cordova Memories

Rancho Cordova Police Officer C.T. Smith was always involved in the Rancho Cordova community growing up. His father was a helicopter pilot in the National Guard, and his work brought him to Rancho Cordova due to Mather Air Force Base. Some of Officer Smith's earliest memories are from this community, and now he is proud to have retired from the Rancho Cordova Police Department (RCPD) after a 23-year career in law enforcement.

Officer Smith's journey began after graduating from California State University, Sacramento with a Bachelor's degree in government and journalism. He was working as a law clerk at the federal court and faced the decision of either going to law school or following

his career path. He decided to use the skills he'd learned to take the a hiring freeze. Officer Smith then applied to the Sacramento County Sheriff's Department Academy, was accepted, and graduated from the Academy in 1995.

Over the next 13 years, Officer Smith worked at the Main Jail, North and South Patrol, Marine Enforcement Detail, Air Operations, serving the contract City of Citrus Heights, and more.

In 2008, Officer Smith joined RCPD as a patrol officer and field training officer. He wanted to serve the Rancho Cordova community, especially having ties to it as a child. He also was interested in being part of RCPD's culture that encourages new ideas and has a supportive city.

For the last two years, Officer Smith served as a School Resource Officer for 19 local schools to

improve safety through mentoring, education, and addressing public test to join the FBI, but there was safety concerns. One of his focuses teachers have treated me like I'm was to find ways to be a positive influence in students' lives by interacting and having a conversation with them as a peer.

> "I'm constantly amazed by the students I have met who have survived through all their struggles," said Officer Smith. "It was fulfilling to me as an officer to be there for them and serve as a positive influence."

> Another one of Officer Smith's focuses was developing relationships with what he calls his second group of coworkers - the administrators and teachers at Rancho Cordova schools. He served as a direct contact for school staff if a problem arose, whether it was a crime that occurred on campus or a student that had something personal happen off campus that impacted his or her school life, and partnered

with them to develop a solution.

"The school administrators and part of their team," said Officer Smith. "They dedicate so much to supporting each school, and I have enjoyed this position in my law enforcement career the most because of that."

One of these "coworkers" is Angi Carlomagno, Principal of Williamson Elementary School. She and the staff at Williamson Elementary built a strong bond with Officer Smith over the past few years. He supported the school by promoting positive relationships with students, providing advice, being visible at the school, attending family events, and participating in Coffee with Cops, the school's way of giving back to the officers by providing them with treats, coffee and time with staff.

"Officer Smith was a supportive

Good Neighbors in Need See Good **Neighbors in Deed**

- Volunteers in Neighborhood Services, or VINS, is bringing back the times when a neighbor in need was a neighbor in deed. The group is basically a volunteer pool providing information, resources, and service in conjunction with the city to help make Rancho Cordova a better place to live.

VINS began in 2009. Maureen Nelson, a charter member who is still active in the group, was noticing large items such as mattresses littering the streets for extended periods. She called Ken Cooley who was a Rancho Cordova city councilman at the time. Cooley suggested she let the mayor know, and Nelson attended a city council meeting. In response, the city asked if she would like to join a group of volunteers.

For a while the city led discussion and invited appropriate speakers to address VINS in an attempt to resolve matters. The members assisted wherever they

"I helped at SPCA when they ndopted dogs here," Nelson said. "I set up tables, any of the things the city needed help with." A member or someone in the neighborhood might have an unresolved issue. For example, if a neighbor's child was struggling in school, with the shared resources of the city and VINS, often someone could be found to help.

Since 2012, VINS has planned and led their own meetings and annually decides the projects and programs on which they want to focus for the year. VINS still meets at City Hall and helps the city as much as possible. "There are about 20 to 25 of us that show up regularly to the monthly meetings, which I think says a lot," said Angel Ball, currently chairperson of the group.

Coach Guy Anderson Honored by the ABCA

Discusses Storied Career and the Current State of Baseball

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) - "I've been accused of being old school; which I am," professed legendary baseball coach Guy Anderson.

I sat down with the winner of 927 high school ballgames for a cup of coffee in Gold River on what was a perfect day for baseball. I showed up early, but Anderson was already there, sitting outside. Meeting with him for the first time, I wasn't sure what to expect. I had only heard stories.


Despite the crowded patio, I knew exactly who Anderson was. You can always tell with baseball guys. We quickly jumped into conversation, as if we'd picked right back up from our last one. The spry, 85-year-old had freshly returned from a Spring Break tournament in Anaheim. Now the assistant coach for Capital Christian High School, Anderson led the Cordova Lancers program for

45 years, winning 17 league titles, five section titles and coaching 24 players who would eventually be drafted by Major League organizations.

Earlier this year he received the American Baseball Coaches Association Dave Keilitz Ethics in Coaching Award. He attended the awards ceremony at the Indiana Convention Center in Indianapolis to accept the award last January. Anderson told me what an honor the award was and how much it meant to him, but also how fortunate he is to have been able to coach such great players throughout the years.

The Playmakers: "Team Means Family"

- "Family: I am a Playmaker. I have been blessed with coaches who care about me, pour into me, coach me hard, and love me. Someday I may be a Mom or Dad. I will be prepared to finish the job and pay-it-forward. That is what a Playmaker does, and I am a Playmaker. I will not tolerate bullying, speaking negatively about someone, or being unkind. Team means family."

That is the first of the four core values in the Playmakers Creed that program founder and executive director Greg "Coach Roz" Roeszler instills into his student athletes from day one. Established in 2009, The Playmakers Organization is more than just an after school program, it's a family. Family, followed by Academics, Serving Others and Winning With Honor.

There are three components to the program: Character and Leadership, Reading and Literacy and Sports and Recreation. "The program is about integrating sports with character," according to Skycrest Elementary 5th grade teacher Jinne Calvi.


Skycrest Elementary in Citrus Heights is just one of four current locations that the program is currently serving, along with schools in Rancho Cordova, Folsom and Woodland with expansion to Antelope and Rocklin on the horizon.

The nonprofit program is for third, fourth and fifth graders from all different backgrounds and walks of life. They are referred by their teachers, but participate after school voluntarily. "We are old school," said Coach Roz. "We have the toughest kids that don't want to go to other programs."

With Coach Roz in charge, the program is facilitated by Sacramento State student-athletes

and fraternity brothers. Sac State senior and former Phi Kappa Tau president Alec Romero has been working with the Playmakers for three years and has become Coach Roz's right hand man. He manages the rest of the coaches and has dedicated a lot of time and hard work to help make the program what it is today.

Fellow Phi Kappa Tau brother and Sac State sophomore Peter Francisco is the newest coach and had only been on the job for a couple of days but was already leading the charge on the basketball court, running layup drills and teaching the Playmakers how to both follow directions and compete.

The program starts off in the classroom after school with the Playmakers doing their homework then openly discussing anything that may be on their minds. The coaches are there for them and help guide a very structured but free

speaking conversation. The class then transitions into a few warmup exercises before heading outside, in a single file line, to play whatever seasonal sport they may choose.

Coach Roz teaches the idea of what he calls the "reverse pyramid." This is the counter sports culture idea that the veterans and leaders of the team actually go last, rather than first. "Pups, seniors, leaders," Roz explained. "In life, you earn the right to go last." This prepares the Playmakers for the idea that sometimes in life you must put your family first – something that Coach Roz and his team are teaching by example.

It is clear that the Playmakers are more than willing to learn and in return lead, but just need that extra guidance from the likes of Coach Roz and his team. While it's not always easy, by the end of each new concept, both on and off the court, everyone is on the same page and working together as a team – and team means family.



jockey," he explained. "You don't win on a donkey; you've got to have a stallion to win the big ones. I've had some pretty good guys that could play the game very well."

For a man who has dedicated much of his life to coaching and teaching others, he has enjoyed the fact that this award is not just about him, but a recognition of who he is and what he so proudly stands for. "This award was outstanding for me, I've been fortunate to be put in a few Hall of Fames. Like I said, you've got to have the stallions it's important to have the players - but this one here was more, to me, about who I am."

I asked the self-proclaimed "old school" coach how the game has evolved over the many decades of ballgames that he has taken part of. "If you start at the Major League level, it's the money. The money is a big difference now and it's an entertainment rather than a sport."

Anderson then addressed the collegiate level, summarizing a recent game that he and his Capital Christian team attended when they were in Southern California for their tournament. "The college level is still good baseball and I'll give you an example. The leadoff batter gets a base hit and the next guy lays down a sacrifice bunt. Early in the game, go get that first run."

What Anderson stressed throughout our conversation about today's game was that sacrifice bunting, or any sort of personal sacrifice at all, is a dying art – especially at the pro level. In last year's 2017 MLB season, a record 6,105 home runs were hit, topping the 5,963 belted in 2000 at the height of the Steroid Era. Strikeouts set a record for the 10th straight season at 40,104 and sacrifice bunts fell to their lowest level since the year 1900 at 925. To put that last number into perspective,

there were only eight teams in 1900 and they played anywhere between 140 and 146 games compared to the 30 teams and 162 game schedule in today's

But individual numbers can mean a lot more than team wins and the kind of contributions that won't show up in the box score to today's young players. The pressures to perform at a high level have trickled down to a lower age group, making the game a more individualistic sport. Whereas only seniors used to worry about playing at the college level, now underclassmen are receiving recruitment letters and are forced to think about the future rather than living in the moment.

"Play now, play the best you can and good things will happen," said Anderson. "Don't worry about next year or you may not get there." From early recruitment to travel ball to personal coaches and trainers, there are new politics in the game of baseball.

But Anderson also understands that when you're in the game as long as he has been, things are bound to take on a different shape over time. That's part of life. "We lost one thing in basketball a few years ago,

and we're losing it in baseball now, and that's the same color shoes," Anderson joked. "You go back to the military. You're a team when you all look alike. And that's why I've always liked the Yankees; they never put the name on the back."

Coach Guy Anderson is the very embodiment of America's pastime - a true throwback in every sense of the word; rich in history and accolades, but willing to accept the evolution of the game, whether he fully agrees with it or not. And that's what great coaches do. They lay down a stern foundation of the history and fundamentals of the game, and the rest, the improvisation, is up to you. And when it comes right down to it, Anderson and the game of baseball may have evolved, but they'll never truly

One program, Cordova Pride, helps residents who, because of illness, disability, or hardships, are having trouble keeping up with yard work. "People come home from having surgery, or they had a stroke or something like that," said VINS member Meada Cashatt. "They just needed help, just to get over the hump." Those whose applications to the city are chosen may receive one-time home beautification such as front yard improvements, fence repair, and removal of overgrown landscape. VINS provides tools, supplies, and volunteers for each project. "We had a house by my house that we went and cleaned up," Cashatt said. "The joy is we had neighbors come and help us; I met neighbors I had never seen before."

The Kudos program recognizes well-maintained front yards in Rancho Cordova with congratulations, a gift certificate and a sign that stays in the yard for a week. The sign recognizes the home for the way it is maintained and embellished and how it follows

the City of Rancho Cordova's Good Neighbor Guide.

Total VINS monthly volunteer hours varies, the usual being around 100, but may rise to 300 hours if it's a very busy volunteer month. Participation in each program is not mandatory but by choice, according to each volunteer's interests. For example, as well as being instrumental in the Kudos program, Nelson participates in the Folsom Cordova Unified School District community reader program. Those hours are counted as VINS volunteer hours as well. Those serving get the joy of helping, and those served the benefits of the assistance. Both sides make new friends.

"One of the city people told us that we're the eyes and ears of the city," Nelson said. "When we're upset about something, they listen."

The Rancho Cordova Police Department congratulates Officer Smith on his retirement and thanks him for his service to the Rancho Cordova community and greater Sacramento region!

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

As you know, we have been working on this for about ten years, and I have been keeping you up to date. Now I'll be able to tell you the progress that is being completed, and after it is done, I'll be able to tell you (along with our Grapevine and with our Communications and Public Affairs Department) about the ribbon cutting ceremony for the 46-bed transitional housing program and additional 50 permanent supportive homes at the village.

There are about 2,000 new homes that will be built in the City of Rancho Cordova during the next year, and I don't know how many new businesses will be added to our City. But you will be very pleased with the progress that is being made. The number of repaired and

resurfaced streets and also new sidewalks and some older ones that are in need of repair will also be completed.

Something that I am very proud of on the Rancho Cordova City Council is the way the Council has been able to complete tremendous work that has been needed for years. The City Council has actually been working for over 15 years, from when the initial Council was elected in November 2002 to sworn into office on July 1, 2003. We had many meetings as "Council Members elect" over those eight months. We hired an interim City Manager, and we looked at the laws and codes that we had to accept from Sacramento County until we began changing some of those codes and laws. I expect that our Council that has been working together over those 15 plus years will continue to work together at our City Council meetings and other public meetings. We can and will disagree at times, but we will continue to operate in a courteous and polite manner while we continue to make our City among the best in our country.

A reporter from the San Francisco Chronicle was in Rancho Cordova when we

officially became a city, and he was looking at the "old California" where some of the cities are looked at with suspicion. But he said, "Rancho Cordova and its neighbors have, in essence, recaptured some of the spirit and energy that built California. It may be just a matter of time before the new California morphs into the old California, and also becomes a tight tangle of houses, traffic and malls. Rancho Cordova's new city fathers will have to work hard to avoid that fate. But for now, there is ample room to grow, and amazingly, room to dream."

I have kept some articles and reports from our past 15 years, and how much we have been able to avoid the fate he talked about in older communities and cities. We are now a city of almost 15 years and are just beginning. Since there are only four other cities that are newer than Rancho Cordova in California, we need to continue to hold onto the "spirit and energy that built California."

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

Jerry Brown Responds to Federal Request for National Guard Personnel

SACRAMENTO REGION, CA (MPG) -Governor Edmund G. Brown Jr. today responded to the federal government's request for additional California National Guard personnel with the following letter. The accompanying agreement, submitted this afternoon for review and approval by the federal government, can be found at https://www.gov.ca.gov/wp-content/ uploads/2018/04/4.11.18-Letter-and-Agreement.pdf

Dear Secretary Nielsen and Secretary Mattis:

Pursuant to your request, the California National Guard will accept federal funding to add approximately 400 Guard members statewide to supplement the staffing of its ongoing program to combat transnational crime. This program is currently staffed by 250 personnel statewide, including 55 at the California border.

Your funding for new staffing will allow the Guard to do what it does best: support operations targeting

transnational criminal gangs, human traffickers and illegal firearm and drug smugglers along the border, the coast and throughout the state. Combating these criminal threats are priorities for all Americans - Republicans and Democrats. That's why the state and the Guard have long supported this important work and agreed to similar targeted assistance in 2006 under President Bush and in 2010 under

President Obama. But let's be crystal clear on the scope

sion to build a new wall. It will not be a mission to round up women and children or detain people escaping violence and seeking a better life. And the California National Guard will not be enforcing federal immigration laws.

Here are the facts: there is no massive wave of migrants pouring into California. Overall immigrant apprehensions on the border last year were as low as they've been in nearly 50 years (and 85 percent of the apprehensions

I agree with the Catholic Bishops who have said that local, state and federal officials should "work collaboratively and prudently in the implementation of this deployment, ensuring that the presence of the National Guard is measured and not disruptive to community life."

I look forward to working with you on this important effort.

District Attorney Anne Marie Schubert announced today that arrest warrants have been issued for Christopher Davis, Scott Davis, and Les McKenzie, the owners of Davis Tow, Inc., of Sacramento, and Davis Tow employees Andrew Applegate, Erik Dyer, Jim Early, Drew Harless, Robert Noble, and Edmond Wilson.

They are charged with one count of conspiracy and twenty-nine counts of unlawfully taking motor vehicles. It is alleged that between January 1, 2015, and May 31, 2016, these Davis Tow owners and employees illegally towed vehicles and withheld them from the vehicles' owners until towing and storage fees were paid.

The District Attorney's Office has also filed a civil case seeking an injunction to prevent Davis Tow from illegally towing vehicles, and collecting money for any illegal tows or storage of vehicles.

Defendant Convicted for 1st-Degree Murder of Girlfriend

DATE: April 3, 2018

CASE: Moses Valdez (Case #14F05956) **PROSECUTOR:** Deputy District Attorney Thien Ho, Homicide Unit

Moses Valdez was convicted by a jury for the first-degree murder of Marissa Pineda De Almanza. The jury also found true that Valdez used a gun in the commission of the murder.

On November 2, 2014, the victim's boyfriend, Moses Valdez, shot the victim in the head and left her for dead in her Elk Grove apartment. A short time later, Valdez returned to the victim's apartment and found she had crawled out of bed and down the hallway towards the front door. Valdez then strangled the victim with a belt and an electrical cord. Valdez fled to Mexico, but was apprehended four months later.

Additional allegations that Valdez has two prior 1995 convictions for voluntary manslaughter, which subject him to three-strikes sentencing, will be determined at his sentenc-

If those allegations are found true, Valdez

faces a maximum sentence of 100 years to life in prison. Sentencing is set for April 27, 2018, at 10:30 a.m. in Department 39 before the Honorable David Abbott.

Defendant Sentenced for Attempted Murder, Armed Robberies

DATE: April 6, 2018 CASE: Gilbert Smith (Case #16FE013303 & #16FE005509)

PROSECUTOR: Deputy District Attorney James Wax, Career Criminal Prosecution Unit

The Honorable Michael Bowman sentenced Gilbert Smith to 32 years to life in prison. On March 2, 2018, a jury convicted Smith of attempted murder, robbery and being a felon in possession of a firearm. The jury also found true an allegation that Smith personally and intentionally used a firearm causing great bodily injury. Smith committed the crime after being released on bail for an earlier robbery case.

On July 8, 2016, Gilbert Smith robbed a Brinks guard who was transporting a large sum of money from a bank to his armored vehicle. When the guard exited the bank, Smith approached him with a .40 caliber handgun and shot him. Smith then grabbed the money and engaged in a shootout with the injured guard, who shot Smith several times. Both men were transported to the hospital and received emergency treatment. The guard suffered serious injuries, including an infected lung and fractured rib that required multiple surgeries.

In Smith's earlier robbery case, he entered a Walmart wearing a mask and gloves on February 9, 2016. Smith pointed a semi-automatic pistol at an employee and threatened to kill him if he did not give Smith money from the locked safe. Smith took a large amount of money from the safe and fled. The discarded mask was located and DNA taken from the mask was analyzed by the District Attorney's Crime Lab, which matched Smith. Smith pled no contest to that robbery and admitted an allegation that he personally used a firearm in that crime. He was sentenced to an additional 4 years and 4 months, consecutive to the 32 years to life



April 1, 2018 marked the seventh anniversary of Sacramento County's decision to privatize the management and operation of Gibson Ranch Regional Park.

As many will recall, Gibson Ranch Regional Park was closed

Behind the scenes, the results are very positive. In 2017, the park had over 120,000 visitors. Annual revenue from operations exceeds \$700,000.00. The park is cleaned daily. There are no homeless people residing in the park. The bathrooms are clean and stocked. Over forty weddings occurred at Gibson Ranch in 2017, and we expect over fifty in 2018. An agricultural "farm to fork" operation has been established. We now have the capacity to handle dry camping

cost to the taxpayers that had previously been incurred. The activities and programs offered within the park are meeting the active and passive recreational needs of the community.

This has been and remains a good thing for our community, though it is by no means perfect in every way. We continue to try to improve the park. You are invited to drop by announced or unannounced to see for yourself what Gibson Ranch has to offer.

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





Expenses, not income

Dear Dave,

I bring home \$4,100 a month in military disability pay and Social Security combined. My wife brings home an additional \$2,000 each month. Should we base our emergency fund level on her income only, since mine is guaranteed?

-Lewis

Dear Lewis,

Your emergency fund shouldn't be based on income. I recommend folks have three to six months of household expenses set aside in an emergency fund. What would it take to operate your household for that length of time if one or both of your incomes disappeared?

I don't anticipate your income stopping, Lewis. But income loss isn't the only thing you're guarding against with an emergency fund. You're also guarding

against things like an illness in the family, if the transmission in the car goes out, or your home's heating and cooling unit needs to be replaced. There are many more crises that can come upon a family other than a loss of income.

I don't mind if you two lean toward the three-month side of expenses, since your income is pretty stable. But always remember, an emergency fund should contain three to six months of expenses, not income.

What happens to the debt?

Dear Dave,

I've started your personal finance course in high school, so I'm asking this for the entire class. What happens to your debt if you pass away with no relatives or heirs to take responsibility for what you owed?

Dear Elizabeth,

In many cases it simply does not get paid. Relatives or heirs of the deceased are not responsible for a friend or family member's debt,

against things like an illness in except in cases where they have the family, if the transmission in been a co-signer on that debt.

Let's say someone's parents died, and at the time of their death they had \$100,000 in debt in their names only. The only way that debt will be paid is if they owned enough stuff if they had enough in the way of assets — to pay the debt. If they owned a \$200,000 home, the house would have to be sold in order to pay the debts. Their estate would be the only thing standing good for the debt. If they owned nothing, and had no co-signers on any of the debt, the creditor would not get paid. The bank lost that money.

The start location is Hagan Park, 2197 Chase Dr, Rancho Cordova CA 95670. There is a regional park fee of \$4.00 for a day pass or people can park in the nearby adjacent parking lot of the Rancho Cordova High School for free. The walk is available on Saturday, May 12, 2018 and registration is anytime between 9:00

am to 12:00 Noon. Everyone must be off the trail and return by 3:00. The cost is FREE to everyone; however donations are always welcome. People wanting Volkswalk credit will pay \$3.00 for the walk. Dogs must be on leash with cleanup and strollers and wheelchairs would be fine with the 5K (3 miles) and 10K (6 miles) routes. We encourage everyone to bring water and keep drinking so they keep hydrated as well as wearing hats and sunscreen.

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History of the Rancho Cordova Grapevine Independent



APRIL 11, **1968** - The Original Grapevine

This week's issue celebrates 50 years of publication of the Rancho Cordova Grapevine Independent, the newspaper of record for the city of Rancho Cordova. We have put together the lineage of the previous publishers of the newspaper along with some of their quotes and a dab of history found in the archives.

Publishing, especially weekly newspaper publishing, is not for the faint of heart. Deadlines are deadlines that must be met without fail. Every week many thousands of people and thousands of dollars depend on hitting those deadlines. Every one of the past publishers deserves some applause for making their attempt of providing the community with local news and their desire to serve the public.

Here's the history, one publisher at a time, noted by the year they were at the helm.

- 1968 The newspaper was started by John Marcarelli, a local prominent insurance salesman, and his wife Mary Helen, who is actually the one who named the newspaper. "Because the vineyards were all over and a grapevine is a way of spreading the news, we called it The Grapevine," he said, as noted in the April 13th, 1988 issue of the newspaper. The very first edition hit the streets on April 11th, 1968. Marcarelli said, "It was a big financial loss the first year. It never made expenses."
- **1969** The newspaper was sold by Marcarelli to two Mather airmen, Paul Hronec and Norm Mornini. Paul and Dorothy Hronec later bought out Mornini.
- 1970 The Hronec's, who cited that the newspaper was taking too much time away from caring for their special needs son, sold the newspaper to Walt Stern and Bob Mingori. Stern and Mingori were both former Peace Corps volunteers. Mingori said, "It was never a great financial success, but we did make a few bucks along the way, and we did manage to keep ourselves afloat."



APRIL 13, 1988 - Celebrating 20 Years

1972 – Linn Corey, Don Roina and Rosemary Malich bought the newspaper in 1972. They converted the newspaper from a tabloid to a broadsheet newspaper. "Sometimes it made money," Corey said. "One year it would and the next year it wouldn't." Roina sold his share of the newspaper to Cory in 1975. Roina remem-

bers "the weekly toil, the hard work, the deadlines and the scrambling to get enough income to survive."

1979 – Doug Hawkes and his son Mitch purchased the newspaper in 1979, Hawkes had written for the newspaper previously. The newspaper was renamed The Grapevine Independent by Hawkes. Hawkes claimed that he and the family made a good living during their ownership of the newspaper.

1987 – Husband and wife team Bob and Kathy Knight purchased the newspaper from the Hawkes in October of 1987. Bob had worked for a number of other publishers and Kathy had a newspaper career working for

1988 – Doug Hawkes resumed ownership of the newspaper, as the Knights had fallen on tough times to keep it operating. All assets were returned to Hawkes as Knight announced they could not afford to print another issue. His son, Mitch Hawkes, was named publisher on May 4th, 1988.

1989 – In January, Bob Ling, who had previously hailed from New Jersey, bought the newspaper from Hawkes. Ling had previously worked for newspapers in Michigan. He operated the

for a just under seven years. **2011** – As announced in the November 4th, 2011 issue, Kristin Middaugh, previously serving as the newspaper's editor, purchased the newspaper along with sports writer Bill Hicks. They would operate the newspaper until August 9th,

2013, when they announced the

due to a lack of revenue. **2013** – On August 9th, upon hearing of the front page story of the closing of the newspaper, Paul Scholl of Messenger Publishing Group made an immediate drive to their offices in Rancho Cordova, leaving a note and a business card citing an interest in taking over opera-

tions immediately. It was then purchased with a handshake deal a few days later, and the newspaper never missed an issue.

2018 – The newspaper remains as one of the local newspapers owned and operated by Paul Scholl, owner of the Messenger Publishing Group, established in 2006.

Publisher's note:

When I met with the former publishers in their office they were very disheartened that they couldn't make the newspaper business run. They


really wanted to, but as they said, "We're editorial people, not business people." Over the next many weeks, most nights in the dark, broken up only by my battery operated camping lanterns and portable radio playing talk radio, I went through every box and file cabinet one at a time to sort through a rough but storied history of the local newspaper. I found a lot of great things of interest, a lot of years-old dust and dirt, and some things that should be long forgotten.

The inheritance of the newspaper was piles and piles of meaningless paper, nearly zero paid advertising, a long list of uncollectible IOU's, outdated or broken office equipment, and a very suspect subscriber list. There was no staff in place, as they had all been let go weeks or months before. They had one newsstand left, and it was in the office, broken and without anyone knowing how to repair it.

This long and once proud local newspaper was nearly completely destroyed. The telephones were turned off and the number unavailable due to a huge outstanding bill. The website was not accessible, and along with it so to the email addresses. There was no way for the public to contact The Grapevine.

But, there was a name, and a city that wanted their newspaper to survive. One week at a time, through all the critical and sometimes lousy comments from nay-sayers, financial losses, re-organization and operating challenges, the newspaper regained stability. We've built some wonderful new relationships, rebuilt some bridges, and now are entering an even bigger growing period as our economy and the newspaper picks up steam. Advertisers love all the color, the design and the coverage. And we will strive to continuously improve.
